### **IN SEARCH OF LUCKY NO. 7**

For the last six years, the University of Iowa women's basketball team has done what no other Big Ten team has: advance to the NCAA Tournament each season.

"We always want to be in the top of the Big Ten, competing for the championship, competing for that Big Ten tournament championship, and be back in the NCAA Tournament," said UI head coach Lisa Bluder, one of 13 active Division I coaches with 600 or more wins. "It is pretty amazing that we have been in six-straight; we are the only Big Ten university to do so. That shows how hard it is to accomplish the stability our program has over the past several years.

"A seventh-straight appearance is something we are striving for. We know how competitive this conference is, but I believe with the focus that I have seen thus far from this team, we can get the job done."

Iowa returns four players with starting experience from a year ago and eight letterwinners, while adding three newcomers.

With only one senior on a squad of 11, and seven underclassmen, a young 2013-14 Hawkeye squad will look to guide the program to a seventh-straight NCAA tournament appearance.

"I love the energy and competitiveness," said Bluder. "They compete hard all the time and are focused. They have taken no possessions off, and I love that about this team. When you can raise the bar like that and learn to compete every single second you are out on the floor, it brings that intensity level up that you need for games and prepares you for games.

"These players carry themselves like champions, and you have to have that mentality."

### **STEPPING INTO NEW ROLES**

The Hawkeyes said good-bye to three mainstays in the program -- Morgan Johnson, Trisha Nesbitt, Jaime Printy -- following the conclusion of the 2013 season. The senior trio combined to appear in 348 career games. Johnson (No. 9) and Printy (No. 3) both finished in the top 10 on Iowa's career scoring list, while Johnson also became the Hawkeyes' all-time career blocks leader.

Now, it is time for a new group to step up and lead the charge. The group is led by lone senior Theairra Taylor and a pair of junior guards.

"Any time you replace four-year starters, it is difficult, but we have not missed a beat because of the people stepping into leadership-type roles," said Bluder. "This is Theairra Taylor's

team and everybody loves her so much, that they want to be successful for her. She has been a great leader for us.

"Samantha Logic as our point guard has been waiting for this opportunity to have this leadership role. She has been doing a tremendous job. Melissa Dixon has picked up her leadership and is always communicating and talking on the floor. We have people stepping up, ready to assume those leadership roles."

### **BACKCOURT**

Anchoring Iowa's backcourt will be senior Theairra Taylor and two all-conference performers in juniors Samantha Logic and Melissa Dixon. Taylor started all 34 games last season, scoring in double figures 12 times. Logic, a 2013 third team All-Big Ten selection, started all 34 games and set the school record for single-season assists (217) -- leading the Big Ten in the category. Dixon led the Hawkeyes in scoring (12.3) during league play a year ago en route to earning the Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year award.

Two Hawkeye newcomers -- freshmen Ally Disterhoft and Alexa Kastanek -- will be called upon in the backcourt.

"Our guard court looks very good," said Bluder. "They can all handle the ball, shoot, get to the rim and play defense. This group of guards is very strong and our freshmen will contribute right off the bat. Ally and Alexa have blended in effortlessly with this group."

Disterhoft (one of 40 high school seniors selected to the 2013 PARADE All-America Girls Basketball Team) and Kastanek (ESPN HoopGurlz Top 100 recruit) were heralded recruits coming out of high school.

"Ally and Alexa are winners," said Bluder. "Both are coming in with state championships on their high school resume."

The added work in the summer has helped the duo acclimate to the Hawkeye program.

"It has been an easy transition to bring them in," said Bluder. "Having time in the gym with our players this summer, which we have never had before, has benefitted those two, and I feel like they are already veterans. They have become a part of this team so easily.

"Both are incredibly versatile players and can play a number of positions. When you can do that, it is easier to get playing time. They are going to give us added depth that we desperately need right now."

Back for the Hawkeyes is Kathryn Reynolds, who missed the entire 2012-13 season due to an ACL injury in her right knee. She played in 21 games as a freshman in 2011-12.



"Kathryn has had a slow recovery since that ACL tear and had some difficulty with her rehab in the healing process," said Bluder. "Soon, she can play some defense, so we're making the move. We are hoping to have her full-strength by the start of Big Ten play."

### **TAKING THE NEXT STEP**

Sophomores Kali Peschel and Claire Till will see action in the middle of the Hawkeye lineup. Both played limited minutes during their rookie campaigns, and Bluder is looking for both to take the next step.

"Those two did not play a lot as freshmen, and there is one of two ways you can go with that," said Bluder. "Sometimes you do not get a lot of minutes as a freshman and you figure that's your lot for the rest of your career here at Iowa. The other way to take it, which both of them have done, is they have used it for motivation."

"They see an opportunity of a place being void because of graduation and our power forward position is open, and they have used it as incredible motivation to show why we recruited them to come here and that they can contribute at this level."

Peschel appeared in 28 games a year ago, and Till saw action in 16.

"Both will be listed as a three or a four, but we run a four-guard offense so there is no real difference in any of our players one through four, except that four takes the ball out of bounds, and the one our primary ball handler," said Bluder. "Once we get initiated in the offense, everybody does the same thing. It is a very versatile offense; you do not need your typical power forward, or off guard, you can just play your best players. That is what makes our offense so hard to guard; you can have any five of your best players out on the floor."

### **FRONTCOURT**

Bethany Doolittle started all 34 games a year ago, ranking fifth in the Big Ten in blocks. The junior will be counted on to lead the Hawkeyes in the paint.

"I foresee Bethany stepping into our starting center position," said Bluder. "Last year, she played the power forward the entire year, which has helped her develop as a complete basketball player. She is more comfortable handling the ball, guarding the perimeter, and shooting the ball from outside."

"Now, she is going back to the position she played most of her life, and being on the outside last year added to her versatility. I think Bethany will be one of the best centers in the Big Ten this year. She has gotten stronger and is more confident. She can

score and knows she can score against anybody, and that is a great confidence level to take into competition."

Sophomore Nicole Smith and freshman walk-on Hailey Schneden will add depth in the post. Smith played in seven contests as a freshman.

