THE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA

The University of Iowa is a major public research university with a longstanding commitment to teaching, research, and service. Founded in 1847 as Iowa's first public institution of higher learning, the University has long been a national leader in such areas as creative writing, space physics, and health sciences. Today the University enrolls over 31,000 students in undergraduate, graduate, and professional degree programs. The faculty of some 1,600 members includes teachers and researchers in 11 colleges: Business, Dentistry, Education, Engineering, Graduate, Law, Liberal Arts & Sciences, Medicine, Nursing, Public Health and Pharmacy.

KIRK FERENTZ



Moon Family Head Football Coach Kirk Ferentz is in his 24th year as head football coach at the University of Iowa, and his 33rd season overall at the University. Ferentz signed a contract extension following the 2021 season, extending his agreement with Iowa through the 2029 season.

The position of UI head football coach was endowed in 2021 by Will and Renee Moon. The Bettendorf, Iowa couple are UI alumni and longtime Hawkeye supporters.

Under Ferentz' leadership the Iowa football program has earned 19 bowl game invitations since 2001. That success has been achieved with strong commitments to the program, the University of Iowa, and the ideals that represent Hawkeye football – hard work, determination, player development and character, on and off the field.

In 2021 Ferentz led Iowa to its second Big Ten West Division title (2015), posting a 7-2 conference record and 10-4 overall mark. The Hawkeyes won 10 games for the seventh time under Ferentz and earned an invitation to the Vrbo Citrus Bowl, Iowa's 12th January bowl game and 19th post-season invitation overall in the Ferentz era. Iowa was ranked 23rd in the final 2021 rankings, the fourth straight season the Hawkeyes have ended the year in the Top 25.

Ferentz holds a 178-110 record at Iowa, including 110-79 in conference games. The 178 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten rank fourth all-time in league history and his 110 conference victories also rank fourth in Big Ten history. His 25-year record as a college head coach is 190-130.

With Iowa's 33-7 win over Northern Illinois in the opening game of the 2018 season, Ferentz recorded win No. 144 as Iowa's head coach, surpassing the late Hayden Fry as the winningest football coach in program history. Fry was Iowa's head coach for 20 seasons (1979-98).

Ferentz is the longest tenured head football coach in the nation. Ferentz and Fry are the only head coaches to lead a Division I football program for 20 years, consecutively. With a 63-0 win at Illinois in 2018, Ferentz became just the fifth coach in Big Ten Conference history to win 150 games as a Big Ten head coach. Ferentz earned his 100th career Big Ten win at Penn State (Nov. 21, 2020).

Iowa's appearance in the 2022 Vrbo Citrus Bowl is the 12th January bowl game for the Hawkeyes under Ferentz, who has posted five January wins as Iowa's head coach. The Hawkeyes have twice won three straight bowl games (2008-10 and 2017-19) under Ferentz.

Iowa has won 19 conference games over the past three seasons, the most successful three-year stretch since winning 20 league games from 2002-04. Iowa has won at least six conference games in three straight seasons for the first time under Ferentz.

Iowa opened the 2021 season with six straight wins, including three victories over ranked opponents while being ranked as high as second in the nation. Following consecutive losses, the Hawkeyes rallied to win their final four regular season games to earn the Big Ten's West Division title. The Iowa defense set a school record with 25 interceptions and Iowa's 78 interceptions over the past four seasons ranks first nationally.

The Hawkeyes won 47 games from 2015-19, the best five-year win total in school history. Just eight programs in the nation won more games during that time frame. Ferentz guided the Hawkeyes to eight wins or more in five consecutive seasons (2015-19) and 13 seasons overall since 2003.

On the field, Ferentz's approach can be described as smart, tough, and physical. Off the field, academics and character development are a focus. In 2021, the University of Iowa outperformed its peers nationally in the classroom for the 10th consecutive year, according to data released by the NCAA.

Following back-to-back narrow losses to open the 2020 season, Iowa won six straight games, all in Big Ten play, to complete the regular season. The Hawkeyes scored at least 26 points in each of the six wins, while holding three opponents to just seven points. The winning streak included road wins at Minnesota, Penn State and Illinois, and trophy game victories over Minnesota, Nebraska, and Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes were ranked 15th in the nation in the final CFP rankings and coaches poll, 16th by the Associated Press. Iowa's Music City Bowl date with Missouri in December was canceled due to the pandemic.

