The University of Iowa women's soccer team travels to No. 13 Northwestern on Thursday for a 7 p.m. (CT) contest at Martin Stadium. The Hawkeyes close out the regular season at home against No. 24 Penn State on Sunday at 1 p.m. (CT) at the Iowa Soccer Complex. Admission to Sunday's game is free.

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

- Northwestern enters ranked 13th in the nation with just two losses on the season; the Wildcats are second in the conference standings at 6-1-1 (19 points) in Big Ten play.
- The Wildcats were picked to finish 11th in the Big Ten preseason coaches poll but have surpassed
 expectations with 2.125 goals per game and stout a defense that has allowed just 10 goals against this
 season while posting seven shutouts.
- Junior Josie Aulicino leads the offense with seven goals and seven assists on the season; her assist total
 matches the Big Ten high this season, and her 21 points tie for second in the conference.
- Aulicino is also ties for third in SOG (25) while Rowan Lapi ties a Big Ten-best four game winning goals.
- Goalkeeper Mia Raben tops the conference in save percentage (.867) and ranks second in goals against average (.567).

SERIES HISTORY – NORTHWESTERN

lowa is 8-15-2 in the all-time series against the Wildcats. The Hawkeyes won last season, 2-1, at home.

SCOUTING THE NITTANY LIONS

- No. 24 Penn State is 10-3-2 on the season and 5-2-1 in Big Ten play.
- Fifth-year Ally Shlegel has a team-high 16 points and seven goals on the season.
- Senior Kate Wiesner ties for the most assists in the conference with seven on the season.
- Goalkeeper Katherine Asman has started all 15 games this season, posting an .823 save percentage,
 0.76 goals against average, and seven shutouts, which ranks third in the conference.

SERIES HISTORY – PENN STATE

lowa is 3-26-0 against Penn State in program history. The Hawkeyes defeated the Nittany Lions, 1-0, in the last meeting between the two schools, as lowa knocked off fourth-ranked Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals. lowa went on to win the first Big Ten Tournament Title in program history.







Dave Dilanni is in his ninth season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 305-87-35 career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history. In his ninth season at lowa, Dilanni has a 84-69-17 record. He has guided the program to two NCAA Tournament appearences and the first Big Ten title in program history.

In 2021, Dilanni led lowa to a 12-6-2 season and a tie for fourth place in the Big Ten Conference at 5-4-1. The Hawkeyes advanced to the Big Ten Tournament semifinal with a 1-0 first round victory at Michigan State before falling to Rutgers in Piscataway.

Five Hawkeyes earned Big Ten Conference postseason honors. Sara Wheaton was named to the All-Big Ten second team, while Alyssa Walker and Hailey Rydberg picked up third-team honors. Addie Bundy was a unanimous selection on the All-Freshman team and Riley Whitaker was one of 14 players to earn the conference sportsmanship award. The lowa offense averaged 1.55 goals per game as eleven different Hawkeyes combined for 31 goals on the year. On the defensive side of the ball, lowa posted seven shutouts and held held 18 opponents to two scores or fewer through 20 games last season.

Dilanni earned his 300th career win on Oct. 21, 2021, with a 1-0 win over Minnesota. Dilanni is one of two active Big Ten coaches to reach 300 career wins, along with Nebraska's John Walker. lowa's win in the opening round of the conference tournament at Michigan State was Dilanni's 80th win at the University of Iowa, tying Ron Rainey as the program's all-time leader.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Head coach Dave Dilanni is in his ninth season at the helm of the soccer program. Last fall, Dilanni's team posted a 12-6-2 record, tying for fourth in the Big Ten for lowa's highest regular season conference finish since 1999. The Hawkeyes return six starters and a host of other key contributors from the 2021 team. That includes a group of six fifth-year players from a class of seven seniors all with starting experience.
- The Hawkeyes qualified for the Big Ten Tournament in 2021, advancing to the semifinals as the
 tournament five seed before falling to Rutgers. Iowa has qualified for three of the last four Big Ten
 Conference Tournaments, not counting the unorthodox 2020 event which saw all teams compete
 and which the Hawkeyes went on to win for the first time in school history.
- In 2019 and 2020, lowa made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time in program history. The 2020 group earned lowa's first victory in the NCAA Tournament.
- lowa returns 51.6 percent of its goal scoring production from last season. The Hawkeyes lose leading scorer Alyssa Walker, but return a majority of the 11 goal scorers from last season. Assist leader Hailey Ryberg is back this season after dishing seven assists across seven different wins in 2021.
 Rydberg leads lowa with five goals and 14 points on the season.
- Three Hawkeyes Hailey Rydberg, Kenzie Roling, and Samantha Cary were named to the Big Ten Preseason Honors List. Iowa was picked to finish eighth out of 14 teams in the preseason coaches' poll.
- Three players that earned Big Ten Conference postseason honors last season return in 2022. Sara Wheaton was named to the All-Big Ten second team, while Hailey Rydberg picked up third-team honors. Addie Bundy was a unanimous selection on the All-Freshman team.
- Rydberg, Cary, and Wheaton were voted team captains for the 2022 season. Both Rydberg and Wheaton were captains in 2021.

