HAWKEYES | 1st & 10

- Head coach Kirk Ferentz -- the dean of coaches in college football -- won his 200th career game on Sept. 9 when the Hawkeyes won a 20-13 Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series matchup at Iowa State. Ferentz is the 27th head coach to reach the milestone at an FBS institution and just the 99th college coach across all divisions since 1890.
- Iowa is back in the AP Top 25 poll in Week 2, coming in at No. 25. The Hawkeyes also enter the AFCA Coaches' Poll at No. 24 and are receiving votes in the FWAA-NFF Super 16 Poll. (The team was No. 25 in the preseason AP Poll.)
- Senior DB Sebastian Castro was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 11 after returning an interception 30 yards for a touchdown, collecting four tackles and a pass breakup in Iowa's 20-13 road win at Iowa State.
- Tight End U -- Iowa's tight end duo of Luke Lachey and Erick All has combined for 16 catches for 178 yards and one touchdown in the Hawkeyes' first two wins of 2023. Lachey has a team-best 10 catches for 131 yards, while All has six receptions for 47 yards and one touchdown.
- Lachey and All have combined for 106 career receptions for 1,274 yards and seven touchdowns.
- QB Cade McNamara is 15-3 as a starter in 18 career collegiate starts. The Nevada native is 29-of-52 for 314 yards and two touchdowns in two starts as a Hawkeye with a 115.3 passer efficiency rating. McNamara's first completion as a Hawkeye was a 36-yard TD pass to transfer WR Seth Anderson on the second play of the season.
- RS freshman RB Jaziun Patterson rushed for a career-best 86 rushing yards on 10 attempts (8.6 avg.), including a 4-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. Patterson had a career-long 59-yard run on third-and-1 on Iowa's opening possession. It was the second-longest rush by a Hawkeye dating back to the 2022 season.
- The Hawkeyes have had one interception in each of the first two games, including Sebastian Castro's 30-yard pick-six in the road win at Iowa State. The interception return for a touchdown extended Iowa's streak to 16 consecutive seasons (and 21 of the last 23 years). It is the second-longest active streak nationally.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, Iowa is 65-2 when leading by eight points at any point of the game.
- Iowa's defense has allowed one touchdown or less in 11 of its last 15 games dating back to the start of the 2022 season.
- The Hawkeye defense has scored six points during the 2023 season and 46 points since the start of the 2022 season.
- DL Logan Lee blocked Iowa State's Chase Contreras's field goal on the opening possession of the game. It was the second blocked kick of Lee's career. Iowa has blocked a kick/punt in each of the past three seasons.
- LB Jay Higgins is second in the Big Ten and 13th nationally, averaging 11.5 tackles per game. The Indianapolis native had a career-high 16 tackles in the season opener against Utah State.
- DB Cooper DeJean had 10 tackles in Iowa's road win at Iowa State in Week 2. It was DeJean's third career game with 10 or more tackles.
- The Hawkeyes are 1-0 this season and 7-1 dating back to the start of the 2022 season when not committing a turnover. The team is 8-1 in the same span when winning the turnover battle.
- Special special teams... P Tory Taylor is averaging 47.5 yards on 12 punts this season with four being fair caught, three being down inside the 20 and five traveling 50+ yards. K Drew Stevens is 3-for-3 in field goal attempts and all 10 of his kickoffs have been touchbacks.
- The Hawkeyes have 220 interceptions since 2009 -- the second-most nationally. Iowa's 34 interception returns for a touchdown are third-most in the nation in that span.
- Iowa ranks seventh nationally with the most consecutive winning seasons amongst Power 5 programs. Iowa is one of six teams to win eight or more games each year since 2015 (excluding COVID).

SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's game will be the fourth meeting all-time between Iowa and Western Michigan. The Broncos hold a 2-1 advantage in the series, winning 27-21 in 2000 and 28-19 in 2007. The Hawkeyes won the most recent meeting, 59-3, in 2013 when P.J. Fleck was Western Michigan's head coach.

- The Hawkeyes have won their last five games against teams from the Mid-American Conference. Iowa's last loss to a MAC team came against Northern Illinois, 30-27, in the 2013 season opener.

AT THE TOP

Kirk Ferentz is in his 25th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz has 115 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach, tied for the third most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history.

