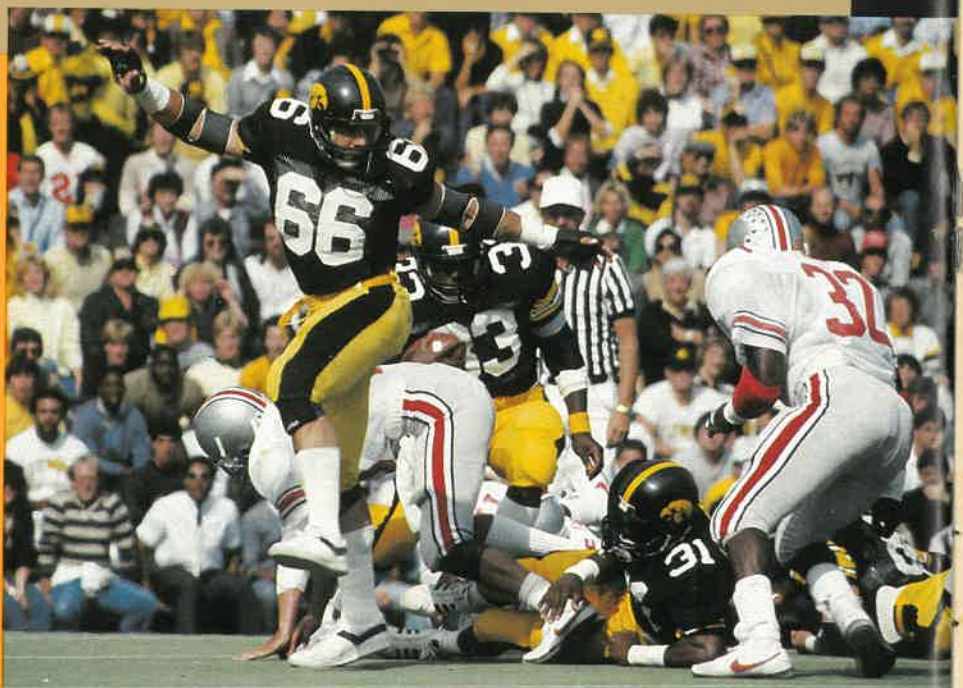

Even with quarterback Chuck Long on the sidelines with a sprained ankle, it still was a record-setting afternoon for the Iowa Hawkeyes in their 61-10 rout of Minnesota. Eddie Phillips ran 80 yards for a touchdown on the first play from scrimmage and finished the day with 172 yards to pass Dennis Mosley as the all-time Iowa career rushing leader. Phillips combined with Norm Granger (123 yards), Owen Gill (104) and Ronnie Harmon (75) to pace a rushing attack that set a school record of 517 yards rushing in one game. Phillips scored the second of his three touchdowns later in the quarter on a nine-yard run. Gill ran 41 yards for a score. Harmon caught a 25-yard pass from Cornelius Robertson, and Tom Nichol kicked a pair of field goals to round out the Hawkeyes' first half scoring parade. Iowa played reserves most of the second half, but still managed to add another 27 points — 20 of them coming in the final quarter. It was the final game for Gopher Coach Joe Salem, whose team set a Big Ten record for points given up in one season. The Hawkeyes accepted a December 30 invitation to play in the Gator Bowl after the game.

Cold weather stalled a couple of high-powered offenses as Florida beat Iowa 14-6 in the 38th annual Gator Bowl. Neal Anderson's first quarter one-yard run gave the Gators a lead they never relinquished. Tom Nichol booted the first of his two field goals to cut the margin to 7-3. With 1:08 left before halftime, Nichol tried to punt out of his own endzone, but the snap from center was dropped and Doug Drew fell on it for a 14-6 Florida halftime lead. The final points were tallied in the third quarter on Nichol's 31-yard field goal. Iowa's potent offense couldn't get untracked, totalling only 281 yards. Quarterback Chuck Long hit on 13-28 passes, but threw four interceptions. The Hawkeye defense surrendered just 260 yards of total offense and only 92 in the air. The Gator Bowl was the third straight season that Hayden Fry's team has made it to a postseason game. The Hawkeyes finished 14th in the national polls and won nine games for only the third time in school history. Running back Owen Gill was Iowa's TV player of the game with 83 yards gained on 10 carries.
