#### HAWKEYES | 1st & 10

- lowa is playing in East Lansing for the first time since 2017 -- a 17-10 Spartan victory. There have been three meetings since 2017, which includes two Hawkeye wins.
- Since 2020, Iowa is 14-5 in road games and the Hawkeyes have posted a winning road record dating back to the start of the 2018 season (20-9 record).
- lowa put up 40 points against a Big Ten opponent for the first time since 2021 (55 at Maryland). The Hawkeyes are 29-0 when scoring 21+ points since 2020.
- Head coach Kirk Ferentz moved into second place in Big Ten history with his 200th victory on Oct. 12 against Washington. He trails only Ohio State's Woody Hayes (205) for the most overall wins in league history.
- Junior DL Aaron Graves earned Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week honors after finishing with five tackles, two sacks and two forced fumbles in the Week 7 victory over Washington. He is the second Hawkeye to be honored this season.
- RB Kaleb Johnson recorded his fifth 100-yard game of the season, finishing with 166 yards on 21 attempts with two touchdowns in the win over Washington in Week 7. He was named the Senior Bowl Co-Offensive Player of the Week for his efforts.
- Johnson is 63 yards from reaching the 1,000-yard mark for the season. He will be the 22nd 1,000-yard rusher in program history and the first since the 2021 season (Tyler Goodson). Johnson is 13th in program history with 2,179 career rushing yards.
- Johnson is second in the nation in rushing yards (937), rushing yards per game (156.2), third in yards per carry (7.94), fourth in rushing touchdowns (12), total touchdown (13) and scoring (13.0).
- Big play KJ... Johnson has 16 rushes of 20+ yards, four 40+ yard runs and five touchdown runs of 25+ yards this season. lowa has 18 20+ yard rushes in 2024.
- lowa's rushing attack has churned out 200+ yards in five of the team's six games. The team's 222.8 yards per game ranks first in the Big Ten and 13th nationally.
- Senior LB Jay Higgins is leading the Big Ten in tackles (ninth nationally), making 62 tackles (10.3 per game). He has led the team in tackles in all six games, including a season-high 14 tackles in Weeks 6 and 7 against 0hio State and Washington. He also has two interceptions and two forced fumbles. Higgins has three double-digit tackle games this season and 14 in his career.
- Graduate LB Nick Jackson made his 500th career tackle against Washington. He is currently fourth in FBS history with 503 career tackles
- lowa has held four of its six opponents to their lowest point total of the season and the Hawkeyes' offense has scored the most points its opponent has allowed in three games.
- PK Drew Stevens made four field goals for the third time in his career, connecting from 37, 46, 25 and 51 yards in Week 7 against Washington. He is 4-for-4 from 40-49 yards this season and it was his fifth career 50+ yard FG.
- Stevens will tie Brion Hurley for the school record of six made field goals of 50+ yards with his next make.
- Tos -- The Hawkeyes have forced 11 turnovers in six games -- seven interceptions, four fumble recoveries. The 11 takeaways are third in the Big Ten and 11th nationally.
- DB Jermari Harris had his first career pick-six, returning an interception 28-yards for a touchdown in Week 3 against Troy. It extended lowa's pick-six streak to 17 straight years, the longest active streak nationally. Harris ranks second in the Big Ten and sixth nationally with three interceptions. He also ranks ninth in the country in passes defended per game (1.3).
- lowa's rushing defense has allowed fewer than 100 yards in four of the first six games, including just 24 yards in Week 3 against Troy. The unit allows 96.3 rushing yards per game, 18th-fewest in the nation, and it has allowed just one touchdown on the ground.
- Don't beat yourself! lowa didn't commit a penalty in Week 3 against Troy and was flagged for only one penalty in road games at Minnesota and Ohio State. lowa leads the nation in fewest penalties (16), fewest penalties per game (2.67), fewest penalty yards (155) and fewest penalty yards per game (25.83).
- Since the start of the 2015 season, lowa is 75-3 when leading by eight points at any point in a game.
- Since 2009, lowa has 235 interceptions -- tied for the third-most in the nation. The team's 35 interception returns for a touchdown are the fourth-most in the nation in that span.



#### **THE SERIES**

- Saturday's game is the 50th meeting in the all-time series that began with a 21-7 Michigan State win in 1953. That first meeting, played in lowa City on Sept. 26, 1953, marked MSU's first game as a member of the Big Ten Conference.
- lowa leads the all-time series 25-22-2, including winning the last two games -- 49-7 in 2020 and 26-16 in 2023. The 2020 meeting was the most lopsided Hawkeye win in the series.
- Saturday's game is lowa's first game in East Lansing since 2017 -- a 17-10 Spartan victory. Michigan State is 11-10-1 all-time in home games against lowa.
- Saturday is the 15-year anniversary of the 2009 game where Ricky Stanzi connected with Marvin McNutt, Jr., for a touchdown pass as time expired to give the Hawkeyes a 15-13 road win at Spartan Stadium. That game is the last time lowa has played a night game in East Lansing.
- Kirk Ferentz recorded his first Big Ten win as lowa's head coach when the Hawkeyes topped Michigan State (21-16) in lowa City in 2000. The teams have played two overtime contests with lowa winning both in double overtime (34-27 in 2007 and 19-16 in 2012).

