IOWA HAWKEYES (12-6-2)

HEAD COACH | DAVE DIIANNI (8TH SEASON)

SEASON IN REVIEW

The 2021 Hawkeyes posted a 12-6-2 record and placed fourth in the Big Ten, lowa's highest finish in the regular season since 1999. The 12-win season was the seventh in program history and the third in head coach Dave Dilanni's eight seasons. Fifth-year senior Alyssa Walker anchored an improved lowa offense that finished in the top half of the confernce in points with nine goals and 20 points, while the stout Hawkeye defense posted seven shutouts and held 18 opponents to two scores or fewer through 20 games.

POSTSEASON ACTION

The Hawkeyes headed into the Big Ten Tournament looking to defend their 2020 crown. Fifth-seeded lowa dispatched No. 4 Michigan State, 1-0, at the DeMartin Soccer Complex, propelled by a second half goal from Alyssa Walker off a fastbreak steal. Goalkeeper Macy Enneking finished with six saves as the sophomore pitched her fourth-straight shutout at the Big Ten Tournament. The Hawkeyes fell in the second round in a close battle at Rutgers; both teams went into halftime scoreless, but a late offensive flurry earned the Scarlet Kights the 2-0 victory.

5 HAWKEYES EARN BIG TEN POSTSEASON HONORS

Five Hawkeyes earned Big Ten Conference postseason honors, the league office announced Oct. 28. Sara Wheaton was named to the All-Big Ten second team. Alyssa Walker and Hailey Rydberg picked up third-team honors. Addie Bundy was a unanimous selection on the All-Freshman team and Riley Whitaker was one of 14 players to earn the conference sportsmanship award.

The 2021 postseason team marks the first time in 21 years lowa had three players named to one of the top three All-Big Ten teams. In 2000, Sarah Lynch (first team), Julie Atkocaitis (second team) and Kate Walse each earned all-conference recognition.

RYDBERG, WALKER AND WHEATON EARN ALL-REGION HONORS

Seniors Hailey Rydberg, Alyssa Walker and Sara Wheaton were named to the United Soccer Coaches North Region Third-Team. The all-region honor is the first for all three players and marks just the second time in program history three Hawkeyes have been named to an all-region team in the same season. Cloe Lacasse, Melanie Pickert and Alex Melin were recognized in 2013.

Rydberg, a third-team all-Big Ten selection, shared lowa's team MVP honors for the second straight season. She recorded two goals and a team-high seven assists, totaling 11 points from the midfield. She played 1,643 minutes, the third most on the team. Rydberg and Wheaton were the only Hawkeyes to start each of lowa's 20 games.

Wheaton was a second-team All-Big Ten honoree and shared team MVP honors with Rydberg. She played the entire contest in 19-of-20 games and logged a team-high 1,826 minutes. She was also voted lowa's Defensive Player of the Year for the second straight season. In 2021, she scored one goal and contributed three assists while anchoring a defense that allowed fewer than one goal per game.

Walker paced the Hawkeye offense, scoring nine goals and adding a pair of assists while totaling 20 points. The nine goals in a single season tie for 11th in program history. Four of Walker's nine goals were game-winners. She started in 19-of-20 games played and was named third-team all-Big Ten and lowa's Offensive Player of the Year.

TEAM AWARDS 2021

Seniors Hailey Rydberg and Sara Wheaton were voted the team's Most Valuable Players for the 2021 season. Wheaton was also named team Defensive Player of the Year, while Alyssa Walker was named Offensive Player of the Year. Freshman Addie Bundy was named Newcomer of the Year, while Samantha Cary and Riley Whitaker each received the Hawk Award.







Dave Dilanni finished his eighth season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 301-81-29 career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history. In his eighth season at Iowa, Dilanni has a 80-63-11 record. He has guided the program to two NCAA Tournament appearences and the first Big Ten title in program history.

The Hawkeyes started the 2020 season slowly after losing 12 seniors from the 2019 NCAA Tournament team. After going winless in their first seven games, the tide began to turn midway through the season and lowa was playing its best soccer when it mattered most. With an expanded Big Ten postseason schedule due to league-only scheduling because of the coronavirus pandemic, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to wins over second-seeded Illinois, third-seeded Minnesota in the Big Ten Regional weekend. The team followed with a road win at top-seeded Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals before downing third-seeded Wisconsin to claim the program's first-ever Big Ten title.

As a result, the Hawkeyes earned their second straight NCAA Tournament berth, and they continued to make history by advancing to the second round for the first time in school history with a 1-0 win over Campbell. lowa had third-seeded UCLA on the ropes in the Round of 32 before surrendering two goals late in a 2-1 defeat to close out the season.

lowa finished the season with a 7-9-1 record, with all seven of the victories coming in the team's final 10 games.

