## 1<sup>ST</sup> & 10

- lowa won the Big Ten West Division title for second time (2015) and put together a 10-win season for the seventh time under Kirk Ferentz (2002, 2003, 2004, 2009, 2015, 2019, 2021).
- lowa finished the season ranked 23rd in the AP poll and 23rd in the final Coaches Poll. lowa was ranked in the final AP poll for the fourth straight season, which is the longest streak under head coach Kirk Ferentz and the second longest in program history (five straight years from 1983-87).
- lowa finished the season in the AP Poll for the fourth straight season, which is the longest steak under Ferentz and second longest in program history (5 straight from 1983-87). lowa had three wins over ranked opponents (vs. #17 Indiana, 34-6; at #9 Iowa State, 27-17; vs. #4 Penn State, 23-20).
- lowa has won 19 conference games over the last three seasons, the most successful threeyear stretch since winning 20 conference games from 2002-04. Iowa has won at least six conference games in three straight years for the first time under Kirk Ferentz (19 wins).
- lowa led the country with a school-record 25 interceptions and tied for third nationally in takeaways (31). The Hawkeyes have 89 interceptions since 2017, more than any team in the country.
- C Tyler Linderbaum became the 12th Hawkeye to earn unanimous consensus All-America status. Iowa football has had a consensus All-American in three straight seasons for the first time in program history. Linderbaum was also the 2021 Rimington Trophy winner, which is awarded to the nation's premier center in college football.
- K Caleb Shudak was named third-team All-American by the Associated Press. Shudak connected on 24-28 FGs and all 36 PAT attempts in 2021, leading the Hawkeyes in scoring with 108 points, the fifth-best single season total in school history. Shudak finished his career 24-29 on FG attempts, an 82.8 career percentage that ranks No. 1 in school history.
- LB Jack Campbell was named second-team All-American by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Campbell led the country with 143 tackles, including 57 solo tackles and 86 assists. The 143 tackles rank fifth in single-season school history and are the most by a Hawkeye since Pat Angerer had 145 in 2009.
- WR Charlie Jones was the Rodgers-Dwight Big Ten Return Specialist of the Year. Jones ranked third in the Big Ten averaging 7.7 yards on a league-high 37 punt returns. He returned 25 kickoffs for an average of 25.4 yards per return, No. 2 in the Big Ten.
- TE Sam LaPorta led lowa in receptions (53) and receiving yards (670). He is the first TE to lead lowa in receptions and receiving yards since T.J. Hockenson in 2018 (49-760). LaPorta had a career-high 122 receiving yards and matched his career high with seven receptions at the 2021 Citrus Bowl. He is the first lowa tight end to have 100 yards receiving since T.J. Hockenson in 2018 (107 vs. Indiana).



lowa was 3-3 in trophy games in 2021. The Hawkeyes are 25-7 in their last 32 trophy games (includes bowl games and conference championships).

lowa is 22-6 in its last 28 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).

The Hawkeyes defeated Nebraska 28-21 to capture the Heroes Trophy for the seventh straight year. Iowa retained possession of Floyd of Rosedale with a 27-22 win against Minnesota on Nov. 13. The Hawkeyes lost possession of the Heartland Trophy on Oct. 30 at Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes defeated No. 9 Iowa State, 27-17, on Sept. 11 to win the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series game for the sixth consecutive time.

#### IN THE RANKINGS

The Hawkeyes are ranked 23rd in the final AP Poll and 23rd in the final Coaches Poll. lowa finished in the AP Poll for the fourth straight season, which is the longest streak under head coach Kirk Ferentz and the second longest in program history (five straight years from 1983-87).

lowa reached as high at No. 2 in the AP and Coaches polls this season, its highest ranking since Nov. 26, 1985 (#2). Iowa spent five weeks ranked No. 1 in 1985.

lowa has three wins this season over ranked opponents (vs. #17 Indiana, 34-6; at #9 Iowa State, 27-17; vs. #4 Penn State, 23-20).

