- lowa will host Northwestern on Homecoming for the 12th time on Saturday. The Hawkeyes are 7-4 against the Wildcats on Homecoming. The last meeting came in 2016 a 38-31 Northwestern victory. Iowa has won three of its last four, nine of 12 and 16 of its last 21 Homecoming contests dating back to 2000.
- TE Sam LaPorta became lowa's career leader in receptions amongst Hawkeye tight ends when he totaled six catches for 55 yards at No. 2 Ohio State. LaPorta has 131 career receptions for 1,462 yards. His yardage total is third amongst lowa tight ends.
- TD No. 3 The Hawkeye defense scored its third touchdown of the season at No. 2 Ohio State when DE Joe Evans sacked C.J. Stroud to force a fumble and returned it 11 yards for his first career touchdown. Iowa's defensive unit has scored 22 points this season (3 TDs, 2 safeties).
- True freshman RB Kaleb Johnson made his first career start at No. 2 Ohio State, becoming the 32nd true freshman (and sixth freshman running back) to start under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Johnson is second on the team with 260 rushing yards and three TDs.
- TE Sam LaPorta is second amongst Big Ten tight ends and fifth nationally in receptions in 2022. LaPorta has 36 receptions for 336 yards in seven games. LaPorta is 10th in the Big Ten in receptions per game (5.1).
- K Drew Stevens has made 7-of-8 field goals attempts as a true freshman, including 2-of-3 from 40+ and 1-of-1 from 50+. The last true freshman to kick for the Hawkeyes was Keith Duncan in 2016.
- LB Jack Campbell is leading the B1G and ranks 11th nationally with 71 tackles in seven games. The Cedar Falls, Iowa, native has had 8 or more tackles in each game, including 4 games with 10+ tackles. Campbell is tied for 38th in program history with 248 tackles with Pat Angerer and Merton Hanks. He also has an INT, fumble recovery and safety this season.
- QB Alex Padilla made his 2022 debut at No. 2 Ohio State, completing 5-of-10 passes for 32 yards while playing the second half. Padilla has played 12 games in his Hawkeye career (with three starts), where he has completed 61-of-124 passes for 680 yards and two touchdowns.
- lowa's defense is ranked sixth nationally in total defense (278.3), eighth in scoring defense (16.1), 11th in passing yards allowed (174.0), 12th in passing efficiency defense (108.95), 14th in rushing defense (104.3) and 15th in first down defense (115). The Hawkeyes have given up 14 or fewer points in five of their seven games.
- P Tory Taylor is second in the Big Ten and ninth nationally with a 45.6 average on 46 punts (tied for the third most in the country). Fifteen of Taylor's punts have gone 50+ yards, 21 have been downed inside the 20 and 13 have been fair caught. Taylor has twice been named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week this season.

THE SERIES

- Iowa holds a 52-28-3 advantage in the series that began with a 12-6 Iowa victory in 1897. The Hawkeyes are 26-12 all-time in games played in Iowa City.
- lowa won 21 consecutive games over Northwestern prior to a 31-20 Wildcat win in 1995 in Evanston. The Wildcats hold a 14-11 advantage since snapping that Hawkeye winning streak.
- lowa won the last meeting, 17-12, in Evanston in 2021. The visiting team has been victorious in each of the last four meetings, with the Wildcats winning the last three meetings in Kinnick Stadium. Five of the last six games in the series have been decided by a touchdown or less.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

lowa has played 1,288 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 679-570-39 (.544). That includes a 422-226-16 (.649) record in home games, a 257-344-23 (.432) record in games away from Iowa City, a 349-388-25 (.476) mark in Big Ten games and a 306-191-15 (.623) record in Kinnick Stadium.



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 24th season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2029 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided lowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and Big Ten West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 181 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He
 has 111 Big Ten wins, which ranks fourth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 12 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004

- lowa has posted a 172-93 (.649) overall mark and a 107-68 (.611) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 15 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- At lowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 181-114 (.614) and a 111-82 (.575) mark in Big Ten games. He is lowa's all-time winningest football coach with 181 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 193-135 (.588), giving him the fourth most wins among active head coaches.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an
 assistant coach since 2012 and lowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line
 before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

Moon Family Head Football Coach Kirk Ferentz has 111 Big Ten wins as lowa's head coach, the fourth most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history. The Hawkeyes defeated Penn State, 41-21, on Nov. 21, 2020, to earn Ferentz' 100th conference win.

- Ferentz' 181 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five include Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Ferentz (181) and Joe Paterno (162).
- Ferentz (181-114) became lowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as lowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached lowa for 20 years (1979-98).
- Both Ferentz (181, 111) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top 10 in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only lowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).
- Ferentz is fourth among active coaches with 193 career victories.
- lowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 24th season as Iowa's head football coach in 2022. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) has been at his current school for 10 seasons or more.

- Defensive coordinator Phil Parker has been with Ferentz throughout his tenure, as he is in his 24th season on lowa's staff, including his 11th as defensive coordinator. He is the longest tenured defensive coordinator in FBS.
- Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his 11th season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016. James Ferentz is currently a member of the NFL's New England Patriots, while Steven Ferentz is on the coaching staff of the NFL's Miami Dolphins.

LONGTIME ASSISTANTS

lowa's coaching staff boasts some of the top longevity in the nation with its assistant coaches. The Hawkeyes are one of five schools nationally with a minimum of five assistants that are entering their seventh-plus year of full-time coaching at the school in 2022.

HAWKEYES ON HOMECOMING

- Iowa owns a 60-44-5 (.579) record in 109 Homecoming games. Iowa has won eight of its last 11 Homecoming games.
- lowa is 20-6 on Homecoming since 1995, and 16-5 since 2000, including winning seven in a row from 2000-06. The Hawkeyes are 16-6 in Homecoming contests under Kirk Ferentz. (There was no homecoming contest in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic).

THE LAST MEETING – Iowa 17, Northwestern 12 (Nov. 6, 2021 – Evanston, Ill.)

