## Lisa Bluder Q-and-A regarding the 2017-18 season:

## Last season, the team made an extended WNIT postseason run.

 How will that experience benefit your team this season?It gave us more games to play. We had the opportunity to compete on our home floor in an intense tournament environment, and that gave our players confidence. They know they can compete at that high level.

On paper, this is a very young team, but your sophomores and juniors have seen a lot of playing time. How will that impact you this season?

We are young. We have two seniors on our roster and neither one of them started last year. Then you look at our roster and who we return and our sophomore and junior classes have had a lot of playing time. We may be young, but we are returning a lot of game experience.

Kathleen Doyle and Hannah Stewart were elected as team captains by their teammates. Can you talk about the importance of their leadership?
Both Hannah and Kathleen were elected as captains this year due to the respect that their teammates have for them in their leadership roles. Both of them are natural leaders. They communicate well, bring high energy, and really communicate with the coaching staff. We have a lot of really good leaders on this team, but I think we have two really good captains in Hannah and Kathleen.

One of the biggest question marks going into this season is Tania Davis. How is her rehabbing process coming along and when can we expect her return to the court?
I'm excited about where Tania is. Her recovery has gone quicker than I had anticipated. I was hoping we would have Tania back around Christmas time or by Big Ten play, but I really think she will be suiting up for that first game. She's doing about 75 percent of practice already.

It was a really pivotal point in the season when we lost Tania last year. She was our starting point guard, our experience, and we loved her. To lose her really put a hole in our team, but it gave an opportunity for other people to step up -- specifically Kathleen Doyle. Having Tania back gives us the depth and the added experience. Tania also brings a swag to the floor that we really need.

Megan Gustafson finished last season as one of the best posts in the country. What can we expect from her in her junior campaign?
I cannot say enough about Megan. She is an unbelievable person, an unbelievable player, and she works hard all of the time. She is someone that never takes a possession off, never rests on offense or defense, is always positive, and always ready to learn. That has translated into being one of the best posts in America. She returns as the third-best field goal percentage shooter in the country, she averaged a double-double, was a first team All-Big Ten honoree as a sophomore. I really believe that Megan could go down as one of the best players to ever where a Hawkeye uniform.

Kathleen Doyle was named to the Big Ten All-Freshmen Team last season. How do you see her role evolving as a sophomore? Kathleen gained some confidence, not only in the WNIT where she played extremely well, but also being invited to the U19 USA Team Trials. That's a big compliment to get invited to those trials. I think she benefited from that. She went up against the best and realized that she can compete with them. I think you always see the biggest growth in players between their freshmen and sophomore years and that is certainly the case with Kathleen, Makenzie and Amanda. Our freshmen have really grown up as sophomores, and Kathleen is leading that charge.

You welcome two newcomers -- three if you include redshirt freshman Alexis Sevillian. How do you see this year's freshmen class impacting the team?
We redshirted Lexi last year. You never really know if you are making the right decision at the time, but it was absolutely the best decision for our team. Lexi had a year to grow, a year to get better, and now she's entering her freshman year with confidence. She is going to be a freshman that we can really count on. Zion is a walk on, so she is learning the ropes and the system. Paula played at a high level in Spain, but it is a completely different basketball game over here. She has a lot to learn, but she is playing behind one of the best posts in the country, so she is going to learn a lot in the next couple of years.

You have two seniors on the team that have had unconventional paths to this point. What kind of impact can we expect from Chase Coley and Carly Mohns?
Seniors usually play and lead in a different way, because they realize that it's going to be the last time they get to wear an lowa uniform. That sense of urgency really brings out the best in them. Carly has had a really rocky career with injuries. I am praying that Carly has a healthy, pain-free year, because she deserves it. She has stayed positive, stayed with it, and she's a good basketball player. Chase has always been a contributor to our program. I don't know how her role will exactly pan out this year, but I know Chase will make an impact on this team.

Year in and year out, lowa is ranked in the top-25 nationally in attendance. What does that support mean to you?
It's amazing. It's something we talk about all the time when we are recruiting players. When you come to lowa, you get to play in front of the best fans in America. They will be there win or lose, they will cheer for you, and they are knowledgeable about the game. We are proud of the atmosphere that we have on our home court. We know that it helps us win games.

Your next win will be win No. 700. What does that milestone mean to you?
It's one of those milestones where I can't really believe it. I can't believe I've even coached that many games. I am genuinely just as excited today as I was the first day I coached a game at lowa. The only thing I can think about is all the women who have went through the program and my staff that I get to share all of these experiences with. I consider myself one of the luckiest people in the world.

## Bruce Harreld <br> President University of lowa

Bruce Harreld became the 21st president of the University of Iowa on November 2, 2015. He received a Bachelor of Engineering degree from Purdue University and a Master of Business Administration degree from Harvard University.

President Harreld served on the faculty of Harvard Business School from 20082014, with dual appointments to the entrepreneurial and strategy units. He was
 faculty chair of the Building New Businesses in Established Organizations program. As a faculty member, he taught in numerous executive programs in Cambridge, Qatar, Mumbai, and Shanghai. He also has been an adjunct professor at Northwestern University in the Kellogg School of Management, developing the first-ever MBA course on Strategic Use of Information Technology.

President Harreld has served in several corporate leadership positions. As senior vice president and division president of Kraft General Foods, he led the strategic unit that formulated strategy and executed acquisitions for this multibillion-dollar company. As president and board member of Boston

Market Company, he, along with five other partners, led the organization from 20 stores in the Boston area to over 1,100 stores nationally. As senior vice president of IBM, President Harreld worked with the CEO and senior management team to chart the organization's transformation from near bankruptcy, led the business transformation team that streamlined operations and reintegrated the global organization, and led the strategy unit that was responsible for the formulation and execution of the company's overall strategy. President Harreld has also served as a consultant, advising public, private, and military organizations on leadership, organic growth, and strategic renewal, including serving as manager, vice president, and member of the board of the Boston Consulting Group.

President Harreld is the author or coauthor of numerous articles and book chapters in such journals and magazines as the Harvard Business Review, California Management Review, and Financial Executive, and books and monographs such as Leading Sustainable Change: An Organizational Perspective (Oxford University Press, 2015) and Core Curriculum Strategy Reading: Executive Strategy (Harvard Business Publishing, 2014). He has also authored or coauthored several case studies for Harvard Business Publishing.

President Harreld has received several awards, including the Accenture Award for best business article of the year and the Distinguished Industrial Engineer and Distinguished Engineering Awards from Purdue University.

President Harreld is married to Mary Gillilan Harreld, an attorney. They have four children and six grandchildren.

## Gary Barta <br> Director of Athletics <br> University of Iowa

Gary A. Barta is in his 12 th year as the director of athletics at the University of Iowa, where he occupies the Henry B. and Patricia B. Tippie Athletics Chair. The position was recently endowed by the Tippies, longtime supporters of the University of lowa and Hawkeye Athletics.

Barta was recognized by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) as a 2015-16 Under Armour Athletics Director of the Year. In 2016, Barta received a contract extension keeping him in lowa City through 2021.

In the past year, lowa Athletics staff, coaches, and Hawkeye student-athletes have continued to raise the bar in their daily approach to: "Win. Graduate. Do It Right." There is tremendous momentum surrounding the entire Athletics program in all three areas.
Barta has engineered a significant Senior Staff reorganization the past few years. The recent changes have allowed the ability to fill a number of key positions with new faces, while realigning staff assignments to fit the needs of Hawkeye coaches, staff, and studentathletes.

In 2016-17, the Ul's annual operating budget exceeded \$100 million for the first time, with 100 percent of the revenue generated by the UI Athletics Department through external funding. The majority of revenue is derived from traditional revenue sources that include: Big Ten Conference revenue share (including media rights), sales of tickets to athletic events on the UI campus, and contributions from loyal Hawkeye fans throughout lowa and across the country.