lowa opened the 2021 season ranked 18th in the AP Poll. It marked the third straight season lowa was ranked in the AP Top 25 preseason poll and its highest preseason appearance since being ranked 17th in 2016.

lowa's first two opponents were ranked in the AP Top 25 (No. 17 Indiana, No. 9 Iowa State). It marked the fourth time in program history the Hawkeyes have opened a season against consecutive opponents ranked in the AP Top 25 (1960, 1973, 1974). The Hawkeyes started 2-0 in 1960, 1-1 in 1974 and 0-2 in 1973.

lowa has been ranked in the AP Top 25 at least once in each of the last seven seasons, the third-longest streak in school history. Iowa finished the 2020 season ranked 15th in the coaches poll and 16th in the AP poll. It marked the 26th time in program history that Iowa finished the season ranked in the top 25. Iowa has finished ranked 15th or better in the AP poll six times in 22 completed seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

#### **HAWKEYE HISTORY**

lowa has played 1,281 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 676-566-39 (.543). That includes a 420-224-16 (.647) record in home games, a 256-342-23 (.431) record in games away from Iowa City, a 348-385-25 (.476) mark in Big Ten games and a 304-189-15 (.612) record in Kinnick Stadium.

#### **HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ**

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) completed his 23rd season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and Big Ten West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 178 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He
  has 110 Big Ten wins, which ranks fourth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 12 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- lowa has posted a 169-89 (.655) overall mark and a 106-65 (.620) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 15 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 178-110 (.618) and a 110-79 (.582) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 178 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 190-131 (.592).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college.
   Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and lowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

Moon Family Head Football Coach Kirk Ferentz has 110 Big Ten wins as lowa's head coach, the fourth most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history. The Hawkeyes defeated Penn State, 41-21, on Nov. 21, 2020, to earn Ferentz's 100th conference win.

Ferentz's 178 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five include Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Ferentz (178) and Joe Paterno (162).

Ferentz (178-110) became lowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as lowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached lowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz completed his 23rd season in 2021.

Both Ferentz (178, 110) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top 10 in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only lowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

lowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

#### **FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY**

Kirk Ferentz completed his 23rd season as Iowa's head football coach in 2021. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) has been at his current school for 10 seasons or more.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker completed his 23rd season on Iowa's staff in 2021, his 10th as defensive coordinator. He is the longest tenured defensive coordinator in FBS

Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to lowa in 2017 to coach lowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), completed his 10th season on lowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

#### **CELEBRATING #300**

The Hawkeyes' 30-7 win against Kent State on Sept. 18 was their 300th win at Kinnick Stadium since the stadium opened in 1929. The first game played at Kinnick Stadium was Oct. 5, 1929, a 46-0 Hawkeye win against Monmouth. Iowa's 100th win at Kinnick was a 31-19 victory over Arizona on Oct. 4, 1969. The 200th win at Kinnick Stadium was a 44-19 victory against Miami, Ohio, on Sept. 8, 2001. Iowa became the seventh Big Ten school to celebrate at least 300 wins in its home stadium.

#### LINDERBAUM NAMED CONSENSUS ALL-AMERICAN, WINNER OF RIMINGTON TROPHY

C Tyler Linderbaum became the 12th Hawkeye to earn unanimous consensus All-America status. He was named first-team All-America by the Walter Camp Foundation, the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), Associated Press, Sporting News, and AFCA.

Linderbaum is the 28th Hawkeye to earn consensus All-America status, while two of those players (OL Calvin Jones and LB Larry Station) earned the distinction in two separate seasons. Iowa football has had a consensus All-American in three straight seasons for the first time in program history.

Along with the consensus All-America status, Linderbaum received the Rimington Trophy, which is awarded to the nation's top center. He was a finalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award and the Outland Trophy. He was named the Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year in the Big Ten, while earning first-team All-Big Ten honors for the second straight season.

Linderbaum started 35 consecutive games at center for the Hawkeyes after playing as a defensive lineman as a true freshman. Iowa posted a 26-9 record during that span. The Hawkeyes won their final six games in 2020 and began the 2021 season with six straight wins.

