- lowa and Minnesota battle for Floyd of Rosedale on Saturday. The Hawkeyes have won six straight in the series. Iowa has not trailed in a game against the Gophers since the fourth quarter in 2016, a span of 245 minutes and 28 seconds. The Hawkeyes are 20-5 in their last 25 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).
- lowa leads the country in interceptions (19) and ranks third nationally in takeaways (24). The Hawkeyes have 83 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country. Ten different Hawkeyes have at least one interception this season. lowa is plus-18 in turnover margin in its seven wins and minus-six in its two losses.
- lowa ranks second the Big Ten and fifth in the country in scoring defense (15.7). The Hawkeyes rank seventh nationally in rush defense (98.7), second in the Big Ten. lowa's total defense (304.7) ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 10th in the country.
- DB Riley Moss and DB Dave Belton tie for the conference lead with four interceptions. DB Matt Hankins ranks seventh with three interceptions. Iowa is the only team in the country with two players with four or more interceptions. Moss has missed the last three games with an injury.
- C Tyler Linderbaum was named a midseason first-team All-American by the Associated Press, Sporting News, CBS Sports, and The Athletic. Linderbaum has made 30 consecutive starts at center. Iowa is 23-7 during that span.
- QB Spencer Petras owns a 13-4 record as Iowa's starting quarterback, the fourth best winning percentage by a starting quarterback in program history. He has made 17 straight starts.
- WR Charlie Jones is the only player in the conference to rank in the top three in average yards per kickoff return and punt return. Jones has returned 15 kickoffs for an average of 23.9 yards per return, No. 3 in the Big Ten. He averages 10.4 yards on a league-high 26 punt returns.
- P Tory Taylor ranks fourth in the Big Ten averaging 45.8 yards per punt. Taylor is tied for the Big Ten lead and ranks fourth nationally with 58 punts. Taylor was recognized as a first-team midseason All-American by The Athletic. Iowa has won the field position battle in each of its seven wins.
- RB Tyler Goodson leads Iowa with 754 yards on 170 attempts. The 170 carries are a single-season career high. He is 8 yards shy of matching his single-season best in rushing yards (762 in 2020). He has been Iowa's leading rusher in 12 straight games. The last Hawkeye to lead the team in rushing in 13 consecutive games was Shonn Greene (2008).
- LB Jack Campbell leads Iowa and ranks fifth in the Big Ten with 83 tackles. He was named a second-team midseason All-American by The Athletic. He had a career-high 18 tackles in Iowa's Week 4 win against Colorado State, earning national and B1G Defensive Player of the Week honors. He is a Butkus Award semifinalist.

Saturday marks Iowa's third trophy game of the season. Iowa is 1-1 in trophy games this season. The Hawkeyes lost possession of the Heartland Trophy on Oct. 30 at Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes defeated No. 9 Iowa State, 27-17, to win the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series game on Sept. 11.

The Hawkeyes are 23-5 in their last 28 trophy games (includes bowl games) and 20-5 in their last 25 rivalry trophy games (lowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin). Iowa is undefeated in its last three bowl appearances. Iowa defeated Boston College, 27-20, at the 2017 Pinstripe Bowl; No. 18 Mississippi State, 27-22, at the 2019 Outback Bowl; and No. 22 USC, 49-24, at the 2019 Holiday Bowl. Iowa's 2020 Music City Bowl game was canceled.

lowa has four rivalry games on it schedule in 2021. The Hawkeyes defend Floyd of Rosedale on Nov. 13 against Minnesota at Kinnick Stadium, and the Heroes Trophy Nov. 26 at Nebraska. Iowa has won six straight against The Cyclones, Gophers and Huskers.

PADILLA SETS CAREER MARKS IN WIN AT NORTHWESTERN

QB Alex Padilla entered the game at Northwestern on Iowa's fourth drive. He finished the game with career highs in yards (172), completions (18) and attempts (28). Padilla has appeared in seven career games (no starts) and has 245 career passing yards (23-44, 0 TD, 0 INT). QB Spencer Petras has started 17 straight games for the Hawkeyes, but left the Northwestern game due to injury. If Petras is unable to start against the Gopher, Padilla would make his starting quarterback debut at Kinnick Stadium.

PETRAS AMONG ALL-TIME LEADERS

QB Spencer Petras has started the last 17 games. He owns a 13-4 record (.765) as lowa's starting quarterback, the fourth best winning percentage by a starting quarterback in program history. lowa has scored 27.9 points per game in 17 Petras starts. Petras has 3,024 career passing yards, 14th all-time in program history.

