HAWKEYES | 1st & 10

- The Hawkeyes are 7-2 overall and 4-2 in Big Ten Conference play. Iowa leads the West Division with three weeks remaining in the
- Sweet November. lowa has won 15 of its last 16 games in the month of November.
- How 'bout the D? lowa's defense ranks fourth nationally, giving up 13.7 points per game. The Hawkeyes have allowed one touchdown over their last 12 quarters and three touchdowns over the past 20 quarters.
- Two of the best: Senior LB Jay Higgins is a semifinalist for the Butkus Award, given to the nation's best linebacker, while junior DB Cooper DeJean is a semifinalist for the Thorpe Award, awarded to the nation's best defensive back. Higgins was also named to the midseason list for the 2023 Rotary Lombardi Award.
- Sophomore kicker Drew Stevens is the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week after drilling a game-winning 53-yard field goal with 14 seconds remaining in Iowa's road win over Northwestern on Nov. 4.
- Stevens is the fifth Hawkeye recognized by the Big Ten this season. DB Sebastian Castro, DB Cooper DeJean, LB Nick Jackson and P Tory Taylor (2) -- have combined to earn six Big Ten Conference weekly recognitions this season. Iowa has had the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week four times in 2023.
- lowa is 3-1 in one-score games this season.
- DB Cooper DeJean made his lowa offense debut against Northwestern. On his first play, he took a jet sweep for 8 yards before serving as a decoy on the next play.
- Head coach Kirk Ferentz is one of 20 coaches named to the 2023 Dodd Trophy Midseason Watch List. Ferentz was the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year in 2015.
- Ferentz is one win from moving into a tie with Michigan's Bo Schembechler for most overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference.
- Four Hawkeyes -- Cooper DeJean, Tory Taylor, Jay Higgins and Sebastian Castro -- were selected midseason All-Americans by various outlets. DeJean, Taylor and Higgins were first team honorees.
- Tory Taylor was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week on Oct. 24. The Australian has been named to the Ray's 8 five times and he has twice been named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week in 2023.
- Block Thompson. Iowa DL Anterio Thompson had his second punt block of the season to set up Iowa's first touchdown in the road win at Northwestern. He is one of 13 players nationally with two blocks this season.
- lowa is bowl eligible for the 22nd time in the last 23 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- RB Leshon Williams became the 52nd player in program history to surpass the 1,000 career rushing yards mark in lowa's road win at Northwestern. Williams has a team-high 551 yards this season and 1,032 yards for his career.
- lowa's rushing defense has allowed just one touchdown on the ground in 2023, which is tied for the national lead. The Hawkeyes are one of two teams nationally to allow one rushing touchdowns (UCLA).
- lowa > 400. lowa's defense allowed 170 yards of total offense against Northwestern on Nov. 4. It is the 23rd consecutive game the unit has allowed 400 or fewer yards, the longest active streak nationally.
- The Hawkeyes have allowed 14 or fewer points in 15 of their last 22 games and the defense has held eight teams without a touchdown since the start of the 2022 season. The unit has allowed one touchdown or less in seven of the first nine games of 2023 and in 16 of the last 22 games.
- LB Jay Higgins and LB Nick Jackson have combined for 185 tackles this season -- the highest by a Power 5 tandem in the nation. Higgins leads the Big Ten and ranks second nationally (the most by a Power 5 player) with 12.6 tackles per game. He has two 15+ and seven 10+ tackle games this season. Jackson has two 10+ tackle games this season and 22 for his career.
- Higgins has 81 tackles in six Big Ten games, averaging 13.5 tackles per contest -- 25 more than Northwestern's Bryce Gallagher. Higgins had 18 tackles at Penn State, tied for the sixth-most in a game this season and the most by a Hawkeye since Jack Campbell in

THE SERIES

- Saturday's game is the fourth all-time meeting between lowa and Rutgers. The Hawkeyes are 3-0 against the Scarlet Knights, winning twice in Piscataway and once in lowa City.
- During the lone meeting in Kinnick Stadium, lowa allowed just five first downs, 47 passing yards and 125 yards total offense in 2019.

LEADING THE WEST

The Hawkeyes sit at 4-2 in Big Ten Conference play in 2023, which put them in a one game lead in the West Division with three games remaining in the regular season. Iowa has won two Big Ten West Division titles (2015, 2021).

MORE QUICK HITTERS

- Walking wounded. Three of lowa's most prominent offensive players -- QB Cade McNamara, TE Luke Lachey and TE Erick All -- are sidelined with season-ending injuries.
- The Hawkeyes have eight interceptions through nine weeks (to rank 47th nationally), including Sebastian Castro's 30-yard pick-six in the road win at lowa State. The interception return for a touchdown extended lowa's streak to 16 consecutive seasons (and 21 of the last 23 years). It is the second-longest active streak nationally.
- The Hawkeyes put up a season-high 41 points -- the highest point total in a 25-game stretch against Western Michigan. Iowa scored 51 points in the road win at Maryland in 2021. The team's five touchdowns were the most since that 2021 game in College Park and Iowa finished with 387 yards of total offense, topping the 300-yard mark for the first time in its last seven games.
- lowa is 155-8-1 when allowing 10 points or less since 1970 and 388-59-19 when allowing 10 points or less all-time.
- The Hawkeye defense has scored 10 points during the 2023 season and 50 points since the start of the 2022 season.
- lowa has blocked three kicks during the 2023 season lowa State, Western Michigan and Northwestern. DL Logan Lee blocked lowa State's Chase Contreraz's field goal on the opening possession and DL Anterio Thompson blocked a punt that resulted in a safety against Western Michigan and a second punt at Northwestern. lowa has blocked a kick/punt in each of the past three seasons.

- The Hawkeyes are 2-0 this season and 8-1 dating back to the start of the 2022 season when not committing a turnover. The team is 11-1 in the same span when winning the turnover battle.
- The Hawkeyes have 226 interceptions since 2009 tied for the most in the nation. lowa's 34 interception returns for a touchdown are third-most in the nation in that span.

AT THE TOP

Kirk Ferentz is in his 25th season as lowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz has 119 Big Ten wins as lowa's head coach — the third most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history.

- Ferentz's 193 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference.
- Ferentz won his 200th career game on Sept. 11 at lowa State. He is the 27th coach at an FBS institution to reach the 200-career win milestone and the 99th coach across all divisions. Former Hawkeye head coach Hayden Fry finished his career with 236 victories.

