HEAD COACH LISA CELLUCCI

Lisa Cellucci enters her 22nd season as a member of the Hawkeye coaching staff in 2021-22 and her eighth as head coach. Cellucci, a three-time All-American and member of the U.S. National Team, is the all-time saves leader at Iowa. In her 20 years at Iowa, the Hawkeyes have compiled a 251-160 record and have been consistently ranked in the NFHC top 20. Cellucci previously worked as the recruiting coordinator, director of the Iowa Field Hockey Camp, and has primarily coached the goalkeepers and defense.



In her seven years as head coach, Cellucci has coached 12 NFHCA All-Americans, 25 NFHCA All-West Regional selections, two NFHCA West Region Players of the Year, 16 All-Big Ten selections (eight first team), one Big Ten Player of the Year, one Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, three Big Ten Offensive Players of the Year, one Big Ten Freshman of the Year, 51 Academic All-Big Ten selections, 41 NFHCA National Academic Squad honorees, 27 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, and 54 NFHCA National Academic Team honors. Cellucci earned back-to-back Big Ten Coach of the Year honors in 2019 and 2021 (spring), and her and her staff have earned NFHCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year, twice.

During the 2021 spring season, Cellucci led the Hawkeyes to their 12th NCAA Final Four in program history. She was named Big Ten Co-Coach of the Year. She mentored three NFHCA All-Americans, five NFHCA All-West Region honorees, and three All-Big Ten selections. Junior Anthe Nijziel was

named Big Ten Player of the Year and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, and junior Lokke Stribos and sophomore Esme Gibson earned All-NCAA Tournament honors. Senior forward Maddy Murphy earned her third NFHCA All-American honor, making her the eighth Hawkeye in program history to accomplish the feat. Murphy led the Hawkeyes in goals (8) and points (18), senior Ellie Holley, a NFHCA All-American, led Iowa in assists (7) and tallied three goals, and freshman Alex Wesneski notched three goals. Iowa's defense allowed only 0.78 goals per game and tallied eight shutouts.

During the 2019 season, Cellucci led the Hawkeyes to their 13th Big Ten Regular Season Championship, sixth Big Ten Tournament title, and 17th Elite Eight appearance in program history. She was named Big Ten Coach of the Year, while her and her staff were named NFHCA West Region Coaching Staff of the Year for the second consecutive season. She mentored two NFHCA All-Americans, five NFHCA All-West Region honorees, and three All-Big Ten selections. Senior Katie Birch was named Big Ten Tournament MVP, and fellow senior Sophie Sunderland and sophomore Lokke Stribos were named to the Big Ten All-Tournament Team. Junior forward Maddy Murphy, a second team NFHCA All-American, led the Hawkeyes in goals (12), assists (13), and points (37), Stribos ranked second in goals (10) and total points (25), and Birch tabbed third in total points (24), tallying seven goals and 10 assists. Iowa's defense allowed only 1.23 goals per game along with four shutouts.

In 2018, Cellucci led Iowa to its 23rd NCAA Tournament appearance in program history with a 14-7 (4-4) record. The Hawkeyes posted seven wins over top-25 opponents, including two over top-10 Penn State, to earn an at-large Sweet 16 bid against Wake Forest. Cellucci and the Hawkeyes made a Big Ten Tournament run as the sixth seed to finish second. Cellucci and her staff were named NFHCA West Region Coaching Staff of the Year.





Cellucci helped mentor two NFHA All-Americans, five NFHA All-West regional selections and three All-Big Ten selections. Sophomore Maddy Murphy, a NFHA third team All-American, led the team in goals (13) and points (33), junior Katie Birch, a NFHA second team All-American, led the team in assists (10) and shots (56), and junior Sophie Sunderland, a NFHA second team All-West Regional selection, was third on the team in goals (7), assists (5), and points (19). Cellucci was also instrumental in Iowa's defense who allowed only 1.10 goals per game along with seven shutouts.

In 2017, Cellucci led two Hawkeyes to postseason accolades. Sophomore Katie Birch, who led the team in goals (14), points (36), and shots (68), earned three postseason honors: First Team All-Big Ten selection, NFHA First Team All-West Regional selection, and NFHA Third Team All-American selection. Birch registered four multi-goal games, including two hat tricks. Freshman Maddy Murphy earned Second Team All-Big Ten and NFHA Second Team All-West honors. Murphy ranked second on the team in goals (11), points (25), and shots (34), while also scoring three-game winning goals. The Hawkeyes finished 7-11 and 3-5 in the Big Ten last season.

