HAWKEYES | 1st & 10

- The Hawkeyes have won seven of the last eight and eight of the last 10 meetings over Iowa State dating back to 2013. Last season's win in Ames was Kirk Ferentz's 200th career victory.
- Iowa is ranked No. 25 in the preseason Associated Press and Coaches polls. Iowa has been ranked in the preseason poll in five consecutive seasons, matching the best streak in program history (1957-61).
- Saturday's game is the first home contest televised by CBS since Iowa's 12-10 victory over Michigan in 1985.
- The Hawkeyes piled up 492 yards of total offense under first-year OC Tim Lester against Illinois State -- the most by a Hawkeye OC in his debut dating back to 1979. It was the program's highest offensive production since 2019 and the most in a season opener since 2002.
- Iowa is currently 40th nationally in total offense (492) and 50th in scoring offense (40.0).
- The Hawkeye defense allowed just 189 yards of total offense and forced three turnovers to pitch its first season-opening shutout since 2005. Iowa has eight shutouts since 2018, second most in the FBS in that span (Georgia, 9).
- Senior QB Cade McNamara completed 21-of-31 passes for 251 yards and three touchdowns against the Redbirds. He was 13-of-14 for 177 yards with 3 TDs in the second half. The 251 passing yards are the most by a Hawkeye QB since 2021. McNamara is 63 passing yards shy of eclipsing 4,000 yards in his collegiate career.
- All three of McNamara's TD passes went to newcomer wide receivers -- Reece Vander Zee (2) and Jacob Gill (1). The unit had three combined TD passes for the entire 2023 season.
- Junior RB Kaleb Johnson notched his fifth career 100-yard game, rushing for 119 yards on 11 carries (10.82 average) with two touchdowns (64 and 18 yards). The 64-yard score was the third-longest rush of his career.
- Freshman WR Reece Vander Zee had five receptions for 66 yards and two touchdowns in his first career game. He is currently first in the Big Ten and sixth nationally in receiving touchdowns.
- It's all about the tight ends. Iowa's tight end room combined for 10 catches for 119 yards against Illinois State, including a team-best six catches for 63 yards by senior Luke Lachey.
- Iowa forced 10 turnovers in '23... the Hawkeyes had three turnovers -- two fumble recoveries and a Jermari Harris interception -- in the season-opening win over Illinois State.
- Junior DL Aaron Graves had three of Iowa's four sacks in the season opener. The sack total was a career best and is leading the nation.
- Iowa returns 19 starters -- nine on offense, eight on defense, two on special teams -- the most in the Big Ten.
- Iowa's defense has allowed fewer than 400 yards in 29 consecutive games -- the longest active streak nationally. The unit has allowed 14 or fewer points in 20 of their last 28 games and it has held 10 teams without a touchdown since the start of the 2022 season.
- Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 197 career wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference -- third most all-time. He trails only Woody Hayes (205) and Amos Alonzo Stagg (199).
- LBs Nick Jackson and Jay Higgins are two of the active leaders in career tackles among Power 5 teams and the pair is being tabbed as the best linebacker duo in college football. Jackson has an NCAA-best 460 career tackles, while Higgins is ninth with 229.
- The Hawkeyes are 158-8-1 when allowing 10 points or less since 1970 and 391-59-19 when allowing 10 points or less all-time.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, Iowa is 72-2 when leading by eight points at any point in a game.
- Iowa has sold out Kinnick Stadium prior to the start of the season for a second straight season.
- Since 2009, Iowa has 229 interceptions -- tied for the third-most in the nation. The team's 34 interception returns for a touchdown are the fourth-most in the nation in that span.

SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's game will mark the 71st meeting in the series. Iowa holds a 47-23 advantage in the series that began with a 16-8 ISU win in 1894. Iowa has won seven of the last eight meetings.

- The Hawkeyes are 2-2 against Iowa State in their last four meetings in Kinnick. Iowa is 25-14 all-time against the Cyclones in Iowa City.
- Ten of the last 12 meetings have been decided by 10 points or less, including the last six dating back to 2017.
- Head coach Kirk Ferentz is 14-10 all-time against Iowa State, including winning 11 of the last 15 meetings, dating back to the 2008 season.
- The teams did not meet between 1935-1976, or 2020. The teams played 43 straight seasons from 1977-2019 before the Big Ten announced in 2020 that it would not play nonconference games due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Iowa held a 29-14 advantage in the series from 1977-2019.

