The second-ranked University of Iowa women's wrestling team had all 15 regional participants gualify for the National Collegiate Women's Wrestling Championships at Simpson College. Iowa also claimed the Region V title accumulating 220 team points in the tournament. The Hawkeyes had 11 student-athletes reach the finals, finishing with champions at six weight classes; Emilie Gonzalez (101), Ava Bayless (109), Brianna Gonzalez (116), Reese Larramendy (143), Marlynne Deede (155), and Kylie Welker (170).

The Hawkeyes will finish the season this weekend at the NCWWC Tournament in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Competition will begin at 11 a.m. on Friday, and continue into Saturday night.

The top 8 placewinners at each weight class will receive All-American status, and a spot on the podium.

USA TODAY'S WOMEN OF THE YEAR

Head coach Clarissa Chun has been named USA Today's Women of the Year Honoree for the state of Iowa announced by the organization last Thursday.

The Hawaii native is a National Wrestling Hall of Fame Distinguished member, two-time Olympian, and was inducted into the Hawaii Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.

ROSE INTO THE RANKINGS

123 pounder Ava Rose has made her way into the recent NWCA Rankings after qualifying for the national tournament last weekend.

Rose sits at the No. 10 spot, after defeating past 10th ranked Alexandra Waitsman of William Jewell. Rose secured 4th place at the regional tournament, to then make her way to nationals this weekend.

IOWA DOMINATES THE DUALS

• The Hawkeyes sit at No. 1 in dual rankings for the second set this year; finishing the season undefeated (16-0).

• Iowa held this place after defeating topseeded North Central College in the NWCA National Duals finals, becoming the 2024 National Duals Champions.

NEWCOMERS

• The Hawkeyes brought in 13 new signees to start the 2023-24 season; 4 transfers and 9 freshman.

•Introducing one transfer from Jamestown, Augsburg, and two from McKendree.

• Only one of the Hawkeye newcomers is an lowa native, Freshman Lilly Luft. Luft comes from Charles City, ranking first nationally in her weight class. • The other 9 freshman come from a wide range of hometowns, reaching from California all the way to New Jersey.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

On January 6th, 2024, the University of Iowa women's wrestling team claimed the NWCA National Duals title at the UNI-Dome in Cedar Falls, Iowa. The Hawkeyes opened the tournament with a win over Adrian College, 49-1. They continued into the round of two defeating seventh-seeded Presbyterian, 39-4. In the semifinals, Iowa downed third-seeded King, 31-8, making it's way to the finals. There, the Hawkeyes faced reigning national champions and first-seeded North Central College. Iowa fought until the very end, winning the dual by one point, 21-20, and officially taking the title.

UNDEFEATED DUAL SEASON

The Hawkeyes finished their inaugural season going 16-0 in dual competition. They had nine wins over NCAA ranked teams and outscored their opponents 593-108 in dual competition. They had two shutout wins over No. 11 Lindenwood and Missouri Valley College. In their final dual in Carver-Hawkeye Arena this season, they defeated NAIA National Dual Champions Life University, 35-6.

CLARISSA CHUN Head Coach UC Colorado Springs, 2005

Clarissa Chun was named head coach of the University of Iowa women's wrestling team on Nov. 18, 2021.Chun is the first head coach in the history of the program. Iowa announced on Sept. 23, 2021, that it was adding women's wrestling as an intercollegiate program, becoming the first NCAA Division I, Power Five conference institution to offer the sport.

Chun joins the Iowa women's wrestling program from USA Wrestling, where she was an assistant coach on the women's national team from 2017-21. Working on staff with former Hawkeye national champion and women's national team head coach Terry Steiner, Chun helped lead the United States to 17 World medals, including seven gold, four silver and six bronzes, as well as an Olympic gold, Olympic silver and two Olympic bronzes.

In the United States' most recent showing at the 2021 World Championships in Oslo, Norway, the women's team won two gold, two silver and three bronze medals, a historic seven-medal performance that led Team USA to a second-place finish.

Prior to being hired at USA Wrestling, Chun was among the most accomplished athletes in international wrestling.

A two-time Olympian, she took fifth at the 2008 Beijing Games before earning a bronze medal at the 2012 London Games, competing at 48 kg. Chun wrestled at five Senior World Championships, which included a gold-medal performance at the 2008 Worlds in Tokyo. She also competed at the 2000, 2009, 2011 and 2012 World Championships.

During her career, Chun won five U.S. Open titles. She was a 2011 Pan American Games silver medalist and won four gold medals at the Pan American Championships. She was a runner-up at four U.S. World Team Trials and three U.S. Opens, in a career which spanned 18 years competing at the Senior level.

Chun competed for Missouri Valley College, where she was a star on one of the pioneer women's college wrestling team programs. She made the Senior Women's National Team while still a student at Missouri Valley.


After leaving college, Chun became a U.S. Olympic Training Center resident athlete for many years, but has also trained at Regional Training Centers on college campuses.

Chun has coaching experience at both the international and college levels. She was a member of the men's wrestling staff at West Virginia University, serving as the program's Operations Assistant while also training at the Regional Training Center.

Chun was inducted in the National Wrestling Hall of Fame as a Distinguished Member in June, 2022. She is one of only four females bestowed Distinguished Member honors. In 2018, Chun was inducted into the Missouri Valley College Hall of Fame, Hawaii Sports Hall of Fame, and Roosevelt High School Hall of Fame.

Chun has coaching experience at both the international and college levels. She was a member of the men's wrestling staff at West Virginia University, serving as the program's Operations Assistant while also training at the Regional Training Center.

Chun was inducted in the National Wrestling Hall of Fame as a Distinguished Member in June, 2022. She is one of only four females bestowed Distinguished Member honors.
