### THIS WEEK

The seventh-ranked University of Iowa field hockey team opens postseason play on Thursday, facing No. 8 Maryland at 4 p.m. (CT) in the quarterfinals of the 2023 Big Ten Tournament. The tournament will be held at Phyllis Ocker Field Hockey Field in Ann Arbor, Michigan.

- The winner of Iowa vs. Maryland will face the winner of Michigan and Rutgers on Friday at 2:30 (CT).

### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Iowa is ranked No. 7 in this week's NFCA poll. The Hawkeyes were ranked No. 1 for four weeks straight (Sept. 5 - Oct. 2) for the second time in program history (2021). Iowa has been ranked in 81 consecutive polls dating back to the 2016 season.
- Iowa leads the nation in scoring average (3.41), scoring margin (2.41), and goals (58). The Hawkeyes rank second in shutouts per game (0.47), shutouts (8), third in goals per game (3.41) and points (156), and fifth in goals against average (1.00) and points per game (9.18).
- The Hawkeye seniors have won two Big Ten regular season championships and one Big Ten tournament title. They have competed in three NCAA Elite Eights and the 2021 NCAA final four.
- Freshman Dionne van Aalsum was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week after tallying two goals and an assist this past weekend in Iowa's upset win over No. 3 Rutgers. The Castricum, Netherlands, native was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week four times this season (Sept. 11, Sept. 18, Oct. 16, Oct. 30), Big Ten Freshman of the Week four times this season (Aug. 26, Sept. 5, Sept. 11, Oct. 30), and NFCA Offensive Player of the Week on September 13. Van Aalsum leads the nation with 27 goals, 60 points, 1.59 goals per game, and 3.53 points per game.
- Sophomore Mia Magnotta has recorded 61 saves and has been in goal the duration of the season including all of Iowa's eight shutout victories. The Forty-Fort, Pennsylvania, native was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on August 29 and NFCA Division I Defensive Player of the week on August 30.
- Iowa has defeated the top-ranked team in three straight seasons (3-1 vs. No. 1 North Carolina in 2021, 2-0 vs. No. 1 Northwestern in 2022 and 3-2 vs. No. 1 North Carolina in 2023).
- The Hawkeyes' win over No. 3 Rutgers this past weekend was their sixth win against a ranked opponent this season. Iowa previously downed No. 1 North Carolina, No. 5 Louisville, No. 12 Wake





Lisa Cellucci enters her 24th season as a member of the University of Iowa field hockey team's coaching staff in 2023-24 and her 10th as head coach. Cellucci, a three-time All-American and member of the U.S. National Team, is the all-time saves leader at Iowa. In her 23 years at Iowa, the Hawkeyes have compiled a 280-175 record and have been consistently ranked in the top 15 of the NFHCA national rankings.

In the past four seasons, the Hawkeyes have been a top 10 team in the national poll and the team ascended to the No. 1 spot in the rankings for seven straight weeks during the 2021 season. Iowa has advanced to the Elite Eight in each of the last four seasons, including a Final Four appearance in the spring of 2021.

Cellucci earned back-to-back-to-back Big Ten Coach of the Year honors (2019-21), becoming the first coach in Big Ten history to accomplish the feat. She and her staff have earned NFHCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year honors twice.

In her nine years as head coach, Cellucci has coached:

- 18 NFHCA All-Americans
- 34 NFHCA All-West Regional selections
- 25 All-Big Ten selections, including 11 first-team honorees three NFHCA West Region Players of the Year, two Big Ten Player of the Years, two Big Ten Defensive Player of the Years, three Big Ten Offensive Players of the Year and one Big Ten Freshman of the Year
- 85 Academic All-Big Ten selections, 74 NFHCA National Academic Squad honorees, 40 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, and 66 NFHCA Scholars of Distinction selections.

The Hawkeyes advanced to their fourth straight NCAA Elite Eight in 2022, finishing the season with a 12-8 overall record. Iowa, which finished the year ranked 11th in the NFHCA poll, advanced to its 21st Elite Eight with a shootout win over Virginia in the Sweet 16. The season ended in a shootout fashion, falling in a 2-1 heartbreaker at Northwestern.

