- In a tradition that started at the University of Iowa football team's season opener in 2017, fans inside Kinnick Stadium and patients and families inside the UI Stead Family Children's Hospital exchange waves at the end of the first quarter of each home game.
- LB Josey Jewell leads the Big Ten and ranks third in the nation with 60 tackles. He has 32 tackles over the last two weeks. Only 11 other players in the Big Ten have 32 tackles this season. Jewell's 8.5 TFL leads the Big Ten.
- QB Nate Stanley has 12 touchdown passes, tying for second in the Big Ten and tied for 10th in the nation. Stanley has 133 pass attempts and 12 touchdown passes since being intercepted on his third pass attempt of the season.
- The Hawkeyes have three players ranked in the top 10 in the league in sacks. Sophomore DE Anthony Nelson is tied for third with 4 sacks (15 yards), and true freshman DE A.J. Epenesa and senior LB Josey Jewell are tied for eighth with 2.5 sacks.
- lowa's starting linebackers have a combined 99 career starts: Josey Jewell (36), Ben Niemann (32), and Bo Bower (31). They rank one, two, and three on the team in tackles.
- WR Matt VandeBerg (119) is seven receptions from moving into the program's all-time top 10 list (Marv Cook, 126).
- lowa DE A.J. Epenesa (T8th-2.5) and Illinois DE Bonny Roundtree (T6th-3.0) are the only freshmen ranked in the top 10 in the Big Ten in sacks.
- DB Josh Jackson ties for the Big Ten lead in passes defended (10) and interceptions (2). He ranks second in passes broken up (8).
- RB Akrum Wadley leads lowa in rushing (368) and receiving yards (244). Wadley has 380 career carries for 2,131 rushing yards, 13th all-time. He is 98 yards from passing Shonn Greene and moving into the program's all-time top 10.
- QB Nate Stanley has a 175.2 passing efficiency in the fourth quarter and overtime. The numbers include 21 completions in 35 attempts for 323 yards, four touchdowns and zero interceptions (5 quarters, 1 overtime period).

#### HAWKEYE HISTORY

lowa has played 1,225 games since beginning football in 1889. lowa's overall record is 636-550-39 (.535). That includes a 397-218-16 (.643) record in home games, a 239-332-23 (.422) record in games away from lowa City, a 320-371-25 (.464) mark in Big Ten games and a 281-183-15 (.607) record in Kinnick Stadium.

# **HAWKEYES ON HOMECOMING**

lowa holds a 57-43-5 (.567) record in 105 Homecoming games. Iowa has won five of its last seven Homecoming games, including a 29-20 win against Illinois in 2015, the last time Illinois was the Hawkeyes' homecoming opponent. Iowa is 6-5-2 against Illinois on Homecoming.

lowa is 17-5 on Homecoming since 1995, and 13-4 since 2000, including winning seven in a row from 2000-06. The Hawkeyes are 13-5 in Homecoming contests under Kirk Ferentz.

#### TACKLE BY JOSEY JEWELL

LB Josey Jewell leads the Big Ten and ranks third in the nation with 60 tackles. His 8.5 tackles-for-loss also lead the Big Ten. He has 32 tackles over the last two weeks, twice matching his career high with 16 vs. Penn State and 16 at Michigan State. Only 11 other Big Ten Players have as many tackles this season as Jewell has had the last two weeks (32). He is the only conference player with at least 40 tackles.

Jewell has led the team in tackles in each of the last two seasons (126 in 2015, 124 in 2016). His 2017 totals include 2.5 sacks, 8.5 tackles for loss, and four pass break-up. The four pass breakups tie for sixth in the Big Ten.

Jewell has 361 career tackles, tying Tom Rusk for eighth all-time. He has 16 career games with double digit tackles.

Jewell was named Walter Camp, Lott IMPACT, and Bednarik Award national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 24-3 win over Wyoming on Sept. 2. Jewell led Iowa with 14 tackles, including seven solo stops.