Linderbaum was recognized at the Rimington Trophy banquet in Lincoln, Nebraska, on Jan. 15. He is the first Hawkeye to earn the Rimington Trophy. He was also a finalist in 2020. Austin Blythe (2015) and Bruce Nelson (2002) were previously finalists for the award.

#### **CAMPBELL LEADS COUNTRY, EARNS ALL-AMERICA HONORS**

LB Jack Campbell was named second-team All-American by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) and Phil Steele. Campbell led the country with 143 tackles, including 57 solo tackles and 86 assists. The 143 tackles rank fifth in single-season school history and are the most by a Hawkeye since Pat Angerer had 145 in 2009.

Campbell is the first Hawkeye to record 100 tackles in a single season since Josey Jewell, who had 100+ tackles each year from 2015-17 (126, 124, 136). Campbell had five double-digit tackle performances (11, 18, 17, 16, 14) this season. He was named one of 16 semifinalists for the Dick Butkus Award.

Campbell recorded his first interception of the season Week 11 against Illinois and returned it 32 yards for a touchdown. He had his second interception of the season at the Big Ten Championship Game. He also has six pass break-ups, two recovered fumbles, one caused fumble and 3.5 tackles for loss.

Campbell was named a second-team midseason All-American by The Athletic. He was the Bronko Nagurski national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's win over Colorado State. He recorded a career-high 18 tackles against Colorado State. He had seven solo tackles and 11 assists and added three pass break-ups to go with his second fumble recovery of the season (touchdown at Iowa State).

#### **RETURN TO SENDER**

WR Charlie Jones was the Rodgers-Dwight Big Ten Return Specialist of the Year. Jones ranked third in the Big Ten averaging 7.7 yards on a league-high 37 punt returns. He returned 25 kickoffs for an average of 25.4 yards per return, No. 2 in the Big Ten. He returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown Week 11 against Illinois.

Jones's 37 punt returns are the most by a Hawkeye in a single season since Peter Maricano returned 39 punts (3.8 average) in 1987. The school record for punt returns in a single season is 40 by Ramon Ochoa in 2003 (12.4 average).

Jones is one of three players in school history to score touchdowns on both kickoff and punt returns. (Jones returned a punt 54 yards for a touchdown vs. Michigan State in 2020). The others include C.J. Jones (100-yard kickoff, 65-yard punt) and Kahlil Hill (two kickoffs: 90, 88; two punts: 62, 57).

#### **GOODSON DECLARES FOR NFL DRAFT**

RB Tyler Goodson announced on Dec. 10 that he has completed his Hawkeye playing career and declared for the NFL Draft. Goodson started 13 games this season.

Goodson led Iowa's rushing attack with 1,151 yards on 156 attempts, both single-season career highs. His six rushing touchdowns rank ninth in the Big Ten. He is the first Hawkeye to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season since 2017 (Akrum Wadley, 1,109).

Goodson rushed for a career-high 156 yards in Iowa's Week 12 win at Nebraska. It was his ninth career 100-yard rushing game and his fourth this season. He had four 100-yard rushing games this season (153, 141, 132, 156).

Goodson has 2,551 career rushing yards, 10th all-time in program history.

In Iowa's 23-19 win against No. 7 Minnesota in 2019, Goodson became the first true freshman to start at running back under Ferentz since 2012 (Greg Garmon). He was also the first true freshman to lead the team in single-season rushing in 2019 (638 yards).

#### **GOING THE OTHER WAY**

lowa led the country with a school-record 25 interceptions. The Hawkeyes have 89 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country. Eleven Hawkeyes had at least one interception this season. The last time lowa had 11 players with an interception in a single season was 1997 (14).

LB/DB Dane Belton tied for fourth in the NCAA and second in the Big Ten with five interceptions. DB Riley Moss and DB Jermari Harris had four interceptions, and DB Matt Hankins had three interceptions. The last time Iowa had four players with at least three interceptions in a single season was 2018 (Gervase 4, Hooker 4, Stone 4, Ojemudia 3).