Iowa concluded the 2019 season with three straight wins over border rivals Minnesota, Illinois, and Nebraska, followed by the 49-24 Holiday Bowl win over No. 22 Southern California. Following a 24-22 loss at Wisconsin to open November, the Hawkeyes handed seventh-ranked Minnesota its first loss of the season to maintain possession of Floyd of Rosedale. A 27-24 win over the Cornhuskers in the final game of the season kept the Heroes Trophy in Iowa City. Iowa's three losses came by a combined 14 points to three teams who were ranked in the top 20 at the time. Iowa also maintained possession of the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Trophy with a non-conference win at Iowa State in September.

Iowa won six of its first seven games in 2018 and closed the season with wins in the final three games, including the 27-22 Outback Bowl win over No. 18 Mississippi State. The four losses came by a total of 23 points, and all were decided in the final minutes of play. Iowa's defense ranked second nationally in interceptions after leading the nation in 2017.

Iowa's 8-5 record in 2017 included wins in three of four trophy games, with victories over Iowa State, Minnesota, and Nebraska, plus the Pinstripe Bowl win to conclude the season. Iowa also began November with a 55-24 win over third-ranked Ohio State. Nine of Iowa's 12 regular season opponents were bowl eligible (posting an 8-1 record) as the Hawkeyes faced one of the strongest schedules in the nation.

Iowa closed the 2016 regular season with three straight wins, including two over ranked opponents. Iowa posted a 6-3 record in Big Ten play to tie for second place in the West Division and finished the season at 8-5 overall.

Highlights of the year included Iowa defeating second-ranked Michigan and 15th-ranked Nebraska in the final month of the season, as well as earning a January bowl invitation for the 10th time during the Ferentz era.

The Iowa football program enjoyed a historic season in 2015, posting a final 12-2 record. Ferentz led the 2015 Hawkeyes to a perfect regular season, setting a school record with 12 wins. The Hawkeyes won the Big Ten Conference West Division (8-0) before falling to Michigan State, 16-13, in a close championship game that was decided in the final minute of play. The Hawkeyes earned their sixth invitation to the Rose Bowl, which was Iowa's first appearance in Pasadena in 25 years.

Ferentz was recognized with both the Hayes-Schembechler and Dave McClain Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year awards in 2015. He was named Eddie Robinson (FWAA) and Woody Hayes national Coach of the Year (Columbus Touchdown Club), and received the Dodd Trophy, presented by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Region 3 Coach of the Year.

KIRK FERENTZ

COACHING HISTORY

Ferentz' coaching career began as a student assistant (1977) at his alma mater, the University of Connecticut. The next two years (1978-79) were spent at Worcester Academy, where he also taught English literature. He then served as a graduate assistant offensive line coach at the University of Pittsburgh during the 1980 season. That Pittsburgh team (coached by Jackie Sherrill) finished with an 11-1 record and a number two national ranking.

Ferentz joined Hayden Fry's Iowa staff as the offensive line coach in 1981, which became Iowa's first winning seasons in 19 years. The season was highlighted by the Hawkeyes winning a conference title and earning a Rose Bowl berth – both of which had not occurred in 20 years.

He continued as Iowa's offensive line coach through the 1989 season and had great success coaching offensive lines that, to date, have anchored four of Iowa's highest scoring offenses. In addition, eight of Iowa's top 10 offensive teams, in terms of yards gained per game, have operated with Ferentz as the head coach or offensive line coach. And Iowa's top nine passing teams of all time have occurred with Ferentz as the head coach, or offensive line coach.

Ferentz was named head coach of the University of Maine Black Bears in 1990 and held that position for three years before being hired by Bill Belichick and the Cleveland Browns to coach the offensive line. He remained with the organization after it moved to Baltimore and became the Baltimore Ravens, serving as assistant head coach and offensive line coach. In all, he worked six years with the Cleveland Browns/Baltimore Ravens of the National Football League.

He rejoined the Hawkeyes as head coach in 1999 and is Iowa's longest tenured head football coach.

