- lowa defeated Kentucky, 21-0, at the 2022 TransPerfect Music City Bowl. The bowl win was the 10th for Kirk Ferentz, tying him with Joe Paterno for the most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz is one of 19 coaches with double digit bowl win totals.
- The Hawkeyes are one of six teams nationally with eight or more wins in each of the last eight seasons (Iowa won six games (.750 winning percentage) during the Big Ten 2020 COVID season). The other five teams are Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Michigan and Ohio State.
- LB Jack Campbell was the recipient of the 2022 William V. Campbell Trophy, an award that recognizes an individual as the absolute best in the nation for their combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. He is the first Hawkeye to receive the honor and the seventh player to be a NFF National Scholar-Athlete.
- The nation's top linebacker. LB Jack Campbell is the first Hawkeye to receive the Butkus Award, which is presented to the nation's top linebacker. The Cedar Falls, Iowa, native had a team-high 128 tackles in 2022, his second straight 100+ tackle season (271 over last two seasons). Campbell was also the Nagurski-Woodson Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year and Butkus-Fitzgerald Big Ten Linebacker of the Year in 2022.
- Campbell earned unanimous consensus All-America status, marking three straight seasons the program has had a unanimous selection. He is the 29th Hawkeye to earn consensus All-America status. Iowa is the only program to have a consensus All-American in each of the last four years and one of two programs (Alabama) to have a unanimous selection each of the last three seasons.
- TE Sam LaPorta is the second Hawkeye to earn the Kwalick-Clark Big Ten Tight End of the Year Award and he was one of three finalists for the John Mackey Award, which is given to the nation's top tight end. LaPorta led the team in receptions and receiving yards for a second straight season, finishing with 58 catches for 657 yards and one touchdown. Amongst lowa's all-time tight ends, LaPorta finished as the career receptions leader (153), while ranking second in receiving yards (1,786).
- RB Kaleb Johnson, an honorable mention Freshman All-American and honorable mention All-Big Ten selection, had three 100-yard games the most by a Hawkeye freshman running back in program history. Johnson had a freshman record 779 yards on 151 attempts with a team-high six touchdowns to go along with a team-best 1,131 all-purpose yards.
- A stout defense. The Hawkeyes held nine opponents at 10 or fewer points a first for the program since 1903 and posted two shutouts. The Music City Bowl shutout was the first in the bowl's 25-year history. lowa limited opponents to 270.8 yards and 13.3 points per game second fewest nationally. Nine Hawkeye defenders earned All-Big Ten recognition.
- DB Cooper DeJean had three pick-6 touchdowns during the 2022 season, including a 14-yard interception return for a touchdown in the TransPerfect Music City Bowl. The three interception returns for touchdowns are a single-season program record and they tie the career school record with Tom Knight, Desmond King and Riley Moss.
- Special Special Teams. P Tory Taylor finished the season with 82 punts for 3,766 yards a school-record yardage total. It is the second straight year he has broken the yardage record. K Drew Stevens made 16-of-18 field goal attempts, which are the most by a Hawkeye freshman in program history. Stevens, who earned College Football News second-team All-America honors, led the team with 72 points. Taylor earned first-team All-America honors from the FWAA, Phil Steele and Pro Football Focus.







#### TROPHY COLLECTION

- lowa went 3-2 in trophy games in 2022. The Hawkeyes fell 10-7 to lowa State in their first trophy game the team's first loss to the Cyclones since 2014. Iowa reclaimed the Heartland Trophy on Nov. 12, downing Wisconsin, 24-10, in Kinnick Stadium, and defeated Minnesota for the eighth straight time, winning 13-10, to retain the Floyd of Rosedale trophy. Nebraska downed Iowa, 24-17, in the regular season finale to claim the Heroes Trophy for the first time since 2013.
- The Hawkeyes closed out the season with a 21-0 win to hoist the TransPerfect Music City Bowl trophy.
- lowa is 28-9 in its last 37 trophy games (includes bowl games and conference championships). The Hawkeyes are 24-8 in their last 32 rivalry trophy games (lowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).

#### IN THE RANKINGS

- The Hawkeyes finished the season receiving votes in the final AP and AFCA Coaches Polls. Iowa was 33rd in the coaches' poll with nine votes and 34th in the AP poll with four votes.
- Prior to 2022, Iowa had been ranked in the AP Top 25 at least once in each of the last seven seasons, the third-longest streak in school history.

#### **HAWKEYE HISTORY**

lowa has played 1,294 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 684-571-39 (.544). That includes a 424-227-16 (.648) record in home games, a 260-344-23 (.433) record in games away from Iowa City, a 353-389-25 (.477) mark in Big Ten games and a 308-192-15 (.613) record in Kinnick Stadium.

#### **FERENTZ AMONG BIG TEN'S BEST**

Moon Family Head Football Coach Kirk Ferentz has 115 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach, tied for the third most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history. The Hawkeyes defeated Penn State, 41-21, on Nov. 21, 2020, to earn Ferentz' 100th conference win.

- Ferentz' 186 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five include Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Ferentz (186) and Joe Paterno (162).
- Ferentz (186-115) became lowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98).
- Ferentz has 115 Big Ten victories, which are tied with Amos Alonzo Stagg for third place on the league's all-time conference wins list.
- Both Ferentz (186, 115) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top 10 in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only lowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).




# **HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ**

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) concluded his 24th season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa in 2022. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2029 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided lowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and Big Ten West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 186 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He
  has 115 Big Ten wins, which ties for third all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 12 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004
  Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange
  Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- lowa has posted a 177-94 (.653) overall mark and a 111-69 (.617) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 16 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- At lowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 186-115 (.618) and a 115-83 (.581) mark in Big Ten games. He is lowa's all-time winningest football coach with 186 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 198-136 (.593), giving him the fourth most wins among active head coaches.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an
  assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line
  before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

- Ferentz is fourth among active coaches with 198 career victories.
- lowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

#### **FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY**

Kirk Ferentz concluded his 24th season as Iowa's head football coach in 2022. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) has been at his current school for 10 seasons or more.

• Defensive coordinator Phil Parker has been with Ferentz throughout his tenure, as he is in his 24th season on lowa's staff, including his 11th as defensive coordinator. He is the longest tenured defensive coordinator in FBS.