Support for Hawkeye Athletics has grown significantly under Barta's leadership. An alltime record $\$ 42$ million in fundraising activity was achieved in 2016-17. This philanthropic support has been critical to the long list of Athletics facilities either built or renovated during Barta's 11 years at lowa.

Barta's involvement in the UI campus and the greater lowa City community extends beyond his position as director of the Ul's Intercollegiate Athletics programs. He is a member of the President's Cabinet, comprised of vice presidents and other campus leaders that provide counsel to the Ul's president.

Barta remains active at the conference and national level. He serves on the Rose Bowl Management Committee and is currently involved in the NCAA Transfer Working Group. He is also regularly involved in NACDA (National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics) and LEAD1 (formerly known as the Division IA Athletic Directors Association). From a community standpoint, Barta is currently serving as the Chair of the United Way of Johnson and Washington Counties Board of Directors. He is a long-standing member of the Partnership for Alcohol Safety Committee, and has been a regular participant in numerous Chamber and Convention and Visitor Bureau initiatives during his tenure.

Barta often suggests to his staff that "Hope is not a strategy," which is why the Department is undergoing a comprehensive review and rewriting of the strategic plan for the UI Athletics Department and continues to work with the UI's leadership on a long-term financial plan.

- Rick Heller and the lowa baseball program won the 2017 Big Ten Conference tournament championship for the first time in program history and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in three seasons. The Hawkeyes posted 39 victories-the fifth most in school history-and reached the Big Ten title game for a second consecutive season. Iowa's line-up included national home run leader Jake Adams, who set lowa and Big Ten records with 29 home runs.
- Four players were selected in the 2017 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, moving the four-year total to 15 under Heller-the most in school history. Jake Adams and Mason McCoy were selected within seven picks of each other in the sixth round. They were the highest lowa draft picks since 1999 and the highest by a position player since 1992.
- Joey Woody's track and field team matched a school record by sending 15 individuals to the NCAA Outdoor Championships. The men's squad scored 15 points to finish 17th in the nation, lowa's best finish in 50 years. Aaron Mallett (110-meter hurdles, 4th), Reno Tuufuli (discus, 5 th) and the 1,600-meter relay team (3rd), earned first-team All-America honors. Junior Brittany Brown (200 meters, 7th) and Laulauga Tausaga (discus, 7th) paced the women's team as first-team All-Americans.
- The lowa men's track team earned the Hy-Vee Cup at the Drake Relays, recording the highest point total of all university men's teams competing in one of the premier track and field meets in the nation.
- Under fifth-year head coach Andrew Carter, the lowa rowing program was selected to the NCAA Championships for the second time in program history, ending a 16 -year drought. The Hawkeyes finished fourth in the Big Ten and were ranked as high as 11th in the nation during the season. Carter was named NCAA Regional Coach of the Year.
Tom Brands' lowa wrestling squad finished third in the Big Ten and fourth at the NCAA Championships. Senior Cory Clark won an NCAA title at 133 pounds and the Hawkeyes crowned five All-Americans. Thomas Gilman and Sammy Brooks won Big Ten individual championships; Michael Kemerer and Cash Wilcke were named to Amateur Wrestling News All-Rookie Team.
- lowa football appeared in its fourth straight January bowl game following the 2016 season, as the Hawkeyes have won 20 games over the past two seasons.
- Iowa football participated in the Big Ten Conference football championship game in 2015 and appeared in the 2016 Rose Bowl Game.
lowa football has appeared in 14 bowl games under head coach Kirk Ferentz, including 10 January bowl games.
- Under Fran McCaffery, the lowa men's basketball team advanced to the postseason for a sixth consecutive season (three NCAA, three NIT), reaching the second round of the NIT before falling to the eventual tournament champion in overtime. Two Hawkeyes earned AllBig Ten honors, including first-team selection Peter Jok. The Hawkeyes have had a first-team All-Big selection for four consecutive seasons.
- Lisa Bluder's Hawkeye women's basketball team advanced to postseason play for the 10th straight season while fielding a very young team comprised of nine underclassmen and five upperclassmen. lowa advanced to the fourth round of the WNIT, collecting postseason wins over Missouri State, South Dakota, and Colorado. Three Hawkeyes earned All-Big Ten honors and five earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition.
- The UI men's golf team, under the direction of third-year head coach Tyler Stith, competed in its ninth straight NCAA Tournament. The Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten Championships.
- Larissa Libby's GymHawks advanced to the NCAA Regionals for the ninth time in the last 10 seasons, where they finished third (195.050). Senior Angel Metcalf and freshman Clair Kaji advanced as individual competitors at the NCAA Championships. The GymHawks were
third at the Big Ten Championships, with five gymnasts earning All-Big Ten honors. - JD Reive's UI men's gymnastics squad placed fifth at the Big Ten Championships and saw Matt Loochtan garner first-team All-Big Ten recognition. Five student-athletes advanced to NCAA individual event finals.
- First-year head coach Sasha Schmid led the women's tennis team to a plus-five improvement in conference wins from the previous season and guided lowa back to the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2014. Elise van Heuvelen was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year and first-team All-Big Ten.
- The lowa women's swimming and diving team placed 26th as a team at the 2017 NCAA Championships under Marc Long - the program's highest finish since 2005. The Hawkeyes had two first-team All-Americans in Emma Sougstad and Calli Head.
- The lowa men's and women's swimming and diving teams both tallied Top- 40 finishes at the NCAA Championships under head coach Marc Long. The program had two student-athletes-junior Emma Sougstad (100 breast) and senior Roman Trussov (100 breast, 200 breast)-garner three All-America distinctions.
- In his third year as head coach, Bond Shymansky guided the volleyball team to one of the best volleyball seasons in program history. lowa finished the regular season with a 19-13 overall record and a 9-11 mark in Big Ten play, recording the program's first winning season since 2000. Loxley Keala became the eighth player in program history to garner 2,000 assists, a feat she accomplished in just two years with the program. As a senior, Keala amassed 1,212 assists and became the first Hawkeye to earn All-Big Ten honors since 2001.


## - Graduate •

- In October 2016, the NCAA reported lowa's student-athletes set a Hawkeye record by posting a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) score of 90 percent. Iowa student-athletes also earned a 76 percent Federal Graduation Rate (FGR). The FGR is also a record, and tops among the three Board of Regents State of lowa institutions.
- Sixteen teams improved their GSR over 2015-16 while 16 teams also improved their Academic Progress Rate (APR) over the previous year.
- The grade point average for all UI student-athletes has reached 3.0 or above for the past two years, which exceeds the GPA average for all students attending the University of lowa.
- Last May, the NCAA reported all 24 of lowa's sports programs were comfortably above the APR threshold for the seventh straight year. The NCAA also singled out the men's golf, women's swimming and diving, and men's gymnastics teams for APR scores that ranked in the top 10 percent of their peer groups.
- Women's basketball senior Ally Disterhoft was named College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-American of the Year for the second straight year. Disterhoft is just the fifth scholar-athlete to win the prestigious award in back-toback years since its inception in 1987-88 and the second Big Ten athlete to accomplish the feat.
- One-hundred-eighty-three UI student-athletes earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition throughout the year.
- Forty-five UI student-athletes earned the Big Ten Conference Distinguished Scholar Award.
- The women's rowing program featured 15 Academic All-Big Ten selections and four Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association National Scholar-Athletes.
- Men's gymnastics tied a school record with nine Academic All-Big Ten selections. Senior Jack Boyle was named a finalist for the Nissen-Emery Award, given to the country's most outstanding senior gymnast in the gym and in the classroom.
- Seven men's and women's swimming student-athletes were named College Swimming Coaches Association of America (CSCAA) Scholar All-Americans and 21 earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition.
- Wrestlers Michael Kemerer, Alex Meyer, and Brandon Sorensen were named to the National Wrestling Coaches Association (NWCA) All-Academic Team.


