EXHIBITION GAME STORYLINES

- Six Hawkeyes are Iowa natives, two hail from Illinois, two are international (Serbia and England), and one each from New York, Nebraska, Massachusetts, Michigan, and Indiana. Iowa's average height is 6-foot-5.
- The Hawkeyes have been ranked in the final AP Poll each of the last three years: #16 in 2022; #8 in 2021; #25 in 2020. The last time Iowa has been ranked in the final AP Poll three consecutive seasons was 1987 (#6), 1988 (#17) and 1989 (#14).
- Iowa has won 68 games combined over the last three seasons (20 in 2020; 22 in 2021; 26 in 2022). The 68 victories are the fourth most over a three-year stretch in program history and most since winning 77 contests from 1987-89.
- Iowa returns 52.4 percent of its scoring production from last season, third most among Big Ten teams.
- Iowa won four games in four days to capture the 2022 Big Ten Tournament Championship, its third tournament title in program history and first since 2006.
- Junior Ahron Ulis, who wore No. 4 the last two years, will wear No. 1 in 2022-23.
- The Hawkeyes have won 42 games over Big Ten teams -- including conference tournament contests -- over the past three seasons, second most in the league (Illinois, 47).
- Redshirt junior Connor McCaffery and redshirt freshman Patrick McCaffery are one of 22 father/coach and son/player duos in Division I in 2022-23. Of the 22 schools, the McCaffery's are the only program with a father/coach and two sons on the roster.
- Iowa has qualified for six NCAA tournaments over the last eight completed seasons (2014-16, 2019, 2021, 2022) and nine postseason tournaments over the last 10 completed seasons (6 NCAA; 3 NIT). The 2020 postseason was canceled due to COVID-19.
- Iowa won 26 games, the second most single season total in program history (30 in 1987).
- After his historic season, Keegan Murray was selected by the Sacramento Kings with the fourth pick in the 2022 NBA Draft, the highest selection by a Hawkeye in program history.
- Keegan Murray became Iowa's single-season scoring leader (822 points). After going 117 years without a player scoring 700 points in a single season, the Hawkeyes have had a player score over 700 points in each of the last three seasons: Luka Garza scored 740 in 2020 and 747 in 2021.
- Iowa posted its ninth upper division Big Ten finish in the last 10 seasons. The Hawkeyes have finished fifth or better in the regular season standings six of the last eight years.
- Iowa led the Big Ten and ranked fifth nationally in scoring offense (83.2). The Hawkeyes have led the league in scoring five of the last nine seasons, including the last four.
- The Hawkeyes boasted a 15-3 record in home games in 2021-22. Iowa has won 14+ home contests each of the last four years.
- The Hawkeyes won eight of their last 10 games away from home (Maryland; Ohio State; Nebraska; Michigan; Northwestern; Rutgers; Indiana; Purdue).
- Twenty-one of Iowa's 26 wins came by 10+ points, including 12 by 20 points or more.
- The Hawkeyes won 12 of their last 15 games -- winning 10 of the 12 by double figures -- dating back to Feb. 6. Iowa went 5-1 in neutral site contests in 2021-22.
- The Hawkeyes were tops in the country in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.74); fourth in fewest turnovers per game (9.2); and seventh in turnover margin (4.4).
- Six of Iowa's ten losses were by a five-point margin or less.
- Fran McCaffery has coached a first-team All-Big Ten honoree seven of the last nine years. He has guided Iowa to 20+ wins eight of the last 10 seasons, including four-straight.

THE SETTING

Iowa will host Truman State (Division II) on Monday, Oct. 31, in an exhibition game. Tipoff is set for 7:01 p.m. (CT) on Mediacom Court at Carver-Hawkeye Arena (15,056). Tickets are \$10 for adults, and \$5 for youth and UI students. The game will be streamed on mobile devices on B1G+ (\$) and will be broadcast on the Hawkeye Radio Network.

PREGAME TRICK-OR-TREAT

Kids and fans are encouraged to participate in a trick-or-treat prior to Monday's exhibition. Student-athletes from various Iowa athletic teams (baseball, men's wrestling, and track & field) will pass out candy on the concourse from 5:30-7 p.m.