#### **CAMPBELL IS THE ACADEMIC HEISMAN**

Senior LB Jack Campbell is the recipient of the 2022 William V. Campbell Trophy, while also being member of the National Football Foundation National Scholar-Athlete class. The award is presented to an individual as the absolute best in the nation for their combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.

• Campbell is the first Hawkeye football player to earn the honor and he was the seventh Hawkeye to be named a NFF National Scholar-Athlete.

## THE NATION'S BEST LINEBACKER

Senior LB Jack Campbell is the first Hawkeye to win the Butkus Award, which is presented annually to the nation's best linebacker. The Cedar Falls, Iowa, native finished the 2022 season with 128 tackles – his second straight 100+ tackle season.

- Campbell was also named the Nagurski-Woodson Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year and the Butkus-Fitzgerald Big Ten Linebacker of the Year in 2022. He is the fourth Hawkeye to be named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, joining Leroy Smith (1991), Josey Jewell (2017) and Daviyon Nixon (2020). Iowa has won two of the last three top defensive honors.
- Campbell is the second Hawkeye to take home the Big Ten's top linebacker honors, joining Jewell in 2017.
- Campbell was also a semifinalist for the Bednarik and Rotary Lombardi Awards.
- Head coach Kirk Ferentz has now coached 11 players to 13 national awards during his Hawkeye tenure.

#### THE BIG TEN'S BEST TIGHT END IS A MACKEY FINALIST

Senior TE Sam LaPorta was named the Kwalick-Clark Big Ten Tight End of the Year for the 2022 season. The Highland, Illinois, native is the second Hawkeye to earn the distinction, joining T.J. Hockenson in 2018.

- LaPorta led the team with 58 receptions for 657 yards and one touchdown in 2022. It was the second straight year LaPorta led the Hawkeyes in catches and receiving yards.
- LaPorta was one of three finalists for the John Mackey Award, which is presented to the nation's top tight end, along with Notre Dame's Michael Mayer and Georgia's Brock Bowers.

#### **HAWKEYE ALL-AMERICANS**

Five Hawkeyes – LB Jack Campbell, P Tory Taylor, DB Kaevon Merriweather, K Drew Stevens and RB Kaleb Johnson – earned All-America distinction.

- Campbell earned unanimous consensus first-team All-America honors by each of the five outlets recognized by the NCAA in consensus balloting (Walter Camp, FWAA, Associated Press, Sporting News, AFCA). The Cedar Falls, Iowa, native is the 13th Iowa player to earn unanimous honors.
- Taylor was named first-team All-America by the FWAA, Phil Steele and Pro Football Focus. The Australian averaged 45.4 yards on 82 punts and opponents averaged just 4.4 yards on 21 returns.
- Merriweather earned first-team All-America honors by Pro Football Focus, second team by Sporting News and The Associated Press and third-team by Phil Steele. The Michigan native had 47 tackles, three interceptions and scored a defensive touchdown via fumble return at Rutgers.
- Stevens was named second-team Freshman All-America by College Football News, while Johnson earned honorable mention honors. Stevens had an lowa freshman record 16 field goals and a team-best 72 points in 2022, while Johnson had a freshman record 779 rushing yards and six touchdowns, including three 100-yard games.

#### **BIG TEN ALL-CONFERENCE HONOREES**

Fifteen University of Iowa football student-athletes garnered All-Big Ten recognition for the 2022 season. Five Hawkeyes – LB Jack Campbell, DB Riley Moss, DB Cooper DeJean, TE Sam LaPorta and P Tory Taylor – earned first-team honors by either the coaches or media.

- Campbell was a first-team selection by both the coaches and media, while Moss earned first-team honors by the coaches and DeJean by the media. (Moss was a second-team selection by media; DeJean was second team by coaches.)
- LB Seth Benson and DL Lukas Van Ness earned second-team honors on both teams, while DL Joe Evans was a second-team selection by the media and honorable mention by the coaches. Defensive tackles Logan Lee and Noah Shannon and DB Kaevon Merriweather also earned honorable mention honors on both teams.
- Offensively, LaPorta earned first-team All-Big Ten honors by both the coaches and media. RB Kaleb Johnson earned honorable mention recognition by the coaches and media and OL Mason Richman was an honorable mention selection by the coaches.
- Taylor was a first-team All-Big Ten selection by the media and third team by the coaches, while K Drew Stevens earned second-team honors from the media and was a third teamer by the coaches
- Merriweather was also tabbed as Iowa's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honoree.

#### **DEJEAN: MUSIC CITY BOWL MVP**

DB Cooper DeJean was named the 2022 TransPerfect Music City Bowl Most Valuable Player after recording a 14-yard pick six, making seven tackles (one TFL) and finishing with 42 punt return yards – an Iowa bowl record. DeJean finished with 56 all-purpose yards in the Hawkeyes' 21-0 win over Kentucky.

• DeJean's pick six was his third of the season, setting a single season program record. It also tied a career school record with Tom Knight, Desmond King and Riley Moss.

#### ONE OF THE BEST HAWKEYE D'S

Iowa's defense limited opponents to 270.8 yards and 13.3 points during the 2022 season. The Hawkeyes ranked second nationally in both statistical categories.

- The 270.8 yards are the lowest yards allowed by a Hawkeye defense since 1981 (253.6)
- The 13.3 points allowed are the fewest for the unit since 2008 (13.0).

#### LAPORTA BREAKS TIGHT END MARK

Senior TE Sam LaPorta became lowa's career receptions leader amongst tight ends during lowa's road game at No. 2 Ohio State when he totaled six catches for 55 yards. The Illinois native moved past the 1,500 career receiving yards mark against Northwestern; he finished his career with 153 receptions for 1,786 yards. He finished his career 14th in program history in receiving yards and second all-time amongst Hawkeye tight ends -- just 39 yards behind Hawkeye All-American Marc Cook.

- LaPorta was targeted 16 times at Illinois on Oct. 8 and finished with a career-high nine receptions for 101 yards. He finished with three receptions for 71 yards and one touchdown his first of the season in lowa's road win at Purdue. He had a career-long 58-yard reception on lowa's first offensive play in the win at Minnesota and had four catches for 95 yards before leaving the game because of injury late in the first quarter. LaPorta missed lowa's regular season finale against Nebraska because of injury.
- LaPorta had two career 100-yard receiving games as he also had seven catches for 122 yards and one touchdown against Kentucky in the Citrus Bowl.
- LaPorta led the team and Big Ten tight ends in both receptions and receiving yards in 2022. He was fourth in the nation amongst tight ends in receptions and receiving yards. He is the first tight end to lead the team in both categories in consecutive seasons.