#### **WOODY & KIRK**

Kirk Ferentz, in his 26th season as lowa's head football coach and the longest tenured active head coach in college football, won his 200th career game as a member of the Big Ten Conference on Oct. 12, 2024, against Washington. The victory moved Ferentz into second place in Big Ten history, trailing only Ohio State's Woody Hayes' 205 wins.

- Ferentz has 124 Big Ten wins, which rank third alltime, trailing Hayes (153) and Michigan's Bo Schembechler (143).
- Ferentz won his 200th career game at lowa State in 2023. He is the 27th coach at an FBS institution to reach the 200-career win milestone and the 99th coach across all divisions. Former Hawkeye head coach Hayden Fry finished his career with 236 victories.

#### **ASSISTANT HC**

For the first time in the Ferentz era, the Hawkeyes have an assistant head coach. Seth Wallace was elevated into the role in January 2024. In addition to his assistant head coach duties, Wallace continues as lowa's assistant defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. Wallace served as the acting head coach in the season opener — a 40-0 Hawkeye victory.

#### **LESTER: THE OC**

Tim Lester is in his first season as lowa's offensive coordinator, joining the program after serving as a senior analyst with the Green Bay Packers in 2023. Lester previously was head coach at Western Michigan, where he won 37 games and appeared in three bowl games. He guided the Broncos to a top-35 national ranking in total offense in four consecutive seasons. He was the primary play caller in three of those campaigns.

• lowa had 492 yards in Lester's debut as the offensive coordinator. It was the best production by an lowa OC in their debut dating back to 1979. The Hawkeyes have scored 40 points twice in Lester's first six games as the OC.

#### AT THE ALMA MATER

Four Hawkeye coaches -- Ladell Betts, Abdul Hodge, Kelvin Bell and LeVar Woods -- played for the lowa football program under Kirk Ferentz.

#### **MORE NOTABLES**

- Three of Iowa's five road games will be played on natural grass, including Saturday's game at Michigan State.
- lowa has come-from-behind in the second half to win in two games (trailed 14-10 vs. Troy; 14-7 at Minnesota) this season.
- lowa has had 400+ yards in two of the first six games under first-year OC Tim Lester. The last time the offense had 400+ yards twice in a season came in 2021.
- lowa's defense allowed just 189 yards of total offense and forced three turnovers to pitch its first season-opening shutout since 2005. lowa has eight shutouts since 2018, second most in the FBS in that span (Georgia, 9).
- lowa has played seven games decided by a single possession since the start of the 2023 season. The Hawkeyes are 5-2 in such games.
- lowa's defense has allowed fewer than 400 yards in 33 of the last 34 games and 14 or fewer points in 21 of their last 33 games. The Hawkeyes have held 10 teams without a touchdown since the start of the 2022 season.
- The Hawkeyes are averaging 29.2 points and 357.5 yards of total offense in six games, which ranks 64th and 94th nationally, respectively.
- Senior QB Cade McNamara completed 19-of-23 attempts for 176 yards, completing 82.6 percent of his attempts in Week 3 against Troy. It was his high completion percentage as a Hawkeye. He had two touchdown passes against Washington his fourth game as a Hawkeye with 2+TD passes. McNamara is 21-6 in his career as a starting QB.
- The Hawkeye offense has 10 scoring drives of 70 or more yards this season through the first six games. lowa had a season-long 80-yard touchdown drive against Washington.
- lowa led 13-0 at the half and 19-7 in the third quarter against lowa State. It was the first time the Hawkeyes surrendered a 13-point second half in 10 years (2014 vs. Nebraska).
- The Hawkeyes are 158-8-1 when allowing 10 points or less since 1970 and 391-59-19 when allowing 10 points or less all-time.

#### **TIGHT GAMES**

lowa has played 130 games in the Ferentz era in games decided by one score or less. The Hawkeyes are 65-65 (.500) in such contests. Over the past two seasons, lowa has won five of seven games decided by eight points or fewer.

#### O-LINE NAMED TO MIDSEASON HONOR ROLL

lowa's offensive line was named to the midseason honor roll for the Joe Moore Award on Oct. 8. The award honors offensive line units that display a high level of toughness, effort, teamwork, consistency, technique and finishing. The Hawkeye offense has rushed for 200+ yards in five of the team's first six games, averaging 222.8 yards this season.

#### LACHEY NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST

Senior Luke Lachey has been named a semifinalist for the 2024 William V. Campbell Trophy, college football's premier scholar athlete award. The National Football Foundation will announce a group of 12-14 finalists on Oct. 23.

#### **TACKLING MACHINE**

Senior LB Jay Higgins has had 14 tackles in consecutive games in Week 6 at Ohio State and Week 7 against Washington. The Indianapolis native had three 10+ tackle games this season and 14 in his career.