## - Do It Right •

- The UI provides a superior experience for the more than 650 talented student-athletes who participate in the program annually and the more than one million friends and fans of the UI who attend Hawkeye events on the UI campus while being responsible and productive citizens of the greater lowa City and University of lowa community.
- lowa remains among the handful of intercollegiate athletics programs nationally that successfully maintains its status as 100 percent self-supporting.
- UI student-athletes, coaches, and staff are also active local leaders, logging 15,000 hours of community service and spearheading efforts to support a wide variety of causes ranging from construction of the Ul's new Stead Family Children's Hospital, to the Ul's extremely successful Dance Marathon, to involvement with Coaches vs. Cancer.
- Iowa football has been involved with the Stead Family Children's Hospital "Kid Captain" program for 11 years. UI Athletics teamed with the UI Alumni Association on the "Black and Gold Fridays" outreach program and partnered with the College Football Playoff Foundation on "Extra Yard for (K-12) Teachers" program.
- lowa's annual "Day of Caring" serves as the foundation upon which all these outreach activities rest. Now in its 22 nd year of existence, the Day of Caring happens each April and typically involves representatives of most, if not all, of lowa's sports programs who provide a wide variety of assistance to myriad not-for-profit organizations that serve the greater lowa City community.
- "Doing It Right" also encompasses efforts aimed at improving the student-athlete experience. The UI Athletics Department invested more than $\$ 1.7$ million directly into food cost for its student-athletes in 2014-15 in response to NCAA legislation aimed at
providing a higher quality student-athlete experience, with that figure exceeding $\$ 1.9$ in 2016-17. That commitment will continue annually and is complemented by increases to the value of the scholarships awarded the UI's student-athletes as part of the NCAA's effort to fully address cost of attendance.
- The Ladies Football Academy, spearheaded by Mary and Kirk Ferentz, has donated more than $\$ 1.8$ million to the University of lowa's Stead Family Children's Hospital, which opened recently across the street from Kinnick Stadium.
- Margaret and Fran McCaffery have been champions for Coaches vs. Cancer and the American Cancer Society (ACS). The McCafferys have been actively involved with the Coaches vs. Cancer program and have raised more than $\$ 2$ million to support ACS efforts.


## - Facilities •

Providing the resources for UI student-athletes and coaches to be successful is a priority for Barta and his senior management team. That process includes providing state-of-theart facilities, which is why Barta continues to work closely with institutional leadership on the finalization of a comprehensive master plan for the facilities available to the Hawkeyes. Recently completed and additional facility projects on the horizon include:
Initial phases of the Kinnick Edge, an $\$ 89$ million project over the next two years that includes complete replacement of the north end zone in Kinnick Stadium that will provide new and improved indoor and outdoor seating and amenities, additional video wall, and a new playing surface in lowa's historic football stadium.

- Construction of the $\$ 55$ million Stew and LeNore Hansen Football Performance Center, completed in 2015.
- Center-hung videoboards in Carver-Hawkeye Arena, along with new sound and lighting systems.
Forty-seven million dollar revitalization of Carver-Hawkeye Arena.
- Installation of a new video wall and video ribbon board at Kinnick Stadium.
- Partnered in construction of a new indoor turf facility that accommodates Olympic sports such as baseball, softball, golf, and soccer.
- Renovation of the practice space inside the UI Fieldhouse for the men's and women's gymnastics teams.
- Construction of the James M. Hoak Family Golf Complex for the men's and women's golf programs.
- Installation of FieldTurf on the outdoor football practice fields, matching the playing surface of Kinnick Stadium.
- Design and construction of a new clubhouse and pro shop at Finkbine Golf Course scheduled for completion in 2019.
- Renovation and upgrades for the Gerdin Athletic Learning Center, home to the Ul's Student-Athlete Academic Services staff, scheduled for completion spring 2018.
- Installation of a banked track in the UI Recreation Building, home of UI indoor track programs.
- Stadium upgrades to the baseball (Duane Banks Field) and softball (Bob Pearl Field) facilities.
Olympic sport improvements for soccer, gymnastics, volleyball, field hockey, and several other teams.


## - Fan Support •

- In 2016-17, lowa ranked in the Top 25 in home attendance for football, women's basketball, and men's basketball, while once again leading the nation in wrestling home attendance.
- Iowa ranked 20th in the nation in football home attendance in $2016(69,656)$
- lowa ranked in the Top 25 in the nation in men's basketball home attendance in 2016-17 $(12,548)$.
lowa ranked 19th in the nation in women's basketball home attendance in 2016-17 $(4,395)$.
- lowa led the nation in wrestling home attendance in 2016-17 $(10,591)$. The Hawkeyes have led the nation in attendance for the 11 straight seasons.


## - Personal •

As the director of athletics at the University of Wyoming for three years, seven different Wyoming coaches were named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year. Barta spearheaded a fundraising effort that netted the Cowboy athletics program $\$ 11$ million in private support and $\$ 11$ million in matching state funds.

- As the senior associate athletics director at the University of Washington, he directed the "Campaign for the Student-Athlete," was a participant in the design, construction and/ or renovation of several Washington athletics facilities, including Bank of America Arena and the Dempsey Indoor Practice Facility. In addition to almost doubling the amount of annual private support received by Washington, Barta also managed the department's external relations division, a task that included managing corporate sponsorship and radio contracts. His responsibilities at Washington expanded over time to include hiring coaching and administrative staff, and the day-to-day oversight of several Huskie sport teams.
- The roots of his development experience extend to his first two positions: director of development at his alma mater, North Dakota State University, and director of athletics development and external relations at the University of Northern lowa.
- Barta earned a bachelor of science degree in mass communication and broadcast journalism from North Dakota State in 1987. He was an option quarterback for Bison football squads that won the Division II NCAA National Championship in 1983, 1985, and 1986.
- Barta, and his wife, Connie, have a son, Luke (19), and a daughter, Madison (17). He was born September 4, 1963, in Minneapolis.


## Lisa Bluder <br> Head Coach <br> 18th Year Northern lowa, 1983

Lisa Bluder, the all-time winningest coach in program history, is in her 18th year as head women's basketball coach at the University of Iowa and her 34th year overall. Under her direction, the Hawkeyes have advanced to 16 postseason appearances (12 NCAA and four WNIT) in 17 seasons, including NCAA Tournament berths in eight of the last 10
 seasons. lowa has advanced to the postseason in 10 consecutive seasons (eight NCAA and two WNIT).

The dean of Big Ten coaches, Bluder has posted a 343-202 (.629) record at lowa and her 33-year record stands at 699-344 (.670). Bluder surpassed Hall of Famer C. Vivian Stringer ( 269 wins) as the all-time winningest coach in program history on Feb. 10, 2014, as the Hawkeyes defeated Northwestern, 90-84.

Bluder, one-of-10 active Division I coaches with 699 or more wins, is a three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year (2001, 2008 and 2010) and two-time WBCA Regional Coach of the Year (2001 and 2008). She has guided lowa to a winning record in 16 of her 17 years at lowa, including 11 upper-division finishes in the challenging Big Ten Conference. Bluder, who ranks second among Big Ten coaches all-time in league victories (168), has led lowa to 10, 20-win seasons in her 17 years, including eight of the last 10 years.

Bluder has coached numerous players to different awards in her 17 years in lowa City. She has mentored 20 players to 49 All-Big Ten honors, including 14 first team picks, 16 second, 11 third and eight honorable mention selections. She has also had two Big Ten Freshman of the Year award winners, two Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year recipients, nine members of the Big Ten All-Freshman team and three players named to the Big Ten All-Defensive team, with Kachine Alexander earning the honor twice.