IOWA CORN CY-HAWK SERIES

The Cy-Hawk Series is in its 20th season in 2024-25, being sponsored for the 12th time by Iowa Corn. Iowa's corn farmers are proud to sponsor the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series to celebrate our great state and the sports rivalry that unites us all. The Iowa Corn Growers Association and the Iowa Corn Promotion Board partner with Learfield on behalf of both Iowa State University and University of Iowa Athletics Departments for the title sponsorship of the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series.

The Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series tracks the head-to-head match-ups between the Cyclones and Hawkeyes with each victory earning points toward the overall series championship. The series awards two points (except football, which is worth three) to the winning school in each head-to-head match-up between the two institutions. Additionally, one point is awarded to an institution if the graduation rate of its student-athletes is greater than the national average as reported each fall by the NCAA.

Saturday's game is the first Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series matchup of the 2024-25 season. The two schools meet on the volleyball court on Sept. 11 and the soccer pitch on Sept. 15.

WOODY, AMOS & KIRK

Kirk Ferentz, in his 26th season as Iowa's head football coach and the longest tenured active head coach in college football, won his 195th career game as a member of the Big Ten Conference on Nov. 18, 2023, against Illinois. The victory moved Ferentz past Bo Schembechler for third in Big Ten history. He currently has 197 victories, trailing only Ohio State's Woody Hayes (205) and Chicago's Amos Alonzo Stagg (199).

- Ferentz has 121 Big Ten wins, which also rank third all-time, trailing Hayes (153) and Schembechler (143).

- Ferentz won his 200th career game on Sept. 11 at Iowa State. He is the 27th coach at an FBS institution to reach the 200-career win milestone and the 99th coach across all divisions. Former Hawkeye head coach Hayden Fry finished his career with 236 victories.

ASSISTANT HC

For the first time in the Ferentz era, the Hawkeyes will have an assistant head coach. Seth Wallace was elevated into the role in January 2024. In addition to his assistant head coach duties, Wallace continues as Iowa's assistant defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. Wallace served as the acting head coach in the season opener -- a 40-0 Hawkeye victory.

LESTER: THE OC

Tim Lester is in his first season as Iowa's offensive coordinator, joining the program after serving as a senior analyst with the Green Bay Packers in 2023. Lester previously was head coach at Western Michigan, where he won 37 games and appeared in three bowl games. He guided the Broncos to a top-35 national ranking in total offense in four consecutive seasons. He was the primary play caller in three of those campaigns.

- Iowa had 492 yards in Lester's debut as the offensive coordinator. It was the best production by an Iowa OC in their debut dating back to 1979.

AT THE ALMA MATER

Four Hawkeye coaches -- Ladell Betts, Abdul Hodge, Kelvin Bell and LeVar Woods -- played for the Iowa football program under Kirk Ferentz.

WHAT AN OFFENSIVE DEBUT

The Hawkeyes finished with 492 yards of total offense under first-year Tim Lester offensive coordinator in the season opener against Illinois State. The unit had a balanced attack with 251 passing yards and 241 rushing yards.

- The 492 yards are the most in a season opener since 2002 (593 yards vs. Akron) and the most by the unit since 2019 (644 yards vs. Middle Tennessee State).

McNAMARA SHINES

Senior QB Cade McNamara finished with 251 passing yards and three touchdowns, completing 21-of-31 attempts on Aug. 31 against Illinois State. The 251 yards and three TDs were McNamara's highs as a Hawkeye and the yardage total is a high by an Iowa quarterback since 2021.

- In the second half, McNamara was brilliant, completing 13-of-14 attempts for 177 yards and three TDs.

- It was the fifth time in McNamara's career he has passed for 250 or more yards and his third career game with three or more touchdown passes.

KJ2 -- 100

Junior RB Kaleb Johnson had 11 carries for 119 yards and two touchdowns in Iowa's season-opening win over Illinois State. He scored from 64 and 18 yards for his 10th and 11th career touchdowns.

- Johnson's 64-yard touchdown run was the third-longest rush of his career (75 at Purdue in 2022; 67 vs. Purdue in 2023).

- It was Johnson's fifth career 100-yard game and he tied a career-best with two rushing touchdowns.

VANDER-WOW

Freshman WR Reece Vander Zee had a day to remember in his first career game as a Hawkeye. The Rock Rapids, Iowa, native finished with five receptions for 66 yards and two touchdowns -- a 7-yarder in the third quarter and a 19-yarder early in the fourth.

- Vander Zee is the first Hawkeye true freshman with a receiving touchdown in the season opener since Dominique Douglas versus Montana in 2006.
- He is the first Hawkeye rookie wideout to have two receiving touchdowns in a game since Ihmir Smith-Marsette at Iowa State in 2017.
- Vander Zee became the first true freshman to start a game since 2022, the first true freshman wide receiver to start since 2021 and the seventh true freshman wide out to start under Kirk Ferentz.