- He has had at least 14 tackles in a game six times in his career.
- Higgins had his second career forced fumble and fourth career fumble recovery against the Buckeyes.
- He has a team-high 62 tackles (10.3 per game) to lead the Big Ten and rank ninth nationally. Higgins also has two interceptions and two forced fumbles.
- His has 279 career tackles, which are tied for 21st in program history. Higgins is 12 tackles shy of moving into the top 20 in the record books.

#### **YAHYA BLOCK**

Senior DL Yahya Black blocked a first-quarter field goal attempt in Week 7 against Washington. It was Black's first career block and it is the second consecutive year lowa has blocked a field-goal attempt.

#### **HAWKEYE HONOREES**

• Junior RB Kaleb Johnson was named the Doak Walker National Running Back of the Week and the Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week following his Week 4 performance in the win at Minnesota. The Ohio native had a career-high 206 yards with three touchdowns with five 20+ runs in the game. He became the first Hawkeye since 2012 to post four straight 100-yard games.

- Freshman punter Rhys Dakin was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week on Sept. 24 after punting five times for a 49.6 average in the road win over the Gophers. He placed three punts inside the 20 and three traveled 50+ yard, including a career-best 55-yarder in the second quarter.
- Junior DL Aaron Graves was named the Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week after recording five tackles, two sacks and two forced fumbles in Iowa's Week 7 victory over Washington. It is his first career honor.
- Johnson was named the Senior Bowl Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 14 after rushing for 166 yards with two touchdowns and having three receptions for 22 yards and one touchdown in the win over Washington. It was Johnson's second three touchdown game of the season.

#### **OUR BELL COW**

Junior RB Kaleb Johnson has rushed for 937 yards (second nationally) with 12 touchdowns (fourth in FBS) in 22 quarters. He is second nationally, averaging 156.2 yards on 19.7 attempts per game, which includes 16 rushes of 20+ yards. Johnson's 937 yards are the most in the team's first six games since 1997 (Tavian Banks, 1,018 yards).

- He is third in yards per carry (7.94), fourth in scoring (13), rushing touchdowns (12), points scored (78) and total touchdowns (13).
- Johnson is the first Hawkeye since Mark Weisman in 2014 (five straight) to have two or more touchdowns in four consecutive games. He had nine touchdowns in the first four games -- the most in the team's first four games since Banks in 1997 (12) and his 12 rushing touchdowns are the most by a Hawkeye in a season since 2015 (Jordan Canzeri, 12).
- In six games, Johnson is leading the nation with 16
  20+ yard rushes -- 21, 23, 23, 24, 26, 27, 28, 28, 33,
  33 37, 39, 40, 53, 54, 64 yards five of which went for touchdowns (26, 64, 33, 28, 40). lowa's offense had 12 such rushes as a team during the 2023 season.
- Johnson posted four consecutive 100-yard games, becoming the first Hawkeye to accomplish the feat since Weisman in 2014. He had his second career 200-yard game at Minnesota. He has five 100-yard games in six contests this season, which are tied for the 10th-most in a single season in program history.
- He has nine career 100-yard games (three in 2022, one in 2023 and five in 2024), which are tied for the eighth most all-time.
- Johnson had a career-high 206 yards on 21 carries 9.8 yards per attempt in the road win at Minnesota, finding the end zone a career-best three times. He had five rushes of 20+ yards in the game.
- He had 166 yards on 21 attempts with two rushing touchdowns and three receptions for 22 yards and one touchdown in the Week 7 win over Washington. He is the first lowa running back since 2012 (Weisman) to have multiple three TD games.

- He finished with 25 carries for 173 yards and two touchdowns in Week 3 against Troy to surpass his rushing total from the 2023 season (463 yards). Johnson rushed for 187 yards and two touchdowns on a career-high 25 attempts against lowa State in Week 2. He had 105 yards in the first half alone. Johnson is the first Hawkeye since 2017 to post a 100-yard game against the Cyclones and the yardage total is the most by an lowa player in the series since 1996 (Tavian Banks, 182).
- He rushed for 119 yards on 11 carries (all in the second half) against Illinois State in the season opener, which included a 64-yard touchdown run -- the third-longest rush of his career.

#### **APPROACHING 1K**

Junior Kaleb Johnson needs just 37 yards to become the 22nd player in program history to surpass 1,000 career rushing yards. He currently has 937 yards on 118 attempts. The last Hawkeye to hit the 1,000-yard mark was Tyler Goodson in 2021. Head coach Kirk Ferentz has had 11 1,000-yard rushers in his tenure.

• Shonn Greene surpassed 1,000 yards in his eighth game in 2008. Tavian Banks had 1,018 yards through six games in 1997.

#### **JOHNSON ON CAREER RUSHING LIST**

Junior RB Kaleb Johnson moved into 13th place in program history in career rushing with his 166-yard performance in the Week 71 win over Washington. The Ohio native has 2,179 yards in 29 career games. He is the 17th player in program history to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards.