Five players during Bluder's tenure have earned a total of seven Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) all-region team accolades and six players have earned a total of 11 honorable mention All-America honors. Bluder coached her first consensus All-American in Samantha Logic, who earned the honor after being named a WBCA Division I Coaches All-American, USBWA All-American, ESPN Second Team All-American, and Third Team Associated Press All-American. Logic -- the only player in NCAA history to accumulate at least 1,500 career points, 800 rebounds, 800 assists, and 200 steals -- was one of 12 players in the country to be invited to attend the 2015 WNBA Draft. The point guard was selected with the 10th pick in the first round by the Atlanta Dream, and was later traded to the San Antonio Stars. Logic is only the second first round draft pick in Hawkeye history, joining Toni Foster (1997 by the Phoenix Mercury -- 8th pick).

With Bluder on the lowa sidelines, student-athletes have been named Academic All-Big Ten 86 times, including a program-best eight honorees in 2011 and 2012. The 86 honorees equal the third-highest total in the Big Ten during the last 17 years.

Ally Disterhoft was named the CoSIDA Academic All-America of the Year for the second consecutive season in 2017. She is the fifth scholarathlete to win the prestigious award in back-to-back years since its inception in 1987-88 and the second Big Ten athlete to accomplish the feat. Disterhoft also became lowa's first three-time Academic All-American, as she was named to the third team as a sophomore in 2015 and the first team in 2016 and 2017. Lindsey Meder was the first two-time Academic All-American (2001 and 2002). Samantha Logic also earned Academic All-American distinction in 2015. Iowa is the only Division I women's basketball team to have two student-athletes honored, as Disterhoft was the lone sophomore included on the list.

Bluder led the Hawkeyes to a 20-14 overall record and an 8-8 mark in the Big Ten in 2016-17. In its 10th straight postseason tournament appearance, the Hawkeyes advanced to the WNIT Quarterfinals with wins over Missouri State, South Dakota, and Colorado. Senior Ally Disterhoft and sophomore Megan Gustafson each earned first team AllBig Ten accolades, while freshman Kathleen Doyle became the fourth Hawkeye in as many years to be named to the All-Freshman Team.

With 21 points against Missouri State on March 16, 2017, Disterhoft became lowa's new all-time leading scorer. Disterhoft surpassed Cindy Haugejorde's previous record of 2,059 (1976-80) with four minutes and six seconds left in the four quarter. Disterhoft ended her career with 2,102 points, the second-most by any Hawkeye -- male or female. She ended her career ranked among the top-15 in Hawkeye history in five categories; including career points, 3-point field goals, blocks, rebounds, and assists. She was named lowa's Female Athlete of the Year for 2015-16 and 2016-17, becoming the sixth Hawkeye in school history to earn the honor twice in her collegiate career. She is also the ninth Hawkeye to earn lowa's Big Ten Medal of Honor and be named Female Athlete of the Year in the same season.

Sophomore Megan Gustafson made history in 2016-17. The Port Wing, Wisconsin, native became lowa's single-season rebounding record holder with 10 rebounds against Missouri State on March 16, 2017. She surpassed former Hawkeye Amy Herrig's record of 306 (1998-99). Gustafson also became just the fourth Hawkeye in program history to score 600 or more points in a single season. She ended the season with 628 points, 343 rebounds, and 18 double-doubles. Gustafson ranked among the NCAA top-30 in seven categories, including field goal percentage ( 5 th; 64.7 ), double-doubles ( 10 th; 18 ), field goals made ( 11 th; 260 ), rebounds (11th; 343), rebounds per game (11th; 10.1), defensive rebounds per game ( 26 th; 7 ), and final points ( 28 th; 628 ).

The Hawkeyes made their ninth consecutive postseason appearance, earning an invitation to the WNIT after finishing the season with a 19-14 record overall and an 8-10 mark in Big Ten play. lowa entered the Big Ten Tournament as the No. 9 seed, where it posted an opening win against No. 8 seed Michigan, 97-85. In the contest, the team matched Big Ten Tournament records with 28 assists, 27 field goals, and 12 blocked shots and netted a season-high 97 points, the third-highest point total for a conference team in the tournament.

Junior Ally Disterhoft earned her second straight second team All-Big Ten honor and received the team's Sportsmanship Award. The preseason All-Big Ten pick by coaches scored in double figures in every game this season and became the 34th member of lowa's 1,000 point club. Disterhoft, who was named to the Big Ten Player of the Week Honor Roll twice, became the program's highest scoring junior (565 points) and led the Hawkeyes offensively, averaging 17.1 points per game.

Tania Davis and Megan Gustafson were each named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. It is the fifth time in 15 years that a conference team has had two players named to the Big Ten All-Freshman squad and the first time since 2008. Davis was one of two Big Ten freshmen to lead her team in assists per game (3.4) and average at least one steal per game (1.2). She dished out 111 assists in 22 games played, the second-highest total recorded by a freshman at lowa (Samantha Logic - 136). Gustafson is the only freshman and one of three conference players overall to lead her team in field goal percentage (.554), rebounds (225), and blocks (58). She compiled nine double-doubles in the last 13 games of the season and earned lowa's first Big Ten Freshman of the Week honor since 2012 on Feb. 22. Her 58 blocks is the third-highest total recorded by a freshman in program history.

Iowa made history in 2014-15, earning its sixth Sweet Sixteen appearance in program history and the first since 1996. The Hawkeyes defeated 14th-seeded American (75-67) in the first round of the NCAA Tournament before downing 11th-seeded Miami (88-70) in the second round to secure their Sweet Sixteen berth at home on Mediacom Court in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. It was the first Sweet Sixteen appearance for Bluder and her staff. The Hawkeyes closed their season with a $26-8$ record overall, a runner-up finish in Big Ten Conference play with a 14-4 mark, and a No. 11 national ranking in the USA Today Top 25 Coaches' Poll -- the highest for the program since 1995-96 (No. 7 in AP, No. 9 in

USA Today). The UI was one of 13 teams nationally to finish undefeated at home with an 18-0 mark, setting a program record for wins at home in a single season.

Following the 2014-15 season, Bluder was honored with the Carol Eckman Award and named head coach of the U.S. Pan American Women's Basketball Team. Bluder led the Red, White, and Blue to four consecutive victories over Brazil, Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, and Cuba, before falling to Pan American Games host Canada in the gold medal game. Team USA earned its fifth silver medal at the games, rebounding from a seventh place finish in 2011.

The Hawkeyes finished the 2013-14 campaign with an overall record of 27-9 and a ranking of No. 19 in the postseason AP Top 25 Poll. The Hawkeyes' 27 victories equaled the second-highest total in program history, and the most since 1996. In addition, lowa's 14 home wins equaled the second-highest single-season total in school history. The Hawkeyes made their seventh-straight NCAA Tournament appearance. lowa, a No. 6 seed in the NCAA Tournament, defeated 11 th-seeded Marist in the First Round, 87-65, marking the fourth-largest margin of victory in an NCAA Tournament win in program history.
lowa earned its sixth-straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2012-13, finishing with a 21-13 overall record. The Hawkeyes faced 11 ranked teams during the season, marking the most games played against ranked opponents in lowa history. The Hawkeyes tied the school record for number of wins over ranked opponents with seven, along with setting school records in team assists (534) and rebounds $(1,303)$.
lowa closed the regular season with eight-straight wins in 201112 , securing a second place finish in the Big Ten and its fifth-straight NCAA Tournament berth. lowa's 11 conference wins were the most since 2001-02 and the fourth-most in school history (during a 16-game conference schedule). The Hawkeyes closed the regular season without their leading scorer, Jaime Printy, who suffered a torn ACL.

Bluder had one of her most successful seasons in 2010-11, leading lowa to a 22-9 overall record and a third place finish in the Big Ten at 10-6. lowa's overall win/loss record in 2010-11 was the best for an lowa team since the 1995-96 campaign. The Hawkeyes were nationally ranked for 14 weeks during the season, reaching No. 14 in the Associated Press Poll and No. 13 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. Iowa received an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament for the fourthstraight season.