GILL'S SUCCESSFUL DEBUT

Northwestern transfer Jacob Gill earned a start in his first game as a Hawkeye and he finished with three catches for 46 yards and a touchdown in his debut. Gill's first two receptions resulted in first downs and his third catch was a 31-yard reception for a touchdown, matching Iowa's longest play of the day.

TIGHT END TRIO

A trio of Hawkeye tight ends accounted for 10 receptions for 119 yards in Iowa's season opener against Illinois State. Fifth-year senior Luke Lachey had a team-best six receptions for 63 yards, junior Addison Ostrenga had three catches for 25 yards and sophomore Zach Ortwerth had one catch for 31 yards.

DDDDDD-EFENSE

- Iowa's defense allowed just 189 yards in its 40-0 shutout victory over Illinois State in Week 1. The Hawkeyes have allowed fewer than 200 yards in three of their last seven games and seven opponents to 200 or less since 2022.
- Iowa allowed 56 rushing yards and 133 passing yards in the game. The Redbirds reached Iowa territory three times in the contest, running just eight plays in Hawkeye territory.
 - The unit has four shutouts since the start of the 2022 season and the Hawkeyes have eight shutouts since 2018, second-most in FBS during that span.
 - Iowa's defense gave up just one explosive play (20+ yards) in the victory.

TURNOVER KINGS

For a unit that had just 10 turnovers in 14 games in 2023, the Hawkeyes emphasis on forcing turnovers had a strong start to 2023. Iowa forced three Illinois State turnovers -- two fumble recoveries and a Jermari Harris interception -- during Week 1.

1-2-3 GRAVES

- Junior DL Aaron Graves had a career day in his first career start on Iowa's defensive front. The Iowa native had a career-high three sacks and three TFL in Iowa's season-opening win over Illinois State.
- The Hawkeyes had four total sacks and seven tackles for loss against the Redbirds.

RHYS TO THE RESCUE

- Freshman punter Rhys Dakin had five punts for 196 yards (39.2 average) in his Hawkeye debut Week 1 against Illinois State. The Australian had three of his five punts downed inside the 20 in the victory.
- Dakin hails from Melbourne, Australia -- the same hometown as one of the most decorated punters in college football history in 2023 Ray Guy Award winner Tory Taylor.

FRESHMAN WATCH

Two Hawkeye freshmen -- Reece Vander Zee and Rhys Dakin -- played in the season opener against Illinois State.

OUR PRESEASON NATIONAL DEFENSIVE POY

Senior Jay Higgins was tabbed as Phil Steele's Preseason National Defensive Player of the Year leading into the 2024 season. The Indianapolis native was a tackling machine in 2023 in his first season as a starter, piling up 171 tackles to lead the Big Ten and rank third nationally. Higgins, who had 15+ tackles in three games and 10+ tackles in 10 games, tied an Iowa school record for the most tackles in a single season. He was a first-team All-American by the FWAA, Phil Steele and Sports Illustrated.

MORE NOTABLES

- The Hawkeyes return two defensive players -- Sebastian Castro and Jay Higgins -- who garnered All-America distinction during the 2023 season.
- During the College Football Playoff era, Iowa has won 88 games -- the 12th-most among Power Five Conference teams. The 88 victories are tied for the fourth-most among Big Ten teams (Ohio State, 115; Michigan, 95; Wisconsin, 90; Penn State, 88).
- The Hawkeyes are one of nine FBS programs with a streak of 10+ years of reaching bowl eligibility -- Georgia (27), Oklahoma (25), Wisconsin (22), Alabama (20), Clemson (19), Oklahoma State (18), Iowa (11), Ohio State (11), Memphis (10).
- Iowa is one of 10 FBS programs to have posted 10 straight winning seasons (Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Georgia, Iowa, Memphis, Ohio State, Oklahoma State, Utah and Wisconsin).
- Only five programs nationally have posted top 10 defenses for three consecutive seasons -- Alabama, Clemson, Iowa, Penn State and Georgia -- and only eight programs have posted top 25 defenses in five straight seasons (Alabama, Clemson, Iowa, Notre Dame, Penn State, Pittsburgh, Texas A&M and Georgia).
- Iowa won 25 Big Ten games between 2020-23, matching its highest four-year conference win total in program history (1982-85, 2002-05).
- Iowa has been ranked in the top six in the nation in scoring defense in four of the last five seasons and in the top 10 in total defense in four of the last six seasons. The unit led the country in fewest yards per play allowed in 2022 (3.99) and 2023 (4.08).
- Iowa's defense has allowed fewer than 20 points per game in eight consecutive seasons -- the longest active streak in the nation.