ON THE AIR

Radio: Games are broadcast on the Hawkeye Radio Network. Gary Dolphin handles the play-by-play, along with color commentator Bob Hansen. The network includes more than 40 stations that blanket the state of Iowa and include portions of Illinois, Nebraska, Minnesota, Missouri and Wisconsin. The Hawkeye Radio Network coverage includes a 60-minute pregame show.

Stream: Monday's exhibition will be streamed on mobile devices at B1G+ (\$). John Evans and former Hawkeye Jess Settles will call the action.

MURRAY VOTED PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN, KARL MALONE AWARD CANDIDATE

Junior Kris Murray was named to the 2023 Big Ten Preseason All-Big Ten Team and one of 20 candidates for the 2023 Karl Malone Award, which recognizes the top power forward in college basketball.

It marks the fourth straight season that one or more Hawkeyes have been selected to the preseason all-conference squad, voted upon by a selected panel of media. Joe Wieskamp was selected in 2019 and 2020, Luka Garza was tabbed the Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year in 2020, while Kris' twin brother Keegan was recognized in 2021. Keegan was also the recipient of the 2022 Karl Malone Award.

Murray was Iowa's leading scorer (9.7) and rebounder (4.3) off the bench last season. He improved his scoring average by 9.1 points and rebounding average by 3.7 per outing. The native of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, was second on the team in 3-point percentage (.397), blocks per game (0.9) and field goals made (124), third in offensive (1.6) and defensive (2.7) rebounds per contest, and fourth in steals (0.8) per game. Murray made at least one 3-pointer in a team-best 17 consecutive games (Jan. 22-March 13). He recorded multiple steals in 10 games and multiple blocks in nine contests. His 31 blocks and 43 triples rank seventh and eighth, respectively, by a Hawkeye sophomore. He shared the team's Most Improved Player Award with Tony Perkins.

Murray's best game in 2022 came in leading the Hawkeyes to victory over Indiana on Jan. 13, 2022 (29 points; 11 rebounds; 3 steals; 3 blocks).

HEAD COACH FRAN McCAFFERY

Fran McCaffery, who is signed through the 2028 season, enters his 13th season as the head basketball coach at the University of Iowa and his 27th year overall as a college head coach. McCaffery has reached the 20-win plateau 11 of the last 15 seasons, including four straight.

McCaffery spent five seasons (2005-10) as the head coach at Siena, six years at UNC-Greensboro (1999-2005) and three seasons at Lehigh (1985-88) before joining the Hawkeyes.

McCaffery has nearly four decades of Division I coaching experience. He is in his 41st season as a collegiate coach, which includes 27 years as a head coach and 14 as an assistant. Last March, McCaffery joined Hall of Fame coaches Rick Pitino, Bob Huggins, Eddie Sutton and Lefty Driesell as the only Division I coaches to lead teams to conference tournament titles in four or more different leagues (Big Ten, MAAC, SoCon, ECC). He is one of 14 coaches to lead at least four different Division I teams to the NCAA Tournament.

McCaffery, 62, holds a career mark of 493-339 (.593) and guided his teams to 15 postseason appearances (11 NCAA & four NIT). Iowa likely would have competed in another NCAA Tournament in 2020, if not for the NCAA canceling the postseason due to COVID-19. He is 242-162 (.599) at Iowa; the second winningest coach in program history. McCaffery led Iowa to wins in four of the last seven NCAA Tournaments (2015, 2016, 2019, and 2021).

Since taking over the Iowa program in 2010, Iowa has earned nine postseason tournament bids (6 NCAA, 3 NIT). McCaffery coached Iowa to a Big Ten Tournament title and 26 wins in 2022, the second-most win total in program history. McCaffery has guided five players to first team All-Big Ten status six of the last eight years, including the 2020 & 2021 National and Big Ten Player of the Year, Luka Garza.

McCaffery has posted upper division finishes in nine of the last 10 seasons at Iowa and 21 of 26 seasons as a head coach. The Hawkeyes have finished fifth or better in the Big Ten standings six of the last eight years. He has posted 20 wins or more 11 of the last 15 seasons, including eight of the last 10 years at Iowa (2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022). Iowa's 205 victories between 2013-21 are the most over a 10-year span at Iowa since 1987-96 (207).