ALUMS ON STAFF

The Hawkeyes have five University of Iowa alums on the coaching staff -- Brian Ferentz, Abdul Hodge, LeVar Woods, Kelvin Bell and Ladell Betts. The five alums are tied for the second most nationally (trailing only Air Force, 8).

IOWA'S DEFENSE...

- has allowed just one touchdown in their last 12 quarters and three touchdowns over their last 20 quarters (five games).
- has given up one touchdown or less in seven of nine games this season. The unit has allowed one touchdown or less in 16 of the last 22 contests and has held eight teams without a touchdown since the start of the 2022 season.
- allowed a season-low six points in the road win at Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes shut out the Badgers in the first half and it marked just the fourth time in the last 20 years for Wisconsin to be shutout in the first half at home.
- has allowed one rushing touchdown in nine games, which is tied for the national lead. (lowa is one of two teams to have allowed one rushing touchdown this season (UCLA).
- allowed just 81 passing yards to Northwestern on Nov.
 4 the fewest since 2019 (Rutgers, 41 yards).
- is fourth nationally in scoring defense, surrendering 13.7 points per game.

DEJEAN: THORPE SEMIFINALIST

Junior DB Cooper DeJean has been named one of 15 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award, which is awarded to the nation's best defensive back. The Odebolt, lowa, native is one of two players from the Big Ten Conference on the list along with Ohio State's Denzel Burke.

HIGGINS: BUTKUS SEMIFINALIST

Senior LB Jay Higgins is one of 12 semifinalists for the Butkus Award, presented to the nation's most outstanding linebacker. The Indianapolis native leads the Big Ten and ranks second nationally (most by a Power 5 player) with 12.6 tackles per game. Former Hawkeye Jack Campbell won the Butkus Award in 2022 and was a semifinalist in 2021.

EVANS: BURLSWORTH TROPHY NOMINEE

Sixth-year DL Joe Evans has been named at nominee for the Burlsworth Trophy, an award presented to the most outstanding former walk-on. The Ames, lowa native joined the Hawkeyes as a walk-on in 2018 and will leave the program as a five-year letterwinner and team captain, while ranking in the top 20 in school history in career sacks.

STEVENS EARNS B1G SPECIAL TEAMS HONOR

Sophomore Drew Stevens was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week -- the third Hawkeye special teamer to be honored -- after drilling a game-winning 53-yard field goal with 14 seconds remaining in lowa's 10-7 road win over Northwestern at Wrigley Field. It is Stevens' second career game-winner (at Minnesota, 2022) and tied for the second-longest field goal of his career.

• It is Stevens' second career weekly honor as he was the Big Ten Freshman of the Week in 2022.

ROCK STAR TORY

- Senior punter Tory Taylor was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week on Oct. 24 after punting nine times for 444 yards, averaging 49.3 yards, against Minnesota. Four of his kicks traveled over 50 yards and four were downed inside the 20. Taylor has also been named to the Ray's 8 list five times in 2023.
- Taylor was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 9 after punting six times for 284 yards (47.3 average) in lowa's 20-14 win over Purdue. Two of his six punts went over 50 yards (61 and 57) and two were downed inside the 20-yard line.
- Taylor earned his second straight weekly honor on Oct. 14 after putting on a
 punting display in the road win at Wisconsin. He had a career-high 506 combined
 punting yards (50.6 average) with half of his 10 punts going over 50 yards (two
 60+) and six punts were downed inside the 20.
- Taylor has five career Big Ten weekly honors (2021 at Iowa State; 2022 vs. South Dakota State; 2022 at Rutgers, 2023 vs. Purdue; 2023 at Wisconsin). He is a midseason first-team All-American by the AP, ESPN, Sporting News, CBS, The Athletic and FOX.

DEJEAN/JACKSON EARN BIG TEN WEEKLY ACCOLADES

• DB Cooper DeJean was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 2 after leading the Hawkeyes to a 26-16 win over Michigan State on Sept. 30. The Odebolt, Iowa, native had a 70-yard punt return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter to break a 16-all tie. It was the 15th longest punt return in school history, the first of his career and the first by a Hawkeye since 2020. DeJean also had six tackles and an interception in the game.

- LB Nick Jackson was selected as the Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 2 after recording 10 tackles -- his second straight 10+ tackle game -- a tackle for loss and a key fourth quarter forced fumble that led to a game-sealing Hawkeye field goal.
- The honors are the first of DeJean and Jackson's careers.

CASTRO EARNS B1G DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Senior DB Sebastian Castro was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 11. The Illinois native have a 30-yard interception return for a touchdown in the second quarter, had four tackles and added a pass breakup in Iowa's 20-13 road victory at Iowa State.

Castro's pick-six extended Iowa's active streak to 16 consecutive seasons -- the second-longest streak nationally.

FIRST TIMERS

- TE Addison Ostrenga caught his first career touchdown pass in the third quarter of lowa's 10-7 road win over Northwestern on Nov. 5. The Wisconsin native had three catches for 15 yards in the game.
- WR Kaleb Brown had his first career reception as a Hawkeye -- a 23-yarder on lowa's final drive to set up the game-winning field goal against Northwestern. Brown wore No. 81 in the second half of the game against the Wildcats.

WHAT A STAND!

After a pass interference penalty gave Northwestern a first-and-goal from the 2, lowa's defense conjured up memories of Syracuse in 2005. The Hawkeyes stopped the Wildcats on four consecutive rushing attempts — three from the 1 — for a turnover on downs.

HEAT SEEKING CASTRO

Senior DB Sebastian Castro has been a like a heat seeking missile for the Hawkeye defense, piling up 42 tackles, including six tackles for loss out of the CASH position, while intercepting a team-high three passes and recording four pass break-ups. His three picks are tied for fourth in the Big Ten and 25th nationally.

- Castro earned midseason second-team All-America honors by the Associated Press.
- The Illinois native, who was a high school teammate of RB Leshon Williams, had seven solo tackles, including two TFL and a fourth quarter interception that sealed lowa's road win in Madison.
- Castro also came on a blitz in the fourth quarter against the Badgers in their own end zone. He flushed QB Braedyn Locke from the pocket to allow DL Yahya Black to record a sack and forced fumble, which ultimately resulted in a safety.