COUNTING DOWN TO THE RECORD

Sixth-year linebacker Nick Jackson currently had 469 career tackles, which are the most among active players and the 10th-most in FBS history. With a 109 more tackles, the Atlanta native would pass Troy's Carlton Martial as the all-time FBS leader in career tackles. Jackson's single-season career high in tackles is 117 during the 2021 season at Virginia.

EXPERIENCE GALORE

Seventeen key contributors on the Iowa football team are in their final year of eligibility. Seven are sixth-year seniors -- DB Jermari Harris, QB Cade McNamara, LB Nick Jackson, DB Sebastian Castro, S Quinn Schulte, LB Kyler Fisher and OL Nick DeJong, while nine are fifth-year seniors -- RB Leshon Williams, LB Jay Higgins, DE Deontae Craig, DE Ethan Hurkett, OL Tyler Elsbury, OL Mason Richman, OL Logan Jones, TE Luke Lachey and DL Yahya Black. One fourth-year starter -- OL Connor Colby -- will also exhaust his eligibility in 2024.

BACK UP FRONT

Eleven returning players Iowa's offensive line have combined to play in 263 games, including 170 starts. Among the team's projected starting five, the Hawkeyes' returnees have played in 155 career games, including 131 starts.

• Iowa had the sixth-most returning games played in the nation -- Florida State (345), Oklahoma State (331), Tennessee (284), Duke (263), Oregon (257), Iowa (251) -- entering the 2024 season. The team's 65 starts were the fourth-most nationally behind Oklahoma State (215), Florida State (210) and Duke (168).

A PAIR OF 4-YEAR STARTERS

Fifth-year senior Mason Richman is Iowa's first four-year starter at offensive tackle since Alaric Jackson (2017-20).

Richman has 40 career starts, which are the sixth most among offensive linemen in the Kirk Ferentz era.

• Senior Connor Colby is also entering his fourth season as a starter, primarily as an offensive guard. Colby has made 37 career starts.

C-MAC IS BACK

Graduate QB Cade McNamara was cleared in June to return to all football activities, nine months after suffering a knee injury during the Week 5 game against Michigan State. During his abbreviated first season as a Hawkeye, McNamara completed 43-of-71 passes for 425 yards and five touchdowns.

• For his career, the Nevada native has completed 334-of-544 passes (61.4 percent) for 3,937 yards and 28 touchdowns to 10 interceptions. He has played in 27 career games with 22 career starts.

A STRONG RB ROOM

The Hawkeyes return their top two running backs for the 2024 season in senior Leshon Williams and junior Kaleb Johnson along with redshirt freshman Kamari Moulton. Williams and Johnson have been the team's top two rushers in each of the past two seasons.

• Williams paced the team with 821 yards and one touchdown during the 2023 season and he was second with 412 yards and two touchdowns in 2022.

• Johnson led the team in rushing as a true freshman, finishing with a freshman record 779 yards and six touchdowns in 2022, en route to freshman All-America honors. He rushed for 463 yards and three touchdowns as a sophomore a season ago.

• Johnson ranks 33rd in program history with 1,361 yards, while Williams ranks 34th with 1,311 yards. Williams has three career 100-yard games and Johnson has five 100+ yard contests.

• Moulton earned his first career start in the season opener, finishing with 19 carries for 65 yards.

LACHEY & OSTRENGA BACK TO LEAD "TIGHT END U"

Fifth-year senior Luke Lachey and junior Addison Ostrenga returns to highlight Iowa's tight end room in 2024.

• Lachey, who missed all but three games because of injury during the 2023 season, had 10 catches for 131 yards before suffering his season-ending injury against Western Michigan. For his career, Lachey has 52 catches for 725 yards and four touchdowns.

• Ostrenga emerged in Lachey and tight end Erick All's absence. The Wisconsin native tied for the team lead with 31 receptions (with 25 coming in the team's final five games) for 192 yards and two touchdowns.

CASH CASTRO

Graduate Sebastian Castro burst onto the scene in his first season as a starter, finishing third on the team with 67 tackles, including eight tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks and three interceptions. The Illinois native earned third-team All-America honors by the Associated Press after allowing 40 completions on 74 targets in 483 snaps in coverage. He allowed just 6.1 yards per completion and four catches over 15 yards.

SECONDARY 3/4 IN TACT

The Hawkeyes return three of their four starters in the defensive backfield in sixth-years Quinn Schulte and Jermari Harris and junior Xavier Nwankpa. The trio have combined to start 59 games during their Iowa careers.