"Nicole has made great strides and her hard work over the summer has given her the most confidence she can have this year," said Bluder. "We also brought in a walk-on, Hailey Schneden; she is a welcome addition to our team. She brings an easy-going, brightness to our basketball team. She's eager to learn and works hard."

### **SCHEDULE**

Iowa will play in two familiar nonconference tournaments; the Hawkeye Challenge returns, and Iowa makes another trip to Cancun, Mexico, for the Cancun Challenge. The Hawkeyes will host UC Riverside (regular season home opener) and Dayton -- who has advanced to four-straight NCAA Tournaments -- in the Hawkeye Challenge. Iowa will face USC, Boston College and UNC Wilmington in the Cancun Challenge.

Other nonconference highlights include intra-state rivalry games against Iowa State, Drake and Northern Iowa, a meeting with Syracuse in Iowa City in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, and a trip to NCAA Tournament-qualifier Colorado.

"We play all our in-state rivalries, and those are always intense," said Bluder. "In our own tournament, we are bringing in Dayton, a top-20 women's basketball program. It is wonderful to bring a top-20 program into Carver-Hawkeye Arena, but it will be a battle in our second game of the year."

"Playing at Colorado, a team that was in the NCAA Tournament last year and had an incredible home court winning advantage, will test us," said Bluder. "You do not always get to control who you play in tournaments like the Cancun Challenge. The beauty of that is you get to play good teams on neutral courts, and that has been very good for us in the past. We are playing tough opponents in Cancun again this year."

In Big Ten play, the Hawkeyes will play five league teams twice (Illinois, Indiana, Minnesota, Ohio State, Penn State) and the other six once. Iowa hosts Michigan State, Nebraska and Northwestern, and travels to Michigan, Purdue and Wisconsin.

Six Big Ten teams went dancing in 2013.

"We play in one of the best conferences in America," Bluder said. "We want athletes that want to come here and compete against the very best. They know what they are getting into and welcome it."

### Sally Mason President University of Iowa

Sally Mason became the 20th President of the University of Iowa on August 1, 2007. Trained as a cell developmental biologist, she also holds a full professorship in the Department of Biology in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.



At Iowa, President Mason has spearheaded a sustainable university initiative, making sustainability a central priority of all aspects of the university enterprise. Currently, she is overseeing campus rebuilding in the wake of the historic 2008 flooding, especially the renewal of an arts campus for the 21st century. Under President Mason's leadership, the UI has successfully met the country's recent economic challenges through careful planning, strategic prioritization, and increased efficiency. Other major accomplishments during President Mason's tenure have been a student success initiative that has led to increased enrollment and student retention, as well as an expansion of partnership agreements with Iowa's community colleges in order to offer UI degrees to students throughout the state through on-site and distance learning programs. President Mason successfully advocated for a tuition freeze for resident undergraduate students for the 2013–2014 academic year, the first tuition freeze in thirty years.

The daughter of an immigrant father and the first child in her family to attend college, President Mason received her B.A. in zoology from the University of Kentucky in 1972, her M.S. from Purdue University in 1974, and her Ph.D. in cellular, molecular, and developmental biology from the University of Arizona in 1978. She spent two postdoctoral research years at Indiana University before joining the molecular biosciences faculty at the University of Kansas in 1981, where she received awards for outstanding undergraduate advising and teaching and was awarded a prestigious Kemper Teaching Fellowship. After stints as acting chair of the Department of Physiology and Cell Biology and associate dean in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, in 1995 she won appointment as the dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, the largest academic unit on

the KU campus. President Mason served as provost of Purdue University from 2001–2007, where she was responsible for planning, managing, and reviewing all academic programs at Purdue's West Lafayette campus and four affiliated branch campuses throughout Indiana.

President Mason is the author of many scientific papers and has obtained a number of research grants from the National Science Foundation, the National Institutes of Health, the Wesley Research Foundation, and the Lilly Endowment. Her research interests have focused on the developmental biology, genetics, and biochemistry of pigment cells and pigments in the skin of vertebrates, and she served as president of the PanAmerican Society for Pigment Cell Research. Since 2006, President Mason has been appointed by the President of the United States to three terms on the National Medal of Science President's Committee, including a term as chair. She has also served as chair of the Advisory Committee to the National Science Foundation (NSF) Directorate for Education and Human Resources (EHR) and chair of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) review panel of the NSF Science and Technology Centers Program.

President Mason has held many leadership positions in higher education and national organizations, including president of the Council of Colleges of Arts and Sciences; member of the board of directors of the American Council on Education (ACE); member of the executive committee of the Committee on Institutional Cooperation (CIC); chair of the Iowa Coordinating Council for Post-High School Education (ICCPHSE); and co-chair of the Task Force on National Energy Policy and Midwestern Competitiveness of the Chicago Council on Global Affairs.

Currently, President Mason serves as chair of the Board of Directors Executive Committee of the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU); member of the Board of Trustees of the Universities Research Association; member of the Board of Directors of Campus Compact, the national coalition of college and university presidents committed to fulfilling the civic purposes of higher education; chair of the Big Ten Council of Presidents and Chancellors; member of the Washington Center Council of Presidents; and member of the board of trustees of the Herbert Hoover Presidential Library Association.

President Mason is married to Ken Mason, an educator and textbook author who teaches biology at the University of Iowa.

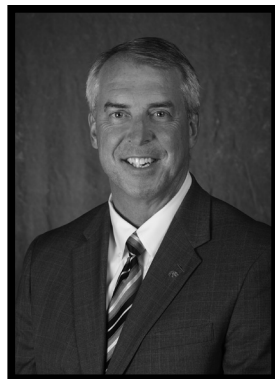

## Gary Barta Director of Athletics University of Iowa



Now in his eighth year as director of athletics at the University of Iowa, Gary Barta continues to provide the UI's more than 600 student-athletes, in addition to more than 225 coaches, administrators and support staff, the strong leadership and strategic vision that is the foundation for the Hawkeyes' success both today and in the future.