Petras led lowa to 12 consecutive wins from 2020-21, winning the final six games of 2020 and the first six games of 2021. He was 194-324 with 17 touchdown passes, four interceptions and 2,226 passing yards during lowa's 12-game winning streak.

Petras matched his career-high with three touchdown passes and set a career-high with two rushing touchdowns Week 5 at Maryland. He became the first lowa quarterback with multiple passing touchdowns and multiple rushing touchdowns in a game since Brad Banks at Minnesota in 2002.

The Hawkeyes averaged 31.8 points per game in 2020, Petras' first year as starting quarterback. It marked lowa's highest point per game total since 2002 (36.5). Iowa won its final six games in 2020, outscoring its opponents 214-83.



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 23rd season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby
 Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club,
 Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 175 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He
 has 107 Big Ten wins, which ranks fourth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 11 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- lowa has posted a 166-87 (.656) overall mark and a 103-65 (.613) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 14 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At lowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 175-108 (.618) and a 107-79 (.575) mark in Big Ten games. He is lowa's all-time winningest football coach with 174 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 187-129 (.592).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college.
 Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

Moon Family Head Football Coach Kirk Ferentz has 107 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach, the fourth most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history. The Hawkeyes defeated Penn State, 41-21, on Nov. 21, 2020, to earn Ferentz's 100th conference win.

Ferentz's 175 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five include Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Ferentz (175) and Joe Paterno (162).

Ferentz (175-108) became lowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 23rd season in 2021.

Both Ferentz (175, 107) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top 10 in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only lowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

lowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 23rd season as lowa's head football coach in 2021. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named lowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) has been at his current school for 10 seasons or more. lowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker is in his 23rd season on lowa's staff, his 10th as defensive coordinator. He is the longest tenured defensive coordinator in FBS.

Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to lowa in 2017 to coach lowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his 10th season on lowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

CELEBRATING #300

The Hawkeyes' 30-7 win against Kent State on Sept. 18 was their 300th win at Kinnick Stadium since the stadium opened in 1929. The first game played at Kinnick Stadium was Oct. 5, 1929, a 46-0 Hawkeye win against Monmouth. Iowa's 100th win at Kinnick was a 31-19 victory over Arizona on Oct. 4, 1969. The 200th win at Kinnick Stadium was a 44-19 victory against Miami, Ohio, on Sept. 8, 2001. Iowa became the seventh Big Ten school to celebrate at least 300 wins in its home stadium.

THE SERIES

Saturday will be the 115th meeting between Iowa and Minnesota. The Hawkeyes have won six straight, and 16 of the last 20. Iowa has won nine straight at home against the Gophers. Minnesota's last win at Kinnick Stadium was Nov. 20, 1999 (25-21).

Minnesota holds a 62-50-2 advantage in a series that began with a 42-4 Gopher victory in 1891. The Golden Gophers won the first 12 games in the series before lowa earned a 6-0 win in 1918. The Hawkeyes are 31-23-1 against Minnesota in games played in lowa City.

Iowa has not trailed in a game against the Gophers since the fourth quarter in 2016, a span of 245 minutes and 28 seconds.

FLOYD OF ROSEDALE

As a result of a bet between the governors of the two states in 1935, possession of Floyd of Rosedale is at stake Saturday. The trophy is currently in possession of Iowa. The series is tied 42-42-2 with Floyd of Rosedale on the line. Iowa has won 16 of the last 20 meetings.

THE LAST MEETING (Minneapolis -- Nov. 13, 2020)

RB Tyler Goodson rushed for a then-career-high 142 yards and added two rushing touchdowns (7, 1).

DB Riley Moss intercepted a pass in the fourth quarter (62 yards return), his fourth career interception against Minnesota. Moss made his first career start and had two interceptions against the Gophers in 2018. He had an interception in 2019 on Minnesota's final offensive play of the game.

DL Zach VanValkenburg had a career-high three sacks and was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week.

WR Nico Ragaini scored his first career rushing touchdown (1 yard) in the first quarter.

GOING THE OTHER WAY

lowa leads the country with 19 interceptions. The school record for interceptions in a season is 23 (1986, 1987, 2008). The Hawkeyes have 83 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country. Ten Hawkeyes have at least one interception this season. The last time lowa had 10 players with an interception in a single season was 2017.