- Schulte, who is in his third season as a the starting free safety, was fourth on the team with 65 tackles a season ago. He had four pass breakups, 2.5 tackles for loss and one interception en route to honorable mention All-Big Ten honors.
- Harris, the team's Comeback Player of the Year in 2023 after missing all of the 2022 season because of injury, had 42 tackles and one interception a season ago where he started 12 contests. Nwankpa started 12 games in his first season as a starter, where he had 42 tackles, two TFL and one interception.

BALL HAWKS

- Iowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 16 seasons and 21 of the last 23. It is the second-longest active streak in the nation.

D-LINE DEPTH

The Hawkeyes have three players listed on the depth chart at all four positions on the defensive line, including returning starters Deontae Craig and Yahya Black. The duo started every game during the 2023 season.

- Craig finished with 54 tackles, including five tackles for loss and three sacks during the 2023 season. Black made 51 stops to go along with five TFL and 3.5 sacks in his first season as a starter.
- Defensive end Ethan Hurkett (52 tackles, six TFL, one INT) and defensive tackle Aaron Graves (37 tackles, 4.5 TFL, 2.5 sacks) join Craig and Black as Iowa's projected starters on the defensive line.

DREW THE KICKER

Two-year starter and two-time Lou Groza Award semifinalist Drew Stevens returns for his third season as Iowa's starting placekicker. Stevens made 18-of-26 field goals during the 2023 season with the 18 makes being the third-most in the Big Ten and tied for the 27th-most nationally.

- Stevens has two career game-winning field goals. He made a 21-yarder with 28 seconds left in a road win at Minnesota in 2022 and a 53-yarder in a road win over Northwestern at Wrigley Field in 2023.
- For his career, Stevens has made 34-of-44 field goal attempts (77.3 percent) and is 39-of-40 on PATs. He is 4-of-6 from 50-59 yards in his Hawkeye career.
- During his first season in Iowa City, Stevens earned freshman All-America honors after making 16-of-18 field goal attempts – the most by a Hawkeye freshman all-time.

FROM THE PORTAL

The Hawkeyes added four players in the transfer portal for the 2024 season.

OL Cade Borud – Transfer from North Dakota... originally from Des Moines, Iowa, where he played with Xavier Nwankpa... member of MVC All-Newcomer Team... started all 12 games at center.

WR Jacob Gill – Transfer from Northwestern... made 17 catches for 195 yards at two touchdowns in three years with Wildcats.

QB Jackson Stratton – Transfer from Colorado State... originally from California... saw action in four games in 2022.

QB Brendan Sullivan – Transfer from Northwestern... recruited by OC Tim Lester out of high school... completed 134-of-195 passes for 1,303 yards and five touchdowns in 2023.

OPPORTUNITY OUT WIDE

The Hawkeyes enter offensive coordinator Tim Lester's first season with opportunity abound in the wide receiving corps. Iowa has two players on the two deep that logged significant snaps in juniors Seth Anderson and Kaleb Brown to go along with senior speedster Kaden Wetjen and redshirt freshmen Jarriett Buie, Dayton Howard and converted running back Terrell Washington, Jr.

- Brown had 22 receptions for 215 yards and one touchdown in 11 games in 2023, while Anderson finished with 11 catches for 150 yards and one touchdown in 14 games.

HAWKEYE FREAK!

Senior Logan Jones is listed on Bruce Feldman's top 100 "Freak List" for a second straight season, jumping 43 spots (from No. 52 to No. 9) on the 2024 edition. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native vertical-jumped 36.6 inches, has squatted 695 pounds (a Hawkeye record) and did the program's second-heaviest hang clean at 470 pounds. He also clocked a 1.53 10-yard split (an Iowa OL record) and ran a 4.09 pro agility time in 2022. His 20-yard shuttle time is .05 faster than the best time an offensive lineman has posted at the NFL Combine.

HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

Iowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers. Since 2010, 54 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft. Today, 34 Hawkeyes are on NFL rosters.

2024 PLAYER COUNCIL

Sixteen players -- seven sixth-year players, seven fifth-year seniors, one senior and one junior -- are on the 2024 Player Council. The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies and being involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected following coaching staff and player input. The group consists of sixth-year student-athletes Sebastian Castro, Nick DeJong, Kyler Fisher, Jermari Harris, Nick Jackson, Cade McNamara and Quinn Schulte, fifth-year seniors Yahya Black, Deontae Craig, Jay Higgins, Ethan Hurkett, Luke Lachey and Mason Richman and seniors Luke Elkin and junior Addison Ostrenga.