Moss had two interceptions returned for a touchdown, both in Week 1. LB Jack Campbell returned an interception 32 yards for a touchdown against Illinois in Week 11.

lowa combined for 10 interceptions in consecutive games against Maryland and Penn State, which ties Miami (2001) for second most over a two-game span over the last 25 years. Mississippi State had 11 in 2002.

Six different Hawkeyes intercepted a pass in Iowa's 51-14 win at Maryland, tying a school record for most players with an interception in a single game (vs. Wisconsin in 1982). The six interceptions are the most in a game since Iowa had a school-record seven interceptions vs. Wisconsin in 1982.

lowa turned 31 turnovers into 92 points in 2021. The Hawkeyes' defense scored 28 points (4 TDs and 2 safeties). Iowa's special teams had two touchdowns (one kickoff return, one blocked punt return).

lowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 14 seasons and 19 of the last 21.

#### **FRESH LEGS**

Three true freshman started at least one game this season. Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first season at Iowa, only 31 true freshmen have started for the Hawkeyes.

In Iowa's Week 4 win against Colorado State, OL Connor Colby started at RG and WR Keagan Johnson started at wide receiver. Colby was the first true freshman offensive lineman to start since Tristan Wirfs in 2017. Johnson was the first true freshman wide receiver to start since Ihmir Smith-Marsette in 2017.

WR Arland Bruce IV made his first career start Week 11 against Illinois. He had a career-long 28-yard reception to set up a 2-yard touchdown rush in the second quarter. Johnson started the same game, marking the first time two true freshmen wide receivers started a game in the Ferentz era.

Colby and DL Lukas Van Ness were named Freshman All-American by the Maxwell Football Club and Football Writers Association of America. Van Ness tied for the team lead with 7.0 sacks and ranked second with 8.5 tackles-for-loss.

Redshirt freshman RB Gavin Williams set career highs with 98 yards rushing on a career-best 16 carries in his first career start at the 2022 Citrus Bowl. He became the first lowa running back to have his first career start come in a bowl game since Jordan Canzeri made his first career start at the 2011 Insight Bowl against Oklahoma.

#### PETRAS AMONG ALL-TIME LEADERS

QB Spencer Petras started 17 consecutive games from the 2020 season opener through Week 9 of 2021. Petras's streak of consecutive starts was snapped when he did not play Nov. 13 against Minnesota due to injury.

Petras owns a 13-6 record (.684) as Iowa's starting quarterback, the ninth best winning percentage by a starting quarterback in program history. Iowa has scored 26.0 points per game in 19 Petras starts. He has 3,474 career passing yards, 13th all-time in program history.

Petras led Iowa to 12 consecutive wins from 2020-21, winning the final six games of 2020 and the first six games of 2021. He was 194-324 with 17 touchdown passes, four interceptions and 2,226 passing yards during Iowa's 12-game winning streak.

Petras matched his career high with three touchdown passes and set a career high with two rushing touchdowns Week 5 at Maryland. He became the first lowa quarterback with multiple passing touchdowns and multiple rushing touchdowns in a game since Brad Banks at Minnesota in 2002.

The Hawkeyes averaged 31.8 points per game in 2020, Petras' first year as starting quarterback. It marked Iowa's highest point per game total since 2002 (36.5). Iowa won its final six games in 2020, outscoring its opponents 214-83.

#### PADILLA LEADS IOWA TO WIN IN FIRST CAREER STARTS

QB Alex Padilla led Iowa to two wins in his first two career starts (27-22 vs. Minnesota in Week 10; 33-23 vs. Illinois in Week 11).

Padilla made his first career start Week 10 against Minnesota and passed for career-high 206 yards. He ran for one touchdown (1) and threw for two (72, 27), both career firsts. He was 6-17 for 83 yards in his second career start, a Week 11 win against Illinois.

Padilla started Week 12 at Nebraska but was relieved at halftime with lowa trailing 14-6. QB Spencer Petras started the second half and led Iowa to a 28-21 win.

