### THIS WEEK

The eighth-ranked University of Iowa field hockey team will face No. 6 Michigan on Sunday at 11:30 a.m. (CT) in a neutral site matchup at Northwestern's Lakeside Field in Evanston, Illinois. The game will be a nonconference matchup as the two teams played the conference matchup last Sunday in Ann Arbor -- a 2-0 Michigan win.

### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Iowa sits at No. 8 in the Week 7 Penn Monto/NFCA Coaches' poll on Oct. 18 after dropping a pair of Big Ten road games last weekend.
- The Hawkeyes are 5-5 against nationally ranked opponents in 2022, which includes a 2-0 victory over No. 1 Northwestern on Sept. 23 in Evanston. It was the second straight year Iowa has knocked off the No. 1 ranked team in the country.
- Iowa will conclude a stretch of seven straight games against nationally ranked foes on Sunday in Evanston. Five of the games have come on the road.
- Iowa won its 10th game of the season with its 2-1 come-from-behind win over No. 17 James Madison on Oct. 9. It is the sixth straight year and the seventh time in head coach Lisa Cellucci's tenure that Iowa has reached the 10-win mark.
- Iowa has had three players earn Big Ten weekly honors in 2022 -- Anthe Nijziel (Defensive, Sept. 12), Grace McGuire (Defensive, Sept. 26) and Alex Wesneski (Offensive, Sept. 26).
- Iowa is outscoring its opponents, 37-16, this season.
- The Hawkeyes have posted five shutouts this season. Iowa didn't allow a shot or penalty corner in a 2-0 win over No. 22 UMASS on Sept. 11.
- Iowa is sixth in the nation in goals against average (1.04), 11th in shutouts per game (0.33), 14th in save percentage (.775) and 16th in scoring margin (1.37).
- Senior goalkeeper Grace McGuire is ninth in the nation in goals against average (1.08) and 17th in save percentage (.765).
- Junior Alex Wesneski is tied for 19th nationally with 11 goals, while sophomore Leive Schalk is 22nd nationally in assists per game (0.60).
- Head coach Lisa Cellucci is in her ninth season at the helm of the Hawkeye field hockey program and her 23rd season overall. Cellucci has been a part of 278 Iowa victories and in 2020, she led the program to the Final Four for the 12th time -- the first since 2008. Iowa has posted double digit win totals in six of her eight seasons. The Hawkeyes have won three Big Ten titles (2019, 2019 (BTT), 2021) under her watch.
- Cellucci earned her third straight Big Ten Coach of the Year honor in 2021. She is the first coach in Big Ten history to be named Coach of the Year in three consecutive seasons.
- Iowa returns two-time Big Ten Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year Anthe Nijziel. The defender is the third player in Big Ten history to earn multiple Player of the Year honors.
- Iowa welcomes back three All-Americans (Nijziel, Grace McGuire and Esme Gibson), four NFCA All-Region honorees (Nijziel, McGuire, Gibson, Lokke Stribos) and four All-Big Ten selections (Nijziel, McGuire, Stribos, Gibson).





Lisa Cellucci enters her 23rd season as a member of the University of Iowa field hockey team's coaching staff in 2022-23 and her ninth as head coach. Cellucci, a three-time All-American and member of the U.S. National Team, is the all-time saves leader at Iowa. In her 22 years at Iowa, the Hawkeyes have compiled a 278-166 record and have been consistently ranked in the top 15 of the NFCA national rankings.

In the past three seasons, the Hawkeyes have been a top 10 team in the national poll and the team ascended to the No. 1 spot in the rankings for seven straight weeks during the 2021 season.

Cellucci has earned back-to-back-to-back Big Ten Coach of the Year honors (2019-21), becoming the first coach in Big Ten history to accomplish the feat. She and her staff have earned NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year honors twice.

In her eight years as head coach, Cellucci has coached:

- 16 NFCA All-Americans
- 31 NFCA All-West Regional selections
- 21 All-Big Ten selections, including 10 first-team honorees
- three NFCA West Region Players of the Year, two Big Ten Player of the Years, two Big Ten Defensive Player of the Years, three Big Ten Offensive Players of the Year and one Big Ten Freshman of the Year
- 68 Academic All-Big Ten selections, 65 NFCA National Academic Squad honorees, 27 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, and 62 NFCA Scholars of Distinction selections.

Following a quick turnaround from the 2021 spring season, Cellucci guided the Hawkeyes to the outright Big Ten regular season title in the fall of 2021 – the first for the program since 1999. It was Iowa's second regular season title in three seasons.

The Hawkeyes started the season with 16 consecutive victories, the second-longest winning streak in school history. The program won five consecutive games against top-seven ranked foes from Sept. 19-Oct. 3 and went 10-3 against ranked opponents during the year.

#### CELLUCCI REACHES MILESTONE

Head coach Lisa Cellucci -- the three-time reigning Big Ten Coach of the Year -- earned her 100th career victory on Aug. 26 when the Hawkeyes downed No. 20 Wake Forest in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. The ninth year head coach is the fourth Hawkeye head coach to reach this 100-win milestone.

#### IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

The Hawkeyes are ranked eighth in the Week 7 Penn Monto/NFCA National Division I rankings. The team has been ranked in 68 consecutive polls dating back to the 2016 season.

- Last season, Iowa finished the year ranked third after being ranked No. 1 for six straight weeks heading into the postseason. The team made its debut at No. 1 on Sept. 28, marking the first time in program history the team had been atop the NFCA poll.

#### PLAYING FROM AHEAD

The Hawkeyes are out-scoring their opponents 11-2 in the first quarter and 17-6 in the first half this season. Iowa has scored first in 11 of 15 games this season.

- Iowa has scored in the game's first seven minutes in seven contests, including a strike just 43 seconds into its win over Providence College. The team has scored in the game's first three minutes four times.

#### DOWN GOES NO. 1

Junior Alex Wesneski scored two first-half goals to lead Iowa to a 2-0 shutout victory over top-ranked Northwestern on Sept. 23. It is the second straight year the Hawkeyes have downed the No. 1 team in the nation.

- Prior to 2021, Iowa hadn't defeated a No. 1 ranked team since 2008. The win snapped Northwestern's 12-game winning streak dating back to last season.

#### CREATING OPPORTUNITIES

Iowa has scored 17 goals on 75 penalty corner attempts for a 22.7 conversion success rate.

- The team has had five or more penalty corners in eight of its 15 games.

#### IRON HAWKS

Four Hawkeye position players have played the duration this season and rarely leave the field -- defenders Lokke Stribos (14), Anthe Nijziel (13) and Harper Dunne (10) and midfielder Esme Gibson (2).

#### NOTHING DOING

The Hawkeyes held No. 22 UMASS without a shot or penalty corner in Iowa's 2-0 victory on Sept. 11. It was the first time since the 2021 spring season against Michigan State that Iowa's defense completely shut down the opposition.

#### WES-GOAL-SKI

Junior Alex Wesneski has scored in eight of Iowa's 15 games of the 2022 season as she leads the team with 11 goals, ranking third in the Big Ten. Wesneski's 11 strikes have come on just 31 shots.

- The Pennsylvania native has three multi-goal games this season. She scored two goals in back-to-back wins over Boston and Saint Louis on Sept. 2 and Sept. 4 before scoring both goals in Iowa's 2-0 road win at No. 1 Northwestern, which led to her being named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 26.
- Wesneski has four multi-goal games in her career.
- Her offensive outburst has nearly tripled her career scoring output. She had four goals entering the 2022 season.

#### ANNI & GAME WINNERS

Sophomore Annika Herbine has scored in six of Iowa's 15 games this season, giving her seven strikes -- second-most on the team. Herbine has a team-best three game-winning goals (Wake Forest, Saint Louis and Providence).

- Herbine had her first career multi-goal game against Providence College on Sept. 9 -- a 3-1 Hawkeye win.
- Herbine is also second on the team with seven assists, giving her 21 points, which are 13th in the Big Ten.

#### ELLIE'S GAME-WINNER

Senior Ellie Flynn scored the game-winning goal in Iowa's 2-1 come-from-behind win over No. 17 James Madison on Oct. 9. It was Flynn's first goal since the 2020 season and her third career strike. Flynn is one of seven Hawkeyes to net a game-winner this season.



**MULTI-GOALSTERS**

Iowa has had five players post seven multi-goal games this season. Junior Alex Wesneski has three multi-goal games, while Anthe Nijziel, Esme Gibson, Annika Herbine and Ciara Smith have one multi-goal contest.

**STOUT DEFENSE**

The Hawkeyes' defense was superb during its season-long seven-game winning streak, posting four shutouts in the seven contests. Iowa allowed just three goals on 35 shots in the seven games with 20 being on goal. (Sixteen of those shots came against No. 1 Northwestern with Iowa leading 2-0).

- Iowa's defense has given up five or fewer shots in 18 of the team's last 35 games dating back to the 2021 season.

**MCGUIRE IN GOAL**

Fifth-year senior Grace McGuire has started 53 consecutive games in goal. The Missouri native has won 40 games, posted 22 shutouts and made 138 saves during her career. She has a 0.89 career goals against average.

- McGuire is 10-5 with a 1.08 goals against average with 56 saves and four shutouts in 2022. She made a career-high 11 saves against No. 2 North Carolina on Aug. 28 and had eight saves (on 16 shots) against No. 1 Northwestern on Sept. 23. She posted 10 saves against No. 10 Michigan on Oct. 16.
- McGuire has two wins over No. 1 ranked opponents in her career.
- Grace McGuire is ninth in the nation in goals against average (1.08) and 17th in save percentage (.765) this season.
- Last season, McGuire made 46 saves in 20 games with an NCAA-best 11 shutouts. She had a program-record eight consecutive shutouts from Sept. 4-26.
- McGuire went 17-3 with a 0.75 goals against average and a 0.754 save percentage. She led the Big Ten and ranked second nationally in goals against average.
- The reigning All-American didn't allow a goal in 561:03 minutes from the second quarter against No. 1 North Carolina on Aug. 29, 2021, to the fourth quarter of the Oct. 1 game at No. 6 Rutgers.

