Iowa has outscored its opponents 70-20 in the fourth quarter. QB Nate Stanley has a 189.8 passing efficiency in the fourth quarter and overtime. The numbers include 24 completions in 39 attempts for 399 yards, five touchdowns and zero interceptions.

Josey Jewell leads the Big Ten and ranks seventh in the nation with 70 tackles. His 9.5 tackles-for-loss (39 yards) ranks second in the Big Ten. Jewell has 42 tackles over the last three games played.

QB Nate Stanley has 15 touchdown passes, second in the Big Ten and tied for 15th in the nation.

Six months after suffering an ACL injury, FS Brandon Snyder returned Oct. 7 to help Iowa defeat Illinois, 45-16. Snyder started and contributed with 3 tackles, 2 pass breakups, and one interception, an 89-yard pick six that halted Illinois' potential go-ahead touchdown drive.

Iowa's starting linebackers have a combined 102 career starts: Josey Jewell (37), Ben Niemann (33), and Bo Bower (32). They rank one, two, and three on the team in tackles.

Senior WR Matt VandeBerg has a reception in 25 consecutive games played. He has 121 career receptions, 11th most in program history. He has 1,488 career receiving yards, 20th in program history.



The Hawkeyes have three players ranked in the top 15 in the league in sacks. Sophomore DE Anthony Nelson ranks third in the Big Ten with five sacks (25 yards) and true freshman DE A.J. Epenesa and senior LB Josey Jewell are tied for 15th with 2.5 sacks.

DB Josh Jackson has started all six games this season at defensive back and ties for the Big Ten lead in passes defended (10) and ranks third in interceptions (2). He ranks fourth in passes broken up (8). He was added to the Bednarik Award watch list on Oct. 6.



RB Akrum Wadley has 403 career carries for 2,246 rushing yards, 10th all-time. Among the 15 career 2,000 yard rushers in program history, Wadley (5.6) ranks third behind Tavian Banks and Shonn Greene (5.9) in average ypc. He is 26 yards from passing Ronnie Harmon for ninth all-time.

Kirk Ferentz has 139 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference, a number that ranks sixth in league history and second all-time at Iowa. He is four wins from tying Hayden Fry as the Hawkeyes' all-time winningest football coach.





HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,226 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 637-550-39 (.535). That includes a 398-218-16 (.643) record in home games, a 239-332-23 (.422) record in games away from Iowa City, a 321-371-25 (.464) mark in Big Ten games and a 282-183-15 (.607) record in Kinnick Stadium.

FINISH STRONG

Iowa has outscored its opponents 70-20 in the fourth quarter. The Hawkeyes also have a touchdown in their lone overtime period (W 44-41 at Iowa State). QB Nate Stanley has a 189.8 passing efficiency in the fourth quarter and overtime. The numbers include 24 completions in 39 attempts for 399 yards, five touchdowns and zero interceptions.

STANLEY MAKING HISTORY

QB Nate Stanley has 15 touchdown passes, second in the Big Ten and tied for 15th in the nation. Stanley threw 12 touchdowns in the first four games of the season, becoming the first quarterback in program history to throw 12 touchdown passes in their first four starts. The four-game stretch was Iowa's best since Chuck Hartlieb threw 12 touchdowns over a four-game stretch in 1987. Chuck Long threw 14 touchdowns in the first four games in 1985.

Stanley threw three touchdowns in his first career start Week 1. The last quarterback to do that was Ricky Stanzi (3, vs. Florida Atlantic in 2008). Since, 1999, the only other quarterback to throw three or more touchdowns in his first career start under Ferentz was Jon Beutjer (4, at Indiana in 2000).

Stanley threw for five touchdowns and 333 yards against Iowa State in Week 2, becoming the first Iowa quarterback with 300-plus passing yards and five-plus touchdown passes since Chuck Hartlieb vs. Northwestern in 1987.

After a slow start in the home loss to Penn State, Stanley completed 12 of his final 14 pass attempts, while also leading lowa on a three-play, 80-yard scoring drive to take a 19-15 advantage in the final two minutes.

TACKLE BY JOSEY JEWELL

LB Josey Jewell leads the Big Ten and ranks seventh in the nation with 70 tackles. His 9.5 tackles-for-loss (39 yards) ranks second in the Big Ten. He matched his career high with 16 vs. Penn State and 16 at Michigan State. Jewell has 42 tackles over the last three games played.

Jewell has led the team in tackles in each of the last two seasons (126 in 2015, 124 in 2016). His 2017 totals include 2.5 sacks (24 yards), 9.5 tackles for loss, six pass break-ups, and one interception.