Forest, No. 14 Michigan, and No. 19 UAlbany.

- The Hawkeyes return seven starters and 14 letterwinners from a team that finished 12-8, advancing to the Elite Eight for the 21st time in program history in 2022.
- The Hawkeyes made their fifth straight and 27th NCAA Tournament appearance in program history -- the most of any team as a member of the Big Ten Conference.
- Head coach Lisa Cellucci is in her tenth season at the helm of the Hawkeye field hockey program and her 24th season overall. Cellucci has been a part of 289 Iowa victories and in 2020, she led the program to the Final Four for the 12th time -- the first since 2008. Iowa has posted double digit win totals in eight of her ten seasons. The Hawkeyes have won three Big Ten titles (2019, 2019 (BTT), 2021) under her watch.

#### BIG TEN TOURNAMENT HISTORY

The Hawkeyes are 35-23 all-time in the Big Ten Tournament. The 35 wins are the second most among all Big Ten schools. Iowa is 1-1 all-time against Maryland in the tournament, previously defeating the Terrapins, 3-0, in 2021 Big Ten Quarterfinals.

#### NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- The Hawkeyes are 29-27 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.
- Iowa has qualified for five straight NCAA Tournaments -- the longest streak since making a school record 15 consecutive tournaments from 1982-96.

#### CELLUCCI REACHES MILESTONE

Head coach Lisa Cellucci -- the three-time reigning Big Ten Coach of the Year -- earned her 100th career victory on Aug. 26, 2022 when the Hawkeyes downed No. 20 Wake Forest in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. The tenth year head coach is the fourth Hawkeye head coach to reach this 100-win milestone.

- Cellucci earned her third straight Big Ten Coach of the Year honor in 2021. She is the first coach in Big Ten history to be named Coach of the Year in three consecutive seasons.

#### IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

Iowa is ranked No. 7 in this week's NFHCA poll. The Hawkeyes have been ranked in 81 consecutive polls dating back to the 2016 season.

- The Hawkeyes were ranked No. 1 for four weeks in row earlier this season (Sept. 5 - Oct. 2). It was the second time in program history (2021) the Hawkeyes have been ranked No. 1 by the NFHCA.

#### DIONNE VAN AWESOME

Van Aalsum leads the nation with 27 goals, 60 points, 1.59 goals per game, and 3.53 points per game.

- The Castricum, Netherlands, native was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week four times this season (Sept. 11, Sept. 18, Oct. 16, Oct. 30), Big Ten Freshman of the Week four times this season (Aug. 26, Sept. 5, Sept. 11, Oct. 30), and NFHCA Offensive Player of the Week on September 13.
- She scored eight goals in wins over Western Michigan and UMass Lowell to become the first Hawkeye to record a hat trick since Maddy Murphy vs. Indiana in 2019 and the first Hawkeye with four goals in a game since Kim Scrapper vs Brown in 2016.

#### ALL ABOUT THE DEFENSE

Iowa has surrendered 17 goals in 17 games, and the Hawkeye defense has allowed 146 shots and 79 shots on goal.



- The Hawkeyes have recorded eight shutouts in 17 games, three being against ranked opponents. Iowa shutout No. 14 Michigan in its Big Ten opener.
- Iowa's defense ranks second in the nation in shutouts (8) and shutouts per game (.47), and third in goals against average (1.00).

### DOWN GOES NO. 1 FOR THE THIRD STRAIGHT SEASON

Freshman Lieve van Kessel's first career goal in overtime sent the seventh-ranked University of Iowa field hockey team to an upset victory over top ranked North Carolina, 3-2, on the Tar Heels home turf on August 27, 2023. Dionne van Aalsum was the key player in sending the matchup into overtime after scoring her second goal of the game with six minutes left in regulation.