Barta often notes, "Hope is not a strategy," and evidence of his commitment to planning and execution is his second strategic plan for the UI Athletics Department. The latest "road map" addresses the next five years for the Hawkeyes and is built on the same core tenets contained in the first: Win. Graduate. Do it right.

The Hawkeyes are coming off a 2012-13 athletics year that saw eight programs participate in national championship competition, a record-setting year in terms of graduation rates – 77 percent, and steady progress in terms of facility improvements, highlighted by the opening of the new indoor practice facility for the UI's football program and the Hoak Family Golf Complex at Finkbine Golf Course, home of the Hawkeyes' men's and women's golf programs.

Under Barta's direction, the UI will continue to put into place the infrastructure that will provide the foundation for competitive success. The 2012-13 basketball season provides an outstanding example of the impact state-of-the-art facilities can have on a program. Boosted by a new practice facility and an enhanced strength and conditioning facility – two pieces of Barta's first strategic plan for the UI – Fran McCaffery's Iowa men's basketball team won 25 games and advanced to the championship game of the 2013 National Invitation Tournament. Lisa Bluder's Iowa women's basketball team earned its sixth consecutive invitation to the NCAA Tournament.

Another example of investments made under Barta's direction that have helped Iowa turn the corner competitively is the UI men's golf program. Barta increased his commitment to the sport when he hired native Iowan Mark Hankins, who had a vision for the program that included a new practice facility. Barta, Hankins and the Hawkeyes celebrated the opening of the new \$6 million Hoak Family Golf Complex in February, just three months before Hankins' nationally ranked squad made its fifth straight appearance in the national regional championships.

Women's basketball and men's golf are two of the eight UI programs that participated in national championship competition in 2012-13. At the top of the list was Tom Brands' wrestling program, which crowned one national champion, had four wrestlers earn All-America honors, and finished fourth nationally at the end of a season that included a Big Ten Conference Dual Meet championship.

JD Reive's men's gymnastics team had three individuals earn All-America honors after finishing fifth at the national meet. Larissa Libby's women's gymnastics program advanced to NCAA regional competition for the sixth straight season.

The Iowa field hockey program under the direction of Tracy Greisbaum advanced to its sixth NCAA Tournament over the last nine years and 22nd in school history – a total that ranks No. 1 among the Hawkeyes' Big Ten Conference peers. Two Hawkeyes were named All-Americans.

Iowa's 200 and 400 medley relay teams and backstroke Grant Betulius earned All-America honors while leading Marc Long's men's swimming and diving team to a 32nd place at the national championship. Larry Wiczorek's UI track and field program crowned eight All-Americans en route to placing 35th at the national outdoor championship.

Interest in the Hawkeyes continues to soar. Sellouts for home games of the football team at historic Kinnick Stadium and a waiting list for access to the premium seating areas inside the Paul W. Brechler Press Box are the norm. So, too, is Iowa leading the country in attendance at home wrestling events -- Iowa averaged just under 9,000 fans per home dual match in 2012-13 -- and being ranked among the nation's Top 20 in attendance in women's basketball.

Success on the court has also resulted in spinning turnstiles for home games of the UI men's basketball team. The Hawkeyes' run to New York City's Madison Square Garden and the NIT championship game included a pair of sold out games on Mediacom Court in 15,400-seat Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Those two sellouts, paired with three regular season sellouts, helped to push Iowa's total average per game to 13,625, an improvement of more than 1,700 per game that has pushed the Hawkeyes into the nation's Top 25 in per game attendance.

Under Barta's leadership, Iowa has also embraced new technologies and that, too, has paid dividends: Iowa ranks among the nation's Top 10 in Facebook "friends"

and Twitter "followers." The UI also delivers Hawk Talk Daily, a daily e-newsletter, and Hawk Talk Monthly, a monthly e-magazine, to more than 70,000 friends of the UI and fans of the Hawkeyes to complement the news, information, video and photography available on hawkeyesports.com, the official world wide web site of the Iowa Hawkeyes and the UI's anchor in the digital world.

Academically, Iowa continues to achieve at a pace that sets the bar across the state and competes favorably with its peers in the Big Ten Conference. UI student-athletes set new records for academic achievement, according to data released by the NCAA in October 2012, as part of its annual report on the work in the classroom by student-athletes across the country.

Student-athletes that entered the UI in the fall of 2005 graduated at a rate of 77 percent, an all-time record for the Hawkeyes. That mark – which uses the federal government benchmark for graduation success – is three points better than the 2011 report when Iowa tied the previous school record of 74 percent set first in 1994-95. It is also six points better than the UI student body and 12 points better than that achieved all by student-athletes nationally.

The UI also set a new record by posting a score of 87 percent in the NCAA's "Graduation Success Rate" or GSR, one point better than what was posted the previous year. It marked the seventh time in the eight years of the GSR's existence that Iowa's student-athletes scored 80 percent or better.

The NCAA's Academic Progress Rate report for 2012-13 revealed that for the fourth consecutive year all of Iowa's 24 sports programs were comfortably above the 930 threshold that signals a red flag for the NCAA. The highlights of Iowa's report include APR's for 18 of Iowa's programs that were better than the national average in that sport, including football, men's basketball and wrestling. The APR for Iowa's football program – 961 – was an all-time best.

As noted, Barta has been the driving force behind substantial investments in the facilities used by Iowa's talented male and female student-athletes. When the Iowa football program moves into its new \$54 million operations center in late summer 2014, the UI will have completed more than \$220 million of construction and renovation work over the previous eight years.

That list of projects includes a \$47 million facelift and addition to Iowa's award-winning Carver-Hawkeye Arena, a project that directly impacted 23 of Iowa's 24 sports programs, two phases of improvements to the facilities used daily by Iowa's football program – construction of a new indoor practice facility and renovation of the Kenyon Outdoor Practice facility in Phase I, and construction of a state-of-the-art operations center in Phase II, a \$9 million investment in scoreboards, ribbon boards, and video walls at historic Kinnick Stadium, construction of the aforementioned \$6 million Hoak Family Golf Complex at Iowa's award-winning Finkbine Golf Course, turf replacement at Grant Field, the home of Iowa's nationally ranked field hockey program, resurfacing of the courts at the Klotz Tennis Center, the home of Iowa's men's and women's tennis programs, and the construction of a new indoor turf facility.