Reserve quarterback Alex Padilla threw for 172 yards and junior running back Tyler Goodson notched his second 100-yard rushing game of the season to lead the Hawkeyes to a 17-12 road victory at Northwestern. Padilla entered the game after Spencer Petras left the game due to injury. Iowa finished with 361 yards of total offense, but just 102 came in the second half.

- The Hawkeyes had a balanced attack with 176 yards on the ground and 185 through the air
- Iowa's defense forced three turnovers interceptions from Dane Belton (2) and Jermari Harris and the team held the Wildcats to 93 yards on the ground. Northwestern finished with 363 yards of total offense after gaining 102 in the first half.

LAPORTA BREAKS TIGHT END RECEPTIONS RECORD

Senior TE Sam LaPorta became Iowa's career receptions leader amongst tight ends during the road game at No. 2 Ohio State. The Illinois native made six catches for 55 yards, moving his career total to 131 receptions for 1,462 yards. LaPorta is 25th in program history in receiving yards and ranks third amongst tight ends.

- LaPorta was targeted 16 times at Illinois on Oct. 8 and he finished with a career-high nine receptions for 101 yards. It was his second career 100 yard receiving game as he made seven catches for 122 yards and one touchdown against Kentucky in the Citrus Bowl.
- LaPorta is second in the Big Ten and fifth nationally amongst tight ends with 36 receptions for 334 yards.

LB Jack Campbell and P Tory Taylor earned multiple midseason All-America honors for their play during the first half of the 2022 season.

• Campbell was on the All-America teams selected by The Athletic, ESPN.com, SportingNews.com and CBSSports.com, while Taylor was included on both The Athletic and CBSSports.com's teams.

TRUE FRESHMAN STARTER

RB Kaleb Johnson became the 32nd freshman of the Kirk Ferentz era to start a game when he was in the starting lineup at No. 2 Ohio State on Oct. 22. Johnson is the sixth Hawkeye running back to start as a freshman under Ferentz, joining Brandon Wegher (2009), Marcus Coker (2010), Jordan Canzeri (2011), Greg Garmon (2012) and Tyler Goodson (2019).

FORCING TOS

The Hawkeyes have forced two or more turnovers in four games this season, including three against Iowa State, Rutgers and Illinois.

• Iowa has forced 12 turnovers in seven games (five fumble recoveries, seven interceptions), and has scored 31 points off the miscues.

NICO REACHES 100

WR Nico Ragaini made his 100th career reception during lowa's Oct. 8 road game at Illinois. The Connecticut native has 105 career receptions for 1,127 yards.

LACHEY STEPS UP

Junior TE Luke Lachey is emerging as Iowa's second tight end weapon. The Columbus, Ohio native had a career-high four receptions for 84 yards against Michigan on Oct. 1, which included a 5-yard touchdown catch for his first career score. In consecutive games against Rutgers and Michigan, Lachey had six catches for 121 yards and one touchdown. He had a career-long 37-yard reception against the Scarlet Knights on Sept. 24.

• Lachey is fourth on the team with 10 receptions for 163 yards and one touchdown.

DEFENSIVE SCORING

lowa's defense extended its pick six streak to 15 consecutive years at Rutgers when sophomore DB Cooper DeJean made an over the shoulder catch and returned the interception 45 yards for his first career touchdown. It was the 30th longest interception return for a touchdown in school history and the 50th all-time.

- Iowa is leading the Big Ten and ranks third nationally with three defensive touchdowns (one interception, two fumble returns).
- Iowa's defense found the end zone a second time in Piscataway when DB Kaevon Merriweather scooped up a Rutgers fumble (forced on a hit by DB Sebastian Castro) and returned it 30 yards for a touchdown. It was the eighth fumble return for a touchdown in school history and the fifth longest in the record books.
- The Hawkeye defense scored its third touchdown at No. 2 Ohio State when DL Joe Evans sacked C.J. Stroud to force a fumble, recovered and returned it 11 yards for his first career touchdown. The score gave Iowa a 7-3 lead in Columbus.
- Iowa's defense has scored 22 points this season via three touchdowns and two safeties.

MIGHTY D

lowa's defense is ranked sixth nationally in total defense (278.3), eighth in scoring defense (16.1), 11th in passing yards allowed (174.0), 12th in passing efficiency defense (108.95), 14th in rushing defense (104.3) and 15th in first down defense (115). The Hawkeyes have given up 14 or fewer points in five of their seven games.

- The Hawkeyes gave up 59 points (9.8 per game) in the first six games. It was the lowest point total for the program through six games since 1956.
- The unit gave up just 20 points in the first four games -- the fewest points allowed for the program in 66 years.
- Iowa has given up 10 or fewer points in five of its first seven games.
- The Hawkeyes gave up 360 yards and 66 rushing yards to No. 2 Ohio State, an offense that was averaging 543.7 yards and 228.0 rushing yards per game.
- Iowa gave up 151 yards of total offense to a Nevada offense that was averaging 336.3 yards per game. It was the second time this season Iowa allowed 151 yards or fewer (120 vs. South Dakota State). It was the first time since 1986 that Iowa's defense has given up 160 or fewer (125 at Iowa State, 159 vs. NIU, 150 vs. UTEP) in the team's first three games.
- lowa's passing defense held the Wolfpack to 82 yards, tied for the 13th fewest in a game in the Kirk Ferentz era. The Hawkeyes have held two of their seven opponents under 100 yards passing (87 vs. South Dakota State).

HEY, COOP

Sophomore DB Cooper DeJean has started all seven games – three at the CASH position and four at defensive back. DeJean recorded an interception in three consecutive games (vs. Iowa State, vs. Nevada, at Rutgers) – a first by a Hawkeye since junior DB Jermari Harris in 2021 season (at Nebraska, vs. Michigan, vs. Kentucky).

