



Petras threw for 481 yards in Weeks 1-2, the most by an Iowa guarterback since Jake Rudock passed for 572 yards in the first two games of 2014. His 265 passing yards Week 1 were the most by a Hawkeye quarterback making his first career start since Jon Beutjer in 2000 (380 yards). Petras was the fifth Hawkeye guarterback under Ferentz to make his first career start on opening day. He led the Iowa offense to 460 total yards, its highest total in a Big Ten game since 2018 against Indiana (479).

Petras threw 50 times Week 2 in his Kinnick Stadium debut. The last lowa quarterback to throw the ball 50 or more times in a game was Jake Rudock, who attempted 56 passes against Maryland in 2014.

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 22nd season as head coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 167 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He has 102 Big Ten wins, which ranks fourth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 11 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 158-85 (.650) overall mark and an 98-63 (.609) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 14 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 167-106 (.611) and a 102-77 (.570) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 167 wins. In 25 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 179-127 (.585).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ AMONG BIG TEN'S BEST

Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 102 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach, the fourth most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history. The Hawkeyes defeated Penn State, 41-21, on Nov. 21, 2020, to earn Ferentz's 100th conference win.

Ferentz's 167 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five includes Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Ferentz (167) and Joe Paterno (162).

Ferentz (167-106) became Iowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 22nd season in 2020.

Both Ferentz (167,102) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top five in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

Iowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 22nd season as Iowa's head football coach in 2020. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) has been at his current school for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker is in his 22nd season on Iowa's staff, his ninth as defensive coordinator. He is the longest tenured defensive coordinator in FBS.

Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his eighth season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

HAWK TALK WITH KIRK FERENTZ

Head Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week during the regular season. This year's show is held virtually and streamed live from 6:30-8 p.m. (CT) on the Hawkeye Radio Network, KCRG 9.2 and the Hawkeye Radio Network YouTube channel.

WINNING ON THE ROAD

With a three-game road winning streak, lowa has won three straight Big Ten road games in a single season for the first time since 2016 (at Rutgers, at Minnesota, at Purdue). Iowa will post a .500 or above road record for all games played for the eighth straight season.

THE LAST MEETING -- TYRONE TRACY (Nov. 9, 2019 at Wisconsin)

WR Tyrone Tracy's 75-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter was Iowa's longest play from scrimmage of the season, and the longest reception of Tracy's career.

Tracy recorded a career-high 130 receiving yards, the most receiving yards by a Hawkeye since Jake Duzey had 138 yards against Ohio State in 2013, and the most receiving yards by a Hawkeye wide receiver since Marvin McNutt had 130 receiving yards against Michigan State in 2011.

THE LAST MEETING -- GAME OF FIRSTS (Nov. 9, 2019 at Wisconsin)

Freshman TE Sam LaPorta became the first true freshman in the Ferentz era to start at tight end, and LB Jack Campbell became the fourth true freshman in the Ferentz era to start at linebacker (James Morris, 2010; A.J. Edds, 2006; Fred Barr, 1999).

LB Barrington Wade made his first career start.

CB Matt Hankins' interception in the fourth quarter was the first of his career. Hankins had a game-high eight tackles.

WR Nico Ragaini caught a 3-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter, the first touchdown of his career.

RETURN TO SENDER

Iowa has two of the country's top returners. Junior Charlie Jones leads the Big Ten and ranks ninth in the country averaging 11.8 yards per punt return. He has one punt return for a touchdown (54 yards vs. Michigan State). Senior WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette averages 21.0 yards per kickoff return in 2020, No. 3 in the Big Ten.

Smith-Marsette ranks No. 2 in Big Ten history in kickoff return average. Smith-Marsette averages 28.7 yards on 52 career kickoff returns. Smith-Marsette has 1,491 kickoff return yards, fourth all-time in program history (Douthitt 1,762; Johnson-Koulianos 1,575; Hill 1,509).

Smith-Marsette has 1,475 career receiving yards, 22nd all-time in program history. He has 3,242 all-purpose yards, 14th all-time.