On the horizon for Barta, from a facilities perspective, is the planning and construction of the "Hawkeye Campus." Located on the western edge of the UI campus, immediately west of Finkbine Golf Course and adjacent to the UI's Athletics Hall of Fame, the practice and competition sites for Iowa's soccer and field hockey programs, and the UI Sports Medicine Clinic, and near the UI's Ashton Cross Country Course, the Hawkeye Campus is envisioned to be the new home for Iowa's track and field, softball, and baseball programs.

Barta is a member of the President's Cabinet, comprised of vice presidents and other campus leaders that provide counsel to UI President Sally Mason. That group was instrumental in the UI's response to record-setting flooding that besieged the campus and the Iowa City and Coralville community in June 2008.

As the director of athletics at the University of Wyoming for three years, seven different UW coaches were named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year. He also spearheaded a fund-raising effort that netted the Cowboy athletics program \$11 million in private support and \$11 million in matching state fund.

As the senior associate athletics director at the University of Washington, he directed the "Campaign for the Student-Athlete," was a participant in the design, construction and/or renovation of several UW athletics facilities, including Bank of America Arena and the Dempsey Indoor Practice Facility.

His responsibilities at Washington expanded over time to include hiring of coaching and administrative staff, and the day-to-day oversight of several Huskie sport teams.

The roots of his development experience extend to his first two positions: director of athletics development and external relations at the University of Northern Iowa and director of development at his alma mater, North Dakota State University.

Barta earned a Bachelor of Science degree in mass communication and broadcast journalism from NDSU in 1987. He was an option quarterback for Bison football squads that won the Division II NCAA National Championship in 1983, 1985 and 1986.

Barta, and his wife, Connie, have a son, Luke (15) and a daughter, Madison (13). He was born Sept. 4, 1963, in Minneapolis.





## **Lisa Bluder**

**Head Coach**

**14th Year**

**Northern Iowa, 1983**

Lisa Bluder is in her 14th season as head women's basketball coach at the University of Iowa and her 30th year overall. Under her direction, the Hawkeyes have advanced to 12 postseason appearances (10 NCAA and two WNIT), including NCAA Tournament berths in each of the last six seasons. Iowa is the only team in the Big Ten, and one of just 13 in NCAA Division I women's basketball, to qualify for the NCAA Tournament in each of the last six years.



The dean of Big Ten coaches, Bluder has posted a 251-157 (.615) record at Iowa and her 28-year record stands at 607-299 (.670). Her 251 wins at Iowa are the second-most of any Hawkeye women's basketball coach, behind Hall of Famer C. Vivian Stringer (269 wins).

Bluder is a three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year (2001, 2008 and 2010) and two-time WBCA Regional Coach of the Year (2001 and 2008). She has guided Iowa to a winning record in 12 of her 13 years at Iowa, including nine upper-division finishes in the challenging Big Ten Conference. Bluder has led Iowa to seven 20-win seasons in her 13 years, including five of the last six years.

Bluder has coached numerous players to different awards in her 11 years in Iowa City. She has mentored 15 players to 38 All-Big Ten honors, including 10 first team picks, 10 second, 12 third and six honorable mention selections. She has also had two Big Ten Freshman of the Year award winners, two Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year recipients, five members of the Big Ten All-Freshman team and two players named to the Big Ten All-Defensive team, with Kachine Alexander earning the honor twice.

Four players during Bluder's tenure have earned a total of five Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) all-region team accolades and five players have earned a total of nine honorable mention All-America honors.

With Bluder on the Iowa sidelines, student-athletes have been named Academic All-Big Ten 62 times, including a program-best eight honorees in 2011 and 2012. Additionally, Lindsey Meder was a two-time Academic All-American (2001 and 2002).

Iowa earned its sixth-straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2012-13, finishing with a 21-13 overall record. The Hawkeyes faced 11 ranked teams during the season, marking the most games played against ranked opponents in Iowa history. The Hawkeyes tied the school record for number of wins over ranked opponents with seven, along with setting school records in team assists (534) and rebounds (1,303).

Iowa closed the regular season with eight-straight wins in 2011-12, securing a second place finish in the Big Ten and its fifth-straight NCAA Tournament berth. Iowa's 11 conference wins were the most since 2001-02 and the fourth-most in school history (during a 16-game conference schedule). The Hawkeyes closed the regular season without their leading scorer, Jaime Printy, who suffered a torn ACL.

Bluder had one of her most successful seasons in 2010-11, leading Iowa to a 22-9 overall record and a third place finish in the Big Ten at 10-6. Iowa's overall win/loss record in 2010-11 was the best for an Iowa team since the 1995-96 campaign. The Hawkeyes were nationally ranked for 14 weeks during the season, reaching No. 14 in the Associated Press Poll and No. 13 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. Iowa received an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament for the fourth-straight season.

In 2009-10, Bluder led one of the youngest teams in the country to a third place finish in the Big Ten and a berth in the championship game of the Big Ten Tournament. The Hawkeyes received an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament, where they knocked off Rutgers in the first round before falling to eventual national runner-up and No. 2 ranked Stanford. Iowa finished the 2009-10 season with a 20-14 record, including a 10-8 mark in Big Ten play.

Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to back-to-back 21-11 overall records during the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons. Iowa won a share of the Big Ten regular season championship in 2008 and finished in a three-way tie for second in 2009. The Hawkeyes boasted a 26-5 home record, advanced to the Big Ten Tournament semifinals and appeared in the NCAA Tournament twice during the two-year stretch.

In 2005-06, Bluder guided a young and mostly inexperienced group of Hawkeyes to a 17-12 overall record and a fifth place finish in the Big Ten. Even with a season plagued by knee injuries, the Hawkeyes persevered with strong senior leadership talented play from its freshman class. Iowa received an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament.