Padilla entered the game Week 9 at Northwestern on lowa's fourth drive, substituting for the injured Petras. Padilla finished the game with a then-career high 172 passing yards. He set career best in completions (18) and attempts (28). Padilla also relieved Petras after the opening drive of the second half at the Big Ten Championship game. He finished the game 10-15 for 38 yards and an interception.

Petras had started 17 straight games for the Hawkeyes before missing the Nov. 13 contest against Minnesota.

#### SHUDAK EARNS ALL-AMERICA RECOGNITION, SET FIELD GOAL RECORD

K Caleb Shudak was named third-team All-American by the Associated Press. Shudak connected on 24-28 field goals and all 36 PAT attempts in 2021, leading the Hawkeyes in scoring with 108 points, the fifth-best single season total in school history.

Shudak finished his career 24-29 on field goal attempts, an 82.8 career percentage that ranks No. 1 in school history (minimum 25 attempts). His 85.7 field goal percentage in 2021 is the fourth best single-season percentage in school history (minimum 15 attempts).

Shudak connected on 4-6 attempts of 50 yards or more, including a career-long 51 yards on three occasions. Shudak connected on four field goal attempts in late season wins over Illinois and Nebraska and for the season was also 7-7 on field goals between 40-49 yards.

Shudak was named first-team All-Big Ten by league media and second-team by Big Ten coaches. He was the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week for his play at Nebraska, including 4-4 field goals in the 28-21 lowa victory.

While also handling kickoff duties for the third straight season Shudak recorded 45 touchbacks on 72 kicks.

Shudak was one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award, presented by the Orange Bowl. Shudak joined the Iowa program as a walk-on.

#### THAT'S NOT A PUNT... THAT'S A PUNT

Melbourne, Australia, native Tory Taylor ranked fourth in the Big Ten averaging 46.1 yards per punt. Taylor led the Big Ten and ranked second nationally with 80 punts. He had 27 punts of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 69-yard punt at Iowa State in Week 2. Thirty-nine of his punts were downed inside the 20. Taylor was recognized as a first-team midseason All-American by The Athletic and was a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award.

lowa owned the field position battle in each of its 10 wins. The Hawkeyes averaged 20-plus yards better in field position three times (+20 vs. Penn State; +22 at Maryland; +22 at lowa State).

This season, Taylor recorded three of the top nine single-game punting averages in the Ferentz era. lowa's Week 2 punting average of 51.1 ranks No. 3 all-time in the Ferentz era. Its Week 1 punting average of 49.5 ranks No. 7 and the 49.0 average Week 8 ties for ninth.

Taylor was Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following Iowa's win at Iowa State. He averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts. Five of his punts were downed inside the 20, while Iowa State had just one punt return.

In Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State, Taylor punted nine times, dropping six inside the 20, five inside the 10 and three punts inside the five.

Taylor was a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, a midseason first-team All-America honoree by The Athletic. He was one of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award and was named a first-team Freshman All-American by the FWAA in 2020.

#### HANKINS EARNS ALL-AMERICA RECOGNITION

DB Matt Hankins was named second-team All-America by the AFCA and Walter Camp Foundation. Hankins started 37 consecutive games in the Iowa secondary from 2018-21 before suffering a season-ending injury following the Hawkeyes' 27-22 victory over Minnesota. The Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist had three interceptions in 2021. He was named second-team All-Big Ten by league coaches and media, and the Associated Press.

The Lewisville, Texas, native was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week, the Rose Bowl Game Big Ten Conference Player of the Week, the Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week, and the Thorpe Award Player of the Week following Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State. Hankins had five tackles and a fourth quarter interception in Iowa's win over Penn State. He had two interceptions in Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.

#### MOSS EARNS ALL-AMERICA RECOGNITION

DB Riley Moss was named second-team All-America by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) and third-team All-America by the Associated Press.

Moss was named Tatum-Woodson Big Ten Defensive Back of the Year and earned first-team All-Big Ten honors from league coaches and media. He is the fifth Hawkeye to earn the Tatum-Woodson award.

