- Kirk Ferentz's 162 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference tie Joe Paterno for 4th all-time in league history. He is one of 5 coaches in B1G history to win at least 150 games as a member of the conference. The top five includes Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Joe Paterno (162), and Ferentz (162).
- DT Daviyon Nixon leads the country in tackles-for-loss per game with 2.75. Nixon has 5.5 tackles for loss, the most in the Big Ten. He has 18 tackles, tied for the most on the team and more than any other Big Ten defensive linemen.
- P Tory Taylor leads the Big Ten and ranks eighth in the country averaging 46.1 yards per punt. The freshman has downed half of his 10 punts inside the 20. The other five punts have ended in a fair catch with no return. Only one of Taylor's 10 punts has been returned, and it went for minus-eight yards.
- TE Sam LaPorta leads lowa and all Big Ten tight ends in receptions (11) and receiving yards (117). Only twice since 1992 has a tight end led lowa in season receiving yards. Alan Cross in 1992 (55-640) and T.J. Hockenson in 2018 (49-760).
- RB Tyler Goodson has started the last six games at running back. He has scored a rushing touchdown in five of those six games. Goodson leads lowa in rushing attempts (29) and rushing yards (120), and is tied for third on the team with seven receptions.
- K Keith Duncan is Iowa's all-time career leader in field goal percentage (85.7). He has made 42-of-49 career field goal attempts. He is 20-of-20 in his career inside 30 yards, and has made 40 consecutive PATs and nine consecutive field goals.
- QB Spencer Petras has 481 yards passing through two games, the most by an Iowa quarterback since Jake Rudock passed for 572 yards in the opening two games of 2014.
- Three Hawkeyes in three different levels of the defense are tied for the team lead with 18 tackles. FS Jack Koerner, LB Nick Niemann, and DL Daviyon Nixon are tied for the team lead and rank sixth in the Big Ten in tackles.
- lowa is the fifth youngest team in the country with 71.5 percent of its roster made up of true freshmen (31), redshirt freshmen (30) and sophomores (27). Oregon (73.6), Florida State (72.6), E. Carolina (72.2) and Stanford (71.6) make up the top four.
- lowa has 56 interceptions since 2017, tied for fourth in the country over the last three-plus years (Alabama, Appalachian State, Louisiana Tech all have 57). The Hawkeyes intercepted two passes in the season opener and one in Week 2.

WARMING UP THE ARM

QB Spencer Petras has 481 yards passing through two games, the most by an Iowa quarterback since Jake Rudock passed for 572 yards in the opening two games of 2014. Petras threw for 265 yards Week 1, the most by a Hawkeye quarterback making his first career start since Jon Beutjer in 2000 (380 yards). Petras was the fifth Hawkeye quarterback under Ferentz to make his first career start on opening day. He led the Iowa offense to 460 total yards, its highest total in a Big Ten game since 2018 against Indiana (479).

Petras threw 50 times Week 2 in his Kinnick Stadium debut. The last Iowa quarterback to throw the ball 50 or more times in a game was Jack Rudock, who attempted 56 passes against Maryland in 2014.

Petras has 89 pass attempts through two weeks, the most by any Big Ten quarterback. He entered the season with 11 career pass attempts.

Petras connected with WR Brandon Smith for his first career touchdown, a 7-yards completion Week 2 against Northwestern.

NEW DRIVER, EXPERIENCED WHEELS

lowa returns its top seven pass catchers from 2019, including wide receivers Nico Ragaini, Brandon Smith, Ihmir Smith-Marsette, and Tyrone Tracy; running backs Tyler Goodson and Mekhi Sargent; and tight end Sam LaPorta. The group combined for 216 receptions, 2,681 yards, and 15 touchdowns. Those numbers include 89 percent of last year's total receptions, 90 percent of last year's receiving yards, and 94 percent of last year's receiving touchdowns.

That group accounts for 43 of lowa's 48 receptions, and 458 of lowa's 481 receiving yards.

LAPORTA LEADS ALL PASS CATCHERS

TE Sam LaPorta leads Iowa and all Big Ten tight ends in receptions (11) and receiving yards (117). Only two times since 1992 has a tight end led Iowa in season receiving yards. Alan Cross in 1992 (55-640) and T.J. Hockenson in 2018 (49-760).

lowa wide receivers account for one-half of the team's 48 receptions. WR Nico Ragaini, WR Brandon Smith, WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette and WR Tyrone Tracy combine for 24 receptions and 266 receiving yards. Smith has the Hawkeyes' lone touchdown reception.