Bluder mentored Iowa to a 23-10 overall record and advanced to the WNIT Final Four in 2004-05. The 23 victories are the most by a Bluder coached Iowa team and the most victories since the 1995-96 season. Iowa started the 2004-05 campaign 13-0 and were the last Division I undefeated team standing. Bluder navigated the Hawkeyes through a difficult schedule and ultimately finished the season ranked 38th in the RPI.

In 2003-04, Bluder and the Hawkeyes finished with a 16-13 record while playing the 14th most difficult schedule in the nation and tied for fourth in the league with a 10-6 mark. In addition, eight of its 16 victories came on the road, making the most road wins by a Hawkeye team since the 1993-94 season.

Bluder helped her third Iowa team to another exciting run in the Big Ten Tournament and WNIT in 2002-03. The seventh-seeded Hawkeyes opened the league tournament with a win over Northwestern. In the quarterfinals, Iowa treated its fans to a thrilling upset over 13th-ranked and second-

seeded Minnesota. The Hawkeyes opened postseason play with wins over Saint Louis and Marquette before falling the Missouri Valley Conference co-champions Creighton Bluejays in the WNIT.

In 2001-02, Bluder coached the Hawkeyes to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year and a fourth place finish in the Big Ten. Iowa finished with an 18-11 overall record and a 10-6 mark in league play.

In her first season with the Black and Gold, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa received the Big Ten's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament with a victory over Purdue to capture the 2001 Big Ten Tournament. Furthermore, the Hawkeyes advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after receiving a No. 4 seed and finished the season ranked No. 16 in the final Associated Press poll. Competing in one of the most demanding conference in the country, Bluder directed the Hawkeyes to a 21-10 overall record, a second-place finish in the conference regular season and captured Iowa's second-ever Big Ten Tournament title. Iowa played the 16th toughest schedule in the country and finished the season ranked 18th in the RPI.

"Our success has always been based on playing up-tempo basketball," said Bluder. "We want to put lots of points on the board. The fast break is our number one offense. That type of basketball is exciting for fans and its fun for our players. When we do get into a half court game, everyone has a role. Our goal is to have four or five players averaging in double figures. We want everyone involved. Defensively, we work hard at never letting anything be easy for our opponent. We play tough player-to-player defense hoping to capitalize on steals to set up our break."

Her presence on the Iowa sidelines turned heads across the country. Virginia and USA Basketball head coach Debbie Ryan chose Bluder to help coach Team USA as an assistant coach at the 2001 World University Games in Beijing, China. Team USA marched into the gold medal game against host-team China and won 87-69. Team USA finished the games with a 7-1 mark.

"This was a new experience for me," Bluder said after winning the gold medal. "Just to reach the gold medal game was a thrill. It's something I will always remember. What I think is really wonderful about this experience is each game I felt like Team USA improved. I was honored to be chosen to represent the United States and experience international coaching for the first time."

Bluder has reached seven coaching milestones while at Iowa. During her first season, she collected her 200th victory at the Division I level when the Hawkeyes defeated Minnesota. She garnered win No. 300 at the Division I level with Iowa's regular season finale win over Indiana in 2006. During her third season, Bluder captured career No. 400 in Iowa's triumph over Iowa State. Bluder won career game No. 500 vs. Penn State on Feb. 10, 2008 and No. 600 vs. Purdue on Jan. 20, 2013.

During her tenure at Iowa, five former players have gone on to become coaches. Cara Consuegra (UNC Charlotte) and Jennie Lillis (Drake) are currently Division I head coaches. Randi Peterson is the head coach at Coe College; Kachine Alexander is an assistant at Concordia (St. Paul) and Wendy Ausdemore served as an assistant at Coe for one season.

Eight former Hawkeyes under Bluder continued their playing careers professionally after graduation. Cara Consuegra, Lindsey Meder, Crystal Smith and Kachine Alexander all had stints in the WNBA. Smith, Alexander, Johanna Solversson, Kristi Smith and Megan Skouby and JoAnn Hamlin also played professionally in Europe.

Bluder, alongside her husband David and daughter Hannah, was introduced as the Hawkeyes' fifth head coach in front of a packed press room in Carver-Hawkeye Arena on April 7, 2000. The native of Marion, Iowa, came to Iowa after spending 10 successful seasons at Drake University.

Bluder compiled a 187-106 (.638) record at Drake in 10 seasons and a 169-36 (.824) record in six seasons at NAIA St. Ambrose University.

In her 10 years as Drake University women's basketball coach, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus-win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times at Drake.

Bluder's 1999-2000 Drake squad registered a 23-7 record. The Bulldogs won both the MVC regular-season and tournament titles and earned the school's fourth trip to the NCAA Tournament under Bluder.

The 1997-98 team finished the season 25-5, Bluder's best record at Drake, and won the MVC regular-season title, recording Drake's best conference finish with a 17-1 record. The Bulldogs also won the MVC Tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the third time in four years. She was named the MVC Coach of the Year for the second straight year as Drake was ranked No. 22 in the final Associated Press ranking.

In 1998-99, Drake posted a 21-10 record in the MVC. It marked the fourth time in five years the Bulldogs reached the 20-win plateau, while advancing to the semifinals of the WNIT Tournament.





Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose University, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder recorded a 169-36 (.824) mark and guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

She is also committed to her team's academic success. While at Drake, she coached two Academic All-America Players of the Year in current Hawkeye Associate Head Coach Jan Jensen (1991) and Tricia Wakely (1996). As a team, the Bulldogs ranked fourth in 1995 graduation rate success among teams ranked in the USA Today/CNN final top-25 Coaches' Poll. While at Iowa, Lindsey Meder became the first Hawkeye women's basketball player to be named a first team Verizon Academic all-American while Wendy Ausdemore, who was a 2009 graduate, was a two-time academic all-District honoree.

Student-athletes who have played under coach Bluder and completed their eligibility have a 100 percent job placement following their career, and all of them have earned their degrees.

Bluder's successful coaching record speaks for itself, however her commitment to her players extends far beyond the records book.

During the summer of 2003, Bluder was elected Division I Midwest Representative of the WBCA Board of Directors. She has also served on the WBCA Kodak All-American selection committee for four terms and the Midwest Regional Advisory Committee for the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championships.