DIIANNI CLOSES IN ON MILESTONES

lowa head coach Dave Dilanni earned his 300th career win on Oct. 21, a 1-0 win over Minnesota. Dilanni has 19 years of collegiate head coaching experience, including 11 at Grand Valley State and eight at the University of Iowa, combining for a record of 301-81-29. Dilanni is the third active Big Ten coach to reach 300 career wins, joining Nebraska's John Waller (338) and Maryland's Ray Leone (309). Iowa's win in the opening round of the conference tournament at Michigan State was Dilanni's 80th win as a Hawkeye, tying Ron Rainey as the program's all-time leader.

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS

lowa posted seven shutouts and held 18 opponents to two scores or fewer through 20 games. Redshirt junior Monica Wilhelm notched 58 saves while allowing just 17 goals through 16 starts. Wilhelm tallied a career-best 11 saves against Rutgers on Oct. 10. Sophomore Macy Enneking saw action in five games down the stretch in 2021, including four starts. She tallied 27 saves and allowed three goals in that span.

90 TRACKER

Fourteen Hawkeye position players registered at least 90 minutes in a game. They include Sara Wheaton (19), Samantha Cary (14) Rielee Fetty (11), Riley Whitaker (seven), Hailey Rydberg (five), Addie Bundy (four), Olivia Hellweg (two), Miah Schueller, Aleisha Ganief, Courtney Powell, Kenzie Roling, Alyssa Walker, Meike Ingles, and Maggie Johnston.

2 FOR THE MONEY

The Hawkeyes are undefeated in their last 31 games when scoring two goals or more. Since the start of the 2018 season, lowa has a record of 30-0-1 when scoring two goals or more. That includes a 9-0 record in 2021, 2-0 in 2020, 13-0-1 in 2019 and 5-0 in 2018. The Hawkeyes won their final two games in 2017 when scoring two-plus goals. The last time lowa lost a game while netting at least two goals was Oct. 1, 2017 at Michigan State (L, 3-2).

SHARING THE WEALTH

Eleven different Hawkeyes combined for 31 goals this season. Fifth-year senior Alyssa Walker led the way offensively with nine goals and 20 points, finishing third in the Big Ten in goals scored. Forward Kenzie Roling also put up six goals for 12 points of her own, while forwards Courtney Powell and Meike Ingles each scored three times. Defender Samantha Cary and midfielder Hailey Rydberg have each sank a pair of goals. Defenders Sara Wheaton, Natalie Massa, and Riley Burns, as well as forwards Maggie Johnston and Samantha Tawharu each scored one goal apiece. Rydberg tallied a team-best seven assists, while freshman Addie Bundy totaled six assists. Iowa has outshot opponents 290-243 on the season.

POWELL PLAYS FOR FAMILY

Graduate student Courtney Powell transferred to lowa from lowa State in 2021 and played her final collegiate season as a tribute her father, a lifelong Hawkeye fan who passed away due to COVID-19. Powell's season-high 81 minutes and early goal were crucial in putting the Cyclones away in lowa's 2-1 Cy-Hawk victory Aug. 26.

YOU CAN CALL IT A COMEBACK

lowa orchestrated the largest comeback in program history on Oct. 14, erasing a 3-0 deficit at Nebraska on the road at Hibner Stadium and scoring four unanswered goals.

A goal in the seventh minute of action by Cornhusker Elenore Dale set the tone for most of the first half, and the Huskers took a 3-0 lead six minutes before the break off of a pair of scores from Sarah Weber.

Then, three minutes before the half, Sara Wheaton launched a perfect ball from midfield down to Alyssa Kellar who served the ball to Courtney Powell for a smooth Hawkeye goal.

lowa continued to chip into the Husker lead when Hailey Rydberg drilled a penalty kick for lowa's second score four minutes into the second half to cut Nebraska's lead to one. lowa earned the equalizer at the 64th mark when Samantha Cary floated the ball into the box to set up a laser to the back-right corner of the net from Kenzie Roling.

History repeated itself with nine minutes to play, as Cary again sent a ball into the box to force a scrum, and lowa's leading scorer Alyssa Walker connected on a header and bounced the gamewinner into the lower left corner to give the Hawkeyes the lead.

 for the first time in school history.
- In 2019 and 2020, lowa made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time in program history.

LOOKING AHEAD

Eight student-athlete have signed national letters of intent to join the Hawkeye program in 2022. The 2022 recruiting class includes class includes one forward, one goalkeeper, two midfielders, and four defenders. That class is represented by six states. They include lowa (Vonderhaar and Woods), Michigan (Fife and Kozicki), Colorado (Formanek), Illinois (Hahn), North Carolina (Skibo) and Missouri (Welker).