In 2009-10, Bluder led one of the youngest teams in the country to a third place finish in the Big Ten and a berth in the championship game of the Big Ten Tournament. The Hawkeyes received an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament, where they knocked off Rutgers in the first round before falling to eventual national runner-up and No. 2 ranked Stanford. lowa finished the 2009-10 season with a 20-14 record, including a 10-8 mark in Big Ten play.

Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to back-to-back 21-11 overall records during the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons. Iowa won a share of the Big Ten regular season championship in 2008 and finished in a three-way tie for second in 2009. The Hawkeyes boasted a 26-5 home record, advanced to the Big Ten Tournament semifinals and appeared in the NCAA Tournament twice during the two-year stretch.

In 2005-06, Bluder guided a young and mostly inexperienced group of Hawkeyes to a 17-12 overall record and a fifth place finish in the Big Ten. Even with a season plagued by knee injuries, the Hawkeyes persevered with strong senior leadership talented play from its freshman class. lowa received an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament.

Bluder mentored lowa to a 23-10 overall record and advanced to the WNIT Final Four in 2004-05. Iowa started the 2004-05 campaign 13-0 and were the last Division I undefeated team standing. Bluder navigated the Hawkeyes through a difficult schedule and ultimately finished the season ranked 38th in the RPI.

In 2003-04, Bluder and the Hawkeyes finished with a 16-13 record while playing the 14th most difficult schedule in the nation and tied for fourth in the league with a 10-6 mark. In addition, eight of its 16 victories came on the road, marking the most road wins by a Hawkeye team since the 1993-94 season.

Bluder helped her third lowa team to another exciting run in the Big Ten Tournament and WNIT in 2002-03. The seventh-seeded Hawkeyes opened the league tournament with a win over Northwestern. In the quarterfinals, lowa treated its fans to a thrilling upset over 13thranked and second-seeded Minnesota. The Hawkeyes opened postseason play with wins over Saint Louis and Marquette before falling the Missouri Valley Conference co-champions Creighton Bluejays in the WNIT.

In 2001-02, Bluder coached the Hawkeyes to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year and a fourth place finish in the Big Ten. lowa finished with an 18-11 overall record and a 10-6 mark in league play.

In her first season with the Black and Gold, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. lowa received the Big Ten's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament with a victory over Purdue to capture the 2001 Big Ten Tournament. Furthermore, the Hawkeyes advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after receiving a No. 4 seed and finished the season ranked No. 16 in the final Associated Press poll. Competing in one of the most demanding conference in the country, Bluder directed the Hawkeyes to a 21-10 overall record, a sec-ond-place finish in the conference regular season and captured lowa's second-ever Big Ten Tournament title. Iowa played the 16th toughest schedule in the country and finished the season ranked 18th in the RPI.
"Our success has always been based on playing up-tempo basketball," said Bluder. "We want to put lots of points on the board. The fast break is our number one offense. That type of basketball is exciting for fans and its fun for our players. When we do get into a half court game, everyone has a role. Our goal is to have four or five players averaging in double figures. We want everyone involved. Defensively, we work hard at never letting anything be easy for our opponent. We play tough play-er-to-player defense hoping to capitalize on steals to set up our break."

Her presence on the lowa sidelines turned heads across the country. Virginia and USA Basketball Head Coach Debbie Ryan chose Bluder to help coach Team USA as an assistant coach at the 2001 World University Games in Beijing, China. Team USA marched into the gold medal game against host-team China and won 87-69. Team USA finished the games with a 7-1 mark.
"This was a new experience for me," Bluder said after winning the gold medal. "Just to reach the gold medal game was a thrill. It's something I will always remember. What I think is really wonderful about this experience is each game I felt like Team USA improved. I was honored to be chosen to represent the United States and experience international coaching for the first time."

Bluder has reached several coaching milestones while at lowa. During her first season, she collected her 200th victory at the Division I level when the Hawkeyes defeated Minnesota. She garnered win No. 300 at the Division I level with lowa's regular season finale win over Indiana in 2006. During her third season, Bluder captured career No. 400 in lowa's triumph over lowa State. Bluder won career game No. 500 vs. Penn State on Feb. 10, 2008 and No. 600 vs. Purdue on Jan. 20, 2013. Bluder surpassed Hall of Famer C. Vivian Stringer ( 269 wins) as the all-time winningest coach in program history on Feb. 10, 2014.

During her tenure at lowa, five former players have gone on to become coaches at the collegiate level. Cara Consuegra (Charlotte) and Jennie (Lillis) Baranczyk (Drake) are currently Division I head coaches. Randi Peterson is the head coach at Coe College; Kachine Alexander is an assistant at Concordia (St. Paul) and Wendy Ausdemore served as an assistant at Coe for one season.

Thirteen former Hawkeyes under Bluder continued their playing careers professionally after graduation. Cara Consuegra, Lindsey Meder, Crystal Smith, Kachine Alexander, and Samantha Logic all had stints in the WNBA. Smith, Alexander, Logic, Bethany Doolittle, Johanna Solverson, Kristi Smith, Megan Skouby, JoAnn Hamlin, Trisha Nesbitt, Morgan Johnson and Theairra Taylor also played professionally in Europe.

Bluder, alongside her husband David and daughter Hannah, was introduced as the Hawkeyes' fifth head coach in front of a packed press room in Carver-Hawkeye Arena on April 7, 2000. The native of Marion, lowa, came to lowa after spending 10 successful seasons at Drake Uni-
versity.
Bluder compiled a 187-106 (.638) record at Drake in 10 seasons and a 169-36 (.824) record in six seasons at NAIA St. Ambrose University.

In her 10 years as Drake University women's basketball coach, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus-win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times at Drake.

Bluder's 1999-2000 Drake squad registered a 23-7 record. The Bulldogs won both the MVC regular-season and tournament titles and earned the school's fourth trip to the NCAA Tournament under Bluder.

The 1997-98 team finished the season 25-5, Bluder's best record at Drake, and won the MVC regular-season title, recording Drake's best conference finish with a 17-1 record. The Bulldogs also won the MVC Tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the third time in four years. She was named the MVC Coach of the Year for the second straight year as Drake was ranked No. 22 in the final Associated Press ranking.

In 1998-99, Drake posted a 21-10 record in the MVC. It marked the fourth time in five years the Bulldogs reached the 20-win plateau, while advancing to the semifinals of the WNIT Tournament.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose University, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder recorded a 169-36 (.824) mark and guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

While at Drake, she coached two Academic All-America Players of the Year in current Hawkeye associate head coach Jan Jensen (1991) and Tricia Wakely (1996). As a team, the Bulldogs ranked fourth in 1995 graduation rate success among teams ranked in the USA Today/CNN final top- 25 Coaches' Poll. While at lowa, Lindsey Meder became the first Hawkeye women's basketball player to be named a first team Verizon Academic All-American. Wendy Ausdemore, a 2009 graduate, and Morgan Johnson, a 2013 graduate, were two-time Academic All-District honorees.

Student-athletes who have played under Bluder and completed their eligibility have a 100 percent job placement following their career, and all of them have earned their degrees.

Bluder's successful coaching record speaks for itself, however her commitment to her players extends far beyond the records book.

During the summer of 2003, Bluder was elected Division I Midwest Representative of the WBCA Board of Directors. She has also served on the WBCA Kodak All-American selection committee for four terms and the Midwest Regional Advisory Committee for the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championships.
"My players are truly an extension of my family," said Bluder. "I care about them in all aspects of their lives. I want to help them succeed as athletes, but especially as people. I have an open-door relationship with my players. Hopefully, they benefit from my perspective as their coach, as a former athlete and as a mother. They can come to me with anything and get help. Along with that aspect, I consider myself a disciplinarian. I don't have a lot of rules, but I do have a lot of expectations. Those revolve around moral and ethical values that are the foundation of our program."