- LaPorta had at least one reception in his final 15 straight games and in 24 of his last 25 contests. He was lowa's top receiver in 10 of 13 games in 2022.
- LaPorta led the team in receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns (tied) in 2021 when he had 53 catches for 670 yards and three touchdowns. He led Big Ten tight ends in receptions, yards, yards after catch (299), yards after contact (206) and catches of 15+ yards (18) in 2021.

## THE NUMBERS BEHIND THE WINNING STREAK

- •The Hawkeyes averaged 23.5 points during their four-game winning streak. Offensively, Iowa averaged 300 yards in the four games with the rushing attack averaging 105.8 yards per game.
- Iowa put together its two best offensive performances in consecutive weeks, finishing with a season-high 33 points and 398 yards total offense against Northwestern and 376 yards total offense at Purdue.
- The team's rushing attack churned out 178 yards against the Wildcats and a season-high 184 yards in West Lafayette.
- The 398 yards against Northwestern were the most for the team since gaining 428 yards at Maryland (W, 51-14) in 2021.
- Iowa had a season-long 91-yard scoring drive at Purdue, which was capped by Sam LaPorta's first touchdown reception of the season.
- The Hawkeyes scored on their first four offensive possessions to start the game (FG, TD, FG, TD) against Northwestern and on seven of their eight offensive possessions. (Iowa scored on nine straight offensive possessions at Maryland in 2021).

## KJ2 = RECORD

Freshman RB Kaleb Johnson led the team with 779 rushing yards on 151 carries, which are the most rushing yards by a Hawkeye freshman in program history (passing Tyler Goodson's 638 yards, 2019). Johnson had three 100-yard games and a team-high six touchdowns.

- Johnson had his first career 200-yard game (second career 100-yard game), finishing with 200 yards on 22 attempts with one touchdown his fourth of the season in the road win at Purdue. The yardage and attempts were both career highs.
- The 200 rushing yards were the 18th-most in a single game in program history and the second-most by a Hawkeye freshman all-time (Marcus Coker, 219 vs. Missouri, Insight Bowl). He was the first Hawkeye to rush for 200 yards in a game since 2015.
- Johnson tallied his third 100-yard game, rushing for 109 yards on 16 attempts with one touchdown against Nebraska. He had a 44-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, tying his third longest rush of the season. Johnson is the first Hawkeye freshman with three 100+ yard rushing games in a single season.
- Johnson had a career-long 75-yard touchdown run on the second play of the third quarter at Purdue. It was Iowa's longest rush since Tyler Goodson's 80-yard touchdown run against Wisconsin in 2020.
- Johnson rushed for his first 100-yard game in his third career contest, finishing with 103 yards on seven carries and scoring two touchdowns against Nevada on Sept. 17. The Ohio native had touchdown runs of 40 and 55 yards to become the first Hawkeye in at least the last 20 years to have two rushing touchdowns of 40+ yards in a single game.

- Johnson was the first lowa freshman to eclipse 100 yards since Tyler Goodson (13-116-1 TD) at Nebraska in 2019. Johnson was also the first lowa freshman with 100+ yards and two touchdowns in a game since Coker in the 2010 Insight Bowl.
- Johnson led the team with 1,131 all-purpose yards, averaging 87.0 yards per game. He averaged 25 yards per kickoff return.

#### **TURNOVER FREE**

The Hawkeyes posted a 6-1 record during the season when they didn't commit a turnover. The lone loss was the 27-14 home loss to No. 4 Michigan on Oct. 1.

#### **IOWA'S DEFENSE..**

- led the nation, allowing 3.99 yards per play -- tied for the best nationally in the last 10 years. It was the Big Ten's best since 2007 and the program's best since 1981. In the last decade only 2016 Alabama and 2017 Alabama held their opponents to less than four yards per play.
- also had the best passing yards per attempt (5.3) and second-best in yards per rush (2.8) in the nation.
- led the nation for the second time in three years in stop rate (drives that end in punts, turnovers or turnover on downs). The Hawkeyes got stops on nearly 79 percent of their drives against FBS offenses.
- gave up just 1.09 points per drive tops in the nation.
- surrendered just 24 plays of 20-plus yards and nine of 30-plus yards over 13 games.
- gave up 200 or fewer yards in six games.
- held opponents to 13 or fewer points in 10 of 13 games, nine opponents at 10 or fewer points and four at three or fewer points. It is the first time since 1903 that the defense has allowed 10 or fewer points in nine games.
- held nine opponents under 100 yards rushing. Iowa limited Northwestern to 18 yards on Oct. 29 the fewest since holding Northern Iowa to six yards in 2018. They were the sixth-fewest rushing yards allowed in the Kirk Ferentz era and the fewest allowed against a Big Ten foe since limiting Minnesota to seven yards in 2008.
- held 11 opponents below their season scoring average and all 13 opponents below their season total offense average.
- kept Purdue out of the end zone, allowing only a second quarter field goal. It was the first time in 62 games (dating back to 2017) that the Boilermakers didn't score a touchdown.
- led the nation with six defensive touchdowns in 2022. The unit also was second in scoring

defense (13.3) and total defense (270.8), fourth in team passing efficiency defense (105.97), 10th in first downs defense (203), 11th in third down conversion defense (.306), 12th in rushing defense (101.3), 14th in interceptions (15), 20th in turnovers (23), 27th in sacks (2.69), 30th in tackles for loss (6.7) and 32nd in red zone defense (.794).

#### **SACK YOU VERY MUCH**

Iowa registered a season-high seven sacks against Northwestern, with all seven sacks coming from different Hawkeyes – DL Lukas Van Ness, DL Deontae Craig, DL Ethan Hurkett, DL Logan Lee, DL Noah Shannon, LB Seth Benson and DL Joe Evans. The seven sacks were the most for the program against a Big Ten team since tallying seven sacks against Northwestern in 2000. (Iowa had seven sacks last season against Kent State.)