Jewell has 371 career tackles, eighth all-time in program history. He has 17 career games with double digit tackles.

Jewell was named Walter Camp, Lott IMPACT, and Bednarik Award national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 24-3 win over Wyoming on Sept. 2. Jewell led Iowa with 14 tackles, including seven solo stops.

Jewell was named Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Week, Bronko Nagurski Defensive Player of the Week, Bednarik Award, and College Sports Madness Defensive Player of the Week following his performance vs. No. 4 Penn State. He matched his career best with 16 tackles, including 11 solo stops. He added three tackles for loss, two pass break-ups, and a recovered fumble. His fifth career interception and 33-yard return in the second quarter led to Iowa's first touchdown of the game.

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 19th season as head football coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

 Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.



- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is sixth with 139 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 83 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 10 January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 130-73 (.640) overall mark and a 79-51 (.608) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 11 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 139-94 (.597) and an 83-65 (.561) mark in Big Ten games. In 22 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 151-115 (.568). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's first-year offensive cordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ AMONG B1G LEADERS, CLOSING ON FRY

Kirk Ferentz has 139 overall wins and 83 Big Ten wins as lowa's head coach. The 83 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Ferentz's 139 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank sixth in league history and second all-time at Iowa. He is four wins from tying Hayden Fry as the Hawkeyes' all-time winningest football coach.

Both Ferentz (139, 83) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top seven in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 19th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more.

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State, and 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

THE SERIES

LAST MEETING: NORTHWESTERN 38, IOWA 31 (Oct. 1, 2016 - Iowa City, Iowa)

Northwestern's Austin Carr caught three touchdowns -- two in the second half -- to help the Wildcats spoil Iowa's Homecoming with a 38-31 win over the Hawkeyes in Kinnick Stadium.

With Iowa leading 24-17, Northwestern scored touchdowns on three straight possessions spanning the third and fourth quarters to give the visitors a 38-24 advantage. The Hawkeyes closed the margin to 38-31 after a 1-yard scoring run by LeShun Daniels, Jr. with 8:10 remaining in the contest. However, Northwestern thwarted a potential game-tying drive by by intercepting a QB C.J. Beathard pass on its 36-yard line with 58 seconds left.

The Wildcats led 10-7 after the first period,

scoring on a Clayton Thorson 4-yard scoring run and 25-yard Jack Mitchell field goal. Iowa's first points came on RB Akrum Wadley's 5-yard touchdown run.

Northwestern took a 17-7 lead early in the second quarter on an 11-yard touchdown pass from Thorson to Carr. The Hawkeyes took a 21-17 lead into half after scoring touchdowns on consecutive possessions in the second period. Wadley scored for the second time -- this time from six yards -- and WR Riley McCarron caught a 15-yard pass from Beathard.

lowa extended its lead to 24-17 with a 24-yard K Keith Duncan field goal on its first possession of the third period. Northwestern scored three second-half touchdowns via a pair of Carr receptions (16, 25) and a Justin Jackson 58-yard run.

Beathard completed 19-of-27 passes for 204 yards, with one touchdown and one interception. Thorson completed 18-of-30 passes for 164 yards and three touchdowns for Northwestern.

Daniels led Iowa's ground attack with 72 yards and one touchdown on 17 carries, while Riley McCarron paced the Hawkeye receivers with a team-best 170 all-purpose yards. McCarron had career highs in receptions (8) and receiving yards (78), while also registering 92 yards in returns (54 kickoffs, 38 punts).

Iowa linebacker Josey Jewell led all tacklers with a personal-best 16 tackles, including 1.5 for loss. Lineman Ifeadi Odenigbo had four of Northwestern's six sacks.

POCKET PRESSURE

The Hawkeyes have three players ranked in the top 15 in the league in sacks. Sophomore DE Anthony Nelson ranks third in the Big Ten with five sacks (25 yards) and true freshman DE A.J. Epenesa and senior LB Josey Jewell are tied for 15th with 2.5 sacks. Nelson had six sacks as a freshman last season, second best on the team. Epenesa leads the team with four quarterback hurries. Jewell ranks second in the conference with 9.5 tackles for loss.

WE'VE GOT YOU COVERED

Junior DB Josh Jackson and sophomore FS Amani Hooker have stepped up to lead a secondary that lost two members to the NFL (Desmond King, Chargers; Greg Mabin, Bills).