HAWKEYE GRADUATES

Iowa has 20 players on the 2024 roster that have already earned their undergraduate degrees. HAWKEYE LEGACIES

- Iowa has four players on its 2024 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: DB Amare Bickham (Lloyd, 1993-95), LB Eric Epenesa (Epenesa, 1997) and LB Jayden Montgomery (Jerry, 1998-01).
- Epenesa's brother, A.J., played at Iowa from 2017-19. DE Drew Campbell is the younger brother of Hawkeye All-America LB Jack Campbell and LB Devan Van Ness is the younger brother of former Iowa DE Lukas Van Ness.
- RB Max White is the great, great grandson of Max Hawkins, a member of Iowa's famed "Ironmen" team in 1939 that included Iowa Heisman Trophy winner Nile Kinnick. White is Hawkins' namesake - Max Hawkins White - and his family lives in Hawkins' former house in Cedar Rapids.
- WR Alex Eichmann's grandfather, Richard "Dick" Gibbs, played at Iowa from 1965-66.
- Three Hawkeyes had relatives that played for the Hawkeyes -- DL Andrew Kraus' father, Matt, played baseball, DL Max Llewellyn's brother, Luke, played baseball at Iowa, and DB Jaylen Watson's uncle is former Hawkeye RB Fred Russell.

IN THE RANKINGS

- The Hawkeyes are ranked in the preseason poll for the fifth time in the last six seasons and for the 11th time under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa is 25th in both the coaches' poll and AP Poll.
- Iowa was ranked 17th in the final College Football Playoff standings for the 2023 season. The Hawkeyes climbed as high as No. 16 twice during the regular season.
- The Hawkeyes finished the 2023 season ranked No. 22 in the AFCA Coaches' Poll and 24th in the Associated Press Poll. Iowa was ranked or receiving votes in one of the polls each week of 2023.
- It was the 11th time under head coach Kirk Ferentz that the Hawkeyes appeared in the final rankings and the 28th time in program history.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,308 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 694-575-39 (.546). That includes a 430-228-16 (.650) record in home games, a 264-347-23 (.435) record in games away from Iowa City, a 360-391-25 (.480) mark in Big Ten games and a 314-193-15 (.616) record in Kinnick Stadium.

TROPHY COLLECTION

- The Hawkeyes went 3-3 in trophy games in 2023, winning 20-13 in an Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series matchup at Iowa State. Iowa has won seven of the last eight meetings against the Cyclones. The Hawkeyes won their second game with a 15-6 road win at Wisconsin, the first in Madison since 2015 before falling 12-10 at home against Minnesota. The loss snapped an eight-game winning streak in the series. Iowa closed out the regular season with a 13-10 road win at Nebraska, the sixth straight win in Lincoln. The Hawkeyes fell to Michigan in the Big Ten Championship Game and Tennessee in the Cheez-It Citrus Bowl.
- Iowa is 31-12 in its last 43 trophy games (includes bowl games and conference championships). The Hawkeyes are 27-9 in their last 36 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

- The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 22 times in the last 23 seasons, including 2023. Iowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz won the 10th bowl game of his career in the Hawkeyes' 21-0 win over Kentucky in the 2022 TransPerfect Music City Bowl, tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 10-10 bowl record.
- Eighteen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Mack Brown (14), Mike Gundy (12), Dabo Swinney (12) and Kyle Whittingham (11) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.
- Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (12), Wisconsin (12), Oregon (11) and USC (11) have more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than Iowa. Iowa is 18-17-1 all-time in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

- Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only seven Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons. They include: Duffy Daugherty (Michigan State; 1965, 1966), Ferentz (Iowa; 2002, 2015), Jim Harbaugh (Michigan; 2022, 2023), Woody Hayes (Ohio State; 1954, 1957, 1968, 1970, 1975); Urban Meyer (Ohio State; 2012, 2013); Bo Schembechler (Michigan; 1971, 1980, 1989); Jim Tressel (Ohio State; 2002, 2006).

For a third straight year, season tickets for the University of Iowa football team is sold out. Iowa sold out all seven home games during both the 2022 and 2023 seasons.

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 26th season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2029 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and Big Ten West Division titles in 2015, 2021 and 2023.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach

of the Year award.