He is tied for 11th in career interceptions (10-239-3 TDs), is one of three players in program history with three interception returns for touchdowns and ranks second in career interception return yards.

#### COLBY, VAN NESS EARN FWAA FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICA HONORS

G Connor Colby and DT Lukas Van Ness were named to the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) Freshman All-America Team.

Colby joined the Hawkeyes last spring and started 11 of 14 games at right guard in his first college season. He earlier earned Freshman All-America honors from the Maxwell Football Club.

Van Ness redshirted his first season before seeing action in 2021. He collected 33 tackles, including 17 solo stops while playing in all 14 games. Van Ness tied for the team lead with seven sacks and had 8.5 tackles for loss, three pressures and one pass break-up.

Van Ness also earned freshman All-America honors from the Maxwell Football Club and earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition as well.

lowa, Ohio State and Texas A&M were the only programs with multiple players on the honor FWAA squad.

#### MOSS EARNS WEEKLY CONFERENCE AND NATIONAL HONORS

DB Riley Moss was named Walter Camp FBS National Defensive Player of the Week and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following No. 18 Iowa's 34-6 win over No. 17 Indiana on Sept. 4.

Moss became just the third player in school history to return two interceptions for touchdowns in a single game. He had a 30-yard interception return to give lowa a 14-0 advantage in the opening minutes of the game. Moss collected his second touchdown in the final minutes of the second quarter, returning the theft 55 yards for the score. Moss added one solo tackle and two pass break-ups against the Hoosiers as the Hawkeye defense allowed just 233 yards total offense.

Moss has 10 career interceptions for 239 yards, including three touchdown returns. The 10 thefts tie for 11th in program history, while his 239 return yards rank second among Iowa's career leaders (Tyler Sash, 392 yards). The three touchdowns tie Desmond King and Tom Knight for the most in school history.

Moss is the sixth Hawkeye to earn the Walter Camp national award, which is in its 18th

LB Jack Campbell was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week following No. 5 lowa's 24-14 win over Colorado State on Sept. 25. He was also named the Bronko Nagurski national Defensive Player of the Week.

Campbell led Iowa's defensive effort in the 24-14 win over Colorado State as the Hawkeyes rallied from a 14-7 halftime deficit. Campbell recovered a Colorado State fumble at the sixyard line in the third quarter, which led to Iowa scoring on the next play to tie the contest, 14-14.

Campbell recorded a career-high 18 tackles against Colorado State. He had seven solo tackles and 11 assists and added three pass break-ups to go with his second fumble recovery of the season (touchdown at lowa State).

#### HANKINS NAMED B1G DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

DB Matt Hankins was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week following No. 3 Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State on Oct. 9. He was also named Nagurski, Thorpe and Rose Bowl Game National Player of the Week following his Week 6 performance.

Hankins was credited with five tackles in Iowa's win over Penn State, including three solo stops and two assists, along with Iowa's fourth and final interception of the day. Hankins was credited with a solo tackle on a Penn State fourth-and-three attempt with 3:39 remaining, stopping a PSU drive that reached the Iowa 45-yardline.

Hankins then stopped Penn State's next possession with an interception on fourth down, his third of the season. Hankins had two interceptions earlier in the season in Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.

The Big Ten weekly honor was the first of Hankins' career.

#### SHUDAK NAMED B1G SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

K Caleb Shudak was named Big Ten Conference Special Teams Player of the Week for his play in the Hawkeyes' 28-21 win at Nebraska on Nov. 26.

Shudak connected on all four field goal attempts against Nebraska, connecting from 51, 48, 36, and 44 yards. The four made field goals matches a career high, set the previous week in Iowa's 33-23 win over Illinois.

Shudak made a career-long 51-yard field goal in three different games this season, including wins over Iowa State, Illinois, and Nebraska. For the season he made 24-of-28 attempts with just two misses from less than 50 yards.

