- Iowa won its last six games in 2020, outscoring its opponents 214-83. Iowa averaged 35.7 points per game and allowed 13.8 ppg during the winning streak. Iowa won six straight Big Ten games for the fifth time in the last 30 seasons (2020, 2015, 2008, 2004, 1991). Iowa scored at least 25 points in each of its six wins.
- Iowa has won six straight Big Ten games for the fifth time in the last 30 years (2020, 2015, 2008, 2004, 1991). Iowa won eight straight conference games in 2015 and 2008, and seven straight in 2004 and 1991.
- Iowa and Indiana are meeting as AP ranked opponents for the second time ever and the first time since 1991, when No. 10 Iowa defeated No. 25 Indiana, 38-21, at Kinnick Stadium.
- Iowa's first two opponents are ranked in the AP Top 25 (No. 17 Indiana, No. 7 Iowa State). It marks the fourth time in program history the Hawkeyes have opened a season against consecutive opponents ranked in the AP Top 25 (1960, 1973, 1974). The Hawkeyes started 2-0 in 1960, 1-1 in 1974 and 0-2 in 1973.
- QB Spencer Petras is on the 2021 Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award Watch List. Petras was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection in 2020. He was 92-156 (59.0) with 1,088 passing yards (181.3 ypg) during Iowa's six-game winning streak to end the season. He threw eight touchdowns and two interceptions over the last six games.
- C Tyler Linderbaum has been named a first-team preseason All-American by five publications. Linderbaum was a first-team All-American in 2020 and a Rimington Award finalist. He has made 21 straight starts at center.
- Iowa has played 22 straight games without surrendering 25 points, the longest streak in the nation among Power 5 teams. The Hawkeyes ranked No. 1 in the nation in 2020 in defensive yards per play (4.3). Iowa ranked No. 2 in the conference in total defense (313.8) and scoring defense (16.0), No. 3 in rush defense (107.6) and No. 5 in pass defense (206.1).
- RB Tyler Goodson has been named to the Doak Walker and Maxwell Award Preseason Watch Lists. Goodson led the Hawkeyes and ranked third in the Big Ten with 762 rushing yards in 2020. He was named first-team All-Big Ten by coaches, media and Associated Press.
- The Hawkeyes return all secondary starters on a defense that ranked third in the Big Ten with 11 interceptions in 2020 (Indiana 17; Northwestern 14). Iowa has 64 interceptions since 2017, tied for the most by any team in the country.
- WR Charlie Jones led the Big Ten and ranked 11th in the country averaging 10.5 yards per punt return in 2020. He had one punt return for a touchdown (54 yards vs. Michigan State).

## IOWA NAMES DUKE SLATER FIELD AT KINNICK STADIUM

The University of Iowa Athletics Department announced July 28, 2021, the naming of Duke Slater Field at Kinnick Stadium. A permanent recognition of Slater was installed on the Kinnick playing surface in the summer of 2021.

Slater, a 6-foot-2, 210-pound tackle for the Hawkeyes from 1918-21, was the first Black student-athlete in school history to earn All-America honors. A three-time first-team All-Big Ten selection, Slater competed in football and track and field for the Hawkeyes. Iowa had a 7-0 Big Ten record in 1921 to claim the conference title and was named by more than one media outlet as national champion.

Slater was the first Black player inducted to the National Football Foundation College Hall of Fame in 1951 as a member of the inaugural class. He is also a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame, being elected as a member of the Centennial Class in 2020. Slater was elected to the National Iowa Varsity Club Hall of Fame in the 1989 inaugural class and in 1951 was one of five members named to the inaugural class of the Iowa Sports Hall of Fame. As part of the 100-year celebration of Iowa football in 1989, he was named a member of Iowa's all-time football team.

In four seasons, Slater helped Iowa post a 23-6-1 record. He turned pro in 1922, joining the Milwaukee Badgers. After two games, he signed with the Rock Island Independents, where he played from 1922-25. Slater completed his career with the Chicago Cardinals (1926-31).

Slater starred as a two-way tackle in the NFL for 10 seasons and was the longest tenured Black player during that era. Slater played the full 60 minutes during the historic Thanksgiving Day game in 1929 when Ernie Nevers scored a single-game record 40 points, an NFL record that still stands.