- DeJean had a career-high 11 tackles, recorded his first career interception and had two pass breakups against Iowa State on Sept. 10.
- In seven games, the Odebolt, Iowa, native is tied for third on the team with 42 tackles, has a team-high three interceptions and has six pass breakups. He is tied for third in the Big Ten and 14th nationally in interceptions.

JACK ATTACK

Senior linebacker Jack Campbell has a team-high 71 tackles – 10.1 per game – in Iowa's first seven games, which leads the Big Ten and ranks 11th nationally. The Cedar Falls, Iowa, native has had eight or more tackles in all seven of Iowa's games (12, 9, 10, 8, 11, 13, 9) and he had 10+ stops in four contests, including a season-high 13 tackles at Illinois.

- Campbell had his first interception of the season (and fourth of his career) against No. 2 Ohio State on Oct. 22. He is the fifth Hawkeye to record an interception this season.
- Campbell has nine career games with 10 or more tackles, which are the most on the team. His nine double-digit tackle games came against: vs. Kent State (11), vs. Colorado State (18), vs. Minnesota (17), at Nebraska (16), vs. Kentucky (14), South Dakota State (12), Nevada (10), Michigan (11) and at Illinois (13).
- Campbell surpassed the 200-career tackle mark in Iowa's 27-0 victory over Nevada on Sept. 17. He currently has 248 career tackles, which is tied for 33rd all-time with Pat Angerer and Merton Hanks. Campbell is 12 tackles shy of the top 30 in program history.

KALEB'S BREAKOUT

True freshman RB Kaleb Johnson rushed for his first 100-yard game in his third career contest, finishing with 103 yards on seven carries and scoring two touchdowns against Nevada on Sept. 17. The Ohio native had touchdown runs of 40 and 55 yards to become the first Hawkeye in at least the last 20 years to have two rushing touchdowns of 40+ yards in a single game.

- Johnson is the first Iowa freshman to eclipse 100 yards since Tyler Goodson (13-116-1 TD) at Nebraska in 2019. Johnson is also the first Iowa freshman with 100+ yards and two touchdowns since Marcus Coker in the 2010 Insight Bowl.
- Through seven games, Johnson has 260 yards on 61 carries for a 4.3 average with three touchdowns. His 18 points are second on the team.
- Johnson has a team-high 538 all-purpose yards, averaging 76.9 yards per game. He is averaging 24.6 yards per kickoff return.

A MARATHON W

Iowa's 27-0 victory over Nevada kicked off at 6:40 p.m. (CT) on Sept. 17 inside Kinnick Stadium and ended at 1:39 a.m. early Sunday morning. There were three weather delays lasting 236 minutes and the game spanned 6:59 minutes from start to finish.

• It was the second weather delay in Kinnick Stadium history. Iowa's game against Tennessee Tech was delayed 84 minutes in 2011. Iowa's last game affected by a delay came at Iowa State in 2019. Iowa won both of those contests.

THE SHUUUUUUUUUUUUUUU

lowa's defense recorded its first shutout since 2019 with its 27-0 victory over Nevada on Sept. 17. Iowa posted two shutouts in 2019, a road win at Northwestern (20-0) and a home win over Rutgers (30-0). The shutout of Nevada was lowa's 13th under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

• Iowa has six shutouts since 2016, which are tied with Penn State, UAB and Virginia Tech for fourth most in the country over that span.

DON'T BEAT YOURSELF

lowa ranks in the top 17 as one of the least penalized teams in the nation in 2022. The Hawkeyes haven't been penalized for more than 50 yards in five of their first seven games.

- The team is sixth in the NCAA in fewest penalty yards (252), eighth in fewest penalty yards per game (36.00), 12th in fewest penalties (33) and 17th in fewest penalties per game (4.71).
- Iowa had just two penalties for 15 yards in the season-opening win over South Dakota State and three penalties for 11 yards at Ohio State.

SCORING EARLY

The Hawkeyes allowed their first points in the first quarter of the season when Rutgers drove for a game-opening field goal on Sept. 24. Iowa is outscoring its opponents, 41-29, in the opening quarter this season.

STEVENS STEPS IN

True freshman walk-on K Drew Stevens is 7-for-8 on field goal attempts this season. The South Carolina native made his Hawkeye field goal kicking debut against Nevada, connecting from 43 and 33 yards. Stevens kicked two more field goals at Rutgers, which included a career-long 51 yarder. It is tied for the 11th longest in program history.

- Stevens is leading the team with 30 points via seven field goals and nine extra points. He is 2-for-3 from 40-49 yards and 1-1 from 50+ this season. His only attempt at Ohio State was good from 49 yards.
- Stevens is Iowa's first true freshman kicker since Keith Duncan in 2016.
- lowa's placekickers are 8-for-11 on field goal attempts this season. Sophomore Aaron Blom made 1-of-3 attempts in the first two games with a make from 46 yards.
- Stevens also handles kickoff duties, where he has 19 touchbacks in 25 kickoffs.

BLOCK THAT PUNT

DL Lukas Van Ness tied a single-game school record, blocking a pair of punts against Iowa State on Sept. 10. It is the sixth time a Hawkeye has had multiple blocks in a single game and Van Ness is the fifth Hawkeye to accomplish the feat.

Ken Iwebema had two blocks against Syracuse in 2007 and against Illinois in 2005.

- Van Ness tied the school record for blocked punts in a game with two inside Iowa State territory. The only other Hawkeye to block two punts in the same game was Sean Considine at Iowa State in 2003.
- Van Ness' first block of the game set up the Hawkeyes' touchdown. It was Iowa's first punt block of the season and first since the 2021 regular season finale at Nebraska (Henry Marchese).
- Van Ness blocked his second punt in the third quarter, giving Iowa possession at the Iowa State 20. The possession ended with an Iowa turnover at the goal line.
- lowa is third in the Big Ten and 18th nationally in blocked kicks, while Van Ness is leading the Big Ten and second nationally behind Temple's De'Von Fox's three blocks.

