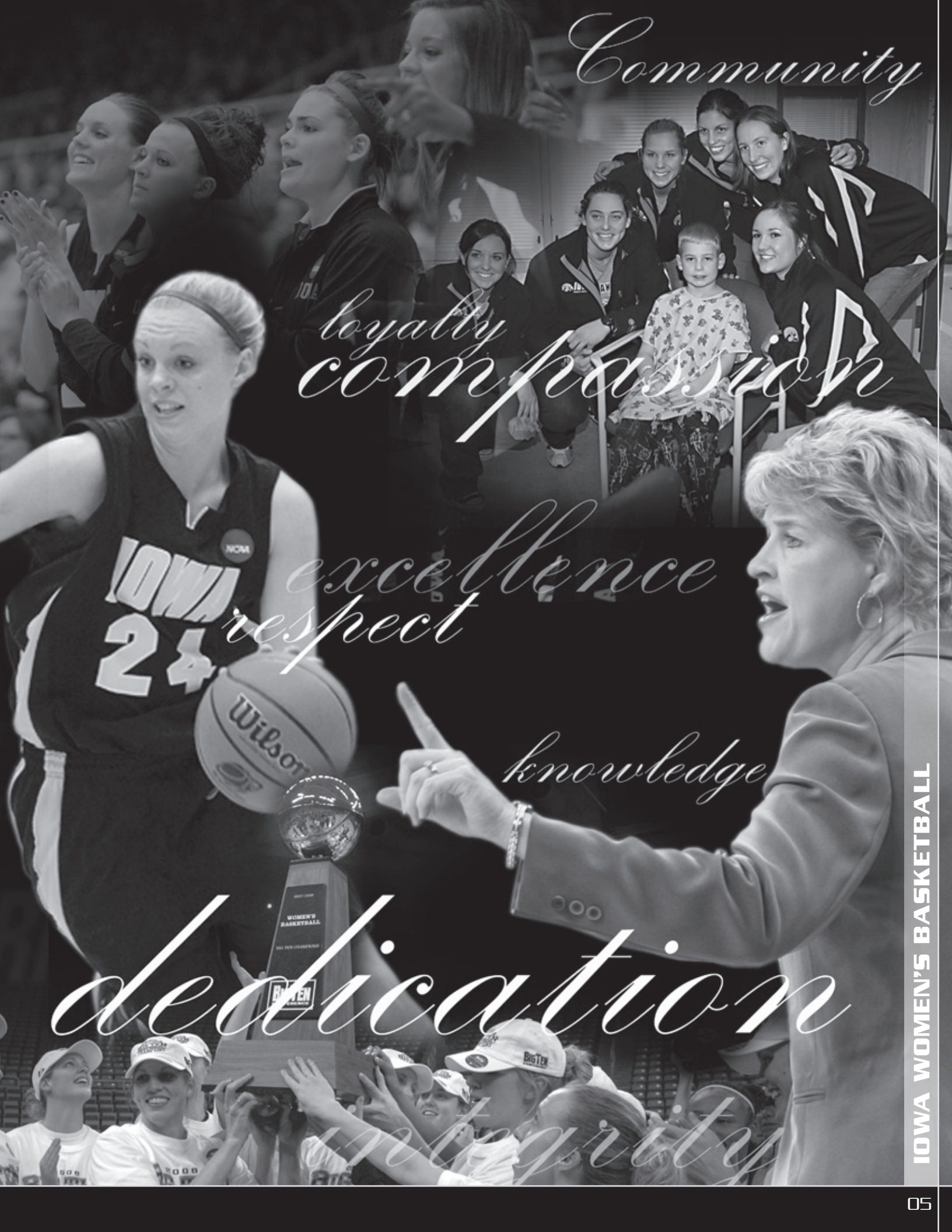

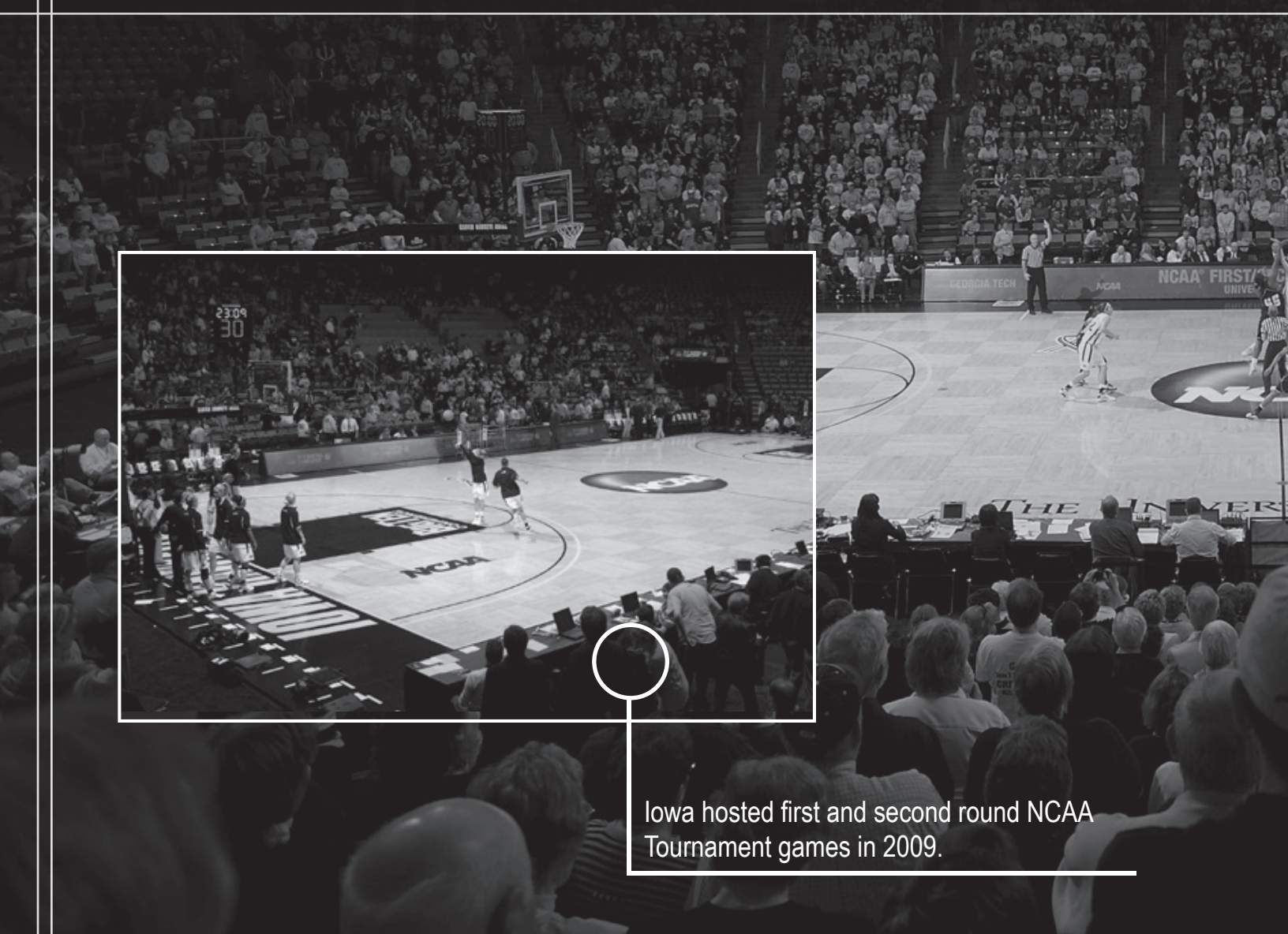
The players and coaches also take time to read to children in the local Iowa City elementary schools as well as extend invitations to elementary school children to attend home basketball games.