PERSONAL HISTORY

Off the field, family is the top priority for Ferentz. Ferentz and his wife, Mary, have been married for 43 years. They have five children: Brian, Kelly, Joanne, James, and Steven. They also have four granddaughters (Presley, Blakely, Connolly, and Jolie), and six grandsons (John, Forest, Nixon, Lincoln, Beckett, and Marshall). All five of their children graduated from City High School in Iowa City and earned degrees from the University of Iowa; and each of the boys had the incredible experience of playing football at the University of Iowa with their father as head coach.

Kirk and Mary are very enthusiastic supporters of the University of Iowa Stead Family Children's Hospital. They serve as advocates for the Children's Hospital, hosting and speaking at events across the state to raise awareness and support for the hospital. Kirk and Mary established the "Ferentz Family Pediatric Research and Education Endowment Fund" in 2007. In honor of their granddaughter, Mary and Kirk donated more than \$1 million in 2017 to establish the Savvy Elizabeth Ferentz Neonatology Research Fund. In addition, the Iowa Ladies' Football Academy has donated \$2.5 million to the UI Stead Family Children's Hospital, which opened across the street from Kinnick Stadium in December, 2016.

Ferentz has also been involved in supporting a number of community and university-related initiatives, including serving as the honorary chair of the University of Iowa's United Way campaign. Kirk and Mary have also contributed generously to the University of Iowa, including donations to the University's College of Liberal Arts. Another significant gift was a \$500,000 commitment to support the Iowa Football Legacy Campaign, which included two key projects benefitting the Hawkeye

football program; the indoor practice facility; and the Stew and LeNore Hansen Football Performance Center.

Ferentz was born August 1, 1955, in Royal Oak, Michigan. He attended Upper St. Clair High School in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and graduated from the University of Connecticut in 1978 with a bachelor's degree in English Education. He was a football captain and an academic all-Yankee Conference linebacker at Connecticut.

Ferentz received the Distinguished Alumnus Award from the Neag School of Education at the University of Connecticut in May, 2009. He was inducted into the Upper St. Clair High School Hall of Fame in September, 2002, and the Western Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame in May, 2003.





2021 SEASON REVIEW

IN THE RANKINGS

The Hawkeyes are ranked 23rd in the final AP Poll and 23rd in the final Coaches Poll. Iowa finished in the AP Poll for the fourth straight season, which is the longest streak under head coach Kirk Ferentz and the second longest in program history (five straight years from 1983-87).

Iowa reached as high as No. 2 in the AP and Coaches polls this season, its highest ranking since Nov. 26, 1985 (#2). Iowa spent five weeks ranked No. 1 in 1985.

Iowa has three wins this season over ranked opponents (vs. #17 Indiana, 34-6; at #9 Iowa State, 27-17; vs. #4 Penn State, 23-20).

Iowa opened the 2021 season ranked 18th in the AP Poll. It marked the third straight season Iowa was ranked in the AP Top 25 preseason poll and its highest preseason appearance since being ranked 17th in 2016.

Iowa's first two opponents were ranked in the AP Top 25 (No. 17 Indiana, No. 9 Iowa State). It marked the fourth time in program history the Hawkeyes have opened a season against consecutive opponents ranked in the AP Top 25 (1960, 1973, 1974). The Hawkeyes started 2-0 in 1960, 1-1 in 1974 and 0-2 in 1973.

Iowa has been ranked in the AP Top 25 at least once in each of the last seven seasons, the third-longest streak in school history. Iowa finished the 2020 season ranked 15th in the coaches poll and 16th in the AP poll. It marked the 26th time in program history that Iowa finished the season ranked in the top 25. Iowa has finished ranked 15th or better in the AP poll six times in 22 completed seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,281 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 676-566-39 (.543). That includes a 420-224-16 (.647) record in home games, a 256-342-23 (.431) record in games away from Iowa City, a 348-385-25 (.476) mark in Big Ten games and a 304-189-15 (.612) record in Kinnick Stadium.

TROPHY COLLECTION

Iowa was 3-3 in trophy games in 2021. The Hawkeyes are 25-7 in their last 32 trophy games (includes bowl games and conference championships).

Iowa is 22-6 in its last 28 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).

The Hawkeyes defeated Nebraska 28-21 to capture the Heroes Trophy for the seventh straight year. Iowa retained possession of Floyd of Rosedale with a 27-22 win against Minnesota on Nov. 13. The Hawkeyes lost possession of the Heartland Trophy on Oct. 30 at Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes defeated No. 9 Iowa State, 27-17, on Sept. 11 to win the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series game for the sixth consecutive time.