LESHON TO THE HOUSE

RB Leshon Williams had an 82-yard touchdown run in the second quarter of lowa's road win at Wisconsin. His rush was tied for the ninth longest in program history, the longest by a Hawkeye since 1997 (Tavian Banks) and the longest all-time by a Hawkeye against Wisconsin. It is the fifth longest run in the nation this season.

- Williams finished the game a career-high 174 rushing yards -- the most by a Hawkeye this season -- on 25 attempts for his second 100-yard rushing game of the season. The Illinois native had his first career 100-yard game, rushing for 145 yards on 12 carries against Western Michigan (and he had two receptions for 27 yards, including a 25-yard touchdown).
- Williams has a team-high 551 yards on 110 carries, averaging 5.0 yards per attempt. He finished with 79 yards on 24 attempts to eclipse the 1,000-yard mark for his career on Nov. 4 at Northwestern. He is the 52nd player in program history to reach 1,000 career yards; he has 1,032 yards.
- He has three "explosive" runs this season, including two runs of 53+ yards (82, 53).

KJ GOES OVER 1K

In his first game since Week 2 at lowa State, sophomore RB Kaleb Johnson returned to record his first 100-yard rushing game of the season and fourth of his career in lowa's Homecoming victory over Purdue. The Ohio native rushed for 134 yards — the second-highest total of his career — on 17 attempts and scored a touchdown, a 67-yarder in the opening quarter. It was lowa's longest offensive play of the season and the second-longest run of Johnson's career.

- Johnson's 134-yard performance pushed him over the 1,000-yard mark for his career. He is the 51st player in program history to surpass the 1,000-yard mark.
- Johnson is second on the team with 278 rushing yards on 74 carries with two touchdowns.
- Last season, Johnson rushed for an lowa freshman record 779 yards on 151 carries, which included three 100-yard games and a team-high six touchdowns.
- Johnson had his first career 200-yard game (second career 100-yard game), finishing with 200 yards on 22 attempts with one touchdown -- his fourth of the season
- -- in the road win at Purdue. The yardage and attempts were both career highs.
- The 200 rushing yards were the 18th-most in a single game in program history and the second-most by a Hawkeye freshman all-time (Marcus Coker, 219 vs. Missouri, Insight Bowl). He was the first Hawkeye to rush for 200 yards in a game since 2015.

ROAD GRINDERS

The Hawkeye rushing attack churned out 381 yards in consecutive victories over Purdue and Wisconsin -- the most in a two-game stretch since 2020 (226 vs. Michigan State, 235 vs. Minnesota).

• lowa's 200 yards against the Badgers are the most since 2008.

• The Hawkeyes rushed for 254 yards against Western Michigan on Sept. 16 -- the most for the program since 2019 against Middle Tennessee State (351 yards).

D CREATES HAVOC

After combining for three sacks and 24 tackles for loss in Iowa's first five games, the Hawkeye defense created havoc in Week 6 against Purdue. Iowa finished with a season-high six sacks (by five different players) and had a season-high 12 tackles for loss, matching the defense's performance in the Music City Bowl victory over Kentucky.

- DL Logan Lee had career highs across the board, finishing with 10 tackles, 2.5 TFL and two sacks. It was his first career game with 10+ tackles.
- DE Joe Evans finished with seven tackles, including a career-best 4.5 TFL and one sack. The 4.5 TFL are tied for the fourth most in a game nationally this season.

1-2 PUNCH

lowa linebackers Jay Higgins and Nick Jackson have been the definition of productive for the Hawkeyes in 2023. The duo have combined for 185 tackles this season, the most by a Power 5 tandem nationally.

- In all games, Higgins has 113 tackles the most by a Power 5 player.
- In Big Ten contests, Higgins has a league-best 81 tackles -- 25 more than Northwestern's Bryce Gallagher. Higgins averages 13.5 tackles per game in six league games.
- Both Higgins and Jackson were named to the Lombardi Award Midseason Watch List; Higgins is a semifinalist for the Butkus Award.

EVANS – A SACK TOP 10'ER

Sixth-year DL Joe Evans, who began his career as a walk-on linebacker, moved into a tie for seventh place on lowa's career sacks list against Northwestern. The Ames, lowa, native has 23 career sacks, which are tied with Anthony Nelson and Colin Cole.

• With 4.5 more sacks, Evans would move into the top five in program history (1. Jared Devries (43.0), 2. Mike Wells (33.0), 3. Matt Roth (30.0), t4. Larry Blue (26.5), t4. A.J. Epenesa (26.5), 6. Bill Ennis-Inge (24.0).

OB DEAC

Wisconsin transfer Deacon Hill took the reins of the lowa quarterback position when Cade McNamara departed with a lower body injury in the first quarter of the Week 5 game against Michigan State. Hill completed 11-of-27 passes for 115 yards and his first career touchdown -- a 13 yarder to Erick All.

- In his first four career starts, Hill has posted a 3-1 record. He is 47-of-113 for 492 yards with three touchdowns and four interceptions. All three of Hill's touchdowns have gone to Hawkeye tight ends.
- Hill was recruited to Wisconsin by Iowa senior special assistant to the head coach Jon Budmayr. As a prep, Hill threw for 3,102 yards and 33 touchdowns and ran for 461 yards and 13 touchdowns as a junior. He played in only three games during his COVID-shortened senior season.

TIGHT END U!!

lowa's tight end room has accounted for 46.2 percent of the team's receptions in 2023 as four Hawkeyes have 43 receptions for 530 yards and four touchdowns.

- Graduate transfer Erick All has a team-high 21 catches for 299 yards and three touchdowns, while junior Luke Lachey has 10 catches for 131 yards. Lachey and All are both out for the season.
- TE Steven Stilianos (5 catches, 54 yards), TE Addison Ostrenga (6 catches, 45 yards, 1TD) and TE Johnny Pascuzzi (1 catch, 1 yard) are lowa's "next man up." Stilianos was an all-conference player at Lafayette before transferring to lowa in 2022.