- Ferentz is third all-time with 197 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference, trailing only Woody Hayes (205) and Amos Alonzo Stagg (Chicago) (199). He has 122 Big Ten wins, which are the third-most all-time, trailing only Woody Hayes (153) and Bo Schembechler (143).
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 12 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Twelve different players have won 14 national awards during Ferentz's tenure.
- Iowa has posted a 188-97 (.658) overall mark and a 118-71 (.624) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top half of the conference 17 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and West Division titles in 2015, 2021 and 2023.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 197-118 (.624) and a 122-85 (.589) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 197 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 209-139 (.599), giving him the fourth most wins among active head coaches.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05, James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013 and Steve was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.
- James Ferentz, retired following an eight-year NFL career in 2024. He is currently an assistant offensive line coach for the New York Giants. Steve Ferentz is in his second season on the coaching staff at the University of South Dakota (outside linebackers coach), while Brian Ferentz is in his first season as an offensive analyst at Maryland.

PHIL PARKER'S IOWA DEFENSE

• Phil Parker was named the recipient of the Frank Broyles Award and the AFCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2023. He was also named PFF's top defensive coordinator in college football in April, 2023.

• Since Parker took over as Iowa's defensive coordinator, Iowa is second in the Big Ten and fifth nationally in points (18.99), first in the Big Ten and fourth nationally in total offense (322.66), first in the Big Ten and third nationally in yards per play (4.75) and the unit is tied for second in the nation in interceptions (179).

• Iowa's defense has allowed 400 yards or less in 28 straight games dating back to the 2021 season -- the longest active streak nationally.

• The Hawkeyes have led the nation in fewest yards per play allowed on defense in consecutive seasons -- 3.99 in 2022 and 4.08 in 2023.

• Iowa's defense has allowed fewer than 20 points per game in eight consecutive seasons -- the longest active streak in the nation.

• Iowa is 18-4 under Parker all-time when returning an interception for a touchdown.

• The Hawkeyes have top-six scoring defenses nationally in three of the past four years. The scoring defense has ranked in the top 20 in the nation in each of the last eight years.

• Iowa's 3.986 yards per play during the 2022 season were the lowest by any team at the FBS level since Florida State's 3.853 in 2012.

• In 2022, the Hawkeyes led FBS in points per drive (1.09), yards per pass attempt (5.3), yards per rush (2.8) and ranked second in FBS in points per game (13.3) and yards per game (270.8).

• Iowa's 270.8 yards per game surrendered in 2022 was the fewest by an Iowa defense since 1981.

• Iowa has 229 interceptions since the start of the 2009 season -- the fourth-most nationally in that span. The "BallHawks" had a school record 25 interceptions in 2021.

• A principle of Parker's defense is to limit explosive plays, forcing the offense to sustain a drive. Iowa surrendered just 15 explosive plays out of 883 defensive snaps over 13 games during the 2022 season.

• Iowa has had six players win the Big Ten Tatum-Woodson Defensive Back of the Year since 2012: Micah Hyde, 2012; Desmond King, 2015; Josh Jackson, 2017; Amani Hooker, 2018; Riley Moss, 2021, Cooper DeJean, 2023).

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 22 of the last 23 seasons. Iowa is 10-9 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (12) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 18-16-1 in 35 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (197-118) replaced Fry and has completed 25 seasons. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa won the Big Ten West Division title in 2021 and 2023 to earn a spot in the Big Ten Championship Game. The Hawkeyes played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP Poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP Poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 354 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 14 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End), Tyler Linderbaum, (Rimington, Top Center), Jack Campbell (Campbell Trophy, Butkus Award) and Tory Taylor (Ray Guy).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa has eight unanimous consensus All-Americans since 2010.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 220 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (89 draft picks/131 free agents).
- Seventeen former Hawkeyes participated in the 2023 NFL Playoffs, a number that ranked eighth nationally among programs and former players. Just one Big Ten program (Ohio State) had more former players participating in the playoffs.
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (46 consecutive years).
- Iowa has had 13 First Round NFL Draft picks under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- Iowa had two first round picks in the 2023 NFL Draft -- LB Lukas Van Ness (Packers) and LB Jack Campbell (Lions). It is the fourth time in program history Iowa has had two players selected in the first round.
- Three former Hawkeyes -- George Kittle, Brandon Scherff and Tristan Wirfs -- are team captains for their respective NFL teams.
- C Tyler Linderbaum and TE Sam LaPorta were named to the 2023 Pro Bowl. LaPorta was also a second-team All-Pro selection. TE George Kittle was first-team All-Pro in 2023.