Jackson has started all six games this season at defensive back and ties for the Big Ten lead in passes defended (10) and ranks third in interceptions (2). He ranks fourth in passes broken up (8). He was added to the Bednarik Award watch list on Oct. 6.

Hooker made his first career start Week 4 against Penn State and recorded a careerhigh 13 tackles. He had five tackles in his second career start at Michigan State. He has 27 tackles this season, fifth on the team. He recorded his first career interception Week 6 against Illinois. Through three conference games, only Josey Jewell (42) has more tackles on the team than Hooker (24).

WELCOME BACK BRANDON SNYDER

Six months after suffering an ACL injury during spring camp, FS Brandon Snyder returned the lineup on Oct. 7 to help Iowa defeat Illinois, 45-16. Snyder started the contest and contributed with three tackles, two pass breakups, and one interception, an 89-yard pick six that halted Illinois' go-ahead touchdown drive.

The 89-yard interception return for a touchdown ties for the sixth longest in school history and is lowa's longest play this season. Iowa has had at least one pick-six every year since 2009.

FRESH LEGS

Running backs Toren Young and Ivory Kelly-Martin carried the ball for the first time in their careers Week 3 when RB Akrum Wadley and RB James Butler each left the North Texas game with injuries.

Young, a redshirt freshman, finished the game with a team-high 19 carries for a teambest 78 yards. Kelly-Martin, a true freshman, finished with 74 yards on 11 carries and two touchdowns (2, 6). Kelly-Martin is the first Iowa true freshman with two-plus rush TD in a game since Marcus Coker in 2010 (vs Missouri).

The rookies combined for 152 yards on 30 carries and two rushing touchdowns. Iowa's seniors, Wadley and Butler, had 98 yards rushing on 24 carries.

WADLEY PURSUES RARE FEAT

Senior RB Akrum Wadley has 483 yards rushing in 2017. He rushed for 1,081 yards in 2016, and with another 1,000-yard campaign he could become the fourth Hawkeye in program history to produce back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons, and the first since Fred Russell went back-to-back in 2002 (1,355) and 2003 (1,264). The other Hawkeyes with back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons include Sedrick Shaw (1,002 in 1994, 1,477 in 1995, 1,116 in 1996) and Ladell Betts (1,090 in 2000 and 1,060 in 2001).

WADLEY MOVING UP THE CHARTS

RB Akrum Wadley is one of 15 players in program history to rush for 2,000 career yards. He has 403 career carries for 2,246 rushing yards, 10th all-time. Among the 15 career 2,000 yard rushers in program history, Wadley (5.6) ranks third behind Tavian Banks and Shonn Greene (5.9) in average yards per carry. He is 26 yards from passing Ronnie Harmon for ninth all-time.

Wadley has 22 career rushing touchdowns, tying for seventh all-time, and 29 career touchdown, sixth all-time, and 174 career points, 13th all-time.

Wadley has 3,012 career all-purpose yards, 15th most in program history (2,246 rush, 666 receiving, 100 KO returns). He is averaging 140.2 all-purpose yards per game, fourth best in the Big Ten and 15th nationally.

VANDEBERG STREAKING UP THE RANKINGS

Senior WR Matt VandeBerg has a reception in 25 consecutive games played. He has 121 career receptions, 11th most in program history. He has 1,488 career receiving yards, 20th in program history.

VandeBerg missed Iowa's final nine games of 2016 due to a foot injury sustained in practice on Sept. 26. He played in the first four games of the season, leading the team in receptions, receiving yards, and receiving touchdowns (19-284-3 TDs) before the injury. On Dec. 21, 2016, the Big Ten Conference granted the University of Iowa's medical hardship waiver request on behalf of VandeBerg and granted the wide receiver a fifth year of eligibility.

NEW JERSEY PREPS LEAVE MARK ON CY-HAWK SERIES

Senior RB Akrum Wadley and true freshman WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette, both graduates of Weequahic (WEEK-way) High School in Newark, New Jersey, combined for four touchdowns in Iowa's 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State on Sept. 9. Wadley turned a short crossing route into a 46-yard touchdown reception in the final minutes of the fourth quarter to tie the game, 38-38, and Smith-Marsette caught a five-yard touchdown pass in the first overtime to win the game, 44-41.

Wadley completed the game with 118 rushing yards on a career-high 28 attempts, four receptions for 72 yards and three KO returns for 70 yards. Smith-Marsette finished his first career start with four receptions, 36 yards, and two touchdowns, including a 15-yard diving score in the fourth quarter, and one rushing attempt for seven yards.