McCaffery and the Hawkeyes boast a 153-40 (.793) home record the last 11 seasons, which includes a school-record 18 wins in 2014 and 13 consecutive victories in 2019-20. Iowa has won 14+ games in Carver-Hawkeye Arena each of the last four seasons (2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022).

McCaffery's five years at Siena were the best in its 70-year history. He led the Saints on an incredible run that ended with three straight Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference championships and NCAA Tournament appearances.

McCaffery's Saints owned a 112-51 (.687) record in his five years with the program. He guided the Saints to four consecutive 20-win seasons. McCaffery's achievements earned the head coach Siena Hall of Fame recognition in 2017.

The 2009 MAAC Coach of the Year and 2010 District I Coach of the Year is the third winningest coach, by percentage, in league history (68-22, .756). He is the only coach to guide a MAAC program to two NCAA Tournament wins. McCaffery led his 2008 and 2009 teams to first round NCAA Tournament victories over Vanderbilt and Ohio State, respectively.

In his final two seasons at Siena, he coached the Saints to back-to-back 27-win campaigns and boasted a combined 39-3 (.929) record against MAAC opponents, which included MAAC Tournament contests.

McCaffery began his coaching career as an assistant at Penn (1982-83) and Lehigh (1983-85). After three seasons as head coach at Lehigh, he spent 11 seasons as an assistant at Notre Dame (1988-99).

McCaffery played basketball at Wake Forest his freshman year (1977-78) and concluded his playing career at Penn his final three seasons (1979-82).

He earned his B.S. degree in Economics from The Wharton School (Penn) in 1982. McCaffery also earned a Master of Education from Lehigh in 1985.

SCOUTING TRUMAN STATE

- Seven of Truman State's top 10 scorers from a year ago return in 2022-23. The Bulldogs' top two scorers from last season -- Cade McKnight (19.2 ppg) and Masen Miller (14.2 ppg) -- both transferred to Indiana State following the season. Redshirt junior Elijah Hazekamp is Truman State's top returning scorer (12.8) and rebounder (7.1 rpg). Truman State averaged 79.3 points per game and owned a +5.1 rebounding margin in 30 games in 2021-22.
- Truman State posted a 20-10 overall record, including a 13-6 conference mark, a year ago.
- The Bulldogs' roster of 20 is comprised of mostly underclassmen: 11 freshmen (three red-shirt), three sophomores, four juniors, and two seniors.
- Half of Truman State's roster (10 of 20) hails from the state of Iowa, including two from Cedar Rapids (Hunter Strait and Caleb Schlaak).
- Former Hawkeye Jeff Horner enters his fifth season as head coach of the Bulldogs. The Mason City, Iowa, native led Truman State to the GLVC Tournament Title and a share of the regular season championship in his second season in 2020. Prior to Truman State, Horner spent four seasons at the University of North Dakota (serving as the director of operations for one season before three as an assistant coach). Horner also had coaching stints at Grand View University and West Des Moines Valley High School.

JEFF HORNER RETURNS TO IOWA CITY

Jeff Horner was a two-time third team All-Big Ten honoree (2004, 2006) and was voted the Most Outstanding Player of the 2006 Big Ten Tournament. He also was recognized as the 2003 Chris Street Award recipient and shared team MVP honors three straight seasons (2004, 2005, 2006). Horner totaled 1,502 points, 612 assists and 563 rebounds as a Hawkeye. He is one of three Hawkeyes to amass four 100-assist seasons (Jordan Bohannon, Dean Oliver). A two-time team captain, Horner ranks second in Iowa career assists (612) and 3-pointers made (262).