- Ferentz's 188 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference.
- Ferentz won his 200th career game on Sept. 11 at Iowa State. He is the 27th coach at an FBS institution to reach the 200-career win milestone and the 99th coach across all divisions. Former Hawkeye head coach Hayden Fry finished his career with 236 victories.

STAFF CONSISTENCY

Iowa is one of just seven programs from across the country that has retained all 10 of its assistant coaches from the 2022 season. Five of the Hawkeye assistants are in at least their eighth season on the Iowa coaching staff -- the second-highest total nationally.

- Defensive coordinator Phil Parker and special teams coordinator LeVar Woods were named to the 247Sports All-Big Ten Coaches first team this summer. Woods' 95.80 score on the Coach Rating Index is second highest in the Big Ten. Parker also had the highest CRI amongst defensive back coaches (81.74).
- Defensive line coach Kelvin Bell and linebackers coach Seth Wallace were named to the 247Sports All-Big Ten Coaches second team.

ALUMS ON STAFF

The Hawkeyes have five University of Iowa alums on the coaching staff -- Brian Ferentz, Abdul Hodge, LeVar Woods, Kelvin Bell and Ladell Betts. The five alums are tied for the second most nationally (trailing only Air Force, 8).

CASTRO EARNS B1G DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Senior DB Sebastian Castro was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 11. The Illinois native had a 30-yard interception return for a touch-down in the second quarter, had four tackles and added a pass breakup in Iowa's 20-13 road victory at Iowa State. Castro's pick-six extended Iowa's active streak to 16 consecutive seasons -- the second-longest streak nationally.

A JAZZY PERFORMANCE

Redshirt freshman Jaziun Patterson rushed for a career-high 86 yards on 10 attempts -- both career highs -- and he scored his first career touchdown in Iowa's 20-13 road win at Iowa State in Week 2. On the Hawkeyes' opening possession of the game, Patterson had a 59-yard rush on third-and-1 to set up Iowa's opening field goal. The rush is the second-longest by a Hawkeye dating back to the start of the 2022 season (Kaleb Johnson, 75 yards at Purdue).

TIGHT END U!!

Iowa's potent 1-2 tight end duo of junior Luke Lachey and graduate transfer Erick All have combined for 16 catches for 178 yards and one touchdown over the first two games.

- Lachey, who has at least one catch in nine straight games, has a team-high 10 catches for 131 yards, including two catches of 30+ yards. He tied a career-high with seven receptions for 73 yards in Week 1 against Utah State.
- Over Lachey's last five games (dating back to 2022), he has 25 catches for 333 yards and two touchdowns.
- All has six catches for 47 yards and a touchdown. His first career reception as a Hawkeye went for a 3-yard touchdown against Utah State.
- The prolific duo has combined for 106 career catches for 1,274 yards and seven touchdowns.
- Lachey and All are both on the Mackey Award Watch List. Iowa is one of five teams nationally to have two players on the preseason honors list.

STINGY D

Iowa's defense has allowed one touchdown or less in 11 of its last 15 games, dating back to the start of the 2022 season. The Hawkeyes allowed a late touchdown (against the second team defense) in the season opener against Utah State and Iowa State scored late in Week 2 in Ames.

- The Hawkeye defense held five teams without a touchdown during the 2022 season.

AIR RAID

Iowa went to the air to score its first two touchdowns of the 2023 season in the season-opening 24-14 victory over Utah State. QB Cade McNamara had a 36-yard touchdown pass to WR Seth Anderson on his first attempt as a Hawkeye (and the second play of the game) and McNamara connected with fellow Michigan transfer Erick All for a 3-yard touchdown on Iowa's second possession.

- Iowa's opening drive touchdown pass was the first to open a season since 1991 vs. Hawai'i (Matt Rodgers to Danan Hughes) and it was the first time in the Kirk Ferentz era that Iowa opened the season with a passing touchdown.
- Iowa had touchdowns on consecutive drives for the first time since Nov. 5, 2022, at Purdue and the unit had two first-quarter touchdown passes first the first time since 2018 (T.J. Hockenson, Noah Fant) against Indiana.

MCNAMARA FOLLOWS CHUCK LONG

QB Cade McNamara's first passing attempt as a Hawkeye went for a touchdown when he connected with WR Seth Anderson for a 36-yard score on the second play of Iowa's 24-14 win over Utah State.