CREATIVE SCORING

Senior LB Jack Campbell has found ways to put points on the scoreboard for the Iowa football team. In his Hawkeye career, Campbell has scored via a safety (vs. South Dakota State, 2022), interception return for a touchdown (vs. Illinois, 2021) and a fumble return for a touchdown (at Iowa State, 2021).

UNCONVENTIONAL 7 WAS ENOUGH

- The Hawkeyes' seven points are the fewest for a Big Ten team in a win since lowa's 6-4 win at Penn State in 2004.
- lowa is the first Big Ten team to win a game without scoring a touchdown since Nebraska in 2018 (beat Michigan State, 9-6). The Hawkeyes' last such win? The 6-4 win at Penn State in 2004.

lowa took the unconventional path to seven points via a field goal and two second-half safeties during the 7-3 victory over South Dakota State on Sept. 3. Following Tory Taylor's punt that pinned the Jacks at the 1, Jack Campbell's tackle for loss gave the Hawkeyes a 5-3 third-quarter lead. Taylor pinned SD State deep again in the fourth quarter and Joe Evans' sack accounted for lowa's final two points.

• It was the first time since 2018 at Penn State that the Hawkeyes had two safeties in the same game.

FRESHMAN PT TRACKER

Iowa has had seven true freshmen play in the first seven games of the 2022 season. The list includes: DL Aaron Graves (6), DB T.J. Hall (7), RB Kaleb Johnson (7), DB Xavier Xwankpa (7), TE Addison Ostrenga (7), RB Jaziun Patterson (1) and K Drew Stevens (7).

OH MY TORY

Junior Tory Taylor is averaging 45.6 yards on 46 punts in seven games. The Australia native has 15 punts of 50+ yards and 21 punts have been downed inside the 20-yard line. His 45.6 average is second in the Big Ten and ninth nationally.

- Taylor punted a career-high 10 times for 479 yards, averaging 47.9 yards per attempt, against South Dakota State on Sept. 3. Taylor had punts downed at the 1, 2, 6, 8, 8 and 12-yard lines and seven of his punts were inside the 20.
- Taylor was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week and to the Rays 8 List on Sept. 5 for his efforts. It is his second career Big Ten weekly honor as he earned his first distinction last season following lowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 lowa State.
- He was also named to the Ray's 8 List following Week 3.
- Taylor was also named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week following lowa's win at Rutgers, where he averaged 42.6 yards on five punts, with four of the five being downed inside the 20. He had a long of 51 yards and Rutgers had just one return for negative two yards.

THE CALIFORNIA KID

- Spencer Petras owns a 16-10 record (.615) as lowa's starting quarterback. Iowa has scored 22.7 points per game in Petras' 26 starts.
- Petras completed 21-of-31 attempts for 246 yards with one touchdown on Oct. 1 against Michigan. It was his highest passing output since the 2021 season at Maryland (259 yards). He is 93-of-175 for 989 yards with two touchdowns (and five interceptions) this season. Petras currently is 11th in program history with 4,463 yards.
- Petras led Iowa to 12 consecutive victories from 2020-21, winning the final six games of 2020 and the first six games of 2021. He went 194-of-324 for 2,226 yards with 17 touchdown passes, four interceptions during the winning streak.
- He started 17 straight games from the 2020 season through Week 9 of 2021 before missing the Nov. 13 game against Minnesota because of injury in 2021.
- The Hawkeyes averaged 31.8 points per game in 2020, Petras' first year as the starting quarterback. It marked lowa's highest point per game total since 2002 (36.5). The Hawkeyes won their final six games in 2020, outscoring their opposition, 214-83.
- Petras matched his career high with three touchdown passes and set a career high with two rushing touchdowns Week 5 at Maryland last season. He became the first lowa quarterback with multiple passing touchdowns and multiple rushing touchdowns in a game since Brad Banks at Minnesota in 2002.

FROM THE ROCKIES

Colorado native Alex Padilla led Iowa to two wins in his first two career starts (27-22 vs. Minnesota in Week 10; 33-23 vs. Illinois in Week 11) during the 2021 season. Padilla went 3-0 as a starter.

- Padilla made his 2022 debut at No. 2 Ohio State on Oct. 22, finishing 5-for-10 for 32 yards with one interception, while playing the second half.
- Padilla made his first career start Week 10 against Minnesota and passed for career-high 206 yards. He ran for one touchdown (1) and threw for two (72, 27), both career firsts. He was 6-for-17 for 83 yards in his second career start, a Week 11 win against Illinois.

WILLIAMS SQUARED

lowa has a 1-2 Williams punch in the backfield in 2022 in sophomores Gavin and Leshon Williams. The duo combined to rush for 374 yards on 86 carries during the 2021 season.

- Leshon Williams made his first career start in the season opener against South Dakota State, finishing with 72 yards on 24 carries, which were both career-bests. Leshon Williams is leading the team with 267 yards on 73 attempts in six games. He scored his first career touchdown from 9 yards out against lowa State on Sept. 10 and scored at Rutgers (9/24). He missed the Nevada game due to the passing of his father.
- Gavin Williams has started two games, where he has 108 yards on 33 attempts in six games. He missed the opener because of injury and played sparingly against lowa State.
- Gavin Williams made his first career start in the 2022 Citrus Bowl against Kentucky, where he finished with 98 yards on 16 carries. Leshon Williams, meanwhile, had 10 carries for 42 yards against the Wildcats.
- Gavin and Leshon Williams are not related.

THE MAN IN THE MIDDLE

Senior linebacker Jack Campbell returns as the anchor of the lowa defense after earning second-team All-America honors by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) and Phil Steele in 2021. The Cedar Falls, Iowa, native led the country with 143 tackles, including 57 solo and 86 assists. The total ranks fifth in a single season in school history and were the most by a Hawkeye since Pat Angerer had 145 in 2009.