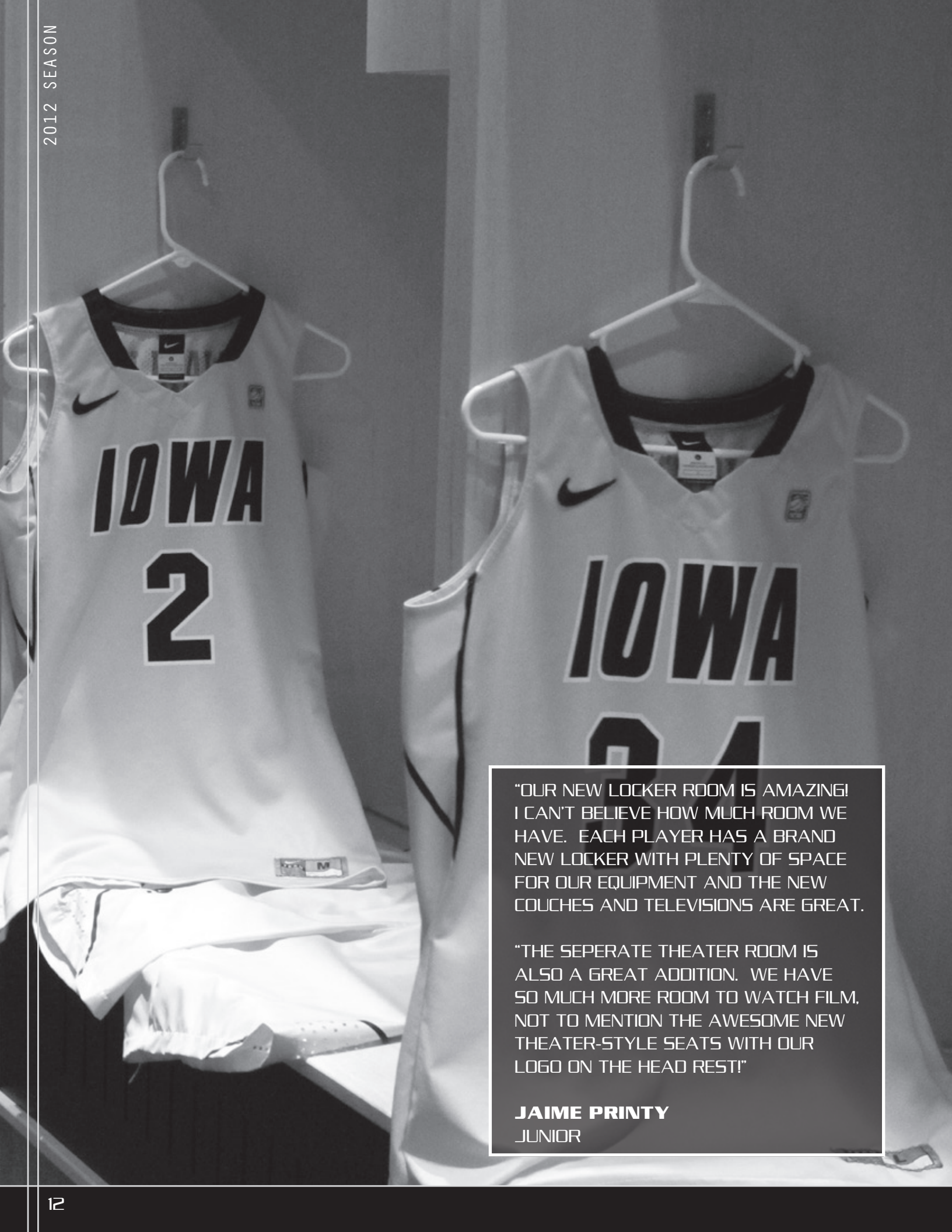

# LOCKER ROOM

The University of Iowa women's locker room was completely renovated and re-opened in the fall of 2011.

The updated locker room doubled in size from 1,200 square feet to 2,400 square feet and includes spacious new lockers, an improved lounge area with leather couches and two 60-inch HD flat screen televisions and a separate theater room with leather chairs and a state-of-the-art video system for film review.