BRIAN FERENTZ NAMED OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye football team captain and three-year letterman for the University of Iowa football team, was named Iowa's offensive coordinator on Jan. 9, 2017. He also coaches Iowa's running backs.

Ferentz, the eldest son of UI head coach Kirk Ferentz, was an Iowa offensive lineman from 2001-05. He joined the Iowa coaching staff in 2012, serving as offensive line coach and adding the title of run-game coordinator in 2015.

In 2016, Iowa's offensive line was the recipient of the Joe Moore Award, which goes to the best offensive line in college football. Due to injuries, Iowa was forced to use seven starting combinations on the offensive line, but the Hawkeyes were able to produce two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season for the first time in program history. The Hawkeyes were also a finalist for the Joe Moore Award in 2015.

Under Ferentz's direction, left tackle Brandon Scherff won the 2014 Outland Trophy, was the Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year in the Big Ten; and earned unanimous consensus All-America honors. Scherff was the fifth player selected in the 2015 NFL Draft (Washington Redskins), while right tackle Andrew Donnal was selected by the St. Louis Rams in the fourth round. Center Austin Blythe was selected in the 2016 NFL Draft (Indianapolis).

Ferentz joined the Hawkeye staff after spending four years with the NFL's New England Patriots. He has been recognized by ESPN.com as one of the top assistant coaches in the Big Ten Conference under the age of 40. Prior to joining the Hawkeyes staff, Ferentz worked under Patriots head coach Bill Belichick and current Houston Texans head coach Bill O'Brien, serving as New England's tight ends coach in 2011, helping the Patriots win the AFC championship and a spot in the 2012 Super Bowl. He was an offensive assistant coach in 2010, working exclusively with the tight ends.

WALLACE, WOODS ADD COORDINATOR TITLES

Tight ends coach LeVar Woods added the title of special teams coordinator in 2017. Woods had assisted with special teams since joining the coaching staff in 2012.

Linebackers coach Seth Wallace added the title of assistant defensive coordinator in 2017. Wallace was defensive coordinator at Valdosta State before joining the Hawkeye coaching staff in 2014. He was recruiting coordinator his first two seasons. He coached defensive backs in 2015 and has coached linebackers since 2016.

COPELAND, O'KEEFE, POLASEK JOIN COACHING STAFF

lowa has three new faces on the 2017 coaching staff. Kelton Copeland coaches the Hawkeye receivers after spending the past four years at Northern Illinois. Ken O'Keefe is back on staff as quarterbacks coach. O'Keefe was lowa's offensive coordinator from 1999-2011 and lowa's quarterbacks coach from 2000-11. Tim Polasek, lowa's offensive line coach, spent the past three seasons as North Dakota State's offensive coordinator.

GRADUATE NEWCOMERS

Graduate transfers RB James Butler and WR Matt Quarells joined the Hawkeyes in fall training camp after earning their degrees from Nevada and New Mexico, respectively.

Butler has 36 carries for 158 yards in 2017. He has not played since suffering an injury Week 3 vs. North Texas. He rushed for 1,336 yards and 12 touchdowns as a junior in 2016, and was a two-time All-Mountain West honorable mention selection. The senior has one year of eligibility remaining. He is a native of Bloomingdale, Illinois.

Quarells has not seen action in 2017. He played in 13 games in 2016, catching 11 balls for 180 yards and one touchdown in the Lobos' triple option offense. The junior has two years of eligibility remaining. He is a native of St. Louis.

WADLEY NAMED TO PAUL HORNUNG AWARD HONOR ROLL

RB Akrum Wadley was named to the Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll following Iowa's 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State on Sept. 9.

Wadley was one of five players nationally to earn the recognition. The Hornung Award is presented annually by the Louisville Sports Commission to the most versatile player in major college football.

Wadley accounted for 260 all-purpose yards against the Cyclones. Wadley rushed for 118 yards and one touchdown on a career-best 28 attempts, and had four receptions for 72 yards and one touchdown. He also added three kickoff returns for 70 yards. Wadley scored on a one-yard run to give lowa a 21-10 advantage in the third quarter.

He later hauled in a short pass from quarterback Nate Stanley and turned the play into a 46-yard scoring play that tied the game in the final two minutes of the fourth quarter.

STANLEY NAMED B1G CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

QB Nate Stanley was named Big Ten Conference co-Offensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State on Sept. 9. He was also one of eight quarterbacks nationally named the Manning Award "Star of the Week."