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, lowa, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern lowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing. On Sept. 4, 2008, Bluder was inducted to the Linn-Mar Athletic Hall of Fame. She has also been inducted to the Northern lowa and St. Ambrose Hall of Fame.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (19) and Emma (16) and one son, David (14).

## Jan Jensen

## Associate Head Coach 18th Year <br> Drake, 1991

Jan Jensen completed her 17th season with the lowa women's basketball staff in 2017 and her 14th as associate head coach. A nationally known presence on the recruiting scene, Jensen serves as the recruiting coordinator and also works with the post players. Jensen completed her 28th season in women's college basketball as a player and coach in 2016.

The native of Kimballton, lowa, has helped guide lowa to 16 postseason appearances, including 12 NCAA Tournament berths. lowa has appeared in the postseason in each of the last 10 seasons (eight NCAA and two WNIT). During her time at lowa, the Hawkeyes have claimed the 2001 Big Ten Tournament championship and the 2008 Big Ten regular season title. She has also helped lead lowa to 11 upper division finishes in the Big Ten and its first trip to the Sweet Sixteen since 1996 in 2015.

Jensen is integral in developing and maintaining top-level recruiting classes at lowa. Jensen helped lowa land the 11 th best recruiting class in the country in 2011, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. In 2001, Jensen spearheaded lowa's efforts in landing the eighth-best recruiting class in the nation according to the Blue Star Index. In 2008, Jensen and the Hawkeyes garnered the 33rd best recruiting class, according to ESPN HoopGurlz, and in 2014, lowa landed the 28th-best class nationally, according to Blue Star Basketball. Iowa followed its Sweet Sixteen season with a 17th-best class ranking nationally in 2015 by ESPN HoopGurlz. Most recently, Jensen solidified in the 18th-best class of 2016, according to Blue Star Basketball.

Jensen has recruited three McDonald's All-Americans to Iowa (Samantha Logic, Lindsay Richards and Johanna Solverson).

Under Jensen's tutelage, Hawkeye post players have received numerous honors. She has coached eight players to a total of 16 All-Big Ten honors, including three first team selections. Megan Skouby was named the 2006 Big Ten Freshman of the Year and the 2008 Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year, while Jennie Lillis was a 2003 Kodak All-District selection. Skouby, along with Krista VandeVenter, were also invited to the U.S.A. Team Trials during their time at lowa.

Most recently, Jensen mentored sophomore Megan Gustafson to first team All-Big Ten honors in 2017. Gustafson also earned Big Ten All-Freshman accolades in 2016. Gustafson finished the season ranked fifth nationally in field goal percentage (64.7), 10th in double-doubles (18), 11th in field goals made (260) and rebounds (343), 25th in rebounds per game (10.1), 26th in defensive rebounds per game (7), and 28th in final points (628). Gustafson set a new single-season rebounding record against Missouri State on March 16, 2017. She ended the season with 343 rebounds, shattering the previous record of 206 set by Amy Herrig in 1999. Gustafson became the fourth Hawkeye in program history to score over 600 points in a single season and the first to accomplish the feat since 1990.

Jensen guided Bethany Doolittle to back-to-back second team All-Big Ten honors and Big Ten All-Tournament Team accolades in 2014 and 2015. She ended her career second all-time in blocks (278) and is the single-season blocks leader (106). In the

Big Ten, Doolittle is eighth in career blocks.
Jensen coached Morgan Johnson to numerous accolades, including two second team All-Big Ten honors. Under Jensen's guidance, Johnson became lowa's career blocks leader and finished inside the top 10 in career scoring and rebounds at lowa.

In 2014, Jensen coached Bethany Doolittle to second-team All-Big Ten and All-Defensive team honors, as Doolittle set a new program single-season record for blocks (106) while leading the conference in the category.

In 2009-10, lowa's post players broke school records for rebounding and blocked shots. Morgan Johnson broke the school mark for single-season blocks, while the team broke the school record for single-season rebounding.

Before becoming a Hawkeye, Jensen also served as Coach Bluder's first assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Drake University. Her recruiting efforts were enough to land the Bulldogs two top-13 and two top-40 classes.

As a player, Jensen was one of the best Bluder ever coached at Drake. During her senior year, she led the nation in scoring with 29.6 points per game and was the Gateway Conference Most Valuable Player. That year, she was a Kodak Honorable Mention All-American, a member of the All-Gateway team and the GTE Academic All-American Player of the Year. Jensen was also Sports Illustrated's National Player of the Week.

She currently ranks fourth on Drake's all-time scoring list $(1,996)$, sixth in field goal percentage (.535) and eighth in rebounds (.750). Jensen is one of only two Drake players to have her number retired in the Knapp Center.

After college, Jensen played professionally in the European Professional Basketball League for BTV-Wuppertal in Germany. She played there from 1992-93 and helped her club win the German Club Championship. She then returned to the United States to begin her coaching career.

In 1993, Jensen was inducted to the lowa Girls High School Basketball Hall of Fame after leading the nation in scoring, averaging 66 points per contest her senior campaign. Couple that with averaging 29.6 points per game her senior year at Drake, Jensen is one of the few players who can say they led the nation in scoring both in high school and at a Division I university.

Jensen graduated from Drake in 1991 with a degree in Public Relations. She earned her Master's in Higher Education five years later.

In February 2007, Jensen received the Drake Double D Award. The award is presented annually to Drake letterwinners for achievements in their chosen field or endeavor and/or community service since leaving Drake. The Double D Award is the highest honor Drake bestows on its student-athletes.

Off the court, Jensen is a leader in fundraising for the United Way of Johnson County. The 2006 campaign totaled over \$2 million -- with a nine percent increase in donations and a 9.7 percent increase in the number of donations. In 2006, she was a recipient of the Corridor Business Journal Forty Under 40 Award. In March 2007, Jensen was named the United Way of Johnson County Volunteer of the Year for her leadership of the Emerging Philanthropists Society and the Healthy Kids School-based Clinics Initiative. She served as a co-chair for this year's United Way fundraising campaign -- the campaign totaled over $\$ 2.5$ million -- and has served on the United Way board and the Shelterhouse board, in addition to working with other groups in the lowa City community.

In the spring of 2014, Jensen was named a recipient of the 'Women of Influence' Award by the Corridor Business Journal. The 'Women of Influence' awards identify women who have made a difference in the Corridor and who are representative role models as leaders in their fields and community.

Jensen and her partner Julie Fitzpatrick, have a son, Jack, and a daughter, Janie.

## Jenni Fitzgerald

Associate Head Coach 18th Year
Drake, 1990
Jenni Fitzgerald enters her 18th year as an assistant basketball coach at the University of lowa and her first year as associate head coach in 2017. Fitzgerald is in her 31st season in women's college basketball as a player and coach.

The native of Long Grove, lowa, has helped guide lowa to 16 postseason appearances, including 12 NCAA Tournament berths. lowa has earned 10 consecutive postseason invitations (eight NCAA and two WNIT). During her time at lowa, the Hawkeyes have claimed the 2001 Big Ten Tournament championship and the 2008 Big Ten regular season title. She has also helped lead lowa to 11 upper division finishes in the Big Ten, and its first Sweet Sixteen appearance since 1996 in 2015.

Fitzgerald is responsible for off-campus recruiting and coaches the perimeter players for the Hawkeyes. She also handles most of the film breakdown, scouting and directs the summer basketball camps.

Under Fitzgerald's tutelage, lowa's perimeter players have garnered numerous awards. She has coached 13 players to a total of 29 All-Big Ten honors, including 10 first team selections and the 2010 Big Ten Freshman of the Year (Jaime Printy). Melissa Dixon was also named Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year in 2013. Fitzgerald has also mentored six players that received all-district honors and four honorable mention All-Americans (Cara Consuegra, Kachine Alexander, Printy, and Samantha Logic). In 2016, freshman Tania Davis was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team.