For the season, Shudak leads the Hawkeyes in scoring with 108 points, adding 36-of-36 PAT attempts to go with his 24 made field goals. Shudak's 108 points rank as the fifth-highest single season total in school history. He also handles kickoff duties, recording 45 touchbacks. The Big Ten weekly honor was the first of Shudak's career.

- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.
- Former OL Tristan Wirfs was the starting right tackle as a rookie for the 2021 Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Former DL Anthony Nelson was a reserve defensive end for the Bucs. Former LB Ben Niemann and LB Anthony Hitchens were on the AFC Champion Kansas City Chiefs.
- Entering the 2021 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (16) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 18 lowa tight ends since 1999 (11 drafted/7 free agents).
- · All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

#### **IOWA STREAK HITS, ENDS AT 12**

lowa finished the 2020 season with six straight wins and opened the 2021 season with six consecutive wins. The Hawkeyes outscored those 12 opponents, 403-161, averaging 33.6 points per game offensively and allowing 13.4 ppg during the winning streak.

The 12-game win streak was lowa's longest since opening the 2015 season with 12 straight wins. Iowa reached the Big Ten Championship game that season and accepted an invitation to the 2016 Rose Bowl game. The 12-game winning streak ranks fourth all-time in school history (20, 1920-23; 14, 1899-00; 13, 2008-09).

Iowa's 12-game streak included nine straight wins against Big Ten opponents (2020-21). It marked the second longest streak of consecutive Big Ten wins. Iowa won 10 straight from 2001-02.

#### **HAWKEYES OPENED 6-FOR-6**

lowa opened the season with six straight wins for the third time in the Kirk Ferentz era. Iowa started 9-0 in 2009 and 12-0 in 2015.

#### **BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001**

The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 20 times in the last 21 seasons. Iowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz is one bowl win shy of tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 9-9 bowl record. His nine bowl wins tie Barry Alvarez for second in Big Ten history.

Seventeen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Nick Saban (17), Mack Brown (14), Kyle Whittingham (11), Mike Gundy (11) and Dabo Swinney (11) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.

Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (11) have more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than Iowa. Iowa is 17-16-1 alltime in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

#### NONCONFERENCE, NO PROBLEM

lowa lost to Kentucky at the 2022 Citrus Bowl, snapping a streak of 15 straight wins against non-conference opponents, including 12 regular season non-conference victories and three bowl wins. The nonconference win streak was the longest in the country.

#### **IOWA PLAYER COUNCIL GROUP**

The University of Iowa football program's 2021 Player Council included 16 student-athlete -- six seniors and 10 juniors.

The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies and being involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected following coaching staff and player input.

The 2021 group consisted of seniors Matt Hankins, Ivory Kelly-Martin, Jack Koerner, Kyler Schott, Caleb Shudak and Zach VanValkenburg, and juniors Dane Belton, Seth Benson, Jack Campbell, Joe Evans, Tyler Goodson, Sam LaPorta, Tyler Linderbaum, Kaevon Merriweather, Spencer Petras, and Tyrone Tracy, Jr.

#### **BIG TEN PERFECTION**

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

Kelvin Bell joined the lowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13. He was named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016, and was named defensive line coach in 2019.

Ladell Betts joined the lowa coaching staff as running backs coach in 2021. Betts is the second leading rushing in lowa football history, rushing for 3,686 yards from 1998-2001. He is the only running back in school history to lead the team in rushing four straight years.

Former Hawkeyes Jason Manson and Sam Brincks lead Iowa's player development unit. Manson, the Hawkeyes' director of player development, was a two-year letterman as a quarterback and wide receiver in 2005 and 2006. Brincks is the assistant director of player development and a 2018 lowa graduate. He played defensive tackle for the Hawkeyes from 2015-2018.

#### HAWKEYE LEGACIES

lowa had five players on its 2021 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: LB Eric Epenesa (Epenesa, 1997), DE Joe Evans (Spence, 1989), DB Thomas Hartlieb (Jim, 1989-92), WR Henry Marchese (John, 1985), and LS Liam Reardon (Bill).