KING OF RETURNS

- lowa's kickoff return unit ranks third in the Big Ten and 18th nationally, averaging 24.54 yards per return this season. Junior Kaden Wetjen, who has 210 yards on eight returns, has a 26.3 return average. Sophomore Kaleb Johnson is averaging 38.5 yards on two returns, including a 54-yard return on the opening kickoff of the 2023 season.
- Junior Cooper DeJean has 238 punt return yards on 20 returns this season, averaging 11.9 yards per return. DeJean had a 70-yard punt return for a touchdown against Michigan State to break a 16-all tie in the fourth quarter. It was the 15th longest return in school history, the first of his career and the first by a Hawkeye since 2020. The Odebolt, lowa, native is leading the Big Ten and ranks 14th nationally with a 11.9 average and he is second nationally in punt return touchdowns.
- DeJean returned a punt 54 yards for a potential game-winning touchdowns on Oct. 21 against Minnesota, but it was taken off the scoreboard following instant replay after officials deemed DeJean used an invalid fair catch signal.

T.O. CENTRAL

- lowa's defense forced multiple turnovers in three consecutive games in wins over Michigan State, Purdue and Wisconsin. For the season, the Hawkeyes are -3 in the turnover battle this season (14-11). Iowa forced three turnovers in Weeks 1-3 and eight from Weeks 5-7.
- The Hawkeyes forced a season-high four turnovers in Week 5 against Michigan State and followed with two more interceptions in Week 6 against Purdue. The four takeaways versus the Spartans were the most forced since 2021 against Penn State.
- lowa picked off three Spartan passes on interceptions from Cooper DeJean, Sebastian Castro and Jermari Harris. They were the most turnovers by the unit since 2021 against Northwestern.
- DeJean and LB Jay Higgins both had interceptions against Purdue and the Hawkeyes forced a fumble and Castro had his third interception to seal the road win at Wisconsin. Iowa also had a safety on a Yahya Black sack against the Badgers -- its second of the season.
- lowa has turned 11 turnovers into 33 points this season. The Hawkeyes have a 33-20 advantage in points off turnovers in 2023.
- Under head coach Kirk Ferentz, lowa is 121-25 when winning the turnover battle.

SAFETY X 2

lowa recorded its second safety of the season in the road win at Wisconsin when DB Sebastian Castro came on a blitz and DL Yahya Black's sack forced a fumble in the end zone (that was recovered by the Badgers). It is the second straight year lowa has had at least two safeties.

• lowa's defense has scored 10 points in 2023 via one pick-six and the two safeties.

TACKLING LINEBACKERS

- Senior LB Jay Higgins leads the Big Ten and is second nationally in tackles, averaging 12.6 tackles per game. The 12.6 tackles per game are the most by a Power 5 student-athlete. The Indianapolis native has two games with 16 or more tackles (16 vs. Utah State, 18 at Penn State) and seven games with 10+ tackles. His 18 stops in Happy Valley were the most by a Hawkeye since Jack Campbell had 18 tackles against Colorado State in 2021 and they are tied for the sixthmost nationally in a game this season.
- Higgins has eight career games with 10 or more tackles.
- LB Nick Jackson has 77 tackles this season, including a season-high 13 stops at Penn State in Week 4. Jackson has two 10+ tackle games as a Hawkeye and 22 such games in his career. The Virginia transfer, who has 436 career tackles, ranks eighth in the Big Ten in tackles (8.0 per game). Jackson was named the Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 2.

BLOCK-R-US

- The Hawkeyes have blocked three kicks this season two punts, one field goal to rank fourth nationally. lowa's special teams' unit has six blocks since the start of the 2022 season and it has at least one block in each of the last three seasons.
- Senior DL Logan Lee blocked Iowa State's Chase Contreraz's field goal on the Cyclones' opening possession of the game in lowa's 20-13 road win in Ames. It was Lee's second career blocked kick. He also blocked a field goal attempt versus Minnesota in 2021.
- Sophomore DL Anterio Thompson blocked a WMU punt in the third quarter -- his first career punt block -- that resulted in a safety. The block came in Thompson's first career game as a Hawkeye. Thompson had a second punt block in the road win at Northwestern to set up lowa's first touchdown.
- Thompson is one of 13 players nationally with two blocks this season, which is tied for the national lead.

A CLEAN NOTE PAD

The Hawkeyes didn't commit a penalty in their Week 2 road win at lowa State and the team committed a single penalty (for five yards) in Week 3 against Western Michigan. Iowa has played penalty free football twice in its last 10 games (at Minnesota, 2022).

- Since 1970, lowa has eight games where it hasn't committed a penalty.
- lowa is fourth in the nation in fewest penalties (31), fewest penalties per game (3.44), fewest penalty yards (266) and fewest penalty yards per game (29.56).

Seven true freshmen -- DB John Nestor (5), RB Kamari Moulton (3), RB Terrell Washington, Jr. (3), WR Jarriett Buie (3), TE Zach Ortwerth (3), LB Nolan DeLong (1) and DB Zach Lutmer (1) - have seen the field during the 2023 season.

BALL HAWKS

- lowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 16 seasons and 21 of the last 23 seasons.
- DB Sebastian Castro's 30-yard pick-six at lowa State in Week 2 extended the streak to 16 straight seasons, which is the second-longest active streak in the nation behind Utah (19). lowa is one of four teams nationally to have a pick-six streak of 10-plus years.
- lowa has eight interceptions and one defensive touchdown in 2023 to rank seventh in the Big Ten and 47th nationally. The Hawkeyes led the Big Ten and the nation with six defensive touchdowns (four interceptions, two fumble returns) during the 2022 season.

NICO'S SIXTH YEAR

Sixth-year senior Nico Ragaini returns as the veteran of lowa's wide receiver room. The Connecticut native has 140 career receptions for 1,473 yards with five touchdowns.

- Ragaini's 140 career receptions are ninth all-time and his 1,473 receiving yards rank 26th in the record books.
- He is six receptions away from moving into a tie for seventh place with Danan Hughes and Ronnie Harmon (146) and 27 yards shy of becoming the 23rd Hawkeye to reach 1,500 career receiving yards.

IN THE SLOW COOKER

lowa's offensive line is more experienced in 2023 with upperclassmen starting in four of the five positions.

- lowa's returning offensive linemen have played in 271 games with 166 career starts amongst the group. Entering the season, lowa's offensive line played in 209 games, which were tied for the ninthmost in the nation and their 126 starts ranked 10th.
- Transfer Rusty Feth is the most experienced lineman on the lowa roster, as he started 34 games and played in 38 contests at Miami (Ohio) prior to joining the Hawkeyes. Feth has started lowa's last five games at left guard.
- OT Gennings Dunker -- a sophomore -- is the youngest starter on lowa's offensive line.