• Johnson is 372 yards from the top 10 on lowa's all-time rushing list -- Shonn Greene (12th, 2,228), Ronnie Harmon (11th, 2,271), Tyler Goodson (10th, 2,551).

#### **KJ FACTS**

- Junior Kaleb Johnson was one of four Big Ten tailbacks to with 100 rushing yards and two touchdowns in four straight games in the last 10 years along with Minnesota's Mohamed Ibrahim (2021-22), Ohio State's Ezekiel Elliott (2014) and Michigan State's Jeremy Langford (2014).
- Since 2000, Johnson was one of three Big Ten players with 680+ rushing yards and 9+ rushing touchdowns through the team's first four games along with Michigan State's Javon Ringer (2008) and Ibrahim (2020).
- Johnson is the fifth player in program history to have multiple career 200-yard games, joining Sedrick Shaw (250/214), Tavian Banks (314/204), Shonn Greene (217/211) and Marcus Coker (252/219).

#### **RUSH STRONG**

The Hawkeyes rushed for 200+ yards in five of the first six games of the 2024 season. It is the first time since the 2013 season that lowa has had five 200+ yard games.

- lowa is averaging 222.8 yards on 38.7 attempts per game through six weeks. The rushing attack is leading the Big Ten and is 13th nationally.
- The Hawkeyes have 18 rushes of 20+ yards in 2024 after having 12 runs of 20+ yards a season ago.

#### JAZZ JOINS THE PARTY

Sophomore Jaziun Patterson has emerged as lowa's top reserve tailback in 2024. The Florida native has 33 carries for 154 yards with one touchdown, averaging 38.5 yards per game.

• In his first action of the 2024 season, Patterson had eight carries for 72 yards, including a 39-yard touchdown run, in the Week 3 victory over Troy.

#### McNAMARA UNDER CENTER

Senior Cade McNamara has completed 86-of-136 passes for 794 yards and five touchdowns in 2024, completing 63.2 percent of his attempts. The Nevada native is averaging 132.3 passing yards per game.

- In 27 career starts, McNamara has a 21-6 record.
- McNamara finished with 251 passing yards and three touchdowns, completing 21-of-31 attempts on Aug. 31 against Illinois State. The 251 yards and three TDs were McNamara's highs as a Hawkeye and the yardage total is a high by an lowa quarterback since 2021. In the second half, McNamara was brilliant, completing 13-of-14 attempts for 177 yards and three TDs.
- It was the fifth time in McNamara's career he has passed for 250 or more yards and his third career game with three or more touchdown passes.
- In Week 3 against Troy, McNamara completed 19-of-23 attempts for 176 yards, completing 83.2 percent of his passes
- -- his high-water mark as a Hawkeye. In Week 7, he completed 8-of-14 attempts for 108 yards with two touchdowns
- -- his fourth two-TD game at lowa.

#### **SULLY IN THE (RED) ZONE**

The Hawkeyes are 6-for-6 in red zone scoring opportunities (5 TDs, 1 FG) with junior QB Brendan Sullivan under center this season. lowa rolled out the package in Week 3 against Troy.

- Sullivan recorded his first career completion and touchdown pass as a Hawkeye in the Week 3 win over Troy a 2-yard touchdown pass to tight end Addison Ostrenga. In Week 4 at Minnesota, Sullivan had a 1-yard rushing touchdown his first of the season.
- He went 2-for-2 against Washington, leading the team to a touchdown and field goal.
- The Northwestern transfer led the Hawkeyes on a five play, 75-yard scoring drive in his first true series in Week 6 at Ohio State. He had a 30-yard rush and 12-yard completion during the series.

#### **HAWKEYE FIRSTS**

- Freshman Dayton Howard's first career reception went for a 33-yard touchdown in the Week 7 win over Washington. The 33-yard pass is tied for the team's longest passing play of the season.
- Junior Kaleb Johnson had an 18-yard touchdown reception -- the first receiving TD of his career.

#### **WEJ ON THE RETURN**

Senior Kaden Wetjen, who is leading the nation with 371 combined kick return yards, has been named to the midseason watch list for the 14th-annual Jet Award, recognizing college football's top return specialist. He is in the top 25 in FBS in kick and punt returns, ranking 19th in kick returns (24.7) and 22nd in punt returns (9.9). The Williamsburg, lowa, native had a career-long 37-yard kickoff return against Washington and he finished the game with 122 all-purpose yards -- 11 rushing, 74 kickoff return and 37 punt return.

#### **STEADY JACOB**

Northwestern transfer Jacob Gill has been a steadying force in lowa's wide receiving corps, leading Hawkeye wideouts with 16 receptions for 169 yards and one touchdown. The North Carolina native had a combined 17 catches in his three seasons with the Wildcats.

- Gill had three catches for 46 yards and a 31-yard touchdown in his Hawkeye debut against Illinois State. In Week 3, he had a team-best five catches for 44 yards.
- Gill has three of lowa's top six explosive plays in the passing game -- a 31-yard catch in Week 1, a 21-yarder vs. lowa State and a 22-yarder at Ohio State.

