The University of Iowa soccer team will host Ohio State on Sunday in its regular season finale at 1 p.m. (CT) at the Iowa Soccer Complex. Admission is free.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- lowa's 14 wins are tied for the second-most in a single season in school history. It is the second 14-win season under head coach Dave Dilanni. Iowa won 14 games during his first season in 2014.
- The Hawkeyes have six Big Ten victories, which are tied for the third-most in a single season in school history. Iowa won a school-record seven league contests in 1999 and 2014.
- lowa has clinched a spot in the 2019 Big Ten Tournament, its second berth in three seasons.
- The Hawkeyes' 14 regular-season wins are the most for the program in school history.
- Senior Claire Graves won her 37th career game in Iowa's road win at Minnesota, moving her past Hannah Clark as the all-time winningest goalkeeper in school history.
- lowa tied a school record, winning its first nine games of the 2019 season. The Hawkeyes also started 9-0-0 in 2013.
- Hannah Drkulec was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week and Gianna Gourley was tabbed as the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Oct. 8. It was lowa's fifth and sixth weekly honor of the season -- the most in school history.
- Iowa is receiving votes in the United Soccer Coaches poll, sitting 29th with 20 points. The Hawkeyes are fourth in the North Region rankings.
- The Hawkeyes tied No. 10/14 Wisconsin (2-2) on Oct. 17 in Madison and defeated Minnesota (2-1) on Oct. 20 in double overtime in Minneapolis courtesy of a Samantha Tawharu golden goal in the 110th minute.
- The Hawkeyes have scored a Big Ten-best 43 goals -- eight off the national lead -- through 18 games. The figure is seventh nationally. This figure also doubles the 2018 season goal total. Iowa is six goals shy of tying the school record of 49 goals in 1999.

MOVING UP THE CHARTS

lowa has 14 victories this season, which are tied for the second most in a single season in program history. The Hawkeyes won a school-record 15 games in 2013, the year the program made its first NCAA Tournament appearance.

DYNAMO DEVIN

Senior Devin Burns has registered a point in nine of Iowa's 18 games this season. She scored her teamleading sixth goal in the Hawkeyes' 3-0 win over Michigan State on Oct. 6, giving her 20 goals for her







Dave Dilanni is in his sixth season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 279-63-25 career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history. In five seasons at Iowa, Dilanni has a 59-43-6 record.

In 2018, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to an 8-7-3 overall record and a 4-5-2 mark in Big Ten play. Iowa was in Big Ten Tournament contention until the final game, but fell short after battling Northwestern to a 1-1 draw. Junior Natalie Winters was a third-team all-region and third-team All-Big Ten selection -- Iowa's first all-region honoree since 2014.

In the classroom, Iowa earned the United Soccer Team Academic Award for a 12th straight season and the Hawkeyes had two Google Cloud Academic All-Americans — the first two in program history. Kaleigh Haus was a first-team selection; Hannah Drkulec earned second-team honors. Iowa also had 10 players earn Academic All-Big Ten honors, 25 players with a 3.0 GPA or better, 14 Dean's List, and 4 President's List honorees during the spring semester.

In May, 2019, Dilanni led the lowa soccer program on its first foreign tour in its history. The Hawkeyes traveled to Germany, Sweden, and Denmark for a 10-day tour.

• lowa is 16-0-1 in games in which Burns has scored in her career.

GRAVES GETS IT DONE

- Senior Claire Graves has posted 13 victories in goal this season, which are tied for the second-most in a single season in program history.
- The Indiana native has posted 7.5 shutouts, a career high. The figure is third in a single season in program history.
- Graves is 13-3-1 with a 0.78 goals against average this season. She has made 38 saves.

OF NOTE...

- Senior Isabella Blackman scored her first goal of the season -- a game-winner -- in Iowa's 4-0 Senior Day victory over Maryland. It was the midfielder's first goal since the second game of her career -- a game-winner in a road win at Missouri in 2016.
- Sophomore Riley Whitaker scored her second career goal, bending in a strike off a corner kick against the Terrapins. She is the 16th Hawkeye to score this season.
- Emma Tokuyama assissted on both goals on Oct. 20 against Minnesota. She now leads the team with five assists.
- Sophomore Samantha Tawharu scored her fourth goal of the season to give lowa a 2-1 double overtime victory over Minnesota on Oct. 20. The golden goal came in the 110th minute with 25 seconds remaining in the game.