- lowa also had 10 tackles for loss against Northwestern its second game with 10+ TFL this season.
- The defense had 14 different players tally a sack during the 2022 season with DL Joe Evans, DL Lukas Van Ness and DL Deontae Craig tying for the team lead with 6.5 sacks apiece.

#### **DYNAMO DREW**

True freshman walk-on K Drew Stevens made 16-of-18 field goal attempts during the 2022 season – the most by a Hawkeye freshman all-time (passing Mike Meyer and Nate Kaeding). The South Carolina native went 7-for-7 from 20-29 yards, 3-for-3 from 30-39 yards, 4-of-6 from 40-49 and 2-for-2 from 50+. Stevens finished tops in the Big Ten and 16th nationally with an .889 field goal percentage and he was sixth in the Big Ten in field goals per game (1.23).

- Stevens was one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza National Collegiate Place-Kicker Award.
- Stevens made a career-long 54-yard field goal in Iowa's 33-13 win over Northwestern. It was one of a career-high four field goal makes against the Wildcats, which led to him earning Big Ten Freshman of the Week and Groza Stars of the Week honors on Oct. 31. The 54-yarder tied for the seventh-longest in program history and was the longest by a Hawkeye since Marshall Koehn drilled a 57-yarder in 2015.
- He made two field goals at Minnesota from 38 and 21 yards. The 21-yard field goal was a game-winner with 28 seconds remaining in the game.
- Stevens had his string of seven straight makes snapped at Purdue when he missed a 44-yarder in the 20+ mph windy conditions (hit the left upright).
- Stevens also drilled a 51-yarder on the road at Rutgers, which was tied for the 11th-longest all-time, and he converted from 49 yards at Ohio State.
- He led the team with 72 points via 16 field goals and 24 extra points. Stevens was lowa's first true freshman kicker since Keith Duncan in 2016.
- On the year, Iowa's placekickers made 17-for-21 field goals. Sophomore Aaron Blom made 1-of-3 attempts in the first two games with a make from 46 yards.
- Stevens also handled kickoff duties, where he had 31 touchbacks in 55 kickoffs.

#### TRUE FRESHMAN STARTER

- RB Kaleb Johnson became the 32nd freshman of the Kirk Ferentz era to start a game when he was in the starting lineup at No. 2 Ohio State on Oct. 22. Johnson, who started six games, was the sixth Hawkeye running back to start as a freshman under Ferentz, joining Brandon Wegher (2009), Marcus Coker (2010), Jordan Canzeri (2011), Greg Garmon (2012) and Tyler Goodson (2019).
- DB Xavier Nwankpa became the 33rd freshman to start when he made his first career start in the Music City Bowl against Kentucky. He was the first true freshman to start on defense since Dane Belton and Jack Campbell in 2019.

#### **FORCING TOS**

The Hawkeyes forced two or more turnovers in eight games this season, including three against Iowa State, Rutgers, Illinois and Wisconsin. Iowa had two fourth-quarter turnovers in the road win at Minnesota and two pick six touchdowns in the TransPerfect Music City Bowl victory over Kentucky.

• Iowa forced 23 turnovers (eight fumble recoveries, 15 interceptions), and scored 66 points off the miscues during the 2022 season.

#### **NICO REACHES 100**

WR Nico Ragaini made his 100th career reception during Iowa's Oct. 8 road game at Illinois. The Connecticut native has 125 career receptions for 1,354 yards with four touchdowns. Ragaini had his first touchdown of the season – a 29-yarder – at Purdue on Nov. 5.

• During bowl prep in Nashville, Ragaini announced he would return in 2023 for his sixth season.

#### **LACHEY'S CAREER DAY**

Sophomore Luke Lachey filled in as tight end No. 1 in the season finale against Nebraska and he enjoyed a career day. The Ohio native had a career-high seven receptions for 89 yards with one touchdown filling in for the injured Sam LaPorta. It came on the heels of a five catch, 77-yard game in the road win at Minnesota, where he had a key 33-yard reception in the seam to set up Iowa's game-winning field goal.

- Lachey had four receptions for 84 yards against Michigan on Oct. 1, which included a 5-yard touchdown catch for his first career score. In consecutive games against Rutgers and Michigan, Lachey had six catches for 121 yards and one touchdown. He had a career-long 37-yard reception against the Scarlet Knights on Sept. 24.
- During the Music City Bowl, Lachey had three catches for 36 yards, including a 15-yard touchdown reception for the game's only offensive points.
- Lachey finished the season third on the team with 28 receptions for 398 yards and a teamhigh four receiving touchdowns.

#### **DEFENSIVE SCORING**

lowa's defense extended its pick six streak to 15 consecutive years at Rutgers when sophomore DB Cooper DeJean made an over the shoulder catch and returned the interception 45 yards for his first career touchdown. It was the 30th longest interception return for a touchdown in school history and the 50th all-time.

- Iowa led the Big Ten and the nation with six defensive touchdowns (four interceptions, two fumble returns).
- lowa's defense found the end zone a second time in Piscataway when DB Kaevon Merriweather scooped up a Rutgers fumble (forced on a hit by DB Sebastian Castro) and returned it 30 yards for a touchdown. It was the eighth fumble return for a touchdown in school history and the fifth longest in the record books.
- The Hawkeye defense scored its third touchdown at No. 2 Ohio State when DL Joe Evans sacked C.J. Stroud to force a fumble, recovered and returned it 11 yards for his first career touchdown. The score gave Iowa a 7-3 lead in Columbus.
- Iowa had its second pick six of the season against Wisconsin when DeJean picked off Graham Mertz and returned it 32 yards for the touchdown.
- The Hawkeyes had two pick sixs in the first half in the Music City Bowl victory over Kentucky. DB Xavier Nwankpa had a 52-yard interception return for a touchdown in the second quarter for his first career interception and touchdown. It was the second-longest interception return for a touchdown in a bowl game in program history.
- DeJean made the score 21-0 against the Wildcats when he had a 14-yard pick six in the second quarter. It was his third pick six of the season, setting a single-season program record.
- Iowa's defense scored 40 points in 2022 via six touchdowns and two safeties.