EXPERIENCE ON DL

The Hawkeyes return two starters on the defensive line in 2023 in Joe Evans and Logan Lee. The duo started all 13 games for during the 2022 season and they have a combined 52 career starts.

- Evans tied for the team lead with 6.5 sacks last season and he finished with 41 tackles, including 8.5 tackles for loss. The Ames, lowa, has 34 tackles, 8.5 TFL and 4.5 sacks in 2023, giving him 23 sacks for his career. Evans had a career-high seven tackles at Penn State and vs. Purdue and a career-best 4.5 TFL against the Boilermakers.
- Lee, who has started 36 consecutive games the third most by an interior defensive lineman nationally had career-highs in tackles (10), TFL (2.5) and sacks (2) in lowa's Homecoming win over Purdue in Week 6.
- DL Noah Shannon has returned to the practice field prior to the Week 7 game after missing the first six weeks due to the gambling punishments. The sixth-year senior has started 28 career games (and played in 42 contests), where he has 44 tackles and 8.5 TFL.
- DE Deontae Craig tied for the team lead with 6.5 sacks and had 10 TFL in a reserve role in 2022. He also forced three fumbles and had 31 tackles a season ago. Craig has two sacks and 4.0 TFL in 2023.

HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

DYNAMIC DREW

Kicker Drew Stevens' sophomore season has made 14-of-18 field goal attempts this season. The 14 field goals are second-most in the Big Ten. In Week 10 against Northwestern, Stevens made a game-winning 53-yard field goal with 14 seconds remaining to give lowa a 10-7 win at Wrigley Field. He was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Nov. 6.

- •In Week 5 against Michigan State, Stevens tied a career high with four field goals, including a make from 53 yards -- the second-longest of his career. The 53-yarder is tied for the ninth-longest in program history.
- Stevens made two field goals from 48 and 40 yards in the road win in Madison. It was his ninth game with two or more field goal makes in his Hawkeye career. He has made 30-of-36 field goal attempts (83.3 percent) in his career and he hasn't missed an extra point. He is 4-of-5 from 50-59 yards in his Hawkeye career.
- Stevens has two career game-winning field goals. He made a 21-yarder with 28 seconds remaining in a road win at Minnesota in 2022 and a 53-yarder in the road win over Northwestern on Nov. 4 at Wrigley Field.
- This season, Stevens has a team-high 58 points (14 FG, 16 PAT) and he has had a touchback on 30 of his 40 kickoffs.
- As a freshman, Stevens earned freshman All-America honors during the 2022 season after making 16-of 18 field goals the most by a Hawkeye freshman all-time (passing Mike Meyer and Nate Kaeding). In the offseason, Stevens added 20 pounds to his 6'1" frame.
- The South Carolina native went 7-for-7 from 20-29 yards, 3-for-3 from 30-39 yards, 4-of-6 from 40-49 and 2-for-2 from 50+ in 2022. Stevens finished tops in the Big Ten and 16th nationally with an .889 field goal percentage and he was sixth in the Big Ten in field goals per game (1.23).
- Stevens is listed on the Lou Groza National Collegiate Place-Kicker Award Watch List. Last season, he was one of 20 semifinalists for the honor.
- Stevens made a career-long 54-yard field goal in lowa's 33-13 win over Northwestern in 2022. It was one of a career-high four field goal makes against the Wildcats, which led to him earning Big Ten Freshman of the Week and Groza Stars of the Week honors on Oct. 31. The 54-yarder tied for the seventh-longest in program history and was the longest by a Hawkeye since Marshall Koehn drilled a 57-yarder in 2015.

THE MOST FAMOUS PUNTER IN AMERICA

Punter Tory Taylor's senior season -- his fourth as the Hawkeyes' starting punter -- has 60 punts for a 47.6-yard average through the first 10 weeks of the 2023 season with 23 punts of 50+ yards (five punts of 60+), 19 being fair caught and 23 being downed inside the 20, nine inside the 10 and six inside the 5. Taylor only has three touchbacks and opponents average just 7.1 yards per return.

- Taylor leads the Big Ten and ranks eighth nationally with his 47.6-yard average. He is a midseason first-team All-American by the AP, ESPN, CBS, The Athletic and FOX.
- The Australia native was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 9 after averaging 47.3 yards on six punts with two 50+ punts (61 and 57) and two punts downed inside the 20. He earned a second straight weekly honor after punting 10 times for a career-high 506 yards with five punts of 50+ yards (two 60+) and six being downed inside the 20 in the road win at Wisconsin.
- Taylor was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week on Oct. 24 after punting

nine times for 444 yards against Minnesota. Four punts went over 50 yards and four were downed inside the 20. He was also named to the Ray's 8 for his efforts in Weeks 1, 2, 4 and 5. In Week 4 at Penn State, Taylor punted seven times for 366 yards with a season-long punt of 62 yards. His 52.3 per punt average was a career best

- Taylor has a 45.9 career average over 262 punts with 122 -- 46.6 percent -- landing inside the 20-yard line.
- Taylor set the school record for punt yardage in consecutive years. He had 80 punts for 3,688 yards in 2022 and 82 punts for 3,725 yards in 2023.
- His 45.4 average in 2022 was second in the Big Ten and 11th nationally.
- Taylor has been named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week five times in his career (2021 at lowa State, 2022 vs. South Dakota State, 2022 at Rutgers, 2023 vs. Purdue, 2023 at Wisconsin).
- During the Music City Bowl win over Kentucky, Taylor tied a bowl record with eight punts for 386 yards (48.3 avg.). Four of his punts pinned the Wildcats inside the 10 and two were inside the 15. He tied Nick Gallery (1993 Alamo) and Jason Baker (1997 Sun) with eight punts.

GONE PORTALING

The Hawkeyes landed eight players from the transfer portal for the 2023 season, including five from Power 5 schools.

QB Cade McNamara (Michigan) – Passed for 2,576 yards and 15 touchdowns in leading the Wolverines to the 2021 Big Ten title... he missed a majority of 2022 because of injury.