#### **CLEAN, DISCIPLINED FOOTBALL**

The Hawkeyes didn't commit a penalty in their Week 3 victory over Troy. It was the third game since the start of the 2023 season and the fourth time in the team's last 21 games where the team wasn't penalized. Since 1970, lowa has 10 games where it hasn't committed a penalty.

- lowa is leading the nation in fewest penalties (16), fewest penalties per game (2.67), fewest penalty yards (155) and fewest penalty yards per game (25.83).
- Since committing seven penalties for 50 yards in Week 1, the Hawkeyes have 10 penalties for 105 yards over their last five games.

#### **TIGHT END PRODUCTION**

Five different tight ends have a reception this season with the group combining for 35 catches for 271 yards and one touchdown in six games this season. Four different tight ends have at least three receptions.

• Fifth-year senior Luke Lachey (19 catches, 156 yards) and junior Addison Ostrenga (11 catches, 63 yards, 1TD) have combined for 30 catches for 219 yards and one touchdown. Lachey and Ostrenga are first and fourth on the team, respectively.

#### WHAT AN OFFENSIVE DEBUT

The Hawkeyes finished with 492 yards of total offense under first-year Tim Lester offensive coordinator in the season opener against Illinois State. The unit had a balanced attack with 251 passing yards and 241 rushing yards.

- The 492 yards are the most in a season opener since 2002 (593 yards vs. Akron) and the most by the unit since 2019 (644 yards vs. Middle Tennessee State).
- •The Hawkeyes had 462 yards in a Week 3 win over Troy; it is the first time since 2021 lowa has had 400+ yards in two games in a single season.

#### **VANDER-WOW**

Freshman WR Reece Vander Zee had a day to remember in his first career game as a Hawkeye. The Rock Rapids, lowa, native finished with five receptions for 66 yards and two touchdowns -- a 7-yarder in the third quarter and a 19-yarder early in the fourth.

- Vander Zee is the first Hawkeye true freshman with a receiving touchdown in the season opener since Dominique Douglas versus Montana in 2006.
- He is the first Hawkeye rookie wideout to have two receiving touchdowns in a game since Ihmir Smith-Marsette at lowa State in 2017 and the first in the season opener dating back to 1996.
- Vander Zee became the first true freshman to start a game since 2022, the first true freshman wide receiver to start since 2021 and the seventh true freshman wide out to start under Kirk Ferentz.
- In six games, Vander Zee is fifth on the team with 11 receptions for 129 yards and two touchdowns.

#### DDDDDD-EFENSE

lowa's defense allowed just 189 yards in its 40-0 shutout victory over Illinois State in Week 1. The Hawkeyes have limited seven opponents to 200 yards or less since 2022.

- lowa's defense limited Minnesota to 66 yards and just five first downs in the second half.
- lowa has held all four of its six opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing (Illinois State, 56; lowa State, 89; Troy, 24; Minnesota, 79). The 24 yards are the fewest for the unit since 2022.
- The Hawkeyes allow 96.3 rushing yards per game in 2024, which is eighth in the Big Ten and 18th nationally. lowa's opponents have one rushing touchdown.
- lowa is 14th in first down defense (96), 19th in turnovers (9) and interceptions (7), 22nd in defensive touchdowns (1), 24th in scoring defense (17.7) and 29th in total defense (316) and sacks (2.50).
- The unit has four shutouts since the start of the 2022 season and the Hawkeyes have eight shutouts since 2018, second-most in FBS during that span.

#### **GRAAAAAVES**

Junior Aaron Graves had his second career game with two or more sacks, finishing with two sacks and two forced fumbles in the Week 7 victory over Washington. He had a career-high three sacks in his first career start against Illinois State.

- Graves is third in the Big Ten and 14th nationally, averaging 0.83 sacks per game.
- lowa's defense has 15 sacks and 25 TFL in six games. Graves (5/5) and Brian Allen (3/4.5) are leading the team in sacks and TFL.

#### **TURNOVER KINGS**

For a unit that had just 15 turnovers in 14 games in 2023, the Hawkeyes emphasis on forcing turnovers had a strong start to 2024. The unit has force has forced at least one turnover in every game this season, forcing 11 in six games.

• lowa's 11 takeaways are 19th nationally and the turnover margin is 15th (1.00).

#### **JERMARIX8**

Graduate Jermari Harris has a team-high three interceptions and seven passes defended in 2024, including a 28-yard pick-six in the Week 3 victory over Troy. The Chicago native has eight career interceptions, which are tied for the 20th most in program history.

• Harris is second in the Big Ten and sixth nationally in interceptions and is ninth in passes defended (1.3).

#### **DREW THE KICKER**

Two-time Lou Groza Award semifinalist Drew Stevens is in his third season as lowa's placekicker. He is 10-for-11 in field goal attempts this season, including a season-long 51-yarder in Week 7 against Washington. Stevens is 4-for-4 from 40-49 yards in 2024.