FERENTZ AMONG BIG TEN'S BEST

Moon Family Head Football Coach Kirk Ferentz has 110 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach, the fourth most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history. The Hawkeyes defeated Penn State, 41-21, on Nov. 21, 2020, to earn Ferentz's 100th conference win.

Ferentz's 178 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five include Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Ferentz (178) and Joe Paterno (162).

Ferentz (178-110) became Iowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz completed his 23rd season in 2021.

Both Ferentz (178, 110) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top 10 in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

Iowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz completed his 23rd season as Iowa's head football coach in 2021. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) has been at his current school for 10 seasons or more.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker completed his 23rd season on Iowa's staff in 2021, his 10th as defensive coordinator. He is the longest tenured defensive coordinator in FBS.

Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), completed his 10th season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

CELEBRATING #300

The Hawkeyes' 30-7 win against Kent State on Sept. 18 was their 300th win at Kinnick Stadium since the stadium opened in 1929. The first game played at Kinnick Stadium was Oct. 5, 1929, a 46-0 Hawkeye win against Monmouth. Iowa's 100th win at Kinnick was a 31-19 victory over Arizona on Oct. 4, 1969. The 200th win at Kinnick Stadium was a 44-19 victory against Miami, Ohio, on Sept. 8, 2001. Iowa became the seventh Big Ten school to celebrate at least 300 wins in its home stadium.

LINDERBAUM NAMED CONSENSUS ALL-AMERICAN, WINNER OF RIMINGTON TROPHY

C Tyler Linderbaum became the 12th Hawkeye to earn unanimous consensus All-America status. He was named first-team All-America by the Walter Camp Foundation, the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), Associated Press, Sporting News, and AFCA.

Linderbaum is the 28th Hawkeye to earn consensus All-America status, while two of those players (OL Calvin Jones and LB Larry Station) earned the distinction in two separate seasons. Iowa football has had a consensus All-American in three straight seasons for the first time in program history.

Along with the consensus All-America status, Linderbaum received the Rimington Trophy, which is awarded to the nation's top center. He was a finalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award and the Outland Trophy. He was named the Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year in the Big Ten, while earning first-team All-Big Ten honors for the second straight season.

Linderbaum started 35 consecutive games at center for the Hawkeyes after playing as a defensive lineman as a true freshman. Iowa posted a 26-9 record during that span. The Hawkeyes won their final six games in 2020 and began the 2021 season with six straight wins.

Linderbaum was recognized at the Rimington Trophy banquet in Lincoln, Nebraska, on Jan. 15. He is the first Hawkeye to earn the Rimington Trophy. He was also a finalist in 2020. Austin Blythe (2015) and Bruce Nelson (2002) were previously finalists for the award.

CAMPBELL LEADS COUNTRY, EARNS ALL-AMERICA HONORS

LB Jack Campbell was named second-team All-American by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) and Phil Steele. Campbell led the country with 143 tackles, including 57 solo tackles and 86 assists. The 143 tackles rank fifth in single-season school history and are the most by a Hawkeye since Pat Angerer had 145 in 2009.

Campbell is the first Hawkeye to record 100 tackles in a single season since Josey Jewell, who had 100+ tackles each year from 2015-17 (126, 124, 136). Campbell had five double-digit tackle

performances (11, 18, 17, 16, 14) this season. He was named one of 16 semifinalists for the Dick Butkus Award.

Campbell recorded his first interception of the season Week 11 against Illinois and returned it 32 yards for a touchdown. He had his second interception of the season at the Big Ten Championship Game. He also has six pass break-ups, two recovered fumbles, one caused fumble and 3.5 tackles for loss.

Campbell was named a second-team midseason All-American by The Athletic. He was the Bronko Nagurski national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's win over Colorado State. He recorded a career-high 18 tackles against Colorado State. He had seven solo tackles and 11 assists and added three pass break-ups to go with his second fumble recovery of the season (touchdown at Iowa State).

RETURN TO SENDER

WR Charlie Jones was the Rodgers-Dwight Big Ten Return Specialist of the Year. Jones ranked third in the Big Ten averaging 7.7 yards on a league-high 37 punt returns. He returned 25 kickoffs for an average of 25.4 yards per return, No. 2 in the Big Ten. He returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown Week 11 against Illinois.

