THIS WEEK

The University of Iowa men's and women's cross country teams return to action after an off week, following the Gans Creek Classic. The Hawkeyes hit the road for the third time this season as they travel to Peoria, Illinois, for the Bradley Pink Classic at Newman Golf Course on Friday. The women's "B" race will take place at 1:30 p.m., followed by the men's "B" race at 2:15 p.m. The women's Red "A" race will begin at 3 p.m., followed by the men's Red "A" race at 3:45 p.m. All race times are CT.

IN THE RANKINGS

The University of Iowa men's cross country team is ranked No. 10 in the USTFCCCA Midwest Region Week Four poll, and the Hawkeye women head into the weekend ranked eighth in the region. In the USTFCCCA Week Four National rankings, Wisconsin sits atop the Big Ten men's side as the nation's 11th-ranked squad, and is joined in the top 30 by No. 15 Michigan. Six Big Ten women's teams occupy spots in the national top 30, led by Minnesota at No. 7.

LAST TIME OUT

The women's team notched its third top-three team finish of the season in as many races at the Gans Creek Classic. The Hawkeye women took third place with 101 points, and were once again led by sophomore Kelli Tosic, who finished 12th and set a new 6K personal best in 21:24.8. The men made moves throughout the race to finish fifth in the team standings with 138 points. All five scoring Hawkeyes placed in the top-30 of the women's race. Junior Gabby Skopec finished 20th in 21:34, freshman Brooke McKee was 21st (21:35.6) and seniors Emma Gordon and Jessica McKee finished 22nd (21:36.2) and 27th (21:45.9), respectively. The first five to cross the finish line, as well as freshmen Lauren McMahon (21:51.7) and Miriam Sandeen (21:52.7), set new 6K personalbests. The men's top five all broke the 25-minute barrier, led by senior Noah Healy who posted a career-best time of 24:08.4 to finish fifth — his second top-five finish this season. Sophomore Nick Trattner crossed next for lowa, recording a new personal best of 24:16.6 to finish ninth and record his third-consecutive top-10 finish. Sophomores Jack Pendergast and Kal Lewis, and senior Jeff Roberts were within five seconds of one another, finishing 39th (24:54.7), 44th (24:57.3) and 46th (24:59.4), to round out scoring for the Hawkeyes while all setting new personal-bests.

TRATTNER MAKING HISTORY

Nick Trattner is the first underclassmen in over a decade to lead the Hawkeye men for the first two races of the season since Jeff Thode in 2010. Trattner finished third at the Hawkeye Invite and sixth at the Dirksen-Greeno Invite. Trattner added a ninth-place finish on Oct. 1 at the Gans Creek Classic. Thode brought home a third-place finish and a victory in those races and went on to lead Iowa in every race that season. Thode is one of the most decorated Hawkeyes in history, recording two individual National Championship appearances and one All-American honor in 2010 placing 30th.



MEN'S TOP RUNNERS

Senior Noah Healy is back for his fourth cross country season with the Hawkeyes. In 2019, Healy was Iowa's second finisher at the Midwest Regional, running a collegiate-best 10K in 31:58. Healy started his 2021 campaign with a pair of top-eight finishes at the Hawkeye Invite and Dirksen-Greeno Invite, and finished fifth at the Gans Creek Classic on Oct. 1. Sophomore Nick Trattner finished second at the 2021 Hawkeye Invite on Sept. 3 to lead lowa to a team win in the season opener, and was the leading Hawkeye again at the Dirksen-Greeno Invite on Sept. 18, finishing sixth in the 8K-race. Sophomore Max Murphy will look to build upon a top-55 finish at the Big Ten Championship in his freshman campaign.

WOMEN'S TOP RUNNERS

Junior Gabby Skopec returns for her third cross country season at Iowa. At the Big Ten Championships in 2020, Skopec was the top finisher for the Hawkeyes, running the 6K in 21:15 — good for a spot in the top 50. Sophomore Kelli Tosic finished 61st in the same race in 22:06 — a freshman at the time, it was the first race of Tosic's career. Tosic has been the team's top finisher in all three races this season, and led the Hawkeyes to a team win in Lincoln at the Dirksen-Greeno Invite. Junior Leah Kralovetz was an All-Region honoree in 2019 after a 16th-place finish. The junior was the top finisher for the Hawkeyes in three races that season.

HAWKEYE NEWCOMERS

The University of Iowa cross country team added 16 student-athletes to its 2021 roster. Six men join the Hawkeyes: Will Arbanas, Jack Gschwendtner, Isaac Hartman, Blake Hayden, Colin Hill and Yohana Yual. On the women's side, the ten new Hawkeyes include Laney Fitzpatrick, Jaiden Itson, Kaitlin Knape, Lauren McMahon, Sarah Murphy, Miriam Sandeen, Lillian Schmidt, Chloe Skidmore, Sam Strauss, and Kathryn Vortherms.

HAWKEYE STATE

Of the 30 women on Iowa's roster, 21 hail from the Hawkeye State. Seven additional states, including Wisconsin (2), Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Kansas, and Texas are represented, as well as Japan. On the men's side, four of the 17 members are from Iowa. Illinois is represented by 7 student-athletes, while Wisconsin is the home of three Hawkeyes. Missouri, New York and New Jersey are each represented with one student-athlete.

NEXT UP FOR THE HAWKEYES

The Hawkeyes head to University Park, Pennsylvania, to compete at the Big Ten Championships on Friday, Oct. 29, with racing set to gun at 1:30 p.m. (CT).

Ashton Cross Country Course

The University of Iowa men's and women's cross country team's home for training and competition is the Ashton Cross Country Course. Located west of the Finkbine Golf Course, the course first opened in 2003 and has hosted the 2014 Big Ten Championships and 2016 NCAA Regional. The course boasts a rolling terrain with outstanding rhythm for running, and offers the ability to race from 3K to 10K around a layout that enables spectators to view the race from start to finish. The Ashton Cross Country Course will also play host to the NCAA Midwest Regional this fall.
