## **IOWA CITY**

"If you are lucky enough to arrive in time for one of the early season varsity football games, well, go catch Hawkeye fever. Join the fervent lowa fans dressed up like bumble-bees in their black-and gold regalia, cheering the team that has gone from laughingstock of the league to Big Ten powerhouse in about six years. Find out why Hawkeye coach Hayden Fry may be the next governor.

"But don't neglect other traditions that Iowa City is equally proud of. The centerpiece of the Iowa Center for the Arts on the west riverbank is Hancher Auditorium, a splendid hall that has hosted everyone from the Cleveland Orchestra and the Modern Jazz Quartet to the touring company of Evita. The University Theatre's home is the nearby Mabie Theatre, which is not only a beautifully designed little house, but a monument to depressionera pioneers who made lowa a leader in educational theater. The Museum of Art is a rambling, serene space in which to view a mostly modern collection dominated by abstract expressionism and its offshoots.

"The biggest act on campus, however, is the Writers' Workshop, a magnet that draws hundreds of fledgling and famous writers to study, teach, and read their works. Combine these people with the 30 or so established foreign authors who come to lowa City each fall under the International Writing Program, and you have a literary reading-and-lecture scene second only to that of New York City."

vantage of the numerous recreational facilities offered around town. The area's more than 30 parks provide opportunities for year-round activities including boating, hiking, swimming, fishing and skiing.

The city's greatest charm, however, remains the down-home goodness of its people, the sincere friendliness of its citizens and the successful "town-gown" partnership built between the community and University, making lowa City the envy of her sister cities throughout the United States.

lowa City is located in eastern lowa and is an easy commute to such cities as Des Moines (the capital of lowa), Chicago, St. Louis, Kansas City, and Minneapolis. As well, Cedar Rapids, a city of more than 150,000, is just a short drive north of lowa City. The Cedar Rapids Airport links residents to every major airport in the Midwest, nation and world.