- McNamara is the first Iowa quarterback since Chuck Long in 1983 to have a touchdown pass on his first completion of the season (24 yards to Norm Granger against Iowa State).

JAY "TACKLE" HIGGINS

Senior LB Jay Higgins ranks second in the Big Ten and is tied for 13th nationally in tackles, averaging 11.5 tackles per game through the first two weeks of the season. The Indianapolis native had a career-high 16 tackles, including a career-best 12 solo stops, and one pass breakup in Iowa's 24-14 victory over Utah State in Week 1. They were the most by a Hawkeye since Butkus Award-winning linebacker Jack Campbell had 16 tackles in the regular season finale against Nebraska in 2022.

- It was Higgins second career game with 10 or more tackles. He had 11 stops last season against Northwestern.

DBS MAKE THE STOP

Iowa defensive backs Cooper DeJean and Deshaun Lee combined for 19 tackles in Iowa's 20-13 Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series road win at Iowa State. DeJean had 10 tackles – his third career game with 10 or more stops – and Lee had a career-high nine stops against the Cyclones.

- DeJean and Lee are second and third on the team in tackles with 17 and 15, respectively.

BLOCK-R-US

Senior DL Logan Lee blocked Iowa State's Chase Contreras's field goal on the Cyclones' opening possession of the game in Iowa's 20-13 road win in Ames. It was Lee's second career blocked kick. He also blocked a field goal attempt versus Minnesota in 2021.

- The Hawkeyes have blocked at least one kick/punt in each of the last three seasons. Iowa blocked three kicks during the 2022 season.

A CLEAN NOTE PAD

The Hawkeyes didn't commit a penalty in their Week 2 road win at Iowa State. It is the second time in Iowa's last five games that the team didn't commit a penalty (at Minnesota, 2022).

- Iowa ranks fifth nationally in fewest penalty yards per game (25.0), sixth in fewest penalty yards (50) and ninth in fewest penalties (7) and fewest penalties per game (3.5).

HARRIS SET TO RETURN

The Hawkeyes will welcome the return of junior DB Jermari Harris to the secondary Week 3 against Western Michigan. The Illinois native has six career starts and has played in 20 career games during his Hawkeye career. He has four interceptions and 36 career tackles heading into the 2023 season after missing the entire 2022 season because of injury.

X ON THE SPOT

Sophomore S Xavier Nwankpa recorded the second interception of his Hawkeye career when he picked off Utah State's Cooper Legas in the third quarter of Iowa's 24-14 victory on Sept. 2. Nwankpa has two interceptions in three career starts.

HAWKEYES RETURN 3 ALL-AMERICANS

Iowa returns three players who garnered All-America recognition in 2022 in P Tory Taylor, K Drew Stevens and RB Kaleb Johnson.

- Taylor was named first-team All-America by the FWAA, Phil Steele and Pro Football Focus. The Australian averaged 45.4 yards on 82 punts and opponents averaged just 4.4 yards on 21 returns.
- Stevens was named second-team Freshman All-America by College Football News, while Johnson earned honorable mention honors. Stevens had an Iowa freshman record 16 field goals and a team-best 72 points in 2022, while Johnson had a freshman record 779 rushing yards and six touchdowns, including three 100-yard games.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

The Hawkeyes return six starters from a defense that was amongst the nation's best in 2022. Iowa held nine opponents to 10 or fewer points – a first for the program since 1903 – and posted two shutouts, including the first in Music City Bowl history.

- The 2022 defense limited opponents to 270.8 yards and 13.3 points, ranking second nationally in both statistical categories. The 270.8 yards were the lowest by a Hawkeye defense since 1981 (253.6) and the 13.3 points allowed were the fewest since 2008 (13.0).
- In two games this season, Iowa is surrendering 13.5 points per game to rank 26th nationally and 309.5 yards, which ranks 46th.

BALL HAWKS

- Iowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 16 seasons and 21 of the last 23 seasons.
- DB Sebastian Castro's 30-yard pick-six at Iowa State in Week 2 extended the streak to 16 straight seasons, which is the second-longest active streak in the nation behind Utah (19). Iowa is one of four teams nationally to have a pick-six streak of 10-plus years.
- Iowa has two interceptions and one defensive touchdown in 2023. The Hawkeyes led the Big Ten and the nation with six defensive touchdowns (four interceptions, two fumble returns) during the 2022 season.
- Iowa forced 23 turnovers (eight fumble recoveries, 15 interceptions) and scored 66 points off the miscues a season ago.