Jones's 37 punt returns are the most by a Hawkeye in a single season since Peter Maricano returned 39 punts (3.8 average) in 1987. The school record for punt returns in a single season is 40 by Ramon Ochoa in 2003 (12.4 average).

Jones is one of three players in school history to score touchdowns on both kickoff and punt returns. (Jones returned a punt 54 yards for a touchdown vs. Michigan State in 2020). The others include C.J. Jones (100-yard kickoff, 65-yard punt) and Kahlil Hill (two kickoffs: 90, 88; two punts: 62, 57).

GOODSON DECLARES FOR NFL DRAFT

RB Tyler Goodson announced on Dec. 10 that he has completed his Hawkeye playing career and declared for the NFL Draft. Goodson started 13 games this season.

Goodson led Iowa's rushing attack with 1,151 yards on 156 attempts, both single-season career highs. His six rushing touchdowns rank ninth in the Big Ten. He is the first Hawkeye to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season since 2017 (Akrum Wadley, 1,109).

Goodson rushed for a career-high 156 yards in Iowa's Week 12 win at Nebraska. It was his ninth career 100-yard rushing game and his fourth this season. He had four 100-yard rushing games this season (153, 141, 132, 156).

Goodson has 2,551 career rushing yards, 10th all-time in program history.

In Iowa's 23-19 win against No. 7 Minnesota in 2019, Goodson became the first true freshman to start at running back under Ferentz since 2012 (Greg Garmon). He was also the first true freshman to lead the team in single-season rushing in 2019 (638 yards).

GOING THE OTHER WAY

Iowa led the country with a school-record 25 interceptions. The Hawkeyes have 89 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country. Eleven Hawkeyes had at least one interception this season. The last time Iowa had 11 players with an interception in a single season was 1997 (14).

LB/DB Dane Belton tied for fourth in the NCAA and second in the Big Ten with five interceptions. DB Riley Moss and DB Jermari Harris had four interceptions, and DB Matt Hankins had three interceptions. The last time Iowa had four players with at least three interceptions in a single season was 2018 (Gervase 4, Hooker 4, Stone 4, Ojemudia 3).

Moss had two interceptions returned for a touchdown, both in Week 1. LB Jack Campbell returned an interception 32 yards for a touchdown against Illinois in Week 11.

Iowa combined for 10 interceptions in consecutive games against Maryland and Penn State, which ties Miami (2001) for second most over a two-game span over the last 25 years. Mississippi State had 11 in 2002.

Six different Hawkeyes intercepted a pass in Iowa's 51-14 win at Maryland, tying a school record for most players with an interception in a single game (vs. Wisconsin in 1982). The six interceptions are the most in a game since Iowa had a school-record seven interceptions vs. Wisconsin in 1982.

Iowa turned 31 turnovers into 92 points in 2021. The Hawkeyes' defense scored 28 points (4 TDs and 2 safeties). Iowa's special teams had two touchdowns (one kickoff return, one blocked punt return).

Iowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 14 seasons and 19 of the last 21.

FRESH LEGS

Three true freshman started at least one game this season. Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first season at Iowa, only 31 true freshmen have started for the Hawkeyes.

In Iowa's Week 4 win against Colorado State, OL Connor Colby started at RG and WR Keagan Johnson started at wide receiver. Colby was the first true freshman offensive lineman to start since Tristan Wirfs in 2017. Johnson was the first true freshman wide receiver to start since Ihmir Smith-Marsette in 2017.

WR Arland Bruce IV made his first career start Week 11 against Illinois. He had a career-long 28-yard reception to set up a 2-yard touchdown rush in the second quarter. Johnson started the same game, marking the first time two true freshmen wide receivers started a game in the Ferentz era.

Colby and DL Lukas Van Ness were named Freshman All-American by the Maxwell Football Club and Football Writers Association of America. Van Ness tied for the team lead with 7.0 sacks and ranked second with 8.5 tackles-for-loss.

Redshirt freshman RB Gavin Williams set career highs with 98 yards rushing on a career-best 16 carries in his first career start at the 2022 Citrus Bowl. He became the first Iowa running back to have his first career start come in a bowl game since Jordan Canzeri made his first career start at the 2011 Insight Bowl against Oklahoma.

