HEAD COACH JEFF GARBUTT, SR.

Jeff Garbutt was named the fourth head coach in the history of the University of Iowa rowing program in October 2021.

Garbutt was an assistant coach on the Iowa staff for seven years from 2013-20. During that time, he helped Iowa reach heights the program had not seen before, qualifying for the NCAA Championships three consecutive years from 2017-19 and reaching No. 7 in the national rankings in 2018, the highest in program history. He returns to Iowa City from La Salle University, where he led the men's and women's rowing programs from 2020-21.

Garbutt was on staff in 2017 and 2018 when Iowa was named College Rowing Coaches Association Region 4 Staff of the Year. In 2017, Iowa broke a 16-year NCAA Championship drought and placed 12th nationally. The following year, the Hawkeyes placed a program-best fourth in the Big Ten and set a school scoring record at NCAA's, putting up 69 points and placing 11th.

HEAD COACH | JEFF GARBUTT, SR. (1ST YEAR)

THIS WEEK

University of Iowa rowing heads back to Sarasota, Florida, for the second time this season to compete in the Big Ten Invitational at Nathan Benderson Park, hosted by Wisconsin.

EVENT SCHEDULE

The Hawkeyes begin competition at 7:30 a.m. with the 2V4. Iowa's next race, the 2N8, is set for 8:00 a.m. The 3V4 will take place at 8:20 a.m., followed by the 1N8 at 9:10 a.m. Boat races start at 9:40 a.m., where the Hawkeyes will compete in the 1V8 (9:40 a.m.), 2V8 (9:50 a.m.) and 1V4 (11:00 a.m.). All times listed are Central Time (CT).

THE COMPETITION

The Big Ten Invitational is Iowa's opening full-roster regatta of the spring, bringing along its 2N8 and 3V4 crews for the first time this season. Each race on Friday and Saturday will be considered a final event.

BIG TEN HONORS

- The Hawkeyes first varsity eight was named Big Ten Boat of the Week following its performance at the Ivy League-Big Ten Double Dual in Camden, New Jersey on March 26.
- The Hawkeyes' 1V8 crew picked up its first win of the season by pulling away from Harvard in the second half of the course and finishing in 6:34.3 -- more than four seconds in front of Harvard's top boat.
- Iowa's 1V8 included Ava Parris (coxswain), Mary Wright, Molly Rygh, Kasi McWhorter, Emma Dabinett, Abbey Klostermann, Lisa Murphy, Hailey Mercuri and Emma Mask.
- The Hawkeyes' 1V4 crew won Big Ten Boat of the Week after its Grand Final at the Sunshine State Invitational, finishing with a time of 7:20.66 -- more than six seconds ahead of second-place Kansas State.
- Iowa's 1V4 included Livvy Osgood, Jaecee Hall, Heidi Hines, Laura Bates and Cara Burns (coxswain).

ABOUT THE HAWKEYES

- The Hawkeyes' varsity four and novice eight crews each picked up grand final victories in Sarasota at the Sunshine State Invitational (April 1-2).
- Iowa captured two victories in its first regatta of the championship season. The Hawkeyes' 1V8 boat came in first, finishing four seconds ahead of Harvard's boat. The second victory occurred in the 2V4, with the Hawkeyes out-pacing Harvard by 28.8 seconds.
- The Hawkeyes are receiving votes for the third consecutive week in the latest national Pocock CRCA Poll.
- Iowa's coaching staff includes associate head coach Megan Fitzpatrick, and assistant coaches Katie Thurstin and Lowell McNicholas.