#### MIGHTY D

- The Hawkeyes gave up 59 points (9.8 per game) in the first six games. It was the lowest point total for the program through six games since 1956.
- The unit gave up just 20 points in the first four games -- the fewest points allowed for the program in 66 years.
- Iowa gave up 185 yards of total offense, including just 68 on the ground, forced two turnovers and shut out Kentucky in the TransPerfect Music City Bowl victory. The Wildcats averaged 22.1 points and 336.3 yards of total offense entering the game.
- Iowa held Purdue to season lows in points (3) and total yards (255), 189.6 below its season average (444.6). The unit held Purdue QB Aidan O'Connell to a season-low 168 yards and to a 46.5 completion percentage his lowest of the season. Purdue was just 2-of-16 on third down.
- Iowa held Wisconsin to 10 points and just 51 rushing yards. The 10 points tied a season low and it was just the second time all season the Badgers didn't rush for 100+ yards.

- The Hawkeyes gave up 360 total yards and 66 rushing yards to No. 2 Ohio State, an offense that was averaging 543.7 yards and 228.0 rushing yards per game.
- Iowa gave up 151 yards of total offense to a Nevada offense that was averaging 336.3 yards per game. It was the second time this season lowa allowed 151 yards or fewer (120 vs. South Dakota State). It was the first time since 1986 that Iowa's defense has given up 160 or fewer (125 at Iowa State, 159 vs. NIU, 150 vs. UTEP) in the team's first three games.
- lowa's passing defense held the Wolfpack to 82 yards, tied for the 13th fewest in a game in the Kirk Ferentz era. The Hawkeyes held three opponents under 100 yards passing (87 vs. South Dakota State, 87 at Minnesota).

#### HEY, COOP

Sophomore DB Cooper DeJean started all 13 games – 10 at defensive back and three at the CASH position. DeJean recorded an interception in three consecutive games (vs. Iowa State, vs. Nevada, at Rutgers) – a first by a Hawkeye since junior DB Jermari Harris in 2021 season (at Nebraska, vs. Michigan, vs. Kentucky) – and he had a pick six for his fourth interception against Wisconsin.

- DeJean had his fifth interception of the season a 14-yard pick six in the bowl win against Kentucky. It was his school record third pick six of the season. He also finished with seven tackles and a bowl record 42 punt return yards en route to being named the Music City Bowl MVP.
- DeJean had a career-high 11 tackles, recorded his first career interception and had two pass breakups against lowa State on Sept. 10. He had a 32-yard pick six, 10 tackles and a career-high four punt returns for 82 yards against Wisconsin on Nov. 12.
- In 13 games, the Odebolt, Iowa, native finished fourth on the team with 75 tackles to go along with a team-high five interceptions and eight pass breakups. He was second in the Big Ten and tied for 15th nationally in interceptions.

#### **JACK ATTACK**

Butkus Award winner Jack Campbell had a team-high 128 tackles – 9.8 per game – during the 2022 season, which ranked second in the Big Ten and 14th nationally. The Cedar Falls, Iowa, native had eight or more tackles in 12 of Iowa's 13 games (12, 9, 10, 8, 11, 13, 9, 11, 7, 11, 10, 8, 10) and he had 10+ stops in eight contests, including a season-high 13 tackles at Illinois.

- Campbell had his first interception of the season (and fourth of his career) against No. 2 Ohio State on Oct. 22 and he had a key fourth quarter pick (and 30-yard return) to set up Iowa's game-winning field goal in the road win at Minnesota. Campbell also had 10 tackles and a fourth quarter forced fumble of Mohamed Ibrahim with the Gophers deep in the red zone, which led to him being named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the week on Nov. 21.
- He was selected as the Butkus Player of the Month for November after helping lowa to a 3-1 record with wins over Purdue, Minnesota and Wisconsin. He had 36 tackles, including 20 solo stops, a forced fumble and an interception in the four contests.

- Campbell had 11 tackles against Wisconsin, to reach 100 tackles for the season. His 128 tackles were 23rd-most in a single season in program history. It was the second straight year he reached the 100-tackle mark as he finished with 143 tackles in 2021. He was the first Hawkeye since Josey Jewell (three straight 100+ tackle seasons) to have 100 or more tackles in consecutive years.
- Campbell had 13 career games with 10 or more tackles. His 13 double-digit tackle games came against: vs. Kent State (11), vs. Colorado State (18), vs. Minnesota (17), at Nebraska (16), vs. Kentucky (14), vs. South Dakota State (12), vs. Nevada (10), vs. Michigan (11), at Illinois (13), vs. Northwestern (11), vs. Wisconsin (11), at Minnesota (10) and vs. Kentucky (10).
- Campbell surpassed the 200-career tackle mark in Iowa's 27-0 victory over Nevada on Sept. 17. He finished his career with 305 career tackles to rank 19th all-time in program history.

#### A MARATHON W

Iowa's 27-0 victory over Nevada kicked off at 6:40 p.m. (CT) on Sept. 17 inside Kinnick Stadium and ended at 1:39 a.m. early Sunday morning. There were three weather delays lasting 236 minutes and the game spanned 6:59 minutes from start to finish.

• It was the second weather delay in Kinnick Stadium history. Iowa's game against Tennessee Tech was delayed 84 minutes in 2011. Iowa's last game affected by a delay came at Iowa State in 2019. Iowa won both of those contests.

#### THE SHUUUUUUUUUUUUUUU

Iowa's defense recorded two shutouts during the 2022 season – blanking Nevada 27-0 on Sept. 17 and closing out the season with a 21-0 shutout win over Kentucky in the 2022 TransPerfect Music City Bowl.

- It was the first shutout in the 25-year history of the Music City Bowl and Iowa's second shutout in 35 bowl games (27-0 over Texas Tech, 1996 Alamo Bowl).
- Iowa was the first Big Ten team to shutout and SEC opponent in a bowl game.
- It was the first shutout by a Big Ten team in a bowl game since Penn State in 1999.
- lowa posted two shutouts for the first time since 2019 (road win at Northwestern (20-0) and home win over Rutgers (30-0).
- lowa now has 14 shutouts under head coach Kirk Ferentz with seven coming since 2016.

#### DON'T BEAT YOURSELF

Iowa finished the season ranking in the top six nationally as one of the least penalized teams. The Hawkeyes were not penalized for more than 50 yards in nine of their 13 games.