THAT'S NOT A PUNT, THIS IS A PUNT

Melbourne, Australia, native Tory Taylor leads the Big Ten and ranks eighth in the country averaging 46.1 yards per punt. The freshman has downed half of his 10 punts inside the 20. The other five punts have ended in a fair catch with no return. Only one of Taylor's 10 punts has been returned, and it went for minus-eight yards.

GOODSON LEADS GROUND GAME

RB Tyler Goodson has started the last six games at running back. He has scored a rushing touchdown in five of those six games. Goodson leads Iowa in rushing attempts (29) and rushing yards (120), and is tied for third on the team with seven receptions.

Goodson started the final four games of 2020 and became the first true freshman in program history to lead the team in single-season rushing yards (638). The last redshirt freshman to lead Iowa in single-season rushing yards was Ladell Betts in 1998 (679 yards). Goodson led the team with five rushing touchdowns, and had 24 receptions for 166 yards. His 158 combined touches led the team.

In Iowa's 23-19 win against #7 Minnesota in 2019, Goodson became the first true freshman to start at running back under Ferentz since 2012 (Greg Garmon).

HAWKEYE HISTORY

lowa has played 1,261 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 660-562-39 (.539). That includes a 411-223-16 (.645) record in home games, a 248-339-23 (.425) record in games away from Iowa City, a 335-383-25 (.468) mark in Big Ten games and a 295-188-15 (.609) record in Kinnick Stadium.



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 22nd season as head coach at lowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015).
 Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is tied for fourth all-time with 162 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He has 97 Big Ten wins, which ranks fourth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- lowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- lowa has played in 11 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 153-85 (.643) overall mark and an 93-63 (.596)
 Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 14 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At lowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 162-106 (.604) and a 97-77 (.557) mark in Big Ten games. He is lowa's all-time winningest football coach with 162 wins. In 25 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 174-127 (.578).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college.
 Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013.
 Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ AMONG BIG TEN'S BEST

Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 97 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach, the fourth most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history.

Ferentz's 162 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference tie Joe Paterno for fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five includes Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Joe Paterno (162), and Ferentz (162).

Ferentz (162-103) became lowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as lowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached lowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 22nd season in 2020.

Both Ferentz (162, 97) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top five in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only lowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

lowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 22nd season as lowa's head football coach in 2020. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named lowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) has been at his current school for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker enters his 22nd season on Iowa's staff, his ninth as defensive coordinator. He is the longest tenured defensive coordinator in FBS.

Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), enters his eighth season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

THE SERIES

lowa holds a 23-22-2 advantage in the series that began with a 21-7 Michigan State win in 1953. That first meeting, played in lowa City on Sept. 26, 1953, marked MSU's first game as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The Spartans are making their first appearance at Kinnick Stadium in seven years.

Kirk Ferentz recorded his first Big Ten win as Iowa's head coach when the Hawkeyes topped Michigan State (21-16) in Iowa City, in 2000. The teams have played two overtime contests, with Iowa winning both in double overtime (34-27 in 2007 and 19-16 in 2012). Michigan State has won the last three meetings, including a 16-13 win at the 2015 Big Ten Championship game. Iowa is 13-10-1 at home against the Spartans.

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

Iowa has posted a 9-8 bowl record under head coach Kirk Ferentz, and has won its last three bowl games, tying its longest such streak in program history. Ferentz's nine bowl wins tie Barry Alvarez for second in Big Ten history (Joe Paterno, 10).

The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 18 times in the last 19 seasons.

Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (10) has more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than Iowa. The following is the record for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

RETURN TO SENDER

Senior WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette is the top kickoff returner in Big Ten history. Smith-Marsette averages 29.4 yards on 49 career kickoff returns, the best in school and Big Ten history. Smith-Marsette has 1,442 kickoff return yards, fifth all-time in program history (Douthitt 1,762; Johnson-Koulianos 1,575; Hill 1,509; King 1,458).

Smith-Marsette has 1,354 career receiving yards, 28th all-time in program history. He has 3,016 all-purpose yards, 16th all-time.

In 2019, Smith-Marsette became the first player in school history to return two kickoffs for a touchdown in the same season. He did it in consecutive games to end the season. He had a 95-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against Nebraska, tying for the 10th longest in school history, and a 98-yard return against USC at the Holiday Bowl, the seventh longest in school history, an lowa bowl record, and tying a Holiday Bowl record.