NICO'S SIXTH YEAR

Sixth-year senior Nico Ragaini returns as the veteran of Iowa's wide receiver room. The Connecticut native has 129 career receptions for 1,398 yards with five touchdowns.

- Ragaini's 129 career receptions rank 12th all-time in program history and his 1,378 receiving yards rank 28th in the record books.

IN THE SLOW COOKER

Iowa's offensive line will be more experienced in 2023 with upperclassmen expected to start in four of the five positions.

- Iowa's returning offensive linemen have played in 218 games with 131 career starts amongst the group. Entering the season, Iowa's offensive line played in 209 games, which were tied for the ninth-most in the nation and their 126 starts ranked 10th.

- Transfer Rusty Feth is the most experienced lineman on the Iowa roster, as he started 34 games and played in 38 contests at Miami (Ohio) prior to joining the Hawkeyes.

- OT Gennings Dunker -- a sophomore -- is the youngest starter on Iowa's offensive line.

KJ2 -- SUPERMAN -- RETURNS

- Freshman RB Kaleb Johnson rushed for a team-high 63 yards on 19 attempts and found the end zone for the seventh time in his career in the opening win over Utah State. Johnson has a team-best 91 yards on 34 attempts through the first two weeks of the 2023 season.

- Johnson rushed for an Iowa freshman record 779 yards on 151 carries in 2022, which included three 100-yard games and a team-high six touchdowns.

- He has rushed for 870 career yards, 130 shy of reaching 1,000 for his career.

- Johnson had his first career 200-yard game (second career 100-yard game), finishing with 200 yards on 22 attempts with one touchdown -- his fourth of the season -- in the road win at Purdue. The yardage and attempts were both career highs.

- The 200 rushing yards were the 18th-most in a single game in program history and the second-most by a Hawkeye freshman all-time (Marcus Coker, 219 vs. Missouri, Insight Bowl). He was the first Hawkeye to rush for 200 yards in a game since 2015.

EXPERIENCE ON DL

The Hawkeyes return two starters on the defensive line in 2023 in Joe Evans and Logan Lee. The duo started all 13 games for during the 2022 season and they have a combined 44 career starts.

- Evans tied for the team lead with 6.5 sacks last season and he finished with 41 tackles, including 8.5 tackles for loss. The Ames, Iowa, native has 18.5 career sacks.

- Lee has started 29 consecutive games. The Illinois, native had 54 tackles, including eight tackles for loss and three sacks a season ago.

- DE Deontae Craig tied for the team lead with 6.5 sacks and had 10 TFL in a reserve role in 2022. He also forced three fumbles and had 31 tackles a season ago.

DYNAMIC DREW

Kicker Drew Stevens' sophomore season has begun with three makes on three field goal attempts through the first two weeks of 2023. Stevens made both field goal attempts in the road win at Iowa State. It was the sixth time in his career he has made two or more field goals.

- Stevens has made 19-of-21 field goal attempts in his career and he hasn't missed an extra point. This season, Stevens has had a touchback in each of his 10 kickoffs.

- As a freshman, Stevens earned freshman All-America honors during the 2022 season after making 16-of-18 field goals -- the most by a Hawkeye freshman all-time (passing Mike Meyer and Nate Kaeding). In the offseason, Stevens added 20 pounds to his 6'1" frame.

- The South Carolina native went 7-for-7 from 20-29 yards, 3-for-3 from 30-39 yards, 4-of-6 from 40-49 and 2-for-2 from 50+ in 2022. Stevens finished tops in the Big Ten and 16th nationally with an .889 field goal percentage and he

- Stevens is listed on the Lou Groza National Collegiate Place-Kicker Award Watch List. Last season, he was one of 20 semifinalists for the honor.
- Stevens made a career-long 54-yard field goal in Iowa's 33-13 win over Northwestern. It was one of a career-high four field goal makes against the Wildcats, which led to him earning Big Ten Freshman of the Week and Groza Stars of the Week honors on Oct. 31. The 54-yarder tied for the seventh-longest in program history and was the longest by a Hawkeye since Marshall Koehn drilled a 57-yarder in 2015.
- He made two field goals at Minnesota – from 38 and 21 yards. The 21-yard field goal was a game-winner with 28 seconds remaining in the game.