- The team ranked fourth in the nation in fewest penalty yards (425), fifth in fewest penalties (53) and fewest penalty yards per game (32.69) and sixth in fewest penalties per game (4.08).
- lowa had just two penalties for 15 yards in the season-opening win over South Dakota State, two penalties for 18 yards against Northwestern and two penalties for 10 yards against Kentucky in the Music City Bowl. Iowa had three or fewer penalties in five games.
- During the road win at Minnesota, neither lowa nor the Gophers were flagged for a penalty. It was the first time Iowa hasn't committed a penalty since 2019 (vs. Mississippi State) and it was the first time since 1986 (Army vs. Navy) that neither team was flagged in an FBS contest.

#### **SCORING EARLY**

The Hawkeyes allowed their first points in the first quarter of the season when Rutgers drove for a game-opening field goal on Sept. 24. Iowa outscored its opponents, 61-42, in the opening quarter in 2022.

#### **BLOCK THAT PUNT**

DL Lukas Van Ness tied a single-game school record, blocking a pair of punts against Iowa State on Sept. 10. It was the sixth time a Hawkeye has had multiple blocks in a single game and Van Ness is the fifth Hawkeye to accomplish the feat.

Ken Iwebema had two blocks against Syracuse in 2007 and against Illinois in 2005.

- Van Ness tied the school record for blocked punts in a game with two inside lowa State territory. The only other Hawkeye to block two punts in the same game was Sean Considine at Iowa State in 2003.
- Van Ness' first block of the game set up the Hawkeyes' touchdown. It was Iowa's first punt block of the season and first since the 2021 regular season finale at Nebraska (Henry Marchese).
- Van Ness blocked his second punt in the third quarter, giving lowa possession at the lowa State 20. The possession ended with an lowa turnover at the goal line.
- DL Deontae Craig notched Iowa's third blocked punt of the season in the second guarter against Wisconsin, setting up Iowa's first touchdown. It was Craig's first career blocked punt.
- Iowa ranked second in the Big Ten and 19th nationally in blocked kicks, while Van Ness ranked second in the Big Ten and sixth nationally.

## CREATIVE SCORING

Senior LB Jack Campbell found a way to put points on the scoreboard for the Iowa football team. In his Hawkeye career, Campbell scored via a safety (vs. South Dakota State, 2022), interception return for a touchdown (vs. Illinois, 2021) and fumble return for a touchdown (at Iowa State, 2021). What appeared to be a pick-six at Minnesota was called back when it was ruled he stepped out of bounds.

## 2 X 2

lowa took the unconventional path to seven points via a field goal and two second-half safeties during the 7-3 victory over South Dakota State on Sept. 3. Following Tory Taylor's punt that pinned the Jacks at the 1, Jack Campbell's tackle for loss gave the Hawkeyes a 5-3 third-quarter lead. Taylor pinned SD State deep again in the fourth quarter and Joe Evans' sack accounted for Iowa's final two points. The setback was South Dakota State's only loss of the season.

• It was the first time since 2018 at Penn State that the Hawkeyes had two safeties in the same game.

# **UNCONVENTIONAL 7 WAS ENOUGH**

- The Hawkeyes' seven points were the fewest for a Big Ten team in a win since lowa's 6-4 win at Penn State in 2004.
- lowa is the first Big Ten team to win a game without scoring a touchdown since Nebraska in 2018 (beat Michigan State, 9-6). The Hawkeyes' last such win? The 6-4 win at Penn State in 2004.

#### FRESHMAN PT TRACKER

Iowa had eight true freshmen play in 2022. The list includes: DB Koen Entringer (4), DL Aaron Graves (12), DB TJ Hall (13), RB Kaleb Johnson (13), DB Xavier Nwankpa (13), TE Addison Ostrenga (13), RB Jaziun Patterson (3) and K Drew Stevens (13).

#### **OH MY TORY**

Junior Tory Taylor averaged 45.4 yards on 82 punts during the 2022 games. The Australia native had 27 punts of 50+ yards, 38 punts were downed inside the 20-yard line and just 21 punts were returned for a 4.4 average. His 45.4 average was second in the Big Ten and 11th nationally.

- Taylor finished the 2022 season with 3,766 yards a school record yardage total. It was the second straight year Taylor broke the school record.
- He punted a career-high 10 times for 479 yards, averaging 47.9 yards per attempt, against South Dakota State on Sept. 3. Taylor had punts downed at the 1, 2, 6, 8, 8 and 12-yard lines and seven of his punts were inside the 20.
- Taylor was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week and to the Rays 8 List on Sept. 5 for his efforts. It is his second career Big Ten weekly honor as he earned his first distinction last season following Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State.
- He was also named to the Ray's 8 List following Week 3.
- Taylor was also named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week following lowa's win at Rutgers, where he averaged 42.6 yards on five punts, with four of the five being downed inside the 20. He had a long of 51 yards and Rutgers had just one return for negative two yards.
- Taylor punted eight or more times in five games this season. He had a career-long 70-yard punt at Purdue in a game where he punted eight times for 414 yards (51.8 avg.). He had five punts at Minnesota with four being downed inside the 20.
- During the Music City Bowl win over Kentucky, Taylor tied a bowl record with eight punts for 386 yards (48.3 avg.). Four of his punts pinned the Wildcats inside the 10 and two were inside the 15. He tied Nick Gallery (1993 Alamo) and Jason Baker (1997 Sun) with eight punts.

#### THE CALIFORNIA KID

- Spencer Petras finished his career with a 20-11 record (.645) as lowa's starting quarterback. Iowa scored 22.68 points per game in Petras' 31 starts.
- Petras left the regular season finale against Nebraska in the first quarter because of injury and he didn't return. The California native also missed the 2022 TransPerfect Music Bowl.
- Petras completed 15-of-24 attempts for 221 yards his second most yards this season at Minnesota. He had a season high two touchdowns after completing 13-of-23 attempts for 192 yards in the road win at Purdue on Nov. 5. It came on the heels of a 220-yard output against Northwestern, where he completed 21-of-30 passes with one touchdown.
- For the season, Petras was 157-of-281 for 1,725 yards with five touchdowns (and five interceptions). He finished his career 10th in program history with 5,199 yards.
- Petras led Iowa to 12 consecutive victories from 2020-21, winning the final six games of 2020 and the first six games of 2021. He went 194-of-324 for 2,226 yards with 17 touchdown passes, four interceptions during the winning streak.