PETRAS AMONG ALL-TIME LEADERS

QB Spencer Petras started 17 consecutive games from the 2020 season opener through Week 9 of 2021. Petras's streak of consecutive starts was snapped when he did not play Nov. 13 against Minnesota due to injury.

Petras owns a 13-6 record (.684) as Iowa's starting quarterback, the ninth best winning percentage by a starting quarterback in program history. Iowa has scored 26.0 points per game in 19 Petras starts. He has 3,474 career passing yards, 13th all-time in program history.

Petras led Iowa to 12 consecutive wins from 2020-21, winning the final six games of 2020 and the first six games of 2021. He was 194-324 with 17 touchdown passes, four interceptions and 2,226 passing yards during Iowa's 12-game winning streak.

Petras matched his career high with three touchdown passes and set a career high with two rushing touchdowns Week 5 at Maryland. He became the first Iowa quarterback with multiple passing touchdowns and multiple rushing touchdowns in a game since Brad Banks at Minnesota in 2002.

The Hawkeyes averaged 31.8 points per game in 2020, Petras' first year as starting quarterback. It marked Iowa's highest point per game total since 2002 (36.5). Iowa won its final six games in 2020, outscoring its opponents 214-83.

PADILLA LEADS IOWA TO WIN IN FIRST CAREER STARTS

QB Alex Padilla led Iowa to two wins in his first two career starts (27-22 vs. Minnesota in Week 10; 33-23 vs. Illinois in Week 11).

Padilla made his first career start Week 10 against Minnesota and passed for career-high 206 yards. He ran for one touchdown (1) and threw for two (72, 27), both career firsts. He was 6-17 for 83 yards in his second career start, a Week 11 win against Illinois.

Padilla started Week 12 at Nebraska but was relieved at halftime with Iowa trailing 14-6. QB Spencer Petras started the second half and led Iowa to a 28-21 win.

Padilla entered the game Week 9 at Northwestern on Iowa's fourth drive, substituting for the injured Petras. Padilla finished the game with a then-career high 172 passing yards. He set career best in completions (18) and attempts (28). Padilla also relieved Petras after the opening drive of the second half at the Big Ten Championship game. He finished the game 10-15 for 38 yards and an interception.

Petras had started 17 straight games for the Hawkeyes before missing the Nov. 13 contest against Minnesota.

SHUDAK EARNS ALL-AMERICA RECOGNITION, SETS FIELD GOAL RECORD

K Caleb Shudak was named third-team All-American by the Associated Press. Shudak connected on 24-28 field goals and all 36 PAT attempts in 2021, leading the Hawkeyes in scoring with 108 points, the fifth-best single season total in school history.

Shudak finished his career 24-29 on field goal attempts, an 82.8 career percentage that ranks No. 1 in school history (minimum 25 attempts). His 85.7 field goal percentage in 2021 is the fourth best single-season percentage in school history (minimum 15 attempts).

Shudak connected on 4-6 attempts of 50 yards or more, including a career-long 51 yards on three occasions. Shudak connected

on four field goal attempts in late season wins over Illinois and Nebraska and for the season was also 7-7 on field goals between 40-49 yards.

Shudak was named first-team All-Big Ten by league media and second-team by Big Ten coaches. He was the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week for his play at Nebraska, including 4-4 field goals in the 28-21 Iowa victory.

While also handling kickoff duties for the third straight season Shudak recorded 45 touchbacks on 72 kicks.

Shudak was one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award, presented by the Orange Bowl. Shudak joined the Iowa program as a walk-on.

THAT'S NOT A PUNT... THAT'S A PUNT

Melbourne, Australia, native Tory Taylor ranked fourth in the Big Ten averaging 46.1 yards per punt. Taylor led the Big Ten and ranked second nationally with 80 punts. He had 27 punts of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 69-yard punt at Iowa State in Week 2. Thirty-nine of his punts were downed inside the 20. Taylor was recognized as a first-team midseason All-American by The Athletic and was a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award.

Iowa owned the field position battle in each of its 10 wins. The Hawkeyes averaged 20-plus yards better in field position three times (+20 vs. Penn State; +22 at Maryland; +22 at Iowa State).