LAST WEEK

lowa tied Purdue, 2-2, on Oct. 13 before defeating Nebraska, 4-0, on Senior Day.

- The Boilermakers took a, 2-0, lead into the half, including one goal off of a penalty kick in the waning minutes of the first half. The Hawkeyes came out firing in the second period, taking 13 shots
 in the final 45 minutes. Their aggression paid off, leading to a Purdue own-goal off of a corner kick
 scrum in the first minute of the second half, followed by a Caroline Halonen goal off a one-on-one
 opportunity in the 55th minute.
- lowa dominated the Cornhuskers three days later, posting a, 4-0, shutout that brought the Hawkeyes to eight goals in the last two games against Nebraska. lowa benefited from another own-goal on Sunday, and was also lifted by two scores from Hailey Rydberg and an additional goal from Caroline Halonen. Rielee Fetty and Elle Otto added a pair of assists on the game.

BIG TEN TOURNAMENT HOPEFULS

lowa is three points back in the Big Ten standings from qualifying for the conference tournament. Conference wins are worth three points each, while ties are worth one point, putting the Hawkeyes within striking distance heading into the final week of the regular season. lowa has qualified for three of the last four Big Ten Conference Tournaments, and also won the 2020 event which saw all teams compete.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

A class of seven senior leaders all with starting experience help anchor the Hawkeyes this season.

- Midfielder Hailey Rydberg was a third-team All-Big Ten selection last season, starting all 20 games and posting two goals with seven assists across seven wins last season.
- Defender Sara Wheaton earned second-team All-Big Ten honors and was lowa's Defensive Player of the Year on a defense that gave up just 20 goals and posted six clean sheets in 2021.
- Other notable veterans include goalkeeper Monica Wilhelm (87 saves, nine wins), defender
 Samantha Cary (19 starts, two goals), Natalie Massa (20 games played, 4 starts), and fifth-year
 players Josie Durr and Jenny Cape who return to the pitch after being sidelined in 2021. Durr scored
 her first goal of the season on Aug. 28 in a 4-0 victory over DePaul; Cape has started in five of 11
 games she has played in this year.

MEET THE NEWCOMERS

The Hawkeyes welcome 14 newcomers in 2022, including eight incoming freshmen and six transfers.

 The freshman class features Kellen Fife, Aubrey Hahn, Emma Kozicki, Morgan Leitz, Halle Skibo, Makenna Vonderhaar, Camille Welker, and Broolyn Woods.





- lowa also welcomes graduate students Cassidy Formanek (Houston), Molly Gervase (Denver),
 Caroline Halonen (Northern Michigan), and Anastasia Savich (Butler), as well as transfer students
 Kyndal Anderson (Furman) and Elle Otto (Mississippi State).
- Anderson scored the game-winners against Cal Poly and DePaul and has three goals on the season;
 Otto has recorded three goals of her own, and her four assists on the year match an lowa-best.
- Six of lowa's 10 goal scorers so far this season are newcomers.

2 FOR THE MONEY

The Hawkeyes are undefeated in their last 36 games when scoring two goals or more. Since the start of the 2018 season, lowa has a record of 33–0–3 when scoring two goals or more. That includes a 3–0–2 record in 2022, 9–0 in 2021, 2–0 in 2020, 13–0–1 in 2019 and 5–0 in 2018. The Hawkeyes won their final two games in 2017 when scoring two-plus goals. The last time lowa lost a game while netting at least two goals was Oct. 1, 2017, at Michigan State (L, 3–2).

DEPTH AT GOALKEEPER

lowa features depth at goalkeeper with redshirt senior Monica Wilhelm and junior Macy Enneking holding down the net. The lowa defense posted seven shutouts and held 18 opponents to two scores or fewer through 20 games last season with both players in goal throughout the year.

- In 2020, Enneking was the only unanimous Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection and earned Big Ten Tournament Most Outstanding Defensive Player accolades for allowing just one goal in four games at the conference tournament. She tallied 52 saves across 11 games and averaged a conference-best .912 save percentage, allowing just five goals in 956 minutes played.
- This season, Enneking has posted 17 saves at an .810 percentage through 447 minutes, while Wilhelm has recorded 41 saves at a .788 percentage in 970 minutes played. Enneking has started the last four games for lowa and has five total starts in 2022

SHARING THE WEALTH

10 different Hawkeyes have combined for 23 goals this season. Hailey Rydberg leads the team with five goals, followed by Caroline Halonen with four goals; Rydberg has a team-high 14 points on the season.

- Hawkeye goal scorers this season are Hailey Rydberg (5), Caroline Halonen (4), Kyndal Anderson (3), Elle Otto (3), Samantha Cary, Josie Durr, Sara Wheaton, Morgan Lietz, Kellen Fife, and Camille Welker. Iowa has forced two own-goals in 2022.
- Rydberg tallied a team-best seven assists last season. She currently ties Caroline Halonen at the top
 of the assist column for lowa with four on the season.
- Rydberg's 61 ranks second in the Big Ten Conference; her 23 shots on goal tie for fifth in the Big Ten.
- Anderson leads lowa with two game-winning goals.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals kick off on Oct. 30. The top eight teams in the conference standings will qualify.