# CARVER- HAWKEYE ARENA **RENOVATION**

## NEW PRACTICE FACILITY AND STATE-OF-THE-ART WEIGHT ROOM

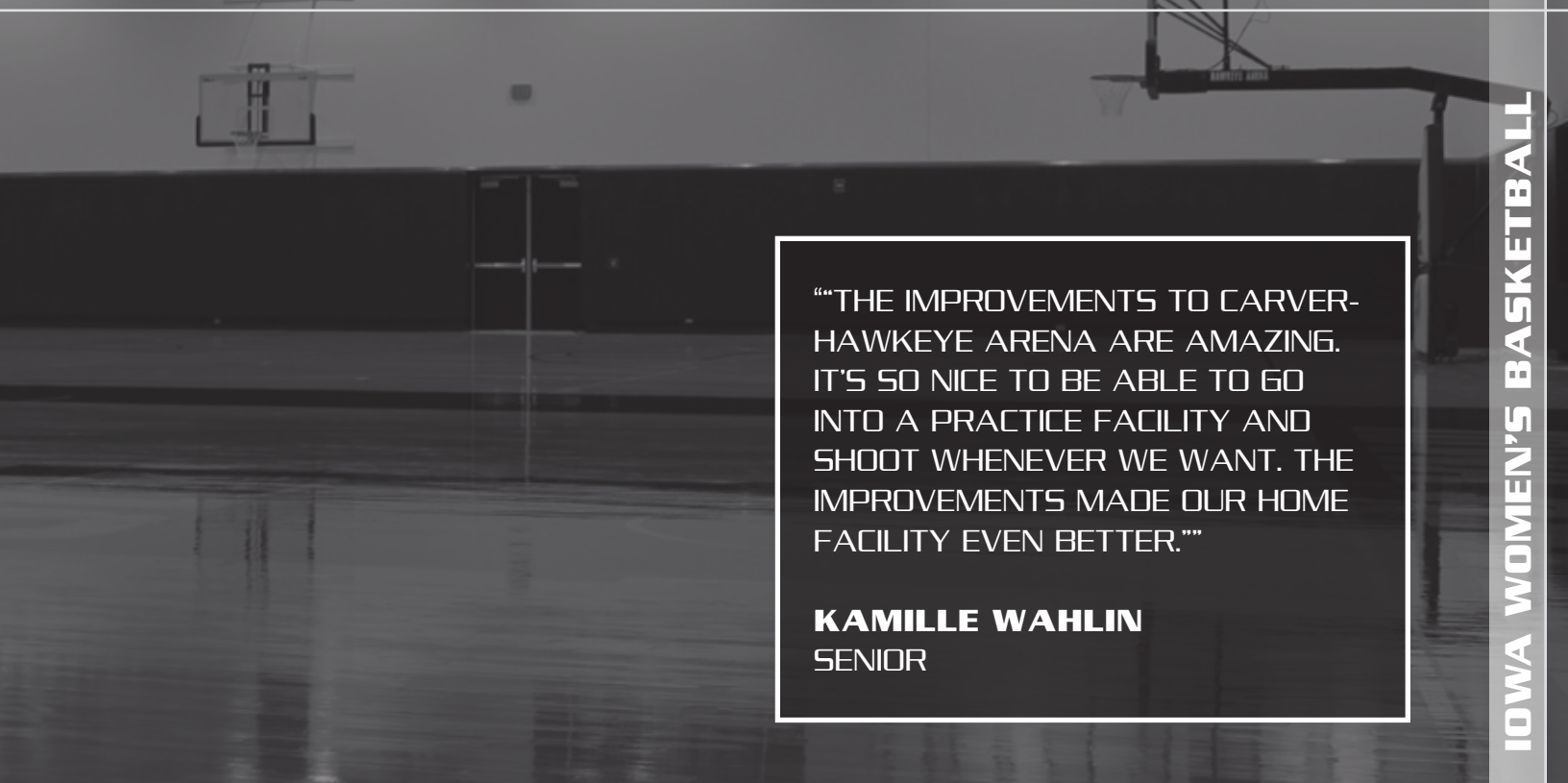
The \$43 million addition and revitalization of Carver-Hawkeye was completed in August of 2011. Additions include a practice facility immediately north of the arena, along with a brand new, state-of-the-art fitness and weight-training space.