DB Riley Moss and DB Dave Belton tie for the conference lead with four interceptions. DB Matt Hankins ranks seventh with three interceptions. Iowa is the only team in the country with two players with four or more interceptions. All three players have recorded two interceptions in a single game this season.

Moss leads the nation in interceptions per game (0.67), having missed Weeks 7, 8 and 9 due to injury. He has two interceptions returned for a touchdown, both in Week 1.

lowa combined for 10 interceptions in consecutive games against Maryland and Penn State, which ties Miami (2001) for second most over a two-game span over the last 25 years. Mississippi State had 11 in 2002.

Six different Hawkeyes intercepted a pass in Iowa's 51-14 win at Maryland, tying a school record for most players with an interception in a single game (vs. Wisconsin in 1982). The six interceptions are the most in a game since Iowa had a school-record seven interceptions vs. Wisconsin in 1982.

lowa has turned 24 turnovers into 84 points in 2021. The Hawkeyes' defense has scored 20 points (3 TDs and 1 safety).

lowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 14 seasons and 19 of the last 21.

The Hawkeyes are ranked 19th in the AP poll and 16th in the coaches poll.

lowa reached as high at No. 2 in the AP and coaches polls this season, its highest ranking since Nov. 26, 1985 (#2). Iowa spent five weeks ranked No. 1 in 1985.

lowa has three wins this season over ranked opponents (vs. #17 Indiana, 34-6; at #9 Iowa State, 27-17; vs. #4 Penn State, 23-20) and has won six straight against ranked opponents overall. Only Alabama (9) has more consecutive wins over ranked opponents.

The Hawkeyes' six straight wins against ranked opponents dates back to 2019. The last time lowa won six straight against ranked opponents was a six-game stretch in 1960.

lowa opened the 2021 season ranked 18th in the AP Poll. It marked the third straight season lowa was ranked in the AP Top 25 preseason poll and its highest preseason appearance since being ranked 17th in 2016.

lowa's first two opponents were ranked in the AP Top 25 (No. 17 Indiana, No. 9 Iowa State). It marked the fourth time in program history the Hawkeyes have opened a season against consecutive opponents ranked in the AP Top 25 (1960, 1973, 1974). The Hawkeyes started 2-0 in 1960, 1-1 in 1974 and 0-2 in 1973.

lowa has been ranked in the AP Top 25 at least once in each of the last seven seasons, the third-longest streak in school history. Iowa finished the 2020 season ranked 15th in the coaches poll and 16th in the AP poll. It marked the 26th time in program history that lowa finished the season ranked in the top 25. Iowa has finished ranked 15th or better in the AP poll six times in 22 completed seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

THAT'S NOT A PUNT... THAT'S A PUNT

Melbourne, Australia, native Tory Taylor ranks fourth in the Big Ten averaging 45.8 yards per punt. Taylor is tied for the Big Ten lead and ranks fourth nationally with 58 punts. He has 17 punts of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 69-yard punt at lowa State in Week 2. Twenty-eight of his punts have been downed inside the 20 this season. Taylor was recognized as a first-team midseason All-American by The Athletic.

lowa owned the field position battle in each of its seven wins. The Hawkeyes averaged 20-plus yards better in field position three times (+20 vs. Penn State; +22 at Maryland; +22 at lowa State).

This season, Taylor has recorded three of the top nine single-game punting averages in the Ferentz era. Iowa's Week 2 punting average of 51.1 ranks No. 3 all-time in the Ferentz era. Its Week 1 punting average of 49.5 ranks No. 7 and the 49.0 average Week 8 ties for ninth.

Taylor was Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following Iowa's win at Iowa State. He averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts. Five of his punts were downed inside the 20, while Iowa State had just one punt return.

In Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State, Taylor punted nine times, dropping six inside the 20, five inside the 10 and three punts inside the five.

In 2020, Taylor was named Eddleman-Fields Big Ten Punter of the Year and first-team All-Big Ten by the coaches, media and Associated Press. He ranked third in the Big Ten and 19th in the country averaging 44.1 yards per punt. The freshman downed 18 of his 40 punts inside the 20. Only six of Taylor's 32 punts were returned (31 yards). Iowa ranked fifth nationally and No. 1 in the Big Ten in net punting (42.9).

Taylor is on the Ray Guy Award Preseason Watch List and is a preseason first-team All-America honoree by The Athletic. He was one of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award and was named a first-team Freshman All-American by the FWAA in 2020.