**HELPING THE CAUSE**

Iowa has 38 assists on its 37 goals in 15 games this season with 10 different players tallying at least one assist. Eight different Hawkeyes have at least two assists on the year. Iowa is 13th in the nation in assists, averaging 2.53 per game.

**TEAM CAPTAINS**

Iowa's team captains for the 2022 season are seniors Anthe Nijziel, Leah Zellner and Esme Gibson and junior Ellie Flynn.

**DEFENDING BIG TEN CHAMPS**

The Hawkeyes claimed the outright Big Ten regular season title for the first time since 1999 during the 2021 season. It was the program's second regular season title in three years and the 16th in program history.

**THE BIG BEST RETURNS... AGAIN**

Senior Anthe Nijziel added to her trophy collection in 2021 as the defender was named the NFHCA West Region Player of the Year, Big Ten Co-Player of the Year and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year. It was her second straight year earning both Big Ten honors. She was also a NFHCA first-team All-American, and NFHCA first-team All-West Region and a unanimous first-team All-Big Ten selection.

- Nijziel was the third player and fourth Hawkeye to earn the NFHCA Regional Player of the Year accolade, joining Natalie Cafone (2014, 2016) and Katie Birch (2019).
- She was the third player in Big Ten history and third Hawkeye all-time to earn the Big Ten Player of the Year honor more than once, joining Liz Tchou (1986, 1987) and Kristy Gleason (1992, 1993).
- Nijziel was the second Hawkeye and eighth Big Ten student-athlete to earn multiple Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year honors.

**IT'S ALL ABOUT THE D**

The Hawkeyes return three defenders -- Anthe Nijziel, Harper Dunne and Lokke Stribos -- and goalkeeper Grace McGuire from a defense that led the NCAA with 11 shutouts in 2021 -- the most for the program since 1993 when it had 16 shutouts.

- The unit posted a program record eight consecutive shutouts from Sept. 4-26 where it surrendered just 12 shots on goal in the eight games.

**ROAD WARRIORS**

The Hawkeyes finished the 2021 season with a 7-0 record away from Iowa City with victories at No. 5 Louisville, No. 6 Rutgers and No. 7 Maryland. The seven road wins were the most since 1999.

- Iowa has won 10 of its last 13 road games dating back to the 2021 season.

**THE INVITEES**

Four Hawkeyes -- Olivia Frazier, Annika Herbine, Jacey Wittel and Mia Magnotta -- earned invitations to USA Field Hockey's 2023 U-21 and Development Squad Selection Camp. The camp will take place in December 2022 or Jan. 2023.

**EXPERIENCE GALORE**

For a second straight year, the Hawkeyes boast a roster with 14 upperclassmen, including seven fifth-year seniors, three seniors and four juniors. Over the past four seasons, Iowa's fifth-year seniors have won 68 games.

- Fifth-year seniors Anthe Nijziel and Lokke Stribos have started all 96 games of their Hawkeye careers. Three additional Hawkeyes -- Sofie Stribos, Harper Dunne and Grace McGuire-- have started 53 or more consecutive games.

**A STORIED HISTORY**

- The Hawkeyes have made 27 NCAA Tournament appearances in program history -- the most of any school as a member of the Big Ten Conference.
- Iowa has made 12 NCAA Final Four appearances, including winning the 1986 NCAA Championship.
- The program's 28 NCAA Tournament victories and 12 NCAA Final Fours are the most of any school as a member of the Big Ten Conference.

**SCOUTING MICHIGAN**

- The Wolverines are 9-4 overall and 4-2 in conference play heading into the weekend. Michigan, which plays Northwestern on Friday in Evanston, has won five straight games with two coming over ranked opponents.
- Michigan's four losses have come against No. 2 North Carolina, No. 5 Louisville, No. 6 Penn State and No. 3 Maryland.
- The Wolverines have scored 41 goals in 13 games with Abby Tamer and Lora Clarke leading the way with nine goals apiece.
- Three goalkeepers have seen action in the cage with Anna Spieker leading the way with a 0.81 goals against average with 18 saves. Spieker made three saves in the shutout win over Iowa on Oct. 16.

**SERIES RECORDS**

- Iowa leads the all-time series over Michigan, 44-30.
- The two teams have split the last eight meetings. The Hawkeyes lost to Michigan, 2-0, on Oct. 16 in Ann Arbor, Michigan. It was the Wolverines' second straight win in the series.

**UP NEXT**

The Hawkeyes close out the regular season on Oct. 28, hosting Michigan State. It will be Senior Day at Grant Field.