The new, air-conditioned practice facility will have two full-size collegiate courts and is equipped with a Robbins MVP (maximum vibration protection) flooring system.

Iowa's new weight room will expand from 1,800 square feet to 11,000 square feet. It will have brand new PowerLift racks, cardio equipment and a 40-yard turf/agility sprint lane.

Keys will not be necessary for the practice facility or locker room, as electronic access is being installed. Student-athletes simply need to place their palm on the reader by the door to gain access.

# THE HAWKEYES **STRENGTH & CONDITIONING**

## **STRENGTH & CONDITIONING PHILOSOPHY**

The philosophy of this program consists mainly of two components. The first is to continually develop a scientifically sound program that will maximize strength, power and explosiveness in order to allow the athlete to get the utmost out of their genetic potential, and to reduce the chance of injury. This will primarily be accomplished through the use of ground based free weight exercises and the progressive incorporation of functional movements and plyometrics. The second is to establish a culture which will develop the discipline, character and mental toughness within each athlete and team as a whole so that they are able to make the sacrifices in their training, leave their comfort zone and develop a Championship ATTITUDE. This will encourage them to make the most out of every situation and opportunity given to them in athletics, so that they might know what it is to be fully committed to something in at least one area of their life. When these two converge, they are not only able to reach their full potential, they become champions on and off the playing field.





# IOWA HAWKEYES ACADEMICS

## ATHLETICS LEARNING CENTER

The \$4.6 million Russell A. and Ann Gerdin Athletics Learning Center opened in September of 2003 and gives all Iowa student-athletes a state of the art facility to help them with their educations.

The Athletics Learning Center is a multi-level, 20,000 square foot facility that provides a computer center, study areas, classes and meeting places for all Hawkeye student-athletes.

The Learning Center features an auditorium that converts into two classrooms, separate study rooms for under and upper-class student-athletes that feature 28 study carrels, a computer lab, five tutorial rooms, the book loan repository, office space for Iowa's Student Services staff and a display area to recognize the academic accomplishments of Iowa's student-athletes.

# A TOTAL PROGRAM



*The men's track and field team won the Big Ten Outdoor Championship and also finished eighth at the indoor NCAA championships.*

The UI Department of Athletics is under the direction of Gary Barta and is regarded as one of the top intercollegiate programs in the nation. Once again, the Hawkeyes enjoyed success both athletically and academically in 2010-11.

Sixty-four Hawkeyes earned all-conference accolades, while 44 were recognized as All-Americans. Hawkeye student-athletes excelled in the classroom as well with 172 earning Academic All-Big Ten laurels. Thirty-four Hawkeyes were honored by the Big Ten Conference with the Distinguished Scholar Award. The graduation rate of Iowa's student-athletes has improved in each of the past 10 years and has consistently ranked above the graduation rate of all UI students.


Iowa's men's cross country, men's and women's tennis, and softball teams were recognized by the NCAA for their high academic marks. The four teams earned Public Recognition Awards, based on their most recent multi-year Academic Progress Rates.

The UI closed the 2010-11 athletics year with a bang, establishing a school record in total points scored in the annual Learfield Sports Directors' Cup. The Hawkeyes accumulated 510 points in the competition that awards points based on each institution's finish in national championship competition in up to 20 total sports (10 women's and 10 men's).

The support of their efforts and attendance by Hawkeye fans ranks among the best across the country.

While the Hawkeyes compete with the best in the nation in a variety of sports, Iowa boasts some of the most impressive athletic facilities in the nation, operated by one of the most respected departments.

Several new projects have come to completion on the Iowa campus. Some of the latest additions to the UI campus include the completion of the new Campus Recreation and Wellness Center, which houses the swimming and diving teams, and the state-of-the-art \$7 million rowing boathouse. In addition to the brand new swimming and rowing facilities, the Roy G. Karro Athletics Hall of Fame and Visitors Center, the Russell and Ann Gerdin Athletic Learning Center and the Hawkeye Tennis and Recreation Center completed construction in recent years. Furthermore, the UI completed a \$47 million Carver-Hawkeye Arena renovation project in the summer of 2011.

Kinnick Stadium received a major upgrade and renovation that was completed just prior to the 2006 season. The \$89 million project included the replacing of the south end zone stands and building of a four-level press box that houses 47 guest suites. New scoreboards, video walls, concession stands and rest rooms were also part of the project.

Iowa student-athletes have been recognized as All-Americans in their sport on 312 occasions during the past 19 years, including 44 this past season.

During the 2010-11 athletic year, the Hawkeyes continued their trend of success on the playing fields and in academic pursuits. Below are some examples of recent Hawkeye success.

The Hawkeye wrestling team continued its dominance on the mat, finishing third at the NCAA Championships. Iowa has claimed 23 national championships, including three in the last four years, and 34 Big Ten titles. Five Hawkeyes earned All-American accolades en route to the team's third place finish.