"My players are truly an extension of my family," said Bluder. "I care about them in all aspects of their lives. I want to help them succeed as athletes, but especially as people. I have an open-door relationship with my players. Hopefully, they benefit from my perspective as their coach, as a former athlete and as a mother. They can come to me with anything and get help. Along with that aspect, I consider myself a disciplinarian. I don't have a lot of rules, but I do have a lot of expectations. Those revolve around moral and ethical values that are the foundation of our program."

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, Iowa, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing. On Sept. 4, 2008, Bluder was inducted to the Linn-Mar Athletic Hall of Fame. She has also been inducted to the Northern Iowa and St. Ambrose Hall of Fame.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (16) and Emma (13) and one son, David (11).

Jan Jensen is in her 14th season with the Iowa Hawkeyes, her 11th as associate head coach. A nationally known presence on the recruiting scene, Jensen serves as the recruiting coordinator and also works with the post players. Jensen is in her 25th season in women's college basketball as a player and coach.

The native of Kimbalton, Iowa, has helped guide Iowa to 12 postseason appearances, including 10 NCAA Tournament berths. During her time at Iowa, the Hawkeyes won the 2001 Big Ten Tournament championship and the 2008 Big Ten regular season title. She has also helped lead Iowa to nine first-division finishes in the Big Ten.

Jensen is integral in developing and maintaining top-level recruiting classes at Iowa. Jensen helped Iowa land the 11th-best recruiting class in the country in 2011, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. In 2001, Jensen spearheaded Iowa's efforts in landing the eighth-best recruiting class in the nation according to the Blue Star Index. In 2008, Jensen and the Hawkeyes garnered the 33rd best recruiting class, according to ESPN HoopGurlz.

Jensen has recruited three McDonald's All-Americans to Iowa (Samantha Logic, Lindsay Richards and Johanna Solverson).

Under Jensen's tutelage, Hawkeye post players have received numerous honors. She has coached six players to a total of 12 All-Big Ten honors, including two first team selections. Megan Skouby was named the 2006 Big Ten Freshman of the Year and the 2008 Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year, while Jennie Lillis was a 2003 Kodak All-District selection. Skouby, along with Krista VandeVenter, were also invited to the U.S.A. Team Trials during their time at Iowa.

Most recently, Jensen coached Morgan Johnson to numerous accolades, including two second team All-Big Ten honors. Under Jensen's guidance, Johnson became Iowa's career blocks leader and finished inside the top 10 in career scoring and rebounds at Iowa.

In 2009-10, Iowa's post players broke school records for rebounding and blocked shots. Morgan Johnson broke the school mark for single-season blocks, while the team broke the school record for single-season rebounding.

Before becoming a Hawkeye, Jensen also served as coach Bluder's first assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Drake University. Her recruiting efforts were enough to land the Bulldogs two top 13 and two top 40 classes.

As a player, Jensen was one of the best Bluder ever coached at Drake. Her senior year, she led the nation in scoring, averaging 29.6 points and was the Gateway Conference Most Valuable Player. That year, she was a Kodak Honorable Mention All-American, a member of the All-Gateway team and the GTE Academic All-American Player of the Year. Jensen was also Sports Illustrated's National Player of the Week.

She currently ranks fourth on Drake's all-time scoring list (1,996), sixth in field goal percentage (.535) and eighth in rebounds (.750). Jensen is one of only two Drake players to have her number retired in the Knapp Center.

After college, Jensen played professionally in the European Professional Basketball League for BTV-Wuppertal in Germany. She played there from 1992-93 and helped her club win the German Club Championship. She then returned to the United States to begin her coaching career.

In 1993, Jensen was inducted to the Iowa Girls High School Basketball Hall of Fame after leading the nation in scoring, averaging 66 points per contest her senior campaign. Couple that with averaging 29.6 points her senior year at Drake, Jensen is one of the few players who can say she led the nation in scoring both in high school and at a Division I university.

Jensen graduated from Drake in 1991 with a degree in public relations. She earned her master's in higher education five years later.

In February 2007, Jensen received the Drake Double D Award. The award is presented annually to Drake letterwinners for achievements in their chosen field or endeavor and/or community service since leaving Drake. The Double D Award is the highest honor Drake bestows on its student-athletes.

Jensen is also a leader in fundraising for the United Way of Johnson County. The 2006 campaign totaled over \$2 million – with a nine percent increase in donations and a 9.7 increase in the number of donations. In March 2007, Jensen was named the United Way of Johnson County Volunteer of the Year for her leadership of the Emerging Philanthropists Society and the Healthy Kids School-based Clinics Initiative.





## **Jenni Fitzgerald**

**Assistant Coach**

**14th Year**

**Drake, 1990**

Jenni Fitzgerald is in her 14th season as an assistant basketball coach at the University of Iowa. Fitzgerald is in her 27th season in women's college basketball as a player and coach.

The native of Long Grove, Iowa, has helped guide Iowa to 12 postseason appearances, including 10 NCAA Tournament berths. During her time at Iowa, the Hawkeyes won the 2001 Big Ten Tournament championship and the 2008 Big Ten regular season title. She has also helped lead Iowa to nine first-division finishes in the Big Ten.

Fitzgerald is responsible for off campus recruiting and coaches the perimeter players for the Hawkeyes. She also handles most of the film breakdown, scouting and directs the summer basketball camps.

Under Fitzgerald's tutelage, Iowa's perimeter players have garnered numerous awards. She has coached 11 players to a total of 25 All-Big Ten honors, including seven first team selections and the 2010 Big Ten Freshman of the Year (Printy). Melissa Dixon was also named Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year in 2013. She has also mentored four players that received all-district honors and three honorable mention All-Americans (Consuegra, Alexander and Printy).

The Hawkeyes have broken numerous school records during Fitzgerald's time at Iowa. In 2009-10, Iowa shattered both the single season and Big Ten record for three-pointers made and attempted and tied single season marks for assists, three-pointers made in a single game and free throw percentage. Iowa set the school record for team assists in 2012-13.