Racial bias presumably kept Slater from being named to the official NFL All-Decade Team of the 1920s. However, he was recognized as an All-Decade player of the 1920s in the book "The Pro Football Chronicle." In total, Slater was named All-BNFL four times (1923, 1925, 1926, 1929), and second-team All-NFL by various outlets in seven of his 10 pro seasons (1923-27, 1929-30).

Slater graduated from law school at Iowa in 1928 and passed the bar that same year while still playing in the NFL. He started a practice in Chicago and became an assistant district attorney and assistant Illinois commerce commissioner. Slater was elected Chicago's second Black judge in 1948, and in 1960 became the first Black judge to serve on the Superior Court of Chicago. He moved to the Circuit Court of Cook County in 1964.

Slater Residence Hall, a dormitory located on the west side of the UI campus, is named after Slater. A relief of Slater throwing a key block in Iowa's 1921 win over Notre Dame is featured outside the north end zone of Kinnick Stadium.

Slater was born Dec. 9, 1898, in Normal, Illinois. He attended high school in Clinton, Iowa, where he earned all-state honors at left tackle. Slater died Aug. 14, 1966, at the age of 67.

## WARMING UP THE ARM

Iowa won its final six games in 2020, outscoring its opponents 214-83. Iowa averaged 35.7 points per game and allowed 13.8 ppg during the winning streak.

QB Spencer Petras, an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection, was 92-156 (59.0) with 1,088 passing yards (181.3 ypg) during Iowa's six-game winning streak. He threw eight touchdowns and two interceptions over the last six games. Petras had 245 pass attempts, third most in the Big Ten. His 1,569 passing yards ranked fifth in the Big Ten.

The Hawkeyes averaged 31.8 points per game in 2020 season, their highest total since 2002 (36.5).

## ABOUT THE SIX-GAME WIN STREAK

Iowa finished the season with six straight Big Ten wins after opening the season with losses at Purdue (24-20) and to Northwestern (21-20).

Iowa won six straight Big Ten games for the fifth time in the last 30 years (2020, 2015, 2008, 2004, 1991). Iowa won eight straight conference games in 2015 and 2008, and seven straight in 2004 and 1991.

Iowa scored at least 25 points in each of its six wins. It is the second time in school history Iowa has scored 25 points or more in six straight wins (2015, seven games).



## HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 23rd season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2025 season.



- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 168 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He has 103 Big Ten wins, which ranks fourth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 11 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 159-85 (.652) overall mark and an 99-63 (.611) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 14 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 168-106 (.613) and a 103-77 (.572) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 168 wins. In 25 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 180-127 (.586).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

### FERENTZ AMONG BIG TEN'S BEST

Moon Family Head Football Coach Kirk Ferentz has 103 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach, the fourth most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history. The Hawkeyes defeated Penn State, 41-21, on Nov. 21, 2020, to earn Ferentz's 100th conference win.

Ferentz's 168 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five include Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Ferentz (168) and Joe Paterno (162).

Ferentz (168-106) became Iowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz completed his 22nd season in 2020.

Both Ferentz (168, 103) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top five in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

Iowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

### FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz enters his 23rd season as Iowa's head football coach in 2021. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) has been at his current school for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker is in his 23rd season on Iowa's staff, his 10th as defensive coordinator. He is the longest tenured defensive coordinator in FBS.

Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his 10th season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

### THAT'S NOT A PUNT, THIS IS A PUNT

Melbourne, Australia, native Tory Taylor was named Eddleman-Fields Big Ten Punter of the Year and first-team All-Big Ten by the coaches, media and Associated Press in 2020. He ranked third in the Big Ten and 19th in the country averaging 44.1 yards per punt. The freshman downed 18 of his 40 punts inside the 20. He had nine punts of 50-plus yards, with a career-high 61 yard punt Week 3 vs. Michigan State. Only six of Taylor's 32 punts were returned (31 yards). Iowa ranked fifth nationally and No. 1 in the Big Ten in net punting (42.9).

Taylor is on the Ray Guy Award Preseason Watch List and is a preseason first-team All-America honoree by The Athletic. He was one of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award and was named a first-team Freshman All-American by the FWAA in 2020.

### GOODSON LEADS GROUND GAME

RB Tyler Goodson led the Hawkeyes and ranked third in the Big Ten with 762 rushing yards in 2020. Goodson had seven rushing touchdowns, tied for fourth in the Big Ten. He was named first-team All-Big Ten by coaches, media and Associated Press.