- Campbell was the first Hawkeye to record 100 tackles in a single season since Josey Jewell, who had 100+ tackles each year from 2015-17. He posted five double-digit tackle performances (11, 18, 17, 16, 14) in 2021. Campbell has a team-high 71 tackles and 3.5 TFL through the first seven games of the season. He was named the Lott IMPACT Player of the week for his efforts against South Dakota State.
- This season, Campbell is a preseason All-American by Athlon Sports, Phil Steele and The Sporting News. He has also been named to the Butkas Award, Nagurski, Bednarik and Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch Lists. He is also a semifinal candidate for the National Football Foundation's William V. Campbell Trophy and was named to at least four midseason All-America teams.

TATUM-WOODSON BIG TEN DB OF THE YEAR RETURNS

Senior Riley Moss returns for his final season as a Hawkeye after earning second-team All-America honors by the Football Writers Association of America and third-team All-America honors by the AP.

- The Ankeny, Iowa, native was also named the Tatum-Woodson Big Ten Defensive Back of the Year in 2021 after finishing with 39 tackles and four interceptions in 11 games.
- Moss is the first Big Ten player since Iowa's Desmond King to return to school the season after winning the Tatum-Woodson Defensive Back of the Year honor.
- Moss tied for 14th in the country and fourth in the Big Ten with four interceptions in 2021. Moss had two interceptions returns for touchdowns in Iowa's opening win over Indiana. He is tied for 11th in career interceptions (10-239-3 TDs), is one of three players in program history with three interception returns for touchdowns and ranks second in career interception return yards.

Iowa fell 10-7 to Iowa State in its first trophy game of the 2022 season. It was the Hawkeyes' first loss to the Cyclones since 2014. Iowa is 25-8 in its last 33 trophy games (includes bowl games and conference championships).

- Iowa is 22-7 in its last 29 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).
- Last season, the Hawkeyes defeated Nebraska, 28-21, to capture the Heroes Trophy for the seventh straight year. Iowa retained possession of Floyd of Rosedale with a 27-22 win against Minnesota on Nov. 13. The Hawkeyes lost possession of the Heartland Trophy on Oct. 30 at Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes defeated No. 9 Iowa State, 27-17, on Sept. 11, 2021, to win the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series game for the sixth consecutive time.

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

- The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 20 times in the last 21 seasons. Iowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19
- lowa head coach Kirk Ferentz is one bowl win shy of tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 9-9 bowl record. His nine bowl wins tie Barry Alvarez for second in Big Ten history.
- Seventeen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Nick Saban (17), Mack Brown (14), Kyle Whittingham (11), Mike Gundy (11) and Dabo Swinney (11) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.
- Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (11) have more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than Iowa. Iowa is 17-16-1 all-time in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

IOWA IN OVERTIME

Iowa holds a 7-5 record in overtime games. Iowa won its first overtime contest, defeating Penn State 26-23 on Nov. 4, 2000, in State College, Pa. A SPECIAL SPECIAL TEAMER

Melbourne, Australia, native Tory Taylor returns for his third season as Iowa's punter after ranking fourth in the Big Ten, averaging 46.1 yards per punt in 2021. The two-time Ray Guy Award semifinalist led the Big Ten and ranked second nationally with 80 punts. He had 27 punts of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 69-yard punt at Iowa State in Week 2. Thirty-nine of his punts were downed inside the 20.

- Taylor is a preseason All-American by Athlon Sports and a Ray Guy Award Watch List honoree leading into the 2022 season and he was named to two midseason All-America teams.
- Last season, Iowa owned the field position battle in each of its 10 wins. The Hawkeyes averaged 20-plus yards better in field position three times (+20 vs. Penn State; +22 at Maryland; +22 at Iowa State).

- Taylor recorded three of the top nine single-game punting averages in the Ferentz era. Iowa's Week 2 punting average of 51.1 ranked No. 3 all-time in the Ferentz era. Its Week 1 punting average of 49.5 ranked No. 7 and the 49.0 average Week 8 tied for ninth.
- Taylor was Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following lowa's win at lowa State. He averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts. Five of his punts were downed inside the 20, while lowa State had just one punt return. His 45.6 average in 2022 is second in the Big Ten and ranks ninth nationally.
- In Iowa's 23-20 win over No. 4 Penn State, Taylor punted nine times, dropping six inside the 20, five inside the 10 and three punts inside the five.

BALL HAWKS

- lowa led the country with a school-record 25 interceptions in 2021. The Hawkeyes have 96 interceptions since 2017, more than any team in the country.
- Five Hawkeyes have interceptions this season. DB/CASH Cooper DeJean recorded an interception in three consecutive games and he has a team-best three interceptions this season. His pick against Iowa State was his first career interception. Senior Terry Roberts had a third-quarter pick against Iowa State (his second career interception) and he had an interception return for a touchdown wiped off the board against Nevada because of a penalty.
- Both DeJean and Kaevon Merriweather had interceptions at Rutgers, Iowa's fourth and fifth picks this season. DeJean returned his interception 45 yards for a pick six. Quinn Schulte had Iowa's sixth interception (his second career pick) at Illinois on Oct. 8 and Jack Campbell had his first pick (fourth career) at No. 2 Ohio State.
- In 2021, Moss had two interception returns for a touchdown, both in Week 1 against Indiana. LB Jack Campbell returned an interception 32 yards for a touchdown against Illinois in Week 11.
- lowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 15 seasons and 20 of the last 22.

DUAL SPORT HAWKEYE

Redshirt freshman wide receiver Brody Brecht is one of 15 players in the FBS that is a football/baseball dual-sport athlete. The Ankeny, Iowa, native was a Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-American in 2022 as a right-handed pitcher. Brecht, who has a 100+ mile per hour fastball, went 1-3 with a 3.18 ERA with 44 strikeouts over 22 2/3 innings.