- He is in the top 15 nationally in field goal percentage (.909) and field goals per game (1.67).
- Stevens tied a career high with four field goals against the Huskies with makes from 37, 46, 25 and 51 yards. It was his third career game with four makes and the 51-yarder was his fifth career FG from 50+.
- Stevens is tied with Nate Kaeding for second most 50+ yard field goals in school history. Stevens will tie Brion Hur-ley for the school record with his next make of 50 yards or more.
- As a sophomore, Stevens made 18-of-26 field goals with the 18 makes being the third-most in the Big Ten and tied for the 27th-most nationally.
- Stevens has two career game-winning field goals. He made a 21-yarder with 28 seconds left in a road win at Min-nesota in 2022 and a 53-yarder in a road win over Northwestern at Wrigley Field in 2023.
- For his career, Stevens has made 44-of-55 field goal attempts (80 percent) and is 62-of-63 on PATs. He is 5-of-8 from 50-59 yards in his Hawkeye career.
- During his rookie season in Iowa City, Stevens earned freshman All-America honors after making 16-of-18 field goal attempts -- the most by a Hawkeye freshman all-time.

#### **RHYS GROWS**

Freshman Rhys Dakin is averaging 44.6 yards on 30 punts in 2024, which ranks 23rd nationally. Fifteen of his 30 punts have been fair caught, 14 have been downed inside the 20 and eight have traveled 50+yards.

- Dakin was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week on Sept. 24 following his Week 4 performance at Minnesota. He averaged 49.6 yards on five punts, including a career-long 55-yarder. Three of his punts were downed inside the 20 and three traveled 50+ yards.
- He had two 50+ yard punts in the Week 7 win over Washington, including a career-best 61 yarder.
- Dakin hails from Melbourne, Australia -- the same hometown as one of the most decorated punters in college football history in 2023 Ray Guy Award winner Tory Taylor.

#### FRESHMAN WATCH

Three Hawkeye freshmen – Rhys Dakin (6 games), Reece Vander Zee (6) and Jaylen Watson (3) – have seen action during the 2024 season.

#### **MORE NOTABLES**

- The Hawkeyes return two defensive players -- Sebastian Castro and Jay Higgins -who garnered All-America distinction during the 2023 season. Higgins was tabbed as Phil Steele's Preseason National Defensive Player of the Year leading into 2024.
- The Hawkeyes are one of nine FBS programs with a streak of 10+ years of reaching bowl eligibility -- Georgia (27), Oklahoma (25), Wisconsin (22), Alabama (20), Clemson (19), Oklahoma State (18), Iowa (11), Ohio State (11), Memphis (10).
- lowa is one of 10 FBS programs to have posted 10 straight winning seasons (Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Georgia, Iowa, Memphis, Ohio State, Oklahoma State, Utah and Wisconsin).
- Only five programs nationally have posted top 10 defenses for three consecutive seasons -- Alabama, Clemson, Iowa, Penn State and Georgia -- and only eight programs have posted top 25 defenses in five straight seasons (Alabama, Clemson, Iowa, Notre Dame, Penn State, Pittsburgh, Texas A&M and Georgia).
- lowa won 25 Big Ten games between 2020-23, matching its highest four-year conference win total in program history (1982-85, 2002-05).
- lowa has been ranked in the top six in the nation in scoring defense in four of the last five seasons and in the top 10 in total defense in four of the last six seasons. The unit led the country in fewest yards per play allowed in 2022 (3.99) and 2023
- lowa's defense has allowed fewer than 20 points per game in eight consecutive seasons -- the longest active streak in the nation.

#### **COUNTING DOWN TO THE RECORD**

Sixth-year linebacker Nick Jackson currently had 503 career tackles, which are the most among active players and fourth-most in FBS history. With 75 more tackles, the Atlanta native would pass Troy's Carlton Martial as the all-time FBS leader in career tackles. Jackson's single-season career high in tackles is 117 during the 2021 season at Virginia.

#### **EXPERIENCE GALORE**

Sixteen key contributors on the lowa football team are in their final year of eligibility. Seven are sixth-year seniors -- DB Jermari Harris, QB Cade McNamara, LB Nick Jackson, DB Sebastian Castro, S Quinn Schulte, LB Kyler Fisher and OL Nick DeJong, while eight are fifth-year seniors -- LB Jay Higgins, DE Deontae Craig, DE Ethan Hurkett, OL Tyler Elsbury, OL Mason Richman, OL Logan Jones, TE Luke Lachey and DL Yahya Black. One fourth-year starter -- OL Connor Colby -- will also exhaust his eligibility in 2024.

#### **BACK UP FRONT**

Eleven returning players lowa's offensive line have combined to play in 306 games, including 195 starts. Among the team's starting five, the Hawkeyes' returnees have played in 180 career games, including 156 starts.

- lowa had the sixth-most returning games played in the nation -- Florida State (345), Oklahoma State (331), Tennessee (284), Duke (263), Oregon (257), Iowa (251)
- -- entering the 2024 season. The team's 65 starts were the fourth-most nationally behind Oklahoma State (215), Florida State (210) and Duke (168).