RETURN TO SENDER

WR Charlie Jones is the only player in the conference to rank in the top three in average yards per kickoff return and punt return. Jones has returned 15 kickoffs for an average of 23.9 yards per return, No. 3 in the Big Ten. He averages 10.4 yards (second in Big Ten) on a league-high 26 punt returns.

GOODSON LEADS GROUND GAME

RB Tyler Goodson leads Iowa's rushing attack with 754 yards on 170 attempts. The 170 carries is a single-season career high. He is eight yards shy of matching his single-season best in rushing yards (762 in 2020). Goodson's six rushing touchdowns rank sixth in the Big Ten.

Goodson rushed for 141 yards and a touchdown his last time out (Week 9 at Northwestern). It was his seventh-career 100-yard game, his second this season. He has been lowa's leading rusher in 12 straight games, the longest streak by a Hawkeye since Shonn Greene led lowa in rushing yards in 13 straight games in 2008. Before Greene, Ladell Betts was lowa's top rusher for 37 straight games from 1998-2001. Betts is now lowa's running backs coach.

Goodson has 2,154 career rushing yards (13th all-time). He is the 16th player in program history to rush for 2,000 yards in a career.

He rushed 22 times for a career-high 153 yards and a career-high three touchdowns Week 3 against Kent State. It was the third-multi-touchdown game of his career. Against Kent State, Goodson became the fifth Iowa player (sixth instance as Akrum Wadley did it twice) in the Ferentz era to rush for 150-plus yards and 3-plus touchdowns in a game (LeShun Daniels 2015, Shonn Greene 2008, Akrum Wadley 2015, 2017, Mark Weisman 2012). His third touchdown rush against Kent State pushed him over 100 career points scored (104). He now has 110 points.

Goodson led the Hawkeyes and ranked third in the Big Ten with 762 rushing yards in 2020. He had seven rushing touchdowns, tied for fourth in the Big Ten. He was named first-team All-Big Ten by coaches, media and Associated Press in 2020.

Goodson led Iowa in rushing attempts (143) and rushing yards (762) in 2020. He tied for

In Iowa's 23-19 win against No. 7 Minnesota in 2019, Goodson became the first true freshman to start at running back under Ferentz since 2012 (Greg Garmon). He was also the first true freshman to lead the team in single-season rushing in 2019 (638 yards).

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 20 times in the last 21 seasons. Iowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz is one bowl win shy of tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 9-8 bowl record and has led lowa to three straight bowl wins, tying its longest such streak in program history. Ferentz's nine bowl wins tie Barry Alvarez for second in Big Ten history.

Seventeen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Nick Saban (16), Mack Brown (14), Gary Patterson (11), Kyle Whittingham (11), Mike Gundy (10) and Dabo Swinney (10) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.

Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (11) and Wisconsin (10) have more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than Iowa. Iowa is 17-15-1 alltime in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

That includes a 418-224-16 (.647) record in home games, a 255-340-23 (.431) record in games away from Iowa City, a 345-385-25 (.474) mark in Big Ten games and a 302-189-15 (.612) record in Kinnick Stadium.

5 HAWKEYES NAMED TO MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICA TEAMS

Five members of the University of Iowa football team have been recognized on college football's midseason All-America football teams. Junior center Tyler Linderbaum was named first-team center by the Associated Press, Sporting News, CBS Sports, and The Athletic.

Senior defensive back Matt Hankins, also named first-team by the Associated Press, is named first team by CBS Sports and second team by The Athletic. Senior defensive back Riley Moss is a first team selection by Sporting News.

Sophomore punter Tory Taylor is recognized as a first-team selection by the Athletic, while junior linebacker Jack Campbell is a second-team choice by The Athletic.

Linderbaum is one of 12 semifinalists for the 2021 Rotary Lombardi Award. He was tabbed preseason first-team All-Big Ten and preseason first-team All-America by five media outlets, including Associated Press, The Athletic, Athlon Sports, Phil Steele and Sporting News. Linderbaum was also named to the Big Ten Conference preseason honors list, as well as the Rimington Trophy and Outland Trophy watch lists.

Hankins was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week, the Rose Bowl Game Big Ten Conference Player of the Week and the Bronko Nagurski and Thorpe Award national Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State. Hankins had five tackles and a fourth quarter interception in the win over Penn State. He had two interceptions earlier in the season in Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.

Moss leads the Big Ten with four interceptions and leads the country in interceptions per game (0.67). Moss had two interception returns for touchdowns in Iowa's opening win over Indiana. He has 10 career interceptions, with three returned for touchdowns.