IOWA SCHEDULE NOTES

- Iowa will open the regular season with three of four games at home, including two straight.
- The Hawkeyes will play back-to-back conference road games four times.
- Iowa has a stretch of four straight home contests in December (ISU, Wisconsin, SE Missouri State and Eastern Illinois).
- Iowa has seven weekend home contests (three on Saturdays and four on Sundays), including six against Big Ten opponents. The Hawkeyes have home games inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena on a Saturday or Sunday four of the final six weekends of the regular season.
- The Hawkeyes have a stretch of four of five league home games in early January. Iowa will host Indiana (Jan. 5), Michigan (Jan. 12), Maryland (Jan. 15) and Northwestern (Jan. 18).
- Iowa is scheduled to play at Penn State on New Year's Day. The Hawkeyes have played on New Year's Day 10 previous times, most recently in 2017, versus Michigan in Iowa City. Prior to 2017, Iowa's last New Year's Day contest was in 1946 versus Saint Louis. The last time the Hawkeyes played a road game on New Year's Day was at Toledo in 1940.
- Iowa has three trips to the Tri-State Area, traveling to New Jersey twice (Nov. 16 at Seton Hall and Jan. 8 at Rutgers) and New York once (Dec. 6 versus Duke at Madison Square Garden).
- Iowa will play on Super Bowl Sunday for the fourth straight season and sixth time in eight years, playing its only regular season game against Minnesota in Minneapolis on Feb. 12.
- Five of Iowa's final eight league games will be on the road.

HAWKEYES WIN 4 GAMES IN 4 DAYS. WIN BIG TEN TOURNAMENT TITLE

Iowa outscored ninth-ranked Purdue 12-4 over the final 2:45 to post a 75-66 triumph and capture the program's third Big Ten Tournament championship in Indianapolis.

- The Hawkeyes (2001, 2022) joined Michigan (2017, 2018) as the only schools to win Big Ten Tournament titles twice by winning four games in four days.
- All-American Keegan Murray was named the Big Ten Tournament Most Outstanding Player, while Murray and Jordan Bohannon were named to the all-tournament team.
- Murray broke the record for most points (103) and field goals made (38) in a single Big Ten Tournament, surpassing the previous mark of 92 points and 34 field goals made by Ohio State's Duane Washington Jr. in 2021.
- Both Iowa's men's and women's basketball teams won the Big Ten Tournament title in the same year for a second time (2001 and 2022).



HAWKEYES WELCOME NEWCOMERS

Iowa welcomes four new faces to the 2022-23 roster: Dasonte Bowen, Josh Dix, Dante Eldridge, and Amarion Nimmers.

Bowen and Dix are true freshman, hailing from Boston and Council Bluffs, respectively. Eldridge and Nimmers are non-scholarship student-athletes. Eldridge, a junior, is the son of assistant coach Courtney Eldridge.

BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK

Iowa became the first school to have a men's basketball player lead the Big Ten in scoring three straight seasons since Purdue from 1968-70.

Iowa's Luka Garza led the conference in scoring average in 2020 (26.2 ppg) and 2021 (21.9 ppg). Keegan Murray led the league in 2022, averaging 23.5 points per game in all games. Murray finished the 20-game league schedule as the Big Ten's leading scorer, averaging 22.8 points per contest.

Purdue legend Rick Mount led the Big Ten in scoring in 1968 (29.7 ppg), 1969 (35.2 ppg), and 1970 (39.4 ppg).

ANOTHER SIXTH YEAR PLAYER

After six seasons and multiple broken records, Jordan Bohannon has exhausted his collegiate eligibility. Bohannon is the program's career leader in four statistical categories: assists (704), 3-pointers made (455), games played (179), and free throw percentage (.887, 370-417). He sank a school and Xfinity Center record 10 3-pointers at Maryland on Feb. 10, 2022. His 455 triples are the most in Big Ten history and 192 more than any other Hawkeye.

Connor McCaffery decided to utilize his COVID bonus year and return for his sixth season with the Hawkeyes.

PATRICK McCAFFERY FINISHED LAST SEASON STRONG

Patrick McCaffery, who was Iowa Men's Basketball's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honoree in 2022, netted double figures in scoring 11 of the last 18 games played last season.

The forward made at least one 3-pointer in 12 of the last 18 games, including sinking multiple triples in six contests during that stretch.