- He started 17 straight games from the 2020 season through Week 9 of 2021 before missing the Nov. 13 game against Minnesota because of injury in 2021.
- The Hawkeyes averaged 31.8 points per game in 2020, Petras' first year as the starting quarterback. It marked lowa's highest point per game total since 2002 (36.5). The Hawkeyes won their final six games in 2020, outscoring their opposition, 214-83.
- Petras matched his career high with three touchdown passes and set a career high with two rushing touchdowns Week 5 at Maryland last season. He became the first lowa quarterback with multiple passing touchdowns and multiple rushing touchdowns in a game since Brad Banks at Minnesota in 2002.

#### **BALL HAWKS**

- Eight Hawkeyes had interceptions in 2022. DB/CASH Cooper DeJean recorded an interception in three consecutive games, he added his fourth pick – four a touchdown -- against Wisconsin on Nov. 12 and he had his third pick six in the Music City Bowl win over Kentucky. His pick against Iowa State was his first career interception. Senior Terry Roberts had a third-quarter pick against Iowa State (his second career interception) and he had an interception return for a touchdown wiped off the board against Nevada because of a penalty.
- Both DeJean and Kaevon Merriweather had interceptions at Rutgers, Iowa's fourth and fifth picks this season. DeJean returned his interception 45 yards for a pick six. Quinn Schulte had Iowa's sixth interception (his second career pick) at Illinois on Oct. 8 and Jack Campbell had his first pick (fourth career) at No. 2 Ohio State. Merriweather notched his second and third picks in consecutive wins against Northwestern and Purdue and LB Seth Benson had his first INT of the season (second of his career) against the Boilermakers.
- Iowa had two more INTs against Wisconsin. DeJean had a 32-yard pick six and DB Riley Moss notched his first interception of the season and the 11th of his career, which are tied for the ninth-most all-time.
- Campbell had his second INT this season (and he returned it 30 yards) with two minutes remaining in the fourth quarter in the road win at Minnesota. His pick set up Iowa's game-winning field goal.
- The Hawkeyes had their 14th and 15th INTs in the bowl win over Kentucky. DB Xavier Nwankpa had a 52-yard pick six for his first career interception and DeJean had a 14-yard pick six in the second quarter. It was his school record third interception return for a touchdown in 2022.
- Iowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 15 seasons and 20 of the last 22.

• Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

#### **BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001**

- The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 21 times in the last 22 seasons. Iowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz won the 10th bowl game of his career in the Hawkeyes' 21-0 win over Kentucky in the 2022 TransPerfect Music City Bowl, tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 10-9 bowl record.
- Eighteen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Nick Saban (18), Mack Brown (14), Kyle Whittingham (11), Mike Gundy (11) and Dabo Swinney (11) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.
- Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (12) have more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than Iowa. Iowa is 18-16-1 all-time in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

## **IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL**

- The Hawkeyes have had 206 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (81 draft picks/125 free agents).
- Seventeen former Hawkeyes participated in the 2023 NFL Playoffs, a number that ranked eighth nationally among programs and former players. Just one Big Ten program (Ohio State) had more former players participating in the playoffs.
- Iowa and Florida lead all schools with five offensive tackles currently active in the

- Iowa is tied with Miami, Florida, Notre Dame, Penn State and Stanford with the most tight ends active in the NFL (4).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (44 consecutive years).
- Iowa has had 11 First Round NFL Draft picks under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- Two former Hawkeyes -- Jake Gervase and Alaric Jackson -- were members of the Los Angeles Rams' 2022 Super Bowl champion team.
- OT Tristan Wirfs earned first-team All-Pro and was a Pro Bowl selection in 2021.
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson (Detroit), TE George Kittle (San Francisco) and Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 23 years, 199-of-238 (84 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 14 years, Iowa has had 53 NFL Draft picks, the third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (83), Michigan (63), Wisconsin (52).
- Iowa has had eight first round picks in the last 12 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020; OL Tyler Linderbaum, 2022.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former lowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 11th year on staff and sixth as lowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles



Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.

- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz, WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.
- Former OL Tristan Wirfs was the starting right tackle as a rookie for the 2021 Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Former DL Anthony Nelson was a reserve defensive end for the Bucs. Former LB Ben Niemann and LB Anthony Hitchens were on the AFC Champion Kansas City Chiefs.
- Entering the 2022 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (16) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 18 lowa tight ends since 1999 (11 drafted/7 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

#### **IOWA PROGRAM NOTES**

- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 21 of the last 22 seasons. lowa is 10-9 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (12) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 18-16-1 in 35 bowl games. lowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (186-115) replaced Fry and has completed 24 seasons. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa won the Big Ten West Division title in 2021 and made its second appearance in the Big Ten Championship game. The Hawkeyes played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, lowa has appeared in the poll 354 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa

- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 13 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End), Tyler Linderbaum, (Rimington, Top Center), Jack Campbell (Campbell Trophy, Butkus Award).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.

- RB Leshon Williams had a 9-yard touchdown run in the first quarter for his first career touchdown. Williams led the Hawkeye rushing attack with 34 yards on 14 attempts.
- DB Cooper DeJean had his first career interception in the second quarter. The interception occurred in the end zone and was downed for a touchback. DeJean had a career high 11 tackles (six solo), one interception and two pass break-ups.
- DB Terry Roberts had his first interception of the season (second of his career) on Iowa State's opening drive of the second half.
- LB Seth Benson finished with 10 tackles second most on the team. It was his seventh career game with 10 or more tackles.
- DB Quinn Schulte (9), DT Logan Lee (8) and DB Terry Roberts (6) each tallied career highs in tackles. DB Riley Moss tied a career high with nine tackles. LB Jack Campbell also had nine tackles, moving his career total to 198.

