### **PROGRAM QUICK HITS**

- Iowa has made 12 consecutive postseason appearances (10 NCAA, 2 WNIT).
- The Hawkeyes have made a postseason tournament appearance in 18 of head coach Lisa Bluder's 19 seasons at the helm of the program, receiving 14 NCAA Tournament and four WNIT (2003, 2005, 2016, 2017) bids.
- Bluder is one of 10 Division I head coaches to win 700 games or more in her career. She enters her 36th season as a head coach and 20th at Iowa in 2019-20.
- Iowa will face 10 2019 NCAA Tournament teams this season, including nonconference opponents Princeton, Towson, Clemson, Iowa State, and Drake, and conference opponents Indiana, Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, and Rutgers.
- Senior Kathleen Doyle was named to the Preseason All-Big Ten team.
- The Hawkeyes finished the 2018-19 season ranked first nationally in field goal percentage (51.5), second in assists per game (21.5), third in total assists (775), fourth in assist/turnover ratio (1.55), 12th in free throw percentage (77.3), 13th in fewest fouls per game (13.6), and 14th in scoring offense (78.4).
- Bluder owns a 398-218 (.646) record and a 193-123 (.611) conference mark at Iowa. In her 35 seasons as a head coach, Bluder is 754-360 (.677).

#### **SCOUTING PRINCETON**

- Princeton is 4-0 on the season with wins over Rider, George Washington, Seton Hall, and Florida Gulf Coast.
- Princeton played its last contest on Nov. 17 -- a 67-53 win over Florida Golf
- Junior guard Carlie Littlefield leads the Tigers with 17.3 points per game., while senior Bella Alarie is second on the team, scoring 10.8 points per
- Alarie leads Princeton with 7.3 rebounds per game with Littleton (6.3), freshman Ellie Mitchell (5.8), and senior Taylor Baur (5.5) following.
- As a team, the Tigers are averaging 75.0 points per game and holding opponents to 56.0.
- The Tigers are led by head coach Carla Berube in her first season as the head coach of the Princeton women's basketball team. Berube won 80 percent of her games at her previous school, Tufts University, going 384-96 in 17 seasons while reaching the NCAA Division III final twice, the Final Four four times and the Sweet 16 nine times, including each of the last eight. In her last seven seasons at Tufts, her record was 197-24, with a winning percentage of .891 during those years.

#### SCOUTING PRINCETON -- THE SERIES

- Iowa leads the all-time series, 1-0.
- Iowa defeated Princeton, 59-44, at Carver-Hawkeye Arena during the 1998-99 season.

#### ON THE SEASON

- Iowa is 2-1 on the season with wins over Florida Atlantic and North Alabama.
- Senior guard Kathleen Doyle is leading the Hawkeyes in points per game (14.7), closely followed by senior Makenzie Meyer (14.0). Sophomore Monika Czinano is also averaging in double figures (12.7).
- Iowa sophomore Monika Czinano recorded career-high 13 points, shooting a perfect 9-for-9 from the field in the Hawkeyes, 86-81, win over North Alabama on Nov. 14.
- Czinano is leading the Hawkeyes in shooting percentage (.842), missing three shots in three games.
- Freshman Gabbie Marshall made her first career start against North Alabama, putting up 13 points and three assists.

#### WELCOME TO THE 1.000-POINT CLUB

- Senior Kathleen Doyle scored her 1,000th-career point in Iowa's 85-53 win over Florida Atlantic.
- Doyle put up seven points in the first quarter to break into the 1,000-point club. She is the 37th Hawkeye to reach 1,000 points and now ranks 36th all-time at Iowa (1,008).

#### PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN

- Senior Kathleen Doyle earned unanimous preseason All-Big Ten recognition, the conference office announced Oct. 21.
- Doyle, a 2018-19 first team All-Big Ten selection (coaches), earns the second preseason honor of her career. The LaGrange Park, Illinois, native finished last season ranked 15th nationally in assists per game (5.9) and tied for 31st in total assists (170). The senior led the Big Ten with 6.3 assists per game in conference action last season. She scored in double figures 20 times in 29 games, and dished out five or more assists on 21 occasions.

#### 2018-19 RECAP

The Hawkeyes won their first Big Ten Tournament Title since 2001 and advanced to their first Elite Eight since 1993.