In 2019, Smith-Marsette became the first player in school history to return two kickoffs for a touchdown in the same season. He did it in consecutive games to end the season. He had a 95-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against Nebraska, tying for the 10th longest in school history, and a 98-yard return against USC at the Holiday Bowl, the seventh longest in school history, an Iowa bowl record, and tying a Holiday Bowl record.

Smith-Marsette had a team-high 10 touchdowns in 2019; five receiving, three rushing, and two kickoff returns.

Smith-Marsette scored three touchdowns at the 2019 Holiday Bowl (all in the first half), tying Shonn Greene's lowa bowl record. He is the second Hawkeye in program history to score a touchdown via rush, reception, and kickoff return, in a single game (George Rice, vs. Purdue in 1951). He is the first college player since 1998 (Deuce McAllister, Independence Bowl) to score a touchdown via rush, reception, kickoff return in a bowl game.

IN THE RANKINGS

Iowa finished the 2019 season ranked No. 15 in both the AP poll and the coaches poll. It marked the 25th time in program history that lowa finished the season ranked in the top 25. Iowa has finished ranked 15th or better in the AP poll six times in 21 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

Iowa's 2020 schedule includes two opponents ranked in the AP top 25 (#15 Northwestern, #25 Wisconsin). These are lowa's most recent wins versus nationally-ranked opponents:

DUNCAN GETTING HIS KICKS

Senior K Keith Duncan is Iowa's all-time career leader in field goal percentage (82.0). He has made 50-of-61 career field goal attempts. His 50 career field goals made rank fifth in program history. He is 20-of-20 in his career inside 30 yards, has 19 field goals made of 40 or more yards (tying Nate Kaeding for most in program history) and has made 60 consecutive PATs.

Duncan is 12-of-16 on field goal attempts this season. He kicked four field goals, including two in the fourth quarter against Nebraska. He first fourth-quarter field goal against the Huskers (48 yards) broke a 20-20 tie, and helped him earn Big Ten co-Player of the Week honors. Duncan has 244 career points, sixth most in program history.

Duncan led the country with a Big Ten single-season record 29 field goals made in 2019, and was a consensus first-team All-American, the 26th in program history. Duncan was named the Bakken-Anderson Kicker of the Year in the Big Ten Conference in 2019, and was one of three finalists for the Lou Groza Award.

Duncan has two game-winning field goals in his career. He kicked a 33-yard field goal as time expired to defeat No. 2 Michigan, 14-13, at home in 2016. He connected on a 48-yard attempt to give Iowa a 27-24 lead with one second left at Nebraska in 2019.

D-LINE EMERGES AMONG BIG TEN'S BEST

Iowa has played 21 straight games without surrendering 25 points, the longest streak in the nation among Power 5 teams.

Junior DT Daviyon Nixon leads an Iowa defensive front that ranks second in the Big Ten in sacks (20.0) and tackles for loss (46.0). Nixon leads the Big Ten with 5.5 sacks and 13.0 tackles for loss. DE Zach VanValkenburg ranks third with 8.5 tackles for loss, and DE Chauncey Golston ranks seventh with 7.5 tackles for loss. Golston's 4.5 sacks rank fourth in the conference.

Iowa ranks No. 3 in the conference in scoring defense (17.3), rush defense (115.0) and total defense (326.4). The Hawkeyes are ranked fourth in pass defense (211.4)

Nixon has two games this season (Northwestern, Nebraska) with three tackles for loss. He set career highs in tackles in Week 1 and Week 2, registering seven stops in the season opener at Purdue, and besting that with 11 tackles in the home opener against Northwestern. He recorded his first career interception Week 5 at Penn State, returning in 71 yards for a touchdown. It was his first touchdown scored at any level in his playing career. The 71-yard return ties for the 14th longest interception return in program history.