In 2016, Iowa finished the season with a 12-7 record and were ranked 15th in the country. Natalie Cafone earned All-American accolades for the third straight season, and was named NFHA first team All-Region for the second straight season. Cafone was also named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year and the NFHA West Region Player of the Year for the second time. Chandler Ackers earned second team All-Big Ten and NFHA second team All-West Region recognition for the second year in a row. Katie Birch was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year and was also named second team All-Big Ten and NFHA second team All-West Region.

In 2015, Cellucci led a pair of Hawkeyes to postseason accolades. Stephanie Norlander earned All-American honors for the second straight year, and was named NFHA first team All-Region. Norlander, the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year, finished the season ranked third in the Big Ten in goals scored (16) and fourth in points (26). Chandler Ackers earned the first postseason honors of her career. The junior was named second team All-Region and second-team All-Big Ten after tallying a career-high eight goals and registering six assists.

In 2014, Iowa was ranked seventh nationally and averaged more than three goals per game. Natalie Cafone and Stephanie Norlander earned NFHA Division I All-American accolades under Cellucci's guidance to become the 86th and 87th Hawkeyes in program history to earn national distinction. Cafone, who earned All-America honors for the second straight season, led the Big Ten in goals and points, and ranked fourth and seventh nationally, respectively. Cafone's efforts earned her Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year and NFHA West Region Player of the Year laurels. Norlander, a second team selection, finished 13th and 19th nationally in goals and points per game, respectively.

Hawkeye goalkeepers have excelled under the mentorship of Cellucci. In 2012, Cellucci was a crucial part of the Black and Gold's success as Iowa reached its 22nd NCAA Tournament in program history. Senior Kathleen McGraw earned first team All-Big Ten and second team All-America recognition under Cellucci's guidance. McGraw, who was a three-time Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week, played every minute in goal and posted five shutouts to lead Iowa to a 14-7 record and its second-straight NCAA Tournament appearance. Her 1.58 goals against average ranked second in the Big Ten and 17th nationally. McGraw closed out her career with 336 saves, the fourth-most in school history.

In 2008, Cellucci was again a vital part of Iowa's success. She coached senior goalkeeper Lissa Munley to eight shutouts, including matches against three nationally ranked opponents. Munley ranked first in Big Ten shutouts, second in goals against average and third in save percentage. Iowa's goals against average ranked ninth-best in the country and helped lead Iowa to its third straight Big Ten Tournament Championship, 20th NCAA Tournament appearance, and 11th NCAA Final Four appearance.

Barb Weinberg, a 2005 graduate, became one of nation's top goalkeepers and went on to become a member of the USA National Team from 2005-2010. Under Cellucci's guidance Weinberg became a two-time All-American, three-time All-Big Ten selection and three time All-region pick.

As a student-athlete, Cellucci was one of the greatest goalkeepers ever to don the Black and Gold. During her four years at Iowa, she was a three-time All-American, four-time All-Big Ten selection and four-time regional All-American. As a freshman, she earned first team All-Big Ten, first team regional All-American and third team NFHCA All-American honors as she helped Iowa to a 16-4 record. Her sophomore campaign was even more impressive, when she went 18-3 and was first team All-Big Ten and a regional All-American, along with being second team NFHCA All-American.

During her senior campaign, Cellucci became Iowa's all-time saves leader by stopping her 494th shot in a 5-3 win over Ball State. She ended her career with 592 saves.

A member of the U.S. National Team from 1999-2000, Cellucci has extensive experience with the U.S. program. She played on the 1998 U.S. Under-23 National Team and on the U.S. Under-18 National Team in 1994. Cellucci also participated in three U.S. Olympic Festivals (1993, 1994 and 1995) and won a gold medal at the 1993 Festival and a bronze medal at the 1995 Festival.

She also has extensive coaching experience with USA Field Hockey. Cellucci, who has a level 2 USA Field Hockey coaching accreditation, has been coaching in the USA High Performance program since 2003 and has served as a member of the Midwest High Performance Coaching Staff since 2005.

Before returning to Iowa as a coach, Cellucci was an assistant coach at James Madison, where she helped the Dukes to a 15-7 record and a spot in the NCAA Tournament in 1999.