Stanley completed 27-of-41 pass attempts for 333 yards and five touchdowns, with no interceptions. His scoring passes covered 10, 17, 15, 46 and 5 yards, as nine Hawkeyes had at least one reception.

Stanley led the lowa offense on four scoring drives of at least 89 yards. Iowa's final scoring drive in the closing minutes of the fourth quarter covered 89 yards in just seven plays as the Hawkeyes tied the game with 1:52 remaining. Stanley then completed 2-of-3 passes for 15 yards in overtime, including the game-winning touchdown after Iowa State had scored a field goal on its overtime possession.

Stanley established career highs in completions (27), attempts (41), yards (333), and touchdowns (5). He had eight touchdown passes in his first two career starts (12 in four games), more than any other quarterback in the Kirk Ferentz era.

Stanley became only the second Big Ten quarterback in the last 20 years with 300-plus passing yards, five-plus touchdown passes and no interceptions in a road game. The Big Ten honor was the first career honor for Stanley.

IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program has 17 players in its 2017 Leadership Group. The group includes five seniors, four juniors, four sophomores, two redshirt freshmen, and two true freshmen. The Leadership Group will vote on the weekly gameday captains, be involved in team decision-making throughout the season, and provide feedback to the head coach. Players were selected by team vote.

The group consists of seniors DL Nathan Bazata, LB Josey Jewell, LB Ben Niemann, WR Matt VandeBerg, OL Sean Welsh, juniors OL James Daniels, DE Parker Hesse, DB Brandon Snyder, and QB Tyler Wiegers, sophomores LB Amani Jones, DE Anthony Nelson, FB Brady Ross, and QB Nathan Stanley, redshirt freshmen LB Nick Niemann and RB Toren Young, and first-year freshmen DE A.J. Epenesa and OL Tristan Wirfs.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2017. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his sixth year on staff and first as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, is in his 10th year on the Iowa staff, his third coaching tight ends after coaching linebackers for three seasons. Woods was named Special Teams Coordinator in 2017. Woods rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13 before being named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with the Hawkeye special teams.

Iowa has four players whose brothers played at Iowa: LS Marshall Coluzzi (Ron in 2016), OL James Daniels (LeShun in 2013-16), DL Brady Reiff (Riley in 2008-11), OL Kevin Ward (Ryan in 2012-16).

LS Austin Spiewak is the grandson of Gary Grouwinkel, who played for Iowa in the 1957 and 1959 Rose Bowl Games.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 15 of the last 16 seasons.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches • polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 312 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had eight individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 57-38 (.600) since 2010.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry and is leading the program for the 19th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

BLACK FRIDAY

Iowa and Nebraska will meet on Black Friday, the day after Thanksgiving, for the seventh consecutive season. The teams have split the last six meetings on Black Friday. The schools have played on Black Friday every year since Nebraska joined the Big Ten Conference. This season, for the first time since the rivalry was resumed, the game will kickoff at 3 p.m. (CT) and be televised on FS1.

The two teams meet on Black Friday in 2018 and 2019, but the Big Ten Conference announced Sept. 12 that the teams will move off of their Black Friday date in 2020 and 2021. Iowa will close both seasons against Wisconsin, while Minnesota will close the regular season against Minnesota.

TROPHY GAMES

The Hawkeyes have four trophy games on the schedule in 2017. Iowa defended the Cy-Hawk trophy with a 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State on Sept. 9. The Hawkeyes will defend the Floyd of Rosedale trophy against Minnesota at Kinnick Stadium on Oct. 28, and the Heroes Trophy on Nov. 24 at Nebraska. Iowa will try to regain possession of the Heartland Trophy at Wisconsin on Nov. 11.

FIND THE NFL-ER

Cole Croston, a free agent signed by the New England Patriots following the 2017 NFL draft, made the team's 53-man roster, meaning the Hawkeyes have had a future NFL player on their offensive line in each of Kirk Ferentz' 18 completed seasons. Croston split time at both tackles positions for the Hawkeyes in 2016.

Austin Blythe, a four-year Iowa starter and seventh-round selection of the Indianapolis Colts in 2016, was the 15th offensive linemen selected in the NFL draft since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as UI head coach.

From 2007-14, an eventual NFL first-round draft pick started on the Iowa offensive line. Brandon Scherff, selected by the Washington Redskins fifth overall in 2015, was Iowa's left tackle from 2012-14. Riley Reiff, selected 23rd overall by the Detroit Lions in 2012, started at left tackle from 2010-11. Bryan Bulaga, selected 23rd overall by the Green Bay Packers in 2010, started at left guard in 2007 before moving to left tackle in 2008-09.