Taylor has been at his best in the biggest games. Six of nine punts against No. 4 Penn State were inside the 20, including four inside the five-yard line. In Iowa's win at Iowa State Taylor dropped three of his punts inside the 10-yard line.

Campbell earned national Player of the Week honors when he recorded 18 tackles in lowa's win over Colorado State. He leads the Hawkeyes with 76 tackles and is a semifinalist for the Dick Butkus Award. He returned a fumble recovery for a touchdown at Iowa State and his fumble recovery against Colorado State led directly to a Hawkeye touchdown.

CAMPBELL NAMED BUTKUS AWARD SEMIFINALIST

LB Jack Campbell was named one of 16 semifinalists for the Dick Butkus Award. The announcement was made Nov. 1 by the Butkus Foundation.

Campbell leads lowa with 83 tackles, including 39 solo tackles and 44 assists. He also has six pass break-ups, two recovered fumbles, one caused fumble and 2.5 tackles for loss. He ranks fifth in the Big Ten in tackles per game (9.2).

Campbell was named a second-team midseason All-American by The Athletic. He was the Bronko Nagurski national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's win over Colorado State. He recorded a career-high 18 tackles against Colorado State. He had seven solo tackles and 11 assists and added three pass break-ups to go with his second fumble recovery of the season (touchdown at Iowa State).

Former lowa linebacker Josey Jewell was a finalist for the Butkus Award in 2016 and a semifinalist in 2017. Finalists for the 2021 Butkus Award will be announced Nov. 22, with the winner being announced on or before Dec. 7.

DB Matt Hankins and DB Riley Moss were named semifinalists for the 2021 Paycom Jim Thorpe Award, awarded to the best defensive back in college football. The announcement was made Oc.t 25 by the Oklahoma Sports Hall of Fame.

Hankins has started 36 straight games in the Iowa secondary and has recorded three interceptions this season. He was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week, the Rose Bowl Game Big Ten Conference Player of the Week, the Bronko Nagurski national Defensive Player of the Week, and the Thorpe Award Player of the Week following Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State. Hankins had five tackles and a fourth quarter interception in Iowa's win over Penn State. He had two interceptions in Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.

Hankins was named a midseason first-team All-American by the Associated Press and CBSSports.com, and a second team selection by The Athletic. He was also recognized by the Thorpe Award following his play in Iowa's win at Iowa State.

Moss is tied for second in the country and leads the Big Ten with four interceptions, despite missing Weeks 8-10 due to injury. Moss had two interceptions returns for touchdowns in Iowa's opening win over Indiana. He has 10 career interceptions, with three returned for touchdowns.

Moss collected his fourth interception of the season in lowa's win over Penn State, before suffering a knee injury just before halftime of that contest. Moss was named a first-team midseason All-American by Sporting News.

Three finalists will be selected on Nov. 23, with the winner being announced Dec. 9 at The Home Depot College Football Awards Show. The official presentation of the Thorpe Award takes place in Oklahoma City on Feb. 8, 2022.

start the 2021 season included wins over three ranked opponents.

Linderbaum was tabbed preseason first-team All-Big Ten and was named a midseason first-team All-American by the Associated Press, Sporting News, CBS Sports, and The Athletic. Linderbaum was also named to the Big Ten Conference preseason honors list, as well as the Rimington Trophy and Outland Trophy watch lists.

Linderbaum was a finalist for the Rimington Trophy a year ago and earned first-team All-America honors from The Athletic and Pro Football Focus. He was a second-team All-America honoree by the Associated Press, FWAA, Phil Steele, and the Walter Camp Foundation. He was a first-team All-Big Ten selection by league media.

The Rotary Lombardi Award goes annually to the college football offensive or defensive lineman, who in addition to outstanding performance and ability, best exemplifies the character and discipline of NFL Hall of Fame Head Coach Vince Lombardi.

Four finalists for the 2021 Lombardi Award will be announced Nov. 9 in Houston, with the winner being announced Dec. 8, also in Houston. Five Hawkeyes have previously been named semifinalists for the Lombardi Award, while defensive end Adrian Clayborn was a finalist in 2010.

MOSS EARNS WEEKLY CONFERENCE AND NATIONAL HONORS

DB Riley Moss was named Walter Camp FBS National Defensive Player of the Week and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following No. 18 Iowa's 34-6 win over No. 17 Indiana on Sept. 4.