TE Erick All (Michigan) – Honorable mention All-Big Ten in 2021... has 54 career receptions for 565 yards and two touchdowns... missed a majority of 2022 because of injury.

QB Deacon Hill (Wisconsin) -- Redshirted first year... appeared in one game in 2022

WR Seth Anderson (Charleston Southern) – Big South Offensive Freshman of the Year and Jerry Rice Freshman of the Year finalist... second-team All-Big South... had 42 receptions for 612 yards and seven touchdowns... son of former NFL WR Flipper Anderson.

LB Nick Jackson (Virginia) – Three-time All-ACC linebacker... Butkus Watch Lists... posted three straight 100+ tackle seasons... has 354 tackles, 20 TFL and 10.5 sacks... started 33 career games.

OL Rusty Feth (Miami (Ohio) – Started 34 career games for Redhawks, including 25 straight over last two seasons at center. . . earned second-team All-MAC honors in 2022.

OL Daijon Parker (Saginaw Valley State) – Appeared in 21 games the last two seasons

WR Kaleb Brown (Ohio State) – Had one catch for five yards (coincidentally against lowa) as a true freshman... has the highest 247Sports rating coming out of high school for a recruit in lowa history.

STUDENT-ATHLETES = GRADUATES

Ten Iowa football student-athletes enter the season having already earned their undergraduate degrees: Nick DeJong, Joe Evans, Rusty Feth, Cade McNamara, Daijon Parker, Tanner Pollock, Nico Ragaini, Chris Reames, Quinn Schulte and Noah Shannon.

WORLD CHAMPION; DUAL SPORT HAWKEYE

Freshman LB Ben Kueter is a world champion wrestler, winning the U20 World Wrestling Championship in July, 2022. The lowa City, lowa, native was named the USA Today Boys Wrestler of the Year for 2022-23 and he was one of five finalists for the high school Butkus Award.

• Kueter will be a dual-sport athlete for the Hawkeyes, as he will also compete on the lowa wrestling team.

LEE NOMINATED FOR AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Senior defensive lineman Logan Lee has been nominated for the AFCA Good Works Team. The award recognizes the extra efforts made by college football players and student support staff off the field.

HAWKEYE FREAKS

Two Hawkeyes -- DB Cooper DeJean and C Logan Jones -- are on listed on Bruce Feldman's college football Freaks List. DeJean comes in at No. 14 after clocking a 0.92 score in his flying 10s and a 2.39 in his 20-yard spring out of a two-point stance. Jones is ranked No. 52 after being second in lowa history in hang-clean and setting a record with a 700-pound squat, while vertical jumping 36 inches.

HALE BAY CHAMP

For a second straight year, sophomore OL Gennings Dunker prevailed as the Solon Beef Days hale bay champion. Dunker finished with a record toss of 14'6" to beat fellow Hawkeye OL Logan Jones. (Hay bales weigh approximately 60 pounds.)

2023 PLAYER COUNCIL

Fifteen players -- three sixth-year players, six seniors and six juniors -- are on the 2023 Player Council. The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies and being involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected following coaching staff and player input.

The group consists of sixth-year student-athletes Joe Evans, Nico Ragaini and Noah Shannon, seniors Kyler Fisher, Jay Higgins, Logan Lee, Cade McNamara, Quinn Schulte and Tory Taylor and juniors Deontae Craig, Cooper DeJean, Jermari Harris, Luke Lachey and Mason Richman.

HAWKEYE LEGACIES

- lowa has seven players on its 2023 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: DB Amare Bickham (Lloyd, 1993-95), LB Eric Epenesa (Epenesa, 1997), DE Joe Evans (Spence, 1989), LB Jackson Filer (Rodney, 1993-96), LB Jayden Montgomery (Jerry, 1998-02), QB Tommy Poholsky (Tom, 1986-89) and LS Liam Reardon (Bill, 1993-96).
- Epenesa's brother, A.J., played at lowa from 2017-19.
- WR Alex Eichmann's grandfather, Richard "Dick" Gibbs, played at Iowa from 1965-66.
- RB Max White is the great, great grandson of Max Hawkins, a member of University of Iowa's famed 'Ironmen" team in 1939 that included Iowa Heisman Trophy winner Nile Kinnick.
- Four Hawkeyes had relatives that played for the Hawkeyes -- OL Griffin Liddle's father, Josh, wrestled at Iowa, DL Andrew Kraus' father, Matt, played baseball, DL Max Llewellyn's brother, Luke, played baseball at Iowa and TE Jalyn Thompson's father, Rod, played basketball.

KINNICK: SOLD OUT

All seven University of Iowa home football games are sold out for the 2023 season. It is the second consecutive season that the Hawkeyes have sold out the stadium for the entire season.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

lowa has played 1,303 games since beginning football in 1889. lowa's overall record is 691-573-39 (.544). That includes a 428-228-16 (.648) record in home games, a 263-345-23 (.433) record in games away from lowa City, a 357-391-25 (.477) mark in Big Ten games and a 312-193-15 (.613) record in Kinnick Stadium.

IN THE RANKINGS

- The Hawkeyes are receiving votes in the Week 11 Associated Press and AFCA Coaches' Poll. lowa is coming in at No. 27 in the Coaches' Poll with 57 votes, while the team is 32nd in the AP Poll with six votes. lowa has been ranked or receiving votes in one of the polls each week of the season.
- The Hawkeyes were ranked No. 25 in the preseason AP Poll for the fourth time in the last five years and the 10th time in the Kirk Ferentz era (27th time overall).
- The Hawkeyes finished the 2022 season receiving votes in the final AP and AFCA Coaches polls. Iowa was 33rd in the Coaches' Poll with nine votes and 34th in the AP Poll with four votes.
- Prior to 2022, Iowa had been ranked in the AP Top 25 at least once in each of the last seven seasons, the third-longest streak in school history.