From 2005-06, Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Marshal Yanda shared time at tackle and guard for the Hawkeyes. Mike Elgin, a seventh round selection of New England, was Iowa's starting center in 2004. Pete McMahon, drafted by Oakland in 2005, was Iowa's right guard in 2003. Oakland's first round pick in 2004, Robert Gallery, was Iowa's left tackle from 2001-03. Eric Steinbach (Cincinnati) started at guard for Iowa from 2000-02, and Bruce Nelson (Carolina) was a four-year starter from 1999-02. Steinbach and Nelson were second round draft picks in 2003.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach, 120 former Hawkeyes have played in the NFL.
- Five former Hawkeyes are playing offensive tackle in the NFL in 2017, tying for the most of any school at that position (Florida).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978. Iowa's streak of 40 consecutive years with at least one selection ties as the seventh longest among all programs.
- Over the past 15 years, 137-of-154 (89 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 10 years, Iowa has had 33 NFL Draft picks, second only to Ohio State (49) and tied with Penn State and Wisconsin.
- Since 2010, Iowa has had 30 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State has had more draft picks in that same time span (46). Michigan has also had 30 players selected in the NFL draft since 2010.
- Iowa has had four first round picks in the last eight NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015. Only Ohio State (7) and Wisconsin (5) have more among Big Ten schools.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a six-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his sixth year on staff and first as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Entering the 2017 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (12) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team.
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Six senior members of Iowa's 2016 team were on NFL opening day rosters in 2017, including, QB C.J. Beathard, OL Cole Croston, DL Jaleel Johnson, DB Desmond King, TE George Kittle and DB Greg Mabin. In addition, free agent WR Riley McCarron is with the New England Patriots.



lowa scored the final 24 points in a 24-3 season-opening victory over Wyoming in Kinnick Stadium. The Hawkeyes improved to 3-0 all-time against the Cowboys.

Wyoming scored the first points of the game on a Cooper Rothe 49-yard field goal. The Cowboys forced four Hawkeye turnovers, however the field goal was the only points of the day the Iowa defense surrendered.

Iowa closed the half with touchdown passes of two and 27 yards from QB Nate Stanley to TE Noah Fant.

Stanley threw his third touchdown in the third period, connecting with WR Nick Easley on a 45-yard strike to extend Iowa's advantage to 21-3. Easley finished the game with a game-best 77 catches on four receptions.

Miguel Recinos split the uprights from 44 yards in the fourth quarter.

Stanley's three touchdown passes are the most by a Hawkeye in a season opener since Drew Tate had six against Montana in 2006. The sophomore signal caller finished the contest completing 8-of-15 passes for 125 yards.

RB Akrum Wadley rushed 24 times for a game-high 116 yards. The senior tailback topped the 100-yard rushing plateau for the 10th time in his career. Wadley is the second player in the Kirk Ferentz era to rush for 100-plus yards in back-to-back season openers (Fred Russell, 2002-03).

Iowa's defense held Wyoming to 233 total yards, including 59 yards rushing, sacked quarterback Josh Allen seven times, and intercepted him twice. CB Josh Jackson and DL Brady Reiff each recorded their first career interceptions in the fourth quarter. Wyoming did not run a single play in the red zone and was just six of 20 on third and fourth down conversion attempts.

Iowa's linebacking trio of Josey Jewell, Ben Niemann, and Bo Bower combined for 38 tackles. Niemann's 13 stops are a career high, while Jewell had a game-best 14 tackles, including two sacks, and Bower had 11. Jewell was named Walter Camp national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts.

lowa used nine first-time starters in the season opener, six on offense and three on defense.

GAME RECAP

Iowa rallied from a 10-point fourth quarter deficit to edge in-state rival Iowa State 44-41 (OT) for the third straight time at Jack Trice Stadium. The Hawkeyes retained possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy.

Trailing 38-31, QB Nate Stanley drove the Hawkeyes 89 yards in seven plays for the game-tying score with 1:09 remaining in the fourth quarter. Stanley connected with RB Akrum Wadley, who dodged five defenders before reaching the end zone from 46 yards to even the score, 38-38.

Iowa's defense held the Cyclones to a 30-yard field goal on the first possession of overtime before Stanley threw a dart to WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette for a 5-yard TD and the win.