Moss became just the third player in school history to return two interceptions for touchdowns in a single game. He had a 30-yard interception return to give lowa a 14-0 advantage in the opening minutes of the game. Moss collected his second touchdown in the final minutes of the second quarter, returning the theft 55 yards for the score. Moss added one solo tackle and two pass break-ups against the Hoosiers as the Hawkeye defense allowed just 233 yards total offense.

Moss has 10 career interceptions for 239 yards, including three touchdown returns. The 10 thefts tie for 11th in program history, while his 239 return yards rank second among lowa's career leaders (Tyler Sash, 392 yards). The three touchdowns tie Desmond King and Tom Knight for the most in school history.

Moss is the sixth Hawkeye to earn the Walter Camp national award, which is in its 18th year of being presented on a weekly basis to one offensive and one defensive player. Previous Hawkeye honorees include linebacker Chad Greenway (2004), linebacker Mike Klinkenborg (2006), linebacker Josey Jewell (2017), defensive back Josh Jackson (2017) and quarterback Nate Stanley (2018).

The weekly conference honor is the second of his career. He was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week in 2018 following a pair of interceptions at Minnesota.

Taylor earned the Big Ten honors after playing a key role in lowa's 27-17 win at lowa State. He averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts, with a long of 69 yards. Five of his punts were downing inside the 20, while lowa State had just one punt return.

The Big Ten Player of the Week honor is a career first for Taylor. He was named to the Ray Guy Award preseason Watch List in July after being named a semifinalist for the award in 2020. Taylor was the Eddleman-Fields Big Ten Conference Punter of the Year in 2020 while earning first-team All-Big Ten honors. He was named first-team Freshman All-America by the FWAA and second-team All-America by The Athletic.

CAMPBELL NAMED B1G DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

LB Jack Campbell was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week following No. 5 Iowa's 24-14 win over Colorado State on Sept. 25. He was also named the Bronko Nagurski national Defensive Player of the Week.

Campbell led Iowa's defensive effort in the 24-14 win over Colorado State as the Hawkeyes rallied from a 14-7 halftime deficit. Campbell recovered a Colorado State fumble at the six-yard line in the third quarter, which led to Iowa scoring on the next play to tie the contest, 14-14. Campbell recorded a career-high 18 tackles against Colorado State. He had seven solo tackles and 11 assists and added three pass break-ups to go with his second fumble recovery of the season (touchdown at Iowa State).

HANKINS NAMED B1G DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

DB Matt Hankins was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week following No. 3 Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State on Oct. 9. He was also named Nagurski, Thorpe and Rose Bowl Game National Player of the Week following his Week 6 performance.

Hankins was credited with five tackles in Iowa's win over Penn State, including three solo stops and two assists, along with Iowa's fourth and final interception of the day. Hankins was credited with a solo tackle on a Penn State fourth-and-three attempt with 3:39 remaining, stopping a PSU drive that reached the Iowa 45-yardline.

Hankins then stopped Penn State's next possession with an interception on fourth down, his third of the season. Hankins had two interceptions earlier this season in Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.

IOWA STREAK HITS, ENDS AT 12

lowa finished the 2020 season with six straight wins and opened the 2021 season with six consecutive wins. The Hawkeyes outscored those 12 opponents, 403-161, averaging 33.6 points per game offensively and allowing 13.4 ppg during the winning streak.

The 12-game win streak was Iowa's longest since opening the 2015 season with 12 straight wins. Iowa reached the Big Ten Championship game that season and accepted an invitation to the 2016 Rose Bowl game. The 12-game winning streak ranks fourth all-time in school history (20, 1920-23; 14, 1899-00; 13, 2008-09).

Iowa's 12-game streak including nine straight wins against Big Ten opponents (2020-21). It marked the second longest streak of consecutive Big Ten wins. Iowa won 10 straight from 2001-02.



IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 20 of the last 21 seasons.
 Iowa is 9-8 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (11) and Wisconsin (10) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 17-15-1 in 33 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- lowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (173-106) replaced Fry and is in his 23rd season in 2021. Ferentz also served as lowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- lowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/ USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 350 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- lowa has had 10 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.

FIND THE NFL-ER

The Hawkeyes have had NFL talent on their offensive line in each of Kirk Ferentz's 22 seasons. Eighteen Iowa offensive linemen have been selected in the NFL Draft, including five in the first round. Former Hawkeye linemen under Ferentz have combined for 13 Pro Bowl appearances. Below is a list of players, by year, that played on the Hawkeyes' offensive line prior to joining the NFL.