Jewell was named Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Week, Bronko Nagurski Defensive Player of the Week, Bednarik Award, and College Sports Madness Defensive Player of the Week following his performance vs. No. 4 Penn State. He matched his career best with 16 tackles, including 11 solo stops. He added three tackles for loss, two pass break-ups, and a recovered fumble. His fifth career interception and 33-yard return in the second quarter led to lowa's first touchdown of the game.

# STANLEY MAKING HISTORY

QB Nate Stanley has 12 touchdown passes, tying for second in the Big Ten and tied for 10th in the nation. All 12 touchdowns came in the first four games of the season. Stanley was the first quarterback in program history to throw 12 touchdown passes in their first four starts. The four-game stretch was Iowa's best since Chuck Hartlieb threw 12 touchdowns over a four-game stretch in 1987. Chuck Long threw 14 touchdowns in the first four games in 1985.

Stanley has 133 pass attempts and 12 touchdown passes since being intercepted on his third pass attempt of the season. He has since completed 80-of-133 (60.1%) attempts.

Stanley threw three touchdowns in his first career start Week 1. The last quarterback to do that was Ricky Stanzi (3, vs. Florida Atlantic in 2008). Since, 1999, the only other quarterback to throw three or more touchdowns in his first career start under Ferentz was Jon Beutjer (4, at Indiana in 2000).

Stanley threw for five touchdowns and 333 yards against Iowa State in Week 2, becoming the first Iowa quarterback with 300-plus passing yards and five-plus touchdown passes since Chuck Hartlieb vs. Northwestern in 1987.

After a slow start in the home loss to Penn State, Stanley completed 12 of his final 14 pass attempts, while also leading lowa on a three-play, 80-yard scoring drive to take a 19-15 advantage in the final two minutes.



# **HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ**

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 19th season as head football coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is sixth with 138 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 82 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- lowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 10 January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 129-73 (.639) overall mark and a 78-51 (.605) Big
  Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the
  conference 11 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a
  second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At lowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 138-94 (.595) and an 82-65 (.558) mark in Big Ten games. In 22 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 150-115 (.566). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college.
   Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and lowa's first-year offensive cordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

### FERENTZ AMONG B1G LEADERS, CLOSING ON FRY

Kirk Ferentz has 138 overall wins and 82 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach. The 82 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Ferentz's 138 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank sixth in league history and second all-time at Iowa. He is five wins from tying Hayden Fry as the Hawkeyes' all-time winningest football coach.

Both Ferentz (138, 82) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top seven in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only lowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

#### FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 19th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more.

#### **BIG TEN PERFECTION**

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State, and 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title

Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

#### LAST MEETING: Iowa 28, Illinois 0 -- Champaign, Illinois

Iowa's offense rushed for 262 yards and three touchdowns, while its defense silenced Illinois in a 28-0 road victory at Memorial Stadium.

The game, which was played in cold (36 degrees) and windy conditions (WNW 20-25 mph), didn't see its first points until Iowa WR Riley McCarron returned a punt 55 yards for a touchdown with 4:33 remaining in the second quarter.

The Hawkeyes extended their lead to 14-0 when RB LeShun Daniels crossed the goal line on a 1-yard run, capping a 12-play, 77-yard drive midway through the third period.

Daniels scored his second touchdown of the game with 7:17 left in the fourth period on a 50-yard run to increase lowa's lead to 21-0.

(fumble, interception). Iowa forced Illinois to punt on its first 10 possessions, a streak that was snapped by a CB Desmond King interception in the third quarter. Illinois' final four drives ended with an interception, turnover on downs, fumble, and turnover on downs.

LB Josey Jewell was credited with a team-best 10 tackles, while Anthony Gair registered a career-best eight stops. In addition to his forced fumble and recovery, Rugamba had seven tackles.