Cellucci, who serves on the Board of Directors for the National Iowa Varsity Club, graduated from the University of Iowa in 1998 with a bachelor of arts degree in communication studies.





ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH MICHAEL BOAL

Michael Boal is in his first season as the associate head coach for the University of Iowa field hockey program and his seventh overall with the program.

During the 2021 spring season, Boal helped guide the Hawkeyes to their 12th NCAA Final Four in program history. Boal helped mentor three NFHCA All-Americans, five NFHCA All-West Region honorees, and three All-Big Ten selections.

Junior Anthe Nijziel was named Big Ten Player of the Year and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, and junior Lokke Stribos and sophomore Esme Gibson earned All-NCAA Tournament honors. Senior forward Maddy Murphy earned her third NFHCA All-American honor, making her the eighth Hawkeye in program history to accomplish the feat. Murphy led the Hawkeyes in goals (8) and points (18), senior Ellie Holley, a NFHCA All-American, led Iowa in assists (7) and tallied three goals, and freshman Alex Wesneski notched three goals. Iowa's defense allowed only 0.78 goals per game and tallied eight shutouts.



During the 2019 season, Boal assisted the Hawkeyes in earning their 13th Big Ten Regular Season Championship, sixth Big Ten Tournament title, and 17th Elite Eight appearance in program history. Iowa's coaching staff was named NFHCA West Region Coaching Staff of the Year for the second consecutive season after recording a 17-5 record. Boal contributed to the mentorship of two NFHCA All-Americans, five NFHCA All-West Region honorees, and three All-Big Ten selections. Senior Katie Birch was named Big Ten Tournament MVP, and fellow senior Sophie Sunderland and sophomore Lokke Stribos were named to the Big Ten All-Tournament Team. Junior forward Maddy Murphy, a second team NFHCA All-American, led the Hawkeyes in goals (12), assists (13), and points (37).

In 2018, Boal helped guide Iowa to a 14-7 record, qualifying for the NCAA Tournament, and finishing second in the Big Ten Tournament. The Iowa coaching staff was named NFHCA West Region Coaching Staff of the Year. Boal was instrumental in six Hawkeyes garnering postseason accolades. Sophomore Maddy Murphy, who led Iowa with 13 goals and 33 points, was a NFHCA third-team All-American, NFHCA first team All-West Regional selection, and a first-team All-Big Ten selection. Junior Katie Birch led the team in assists (10) to earn NFHCA second-team All-America honors, NFHCA first team All-West Region honors, and second-team All-Big Ten honors. Sophie Sunderland, a second-team All-Big Ten selection, joined freshman Anthe Nijziel and Ellie Holley as NFHCA second-team All-West Regional selections. The Hawkeyes finished 14-7 (4-4) with a trip to the NCAA Tournament.

In 2017, Boal helped mentor Katie Birch and Maddy Murphy to postseason honors. Birch led Iowa in goals (14), points (36), and shots (68) to earn first-team All-Big Ten, NFHCA First-team All-West Regional, and NFHCA third-team All-American honors. Birch registered four multi-goal games, including two hat tricks. Freshman Maddy Murphy earned second-team All-Big Ten and NFHCA second-team All-West honors. Murphy ranked second on the team in goals (11), points (25), and shots (34), while also scoring three-game winning goals. The Hawkeyes finished 7-11 and 3-5 in the Big Ten last season.

In 2016, Boal helped guide three Hawkeyes to postseason accolades. Natalie Cafone earned All-American accolades for the third straight season, and was named NFHCA first-team All-Region for the second straight season. Cafone was also named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year and the NFHCA West Region Player of the Year for the second time. Chandler Ackers earned second team All-Big Ten and NFHCA second-team All-West Region recognition for the second year in a row. Katie Birch was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year and was also named second-team All-Big Ten and NFHCA second-team All-West Region. The Hawkeyes finished the 2016 season ranked No. 15 with a 12-7 record.

In 2015, Boal helped guide a pair of Hawkeyes to postseason accolades. Stephanie Norlander earned All-America accolades for the second straight year, and was named NFHCA first-team All-Region. Norlander, the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year, finished the season ranked third in the Big Ten in goals scored (16) and fourth in points (26). Chandler Ackers earned the first postseason honors of her career. The junior was named second-team All-Region and second-team All-Big Ten after tallying a career-high eight goals and registering six assists for the Hawkeyes in 2015.