YEP, THEY'RE FREAKS

Two Hawkeyes -- defensive back Riley Moss and fullback Monte Pottebaum -- have made Bruce Feldman's annual "Freaks" list for the 2022 season.

- Moss, who came in at No. 19, has vertical-jumped 42 inches and broad-jumped 10-8. The Ankeny, Iowa, native has clocked 3.85 seconds in the short shuttle time, which is the fastest time in the Ferentz era. It would have been the fastest time at this year's combine (no one has even cracked 3.90 at the combine since 2017).
- Pottebaum, who came it at No. 52, holds a Hawkeye position record with a 3.92 short shuttle time and a 435-pound power clean.

YOUTHFUL HAWKEYES

Iowa's 2022 roster features 85 underclassmen (55 freshmen and 30 sophomores), which are tied for the 12th most in the nation. Of Iowa's 125 player roster, 68 percent are underclassmen. The Hawkeyes are the second youngest team in the Big Ten.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Seven former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2022.

- Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his 11th year on staff, his sixth as offensive coordinator and first as quarterbacks coach.
- LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, is in his 15th season on the lowa staff. Woods was named special teams coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.
- Kelvin Bell joined the lowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13. He was named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016 and was named defensive line coach in 2019.
- Ladell Betts joined the lowa coaching staff as running backs coach in 2021. Betts is the second leading rushing in lowa football history, rushing for 3,686 yards from 1998-2001. He is the only running back in school history to lead the team in rushing four straight years.
- Abdul Hodge joined the staff as tight end/fullback coach in 2022. The three-time All-Big Ten linebacker lettered for the Hawkeyes from 2002-05, leading the team to 38 wins, two Big Ten titles and four straight January bowl games. Hodge ranks third all-time in career tackles (453).
- Former Hawkeyes Jason Manson and Sam Brincks lead lowa's player development unit. Manson, the Hawkeyes' director of player development, was a two-year letterman as a quarterback and wide receiver in 2005 and 2006. Brincks is the assistant director of player development and a 2018 lowa graduate. He played defensive tackle for the Hawkeyes from 2015-18.

HAWKEYE GRADUATES

Iowa has six student-athletes on its current roster that have earned their degrees. The graduates include: Matt Fagan (Public Health), Riley Moss (Sport and Recreation Management), Turner Pallissard (Business), Spencer Petras (Interdepartmental Studies), Nico Ragaini (Sport and Recreation Management) and Steven Stilianos (Lafayette, Engineering).

MR. & MRS. LEE

Junior defensive lineman Logan Lee proposed to longtime girlfriend Tori Verbeck on Dec. 30 at a Citrus Bowl event in Orlando, Florida. The couple were married on July 3 in Geneseo, Illinois.

HAWKEYE LEGACIES

- Iowa has five players on its 2022 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: LB Eric Epenesa (Epenesa, 1997), DE Joe Evans (Spence, 1989), DB Thomas Hartlieb (Jim, 1989-92), (John, 1985), LB Jayden Montgomery (Jerry, 1998-02) and LS Liam Reardon (Bill).
- Epenesa is one of two players whose brothers played at Iowa: Eric (A.J. 2017-19) and FB Johnny Plewa (Macon in 2013-15).

2022 PLAYER COUNCIL

Twenty-three players -- 12 seniors, six juniors and five sophomores -- are on the 2022 Player Council. The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies and being involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected following coaching staff and player input.

The 12 seniors include Seth Benson, Jack Campbell, Joe Evans, Sam LaPorta, Kaevon Merriweather, Riley Moss, Spencer Petras, Monte Pottebaum, Nico Ragaini, Terry Roberts, Noah Shannon and John Waggoner. Junior members of the group include Kyler Fisher, Jermari Harris, Jay Higgins, Logan Lee, Alex Padilla and Tory Taylor. Sophomore members are Arland Bruce, IV, Connor Colby, Cooper DeJean, Mason Richman and Gavin Williams.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 206 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (81 draft picks/125 free agents).
- Iowa and Florida lead all schools with five offensive tackles currently active in the NFL.
- Iowa is tied with Miami, Florida, Notre Dame, Penn State and Stanford with the most tight ends active in the NFL (4).
- At least one lowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (44 consecutive years).
- Iowa has had 11 First Round NFL Draft picks under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- Two former Hawkeyes -- Jake Gervase and Alaric Jackson -- were members of the Los Angeles Rams' 2022 Super Bowl champion team.
- OT Tristan Wirfs earned first-team All-Pro and was a Pro Bowl selection in 2021.
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson (Detroit), TE George Kittle (San Francisco) and Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 23 years, 199-of-238 (84 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 14 years, lowa has had 53 NFL Draft picks, the third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (83), Michigan (63), Wisconsin (52).
- Iowa has had eight first round picks in the last 12 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020; OL Tyler Linderbaum, 2022.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former lowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 11th year on staff and sixth as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.



- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz, WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.
- Former OL Tristan Wirfs was the starting right tackle as a rookie for the 2021 Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Former DL Anthony Nelson was a reserve defensive end for the Bucs. Former LB Ben Niemann and LB Anthony Hitchens were on the AFC Champion Kansas City Chiefs.
- Entering the 2022 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (16) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 18 lowa tight ends since 1999 (11 drafted/7 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

HAWK TALK WITH KIRK FERENTZ

Head coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week during the regular season. The radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the lowa Hawkeyes. The show airs live each Wednesday from 6:30-8:30 p.m. (CT) from VUE Rooftop at the Hilton Garden Inn in lowa City. Fans can attend shows in person, listen live on the Hawkeye Radio Network or watch on KCRG 9.2.