- OT Tristan Wirfs and TEs George Kittle and T.J. Hockenson were both selected to the Pro Bowl in 2022. Wirfs and Kittle were Second Team NFL All-Pro selections.
- Two former Hawkeyes -- Jake Gervase and Alaric Jackson -- were members of the Los Angeles Rams' 2022 Super Bowl champion team.
- OT Tristan Wirfs earned first-team All-Pro and was a Pro Bowl selection in 2021.
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson (Detroit), TE George Kittle (San Francisco) and Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 24 years, 209-of-252 (83 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 16 years, Iowa has had 61 NFL Draft picks, the third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (93), Michigan (85).
- Iowa has had 10 first round picks in the last 14 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020; OL Tyler Linderbaum, 2022; LB Lukas Van Ness, 2023, LB Jack Campbell, 2023.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 11th year on staff and sixth as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz, WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.
- Former OL Tristan Wirfs was the starting right tackle as a rookie for the 2021 Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Former DL Anthony Nelson was a reserve defensive end for the Bucs. Former LB Ben Niemann and LB Anthony Hitchens were on the AFC Champion Kansas City Chiefs.
- Entering the 2024 season, every Iowa senior starting tight end (18) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 21 Iowa tight ends since 1999 (13 drafted/8 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

IOWA NOTES

- The victory is head coach Kirk Ferentz's 197th career win – two behind Chicago's Amos Alonzo Stagg for the second-most victories in Big Ten history.
- The Hawkeyes improve to 101-33-2 all-time in season openers, including a 22-4 record under Ferentz.
- Assistant head coach Seth Wallace was the acting head coach with Ferentz serving a one game school-imposed suspension for a recruiting contact violation.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Senior QB Cade McNamara completed 21-of-31 passes for 251 yards and three touchdowns.
- McNamara's passing yardage is his high as a Hawkeye.
- He is now 18-4 in his career as a starter.
- Junior Kaleb Johnson paced the team with 11 carries for 119 yards and two touchdowns – a 64-yarder and 18-yarder in the fourth quarter.
- It is Johnson's fifth career 100-yard game and he tied a career-best with two rushing touchdowns.
- The 64-yard rush is the third-longest rush of Johnson's career (75 at Purdue in 2022; 67 vs. Purdue in 2023).
- It was Johnson's 10th and 11th career rushing touchdowns.
- Freshman WR Reece Vander Zee finished with five receptions for 66 yards and two touchdowns -- a 7-yarder -- the first of his career -- in the third quarter and a 19-yarder early in the fourth.
- Vander Zee is the first Hawkeye true freshman with a receiving touchdown in the season opener since Dominique Douglas vs. Montana in 2006.
- He is the first Hawkeye freshman wideout to have two receiving touchdowns in a game since Ihmir Smith-Marsette at Iowa State in 2017.
- Junior WR Jacob Gill had a 31-yard touchdown in the third quarter. It was his first touchdown as a Hawkeye and the third of his career.
- Gill finished with three receptions for 46 yards.
- Senior TE Luke Lachey led the team with six receptions for 63 yards.
- Iowa's tight ends combined for 10 catches and 119 yards in the game.
- Sophomore DL Caden Crawford forced his first career fumble in the fourth quarter.
- Senior DB Sebastian Castro had a forced fumble – the fifth of his career – in the first quarter and T.J. Hall recovered, giving Iowa its second forced turnover of the game.
- Junior DL Aaron Graves finished with four tackles, including a career-high three sacks and three tackles for loss.
- Senior DB Jermari Harris had a first-quarter interception – the sixth pick of his Hawkeye career.
- Junior K Drew Stevens went 2-for-2 on field goal attempts in the first half. He connected from 41 yards for Iowa's first points of the 2024 season in the first quarter before making a 28-yarder just before half.
- WR Reece Vander Zee made his first career start. He is the first true freshman to start since 2022, the first true freshman wide receiver to start since 2021 and the seventh true freshman wide receiver to start in the Kirk Ferentz era.

MISCELLANEOUS

- The Hawkeyes' offense finished with 492 yards of total offense, including 345 in the second half.
- The total offense is the most in a season opener since finishing with 593 (2002).
- It was the most yards by a Hawkeye offense since 2019 against Middle Tennessee. (644)
- UI's offensive coordinator, Tim Lester coached the best offensive output in an OC debut since 1979.
- Iowa notched the 17th shutout of the Ferentz era.
- It is the program's fourth shutout since the start of the 2022 season.
- The Hawkeyes' defense forced three turnovers, turning the three miscues into three points.
- It is the 29th consecutive game Iowa's defense has allowed fewer than 400 yards -- the longest active streak nationally.
- The Hawkeyes allowed just 189 yards of total offense. Illinois State was in Iowa territory three times in the game, running eight total plays.
- Iowa's defense has held seven opponents to 200 yards or less since 2022.