HAWKEYE FASTBREAKS

- After his historic season, Keegan Murray was selected by the Sacramento Kings with the fourth pick in the 2022 NBA Draft, the highest selection by a Hawkeye in program history.
- Iowa has been a top five seed in the last three B1G Tournaments.
- Iowa has won 10 or more Big Ten games seven of the last eight seasons.
- Iowa is 130-28 when scoring 80 points or more, the last 12 seasons. The Hawkeyes are 91-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 61 points, the last 12 years.
- Iowa has won 77 of its last 82 nonconference home games, dating back to 2012.
- Iowa was the only school in the country in 2022 to have both a men's (Keegan Murray) and women's (Caitlin Clark) basketball finalist for both the Naismith and Wooden National Player of the Year awards.
- The Hawkeyes have won seven of their last nine, including four straight, Big Ten/ACC Challenge games.
- Florida State has won an NCAA-record 13 straight overtime games, dating back to January, 2018. The last team to beat the Seminoles in overtime was Iowa (78-75) on Dec. 2, 2015, in Iowa City. That game featured 21 lead changes.

IOWA HISTORY

Iowa has played 2,908 games since beginning basketball in 1902. Iowa's overall record is 1,718-1,190 (.591). Iowa's 1,718 wins are 36th most among Division I programs. That includes a 1,097-377 (.744) record in home games, a 621-813 (.433) record in contests away from Iowa City, an 814-813 (.501) mark in Big Ten games and a 501-151 (.768) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

FRAN McCAFFERY CONTINUES TO WIN

- Head Coach Fran McCaffery enters his 27th season as a head coach and is seven wins from his 500th career victory.
- With Iowa's Big Ten Tournament win last March, McCaffery joined Hall of Fame coaches Rick Pitino, Bob Huggins, Eddie Sutton and Lefty Driesell as the only Division I coaches to lead teams to conference tournament titles in four or more different leagues.
- Fran McCaffery has guided Iowa to 20 wins or more in eight of the last 10 seasons. He has led Iowa to Big Ten upper division finishes nine of the last 10 years. Iowa, Michigan State, and Wisconsin have each recorded a Big Ten-best nine first division finishes since 2013.
- Fran McCaffery has coached a first-team All-Big Ten honoree seven of the last nine seasons. He has guided Iowa to 20+ wins seven of the last nine seasons and fifth place or better finishes in the Big Ten six of the last eight years.

STAFF CHANGES

Fran McCaffery has a couple changes to his staff following last season. Assistant Coach Kirk Speraw retired and Assistant Coach Billy Taylor left for a head coaching position at Elon. Replacing Speraw and Taylor are Courtney Eldridge and Matt Gatens. Eldridge was on staff the previous six seasons, most recently as director of player development and recruiting director. Gatens is a former Hawkeye and most recently was an assistant coach at Drake.

Tristan Spurlock, who played basketball at UCF, is the new Director of Player Development. Al Seibert's title changed to Chief of Staff, while Kyle Denning is now the team's Director of Operations.

VALUING THE BASKETBALL

The Hawkeyes were tops in the country in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.74); fourth in fewest turnovers per game (9.2); and seventh in turnover margin (4.4) last season.

Connor McCaffery continued his mastery of limiting turnovers in 2021-22 with 65 assists and only 13 turnovers (one per 44.6 minutes played), boasting a robust 5.0 assist-to-turnover ratio. McCaffery is Iowa's assist-to-turnover ratio career leader, averaging 3.47, nearly 1.0 above second-place Andre Banks (2.53).

PROFESSIONAL HAWKEYES

A number of recent Iowa basketball graduates are playing professionally: Keegan Murray (NBA Sacramento Kings), Luka Garza (G League Iowa Wolves), Jordan Bohannon (G League Iowa Wolves), Joe Wieskamp (G League Wisconsin Herd), Jarrod Uthoff (Japan), Devyn Marble (Poland), Tyler Cook (G League Salt Lake City Stars), Anthony Clemmons (Turkey), Gabriel Olaseni (Turkey), Ryan Kriener (Matsuyama), Melsahn Basabe (Nicaragua), and Aaron White (Serbia).

Iowa tips off the regular season on Monday, Nov. 7, against Bethune-Cookman. The contest is slated for a 6 p.m. (CT) start and will be televised on ESPNU.