Iowa ranked third in the Big Ten with 18 rushing touchdowns (Ohio State, Minnesota had 19). The offensive line was led by C Tyler Linderbaum, a first-team All-Big Ten honoree and finalist for the Rimington Trophy. The Hawkeyes scored 60 percent of their offensive touchdowns on the ground (18 rushing, 9 receiving, 2 interception return, 1 punt return).

Goodson led Iowa in rushing attempts (143) and rushing yards (762). He tied for the team lead with seven rushing touchdowns (15, 3, 9, 7, 1, 10, 80). He has 1,400 career rushing yards (30th all-time).

Goodson had two multi-touchdown games in 2020. He had two rushing touchdowns (3, 9) Week 3 vs. Michigan State, and two more Week 4 at Minnesota (7, 1). Goodson had four 100-yard rushing games in 2020.

In Iowa's 23-19 win against No. 7 Minnesota in 2019, Goodson became the first true freshman to start at running back under Ferentz since 2012 (Greg Garmon). He was also the first true freshman to lead the team in single-season rushing in 2019 (638 yards).

### HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,269 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 666-562-39 (.541). That includes a 414-223-16 (.646) record in home games, a 251-339-23 (.428) record in games away from Iowa City, a 341-383-25 (.471) mark in Big Ten games and a 298-188-15 (.610) record in Kinnick Stadium.

### BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 19 times in the last 20 seasons. Iowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz is one bowl win shy of tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 9-8 bowl record and has led Iowa to three straight bowl wins, tying its longest such streak in program history. Ferentz's nine bowl wins tie Barry Alvarez for second in Big Ten history.

Seventeen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Nick Saban (16), Mack Brown (14), Gary Patterson (11), Kyle Whittingham (11), Mike Gundy (10) and Dabo Swinney (10) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.

Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (11) and Wisconsin (10) have more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than Iowa. Iowa is 17-15-1 all-time in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

## IN THE RANKINGS

The Hawkeyes open the 2021 season ranked 18th in the AP Poll. It marks the third straight season Iowa is ranked in the AP top 25 preseason poll and its highest preseason appearance since being ranked 17th in 2016.

Iowa's first two opponents are ranked in the AP Top 25 (No. 17 Indiana, No. 7 Iowa State). It marks the fourth time in program history the Hawkeyes have opened a season against consecutive opponents ranked in the AP Top 25 (1960, 1973, 1974). The Hawkeyes started 2-0 in 1960, 1-1 in 1974 and 0-2 in 1973.

Iowa has been ranked in the AP Top 25 at least once in each of the last seven seasons, the third-longest streak in school history.

Iowa finished the 2020 season ranked 15th in the coaches poll and 16th in the AP poll. It marked the 26th time in program history that Iowa finished the season ranked in the top 25. Iowa has finished ranked 15th or better in the AP poll six times in 22 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

## TROPHY COLLECTION

The Hawkeyes are 22-4 in their last 26 trophy games (includes bowl games) and 19-4 in their last 23 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin). Iowa is undefeated in its last three bowl appearances. Iowa defeated Boston College, 27-20, at the 2017 Pinstripe Bowl; No. 18 Mississippi State, 27-22, at the 2019 Outback Bowl; and No. 22 USC, 49-24, at the 2019 Holiday Bowl. Iowa's 2020 Music City Bowl game was canceled.

Iowa has four rivalry games on its schedule in 2021. The Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series returns following a one year hiatus. The Hawkeyes have won the last five meetings in the series and will try to extend the streak to six Sept. 11 at Iowa State. Iowa defends the Heartland Trophy Oct. 30 at Wisconsin, Floyd of Rosedale Nov. 13 against Minnesota at Kinnick Stadium, and the Heroes Trophy Nov. 26 at Nebraska. Iowa has won six straight against the Gophers and six in a row against the Huskers.

Iowa plays two Friday games in 2021. The Hawkeyes visit Maryland on Oct. 1 and Nebraska on Nov. 26. Iowa is 8-3 all-time in games played on Friday.

Iowa and Nebraska meet on Black Friday, the day after Thanksgiving, for the 11th consecutive season. The schools have played on Black Friday every year since Nebraska joined the Big Ten Conference in 2011. Iowa is 7-3 in the previous 10 Black Friday meetings, including winners of six straight.