#### A PAIR OF 4-YEAR STARTERS

Fifth-year senior Mason Richman is lowa's first four-year starter at offensive tackle since Alaric Jackson (2017-20). Richman has 45 career starts, which are the fourthmost among offensive linemen in the Kirk Ferentz era.

• Senior Connor Colby is in his fourth season as a starter, primarily as an offensive guard. Colby has made 42 career starts.

**WR Jacob Gill** – Transfer from Northwestern... made 17 catches for 195 yards at two touchdowns in three years with Wildcats.

**QB Jackson Stratton** — Transfer from Colorado State... originally from California... saw action in four games in 2022.

**QB Brendan Sullivan** – Transfer from Northwestern... recruited by OC Tim Lester out of high school... completed 134-of-195 passes for 1,303 yards and five touchdowns in 2023.

#### **HAWKEYE FREAK!**

Senior Logan Jones is listed on Bruce Feldman's top 100 "Freak List" for a second straight season, jumping 43 spots (from No. 52 to No. 9) on the 2024 edition. The Council Bluffs, lowa, native vertical-jumped 36.6 inches, has squatted 695 pounds (a Hawkeye record) and did the program's second-heaviest hang clean at 470 pounds. He also clocked a 1.53 10-yard split (an lowa OL record) and ran a 4.09 pro agility time in 2022. His 20-yard shuttle time is .05 faster than the best time an offensive lineman has posted at the NFL Combine.

#### A NEW (HAY BALE) CHAMP!

Redshirt freshman Kade Peiper earned the distinction as Solon Beef Days Hay Bale Toss champion on July 24. He cleared 12-foot with ease to win the final, which included three other Hawkeyes -- Tyler Elsbury, Leighton Jones and Cael Winter.

#### **2024 PLAYER COUNCIL**

Sixteen players — seven sixth-year players, seven fifth-year seniors, one senior and one junior — are on the 2024 Player Council. The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies and being involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected following coaching staff and player input. - Epenesa's brother, A.J., played at lowa from 2017-19. DE Drew Campbell is the younger brother of Hawkeye All-America LB Jack Campbell, LB Devan Van Ness is the younger brother of former lowa DE Lukas Van Ness and Cody Fox is the younger brother of former lowa OL Taylor Fox.
- RB Max White is the great, great grandson of Max Hawkins, a member of Iowa's famed "Ironmen" team in 1939 that included Iowa Heisman Trophy winner Nile Kinnick. White is Hawkins' namesake Max Hawkins White and his family lives in Hawkins' former house in Cedar Rapids.

- Three Hawkeyes had relatives that played for the Hawkeyes -- DL Andrew Kraus' father, Matt, played baseball, DL Max Llewellyn's brother, Luke, played baseball at lowa, and DB Jaylen Watson's uncle is former Hawkeye RB Fred Russell.

#### IN THE RANKINGS

- The Hawkeyes were ranked in the first two polls (25th and 21st) of the 2024 season before falling out in Week 3. lowa is receiving votes in both the Associated Press and Coaches' polls.
- lowa was ranked 17th in the final College Football Playoff standings for the 2023 season. The Hawkeyes climbed as high as No. 16 twice during the regular season.
- The Hawkeyes finished the 2023 season ranked No. 22 in the AFCA Coaches' Poll and 24th in the Associated Press Poll. lowa was ranked or receiving votes in one of the polls each week of 2023.
- It was the 11th time under head coach Kirk Ferentz that the Hawkeyes appeared in the final rankings and the 28th time in program history.

#### **BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001**

- The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 22 times in the last 23 seasons, including 2023. lowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- lowa head coach Kirk Ferentz won the 10th bowl game of his career in the Hawkeyes' 21-0 win over Kentucky in the 2022 TransPerfect Music City Bowl, tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference.
   Ferentz has a 10-10 bowl record.
- Eighteen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Mack Brown (14), Mike Gundy (12), Dabo Swinney (12) and Kyle Whittingham (11) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.
- Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State (12), Wisconsin (12), Oregon (11) and USC (11) have more bowl wins (including FCS Playoffs and the BCS championship game), than lowa. lowa is 18-17-1 all-time in bowl games. The following are the records for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

#### **BIG TEN PERFECTION**

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

• Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only seven Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons. They include: Duffy Daugherty (Michigan State; 1965, 1966), Ferentz (Iowa; 2002, 2015), Jim Harbaugh (Michigan; 2022, 2023), Woody Hayes (Ohio State; 1954, 1957, 1968, 1970, 1975); Urban Meyer (Ohio State; 2012, 2013); Bo Schembechler (Michigan; 1971, 1980, 1989); Jim Tressel (Ohio State; 2002, 2006).

For a third straight year, season tickets for the University of lowa football team is sold out. Iowa sold out all seven home games during both the 2022 and 2023 seasons.

## HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 26th season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2029 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided lowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and Big Ten West Division titles in 2015, 2021 and 2023.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach

of the Year award.