THE MOST FAMOUS PUNTER IN AMERICA

Punter Tory Taylor's senior season – his fourth as the Hawkeyes' starting punter – has 12 punts for a 47.5 yard average through the first two weeks of the 2023 season with five punts of 50+ yards, four being fair caught and three being downed inside the 20-yard line.

- Taylor was named to the Ray's 8 for his efforts in Week 1 in Iowa's season-opening win over Utah State.
- Taylor has a 45.6 career average over 214 punts with 101 – 47.2 percent -- landing inside the 20-yardline.
- Taylor set the school record for punt yardage in consecutive years. He had 80 punts for 3,688 yards in 2022 and 82 punts for 3,725 yards in 2023.
- His 45.4 average in 2022 was second in the Big Ten and 11th nationally.
- He punted a career-high 10 times for 479 yards, averaging 47.9 yards per attempt, against South Dakota State on Sept. 3. Taylor had punts downed at the 1, 2, 6, 8, 8 and 12-yard lines and seven of his punts were inside the 20.
- Taylor has been named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week three times in his career (2021 at Iowa State, 2022 vs. South Dakota State and 2022 at Rutgers).
- During the Music City Bowl win over Kentucky, Taylor tied a bowl record with eight punts for 386 yards (48.3 avg.). Four of his punts pinned the Wildcats inside the 10 and two were inside the 15. He tied Nick Gallery (1993 Alamo) and Jason Baker (1997 Sun) with eight punts.

WORLD CHAMPION; DUAL SPORT HAWKEYE

Freshman LB Ben Kueter is a world champion wrestler, winning the U20 World Wrestling Championship in July, 2022. The Iowa City, Iowa, native was named the USA Today Boys Wrestler of the Year for 2022-23 and he was one of five finalists for the high school Butkus Award.

- Kueter will be a dual-sport athlete for the Hawkeyes, as he will also compete on the Iowa wrestling team.

LEE NOMINATED FOR AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Senior defensive lineman Logan Lee has been nominated for the AFCA Good Works Team. The award recognizes the extra efforts made by college football players and student support staff off the field.

HAWKEYE FREAKS

Two Hawkeyes -- DB Cooper DeJean and C Logan Jones -- are on listed on Bruce Feldman's college football Freaks List. DeJean comes in at No. 14 after clocking a 0.92 score in his flying 10s and a 2.39 in his 20-yard spring out of a two-point stance. Jones is ranked No. 52 after being second in Iowa history in hang-clean and setting a record with a 700-pound squat, while vertical jumping 36 inches.

HALE BAY CHAMP

For a second straight year, sophomore OL Gennings Dunker prevailed as the Solon Beef Days hale bay champion. Dunker finished with a record toss of 14'6" to beat fellow Hawkeye OL Logan Jones. (Hay bales weigh approximately 60 pounds.)

2023 PLAYER COUNCIL

- Epenesa’s brother, A.J., played at Iowa from 2017-19.
- WR Alex Eichmann’s grandfather, Richard “Dick” Gibbs, played at Iowa from 1965-66.
- RB Max White is the great, great grandson of Max Hawkins, a member of University of Iowa’s famed ‘Ironmen’ team in 1939 that included Iowa Heisman Trophy winner Nile Kinnick.
- Four Hawkeyes had relatives that played for the Hawkeyes -- OL Griffin Liddle’s father, Josh, wrestled at Iowa, DL Andrew Kraus’ father, Matt, played baseball, DL Max Llewellyn’s brother, Luke, played baseball at Iowa and TE Jalyn Thompson’s father, Rod, played basketball.

KINNICK: SOLD OUT

All seven University of Iowa home football games are sold out for the 2023 season. It is the second consecutive season that the Hawkeyes have sold out the stadium for the entire season.