#### **POCKET PRESSURE**

The Hawkeyes have three players ranked in the top 10 in the league in sacks. Sophomore DE Anthony Nelson is tied for third in the Big Ten with four sacks (15 yards) and true freshman DE A.J. Epenesa and senior LB Josey Jewell are tied for eighth with 2.5 sacks. Nelson had six sacks as a freshman last season, second best on the team. Epenesa leads the team with four quarterback hurries. Jewell leads the conference with 8.5 tackles for loss.

#### **FINISH STRONG**

lowa has scored 46 points in the fourth quarter, more than any other quarter. The Hawkeyes also have a touchdown in their lone overtime period (W 44-41 at lowa State). QB Nate Stanley has a 175.2 passing efficiency in the fourth quarter and overtime. The numbers include 21 completions in 35 attempts for 323 yards, four touchdowns and zero interceptions.

# WE'VE GOT YOU COVERED

Junior DB Josh Jackson and sophomore FS Amani Hooker have stepped up to lead a secondary that lost two members to the NFL (Desmond King, Chargers; Greg Mabin, Bills).

Jackson has started all five games this season at defensive back and ties for the Big Ten lead in passes defended (10) and interceptions (2). He ranks second in passes broken up (8).

Hooker made his first career start Week 4 against Penn State and recorded a career-high 13 tackles. He had five tackles in his second career start at Michigan State. He has 21 tackles this season, sixth on the team.

#### **FRESH LEGS**

Running backs Toren Young and Ivory Kelly-Martin carried the ball for the first time in their careers Week 3 when RB Akrum Wadley and RB James Butler each left the North Texas game with injuries.

Young, a redshirt freshman, finished the game with a team-high 19 carries for a team-best 78 yards. Kelly-Martin, a true freshman, finished with 74 yards on 11 carries and two touchdowns (2, 6). Kelly-Martin is the first lowa true freshman with two-plus rush TD in a game since Marcus Coker in 2010 (vs Missouri).

The rookies combined for 152 yards on 30 carries and two rushing touchdowns. lowa's seniors, Wadley and Butler, had 98 yards rushing on 24 carries.

#### **WADLEY PURSUES RARE FEAT**

Senior RB Akrum Wadley has 368 yards rushing in 2017. He rushed for 1,081 yards in 2016, and with another 1,000-yard campaign he could become the fourth Hawkeye in program history to produce back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons, and the first since Fred Russell went back-to-back in 2002 (1,355) and 2003 (1,264). The other Hawkeyes with back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons include Sedrick Shaw (1,002 in 1994, 1,477 in 1995, 1,116 in 1996) and Ladell Betts (1,090 in 2000 and 1,060 in 2001).

#### **WADLEY MOVING UP THE CHARTS**

RB Akrum Wadley is one of 15 players in program history to rush for 2,000 career yards. He has 380 career carries for 2,131 rushing yards, 13th all-time. Among the 15 career 2,000 yard rushers in program history, Wadley (5.6) ranks third behind Tavian Banks and Shonn Greene (5.9) in average yards per carry. He is 98 yards from passing Greene and moving into the program's all-time top 10 leading rushers.

Wadley has 21 career rushing touchdowns, tying for 10th all-time, and 27 career touchdown for 162 career points, tying for 16th all-time.

Wadley has 2,883 career all-purpose yards, 16th most in program history (2,126 rush, 657 receiving, 100 KO returns).

#### **VANDEBERG STREAKING UP THE RANKINGS**

Senior WR Matt VandeBerg has a reception in 24 consecutive games played. He has 119 career receptions, 11th most in program history. He has 1,440 career receiving yards, 23rd in program history.

VandeBerg missed lowa's final nine games of 2016 due to a foot injury sustained in practice on Sept. 26. He played in the first four games of the season, leading the team in receptions, receiving yards, and receiving touchdowns (19-284-3 TDs) before the injury. On Dec. 21, 2016, the Big Ten Conference granted the University of Iowa's medical hardship waiver request on behalf of VandeBerg and granted the wide receiver a fifth year of eligibility.