Iowa football continued its stellar play, finishing in the upper division of the Big Ten for the ninth time in the last 10 years. The Hawkeyes capped their season with a thrilling 27-24 come-from-behind victory over Missouri in the Insight Bowl. The win was Iowa's third straight bowl victory, a school record.

Iowa's field hockey team has won the Big Ten Tournament championship three of the last five years and finished third

nationally, advancing all the way to the Final Four in 2008. A total of 41 Hawkeyes have garnered All-Big Ten accolades under head coach Tracey Griesbaum.

The women's basketball team had another outstanding season, finishing third in the league and advancing to the NCAA Tournament. Lisa Bluder, who is a three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year and two-time Regional Coach of the Year, coached Kachine Alexander and Jaime Printy to honorable mention All-America status. Alexander was also tabbed the Premier Player of the Year. Bluder has guided Iowa to eight first division finishes in her 11 years and has taken her program to eight NCAA Tournaments, including four straight.

The men's track and field team finished eighth in the nation at the indoor national championships and won the outdoor Big Ten title in 2011. Coach Larry Wiecek was named Big Ten Coach of the Year, while numerous Hawkeyes earned all-league and All-America honors.

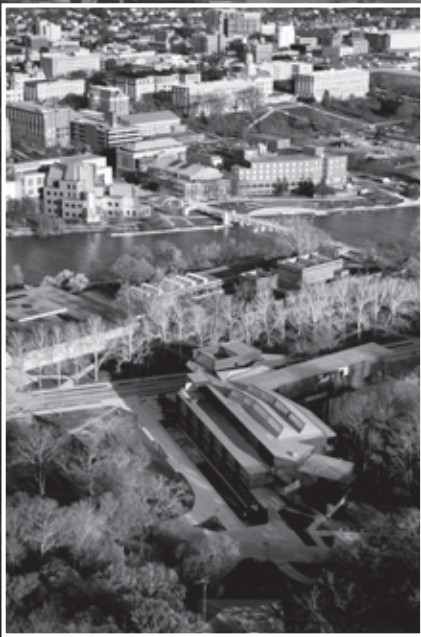
Head coach Mark Hankins continued to have his men's golfers play at a high level. The Hawkeyes advanced to the NCAA Championships for the second time in three years and tied for 10th nationally – a school-record finish. Vince India was named the Big Ten Player of the Year and earned the prestigious Les Bolstad Trophy, which goes to the male golfer with the lowest stroke average in the Big Ten.

The men's basketball team had its first season under head coach Fran McCaffery. Hawkeye fans flocked to Carver-Hawkeye Arena to watch the Black and Gold. Attendance increased 20 percent, which ranked fifth-best in the country.

The aforementioned list of team and individual accomplishments are just a sampling of the recent excellence achieved in Iowa City.

Whether it's the top-notch athletic or academic performances, the outstanding community and fan support, or the impressive facilities, it's easy to understand why Iowa fans everywhere truly believe, "It's great to be a Hawkeye."