Smith-Marsette had a team-high 10 touchdowns in 2019; five receiving, three rushing, and two kickoff returns.

Smith-Marsette scored three touchdowns at the 2019 Holiday Bowl (all in the first half), tying Shonn Greene's Iowa bowl record. He is the second Hawkeye in program history to score a touchdown via rush, reception, and kickoff return, in a single game (George Rice, vs. Purdue in 1951). He is the first college player since 1998 (Deuce McAllister, Independence Bowl) to score a touchdown via rush, reception, kickoff return in a bowl game.

IN THE RANKINGS

lowa finished the 2019 season ranked No. 15 in both the AP poll and the coaches poll. It marked the 25th time in program history that lowa finished the season ranked in the top 25. lowa has finished ranked 15th or better in the AP poll six times in 21 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

TROPHY COLLECTION

The Hawkeyes have three trophy games on the 2020 schedule, including Nov. 13 at Minnesota, Nov. 27 vs. Nebraska, and Dec. 12 vs. Wisconsin. Iowa will not get a chance to defend the Cy-Hawk Trophy due to the Big Ten's decision to play a conference-only schedule.

The Hawkeyes were 4-1 in trophy games in 2019, including 3-1 in rivalry games and 1-0 in the postseason. Iowa defended the Cy-Hawk Trophy at Iowa State, the Floyd of Rosedale trophy against #7 Minnesota, and the Heroes Trophy at Nebraska. The Hawkeyes fell at #16 Wisconsin in a battle for the Heartland Trophy.

The Hawkeyes are 16-4 in their last 20 rivalry trophy games (lowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin), with all four losses coming to Wisconsin, and have won three straight bowl games.

DUNCAN GETTING HIS KICKS

Senior K Keith Duncan is Iowa's all-time career leader in field goal percentage (85.7). He has made 42-of-49 career field goal attempts. He is 20-of-20 in his career inside 30 yards, and has made 40 consecutive PATs and nine consecutive field goals.

Duncan led the country with a Big Ten single-season record 29 field goals made in 2019, and was a consensus first-team All-American, the 26th in program history. Duncan was named the Bakken-Anderson Kicker of the Year in the Big Ten Conference in 2019, and was one of three finalists for the Lou Groza Award.

Duncan has two game-winning field goals in his career. He kicked a 33-yard field goal as time expired to defeat No. 2 Michigan, 14-13, at home in 2016. He connected on a 48-yard attempt to give lowa a 27-24 lead with one second left at Nebraska in 2019.

NIXON EMERGES AS BIG TEN'S BEST

Junior DT Daviyon Nixon leads the country in tackles-for-loss per game with 2.75. Nixon has 5.5 tackles for loss, the most in the Big Ten. He has 18 tackles, tied for the most on the team and more than any other Big Ten defensive linemen.

Nixon set career highs in tackles in Week 1 and Week 2. He registered seven stops in the season opener at Purdue, and bested that with 11 tackles in the home opener against Northwestern.

Nixon had one career start and 13 games played entering 2020. His career totals included 36 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss, and three sacks. He is one of three new starters on lowa's defensive line. Senior Chauncey Golston is the lone returning frontline starter on a defense that ranked in the top 20 in scoring, rushing, passing, and total defense in 2019. Iowa was fifth in the country in scoring defense (14.0 ppg), 12th in total defense (308.2 ypg), 14th in rushing defense (112.5), and 19th in passing defense (195.7 ypg). The Hawkeyes held seven-of-13 opponents to their season-low point total. Golston is the lone returner among the front four. He led the Big Ten and ranked sixth in the nation with three fumble recoveries last season.

lowa ranks third in the Big Ten in rush defense (123.5), total defense (329.5), and sacks (5.0). The Hawkeyes are ranked second in yard per carry allowed (2.8).

In 2019, lowa's scoring defense (14.0) was the second lowest total of the Ferentz era (13.0 in 2008). The Hawkeyes allowed just 16.6 first downs per game, 12th fewest in the country and third in the Big Ten, and just 21 touchdowns, third fewest in the country (San Diego State 19, Georgia 20).

3 LEVELS OF THE POWER TRIO

Three Hawkeyes in three different levels of the defense are tied for the team lead with 18 tackles apiece. FS Jack Koerner, LB Nick Niemann, and DL Daviyon Nixon are tied for the team lead and rank sixth in the Big Ten in tackles.