The Nov. 16 show will be moved to Nov. 15 because of the men's basketball game at Seton Hall.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 20 of the last 21 seasons. Iowa is 9-9 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (11) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 17-16-1 in 34 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (178-109) replaced Fry and completed his 23rd season in 2021. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa won the Big Ten West Division title in 2021 and made its second appearance in the Big Ten Championship game. The Hawkeyes played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on

- Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/ USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 354 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 11 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. IOWA NOTES

• The Hawkeyes' seven points are the fewest for a Big Ten team in a win since lowa's 6-4 win at Penn State in 2004.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- LB Jack Campbell had a team high 12 tackles (4 solo, 8 assists). It is his sixth career game with 10 or more tackles, which are tied for the most on the team. Campbell now has 189 career tackles.
- Iowa finished with four sacks in the game. DE Joe Evans tied a career high with two sacks and DT Logan Lee had a career-best 1.5 sacks.
- DB Cooper DeJean finished with a career high four tackles in his first career start; DB Quinn Schulte had a career-high four pass breakups in his first career start.
- RB Leshun Williams had career-highs in carries (24) and yards (72).
- WR Arland Bruce VI had five catches for a career-high 68 yards. Bruce had a team-high 96 all-purpose yards.
- P Tory Taylor had punts downed at the 1, 2, 6, 8, 8 and 12 yard lines. Taylor had a career-high 10 punts for 479 yards, averaging 47.9 yards per punt. Seven of his 10 punts were downed inside the 20-yard line and three went 50 or more yards.
- K Aaron Blom connected on 1-of-2 field goal attempts (good from 46, miss from 40) for his first career points.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Iowa's defense scored four points on two safeties Jack Campbell had a 1-yard tackle for loss on Isaiah Davis in the third quarter and Joe Evans' sack accounted for the game's final points on a safety in the fourth quarter.
- The Hawkeyes have three safeties in their last two regular season games -- (Lukas Van Ness sack on an intentional grounding at Nebraska, 11/26/21).
- lowa's defense allowed 120 total yards, which are the fewest in a season-opening game since 2004 (110 vs. Kent State). The 120 yards are the fewest surrendered by the Hawkeye defense since 2018 against Maryland (115 yards).
- Iowa is the first Big Ten team to win a game without scoring a touchdown since Nebraska in 2018 (beat Michigan State, 9-6). The Hawkeyes' last such win? The 6-4 win at Penn State in 2004.
- Iowa had seven first-time starters in the game: Offense: Logan Jones (OL), Beau Stephens (OL), Alec Wick (WR), Leshun Williams (RB); Defense: Cooper DeJean (DB), Joe Evans (DL), Quinn Schulte (DB).
- Five true freshmen saw the first action of their careers. They include: T.J. Hall (DB), Kaleb Johnson (RB), Xavier Nwankpa (DB), Addison Ostrenga (TE) and Drew Stevens (K).
- lowa is 99-33-2 in season-opening games, including an 20-4 mark under coach Kirk Ferentz.
- Iowa won the toss and elected to receive. The Hawkeyes have played 289 games under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa has opened the game on offense 215 times (137-78). The Hawkeyes have opened the game on defense 74 times (42-32).

• The Hawkeyes attempted a game-tying field goal as time expired, but the kick hooked left, giving Iowa State its first win in the series since 2015. Iowa had won six straight in the series; Iowa State's last three wins over the Hawkeyes have all come by a field goal.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

• DE Lukas Van Ness blocked two lowa State punts, tying a school record. It is the sixth time a Hawkeye has had multiple blocks in a single game and Van Ness is the fifth Hawkeye to accomplish the feat.

Ken Iwebema had two blocks against Syracuse in 2007 and against Illinois in 2005.

- Van Ness tied the school record for blocked punts in a game with two inside lowa State territory. The only other Hawkeye to block two punts in the same game was Sean Considine at Iowa State in 2003.
- His first block of the game set up the Hawkeyes' first touchdown. It was lowa's first punt block of the season and first since the 2021 regular season finale at Nebraska (Henry Marchese).
- Van Ness blocked his second punt in the third quarter, giving lowa possession at the lowa State 20. The possession ended with an lowa turnover at the goal line.
- RB Leshon Williams had a 9-yard touchdown run in the first quarter for his first career touchdown. Williams led the Hawkeye rushing attack with 34 yards on 14 attempts.
- DB Cooper DeJean had his first career interception in the second quarter. The interception occurred in the end zone and was downed for a touchback. DeJean had a career high 11 tackles (six solo), one interception and two pass break-ups.
- DB Terry Roberts had his first interception of the season (second of his career) on Iowa State's opening drive of the second half.
- \bullet LB Seth Benson finished with 10 tackles second most on the team. It was his seventh career game with 10 or more tackles.
- DB Quinn Schulte (9), DT Logan Lee (8) and DB Terry Roberts (6) each tallied career highs in tackles. DB Riley Moss tied a career high with nine tackles. LB Jack Campbell also had nine tackles, moving his career total to 198.
- TE Sam LaPorta's 2-yard catch in the second quarter was the 100th of his career. He had a career-high eight receptions for 55 yards.
- WR Alec Wick had his first career reception for 14 yards on the game's final drive.

MISCELLANEOUS

- lowa scored on its first offensive possession, going 16 yards on two plays following the first blocked punt. It was the first game since last season against Minnesota (10 plays, 39 yards, FG) that the Hawkeyes scored on their first possession of the game.
- Iowa's defense forced three turnovers two interceptions, one forced fumble.
- The defense notched its first turnover of the season in the second quarter with a forced fumble at its own goal line. DB Kaevon Merriweather had his first career forced fumble, jarring the ball loose from ISU RB Jirehl Brock. LB Logan Klemp recovered in the end zone for the touchback.
- Iowa had interceptions on consecutive possessions in the second and third quarter. Cooper DeJean had an interception in the end zone with 57 seconds left in the first half. Terry Roberts intercepted Dekkers at midfield on the first possession of the second half.
- Iowa State had three possessions in the red zone (0, 4, 12) in the first half, but came away with just a field goal. The Hawkeye defense did not allow a touchdown in the first seven quarters of the season.
- Freshman Aaron Graves became the sixth Hawkeye freshman to see action this season. He joins a list that includes: T.J. Hall (DB), Kaleb Johnson (RB), Xavier Nwankpa (DB), Addison Ostrenga (TE) and Drew Stevens (K).
- lowa won the toss and elected to defer. The Hawkeyes have played 290 games under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa has opened the game on offense 215 times (137-78). The Hawkeyes have opened the game on defense 75 times (42-33).

