

#### THIS WEEK

The University of Iowa women's soccer team hosts Pacific at 7 p.m. (CT) on Thursday night at the Iowa Soccer Complex. Admission is free. The Hawkeyes then hit the road, traveling to Waco, Texas, to take on Baylor on Sunday at Betty Lou Mays Field. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. (CT).

#### SCOUTING THE TIGERS

- Pacific enters the contest with a 2-2-0 record with wins over Sacramento State (4-2) and UC Davis (1-0). The Tigers tied Long Beach State, 2-2, to open the season and most recently tied Oregon State, 1-1, last Sunday.
- Co-head coaches Danesha Adams and J.J. Wozniak are entering their second season at the helm of the Pacific program after earning West Coast Conference Coach of the Year honors in 2021. The duo served Pacific on an interim basis, leading the program its best record in decades at 10-6-3 record overall.
- Goalkeeper Brenna Crump was named the West Coast Conference Goalkeeper of the Year in 2021.
- Fifth-year senior Jenae Packard leads the Tigers this season with two goals and two assists.

#### SERIES HISTORY - PACIFIC

Iowa is 2-0-0 against Pacific, most recently downing the Tigers, 1-0, in 2015.

#### SCOUTING THE BEARS

- Baylor is no stranger to Big Ten competition this season; the Bears opened the season with a 1-1 draw against Minnesota before falling to Wisconsin, 2-0, the following game. Since then, Baylor picked up a 2-1, win at Florida before falling, 6-0, at North Carolina.
- Head coach Michelle Lenard takes over Baylor this season after 14 seasons at Dallas Baptist University, where she amassed a 200-77-26 record and earned 13 conference titles.
- The Bears finished third in the Big 12 Conference last season at 4-2-3 and finished with an 8-5-6 record overall.
- Baylor's three goals on the season have been scored by juniors Gabby Mueller and Ashely Merrill along with sophomore Haven Terry.

#### SERIES HISTORY - BAYLOR

Iowa is 1-1-0 against the Bears. The programs first met in 2003, when the Hawkeyes claimed a, 1-0, victory at home. Baylor won the rematch in 2004, 2-1.

Dave Dilanni is in his ninth season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 303-83-29 career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history. In his ninth season at Iowa, Dilanni has a 82-65-11 record. He has guided the program to two NCAA Tournament appearances and the first Big Ten title in program history.

In 2021, Dilanni led Iowa to a 12-6-2 season and a tie for fourth place in the Big Ten Conference at 5-4-1. The Hawkeyes advanced to the Big Ten Tournament semifinal with a 1-0 first round victory at Michigan State before falling to Rutgers in Piscataway.

Five Hawkeyes earned Big Ten Conference postseason honors. Sara Wheaton was named to the All-Big Ten second team, while Alyssa Walker and Hailey Rydberg picked up third-team honors. Addie Bundy was a unanimous selection on the All-Freshman team and Riley Whitaker was one of 14 players to earn the conference sportsmanship award. The Iowa offense averaged 1.55 goals per game as eleven different Hawkeyes combined for 31 goals on the year. On the defensive side of the ball, Iowa posted seven shutouts and held 18 opponents to two scores or fewer through 20 games last season.

Dilanni earned his 300th career win on Oct. 21, 2021, with a 1-0 win over Minnesota. Dilanni is one of two active Big Ten coaches to reach 300 career wins, along with Nebraska's John Walker. Iowa's win in the opening round of the conference tournament at Michigan State was Dilanni's 80th win at the University of Iowa, tying Ron Rainey as the program's all-time leader.

#### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Head coach Dave Dilanni is in his ninth season at the helm of the soccer program. Last fall, Dilanni's team posted a 12-6-2 record, tying for fourth in the Big Ten for Iowa's highest regular season conference finish since 1999. The Hawkeyes return six starters and a host of other key contributors from the 2021 team. That includes a group of six fifth-year players from a class of seven seniors all with starting experience.
- The Hawkeyes qualified for the Big Ten Tournament in 2021, advancing to the semifinals as the tournament five seed before falling to Rutgers. Iowa has qualified for three of the last four Big Ten Conference Tournaments, not counting the unorthodox 2020 event which saw all teams compete and which the Hawkeyes went on to win for the first time in school history.
- In 2019 and 2020, Iowa made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time in program history. The 2020 group earned Iowa's first victory in the NCAA Tournament.
- Iowa returns 51.6 percent of its goal scoring production from last season. The Hawkeyes lose leading scorer Alyssa Walker, but return a majority of the 11 goal scorers from last season. Assist leader Hailey Rydberg is back this season after dishing seven assists across seven different wins in 2021. Newcomer Kyndal Anderson leads Iowa with two goals and four assists so far this season.
- Three Hawkeyes — Hailey Rydberg, Kenzie Roling, and Samantha Cary — were named to the Big Ten Preseason Honors List. Iowa was picked to finish eighth out of 14 teams in the preseason coaches' poll.
- Three players that earned Big Ten Conference postseason honors last season return in 2022. Sara Wheaton was named to the All-Big Ten second team, while Hailey Rydberg picked up third-team honors. Addie Bundy was a unanimous selection on the All-Freshman team.
- Rydberg and Sara Wheaton were also named to the 2021 United Soccer Coaches North Region third team a season ago.