Individually, Wendy Ausdemore broke or tied seven school records in her four years at Iowa while Kristi Smith became the first Hawkeye ever to amass over 400 points and 100 assists in three seasons. In 2009-10, Kachine Alexander set new school records in free throws made and attempted in a single season, Kamille Wahlin tied the school record for three-pointers made and set a new mark for three-pointers attempted and also became the first player in school history to record 400 career assists and 200 made 3-pointers. Kachine Alexander became the first player in school history, and just the fifth in Big Ten history, to collect 1,000 career points, 800 career rebounds and 300 career assists.



Most recently, Jaime Printy finished her career ranked inside the top 10 in points, 3-pointers made and assists at Iowa, while also setting numerous single-game, season and career free throw marks.

Four former Hawkeye guards that Fitzgerald coached continued their playing careers in the WNBA, including Cara Consuegra, Lindsey Meder, Crystal Smith and Kachine Alexander.

Fitzgerald is very familiar with both Lisa Bluder and fellow assistant Jan Jensen, both of whom she coached with for eight years at Drake University prior to coming to Iowa.

While at Drake, Fitzgerald worked with the guards, directed summer camps and handled the administrative duties for the Bulldog basketball program from 1993-2000.

From 1986-91, Fitzgerald was the starting point guard for the Drake Bulldogs. She was a teammate of fellow Hawkeye assistant coach Jan Jensen. As a senior, Fitzgerald served as her team's captain and was named to the All-Gateway Conference first team. As a junior, Fitzgerald was her team's Most Valuable Player.

Fitzgerald graduated from Drake in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in business administration with a management major. In January 2009, Fitzgerald was one of three former Drake student-athletes to receive the Drake Double D Award. The award is presented annually to Drake letterwinners for achievements in their chosen field or endeavor and/or community service since leaving Drake. The Double D Award is the highest honor Drake bestows on its student-athletes.

After graduation, Fitzgerald completed her master of science degree in physical education, with an emphasis in sport management, from Southern Illinois University in 1992. While at Southern Illinois, Fitzgerald was a graduate assistant with the Salukis.

In high school, Fitzgerald was Iowa's Female Athlete of the Year in 1986 after being named Miss Basketball and first team all-state in basketball, volleyball and softball. In 1995, she was inducted into the Iowa Girl's Basketball Hall of Fame.

Fitzgerald is the daughter of Bob and Jan Fitzgerald. She has an older sister, Robin, and younger brother, Randy.

Lacey Goldwire is in her first season as an assistant women's basketball coach at the University of Iowa in 2013-14.

Her main responsibilities with our team will be developing our wing players, and recruiting. I have no doubt that Lacey will be a great Hawkeye."

"I cannot begin to express how excited I am to join the Hawkeye family," said Goldwire. "The University of Iowa women's basketball program has proved to be top in the nation and is on the rise. Coach Bluder and the staff at Iowa are an accomplished and outstanding group of women, and I am very privileged to get to work with such an experienced staff. It is great to be a part of a program with such an amazing fan base and support system. The Hawkeye fans love women's basketball and make Carver-Hawkeye Arena a fun place to play."

"I am very appreciative of the opportunity to work at the University of Iowa, and I am thankful for those who have helped me get to this point. I am so eager to get settled in and to have the team back on campus so we can hit the floor."

Goldwire spent the 2012-13 season as an assistant coach at Morehead State. Prior to joining the Eagles' staff, Goldwire served on the Oklahoma State staff for four seasons -- two as a student assistant and two as a graduate assistant.

Following Oklahoma State's tragic loss of its head and assistant coach during a plane crash in November of 2011, Goldwire was elevated to interim assistant coach where she took on added recruiting duties. During her time with the program, the Cowgirls won 80 games and advanced to the postseason all four years, winning the 2012 WNIT championship.

Goldwire, an Oklahoma City native, played collegiately at East Central (Okla.) University where she ranks fifth in career scoring with 1,340 points. She averaged 21.1 points and 5.9 rebounds as a senior and was tabbed Lone Star Conference North co-Player of the Year and Second-Team All-South Central Region. She also earned ECU's Athlete of the Year honor in 2007-08. She was named honorable mention All-LSC following her sophomore and junior campaigns.

Goldwire, an all-state and all-city player at Del City (Okla.) High School, graduated from Oklahoma State with a bachelor of science in education and a master's degree in teaching, learning and leadership.

Abby Emmert is in her fifth season as director of basketball operations for the University of Iowa women's basketball program.

The Winterset, Iowa, native works closely with the Hawkeye basketball staff, helping coordinate and carry out day-to-day activities of the program. Emmert is responsible for arranging team travel and activities, supervising public service opportunities for the team and coordinating summer camps and training tables.

Emmert is also Iowa's chief scheduler, helping to build one of the most exciting and demanding schedules in the country for the Hawkeye program.

Emmert was a member of the Iowa women's basketball team from 2005-08. She was named team co-captain in 2008, and helped lead the Hawkeyes to a Big Ten regular season championship. Emmert also received the Dr. Christine Grant Leadership Award for women's basketball as a senior.

Emmert played in 123 career games as a Hawkeye, including 22 starts. Her 123 games played are tied for the fourth-most of any player in program history.

She scored 299 career points, collected 144 rebounds and dished out 177 assists. She scored a career-high 17 points against Iowa State as a junior in 2006.

Emmert graduated with a communications studies degree from the University of Iowa in 2008, and worked for the United Way of East Central Iowa before taking over as director of basketball operations.

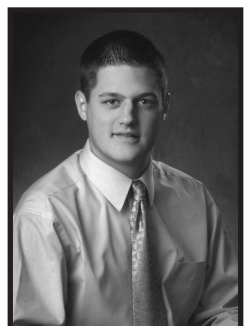

The 1987-88 Iowa Hawkeyes won its first outright Big Ten Championship with a 17-1 regular season conference mark. The team finished the season ranked No. 2 in the final Associated Press poll.

**1988-89 (27-5, 16-2)**

In 1988-89, the Hawkeyes claimed a share of the Big Ten Championship with a 15-3 mark. This group of Hawkeyes would extend its home winning streak to 41 games, the second-longest in the nation at the time.