TROPHY COLLECTION

- The Hawkeyes is 2-1 in trophy games in 2023, winning 20-13 in an lowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series matchup at lowa State. Iowa has won seven of the last eight meetings against the Cyclones. The Hawkeyes won their second game with a 15-6 road win at Wisconsin, the first in Madison since 2015 before falling 12-10 at home against Minnesota. The loss snapped an eight-game winning streak in the series.
- lowa went 3-2 in trophy games in 2022. The Hawkeyes fell 10-7 to lowa State in their first trophy game the team's first loss to the Cyclones since 2014. Iowa reclaimed the Heartland Trophy on Nov. 12, downing Wisconsin, 24-10, in Kinnick Stadium, and defeated Minnesota for the eighth straight time, winning 13-10, to retain the Floyd of Rosedale trophy. Nebraska downed Iowa, 24-17, in the regular season finale to claim the Heroes Trophy for the first time since 2013.
- The Hawkeyes closed out the season with a 21-0 win to hoist the TransPerfect Music City Bowl trophy.
- lowa is 30-10 in its last 40 trophy games (includes bowl games and conference championships). The Hawkeyes are 26-9 in their last 35 rivalry trophy games (lowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

- The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 22 times in the last 23 seasons, including 2023. lowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- lowa head coach Kirk Ferentz won the 10th bowl game of his career in the Hawkeyes' 21-0 win over Kentucky in the 2022 TransPerfect Music City Bowl, tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 10-9 bowl record.
- Eighteen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Nick Saban (18), Mack Brown (14), Kyle Whittingham (11), Mike Gundy (11) and Dabo Swinney (11) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.
- Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (12) have more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than lowa. lowa is 18-16-1 all-time in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 25th season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at lowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is lowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2029 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and Big Ten West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant

Coach of the Year award.

- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 193 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He has 119 Big Ten wins, which are the third-most all-time, trailing only Woody Hayes (153) and Bo Schembechler (143).
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- lowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- lowa has played in 12 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- lowa has posted a 184-96 (.653) overall mark and a 115-71 (.617) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top
 one-half of the conference 16 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and West
 Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- At lowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 193-117 (.619) and a 119-85 (.581) mark in Big Ten games. He is lowa's all-time winningest football coach with 193 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 204-138 (.594), giving him the fourth most wins among active head coaches.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and lowa's
 offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive
 line before graduating in May, 2013. Steve was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.
- James Ferentz is in his eighth NFL season as a member of the New England Patriots. Steve Ferentz is in his first season as a member of coaching staff at the University of South Dakota (outside linebackers coach).

PHIL PARKER'S IOWA DEFENSE

- Phil Parker was named PFF's top defensive coordinator in college football in April, 2023.
- Since Parker took over as lowa's defensive coordinator, lowa is second in the Big Ten and fifth nationally in points (18.57), first in the Big Ten and fifth nationally in total offense (325.18) and the unit leads the nation in interceptions (176).
- lowa's defense has allowed 400 yards or less in 23 straight games dating back to the 2021 season -- the longest active streak nationally.
- lowa is 18-4 under Parker all-time when returning an interception for a touchdown.
- The Hawkeyes have top-six scoring defenses nationally in three of the past four years. The scoring defense has ranked in the top 20 in the nation in each of the last eight years.
- lowa's 3.986 yards per play during the 2022 season were the lowest by any team at the FBS level since Florida State's 3.853 in 2012.
- In 2022, the Hawkeyes led FBS in points per drive (1.09), yards per pass attempt (5.3), yards per rush (2.8) and ranked second in FBS in points per game (13.3) and yards per game (270.8).
- lowa's 270.8 yards per game surrendered was the fewest by an lowa defense since 1981.
- The defense had a 79 percent stop rate -- drives that ended in punts, turnovers or turnovers on downs -- to lead the country.
- lowa has 226 interceptions since the start of the 2009 season -- tied for the second most nationally in that span. The "BallHawks" had a school record 25 interceptions in 2021.
- A principle of Parker's defense is to limit explosive plays, forcing the offense to sustain a drive. lowa surrendered just 15 explosive plays out of 883 defensive snaps over 13 games during the 2022 season.
- lowa has had five players win the Big Ten Tatum-Woodson Defensive Back of the Year since 2012: Micah Hyde, 2012; Desmond King, 2015; Josh Jackson, 2017; Amani Hooker, 2018; Riley Moss, 2021).

A BROAD PERSPECTIVE... IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 22 of the last 23 seasons. Iowa is 10-9 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (12) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 18-16-1 in 35 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- lowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (193-117) replaced Fry and has completed 24 seasons. Ferentz also served as lowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- lowa won the Big Ten West Division title in 2021 and made its second appearance in the Big Ten Championship game. The Hawkeyes played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. lowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. lowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- lowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP Poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP Poll was released, lowa has appeared in the poll 354 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 13 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End), Tyler Linderbaum, (Rimington, Top Center), Jack Campbell (Campbell Trophy, Butkus Award).
- lowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- lowa has six unanimous consensus All-Americans since 2010, the third-most in the nation.
- lowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in lowa football history, based on total wins. lowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. lowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- lowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 213 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (85 draft picks/128 free agents).
- Seventeen former Hawkeyes participated in the 2023 NFL Playoffs, a number that ranked eighth nationally among programs and former players. Just one Big Ten program (Ohio State) had more former players participating in the playoffs.
- lowa and Florida lead all schools with five offensive tackles currently active in the NFL.
- lowa is tied with Miami, Florida, Notre Dame, Penn State and Stanford with the most tight ends active in the NFL (4).
- At least one lowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (45 consecutive years).
- Iowa has had 13 First Round NFL Draft picks under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- lowa had two first round picks in the 2023 NFL Draft -- LB Lukas Van Ness (Packers) and LB Jack Campbell (Lions). It is the fourth time in program history lowa has had two players selected in the first round.

- OT Tristan Wirfs and TEs George Kittle and T.J. Hockenson were both selected to the Pro Bowl in 2023. Wirfs and Kittle were Second Team NFL All-Pro selections.
- Two former Hawkeyes -- Jake Gervase and Alaric Jackson -- were members of the Los Angeles Rams' 2022 Super Bowl champion team.
- OT Tristan Wirfs earned first-team All-Pro and was a Pro Bowl selection in 2021.
- TET.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson (Detroit), TE George Kittle (San Francisco) and Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- •TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 23 years, 204-of-245 (83 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 15 years, lowa has had 57 NFL Draft picks, the third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (89), Michigan (72).
- lowa has had 10 first round picks in the last 13 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020; OL Tyler Linderbaum, 2022; LB Lukas Van Ness, 2023, LB Jack Campbell, 2023.
- lowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former lowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 11th year on staff and sixth as lowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former lowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- $\bullet Former \, center \, James \, Ferentz \, was \, a \, member \, of the \, 2016 \, Super \, Bowl \, champion \, Denver \, Broncos.$
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz, WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.
- Former OL Tristan Wirfs was the starting right tackle as a rookie for the 2021 Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Former DL Anthony Nelson was a reserve defensive end for the Bucs. Former LB Ben Niemann and LB Anthony Hitchens were on the AFC Champion Kansas City Chiefs.
- Entering the 2023 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (17) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 19 lowa tight ends since 1999 (12 drafted/7 free agents).
- All 11 members of lowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