The game started at 6:40 p.m. (CT) on Saturday and ended at 1:39 a.m. Sunday. There were three weather delays lasting 236 minutes in the contest that spanned 6:59 minutes from start to finish.

- RB Kaleb Johnson tallied his first career 100-yard game, finishing with 103 yards and two touchdowns on seven attempts for a 14.7 yard average. He scored his first career touchdown from 40 yards out on his first carry of the game and he had a 55-yarder in the fourth quarter.
- Johnson is the first Hawkeye freshman to rush for 100 yards in a game since Tyler Goodson (13-116-1 TD) at Nebraska in 2019.
- QB Spencer Petras completed 14-of-26 attempts for a season-high 175 yards and one touchdown. Petras moved into 12th place on the lowa career passing yards list with 3,850 yards.
- WR Arland Bruce IV caught a 21-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter for his second career receiving touchdown (fifth TD overall). Bruce IV had a team-high three catches for 50 yards.
- WR Nico Ragaini and WR Keagan Johnson made their season debuts after missing the first two games because of injury. Ragaini had two catches for 56 yards, including a 46-yarder in the third quarter. Johnson had one catch for seven yards and was targeted five times.
- RB Jaziun Patterson became the seventh true freshman to see action this season. He rushed six times for 20 yards.
- DB Cooper DeJean intercepted a pass in the first quarter for his second interception in as many games and second of his career. DeJean also had two tackles and two pass breakins.
- LB Jack Campbell had a game high 10 tackles. It is his second game this season and seventh career contest with 10 or more tackles. Campbell surpassed the 200-career tackle mark in the game; he now has 208 tackles, which puts him in 68th in program history. He moved past the likes of Leroy Smith, Ben Niemann and Ed Miles.
- DL Lukas Van Ness had a career-high eight tackles and DL John Waggoner had a career-high six tackles. Van Ness also had 2.5 TFL and 1.5 sacks, giving him nine career sacks.
- DL Aaron Graves had his first career sack in the third quarter. Graves finished with a career-high four tackles and 1.5 TFL in the game.
- K Drew Stevens went 2-for-2 on field goal attempts in the first two attempts of his career. He made a 43-yard field goal on his first attempt in the second quarter and connected on a 32-yarder in the third quarter.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Saturday's game included three weather delays -- 80-minutes (8:36 p.m. to 9:56 p.m.), 110 minutes (10:05 p.m. to 11:55 p.m.) and 46 minutes (11:57 p.m. to 12:43 a.m.) for a total of 3:56.
- It is the second weather delay in Kinnick Stadium tory. Iowa's game against Tennessee Tech was delayed 84 minutes on Sept. 3, 2011.
- Iowa's last game that included a weather delate came on Sept. 14, 2019, at Iowa State. There was a 2:55 delay at Jack Trice Stadium in Ames, Iowa.
- lowa had a season-high 337 yards of total offense, rushing for a season-high 162 yards on 35 attempts, averaging 4.6 yards per carry. Seven different receivers caught a pass in the game and the passing attack had a season-high 175 yards and one touchdown.
- lowa's defense posted its first shutout since 2019 a 20-0 win at Northwestern (10/26/19). It was the Hawkeyes' first shutout in Kinnick Stadium since defeating Rutgers, 30-0, on Sept. 7, 2019.
- The Hawkeye defense limited Nevada to 151 yards of total offense. The Wolfpack entered the game averaging 336.3 yards.
- lowa has limited two of its first three opponents to 151 yards or less. (South Dakota State, 120 yards; Nevada, 151 yards). It is the first time since 1986 that the Hawkeye defense has held two of the first three opponents to 160 yards or fewer (125 at Iowa State; 159 vs. NIU; 150 at UTEP).
- Iowa improves to 14-7 all-time in night games at Kinnick Stadium.

IOWA NOTES

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- DL Joe Evans' sack forced a fumble of C.J. Stroud on the first play of Ohio State's second series. Evans recovered the fumble and returned it 13 yards for his first career touchdown, giving lowa a 7-3 lead. It was Evans' third sack of the season and second career forced fumble (vs. Minnesota, 2021).
- LB Jack Campbell had an interception on the first play of the third quarter. It was his first interception of the season and fourth career pick. Campbell has forced a turnover in consecutive games.
- Campbell finished with a team high nine tackles. He has eight or more tackles in all seven games and has 71 tackles this season.
- QB Alex Padilla made his season debut, finishing 5-for-10 for 32 yards and one interception. He played the second half.
- TE Sam LaPorta made six catches for 55 yards to lead the team and become the lowa leader in career receptions amongst Hawkeye tight ends, passing Marv Cook (126). LaPorta has 131 receptions for 1,462 yards. The yardage total ranks 25th all-time -- third-most amongst lowa tight ends.
- WR Diante Vines made his season debut after missing the first six games because of injury. Vines made his first career catch in the second quarter.
- K Drew Stevens connected on a 49-yard field goal in the second quarter. It was the second-longest field goal of his career; he is now 2-of-3 beyond 40 yards this season.

MISCELLANEOUS

- lowa's defense allowed four first-half field goals after Ohio State started drives in Hawkeye territory (29, 23, 34, 32-yard lines). Ohio State's second touchdown came via a pick six.
- The Hawkeyes limited Ohio State to 360 yards and just 66 on the ground. The Buckeyes entered the game averaging 543.7 yards of total offense and 228.0 rushing yards per game.
- Iowa's defense has now scored three touchdowns (DeJean pick six and Merriweather fumble return at Rutgers) and recorded two safeties this season for 22 total defensive points.