**1989-90 (23-6, 15-3)**

During the 1989-90 season, the Hawkeyes won a share of the Big Ten Championship with a 15-3 conference record. The Hawkeyes finished the season ranked No. 10 in the final Associated Press poll.

**1991-92 (25-4, 16-2)**

The 1991-92 Hawkeyes won the Big Ten Championship outright with a 16-2 conference record. Iowa finished the season ranked No. 7 in the AP poll.

**1992-93 (27-4, 16-2)**

With a 16-2 conference record, Iowa claimed a share of the Big Ten title during the 1992-93 season. This special group of Hawkeyes would go on to become the only Iowa team to advance to the Final Four.

**1995-96 (27-4, 15-1)**

The 1995-96 Hawkeyes finished with a 15-1 mark to win its seventh Big Ten title. This group of Hawkeyes finished the season ranked No. 7 in the AP poll.

**1997 Big Ten Tournament (18-12, 9-7)**

The 1996-97 Hawkeyes finished fourth in the Big Ten during the regular season and needed to win the Big Ten Tournament in order to advance to the NCAA Tournament. Iowa defeated Northwestern, Indiana and Illinois to win its first Big Ten Tournament title.

**1997-98 (18-11, 13-3)**

Iowa's 1997-98 squad finished the regular season with a 13-3 conference mark to secure its eighth Big Ten Championship. The team finished the season ranked No. 24 in the final Associated Press poll.

**2001 Big Ten Tournament (21-10, 12-4)**

In Lisa Bluder's first year at Iowa, the 2000-01 Hawkeyes finished second in the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes knocked off Indiana, Illinois and Purdue to win the first Big Ten crown under Bluder.

**2008-09 (21-11, 13-5)**

In 2008, Iowa won a share of the Big Ten regular season championship, its ninth in school history. The Hawkeyes won a Big Ten-season-best eight-straight during league play.

### **Michelle Edwards (1984-88)**

A native of Boston, and a Class of 2014 Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductee, Michelle Edwards is one of the most decorated players in Iowa women's basketball history. The 5-foot-9 guard, nicknamed "Ice", amassed a career record of 102-22 from 1984-1988. During her four years, Edwards led the Hawkeyes to three NCAA Tournament appearances and two Big Ten titles. In 1988, she was named the Champion Products National Player of the Year, the highest honor in women's collegiate basketball. Edwards garnered several other honors that year including being named a Kodak All-American, a Naismith All-American, a USBWA All-American, the Big Ten Player of the Year, and the University of Iowa Athlete of the Year. In her senior season, Edwards also led Iowa to its first ever national No. 1 ranking, along with a record of 29-2 overall and 17-1 in the Big Ten. She paced the Hawkeyes, averaging 20 points, 4.8 rebounds, 4.5 assists, and 2.9 steals. The three-time first team All-Big Ten selection is the only Hawkeye to have her jersey retired (No. 30). Edwards ranks high in several Iowa statistical categories, including second in career assists (431), fourth in career scoring (1,821), and third in career steals (235). She also ranks second among single season scoring leaders (621). Edwards -- inducted into the University of Iowa Athletics Hall of Fame in 2000 -- played in the National Olympic Festival in 1985 and was a member of the U.S. Select Team in 1986. In 1991, she was part of the United States Pan American Team, and she also competed in the U.S. Olympic Trials in 1988 and 1992. Upon graduation, Edwards played professionally in Italy for nine seasons before joining the WNBA during its inaugural year in 1997. She then spent three seasons with the Cleveland Rockers and two seasons with the Seattle Storm.

### **Franthea Price (1986-90)**

Franthea Price -- a 2013 National Iowa Varsity Club Athletics Hall of Fame inductee -- played for the Hawkeyes from 1986-1990, and in her senior season, she became the second Kodak All-American in school history. The four-year starter from River Rouge, Mich., had an impressive career at Iowa, which began with her being named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1987. Price was named first team All-Big Ten in 1988 and 1990, and second team All-Big Ten in 1989. In her senior year, Price earned the honor of Big Ten Player of the Year and led the conference in scoring at 19.8 points per game. The 5-foot-9 forward led the Hawkeyes in several statistical categories that year including scoring (21.2), rebounding (7.1), steals (2.9), and 3-point field goals (47). A consistent contributor, Price scored in double figures in 34 of her last 35 games. She holds the school record for career steals with 321, and is tied for first for most steals in a single game with nine. Price also ranks fifth in career scoring (1,742), third in career assists (387), and eighth in career rebounds (726). Outside of Iowa, Price was a member of the U.S. World Junior National Team in 1986 and competed in the National Olympic Festival in 1985 and 1986. In 1987, Price won a gold medal as part of the United States William R. Jones Cup team, and she was a member of the United States Select team in 1989. Price also competed in the U.S. Olympic Trials in 1988. After finishing her career at Iowa, Price played professionally in Spain for several years before joining the WNBA's Sacramento Monarchs in 1998.

### **Toni Foster (1989-93)**

A 6-foot-1 forward from Chicago, Toni Foster was named a Kodak All-American in 1993 and was a finalist for Champion Player of the Year. Foster played for the Hawkeyes from 1989-1993, and led the team in both scoring and rebounding for three consecutive years, a feat accomplished only once previously. A three-time first team All-Big Ten selection, Foster was named the Big Ten Player of the Year in 1993. She was also named the 1993 SportsChannel Player of the Year. During her senior season, Price led Iowa in scoring (15.7), rebounding (8.2), and blocked shots (1.3). She collected 27 double-doubles during her illustrious career, including nine in her senior year. In Iowa's career statistical categories, Foster ranks second in both rebounds (887) and blocks (145). She also ranks sixth in scoring (1,606) and ninth in steals (167). Foster competed in the National Olympic Festival in 1987 and 1991. When the WNBA was formed in 1997, Foster was the seventh overall pick and was selected by the Phoenix Mercury. She spent two seasons with the Mercury before joining the Seattle Storm in 1999 by way of an expansion draft.

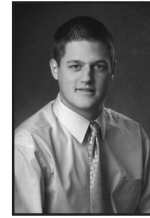