#### **NEW JERSEY PREPS LEAVE MARK ON CY-HAWK SERIES**

Senior RB Akrum Wadley and true freshman WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette, both graduates of Weequahic (WEEK-way) High School in Newark, New Jersey, combined for four touchdowns in Iowa's 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State on Sept. 9. Wadley turned a short crossing route into a 46-yard touchdown reception in the final minutes of the fourth quarter to tie the game, 38-38, and Smith-Marsette caught a five-yard touchdown pass in the first overtime to win the game, 44-41.

Wadley completed the game with 118 rushing yards on a career-high 28 attempts, four receptions for 72 yards and three KO returns for 70 yards. Smith-Marsette finished his first career start with four receptions, 36 yards, and two touchdowns, including a 15-yard diving score in the fourth quarter, and one rushing attempt for seven yards.

# **BRIAN FERENTZ NAMED OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR**

Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye football team captain and three-year letterman for the University of Iowa football team, was named Iowa's offensive coordinator on Jan. 9, 2017. He also coaches Iowa's running backs.

Ferentz, the eldest son of UI head coach Kirk Ferentz, was an Iowa offensive lineman from 2001-05. He joined the Iowa coaching staff in 2012, serving as offensive line coach and adding the title of run-game coordinator in 2015.

In 2016, Iowa's offensive line was the recipient of the Joe Moore Award, which goes to the best offensive line in college football. Due to injuries, Iowa was forced to use seven starting combinations on the offensive line, but the Hawkeyes were able to produce two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season for the first time in program history. The Hawkeyes were also a finalist for the Joe Moore Award in 2015.

Under Ferentz's direction, left tackle Brandon Scherff won the 2014 Outland Trophy, was the Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year in the Big Ten; and earned unanimous

consensus All-America honors. Scherff was the fifth player selected in the 2015 NFL Draft (Washington Redskins), while right tackle Andrew Donnal was selected by the St. Louis Rams in the fourth round. Center Austin Blythe was selected in the 2016 NFL Draft (Indianapolis).

Ferentz joined the Hawkeye staff after spending four years with the NFL's New England Patriots. He has been recognized by ESPN.com as one of the top assistant coaches in the Big Ten Conference under the age of 40. Prior to joining the Hawkeyes staff, Ferentz worked under Patriots head coach Bill Belichick and current Houston Texans head coach Bill O'Brien, serving as New England's tight ends coach in 2011, helping the Patriots win the AFC championship and a spot in the 2012 Super Bowl. He was an offensive assistant coach in 2010, working exclusively with the tight ends.

#### **WALLACE, WOODS ADD COORDINATOR TITLES**

Tight ends coach LeVar Woods added the title of special teams coordinator in 2017. Woods had assisted with special teams since joining the coaching staff in 2012.

Linebackers coach Seth Wallace added the title of assistant defensive coordinator in 2017. Wallace was defensive coordinator at Valdosta State before joining the Hawkeye coaching staff in 2014. He was recruiting coordinator his first two seasons. He coached defensive backs in 2015 and has coached linebackers since 2016.

## COPELAND, O'KEEFE, POLASEK JOIN COACHING STAFF

lowa has three new faces on the 2017 coaching staff. Kelton Copeland coaches the Hawkeye receivers after spending the past four years at Northern Illinois. Ken O'Keefe is back on staff as quarterbacks coach. O'Keefe was lowa's offensive coordinator from 1999-2011 and lowa's quarterbacks coach from 2000-11. Tim Polasek, lowa's offensive line coach, spent the past three seasons as North Dakota State's offensive coordinator.

#### **GRADUATE NEWCOMERS**

Graduate transfers RB James Butler and WR Matt Quarells joined the Hawkeyes in fall training camp after earning their degrees from Nevada and New Mexico, respectively.