In 2014, Boal helped guide an Iowa team that ranked seventh nationally and averaged more than three goals per game to an 11-7 overall mark while finishing 4-4 in conference play. The Hawkeyes finished fifth in the Big Ten and earned a berth in the conference tournament for the 22nd consecutive year.

Prior to his arrival at Iowa, Boal worked at James Madison, where he joined the staff as associate head coach in July of 2013. He was named interim head coach in October of 2013, and served in that role for the remainder of the 2013 season, leading the Dukes to a 4-2 finish and a tie for third in the Colonial Athletic Association. Boal also served as an assistant coach for the Dukes during the 2010 season, coaching goalkeepers and playing a key role in recruiting efforts.

In between his two stops at James Madison, Boal spent two seasons as the associate head coach at Virginia, helping lead the Cavaliers to the 2012 NCAA Tournament.

The Sunderland, England, native served as the assistant director of hockey at Durham University in the United Kingdom prior to coaching at the NCAA Division I level. He was responsible for the coaching and development of both men's and women's performance groups, recruiting across Europe, match preparation, video analysis, and conducting coaching and evaluation sessions for all 16 intramural college teams.

At Durham University Boal assisted Gavin Featherstone, a renowned double Olympic and World Cup head coach for the USA and South Africa field hockey teams. They led the men's and women's teams at Durham to top-10 rankings amongst United Kingdom universities, and won National North Conference Championships and Northern Division One Championships in 2010.

Before joining the staff at Durham, Boal coached at the Olton & West Warwick's Hockey Club for four years. He was involved in all aspects of the management of the women's first and second teams, including daily planning and conducting of practice, and physical training. He coached the women's first team in the prominent English National Premier League at the age of 20, making Boal the youngest ever to coach a women's team in the League.

While at Olton & West Warwick's, Boal also coached players with national and international representative honors, including two 2008 Olympians for Great Britain. He developed three representatives for the Junior World Cup and two under-18 Internationals.

Boal graduated with honors from the University of Birmingham in the United Kingdom in June of 2009. He earned his bachelor's degree in sports management and was an ambassador for the university. Boal made four British University Finals Appearances as a player and coach and was part of their 2006-07 National League winning side.



ASSISTANT COACH JESS BARNETT

University of Iowa graduate and former Hawkeye All-American Jess Barnett was named an assistant in July 2021.

Barnett, a three-time All-Big Ten honoree, regional All-American, Big Ten All-Tournament selection, and two-time NFCA All-American, returned to Iowa City after playing at Grant Field from 2009-12. The North Vancouver, Canada, native started every game of her career and helped lead Iowa to two-straight NCAA Sweet 16 appearances in 2011 and 2012.

Barnett was honored as Iowa athletics female athlete of the year in 2011 and 2012. She was also a two-time team captain and named team MVP her sophomore, junior, and senior seasons. In 77 career games, Barnett scored 27 goals and registered seven assists, while leading the Hawkeye defense.



Following her collegiate career, Barnett was a member of the Canadian National Team where she won bronze in the 2013 Pan American Cup in Argentina and garnered over 40 international caps with Team Canada.

Barnett, who previously was the assistant field hockey coach at Yale since 2016, began her coaching career in 2014 with Field Hockey Canada, assisting in their Junior National Program. In 2015, she returned to the Hawkeyes as a volunteer coach for the 2015-16 season before beginning her tenure at Yale from 2016-21.

In her first season at Yale, she helped the Bulldogs double their win total from the previous season. In her second and third seasons, the Bulldogs continued to best their win total each year. The team ended its 2019 season, winning five of their final six games.

DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS SARAH HUMPHRIES

Sarah Humphries is in her third season as director of operations for the field hockey program.

Humphries works closely with the Hawkeye staff to help facilitate day-to-day activities of the program. She will serve as the team travel coordinator, oversee the program's meal arrangements, act as a liaison to many event units such as equipment, event management, and external relations. Humphries will also assist with on campus recruiting and coordinating camps and clinics.

Prior to joining the field hockey staff, Humphries was the head coach at Transylvania University, a Division III school in Lexington, Kentucky, since 2014. On top of her coaching duties, Humphries was involved in all aspects of the field hockey program, including budgeting, event management, travel coordination, student-athlete skill development and compliance, and recruiting.



Humphries began coaching in 2008 as a coach for middle to high school-aged girls at the Kentuckiana Field Hockey Association. From 2011 to 2013, she was an assistant coach at Division III Earlham College in Richmond, Indiana.