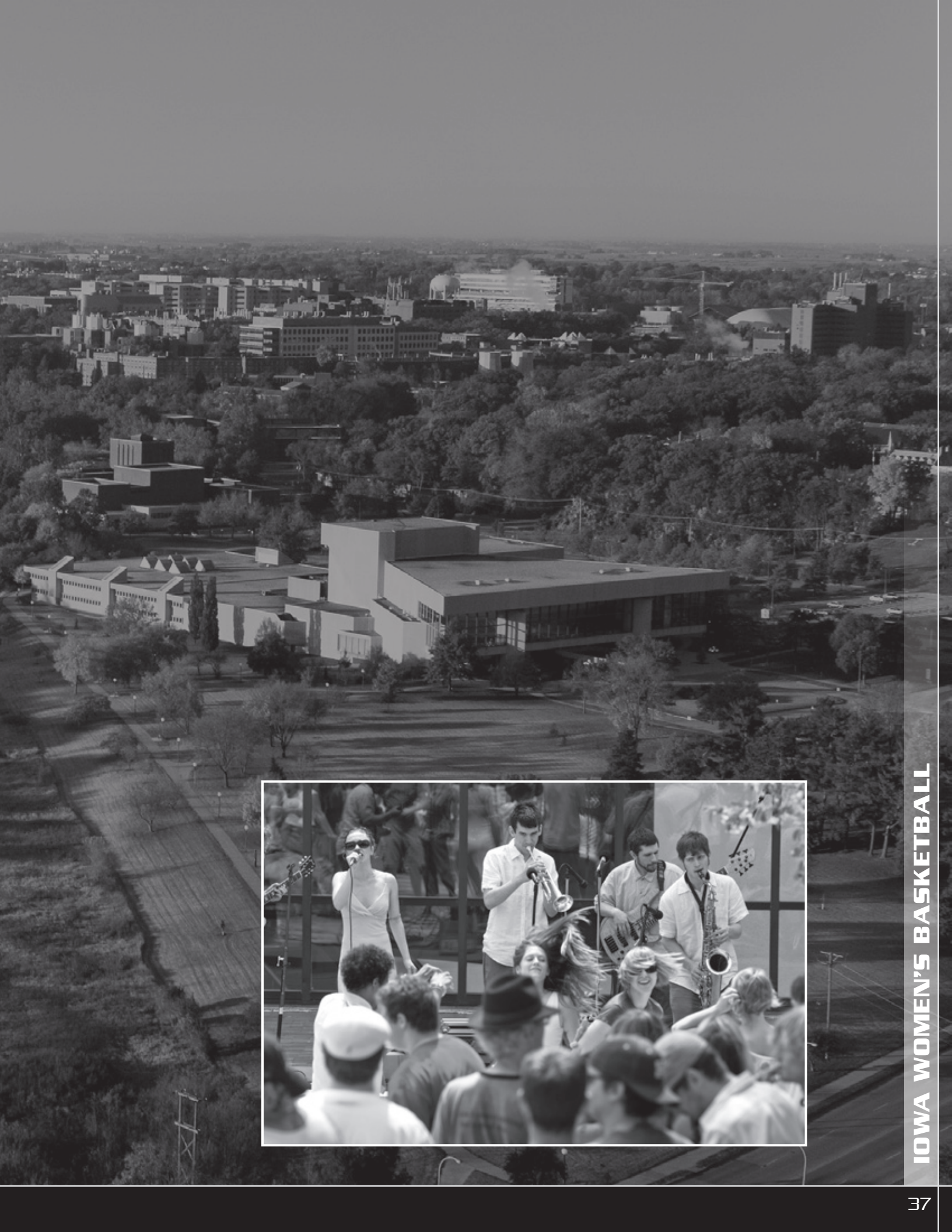
# THE IOWA CITY COMMUNITY

## **BIG LIFE. BIG STAGE. BIG TEN.**

The Big Ten Conference is a union of 12 world-class academic institutions who share a common mission of research, graduate, professional and undergraduate teaching and public service. The conference's 100-plus years of history, strong tradition of competitive intercollegiate athletic programs, vast and passionate alumni base, and consistent leadership in innovations position the Big Ten and its entire community firmly on the Big Stage.

The Big Ten has sustained a comprehensive set of shared practices and policies that enforce the priority of academics and emphasize the values of integrity, fairness and competitiveness in all aspects of its student-athletes' lives, with the ultimate goal of ensuring that each individual has the opportunity to live a Big Life.

The Big Ten Conference has held a league tournament every year since 1995, with every tournament but one being held in Indianapolis.

Fans have embraced the Big Ten Women's Tournament. Nearly 36,000 fans watched in 2008 as Purdue captured the tournament title marked by close games and stellar individual performances.

Conseco Fieldhouse has played host to the conference tournament the last 10 consecutive years and 11 overall. The Big Ten announced in 2012 that the conference tournament will rotate between Indianapolis (2012, 2014, 2016) and the Sears Centre in Hoffman Estates, Ill. (2013, 2015).





# BIG TEN/ACC Challenge

The Big Ten/ACC Women's Basketball Challenge enters its fifth year of existence during the 2011-12 season.

The Big Ten/ACC Women's Basketball Challenge matches 12 teams from each conference in head-to-head competition traditionally on the first Wednesday, Thursday and Friday after Thanksgiving, following the men's Big Ten/ACC Challenge.

For the third time in the last four seasons, the Big Ten sent eight teams to postseason play in 2011. Five teams earned bids to the NCAA Championship, while three others appeared in the WNIT. The Big Ten has sent at least one team to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 25 of the last 27 years and has had at least one squad participate in five of the last 13 Final Fours.

The ACC had eight postseason teams, including six in the NCAA Championship. Overall, the ACC has made 14 Final Four appearances.

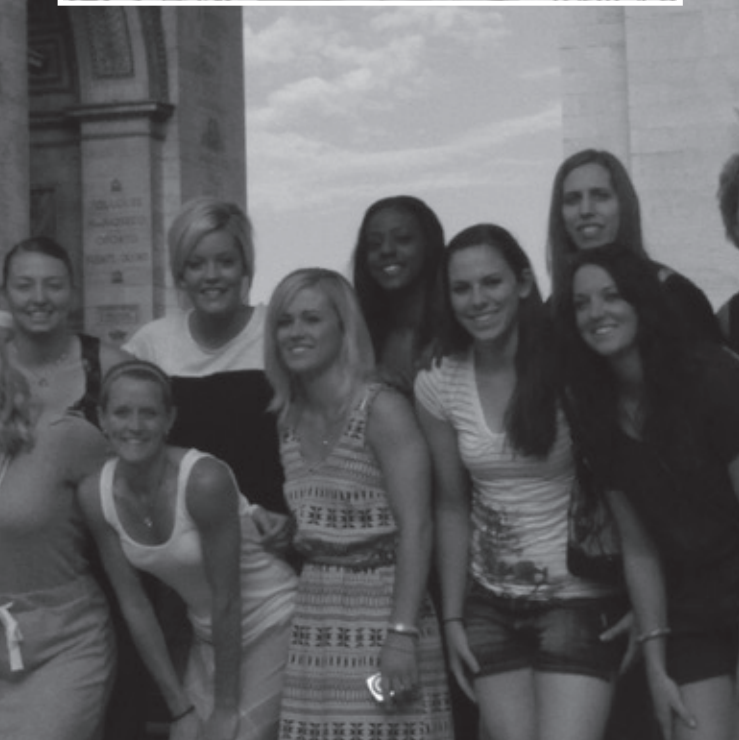
Iowa toured the beautiful cities of Rome, Vatican City, Florence, Venice and Lake Como on a 12-day trip in 2003 that included four exhibition games.