IN THE RANKINGS

- Iowa is back in the AP Top 25 poll in Week 2, coming in at No. 25. The Hawkeyes also enter the AFCA Coaches’ Poll at No. 24 and are receiving votes in the FWAA-NFF Super 16 Poll. (The team was No. 25 in the preseason AP Poll.)
- The Hawkeyes were ranked No. 25 in the preseason AP Poll for the fourth time in the last five years and the 10th time in the Kirk Ferentz era (27th time overall).
- The Hawkeyes finished the 2022 season receiving votes in the final AP and AFCA Coaches polls. Iowa was 33rd in the coaches’ poll with nine votes and 34th in the AP Poll with four votes.
- Prior to 2022, Iowa had been ranked in the AP Top 25 at least once in each of the last seven seasons, the third-longest streak in school history.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,296 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa’s overall record is 686-571-39 (.544). That includes a 425-227-16 (.648) record in home games, a 261-344-23 (.433) record in games away from Iowa City, a 353-389-25 (.477) mark in Big Ten games and a 309-192-15 (.613) record in Kinnick Stadium.

TROPHY COLLECTION

- The Hawkeyes won their first trophy game of the 2023 season, winning 20-13 in an Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series matchup at Iowa State. Iowa has won seven of the last eight meetings against the Cyclones.
- Iowa went 3-2 in trophy games in 2022. The Hawkeyes fell 10-7 to Iowa State in their first trophy game – the team’s first loss to the Cyclones since 2014. Iowa reclaimed the Heartland Trophy on Nov. 12, downing Wisconsin, 24-10, in Kinnick Stadium, and defeated Minnesota for the eighth straight time, winning 13-10, to retain the Floyd of Rosedale trophy. Nebraska downed Iowa, 24-17, in the regular season finale to claim the Heroes Trophy for the first time since 2013.
- The Hawkeyes closed out the season with a 21-0 win to hoist the TransPerfect Music City Bowl trophy.
- Iowa is 29-9 in its last 38 trophy games (includes bowl games and conference championships). The Hawkeyes are 25-8 in their last 33 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).

HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

Iowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers. Since 2010, 50 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft. Today, 37 Hawkeyes are on NFL rosters.

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

• Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

• The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 21 times in the last 22 seasons. Iowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

• Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz won the 10th bowl game of his career in the Hawkeyes' 21-0 win over Kentucky in the 2022 TransPerfect Music City Bowl, tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 10-9 bowl record.

• Eighteen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Nick Saban (18), Mack Brown (14), Kyle Whittingham (11), Mike Gundy (11) and Dabo Swinney (11) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.

• Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (12) have more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than Iowa. Iowa is 18-16-1 all-time in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

3 HAWKEYES NAMED FINALISTS FOR SENIOR BOWL 75TH ANNIVERSARY TEAM BALLOT

Former University of Iowa football players Nate Kaeding, Bob Sanders and Marshal Yanda have been named finalists on the Senior Bowl 75th Anniversary Team ballot.

The inaugural Senior Bowl was played in Jacksonville, Florida, in 1950 and moved to Mobile, Alabama, the following year, where it has become an annual tradition for over seven decades. Players who were on NFL rosters between 1998-2023 are eligible for selection to the 75th Anniversary Team.

The 75th Anniversary Team selection process will include fan participation, as well as input from current NFL executives and the Senior Bowl's executive committee. Fans can vote at seniorbowl.com.

PHIL PARKER'S IOWA DEFENSE

- Phil Parker was named PFF's top defensive coordinator in college football in April, 2023.
- Since Parker took over as Iowa's defensive coordinator, Iowa is second in the Big Ten and fifth nationally in points (18.82), first in the Big Ten and fifth nationally in total offense (326.65), first in the big ten and third nationally in yards per play (4.82) and the unit ranks second in the nation in interceptions (170).
- The Hawkeyes have top-six scoring defenses nationally in three of the past four years. The scoring defense has ranked in the top 20 in the nation in each of the last eight years.
- Iowa's 3.986 yards per play during the 2022 season were the lowest by any team at the FBS level since Florida State's 3.853 in 2012.
- In 2022, the Hawkeyes led FBS in points per drive (1.09), yards per pass attempt (5.3), yards per rush (2.8) and ranked second in FBS in points per game (13.3) and yards per game (270.8).
- Iowa's 270.8 yards per game surrendered was the fewest by an Iowa defense since 1981.
- The defense had a 79 percent stop rate -- drives that ended in punts, turnovers or turnovers on downs -- to lead the country.
- Iowa has 220 interceptions since the start of the 2009 season -- the second-most nationally in that span. The "BallHawks" had a school record 25 interceptions in 2021.
- A principle of Parker's defense is to limit explosive plays, forcing the offense to sustain a drive. Iowa surrendered just 15 explosive plays out of 883 defensive snaps over 13 games during the 2022 season.
- Iowa has had five players win the Big Ten Tatum-Woodson Defensive Back of the Year since 2012: Micah Hyde, 2012; Desmond King, 2015; Josh Jackson, 2017; Amani Hooker, 2018; Riley Moss, 2021).