VanValkenburg had a career-high three sacks Week 4 at Minnesota, the most by a Hawkeye since A.J. Epenesa had 4.5 against Nebraska in 2019. He has four fumble recoveries this season, tied for the most in the country. His 3.5 sacks tie for eighth in the Big Ten.

Golston has 4.5 sacks, fourth in the Big Ten. He is the lone returning frontline starter on a defense that ranked in the top 20 in scoring, rushing, passing, and total defense in 2019. He intercepted a pass at Penn State, his third career interception, and forced a fumble on Nebraska's final play to help lowa defeat the Huskers, 26-20. The forced fumble was the first of his career.

LAPORTA LEADS ALL PASS CATCHERS

TE Sam LaPorta leads Iowa in receptions (26) and receiving yards (260). Only two times since 1992 has a tight end led Iowa in season receiving yards. Alan Cross in 1992 (55-640) and T.J. Hockenson in 2018 (49-760).

Iowa wide receivers account for 69 of the team's 127 receptions (54.3 percent). WR Nico Ragaini, WR Brandon Smith, WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette and WR Tyrone Tracy combine for 69 receptions and 749 receiving yards. The receivers have five of Iowa's seven touchdown receptions (Smith 7 yards, 14 yards; Smith-Marsette 8, 4; Tracy 6), and two of Iowa's rushing touchdowns (Ragaini 1; Smith Marsette 13).

THAT'S NOT A PUNT, THIS IS A PUNT

Melbourne, Australia, native Tory Taylor ranks third in the Big Ten and 18th in the country averaging 44.6 yards per punt. The freshman has downed 17 of his 32 punts inside the 20. He has nine punts of 50-plus yards, with a career-high 61 yard punt Week 3 vs. Michigan State. Only six of Taylor's 32 punts have been returned (31 yards). Iowa is fifth nationally and No. 1 in the Big Ten in net punting (43.7).

Taylor is one of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award.

GOODSON LEADS GROUND GAME

RB Tyler Goodson leads the Hawkeyes and ranks third in the Big Ten with 656 rushing yards. Goodson has started the last 11 games at running back and has 10 rushing touchdowns during that stretch. He has 1,294 career rushing yards.

Goodson has three 100-yard rushing games this season. He rushed for 113 yards against Michigan State and a career-high 142 yards against Minnesota. He set a career high with 30 carries against Nebraska, rushing for 111 yards. Goodson leads lowa in rushing attempts (132) and rushing yards (656). He has six rushing touchdowns (15, 3, 9, 7, 1, 10).

Goodson has two multi-touchdown games this season. He had two rushing touchdowns (3, 9) Week 3 vs. Michigan State, and two more Week 4 at Minnesota (7, 1).

lowa is tied for first in the Big Ten with 17 rushing touchdowns: RB Mekhi Sargent (7), Goodson (6), QB Spencer Petras (2), WR Nico Ragaini (1), Ihmir Smith-Marsette (1). The Hawkeyes have scored 71 percent of their offensive touchdowns on the ground (17 rushing, 7 passing, 2 interception return, 1 punt return).

Goodson started the final four games of 2020 and became the first true freshman in program history to lead the team in single-season rushing yards (638). The last redshirt freshman to lead lowa in single-season rushing yards was Ladell Betts in 1998 (679 yards). Goodson led the team with five rushing touchdowns (1, 10, 2, 55, 1), and had 24 receptions for 166 yards. His 158 combined touches led the team.

In Iowa's 23-19 win against No. 7 Minnesota in 2019, Goodson became the first true freshman to start at running back under Ferentz since 2012 (Greg Garmon).

BIG NIEMANN ON CAMPUS

Senior LB Nick Niemann leads the Hawkeyes and ranks second in the Big Ten with 69 tackles. He entered the season with 80 career tackles, including a season-high 43 as a sophomore in 2018. He recorded a career-best 17 tackles Week 5 at Penn State, the most by a Hawkeye since LB Anthony Hitchens made 19 stops against Iowa State in 2012. Niemann is the third Hawkeye this season to register 13 or more tackles in a single game (FS Jack Koerner 13 vs. Purdue; LB Seth Benson 13 vs. Northwestern).