This season, Taylor recorded three of the top nine single-game punting averages in the Ferentz era. Iowa's Week 2 punting average of 51.1 ranks No. 3 all-time in the Ferentz era. Its Week 1 punting average of 49.5 ranks No. 7 and the 49.0 average Week 8 ties for ninth.

Taylor was Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following Iowa's win at Iowa State. He averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts. Five of his punts were downed inside the 20, while Iowa State had just one punt return.

In Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State, Taylor punted nine times, dropping six inside the 20, five inside the 10 and three punts inside the five.

Taylor was a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, a midseason first-team All-America honoree by The Athletic. He was one of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award and was named a first-team Freshman All-American by the FWAA in 2020.

HANKINS EARNS ALL-AMERICA RECOGNITION

DB Matt Hankins was named second-team All-America by the AFCA and Walter Camp Foundation. Hankins started 37 consecutive games in the Iowa secondary from 2018-21 before suffering a season-ending injury following the Hawkeyes' 27-22 victory over Minnesota. The Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist had three interceptions in 2021. He was named second-team All-Big Ten by league coaches and media, and the Associated Press.

The Lewisville, Texas, native was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week, the Rose Bowl Game Big Ten Conference Player of the Week, the Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week, and the Thorpe Award Player of the Week following Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State. Hankins had five tackles and a fourth quarter interception in Iowa's win over Penn State. He had two interceptions in Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.

MOSS EARNS ALL-AMERICA RECOGNITION

DB Riley Moss was named second-team All-America by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) and third-team All-America by the Associated Press.

Moss was named Tatum-Woodson Big Ten Defensive Back of the Year and earned first-team All-Big Ten honors from league coaches and media. He is the fifth Hawkeye to earn the Tatum-Woodson award.

The Ankeny, Iowa, native tied for 14th in the country and fourth in the Big Ten with four interceptions. Moss had two interceptions returns for touchdowns in Iowa's opening win over Indiana. He is tied for 11th in career interceptions (10-239-3 TDs), is one of three players in program history with three interception returns for touchdowns and ranks second in career interception return yards.

COLBY, VAN NESS EARN FWAA FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICA HONORS

G Connor Colby and DT Lukas Van Ness were named to the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) Freshman All-America Team.

Colby joined the Hawkeyes last spring and started 11 of 14 games at right guard in his first college season. He earlier earned Freshman All-America honors from the Maxwell Football Club.

Van Ness redshirted his first season before seeing action in 2021. He collected 33 tackles, including 17 solo stops while playing in all 14 games. Van Ness tied for the team lead with seven sacks and had 8.5 tackles for loss, three pressures and one pass break-up.

Van Ness also earned freshman All-America honors from the Maxwell Football Club and earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition as well.

Iowa, Ohio State and Texas A&M were the only programs with multiple players on the honor FWAA squad.

MOSS EARNS WEEKLY CONFERENCE AND NATIONAL HONORS

DB Riley Moss was named Walter Camp FBS National Defensive Player of the Week and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following No. 18 Iowa's 34-6 win over No. 17 Indiana on Sept. 4.

Moss became just the third player in school history to return two interceptions for touchdowns in a single game. He had a 30-yard interception return to give Iowa a 14-0 advantage in the opening minutes of the game. Moss collected his second touchdown in the final minutes of the second quarter, returning the theft 55 yards for the score. Moss added one solo tackle and two pass break-ups against the Hoosiers as the Hawkeye defense allowed just 233 yards total offense.

Moss has 10 career interceptions for 239 yards, including three touchdown returns. The 10 thefts tie for 11th in program history, while his 239 return yards rank second among Iowa's career leaders (Tyler Sash, 392 yards). The three touchdowns tie Desmond King and Tom Knight for the most in school history.

Moss is the sixth Hawkeye to earn the Walter Camp national award, which is in its 18th year of being presented on a weekly basis to one offensive and one defensive player. Previous Hawkeye honorees include linebacker Chad Greenway (2004), linebacker Mike Klindenborg (2006), linebacker Josey Jewell (2017), defensive back Josh Jackson (2017) and quarterback Nate Stanley (2018).

2021 SEASON REVIEW

TAYLOR NAMED B1G CO-SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

P Tory Taylor was named Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following No. 10 Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State on Sept. 11 in the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series. He was also named to the Ray Guy Award's Ray's 8 list following Iowa's Week 2 win, following Iowa's win over Penn State, and after Iowa's game at Wisconsin.