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ



Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 25th season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2029 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and Big Ten West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant

Coach of the Year award.

- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 188 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He has 115 Big Ten wins, which ties for third all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 12 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 179-94 (.653) overall mark and a 111-69 (.617) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 16 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 188-115 (.619) and a 115-83 (.581) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 188 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 200-136 (.594), giving him the fourth most wins among active head coaches.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steve was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.
- James Ferentz is in his eighth NFL season as a member of the New England Patriots. Steve Ferentz is in his first season as a member of coaching staff at the University of South Dakota (outside linebackers coach).

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 21 of the last 22 seasons. Iowa is 10-9 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (12) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 18-16-1 in 35 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (188-115) replaced Fry and has completed 24 seasons. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa won the Big Ten West Division title in 2021 and made its second appearance in the Big Ten Championship game. The Hawkeyes played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP Poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP Poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 354 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 13 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End), Tyler Linderbaum, (Rimington, Top Center), Jack Campbell (Campbell Trophy, Butkus Award).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa has six unanimous consensus All-Americans since 2010, the third-most in the nation.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 213 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (85 draft picks/128 free agents).
- Seventeen former Hawkeyes participated in the 2023 NFL Playoffs, a number that ranked eighth nationally among programs and former players. Just one Big Ten program (Ohio State) had more former players participating in the playoffs.
- Iowa and Florida lead all schools with five offensive tackles currently active in the NFL.
- Iowa is tied with Miami, Florida, Notre Dame, Penn State and Stanford with the most tight ends active in the NFL (4).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (45 consecutive years).
- Iowa has had 13 First Round NFL Draft picks under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- Iowa had two first round picks in the 2023 NFL Draft -- LB Lukas Van Ness (Packers) and LB Jack Campbell (Lions). It is the fourth time in program history Iowa has had two players selected in the first round.

- OT Tristan Wirfs and TEs George Kittle and T.J. Hockenson were both selected to the Pro Bowl in 2023. Wirfs and Kittle were Second Team NFL All-Pro selections.
- Two former Hawkeyes -- Jake Gervase and Alaric Jackson -- were members of the Los Angeles Rams' 2022 Super Bowl champion team.
- OT Tristan Wirfs earned first-team All-Pro and was a Pro Bowl selection in 2021.
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson (Detroit), TE George Kittle (San Francisco) and Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 23 years, 204-of-245 (83 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 15 years, Iowa has had 57 NFL Draft picks, the third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (89), Michigan (72).
- Iowa has had 10 first round picks in the last 13 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020; OL Tyler Linderbaum, 2022; LB Lukas Van Ness, 2023, LB Jack Campbell, 2023.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 11th year on staff and sixth as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz, WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.
- Former OL Tristan Wirfs was the starting right tackle as a rookie for the 2021 Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Former DL Anthony Nelson was a reserve defensive end for the Bucs. Former LB Ben Niemann and LB Anthony Hitchens were on the AFC Champion Kansas City Chiefs.
- Entering the 2023 season, every Iowa senior starting tight end (17) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 19 Iowa tight ends since 1999 (12 drafted/7 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

No. 25 Iowa (1-0) defeated Utah State (0-1), 24-14, in its season opener on Saturday inside Kinnick Stadium.