Butler has 36 carries for 158 yards in 2017. He has not played since suffering an injury Week 3 vs. North Texas. He rushed for 1,336 yards and 12 touchdowns as a junior in 2016, and was a two-time All-Mountain West honorable mention selection. The senior has one year of eligibility remaining. He is a native of Bloomingdale, Illinois.

Quarells has not seen action in 2017. He played in 13 games in 2016, catching 11 balls for 180 yards and one touchdown in the Lobos' triple option offense. The junior has two years of eligibility remaining. He is a native of St. Louis.

#### WADLEY NAMED TO PAUL HORNUNG AWARD HONOR ROLL

RB Akrum Wadley was named to the Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll following Iowa's 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State on Sept. 9.

Wadley was one of five players nationally to earn the recognition. The Hornung Award is presented annually by the Louisville Sports Commission to the most versatile player in major college football.

Wadley accounted for 260 all-purpose yards against the Cyclones. He is averaging 142.4 all-purpose yards per game, fourth best in the Big Ten and 21st nationally.

Wadley rushed for 118 yards and one touchdown on a careerbest 28 attempts, and had four receptions for 72 yards and one touchdown. He also added three kickoff returns for 70 yards.

Wadley scored on a one-yard run to give Iowa a 21-10 advantage in the third quarter. He later hauled in a short pass from quarterback Nate Stanley and turned the play into a 46-yard scoring play that tied the game in the final two minutes of the fourth quarter.

#### STANLEY NAMED B1G CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

QB Nate Stanley was named Big Ten Conference co-Offensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State on Sept. 9. He was also one of eight quarterbacks nationally named the Manning Award "Star of the Week."

Stanley completed 27-of-41 pass attempts for 333 yards and five touchdowns, with no interceptions. His scoring passes covered 10, 17, 15, 46 and 5 yards, as nine Hawkeyes had at least one reception.

Stanley led the Iowa offense on four scoring drives of at least 89 yards. Iowa's final scoring drive in the closing minutes of the fourth quarter covered 89 yards in just seven plays as the Hawkeyes tied the game with 1:52 remaining. Stanley then completed 2-of-3 passes for 15 yards in overtime, including the game-winning touchdown after Iowa State had scored a field goal on its overtime possession.

Stanley established career highs in completions (27), attempts (41), yards (333), and touchdowns (5). He had eight touchdown passes in his first two career starts (12 in four games), more than any other quarterback in the Kirk Ferentz era.

Stanley became only the second Big Ten quarterback in the last 20 years with 300-plus passing yards, five-plus touchdown passes and no interceptions in a road game. The Big Ten honor was the first career honor for Stanley.

#### **IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP**

The University of Iowa football program has 17 players in its 2017 Leadership Group. The group includes five seniors, four juniors, four sophomores, two redshirt freshmen, and two true freshmen. The Leadership Group will vote on the weekly gameday captains, be involved in team decision-making throughout the season, and provide feedback to the head coach. Players were selected by team vote.

The group consists of seniors DL Nathan Bazata, LB Josey Jewell, LB Ben Niemann, WR Matt VandeBerg, OL Sean Welsh, juniors OL James Daniels, DE Parker Hesse, DB Brandon Snyder, and QB Tyler Wiegers, sophomores LB Amani Jones, DE Anthony Nelson, FB Brady Ross, and QB Nathan Stanley, redshirt freshmen LB Nick Niemann and RB Toren Young, and first-year freshmen DE A.J. Epenesa and OL Tristan Wirfs.

#### **BACK ON CAMPUS**

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2017. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his sixth year on staff and first as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, is in his 10th year on the lowa staff, his third coaching tight ends after coaching linebackers for three seasons. Woods was named Special Teams Coordinator in 2017. Woods rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the lowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13 before being named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with the Hawkeye special teams.