DRKULEC DOES IT ALL

Senior Hannah Drkulec earned her fourth Big Ten weekly honor of the season Oct. 8 when she was tabbed the league's Defensive Player of the Week. Drkulec keyed an lowa defense that posted back-to-back shutouts of Nebraska and Michigan State and she scored the game-winning goal in East Lansing.

- Drkulec was previously named Defensive Player of the Week on Aug. 27 and Sept. 10 and she tabbed as the Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 17 following her first career two-goal game in the road win at Notre Dame.
- Drkulec became the third Big Ten student-athlete all-time to garner Offensive and Defensive Player of the Week honors in the same season (Lisa Grubb, Ohio State, 2001; Izzy Rodriguez, Ohio State, 2018)
- Drkulec's four weekly honors match Britta Vogele for the most in a single-season in school history.
- The defender was also named to TopDrawerSoccer's National Team of the Week on Sept. 17.
- Drkulec has a career-high five goals in 2019. She scored her second career game-winning goal in the road win at Michigan State on Oct. 6.

A PROGRAM FIRST

The Hawkeyes debuted in the United Soccer Coaches poll on Sept. 17, coming in at No. 19. It was lowa's highest ranking in school history and the first time the program has been in the United Soccer Coaches poll (previously NSCAA).

• lowa also joined TopDrawerSoccer's Top 25 for the first time since 2014, when the Hawkeyes were ranked 25th.

ADDITIONAL HAWKEYE HONOREES

- Senior Claire Graves was named the Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Week on Sept. 10 after posting back-to-back shutouts of No. 14 NC State and UNC Greensboro. She was also named honorable mention on TopDrawerSoccer's National Team of the Week on Sept. 10.
- Freshman Gianna Gourley was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Oct. 8 after scoring the game-winning goal in the home win over Nebraska.

AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

The Hawkeyes rank among the top 20 in the nation in seven categories. lowa is tied for first in penalty kicks (1.000), seventh in goals (43), eighth in points (121), 12th in assists (35), 18th in scoring offense (2.39), 18th in shots on goal per game (8.33), and 20th in winning percentage (.806).

B1G LEADERS

- The Hawkeyes are leading the Big Ten in all six offensive categories -- goals (43), points (121), shots (296), goals per game (2.39), assists (35), and assists per game (1.94).
- Senior Devin Burns and Natalie Winters are tied for ninth in the Big Ten with six goals.





- Devin Burns is tied for sixth in the conference with 45 shots and tied for eighth in shots per game (2.50)
- Senior Natalie Winters is tied for sixth in game-winning goals with three.

IOWA'S DEFENSE HAS...

- allowed seven or fewer shots in 11 of its 18 games. lowa allowed just two shots in three games
- -- wins over Western Michigan, Northern Iowa, and Northern Colorado -- and three shots in the road loss at Purdue.
- posted eight shutouts, including back-to-back-to-back against No. 14 NC State, UNC Greensboro, and Northern Colorado. Four of lowa's six Big Ten wins have come via the shutout.

OFFENSIVELY SPEAKING

- lowa is out-shooting its opposition, 296-125, and the Hawkeyes have an 102-57 advantage in corner kicks. The Hawkeyes have 20 or more shots in six games.
- Nine different Hawkeyes have scored a game-winning goal this season, including career firsts from: Hannah Drkulec, Gianna Gourley, Samantha Tawharu, Emma Tokuyama, and Sara Wheaton.
- The Hawkeyes have scored three or more goals in eight games this season.

I SCORE, YOU SCORE, WE ALL SCORE

The Hawkeyes have scored 43 goals in 18 games (lowa scored 20 total goals in 2018) and 16 different players have found the back of the net. Seventeen different players have tallied a point this season

- lowa has an NCAA-leading 16 different goal scorers in 2019.
- Freshmen Gianna Gourley, Sara Wheaton, and Samantha Cary, sophomores Samantha Tawharu, Skylar Alward, Jenny Cape, and senior Emma Tokuyama have scored their first career goals this season.
- lowa scored six goals in its 6-1 victory over Northern lowa on Aug. 25 -- the most for the program since 2017. The six goals (and six assists in the game) are tied for the most in a single game in the Big Ten this season.