Stanley completed 27-of-41 passes to nine different targets for 333 yards with five touchdowns and no interceptions. He is the first Iowa QB with 300-plus passing yards and five-plus TD passes since Chuck Hartlieb versus Northwestern in 1987. Stanley engineered four touchdown drives over 89 yards, three of which covered 91 yards or more. His efforts earned the sophomore signal caller Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors.

Wadley amassed a game-best 260 yards of total offense, rushing the ball 28 times for 118 yards and a score and catching four passes for 72 yards and a touchdown. He added 70 yards on three kickoff returns.

In his first career start, Smith-Marsette had four receptions for 36 yards and two touchdowns, including the gamewinner. He also had one rush for seven yards. WR Nick Easley is the first player under Kirk Ferentz to have a TD reception in each of his first two career games. He had a career and teamhigh seven receptions for 48 yards and one touchdown. WR Matt VandeBerg had three receptions for 42 yards and one touchdown. He is the only player in the Ferentz era to have a receiving TD in three different games against the Cyclones.

Five Hawkeyes set career highs in tackles: DE Parker Hesse (7), FS Jake Gervase (6), DB Josh Jackson (6), DB Michael Ojemudia (4), and DE Sam Brincks (3). Josey Jewell shared the team lead in tackles with seven. In addition to his seven tackles, Hesse intercepted his second career pass at the line of scrimmage, which lead to a field goal to tie the game, 31-31, with 5:16 left in the fourth period.

The game featured three ties and three lead changes. A combined 31 points were scored in the fourth quarter (17 by lowa; 14 by lowa State).

lowa scored 21 unanswered second-half points in registering a 31-14 victory over North Texas inside Kinnick Stadium to remain unbeaten. The Hawkeyes begin the season 3-0 for the seventh time under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

The Hawkeyes' ground attack stifled the Mean Green; lowa rushed 59 times for 238 yards. lowa maintained possession for 40:45, the second most under Ferentz (Kent State, 2004).

North Texas capitalized on two lowa personal foul penalties on its final drive of the first half, resulting in a 13-yard TD pass to take a 14-10 advantage over the home team at half.

It was all Hawkeyes in the second half as Iowa scored touchdowns on its first three possessions, while its fourth possession ended with the Hawkeyes in victory formation at the 2-yard line. All four of Iowa's touchdown drives were 10 plays or more, with its third score covering 87 yards in 8:50.

QB Nate Stanley completed 16-of-27 passes for 197 yards and two touchdowns. The sophomore signal caller has thrown 10 touchdowns over the first three games, the best three-game stretch in the Ferentz era. It is Iowa's best threegame stretch since Chuck Hartlieb threw 11 touchdowns over a three-game stretch in 1987.

lowa had three players rush for 70 yards or more: Toren Young (19 carries, 78 yards), Ivory Kelly-Martin (11 attempts, 74 yards, 2 TDs), and James Butler (16 carries, 74 yards). Kelly-Martin and Young each carried the ball for the first time in their careers. Kelly-Martin is the first true freshman with two rushing touchdowns in a game since Marcus Coker in 2010 (Missouri).

RB Akrum Wadley had two catches for a team-best 80 yards and rushed eight times for 24 yards. His 3-yard rush in the first quarter pushed the senior tailback over 2,000 career yards. Wadley left the game in the second period and did not return due to injury.

Tight ends T.J. Hockensen (8 yards) and Noah Fant (23 yards) caught Iowa's first two touchdowns.

Defensively, Josh Jackson blocked a field goal, intercepted his second pass of the season, had two pass break-ups and was credited with three tackles.

Penn State QB Trace McSorley completed a 7-yard touchdown pass to TE Juwan Johnson as time expired to lift the Nittany Lions to a narrow 21-19 victory over Iowa at Kinnick Stadium in primetime.

Despite being outgained 579 to 273 in total offense and Penn State amassing 99 plays, the Hawkeyes fought the fourth-ranked team to the wire in both team's conference opener. The game featured four lead changes, including two in the final two minutes of the contest.

Trailing 5-0 in the second quarter, LB Josey Jewell intercepted McSorley and returned the theft 33 yards to the Penn State 21-yard line. Iowa scored on the next play, a 21-yard pass play from QB Nate Stanley to WR Nick Easley. Iowa had one snap inside Penn State territory in the first half and made it count as the Hawkeyes led 7-5 at halftime.

The Nittany Lions scored 10 points in the third quarter on a 21-yard field goal and a Saquon Barkley 8-yard rush.

RB Akrum Wadley scored two fourth quarter touchdowns; first a career-long 70-yard pass play from Stanley, then a 35yard run with 1:42 remaining.