- lowa is now 100-33-2 in season opener, including 21-4 all-time under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- The win is Ferentz's 199th career victory and his 187th win at lowa.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- QB Cade McNamara completed 17-of-30 attempts (56.6 percent) for 191 yards and two touchdowns in his lowa debut (17th career start).
- McNamara had a 36-yard touchdown pass on his first career attempt as a Hawkeye. He is the first lowa quarterback since Chuck Long in 1983 to have a touchdown pass on his first completion of the season (24 yards to Norm Granger against lowa State).
- TE Luke Lachey tied a career-high with seven receptions for 73 yards, including a 31-yarder in the fourth quarter.
- lowa's tight ends (Lachey and Erick All) combined for 10 catches for 88 yards and one touchdown.
- RB Kaleb Johnson led Iowa's rushing attack with 63 yards on 19 attempts, including a 3-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. It is Johnson's seventh career rushing touchdown.
- Johnson also had a career-long 54-yard kickoff return on the opening kickoff of the 2023 season.
- WR Seth Anderson had a 36-yard touchdown reception and TE Erick All had a 3-yard touchdown reception both players' first career receptions at Iowa.
- LB Jay Higgins had a career high 16 tackles, including 12 solo stops. It was his second career game with 10 or more tackles.
- DB Xavier Nwankpa had his second career interception in the second quarter. Nwankpa has two interceptions in two career starts.

MISCELLANEOUS

- lowa's opening drive touchdown pass was the first to open a season since 1991 vs. Hawaii (Matt Rodgers-to-Danan Hughes). It is the first time in the Kirk Ferentz era that lowa opened the season with a passing touchdown.
- lowa had touchdowns on consecutive drives for the first time since Nov. 5, 2022, at Purdue and it is the first time the unit had two first-quarter touchdowns in the opening quarter since Nevada (9/17/22).
- DL Deontae Craig, DL Yahya Black and DB Deshaun Lee made their first career starts. QB Cade McNamara, TE Erick All and LB Nick Jackson made their first career starts as Hawkeyes.

- lowa now leads the lowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series, 5-2, through the first three matchups during the 2023-24 season.
- In three out of the last four meetings, the outcome has been decided by one score.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- RB Jaziun Patterson had a career-best 86 rushing yards on 10 attempts, including a 4-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. It was the first touchdown run of his career.
- Patterson had a career-long 59-yard run on third-and-1 on lowa's opening possession. The 59-yard rush is the second-longest rush dating back to the 2022 season
- •TE Luke Lachey had three receptions for a team-high 58 yards and TE Erick All had three catches for 32 yards. In two games, the tight end duo has 16 receptions for 178 yards and one touchdown.
- CASH Sebastian Castro had a 30-yard interception return for a touchdown to give lowa a 17-0 lead. It was Castro's first career interception and his second career defensive touchdown (fumble return at Rutgers).
- DL Logan Lee blocked lowa State's Chase Contreraz's field goal on the opening possession of the game. It is the second blocked kick of Lee's career (vs. Minnesota). lowa has blocked a kick/punt in each of the last three seasons.
- DB Cooper DeJean had 10 tackles, including six solo stops. It is the third time in his career he has had 10 or more tackles.
- K Drew Stevens went 2-for-2 on field goal attempts. It is the sixth time in Stevens' career he has made two or more field goals. The North Carolina native is 3-for-3 on field goal attempts this season.
- Stevens is 19-of-21 in field goal attempts for his Hawkeye career.

MISCELLANEOUS

- lowa extended its pick 6 streak to 16 consecutive seasons (and 21 of the last 23 years) with Sebastian Castro's 30-yard pick 6 in the second quarter. The streak is the second longest nationally.
- lowa's defense has allowed one touchdown or less in 11 of its last 15 games, dating back to the start of the 2022 season. The Hawkeyes allowed one touchdown (and two field goals) in its season-opening 24-14 triumph over Utah State on Sept. 2 in Kinnick Stadium. Since the start of the 2015 season, lowa is now 65-2 when leading by eight points at any point in a game.
- The Hawkeyes scored on their opening possession in back-to-back games (TD vs. Utah State, FG vs. Iowa State).

- It is the first safety of the season and the first for the program since recording two safeties against South Dakota State in the 2022 season opener.
- lowa has blocked two kicks this season (one punt, one field goal) and the defense/special teams have scored eight points.
- LB Jay Higgins and LB Nick Jackson combined for 18 total tackles.

- The Hawkeyes rushed for 254 yards a season high and the most by the offense since 2019 vs. Middle Tennessee State (358 yards).
- lowa scored a season-high 41 points the most for the program since 2021 at Maryland (51 points).
- lowa's defense surrendered just 35 yards and allowed one first down in the second half. WMU had 239 yards of total offense the fewest allowed by the Hawkeye defense this season.

- WR Nico Ragaini had four catches for 28 yards, moving him into eighth place on lowa's all-time receptions list (139 catches, 1,465 yards).
- LB Jay Higgins had a game high 14 tackles -- his sixth game with 10+ tackles this season (seventh of his career). Higgins has registered 101 tackles this season.
- DL Joe Evans had one sack and six total tackles in the game. Evans has a teambest 3.5 sacks this season and 22 sacks for his career, moving him into a tie for ninth place in program history with Leroy Smith (1988-91).
- Evans has 3.5 career sacks against Minnesota.
- P Tory Taylor had nine punts for 444 yards for a 49.3 yard average and a long of 57. Five of his nine punts were downed inside the 20 and four went over 50 yards.

MISCELLANEOUS

- lowa opened the game with an 11 play, 70-yard scoring drive that resulted in a 23-yard Drew Stevens field goal. It is the fourth time this season the offense has scored on its opening drive.
- lowa's defense has kept back-to-back teams out of the end zone and eight teams without a touchdown since the start of the 2022 season.