BENSON STARTS AND FINISHES

Sophomore LB Seth Benson made his first five career starts Weeks 2-7. He was lowa's leading tackler in weeks 2-3 and tied for the team lead in Week 4. He recorded a career-high 13 tackles in his first career start Week 2 against Northwestern. It was Benson's first appearance of the season after missing the opener with an injury. He had a team-high eight tackles Week 3 vs. Michigan State, and tied for the team lead with seven stops at Minnesota. His 43 tackles rank second on the team. Benson appeared in all 13 games as a redshirt freshman in 2019, and saw limited action in three games as a true freshman in 2018. He entered his first career start with 11 career tackles.

GOING THE OTHER WAY

The Hawkeyes rank third in the Big Ten with 10 interceptions (Indiana 17; Northwestern 12). Iowa has 63 interceptions since 2017, the most by any team in the country.

The Hawkeyes had at least one interception in 12 straight games before not collecting an interception Week 6 vs. Nebraska. They had 18 total interceptions during that stretch. Iowa intercepted two passes in the season opener, one in Week 2, three in Week 3, two in Week 4, and two in Week 5. The last time Iowa had a stretch of at least 12 games with an interception was 2008, when the Hawkeyes intercepted a pass in each of the 13 games.

FS Jack Koerner is tied for fifth in the Big Ten with three interceptions. LB Barrington Wade and DB Riley Moss each have two interceptions. DE Chauncey Golston, DB Matt Hankins and DL Daviyon Nixon each have one.

Moss returned his interception 54 yards Week 3 against Michigan State to extend the Hawkeyes' streak of consecutive seasons with a pick-six to 13. Iowa has had at least one interception returned for a touchdown in 18 of the last 20 seasons. Nixon returned his interception 71 yards for a pick six Week 5, the 14th longest interception return in program history.

REINVENTING THE STADIUM WAVE

In a tradition that started at the 2017 season opener, players, coaches, and fans inside Kinnick Stadium exchange waves at the end of the first quarter with patients and families inside the UI Stead Family Children's Hospital. The tradition continues in 2020, with limited fans inside Kinnick Stadium.

The UI Stead Family Children's Hospital opened in 2017. It is connected to the south end of the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics and overlooks Kinnick Stadium from the southeast grandstands. During Iowa football home games, patients and their families can watch the game from the top floor (Level 12), one of the highest vantage points in Iowa City. Due to the COVID pandemic, patients and their families must stay in their rooms and wave in 2020.

The University of Iowa football program received the prestigious 2017 Disney Sports Spirit Award after launching the heart-warming tradition that touched the lives of scores of young patients at the University's Stead Family Children's Hospital.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.
- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 18 of the last 19 seasons. Iowa is 9-8 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (10) has more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 17-15-1 in 33 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (164-106) replaced Fry and is in his 22nd season in 2020. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 335 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 10 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country. The Hawkeyes were named to the Joe Moore Award midseason honor roll in 2020.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 188 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (75 draft picks/113 free agents).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (43 consecutive years).
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 19 years, 155-of-180 (88 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 13 years, Iowa has had 49 NFL Draft picks, tied for third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (73), Michigan (55), Wisconsin (49).
- Iowa has had seven first round picks in the last 10 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.

- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his seventh year on staff and first as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz, WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.
- Entering the 2020 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (15) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 17 lowa tight ends since 1999 (11 drafted/6 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.





IOWA NOTES

QB Spencer Petras finished the game with 265 yards passing, the most by a Hawkeye quarterback in his first career start since Jon Beutjer in 2000 (380). Petras started the game 1-for-6 with three passing yards, and finished the first half completing 13 of his 15 throws for 171 yards. He was 14-of-21 in the first half for 174 yards passing. He added one rushing touchdown.

QB Spencer Petras is the fifth Hawkeye quarterback in the Ferentz era to make his first career start on opening day (Petras, Stanley, Rudock, Tate, Chandler).