Fitzgerald coached her first consensus All-American in Samantha Logic, who earned the honor after being named a WBCA Division I Coaches All-American, USBWA All-American, ESPN Second Team All-American, and Third Team Associated Press AllAmerican. Logic -- the only player in NCAA history to accumulate at least 1,500 career points, 800 rebounds, 800 assists, and 200 steals -- was one of 12 players in the country to be invited to attend the 2015 WNBA Draft. The point guard was selected with the 10th pick in the first round by the Atlanta Dream, and was later traded to the San Antonio Stars. Logic is only the second first round draft pick in Hawkeye history, joining Toni Foster (1997 by the Phoenix Mercury -- 8th pick).

The Hawkeyes have broken numerous school records during Fitzgerald's time at lowa. In 2009-10, lowa shattered both the single season and Big Ten record for three-pointers made and attempted and tied single season marks for assists, threepointers made in a single game and free throw percentage. lowa set the school record for team assists in 2012-13 (534), before shattering the record in 2013-14 (644). The Hawkeyes also set the school record for scoring offense in 2013-14 (78.2), leading the league in scoring while scoring the second-most points in a season in Big Ten history $(2,814)$. For the second consecutive season, the Hawkeyes broke the scoring offense school record
averaging 79.5 points per game in 2014-15. Melissa Dixon was crowned the NCAA statistical champion in 2014-15 after leading all Division I players in 3-point field goals per game (3.65). She is the lowa record holder in career 3-pointers made (334), 3-pointers made in a season (124), and 3-pointers made in a game (10). Dixon also set or tied arena records for most 3-pointers in a game in at least five venues this season (Drake, Rutgers, Illinois, Northwestern, lowa). Individually, Wendy Ausdemore broke or tied seven school records in her four years at lowa while Kristi Smith became the first Hawkeye ever to amass over 400 points and 100 assists in three seasons. In 2009-10, Kachine Alexander set new school records in free throws made and attempted in a single season, Kamille Wahlin tied the school record for threepointers made and set a new mark for three-pointers attempted and also became the first player in school history to record 400 career assists and 200 made 3-pointers. Kachine Alexander became the first player in school history, and just the fifth in Big Ten history, to collect 1,000 career points, 800 career rebounds and 300 career assists. Jaime Printy finished her career ranked inside the top 10 in points, 3 -pointers made and assists at lowa, while also setting numerous single-game, season and career free throw marks.

All-American Samantha Logic surpassed Cara Consuegra (1997-2001) as lowa's all-time assists leader and became the 31st 1,000-point scorer in program history during the 2013-14 campaign. Logic, the Big Ten leader in assists, notched three tripledoubles, becoming the first Big Ten player to record three tripledoubles in a single season.

Four former Hawkeye guards that Fitzgerald coached continued their playing careers in the WNBA, including Cara Consuegra, Lindsey Meder, Crystal Smith, Kachine Alexander, and Samantha Logic.

Fitzgerald is very familiar with both Lisa Bluder and fellow assistant Jan Jensen, both of whom she coached with for eight years at Drake University prior to coming to lowa.

While at Drake, Fitzgerald worked with the guards, directed summer camps and handled the administrative duties for the Bulldog basketball program from 1993-2000.

From 1986-91, Fitzgerald was the starting point guard for the Drake Bulldogs. She was a teammate of fellow Hawkeye assistant coach Jan Jensen. As a senior, Fitzgerald served as her team's captain and was named to the All-Gateway Conference first team. As a junior, Fitzgerald was her team's Most Valuable Player.

Fitzgerald graduated from Drake in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in business administration with a management major. In January 2009, Fitzgerald was one of three former Drake stu-dent-athletes to receive the Drake Double D Award. The award is presented annually to Drake letterwinners for achievements in their chosen field or endeavor and/or community service since leaving Drake. The Double D Award is the highest honor Drake bestows on its student-athletes.

After graduation, Fitzgerald completed her Master of Science degree in Physical Education, with an emphasis in Sport Management, from Southern Illinois University in 1992. While at Southern Illinois, Fitzgerald was a graduate assistant with the Salukis.

In high school, Fitzgerald was lowa's Female Athlete of the Year in 1986 after being named Miss Basketball and first team all-state in basketball, volleyball and softball. In 1995, she was inducted into the lowa Girl's Basketball Hall of Fame.

Fitzgerald is the daughter of Bob and Jan Fitzgerald. She has an older sister, Robin, and younger brother, Randy.

## Raina Harmon <br> Assistant Coach <br> 1st Year <br> Central Michigan, 2004

Raina Harmon was named assistant women's basketball coach at the University of lowa, head coach Lisa Bluder announced May 30, 2017.

Harmon spent the last five seasons (2012-2017) as an
 assistant coach at Central Michigan where her primary responsibilities included perimeter player development, academics, and scouting. In Harmon's five years at CMU, the Chippewas registered a combined 99-61 overall record. The Detroit native helped guide CMU to a 2017 Mid-American Conference (MAC) Regular Season Championship, 2013 MAC Championship, three MAC West titles $(2014,2016,2017)$, an NCAA Tournament berth (2013), and three WNIT appearances.

Prior to her stint at CMU, Harmon served as the Director of Women's Basketball Operations at Michigan from 2010-12, where she assisted the coaching staff with all administrative aspects of the program. Before Michigan, Harmon spent a season as an assistant varsity girls basketball coach at Martin Luther King Jr. Senior High School in Detroit.

Harmon played for Central Michigan from 2001-04. In 2003, she received the Dee Pommerenk Sportsmanship Award. Harmon also served as the president of the student-athlete advisory committee in 2003-04.

Harmon earned a bachelor's degree in sports studies from CMU in 2004. She earned her master's degree in sports administration from Wayne State in 2009.

Abby (Emmert) Stamp Director of Player Development 9th Year<br>lowa, 2008

Abby (Emmert) Stamp is in her ninth year with the lowa women's basketball program. After spending eight seasons as lowa's director of operations,
 Stamp was promoted to director of player development in 2017.

The Winterset, lowa, native works closely with lowa student-athletes, helping them develop into strong leaders and role models in the lowa City community. Stamp assists the basketball staff in the day-to-day activities of the program.

Stamp is also lowa's chief scheduler, helping to build one of the most exciting and demanding schedules in the country for the Hawkeye program.

Stamp was a member of the lowa women's basketball team from 2005-08. She was named team co-captain in 2008, and helped lead the Hawkeyes to a Big Ten regular season championship. Stamp also received the Dr. Christine Grant Leadership Award for women's basketball as a senior.

Stamp played in 123 career games as a Hawkeye, including 22 starts. Her 123 games played are the tied for the fourth-most of any player in lowa women's basketball history.

She scored 299 career points, collected 144 rebounds and dished out 177 assists. She scored a career-high 17 points against lowa State as a junior in 2006.

Stamp graduated with a communications studies degree from the University of lowa in 2008, and worked for the United Way of East Central lowa before taking

Reynolds graduated with a business management degree from the University of lowa in 2015 and earned her Law Degree from the University of lowa in 2017 before taking over as director of basketball operations.

## 1986-87 (26-5, 17-1)

The 1986-87 team won its first Big Ten Championship when the Hawkeyes claimed a share of the title with a 17-1 conference record. The team would go on and advance to the Elite Eight in the NCAA Tournament.

## 1987-88 (29-2, 17-1)

The 1987-88 Hawkeyes won their first outright Big Ten Championship with a 17-1 regular season conference mark. The team finished the season ranked No. 2 in the final Associated Press poll.

## 1988-89 (27-5, 16-2)

In 1988-89, the Hawkeyes claimed a share of the Big Ten Championship with a 15-3 mark. This group of Hawkeyes would extend its home winning streak to 41 games, the second-longest in the nation at the time.