#### **TROPHY GAMES**

The Hawkeyes have four trophy games on the schedule in 2017. Iowa defended the Cy-Hawk trophy with a 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State on Sept. 9. The Hawkeyes will defend the Floyd of Rosedale trophy against Minnesota at Kinnick Stadium on Oct. 28, and the Heroes Trophy on Nov. 24 at Nebraska. Iowa will try to regain possession of the Heartland Trophy at Wisconsin on Nov. 11.

### **FIND THE NFL-ER**

Cole Croston, a free agent signed by the New England Patriots following the 2017 NFL draft, made the team's 53-man roster, meaning the Hawkeyes have had a future NFL player on their offensive line in each of Kirk Ferentz' 18 completed seasons. Croston split time at both tackles positions for the Hawkeyes in 2016.

Austin Blythe, a four-year lowa starter and seventh-round selection of the Indianapolis Colts in 2016, was the 15th offensive linemen selected in the NFL draft since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as UI head coach.

From 2007-14, an eventual NFL first-round draft pick started on the Iowa offensive line. Brandon Scherff, selected by the Washington Redskins fifth overall in 2015, was Iowa's left tackle from 2012-14. Riley Reiff, selected 23rd overall by the Detroit Lions in 2012, started at left tackle from 2010-11. Bryan Bulaga, selected 23rd overall by the Green Bay Packers in 2010, started at left guard in 2007 before moving to left tackle in 2008-09.

From 2005-06, Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Marshal Yanda shared time at tackle and guard for the Hawkeyes. Mike Elgin, a seventh round selection of New England, was lowa's starting center in 2004. Pete McMahon, drafted by Oakland in 2005, was lowa's right guard in 2003. Oakland's first round pick in 2004, Robert Gallery, was lowa's left tackle from 2001-03. Eric Steinbach (Cincinnati) started at guard for lowa from 2000-02, and Bruce Nelson (Carolina) was a four-year starter from 1999-02. Steinbach and Nelson were second round draft picks in 2003.

#### **IOWA PROGRAM NOTES**

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 15 of the last 16 seasons.
- lowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, lowa has appeared in the poll 312 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- lowa has had eight individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- lowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 57-38 (.600) since 2010.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry and is leading the program for the 19th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

# **BLACK FRIDAY**

Iowa and Nebraska will meet on Black Friday, the day after Thanksgiving, for the seventh consecutive season. The teams have split the last six meetings on Black Friday. The schools have played on Black Friday every year since Nebraska joined the Big Ten Conference. This season, for the first time since the rivalry was resumed, the game will kickoff at 3 p.m. (CT) and be televised on FS1.

The two teams meet on Black Friday in 2018 and 2019, but the Big Ten Conference announced Sept. 12 that the teams will move off of their Black Friday date in 2020 and 2021. Iowa will close both seasons against Wisconsin, while Minnesota will close the regular season against Minnesota.

#### KIRK FERENTZ RADIO SHOW

Iowa Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week during the regular season. The radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes. The show airs live each Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. from Carlos O'Kelly's in Iowa City.

#### **HOME GROWN HAWKEYES**

lowa's 2017 roster of 121 players includes 57 players from the state of lowa. The roster includes 21 players from Illinois; nine from Wisconsin; six from Michigan; four from Maryland; three from Florida, New Jersey, South Dakota, and Texas; two from Missouri, Nebraska, and Ohio; and one from Georgia, Indiana, Kansas, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina, and Pennsylvania.

#### **REINVENTING THE STADIUM WAVE**

In a tradition that started at the University of Iowa football team's season opener in 2017, fans inside Kinnick Stadium and patients and families inside the UI Stead Family Children's Hospital exchange waves at the end of the first quarter of each home game.

The UI Stead Family Children's Hospital opened in 2017. It is connected to the south end of the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics and overlooks Kinnick Stadium from the southwest grandstands. During Iowa football home games, patients and their families can watch the game from the top floor (Level 12), one of the highest vantage points in Iowa City.