Epenesa is one of two players whose brothers played at Iowa: Eric (A.J. 2017-19) and FB Johnny Plewa (Macon in 2013-15).

lowa had one set of the brothers on the team: TE Bryce Schulte and DB Quinn Schulte.

RB Max White is the great, great grandson of Max Hawkins, a member of University of Iowa's famed 'Ironmen" team in 1939 that included Iowa Heisman Trophy winner Nile Kinnick.

LS Austin Spiewak is the grandson of Gary Grouwinkel, who played for Iowa in the 1957 and 1959 Rose Bowl games.

#### **IOWA PROGRAM NOTES**

- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 20 of the last 21 seasons.
   Iowa is 9-9 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (11) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 17-16-1 in 34 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- lowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (178-108) replaced Fry and completed his 23rd season in 2021. Ferentz also served as lowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa won the Big Ten West Division title in 2021 and made its second appearance in the Big Ten Championship game. The Hawkeyes played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).

- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, lowa has appeared in the poll 354 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the topranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 11 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End), Tyler Linderbaum, (Rimington, Top Center).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.

lowa has won its last nine games. The Hawkeyes have outscored their last eight opponents, 305-113, averaging 33.9 points per game offensively and allowing 12.6 ppg during the winning streak. Iowa has scored at least 25 points in each win.

QB Spencer Petras has led Iowa to nine consecutive wins. He was 25-36 for 209 yards passing today. The 25 completions are one shy of matching a career-high. Petras is 141-240 with 1,548 passing yards during Iowa's nine-game winning streak. He has thrown 10 touchdowns and two interceptions over the last nine games.

RB Tyler Goodson rushed 22 times for a career-high 153 yards and a career-high three touchdowns, the third-multi-touchdown game of his career. The last Hawkeye to rush for three touchdowns in a single game was Akrum Wadley in 2017 vs. Nebraska. Goodson recorded his sixth career 100-yard rushing yard game, his first this season.

The Hawkeyes won their 300th game at Kinnick Stadium since the stadium opened in 1929. The first game played at Kinnick Stadium was Oct. 5, 1929, a 46-0 Hawkeye win against Monmouth. Iowa's 100th win at Kinnick was a 31-19 victory over Arizona on Oct. 4, 1969. The 200th win at Kinnick Stadium was a 44-19 victory against Miami, Ohio, on Sept. 8, 2001. Iowa is seventh Big Ten school to celebrate at least 300 wins in its home stadium.

QB Spencer Petras connected with RB Tyler Goodson for a 67-yard touchdown in the third quarter. It was a career-long pass for Petras and a career-long reception for Goodson.

lowa scored 31 points in the second quarter, the most points scored in a single quarter since scoring 37 in the first quarter against Akron on Aug. 31, 2002. The 31 points scored in a Big Ten game are the most by a Hawkeye team since putting up 35 points on Illinois in the first quarter in 1985.

Six different Hawkeyes intercepted a pass Friday, tying a school record for most players with an interception in a single game (vs. Wisconsin in 1982). The six interceptions are the most in a game since lowa had a school-record seven interceptions vs. Wisconsin in 1982. Iowa leads the Big Ten with 12 interceptions. Iowa has 76 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country.

Iowa had seven takeaways, its most in a single game single game since 1987 against Northwestern (8). The Hawkeye defense has scored 20 points this season (3 TDs and 1 safety).

lowa scored points following its first four takeaways, turning the four takeaways into 24 points. The Hawkeyes have scored 75 points on 16 takeaways this season.

lowa clinched a share of the Big Ten West Division title.

lowa scored the final 22 points of the game and outscored the Huskers 19-0 in the fourth quarter. Iowa erased a 12-point fourth quarter deficit (trailed 21-9), its largest fourth-quarter deficit in a win since trailing by 14 points against Pittsburgh in 2011. The last double-digit fourth quarter deficit erased by Iowa in a win was in 2014 (trailed Ball State 13-3 entering the fourth).