## 1989-90 (23-6, 15-3)

During the 1989-90 season, the Hawkeyes won a share of the Big Ten Championship with a 15-3 conference record. The Hawkeyes finished the season ranked No. 10 in the final Associated Press poll.

## 1991-92 (25-4, 16-2)

The 1991-92 Hawkeyes won the Big Ten Championship outright with a 16-2 conference record. lowa finished the season ranked No. 7 in the AP poll.

## 1992-93 (27-4, 16-2)

With a 16-2 conference record, lowa claimed a share of the Big Ten title during the 1992-93 season. This special group of Hawkeyes would go on to become the only lowa team to advance to the Final Four.

1995-96 (27-4, 15-1)
The 1995-96 Hawkeyes finished with a 15-1 mark to win their seventh Big Ten title. This group of Hawkeyes finished the season ranked No. 7 in the AP poll.

## 1997 Big Ten Tournament (18-12, 9-7)

The 1996-97 Hawkeyes finished fourth in the Big Ten during the regular season and needed to win the Big Ten Tournament in order to advance to the NCAA Tournament. lowa defeated Northwestern, Indiana and IIlinois to win its first Big Ten Tournament title.

## 1997-98 (18-11, 13-3)

lowa's 1997-98 squad finished the regular season with a 13-3 conference mark to secure its eighth Big Ten Championship. The team finished the season ranked No. 24 in the final Associated Press poll.

## 2001 Big Ten Tournament (21-10, 12-4)

In Lisa Bluder's first year at lowa, the 2000-01 Hawkeyes finished second in the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes knocked off Indiana, Illinois and Purdue to win the first Big Ten Tournament crown under Bluder.

## 2007-08 (21-11, 13-5)

In 2008, lowa won a share of the Big Ten regular season championship, its ninth in school history. The Hawkeyes won a Big Ten-season-best eight-straight during league play.

## Michelle Edwards (1984-88)

A native of Boston, and a Class of 2014 Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductee, Michelle Edwards is one of the most decorated players in lowa women's basketball history. The 5-foot-9 guard, nicknamed "Ice", amassed a career record of 97-22 from 19841988. During her four years, Edwards led the Hawkeyes to three NCAA Tournament appearances and two Big Ten titles. In 1988, she was named the Champion Products National Player of the Year, the highest honor in women's collegiate basketball. Edwards garnered several other honors that year including being named a Kodak All-American, a Naismith AllAmerican, a USBWA All-American, the Big Ten Player of the Year, and the University of lowa Athlete of the Year. In her senior season, Edwards also led lowa to its first ever national No. 1 ranking, along with a record of 29-2 overall and 17-1 in the Big Ten. She paced the Hawkeyes, averaging 20 points, 4.8 rebounds, 4.5 assists, and 2.9 steals. The three-time first team All-Big Ten selection is the only Hawkeye to have her jersey retired (No. 30). Edwards ranks high in several lowa statistical categories, including third in career assists (431), fourth in career scoring ( 1,821 ), and third in career steals (235). She also ranks second among single season scoring leaders (621). Edwards -- inducted into the University of Iowa Athletics Hall of Fame in 2000 -- played in the National Olympic Festival in 1985 and was a member of the U.S. Select Team in 1986. In 1991, she was part of the United States Pan American Team, and she also competed in the U.S. Olympic Trials in 1988 and 1992. Upon graduation, Edwards played professionally in Italy for nine seasons before joining the WNBA during its inaugural year in 1997. She then spent three seasons with the Cleveland Rockers and two seasons with the Seattle Storm.

## Franthea Price (1986-90)

Franthea Price -- a 2013 National lowa Varsity Club Athletics Hall of Fame inductee -- played for the Hawkeyes from 1986-1990, and in her senior season, she became the second Kodak All-American in school history. The four-year starter from River Rouge, Mich., had an impressive career at lowa, which began with her being named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1987. Price was named first team All-Big Ten in 1988 and 1990, and second team All-Big Ten in 1989. In her senior year, Price earned the honor of Big Ten Player of the Year and led the conference in scoring at 19.8 points per game. The 5 -foot- 9 forward led the Hawkeyes in several statistical categories that year including scoring (21.2), rebounding (7.1), steals (2.9), and 3-point field goals (47). A consistent contributor, Price scored in double figures in 34 of her last 35 games. She holds the school record for career steals with 321, and is tied for first for most steals in a single game with nine. Price also ranks sixth in career scoring $(1,742)$, eighth in career assists (387), and 11th in career rebounds (726). Outside of lowa, Price was a member of the U.S. World Junior National Team in 1986 and competed in the National Olympic Festival in 1985 and 1986. In 1987, Price won a gold medal as part of the United States William R. Jones Cup team, and she was a member of the United States Select team in 1989. Price also competed in the U.S. Olympic Trials in 1988. After finishing her career at lowa, Price played professionally in Spain for several years before joining the WNBA's Sacramento Monarchs in 1998.

## Toni Foster (1989-93)

A 6-foot-1 forward from Chicago, Toni Foster was named a Kodak All-American in 1993 and was a finalist for Champion Player of the Year. Foster played for the Hawkeyes from 1989-1993, and led the team in both scoring and rebounding for three consecutive years, a feat accomplished only once previously. A three-time first team All-Big Ten selection, Foster was named the Big Ten Player of the Year in 1993. She was also named the 1993 SportsChannel Player of the Year. During her senior season, Price led lowa in scoring (15.7), rebounding (8.2), and blocked shots (1.3). She collected 27 double-doubles during her illustrious career, including nine in her senior year. In lowa's career statistical categories, Foster ranks third in rebounds (887) and fifth in blocks (145). She also ranks seventh in scoring $(1,606)$ and 13th in steals (167). Foster competed in the National Olympic Festival in 1987 and 1991. When the WNBA was formed in 1997, Foster was the seventh overall pick and was selected by the Phoenix Mercury. She spent two seasons with the Mercury before joining the Seattle Storm in 1999 by way of an expansion draft.

## Samantha Logic (2012-15)

Samantha Logic, a four-year starter for the Hawkeyes from 2012-15, became the fourth consensus AllAmerican in lowa women's basketball history in 2015. Logic, the only player in NCAA history to accumulate at least 1,500 career points, 800 rebounds, 800 assists, and 200 steals, earned All-America accolades from the WBCA, Associated Press, USBWA, and ESPN after leading the Hawkeyes to their first Sweet Sixteen appearance since 1996 and the program's sixth overall. The Racine, Wisconsin, native was named to the Oklahoma City Regional All-Tournament Team after recording her sixth career triple-double against No. 5 Baylor (13 points, 10 rebounds, 14 assists); the feat marks only the 14th triple-double in the history of the NCAA Tournament and her 14 assists are an lowa NCAA Tournament record. Success continued off the court for Logic, who was named a Capital One Academic All-American, won the Senior CLASS Award, and received the Big Ten Medal of Honor in 2015. She also earned three Academic All-Big Ten honors. Logic ends her career second in assists in Big Ten history (Samantha Prahalis of Ohio State is first (901)) and 11th in NCAA History. She ranks first in program history in career assists and starts (135), second in steals (260) and rebounds (922), and 10th in scoring $(1,546)$. Logic led the Big Ten in assists in league play in each of her last three seasons. Her six career triple-doubles mark the second-highest total in the history of NCAA women's basketball, and the most by any player as a member of the Big Ten. She recorded 33 career double-doubles (third-most in program history), dished out double-digit assists 28 times in her career (the most in program history), and started all 135 games of her Hawkeye career. Logic, one of 12 players in the country to be invited to attend the 2015 WNBA Draft in person, was selected as the 10th pick in the first round by the Atlanta Dream. She spent a few months with the Dream before joining the San Antonio Stars. Logic is the second first round WNBA draft pick in program history and the 12th lowa draftee overall.