- This was the Hawkeyes' first win against UNC in Chapel Hill.
- This is the second time in program history that Iowa went 2-0 in ACC/Big Ten Challenge (since 2002).
- This was only North Carolina's third loss in Karen Shelton Stadium which opened in 2018.
- This was the first loss for the Tar Heels since November 2021, and their first regular season loss since October 2021.
- The Hawkeyes have downed the No. 1 team in the nation three years in a row (3-1 vs. No. 1 North Carolina in 2021, 2-0 vs. No. 1 Northwestern in 2022 and 3-2 vs. No. 1 North Carolina in 2023).
- Prior to 2021, Iowa hadn't defeated a No. 1 ranked team since 2008. The win snapped Northwestern's 12-game winning streak dating back to last season.

### FRESHMAN, FRESHMAN, FRESHMAN

- Six of Iowa's seven goals in opening weekend were scored by freshmen, including all three against No. 1 North Carolina.
- The four-time Big Ten Freshman Player of the Week Dionne van Aalsum has gone ten-for-17 in multi-goal games in her collegiate career, and she has scored at least one goal in 13 games.
- Freshman Miranda Jackson has recorded two goals against ranked foes, No. 12 Wake Forest and No. 14 Michigan. She has recorded five goals this season ranking third in the Hawkeye offense.
- Freshman Rachel Herbine recorded her first career goals and first multi-goal game against Merrimack College.
- Freshman Lieve van Kessel's first career goal was in overtime against the No. 1 Tar Heels.

### SENIOR SPOTLIGHT

Hawkeye seniors - Sammy Freeman, Mary Jane McNary, Kelly Rose, Sophie Stribos and Esme Gibson - have won 70 games, two Big Ten regular season championships and one Big Ten tournament title. They have also competed in three NCAA Elite Eights and the 2021 NCAA final four in their time in black and gold.

- On the field, this class has earned two All-America, three all-region, two all-conference and two Big Ten all-tournament team honors.
- In the classroom, these scholars have accounted for 12 NFHCA national academic squad honors, 10 academic all-Big Ten selections, and multiple dean's/president's list honors.

### MAGNOTTA IN GOAL

Sophomore goal keeper Mia Magnotta has played the duration of all 17 games this season. She has allowed 17 goals, tallied 61 saves, and has been part of eight Hawkeye shutouts. The Forty-Fort, Pennsylvania native tallied a career high eight saves against No. 2 Northwestern breaking her previous career high six saves she recorded in win over No. 1 North Carolina at the beginning of the season.

### IRON HAWKS

Four returning Hawkeye position players played the duration of last season and rarely leave the field -- Harper Dunne, Esme Gibson, Sofie Stribos, and Lieve Schalk.

### HELPING THE CAUSE

Iowa has 40 assists on its 58 goals this season with eight different players tallying at least two assists. Six different Hawkeyes have at least four assists on the year.

### EXPERIENCE GALORE

- For a third straight year, the Hawkeyes boast a roster with 14 upperclassmen, including two fifth-year seniors, five seniors and six juniors.
- Fifth-year senior Sofie Stribos has started in over 70 consecutive games.
- Senior Harper Dunne started in 65 consecutive games before a season ending injury.

### A STORIED HISTORY

- The Hawkeyes have made 27 NCAA Tournament appearances in program history -- the most of any school as a member of the Big Ten Conference.
- Iowa has made 12 NCAA Final Four appearances, including winning the 1986 NCAA Championship.
- The program's 30 NCAA Tournament victories and 12 NCAA Final Fours are the most of any school as a member of the Big Ten Conference.

### SCOUTING MARYLAND

- Maryland is ranked seventh in the NFCA poll with an overall record of 14-4 and conference record of 7-2.
- The Terrapins are coming off their second Big Ten loss of the season against Northwestern, 5-1.
- Hope Rose leads the team with 12 goals, two assist, and 26 points.

### SERIES RECORDS

- Iowa is 6-20-1 all-time against Maryland.

The Hawkeyes lost to Maryland 4-1 earlier this season. Iowa beat the Terrapins, 3-0, in the first round of the 2020 Big Ten Tournament.
