MEN'S BASKETBALL PARKING ADJUSTMENTS

Men's Basketball fans should take note of changes to their parking options for the Friday, November 12 game vs. Missouri-Kansas City at 7:00 p.m. Reserved parking for the Saturday, November 13 Iowa Football game will be held in Lots 40, 75S and 43N (RV areas only) on Friday evening, and will not be available for the Men's Basketball game.

Hawkeye fans with Men's Basketball parking passes will have the following options:

- 'ZONE A' PERMIT:** Allow entry into Lot 46 or the east section of Lot 75, as usual.
- Access Lot 46 and Lot 75 off of Hawkins Drive.
- 'ZONE B' PERMIT:** Allow entry into the east half of Lot 33 or the north half of Lot 75. *The south half of Lot 75 will not be available for Men's Basketball parking.*
- Access Lot 33 off of Elliott Drive. Entrance to Lot 75 is off of Hawkins Drive.
- 'ZONE C' PERMIT:** Allow entry into Lot 43N. *Lot 40 will not be available for Men's Basketball parking.*
- Access Lot 43N off of Hawkins Drive only. Melrose Avenue will not be an available entrance for 'Zone C' permits accessing Lot 43N. Vehicles must depart Lot 43N following the Men's Basketball game.
- 'P' PERMIT:** Allow entry into Lots 65, 43W and 43NW. *Lot 43N will not be available for public parking.*
- Access Lot 65 off of Hawkins Drive.

PUBLIC PARKING

Public parking will be available in Lots 65, 43W and 43NW at a cost of \$5.00. Parking Lot 65 is located off Hawkins Drive.

Newton Road Ramp, Ramp 3 and Ramp 4 will also be available at the applicable hourly rate.

Public parking will not be available in Lot 43N for the Men's Basketball game on November 12.

ADA PARKING

ADA parking will be available in the west half of Lot 33 at a cost of \$5.00. A state-issued ADA placard or license plate is required for entry. Lot 33 can be accessed from Elliott Drive.

ADA parking will not be available in Lot 40 for the Men's Basketball game on November 12.

Men's Basketball attendees without the proper football parking pass are required to leave the lot immediately after the Men's Basketball game.