DOWN GOES NO. 14

- The Hawkeyes' 1-0 victory at No. 14 NC State was the program's third-highest ranked victory in its history and the highest ranked opponent since 2013.
- lowa defeated No. 7 Michigan in the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals in 2013. The program also knocked off 12th-ranked Wisconsin in 1999.

PERFECT PK

Senior Natalie Winters has scored six goals -- with four coming on penalty kicks. She is a perfect 8-for-8 in her career in penalty kicks.

HOME COOKIN' AT THE ISC

The Hawkeyes home unbeaten streak came to an end Sept. 29 in an overtime loss to Northwestern. lowa was riding a 16-game unbeaten streak that dated back to Oct. 21, 2017.

• lowa is 15-2-3 dating back to the start of the 2018 season, which includes an 8-2 record at home this season.

HAWKEYE TIDBITS

- The Hawkeyes are 6-1-1 on the road this season, a year after going 1-7-0 away from lowa City. The six road wins are tied for the most in a single season in school history.
- lowa posted a 1-0 road win at Indiana in its Big Ten Conference opener. It was the Hawkeyes first victory in a league opener since 2014 and the first on the road in school history.

90-MINUTE CLUB

lowa has five position players that are a part of the 90-minute club. The club includes: Riley Whita-ker (14 games), Hannah Drkulec (10), Sara Wheaton (10), Samantha Cary (9), and Isabella Blackman (8).

OUICK ATTACK

- The Hawkeyes' offense has come out fast, scoring in the game's first seven minutes in four contests -- (UNI (6:58), Illinois State (0:47), UNC Greensboro (3:52), Northern Colorado (6:09).
- lowa has scored first in 13 of 18 games this season. The Hawkeyes fell behind in the road win at

• Out of 1,576 total minutes this season, lowa has only trailed for 129 minutes and 23 seconds.

EXPERIENCE GALORE

- The Hawkeyes boast a roster featuring 12 seniors and 14 total upperclassmen. The 12 seniors are believed to be the most by a team in the nation.
- The 12 seniors have combined to start 433 games in their collegiate careers.
- lowa has played 72 games since the senior class arrived in 2016. Nine seniors have appeared in 50 or more games in their careers.
- Senior Natalie Winters has started 73-of-74 career games and she has appeared in all 74 contests.
- Hannah Drkulec 73-of-74 (50 starts); Isabella Blackman 72-of-74 (64 starts); Claire Graves 69-of-74 (68 starts), Kaleigh Haus 68-of-74 (50 starts); Devin Burns 67-of-74 (54 starts), Olivia Fiegel 58-of-74 (17 starts); Leah Moss 57-of-74 (40 starts); Emma Tokuyama 53-of-74 (4 starts).

GRAVES TIES CAREER WINS RECORD

Senior Claire Graves became lowa's career wins leader when the Hawkeyes defeated Minnesota, 2-1, on Oct. 20. She has 37 career victories. Graves currently ranks in the top-four in three categories — first in career wins (37), second in career shutouts (24.5), and fourth in career saves (229).

BURNS AMONG CAREER LEADERS

• Senior Devin Burns has scored six goals during the 2019 season, giving her 20 career goals, which are the sixth-most in school history. Linzy Wolman is fifth with

21 goals.

- Burns is also tied for third all-time with nine career game-winning goals.
- She currently has 52 career points, which is tied with Bri Toelle (52) for sixth place all-time

HAWKEYE TIDBITS

- The Hawkeyes were picked to finish 10th in the Big Ten preseason poll.
- Seniors Hannah Drkulec and Isabella Blackman were voted the Hawkeyes' team captains for the 2019 season.

SCOUTING OHIO STATE

- The Buckeyes bring a 4-8-4 overall and 2-4-3 conference record into Sunday's game against lowa. Ohio State is currently 10th in the Big Ten standings.
- Ohio State is winless while playing away from Columbus this season with an 0-4-2 road record.
- The Buckeyes are currently on a five-game winless streak, and they have scored only scored three goals during this stretch.
- Kayla Fischer and Marissa Birzon are tied with four goals a piece to lead the Buckeyes. Seven other players have scored one goal this season.

SERIES RECORD

- The Buckeyes lead the all-time series over lowa, 16-6-1. Ohio State has won five straight in the series over lowa.
- lowa's last victory in the series was a 2-1 road win in Columbus in 2014.