QB Spencer Petras scored Iowa's first touchdown of the season, a 1-yard touchdown rush. It is his second career rushing touchdown.

TE Sam LaPorta led Iowa with a career-high 71 receiving yards.

RB Tyler Goodson tied his career-high with five receptions. His 40yard reception was a career long.

FS Jack Koerner led Iowa with 13 tackles, tying a career high. DB Riley Moss added a career high seven tackles. DT Daviyon Nixon (7) and CB Julius Brents (4) also tied their career best in tackles.

LB Barrington Wade had a career-high five tackles and added his first career sack (9 yards) and interception (9 yards).

Iowa had 460 yards total offense, its highest total in a Big Ten game since 2018 against Indiana (479).

Purdue scored first, marking the first time since Nov. 9, 2019 (vs. Wisconsin) that lowa trailed in a game. The Hawkeyes ended 2019 on a four-game winning streak and did not trail in any of those four games.

lowa won the toss and elected to receive. The Hawkeyes have played 267 games under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa has opened the game on offense 201 times (126-75). The Hawkeyes have opened the game on defense 66 times (36-30).

The Hawkeyes host Northwestern on Oct. 31 at Kinnick Stadium. Kickoff is at 2:30 p.m. (CT). The game is televised on ESPN.

QB Spencer Petras threw his first career touchdown, a 7-yard toss to WR Brandon Smith in the first quarter. Petras completed 26 passes on 50 attempts. No Hawkeye since at least 1982 completed more passes or had more attempts in their Kinnick Stadium debut. The 50 attempts are the most by a Hawkeye quarterback since Jake Rudock threw 56 times against Maryland in 2014. Kirk Ferentz won his 163rd game as a member of the Big Ten Conference, passing Joe Paterno for fourth all-time in league history. Ferentz is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five includes Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Kirk Ferentz (163) and Joe Paterno (162).

RB Tyler Goodson rushed for 113 yards. His 71-yard rush in the third quarter is a career long and pushed him over the 100 yard mark, his second career 100-yard rushing game. had two rushing touchdowns today (3, 9). It is his first career multi-touchdown game. Goodson has started the last seven games at running back. He has seven rushing touchdowns over the last seven games.

DB Riley Moss's 54-yard interception return for a touchdown was lowa's first interception return for a touchdown since the 2019 Holiday Bowl (Nick Niemann). Iowa has at least one pick-six in 13 consecutive seasons, and at least one interception returned for a touchdown in 18 of the last 20 seasons.

WR Charlie Jones returned a punt 54 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. It is his first career punt return for a touchdown, and Iowa's first since 2018 (Kyle Groenenweg, 61 yards at Illinois). Jones had a then career-best 31-yard punt return in the second quarter to set up Iowa's third touchdown drive.

WR Charlie Jones had 105 punt return yards on five returns (21.0 avg.). In all of 2019, Iowa returned 15 punts for 121 yards (8.1 avg.).

P Tory Taylor averaged 45.9 yards on seven punts, including a career-long 61 yard punt in the second quarter. He had two punts of 50-plus yards and five punts downed inside the 20. Taylor entered the game leading the Big Ten with 46.1 yards per punt.

Iowa scored 49 points today, the most in series history. It is the third time in the series Iowa top 40 points (44 in 2002, 41 in 1980). The 49 points scored are the most by the Hawkeyes at Kinnick Stadium since defeating Ohio State, 55-24 in 2017,

Iowa had three interceptions (Jack Koerner, Barrington Wade, Riley Moss), its first three-interception game since 2018 at Illinois. Iowa has at least one interception in the last 10 games. Iowa has 14 interceptions over the last 10 games, and 59 interceptions since 2017.

Iowa returned a punt and interception for a touchdown in the same game for the first time since 2014 vs. Nebraska (Lowdermilk 17-yard INT, Drew Ott 12-yard punt).

The Hawkeyes scored a touchdown on offense, defense and special teams for the second time in the last four games (USC at 2019 Holiday Bowl).