The wave highlights the relationship between the football team and the hospital. The Hawkeyes' "Touchdowns for Kids" campaign has long been a fundraiser and during every game, a "Kid Captain" from the hospital receives special recognition from the Hawkeye football program.

#### *397 AND COUNTING*

The Hawkeyes have won 397 games at home since becoming a varsity football team in 1889. The Hawkeyes are 397-218-16 at home, including a 116-35-1 mark at lowa Field and a 281-183-15 record at Kinnick Stadium.

lowa's first win at home was 64-6 victory vs. Cornell in 1891 at lowa Field.

Kinnick Stadium opened in 1929 as Iowa Stadium. It was renamed Kinnick Stadium in 1972 in honor of 1939 Heisman Trophy winner Nile Kinnick. Prior to 1929 Iowa played its home games at Iowa Field, located on the east bank of the Iowa River (now a parking lot between the English Philosophy Building and UI Main Library).

#### **ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!**

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is in its 14th season in 2017.

Adults can ride the train for \$15, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day (cash only on game day) at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. The trip to Kinnick Stadium is approximately 10 minutes. Media credentials are accepted as well.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to 11 a.m. kickoffs, and four hours prior to the start of afternoon and night games. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

#### **IOWA GAME DAY INFORMATION**

The University of Iowa has implemented changes intended to improve the safety and game day experience for fans attending Iowa football home games at Kinnick Stadium this fall. Changes include, but are not limited to, a partial closure of Hawkins Drive, a postgame two-lane traffic pattern on Melrose Avenue, singlegame ADA parking, and information regarding the UI Hawkeye Marching Band pregame performance in the Recreation Building. ## **HAWKEYES RETURN NATION'S TOP OFFENSIVE LINE UNIT**

Seniors Ike Boettger (LT, LG, RT), Boone Myers (LT, LG), and Sean Welsh (RG, RT); juniors James Daniels (C), Lucas LeGrand (C), and Keegan Render (LG, RG); and sophomore Levi Paulsen (RG) all started at least one game for an offensive line that won the Joe Moore Award in 2016. The Joe Moore Award honors offensive line units that display a high level of toughness, effort, teamwork, consistency, technique, and "finishing". It is the only major college football award to honor a unit.

The Hawkeyes were selected over national runner-up Alabama and third-ranked Ohio State. Iowa was selected by a voting committee comprised solely of people who played or coached the offensive line position, including all of the current offensive line coaches at the Division I/FBS level as well as former players, coaches and colleagues of Coach Moore, and select media. Iowa's offense averaged 171.8 rushing yards per game -- averaging 4.5 yards per carry, and more than two yards before contact -- and 325 yards total offense per game.

## **HAWKEYES IN THE NFL**

lowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers. Since 2010, 26 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft. Today, 26 Hawkeyes are on NFL rosters.

# **IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL**

- Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach, 120 former Hawkeyes have played in the NFL.
- Five former Hawkeyes are playing offensive tackle in the NFL in 2017, tying for the most of any school at that position (Florida).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978. Iowa's streak
  of 40 consecutive years with at least one selection ties as the seventh longest among all
  programs.
- Over the past 15 years, 137-of-154 (89 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 10 years, Iowa has had 33 NFL Draft picks, second only to Ohio State (49) and tied with Penn State and Wisconsin.
- Since 2010, Iowa has had 30 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State has had more draft picks in that same time span (46). Michigan has also had 30 players selected in the NFL draft since 2010.
- Iowa has had four first round picks in the last eight NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010;
   DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015. Only Ohio State (7) and Wisconsin (5) have more among Big Ten schools.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a six-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former lowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his sixth year on staff and first as lowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former lowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Entering the 2017 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (12) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team.
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Six senior members of Iowa's 2016 team were on NFL opening day rosters in 2017, including, QB C.J. Beathard, OL Cole Croston, DL Jaleel Johnson, DB Desmond King, TE George Kittle and DB Greg Mabin. In addition, free agent WR Riley McCarron is with the New England Patriots.