## JENSEN'S BIO

Jan Jensen is in her 12th season with the Iowa Hawkeyes, her eighth as associate head coach. A nationally known presence on the recruiting scene, Jensen serves as the recruiting coordinator and also works with the post players. Jensen is in her 23rd season in women's college basketball as a player and coach.

The native of Kimbalton, IA, has helped guide Iowa to 10 postseason appearances, including eight NCAA Tournament berths. During her time at Iowa, the Hawkeyes won the 2001 Big Ten Tournament championship and the 2008 Big Ten regular season title. She has also helped lead Iowa to eight first-division finishes in the Big Ten, including the last four seasons.

Jensen is integral in developing and maintaining top-level recruiting classes at Iowa. Jensen helped Iowa land the 11th best recruiting class in the country in 2011, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. In 2001, Jensen spearheaded Iowa's efforts in landing the eighth-best recruiting class in the nation according to the Blue Star Index. In 2008, Jensen and the Hawkeyes garnered the 33rd best recruiting class, according to ESPN HoopGurlz.

Before becoming a Hawkeye, Jensen also served as Coach Bluder's first assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Drake University. Her recruiting efforts were enough to land the Bulldogs two top 13 and two top 40 classes.

As a player, Jensen was one of the best Bluder ever coached at Drake. Her senior year, she led the nation in scoring with 29.6 ppg and was the Gateway Conference Most Valuable Player. That year she was a Kodak Honorable Mention All-American, a member of the All-Gateway team and the GTE Academic All-America Player of the Year. Jensen was also Sports Illustrated's National Player of the Week.

One of only two Drake players to have her number retired in the Knapp Center.

After college, played professionally in the European Professional Basketball League for BTV-Wuppertal in Germany. She played there from 1992-93 and helped her club win the German Club Championship.

In 1993, was inducted to the Iowa Girls High School Basketball Hall of Fame.

Graduated from Drake in 1991 with a degree in Public Relations. She earned her Masters in Higher Education five years later.

In February 2007, was one of four former Drake student-athletes to receive the Drake Double D Award. The award is presented annually to Drake letterwinners for achievements in their chosen field or endeavor and/or community service since leaving Drake. The Double D Award is the highest honor Drake bestows on its student-athletes.

Leader in fundraising for the United Way of Johnson County. The 2006 campaign totaled over \$2 million.

In March, 2007, was named the United Way of Johnson County Volunteer of the Year for her leadership of the Emerging Philanthropists Society and the Healthy Kids School-based Clinics Initiative.