Taylor earned the Big Ten honors after playing a key role in Iowa's 27-17 win at Iowa State. He averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts, with a long of 69 yards. Five of his punts were downing inside the 20, while Iowa State had just one punt return.

The Big Ten Player of the Week honor was a career first for Taylor. He was named a Ray Guy Award semifinalist in 2020 and 2021. Taylor was the Eddleman-Fields Big Ten Conference Punter of the Year in 2020 while earning first-team All-Big Ten honors. He was named first-team Freshman All-America by the FWAA and second-team All-America by The Athletic.

CAMPBELL NAMED B1G DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

LB Jack Campbell was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week following No. 5 Iowa's 24-14 win over Colorado State on Sept. 25. He was also named the Bronko Nagurski national Defensive Player of the Week.

Campbell led Iowa's defensive effort in the 24-14 win over Colorado State as the Hawkeyes rallied from a 14-7 halftime deficit. Campbell recovered a Colorado State fumble at the six-yard line in the third quarter, which led to Iowa scoring on the next play to tie the contest, 14-14.

Campbell recorded a career-high 18 tackles against Colorado State. He had seven solo tackles and 11 assists and added three pass break-ups to go with his second fumble recovery of the season (touchdown at Iowa State).

HANKINS NAMED B1G DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

DB Matt Hankins was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week following No. 3 Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State on Oct. 9. He was also named Nagurski, Thorpe and Rose Bowl Game National Player of the Week following his Week 6 performance.

Hankins was credited with five tackles in Iowa's win over Penn State, including three solo stops and two assists, along with Iowa's fourth and final interception of the day. Hankins was credited with a solo tackle on a Penn State fourth-and-three attempt with 3:39 remaining, stopping a PSU drive that reached the Iowa 45-yardline.

Hankins then stopped Penn State's next possession with an interception on fourth down, his third of the season. Hankins had two interceptions earlier in the season in Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.

The Big Ten weekly honor was the first of Hankins' career.

SHUDAK NAMED B1G SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

K Caleb Shudak was named Big Ten Conference Special Teams Player of the Week for his play in the Hawkeyes' 28-21 win at Nebraska on Nov. 26.

Shudak connected on all four field goal attempts against Nebraska, connecting from 51, 48, 36, and 44 yards. The four made field goals matches a career high, set the previous week in Iowa's 33-23 win over Illinois.

Shudak made a career-long 51-yard field goal in three different games this season, including wins over Iowa State, Illinois, and Nebraska. For the season he made 24-of-28 attempts with just two misses from less than 50 yards.

For the season, Shudak leads the Hawkeyes in scoring with 108 points, adding 36-of-36 PAT attempts to go with his 24 made field goals. Shudak's 108 points rank as the fifth-highest single season total in school history. He also handles kickoff duties, recording 45 touchbacks.

The Big Ten weekly honor was the first of Shudak's career.

IOWA STREAK HITS, ENDS AT 12

Iowa finished the 2020 season with six straight wins and opened the 2021 season with six consecutive wins. The Hawkeyes outscored those 12 opponents, 403-161, averaging 33.6 points per game offensively and allowing 13.4 ppg during the winning streak.

The 12-game win streak was Iowa's longest since opening the 2015 season with 12 straight wins. Iowa reached the Big Ten Championship game that season and accepted an invitation to the 2016 Rose Bowl game. The 12-game winning streak ranks fourth all-time in school history (20, 1920-23; 14, 1899-00; 13, 2008-09).

Iowa's 12-game streak included nine straight wins against Big Ten opponents (2020-21). It marked the second longest streak of consecutive Big Ten wins. Iowa won 10 straight from 2001-02.

IOWA PLAYER COUNCIL GROUP

The University of Iowa football program's 2021 Player Council included 16 student-athlete -- six seniors and 10 juniors.

The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies and being involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected following coaching staff and player input.

The 2021 group consisted of seniors Matt Hankins, Ivory Kelly-Martin, Jack Koerner, Kyler Schott, Caleb Shudak and Zach VanValkenburg, and juniors Dane Belton, Seth Benson, Jack Campbell, Joe Evans, Tyler Goodson, Sam LaPorta, Tyler Linderbaum, Kaevon Merriweather, Spencer Petras, and Tyrone Tracy, Jr.