Koerner matched his career high with 13 tackles in the season opener. Nixon set career mark in both Week 1 and Week 2, with seven and 11 tackles each week, respectively. Niemann had eight tackles in Week 1, and matched his career high with 10 tackles Week 2.

BENSON SHINES IN FIRST CAREER START

Sophomore LB Seth Benson recorded a career-high 13 tackles in his first career start Week 2 against Northwestern. It was Benson's first appearance of the season. He missed the opener with an injury.

Benson appeared in all 13 games as a redshirt freshman in 2019, and saw limited action in three games as a true freshman in 2018. He entered his first career start with 11 career tackles

Benson is the second Hawkeye in as many weeks to have 13 tackles. FS Jack Koerner led lowa with 13 stops Week 1.

GOING THE OTHER WAY

lowa has 56 interceptions since 2017, tied for fourth in the country over the last three-plus years (Alabama, Appalachian State, Louisiana Tech all have 57).

The Hawkeyes intercepted two passes in the season opener and one in Week 2. LB Barrington Wade recorded the first of his career, and CB Matt Hankins recorded his third. FS Jack Koerner had an interception Week 2, the second of his career.

lowa intercepted at least one pass in the final seven games of the 2019 season, including a 25-yard interception return for a touchdown by LB Ben Niemann at the 2019 Holiday Bowl. Niemann's interception was the first of his career, lowa's final score of the season, and extended the Hawkeyes' streak with a pick-six to 12 consecutive seasons. lowa has had at least one interception returned for a touchdown in 17 of the last 19 seasons.

The Iowa secondary returns two starters from 2019 in cornerback Matt Hankins and safety Jack Koerner. In addition, Dane Belton started four games at the "cash" position last year as a true freshman. He has split time between "cash" and safety to start the season.

REINVENTING THE STADIUM WAVE

In a tradition that started at the 2017 season opener, players, coaches, and fans inside Kinnick Stadium exchange waves at the end of the first quarter with patients and families inside the UI Stead Family Children's Hospital. The tradition continues in 2020, with limited fans inside Kinnick Stadium.

The UI Stead Family Children's Hospital opened in 2017. It is connected to the south end of the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics and overlooks Kinnick Stadium from the southeast grandstands. During Iowa football home games, patients and their families can watch the game from the top floor (Level 12), one of the highest vantage points in Iowa City.

The University of Iowa football program received the prestigious 2017 Disney Sports Spirit Award after launching the heart-warming tradition that touched the lives of scores of young patients at the University's Stead Family Children's Hospital.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

The Big Ten Conference announced Oct. 12 that Iowa will play two Friday games in 2020. The Hawkeyes defend Floyd of Rosedale under the lights at Minnesota on Nov. 13 at 6 p.m. (CT). Iowa defends the Heroes Trophy two weeks later on Nov. 27, hosting Nebraska at Kinnick Stadium. That kickoff time has not yet been announced.

BLACK FRIDAY

lowa and Nebraska will meet on Black Friday, the day after Thanksgiving, for the 10th consecutive season. The schools have played on Black Friday every year since Nebraska joined the Big Ten Conference in 2011. That streak was originally scheduled to end 2020. The Big Ten Conference announced in 2017 that the teams will move off of their Black Friday date in 2020 and 2021. The 2020 schedule was twice altered due to the COVID 19 pandemic. Iowa is scheduled to close the 2021 season against Wisconsin, while Nebraska will close the regular season against Minnesota.

IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program's Leadership Group included 22 student-athletes -- nine seniors, two juniors, seven sophomores, and four redshirt freshmen. The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies and being involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected following coaching staff and player input.

The group consists of seniors Cole Banwart, Keith Duncan, Chauncey Golston, Matt Hankins, Alaric Jackson, Nick Niemann, Mekhi Sargent, Austin Schulte and Brandon Smith; juniors, Ivory Kelly-Martin and Jack Koerner; sophomores Dane Belton, Seth Benson, Julius Brents, Jack Campbell, Tyler Linderbaum, Spencer Petras, and Tyrone Tracy, Jr.; and redshirt freshmen Jermari Harris, Desmond Hutson, Logan Lee, and Alex Padilla.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.
- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 18 of the last 19 seasons. Iowa is 9-8 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (10) has more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 17-15-1 in 33 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took
 over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record
 of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (162-106) replaced Fry and is in his 22nd season
 in 2020. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 334 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 10 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
 They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press
 National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding
 (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene
 (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman),
 Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson
 (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Three former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2019. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, enters his ninth year on staff, his fourth as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, enters his 13th year on the lowa staff. Woods was named Special Teams Coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the lowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13. He was named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016, and was named defensive line coach in 2019.

HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

Iowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers.

Since 2010, 42 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft.

Today, 29 Hawkeyes are on NFL active rosters and five on practice teams.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 188 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (75 draft picks/113 free agents).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (43 consecutive years).
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 19 years, 155-of-180 (88 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 13 years, Iowa has had 49 NFL Draft picks, tied for third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (73), Michigan (55), Wisconsin (49).
- lowa has had seven first round picks in the last 10 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020.
- lowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former lowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his seventh year on staff and first as lowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz, WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.

IOWA NOTES

QB Spencer Petras finished the game with 265 yards passing, the most by a Hawkeye quarterback in his first career start since Jon Beutjer in 2000 (380). Petras started the game 1-for-6 with three passing yards, and finished the first half completing 13 of his 15 throws for 171 yards. He was 14-of-21 in the first half for 174 yards passing. He added one rushing touchdown.

QB Spencer Petras is the fifth Hawkeye quarterback in the Ferentz era to make his first career start on opening day (Petras, Stanley, Rudock, Tate, Chandler).

QB Spencer Petras scored Iowa's first touchdown of the season, a 1-yard touchdown rush. It is his second career rushing touchdown.

TE Sam LaPorta led Iowa with a career-high 71 receiving yards.

RB Tyler Goodson tied his career-high with five receptions. His 40-yard reception was a career long.

FS Jack Koerner led Iowa with 13 tackles, tying a career high. DB Riley Moss added a career high seven tackles. DT Daviyon Nixon (7) and CB Julius Brents (4) also tied their career best in tackles.

LB Barrington Wade had a career-high five tackles and added his first career sack (9 yards) and interception (9 yards).

Iowa had 460 yards total offense, its highest total in a Big Ten game since 2018 against Indiana (479).

Purdue scored first, marking the first time since Nov. 9, 2019 (vs. Wisconsin) that Iowa trailed in a game. The Hawkeyes ended 2019 on a four-game winning streak and did not trail in any of those four games.

Iowa won the toss and elected to receive. The Hawkeyes have played 267 games under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa has opened the game on offense 201 times (126-75). The Hawkeyes have opened the game on defense 66 times (36-30).

The Hawkeyes host Northwestern on Oct. 31 at Kinnick Stadium. Kickoff is at 2:30 p.m. (CT). The game is televised on ESPN.

IOWA NOTES

DT Daviyon Nixon set career highs with 11 tackles and 3.0 tackles for loss. He set a then-career high with 7 tackles Week 1. Through two games, he has 18 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss, and 2.0 sacks.

WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette set a career high with seven receptions. He had 84 yards receiving to move past Bill Schultz and Dallas Clark in career receiving yards (1,354).

QB Spencer Petras threw his first career touchdown, a 7-yard toss to WR Brandon Smith in the first quarter. Petras completed 26 passes on 50 attempts. No Hawkeye since at least 1982 completed more passes or had more attempts in their Kinnick Stadium debut. The 50 attempts are the most by a Hawkeye quarterback since Jake Rudock threw 56 times against Maryland in 2014. The 26 attempts are the most by a Hawkeye quarterback since Nate Stanley completed 27 passes against Northwestern in 2018.

K Keith Duncan scored eight points today to move past Mark Weisman for 11th all-time in career scoring (200). He connect on field goals of 22 and 47 yards, and has made nine consecutive field goal attempts.

LB Seth Benson had a game and career-high 13 tackles in his first career start. Rily Moss (9) and Zach VanValkenburg (7) also had career highs in tackles.

FS Jack Koerner intercepted a pass in the fourth quarter, his first of the season and second of his career.

TE Sam LaPorta matched his career high with six receptions.

The Hawkeyes' last eight losses have been one-possession games. Those eight losses have been by a combined 30 points.

Iowa had won five straight games when recovering at least two opponent fumbles. Its last loss with two fumble recoveries was against Nebraska in 2012 (L, 13-7).

Iowa won the toss and deferred. The Hawkeyes have played 268 games under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa has opened the game on offense 201 times (126-75). The Hawkeyes have opened the game on defense 67 times (36-31).