## IOWA PLAYER COUNCIL GROUP

The University of Iowa football program's 2021 Player Council includes 16 student-athlete -- six seniors and 10 juniors.

The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies and being involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected following coaching staff and player input.

## BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons (minimum seven games).

## BACK ON CAMPUS

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2021. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his 10th year on staff, his fifth as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, is in his 14th year on the Iowa staff. Woods was named special teams coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13. He was named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016, and was named defensive line coach in 2019.

Ladell Betts joined the Iowa coaching staff as running backs coach in 2021. Betts is the second leading rushing in Iowa football history, rushing for 3,686 yards from 1998-2001. He is the only running back in school history to lead the team in rushing four straight years.

Former Hawkeyes Jason Manson and Sam Brincks lead Iowa's player development unit. Manson, the Hawkeyes' director of player development, was a two-year letterman as a quarterback and wide receiver in 2005 and 2006. Brincks is the assistant director of player development and a 2018 Iowa graduate. He played defensive tackle for the Hawkeyes from 2015-2018.

## HAWKEYE LEGACIES

Iowa has six players on its 2021 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: LB Eric Epenesa (Epenesa Epenesa, 1997), DE Joe Evans (Spence, 1989), DB Thomas Hartlieb (Jim, 1989-92), LS Zach Kluver (Todd), WR Henry Marchese (John, 1985), and LS Liam Reardon (Bill).

Epenesa is one of three players whose brothers played at Iowa: Eric (A.J. 2017-19), Zach Kluver (Tyler in 2013-17), and FB Johnny Plewa (Macon in 2013-15).

Iowa has one set of the brothers on the team: TE Bryce Schulte and DB Quinn Schulte.

RB Max White is the grandson of Max Hawkins, a member of University of Iowa's famed 'Ironmen' team in 1939 that included Iowa Heisman Trophy winner Nile Kinnick.

LS Austin Spiewak is the grandson of Gary Grouwink, who played for Iowa in the 1957 and 1959 Rose Bowl games.



## HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

## IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 199 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (79 draft picks/120 free agents).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (44 consecutive years).
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson was named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) and TE George Kittle (San Francisco) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 20 years, 163-of-188 (87 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 14 years, Iowa has had 53 NFL Draft picks, the third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (83), Michigan (63), Wisconsin (52).
- Iowa has had seven first round picks in the last 11 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 10th year on staff and fifth as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.

- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

**HALL OF FAME**

The University of Iowa Athletics Department's 32nd Hall of Fame class will be inducted into the Iowa Athletics Hall of Fame on Friday, Sept. 3, the evening prior to the season opener against Indiana.

The 32nd Hall of Fame class includes Dan Bachman (men's swimming), Kari Hamel (volleyball), Kristi Hanks (softball), Frank "Kinney" Holbrook (football), Kristen Holmes (field hockey), Roy Marble (men's basketball), Fred Mims (administration, baseball), Diane Nukuri (cross country, track), Brad Penrith (wrestling) and Ed Podolak (football).

All Hawkeye athletes who have earned at least one varsity letter award at Iowa are eligible for the Iowa Athletics Hall of Fame. Athletes must have completed their eligibility 10 years, and coaches/administrators five years prior to their induction.

**FRYfest**

FRYfest is in its 12th year of celebrating all that is Hawkeye. The event, named after legendary UI football coach Hayden Fry, kicks off the UI football season each year at Coralville's Iowa River Landing. This year's FRYfest is FRYday, Sep. 3, and includes the World's Largest Hawkeye Tradeshow, a panel discussion and autograph session with the 2021 Athletic Hall of Fame class, the Hawkeye pep rally, and a "High Porch Block Party" that includes the kids zone, bags tournament, fireworks, and live music by The Spazmatics.

The 2021 FRYfest will be "Celebrating the Legends" with panels honoring legendary athletic directors Bump Elliott and Dr. Christine Grant, Iowa sports writers and a panel honoring Coach Fry featuring Coach Don Patterson and Marv Cook. **IOWA PROGRAM NOTES**

- Only eight Power 5 teams have won more games than Iowa since the 2015 season: Clemson, Alabama, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Georgia, Wisconsin, LSU and Notre Dame.
- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 19 of the last 20 seasons. Iowa is 9-8 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (11) and Wisconsin (10) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 17-15-1 in 33 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (164-106) replaced Fry and is in his 23rd season in 2021. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 340 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 10 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.