Penn State drove 80 yards and scored the game-winner on its 12th and final play.

Wadley (80 rush, 75 receiving) totaled 155 yards of Iowa's 273 total offense. Stanley completed 13-of-22 passes for 191 yards and two scores, connecting on 12 of his final 14 attempts.

In addition to the interception, Jewell had a game-high 16 tackles to match his career high. He also had a personalbest three tackles for loss and added two pass break-ups. He was named Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Week. DB Amani Hooker had 13 tackles in his first career start, while DB Manny Rugamba had a career-high nine stops.

Barkley paced the Nittany Lions, accumulating a school single-game record 358 all-purpose yards.

The loss snaps lowa's Big Ten opener winning streak at five. Iowa's last conference opening loss was in 2011 at Penn State.

GAME RECAP

Michigan State scored 14 first-quarter points and held on for a 17-10 victory over Iowa inside Spartan Stadium. The win snapped a two-game losing streak to the Hawkeyes in East Lansing, Michigan.

WR Felton Davis caught touchdown passes of six and 22 yards in the first quarter to give the Spartans an early 14-point cushion. Davis finished the contest with a game-best nine catches for 114 yards and two scores.

Iowa's Akrum Wadley crossed the goal line from nine yards away with 12:15 remaining in the second quarter for the Hawkeyes' only touchdown of the game. The senior tailback finished the game with 47 all-purpose yards (30 rushing, 17 receiving).

The Spartans led 17-7 at half after Matt Coghlin split the uprights on a 38-yard field goal with 43 seconds left in the second quarter. Iowa's Miguel Recinos converted a 43-yard field goal with 9:08 left in the fourth period for the only scoring in the second half.

Both teams passed for 212 yards, while Michigan State outgained Iowa 88-19 on the ground. Iowa's average starting position was its own 22-yard line, starting four drives inside its own 10-yard line. Michigan State benefited from a shorter field most of the game, with its average field position being its 39-yard line. The Spartans also recovered two Hawkeye fumbles on their side of the field, one of those in the red zone.

LB Josey Jewell led the Hawkeye defense again, equaling a career high with 16 tackles (10 solo), including three for loss and 0.5 sacks. He also forced a fumble. CB Michael Ojemudia, who started for the injured Manny Rugamba, totaled a personal-best eight stops.

Nine different Hawkeyes caught a pass, including DE A.J. Epenesa, who caught a 15-yard pass from punter Colten Rastetter. QB Nate Stanley completed 16-of-31 passes for 197 yards. TE T.J. Hockenson posted career highs in receptions (3) and receiving yards (46).

Iowa's last four trips to Michigan State have resulted in one-possession games (2-2).

lowa scored 35 of the game's final 38 points in a 45-16 rout over Illinois on Homecoming inside Kinnick Stadium. The 45 points are the most by the Hawkeyes against Illinois since 1985 (59 points).

QB Nate Stanley threw three touchdowns, while RB Akrum Wadley scored two touchdowns (one rush, one receiving) to spark the Hawkeye offense.

Illinois led 13-10 after Chase McLaughlin's second of three field goals with 2:49 left in the second quarter. A fake punt on Iowa's ensuing offensive possession ultimately ended with a Wadley 2-yard scoring reception with eight seconds remaining in the first half.

Midway through the third period, a Fighting Illini scoring threat was thwarted when FS Brandon Snyder returned an interception 89 yards for a touchdown. Snyder's return tied Shaun Prater for the sixth longest interception return in school history. Snyder, who was playing in his first game of the season after returning from an ACL injury, also had three tackles and two pass break-ups.

lowa, who has beaten Illinois nine of the last 10 games and four straight, reached the end zone three more times in the fourth quarter. WR Matt VandeBerg caught a 39-yard touchdown pass, Ivory Kelly-Martin had a 3-yard score, and Wadley crossed the goal line from 18 yards away.

Wadley finished the contest with a game-best 129 allpurpose yards, including 115 rushing yards, moving the tailback into 10th all-time in Iowa career rushing. Stanley completed 17-of-32 passes for 247 yards. The Hawkeye signal caller was intercepted on his 15th pass attempt, breaking a streak of 147 attempts without an interception. WR Nick Easley equaled a personal best with seven receptions for 59 yards and a touchdown.

Iowa's defense collected four takeaways; interceptions by Geno Stone, Amani Hooker and Snyder, and a Ben Niemann fumble recovery. Linebacker Josey Jewell and Bo Bower tied for the team lead with 10 tackles each.