### **HEAD COACH LISA BLUDER**

Lisa Bluder, the all-time winningest coach in program history, is in her 20th year as head women's basketball coach at the University of Iowa and her 36th year overall. Under her direction, the Hawkeyes have advanced to 18 postseason appearances (14 NCAA and four WNIT) in 19 seasons, including NCAA Tournament berths in 10 of the last 12 seasons. Iowa has advanced to the postseason in 12 consecutive seasons (10 NCAA and two WNIT).

- Iowa tied the highest win total in program history (29 wins, 1987-88).
- The Hawkeyes went undefeated in Carver-Hawkeye Arena for the first time since 2014-15 (18-0).
- Last season, Iowa registered seven wins over ranked opponents (No. 20 West Virginia, No. 20 Minnesota, No. 14 Rutgers, No. 21 Michigan State, No. 7 Maryland, No. 8 Maryland, and No. 10 NC State).
- The Hawkeyes set the Big Ten record for assists in a single-season with 775 assists, crushing the previous record of 694 set by Maryland in 2016-17.
- Iowa set a Big Ten record with 392 assists in conference play, topping Ohio State's mark of 356 set in 1984-85.
- The Hawkeyes averaged 21.8 assists per game during Big Ten contests, passing Iowa's own Big Ten record of 20.8 assists per game during the 2000-01 season.
- Iowa set new school assists records in back-to-back games, dishing out 34 assists against Western Kentucky (Nov. 13), before besting that mark with 36 against N.C. Central (Nov. 17).
- The Hawkeyes finished the 2018-19 season with a 29-7 overall record.
- Iowa registered its 13th upper division finish in conference, placing second.
- Iowa has advanced to the postseason in 12 consecutive seasons (10 NCAA and two WNIT).
- The Hawkeyes finished the 2018-19 season ranked first nationally in field goal percentage (51.5), second in assists per game (21.5), third in total assists (775), fourth in assist/turnover ratio (1.55), 12th in free throw percentage (77.3), 13th in fewest fouls per game (13.6), and 14th in scoring offense (78.4).

#### **ROSTER AT A GLANCE**

- The Hawkeyes return nine letterwinners, including two starters in All-Big Ten selection Kathleen Doyle and Makenzie Meyer. Alexis Sevillian made 12 starts last season.
- Doyle led the team last season in assists, averaging 5.9 per game a mark that led the Big Ten and ranked 15th nationally. She also led in steals, averaging 2.3 per contest - the second-best mark in the Big Ten. She ranked third on the team in scoring, averaging 12.0 points per game.
- Meyer led the team with 62 3-pointers made and recorded 143 assists.
- Guard Megan Meyer enters her freshman season after averaging 24.9 points per game, 4.6 rebounds, and 4.5 assists as a senior. Meyer is a four-time all-state honoree and two-time Globe Gazette Player of the Year (2017, 2018).
- Guard/forward McKenna Warnock joins the squad from Monona Grove where she was the all-time leading scorer (boys and girls) and all-time leading rebounder.
- Guard Gabbie Marshall enters her first year after leading Mount Notre Dame to a 2019 Ohio State Championship title, recording 73 steals and shooting 42.6 percent from 3-point range.
- Edwardsville, Illinois, native, Kate Martin will make her debut after redshirting last season with a knee injury. The first-team all-state honoree averaged 16.2 points, 5.9 rebounds, 2.9 assists, and 2.1 steals per game as a senior.

#### **GUARDS ON DUTY**

- The Hawkeyes are experienced at the guard position, returning seniors Kathleen Doyle, Makenzie Meyer, and junior Alexis Sevillian.
- Together, the trio accounted for 131 of Iowa's 201 3-pointers made (65 percent) and collectively averaged 78.9 percent from the free-throw line last season.

### **MEET THE CAPTAINS**

- For the third consecutive year, senior Kathleen Doyle has been named captain by her teammates along with senior Makenzie Meyer and junior Alexis Sevillian.
- Doyle, a first team All-Big Ten selection, returns for her senior season after leading the Big Ten with 6.3 assists per game in conference play.

#### RECORD WATCH

- Head coach Lisa Bluder is two wins away from the 400-win mark at Iowa.
- Senior Kathleen Doyle is 40 assists from ranking second all-time at Iowa. Doyle has 536 total assists.

#### **UP NEXT**

Iowa heads to San Juan, Puerto Rico, to play in the Puerto Rico Clasico. The Hawkeyes will take on Cincinnati (Nov.27), Towson (Nov. 28), and Washington (Nov. 30).