- Iowa is now 100-33-2 in season opener, including 21-4 all-time under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- The win is Ferentz's 199th career victory and his 187th win at Iowa.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- QB Cade McNamara completed 17-of-30 attempts (56.6 percent) for 191 yards and two touchdowns in his Iowa debut (17th career start).
- McNamara had a 36-yard touchdown pass on his first career attempt as a Hawkeye. He is the first Iowa quarterback since Chuck Long in 1983 to have a touchdown pass on his first completion of the season (24 yards to Norm Granger against Iowa State).
- TE Luke Lachey tied a career-high with seven receptions for 73 yards, including a 31-yarder in the fourth quarter.
- Iowa's tight ends (Lachey and Erick All) combined for 10 catches for 88 yards and one touchdown.
- RB Kaleb Johnson led Iowa's rushing attack with 63 yards on 19 attempts, including a 3-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. It is Johnson's seventh career rushing touchdown.
- Johnson also had a career-long 54-yard kickoff return on the opening kickoff of the 2023 season.
- WR Seth Anderson had a 36-yard touchdown reception and TE Erick All had a 3-yard touchdown reception – both players' first career receptions at Iowa.
- LB Jay Higgins had a career high 16 tackles, including 12 solo stops. It was his second career game with 10 or more tackles.
- DB Xavier Nwankpa had his second career interception in the second quarter. Nwankpa has two interceptions in two career starts.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Iowa's opening drive touchdown pass was the first to open a season since 1991 vs. Hawaii (Matt Rodgers-to-Danan Hughes). It is the first time in the Kirk Ferentz era that Iowa opened the season with a passing touchdown.
- Iowa had touchdowns on consecutive drives for the first time since Nov. 5, 2022, at Purdue and it is the first time the unit had two first-quarter touchdowns in the opening quarter since Nevada (9/17/22).
- DL Deontae Craig, DL Yahya Black and DB Deshaun Lee made their first career starts. QB Cade McNamara, TE Erick All and LB Nick Jackson made their first career starts as Hawkeyes.

IOWA NOTES

- The win is head coach Kirk Ferentz's 200th career victory and his 188th at Iowa. He is the 27th head coach to reach the 200-win milestone at an FBS institution.
- Iowa has won six straight games over Iowa State in Ames and seven of the last eight meetings overall. The Hawkeyes are now 47-23 all-time against Iowa State.
- Iowa now leads the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series, 5-2, through the first three matchups during the 2023-24 season.
- In three out of the last four meetings, the outcome has been decided by one score.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- RB Jaziun Patterson had a career-best 86 rushing yards on 10 attempts, including a 4-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. It was the first touchdown run of his career.
- Patterson had a career-long 59-yard run on third-and-1 on Iowa's opening possession. The 59-yard rush is the second-longest rush dating back to the 2022 season.
- TE Luke Lachey had three receptions for a team-high 58 yards and TE Erick All had three catches for 32 yards. In two games, the tight end duo has 16 receptions for 178 yards and one touchdown.
- CASH Sebastian Castro had a 30-yard interception return for a touchdown to give Iowa a 17-0 lead. It was Castro's first career interception and his second career defensive touchdown (fumble return at Rutgers).
- DL Logan Lee blocked Iowa State's Chase Contreras's field goal on the opening possession of the game. It is the second blocked kick of Lee's career (vs. Minnesota). Iowa has blocked a kick/punt in each of the last three seasons.
- DB Cooper DeJean had 10 tackles, including six solo stops. It is the third time in his career he has had 10 or more tackles.
- K Drew Stevens went 2-for-2 on field goal attempts. It is the sixth time in Stevens' career he has made two or more field goals. The North Carolina native is 3-for-3 on field goal attempts this season.
- Stevens is 19-of-21 in field goal attempts for his Hawkeye career.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Iowa extended its pick 6 streak to 16 consecutive seasons (and 21 of the last 23 years) with Sebastian Castro's 30-yard pick 6 in the second quarter. The streak is the second longest nationally.
- Iowa's defense has allowed one touchdown or less in 11 of its last 15 games, dating back to the start of the 2022 season. The Hawkeyes allowed one touchdown (and two field goals) in its season-opening 24-14 triumph over Utah State on Sept. 2 in Kinnick Stadium. Since the start of the 2015 season, Iowa is now 65-2 when leading by eight points at any point in a game.
- The Hawkeyes scored on their opening possession in back-to-back games (TD vs. Utah State, FG vs. Iowa State).
- Iowa had an eight-play, 80-yard scoring drive on its second possession – it's longest scoring drive of the season.
- Iowa didn't commit a penalty in the game (and there were only two penalties in the game). It is the second time in the last five games that the Hawkeyes didn't commit a penalty (at Minnesota, 2022).