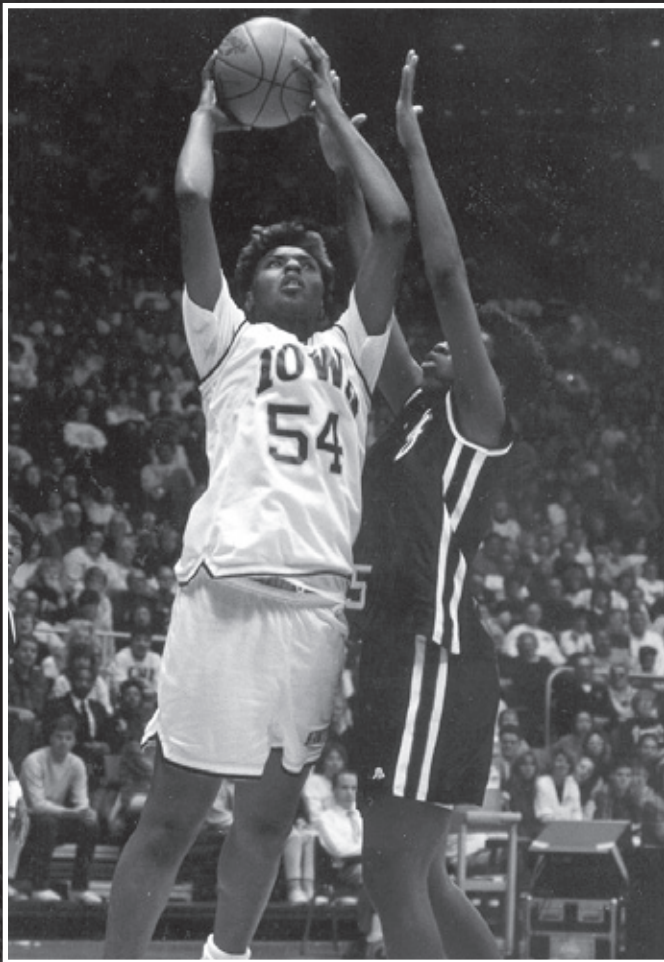
# CONSENSUS FIRST TEAM ALL-AMERICANS



## Michelle Edwards [1984-88]

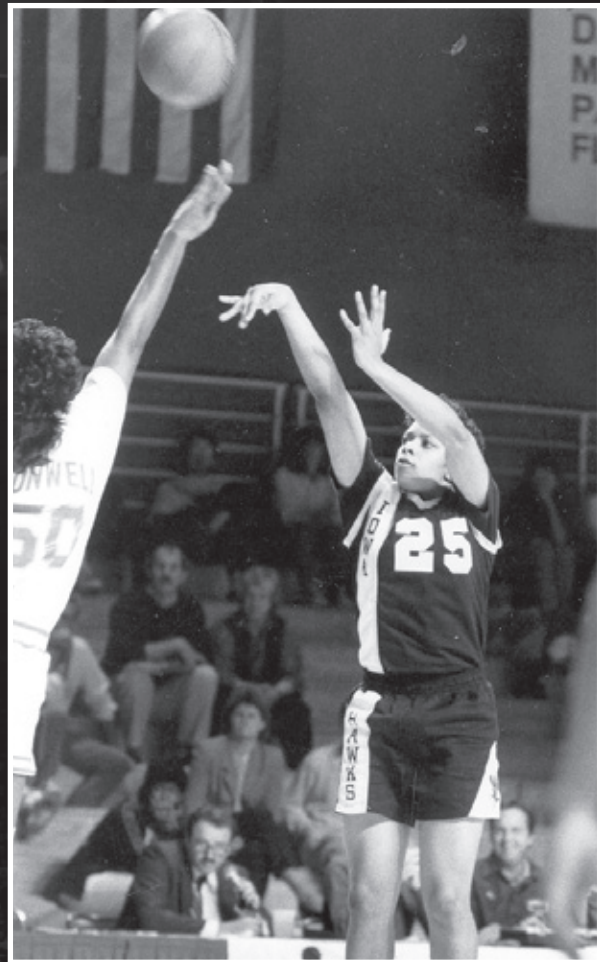
A native of Boston, Massachusetts, Michelle Edwards is one of the most decorated players in Iowa women's basketball history. The 5-9 guard, nicknamed "Ice", amassed a career record of 102-22 from 1984-1988. During her four years, Edwards led the Hawkeyes to three NCAA Tournament appearances and two Big Ten titles. In 1988, she was named the Champion Products National Player of the Year, the highest honor in women's collegiate basketball. Edwards garnered several other honors that year including being named a Kodak all-American, a Naismith all-American, a USBWA all-American, the Big Ten Player of the Year, and the University of Iowa Athlete of the Year. In her senior season, Edwards also led Iowa to its first ever national number one ranking, along with a record of 29-2 overall and 17-1 in the Big Ten. She paced the Hawkeyes with an average of 20 points per game, 4.8 rebounds per game, 4.5 assists per game, and 2.9 steals per game. The three-time first team all-Big Ten selection is the only Hawkeye to have her jersey retired (No. 30). Edwards ranks high in several Iowa statistical categories, including second in career assists (431), third in career scoring (1,821), and third in career steals (235). She also ranks second among single season scoring leaders (621) and is tied for first in assists in a single game (12). Edwards played in the National Olympic Festival in 1985 and was a member of the U.S. Select Team in 1986. In 1991, she was part of the United States Pan American Team, and she also competed in the U.S. Olympic Trials in 1988 and 1992. Upon graduation, Edwards played professionally in Italy for nine seasons before joining the WNBA during its inaugural year in 1997. She then spent three seasons with the Cleveland Rockers and two seasons with the Seattle Storm.





## Franthea Price (1986-90)

Franthea Price played for the Hawkeyes from 1986-1990, and in her senior season she became the second Kodak all-American in school history. The four-year starter from River Rouge, Michigan, had an impressive career at Iowa, which began with her being named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1987. Price was named to the first team all-Big Ten in 1988 and 1990, and she was named second team all-Big Ten in 1989. In her senior year, Price earned the honor of Big Ten Player of the Year and led the conference in scoring with 19.8 points per game. The 5-9 forward led the Hawkeyes in several statistical categories that year including scoring (21.2), rebounding (7.1), steals (2.9), and three-point field goals (47). A consistent contributor, Price scored in double figures in 34 of her last 35 games. She holds the school record for career steals with 321, and is tied for first for most steals in a single game with nine. Price also ranks fifth in career scoring (1,742), third in career assists (387), and eighth in career rebounds (726). Outside of Iowa, Price was a member of the U.S. World Junior National Team in 1986 and competed in the National Olympic Festival in 1985 and 1986. In 1987, Price won a gold medal as part of the United States William R. Jones Cup team, and she was a member of the United States Select team in 1989. Price also competed in the U.S. Olympic Trials in 1988. After finishing her career at Iowa, Price played professionally in Spain for several years before joining the WNBA Sacramento Monarchs in 1998.



## Toni Foster (1989-93)

A 6-1 forward from Chicago, Illinois, Toni Foster was named a Kodak all-American in 1993 and was a finalist for Champion Player of the Year. Foster played for the Hawkeyes from 1989-1993, and led the team in both scoring and rebounding for three consecutive years, a feat accomplished only once previously. A three-time first team all-Big Ten selection, Foster was named the Big Ten Player of the Year in 1993. She was also named the 1993 SportsChannel Player of the Year. During her senior season, Price led Iowa in scoring (15.7), rebounding (8.2), and blocked shots (1.3). She collected 27 double-doubles during her illustrious career, including nine in her senior year. In Iowa's career statistical categories, Foster ranks second in both rebounds (887) and blocks (145). She also ranks sixth in scoring (1,606) and ninth in steals (167). Foster competed in the National Olympic Festival in 1987 and 1991. When the WNBA was formed in 1997, Foster was the seventh overall pick and was selected by the Phoenix Mercury. She spent two seasons with the Mercury before joining the Seattle Storm in 1999 by way of an expansion draft.