#### LAST WEEK

- Iowa fell to Kansas, 1-0, on Aug. 25 at the Iowa Soccer Complex. The Hawkeyes posted 13 shots, nine of which came in the second half, as senior Hailey Rydberg led the way with five shots, including three on goal. Still, the Jayhawks' Shira Elinav struck the game-winner in the 52nd minute to secure the Kansas victory. Goalkeeper Monica Wilhelm recorded five saves on 15 total KU shots.
- The Hawkeyes bounced back with a, 4-0, shutout victory over DePaul on Sunday. Four different Iowa players scored and 21 Hawkeyes saw playing time in the dominant performance. Junior Kyndal Anderson broke things open with a goal in the eighth minute and senior Josie Durr and freshman Camille Anderson would pile on two more scores before halftime. Sophomore Elle Otto tallied two assists in the first 45 minutes, and freshman Kellen Fife finished things off with her first career goal in the 58th minute of play. Wilhelm picked up four saves as Iowa out-shot the Blue Demons, 20-4, in the match.

#### SENIOR LEADERSHIP

A class of seven senior leaders all with starting experience help anchor the Hawkeyes this season.

- Midfielder Hailey Rydberg was a third-team All-Big Ten selection last season, starting all 20 games and posting two goals with seven assists across seven wins last season.
- Defender Sara Wheaton earned second-team All-Big Ten honors and was Iowa's Defensive Player of the Year on a defense that gave up just 20 goals and posted six clean sheets on the year.
- Other notable veterans include goalkeeper Monica Wilhelm (87 saves, nine wins), defender Samantha Cary (19 starts, two goals), Natalie Massa (20 games played, 4 starts), and fifth-year players Josie Durr and Jenny Cape who return to the pitch after being sidelined in 2021. Durr scored her first goal of the season in Sunday's, 4-0, victory over DePaul.

#### MEET THE NEWCOMERS

The Hawkeyes welcome 14 newcomers in 2022, including eight incoming freshmen and six transfers.

- The freshman class features Kellen Fife, Aubrey Hahn, Emma Kozicki, Morgan Leitz, Halle Skibo, Makenna Vonderhaar, Camille Welker, and Brooklyn Woods.
- Iowa also welcomes graduate students Cassidy Formanek (Houston), Molly Gervase (Denver), Caroline Halonen (Northern Michigan), and Anastasia Savich (Butler), as well as transfer students Kyndal Anderson (Furman) and Elle Otto (Mississippi State). Anderson scored the game-winners against Cal Poly and DePaul.
- Three of Iowa's four goal scorers so far this season are newcomers; Anderson has recorded two game-clinching goals, while Welker and Fife each converted in the win against DePaul on Aug. 28.



## 2 FOR THE MONEY

The Hawkeyes are undefeated in their last 32 games when scoring two goals or more. Since the start of the 2018 season, Iowa has a record of 31-0-1 when scoring two goals or more. That includes a 1-0 record in 2022, 9-0 in 2021, 2-0 in 2020, 13-0-1 in 2019 and 5-0 in 2018. The Hawkeyes won their final two games in 2017 when scoring two-plus goals. The last time Iowa lost a game while netting at least two goals was Oct. 1, 2017, at Michigan State (L, 3-2).

## TEAM CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Seniors Hailey Rydberg, Samantha Cary, and Sara Wheaton were voted team captains for the 2022 season. Both Rydberg and Wheaton were captains in 2021.

## DEPTH AT GOALKEEPER

Iowa features depth at goalkeeper with redshirt senior Monica Wilhelm and junior Macy Enneking holding down the net. The Iowa defense posted seven shutouts and held 18 opponents to two scores or fewer through 20 games last season with both players in goal throughout the year.

- Redshirt junior Monica Wilhelm notched 58 saves while allowing just 17 goals through 16 starts. Wilhelm tallied a career-best 11 saves against Rutgers last season.
- Sophomore Macy Enneking saw action in five games down the stretch in 2021, including four starts. She tallied 27 saves and allowed three goals in that span.
- In 2020, Enneking was the only unanimous Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection and earned Big Ten Tournament Most Outstanding Defensive Player accolades for allowing just one goal in four games at the conference tournament. She tallied 52 saves across 11 games and averaged a conference-best .912 save percentage, allowing just five goals in 956 minutes played.
- This season, Enneking has posted six saves at an .857 percentage through 176 minutes, while Wilhelm has recorded nine saves at a .900 percentage in 183 minutes played.

## SHARING THE WEALTH

Eleven different Hawkeyes combined for 31 goals in 2021. Alyssa Walker ('21) led the way offensively with nine goals and 20 points, finishing third in the Big Ten in goals scored.

- As for Iowa's returning players, forward Kenzie Roling put up six goals for 12 points to finish second on the team in both statistical categories. Samantha Cary and Hailey Rydberg each sank a pair of goals, while defenders Sara Wheaton, Natalie Massa, and Maggie Johnston each scored one goal apiece.
- Rydberg tallied a team-best seven assists, while freshman Addie Bundy was close behind with six assists. Iowa outshot opponents, 290-243, and won the shots on goal battle, 139-110, last season.
- In 2022, four Hawkeyes have combined for five goals. They are Kyndal Anderson (2), Josie Durr (1), Kellen Fife (1), and Camille Welker (1). Sophomore Elle Otto leads Iowa with two assists this season.

## LOOKING AHEAD

Iowa travels to a pair of in-state foes next week. First, the Hawkeyes face Iowa State on Sept. 8 at 6 p.m. (CT) at the Cyclone Sports Complex in Ames, Iowa, to open the 2022-23 Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series. The Hawkeyes then travel to Northern Iowa on Sept. 11. Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. (CT).