From 2012-18, Humphries was a coach and eventual resident director of the Mid Atlantic Field Hockey Camp. There she organized camp-wide tournaments, assessed players' skills, and provided other means of leadership for players and junior coaches.

She was also the co-founder and co-director of the Blast in the Bluegrass Field Hockey Clinic across Kentucky from 2016-18.

Humphries played field hockey at Centre College, a Division III school in Danville, Kentucky, from 2007-11 where she graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in biology.

In 2015, she received her Master of Science degree in Recreation and Sports Administration with a focus on Athletic Administration and Coaching from Western Kentucky University.

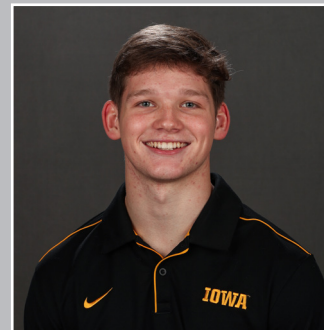

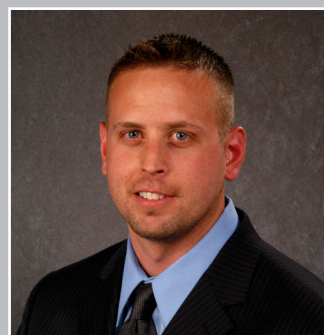

GRANT FIELD

Since 1989 at Hawkeye Field Hockey Field, opponents have usually left Iowa City unhappy. The Hawkeyes own an overall home record of 237-71, a conference record of 69-33 at home and an 14-5 record in NCAA Tournament games played in Iowa City. Originally named Hawkeye Field Hockey Field, the facility was renamed in honor of former University of Iowa Women's Athletics Director and founder of Iowa Field Hockey, Dr. Christine Grant, on Sept. 22, 1991. The new field was re-dedicated on Oct. 8, 2006. The Hawkeyes set a home attendance record Oct. 24, 1993 with 1,339 fans watching Iowa defeat No. 4 Penn State, 4-0. Iowa has gone undefeated on its home field in six separate seasons, including a 40-game home winning streak.

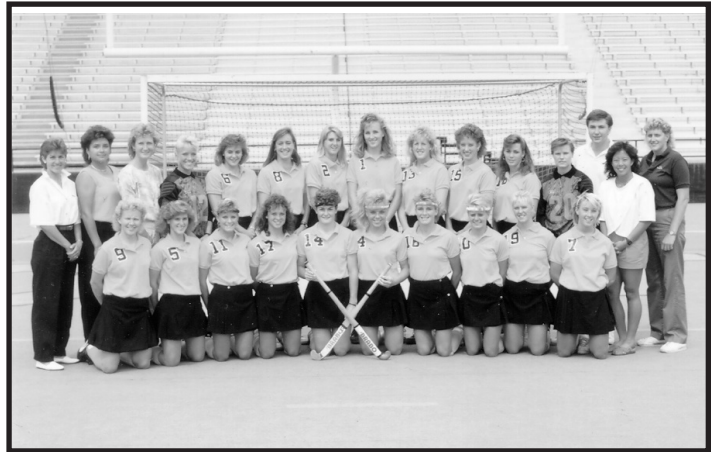

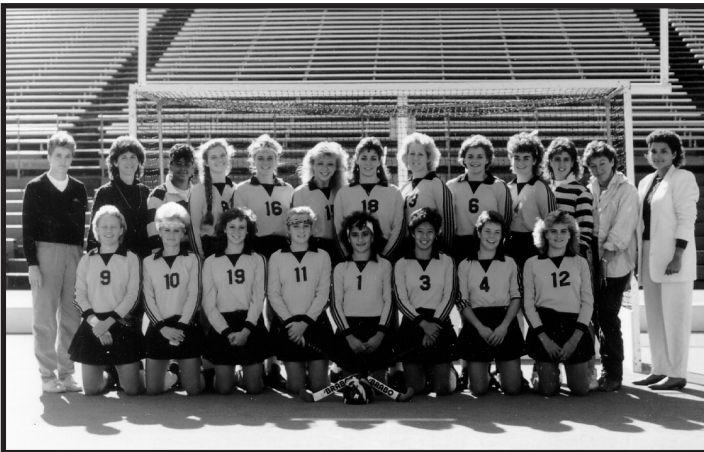