- Johnson is the first Hawkeye freshman to rush for 100 yards in a game since Tyler Goodson (13-116-1 TD) at Nebraska in 2019.
- QB Spencer Petras completed 14-of-26 attempts for a season-high 175 yards and one touchdown. Petras moved into 12th place on the lowa career passing yards list with 3.850 yards.
- WR Arland Bruce IV caught a 21-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter for his second career receiving touchdown (fifth TD overall). Bruce IV had a team-high three catches for 50 yards.
- WR Nico Ragaini and WR Keagan Johnson made their season debuts after missing the first two games because of injury. Ragaini had two catches for 56 yards, including a 46-yarder in the third quarter. Johnson had one catch for seven yards and was targeted five times.
- RB Jaziun Patterson became the seventh true freshman to see action this season. He rushed six times for 20 yards.
- DB Cooper DeJean intercepted a pass in the first quarter for his second interception in as many games and second of his career. DeJean also had two tackles and two pass breakups.
- LB Jack Campbell had a game high 10 tackles. It is his second game this season and seventh career contest with 10 or more tackles. Campbell surpassed the 200-career tackle mark in the game; he now has 208 tackles, which puts him in 68th in program history. He moved past the likes of Leroy Smith, Ben Niemann and Ed Miles.
- DL Lukas Van Ness had a career-high eight tackles and DL John Waggoner had a career-high six tackles. Van Ness also had 2.5 TFL and 1.5 sacks, giving him nine career sacks.
- DL Aaron Graves had his first career sack in the third quarter. Graves finished with a career-high four tackles and 1.5 TFL in the game.
- K Drew Stevens went 2-for-2 on field goal attempts in the first two attempts of his career. He made a 43-yard field goal on his first attempt in the second quarter and connected on a 32-yarder in the third quarter.

#### MISCELLANEOUS

- Saturday's game included three weather delays -- 80-minutes (8:36 p.m. to 9:56 p.m.), 110 minutes (10:05 p.m. to 11:55 p.m.) and 46 minutes (11:57 p.m. to 12:43 a.m.) for a total of 3:56.
- It is the second weather delay in Kinnick Stadium tory. Iowa's game against Tennessee Tech was delayed 84 minutes on Sept. 3, 2011.
- lowa's last game that included a weather delate came on Sept. 14, 2019, at lowa State. There was a 2:55 delay at Jack Trice Stadium in Ames, lowa.
- lowa had a season-high 337 yards of total offense, rushing for a season-high 162 yards on 35 attempts, averaging 4.6 yards per carry. Seven different receivers caught a pass in the game and the passing attack had a season-high 175 yards and one touchdown.
- Iowa's defense posted its first shutout since 2019 a 20-0 win at Northwestern (10/26/19). It was the Hawkeyes' first shutout in Kinnick Stadium since defeating Rutgers, 30-0, on Sept. 7, 2019.
- The Hawkeye defense limited Nevada to 151 yards of total offense. The Wolfpack entered the game averaging 336.3 yards.
- lowa has limited two of its first three opponents to 151 yards or less. (South Dakota State, 120 yards; Nevada, 151 yards). It is the first time since 1986 that the Hawkeye defense has held two of the first three opponents to 160 yards or fewer (125 at Iowa State; 159 vs. NIU; 150 at UTEP).
- Iowa improves to 14-7 all-time in night games at Kinnick Stadium.

- Campbell now has 100 tackles this season, moving over the century mark for a second straight season. He is the first Hawkeye since Josey Jewell to have 100 or more tackles in consecutive season (Jewell had three straight from 2015-17).
  - o Campbell moved into 20th place on Iowa's all-time tackles list with 277.
- DL Deonte Craig blocked a Wisconsin punt in the second quarter his first career block and LB Jay Higgins returned it 3 yards to the UW 17 to set up lowa's first touchdown. It was the team's third block of the season.
- o Craig tied a career-high with five tackles and had a career-high 1.5 sacks.
- DL Joe Evans had sack and forced fumble in the fourth quarter. It is his second forced fumble (at Ohio State) of the season.
- o Evans has had at least one sack in lowa's last four games. He has six sacks, which are second-most on the team.
- K Drew Stevens made a 44-yard field goal in the fourth quarter his fifth make from 40 or more yards this season. Stevens is 13-of-15 in field goal attempts this season the most makes by a freshman since Mike Meyer's 14 in 2010.
- Freshman Koen Entringer made his season debut. He is the eighth true freshman to play this season.

- lowa scored its fourth defensive touchdown in the second quarter, courtesy of DB Cooper DeJean's 32-yard pick six. The Hawkeyes have scored 28 points via four touchdowns and two safeties
  - o Iowa entered the game fourth nationally with three defensive touchdowns.
- lowa had two interceptions (Cooper DeJean/Riley Moss) for the second straight game and for the third time this season. The Hawkeyes have 12 interceptions this season and have four games with two picks.
- o lowa forced three turnovers (2 INT, 1 Fumble) and blocked a punt, tying a season high for the fourth time. The team has a 48-30 advantage in points off turnovers this season
- The Hawkeyes held Wisconsin to 10 points. The defense has held seven opponents to 10 or fewer points and eight opponents to 13 points or less.

- Campbell had his third career forced fumble, jarring the ball loose from Mohamed Ibrahim in the fourth quarter with the Gophers driving in the red zone. DL Deontae Craig recovered at the Iowa 9 for his first career fumble recovery.
- Campbell finished with 10 tackles his seventh 10+ tackle game this season and 12th of his career.
  - o Campbell is now 20th in school history with 287 career tackles.
- QB Spencer Petras had a 1-yard touchdown in the first quarter. It is his second straight game with a touchdown, his third of the season and 12th of his career.
- o Petras finished 15-of-24 for 221 yards, completing 63 percent of his attempts. The 221 yards are his second-most this season (246 vs. Michigan).
- TE Sam LaPorta had a career-long 58-yard reception on Iowa's first offensive play of the game. LaPorta finished the game with four catches for 95 yards before leaving the game with an injury in the first half.
- TE Luke Lachey had a career-high five receptions to finish with 77 yards. His 33-yard reception in the fourth quarter was the second-longest of his career.
- o Iowa's tight ends LaPorta (4-95), Lachey (5-77) and Addison Ostrenga (1-6) combined for 10 catches for 178 yards.
- RB Kaleb Johnson had a team-high 43 yards on eight attempts to pass Tyler Goodson for Iowa's freshman rushing record with 653 yards. It is the fifth game this season he has led the team in rushing.
- K Drew Stevens made a 38-yard field goal in the first quarter and the go-ahead 21-yard field goal with 31 seconds remaining. Stevens is 15-of-17 in field goal attempts this season. His 15 field goals are the most by a Hawkeye freshman in program history, moving past Mike Meyer and Nate Kaeding.