- Ferentz is second all-time with 200 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference, trailing only Woody Hayes (205). He has 124 Big Ten wins, which are the third-most all-time, trailing only Woody Hayes (153) and Bo Schembechler (143).
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- lowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- lowa has played in 12 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009
  Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Twelve different players have won 14 national awards during Ferentz's tenure.
- lowa has posted an 191-98 (.658) overall mark and a 121-72 (.624) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top half of the conference 17 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and West Division titles in 2015, 2021 and 2023.
- At lowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 200-121 (.623) and a 124-86 (.589) mark in Big Ten games. He is lowa's all-time winningest football coach with 200 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 212-142 (.598), giving him the fourth most wins among active head coaches.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05, James
  was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013 and Steve was a senior offensive lineman
  in 2016.
- James Ferentz, retired following an eight-year NFL career in 2024. He is currently an assistant offensive line coach for the New York Giants. Steve Ferentz is in his second season on the coaching staff at the University of South Dakota (outside linebackers coach), while Brian Ferentz is in his first season as an offensive analyst at Maryland.

## PHIL PARKER'S IOWA DEFENSE

- Phil Parker was named the recipient of the Frank Broyles Award and the AFCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2023. He was also named PFF's top defensive coordinator in college football in April, 2023.
- Since Parker took over as lowa's defensive coordinator, lowa is second in the Big Ten and fifth nationally in points (19.04), first in the Big Ten and fourth nationally in total offense (322.58), first in the Big Ten and third nationally in yards per play (4.77) and the unit is second in the nation in interceptions (185) and third in interceptions returned for touchdowns (28).
- lowa's defense allowed 400 yards or less in 33 of the last 34 games.
- The Hawkeyes have led the nation in fewest yards per play allowed on defense in consecutive seasons -- 3.99 in 2022 and 4.08 in 2023.
- lowa's defense has allowed fewer than 20 points per game in eight consecutive seasons -- the longest active streak in the nation.
- lowa is 18-4 under Parker all-time when returning an interception for a touchdown.
- The Hawkeyes have top-six scoring defenses nationally in three of the past four years. The scoring defense has ranked in the top 20 in the nation in each of the last eight years.
- lowa's 3.986 yards per play during the 2022 season were the lowest by any team at the FBS level since Florida State's 3.853 in 2012.
- In 2022, the Hawkeyes led FBS in points per drive (1.09), yards per pass attempt (5.3), yards per rush (2.8) and ranked second in FBS in points per game (13.3) and yards per game (270.8).
- lowa's 270.8 yards per game surrendered in 2022 was the fewest by an lowa defense since 1981.
- lowa has 235 interceptions since the start of the 2009 season -- tied for the third-most nationally in that span. The "BallHawks" had a school record 25 interceptions in 2021.
- A principle of Parker's defense is to limit explosive plays, forcing the offense to sustain a drive. lowa surrendered just 15 explosive plays out of 883 defensive snaps over 13 games during the 2022 season.
- Iowa has had six players win the Big Ten Tatum-Woodson Defensive Back of the Year since 2012: Micah Hyde, 2012; Desmond King, 2015; Josh Jackson, 2017; Amani Hooker, 2018; Riley Moss, 2021, Cooper DeJean, 2023).

#### **IOWA PROGRAM NOTES**

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 22 of the last 23 seasons. Iowa is 10-9 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (12) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 18-16-1 in 35 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- lowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (200-121) replaced Fry and has completed 25 seasons. Ferentz also served as lowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- lowa won the Big Ten West Division title in 2021 and 2023 to earn a spot in the Big Ten Championship Game. The Hawkeyes played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. lowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. lowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- lowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP Poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP Poll was released, lowa has appeared in the poll 354 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 14 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End), Tyler Linderbaum, (Rimington, Top Center), Jack Campbell (Campbell Trophy, Butkus Award) and Tory Taylor (Ray Guy).
- lowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- lowa has eight unanimous consensus All-Americans since 2010.
- lowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in lowa football history, based on total wins. lowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. lowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- lowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.

#### IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 220 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (89 draft picks/131 free agents).
- Seventeen former Hawkeyes participated in the 2023 NFL Playoffs, a number that ranked eighth nationally among programs and former players. Just one Big Ten program (Ohio State) had more former players participating in the playoffs.
- At least one lowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (46 consecutive years).
- Iowa has had 13 First Round NFL Draft picks under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- Iowa had two first round picks in the 2023 NFL Draft -- LB Lukas Van Ness (Packers) and LB Jack Campbell (Lions). It is the fourth time in program history Iowa has had two players selected in the first round.
- Three former Hawkeyes -- George Kittle, Brandon Scherff and Tristian Wirfs -- are team captains for their respective NFL teams.
- C Tyler Linderbaum and TE Sam LaPorta were named to the 2023 Pro Bowl. LaPorta was also a second-team All-Pro selection. TE George Kittle was first-team All-Pro in 2023.

- OT Tristan Wirfs and TEs George Kittle and T.J. Hockenson were both selected to the Pro Bowl in 2022. Wirfs and Kittle were Second Team NFL All-Pro selections.
- Two former Hawkeyes -- Jake Gervase and Alaric Jackson -- were members of the Los Angeles Rams' 2022 Super Bowl champion team.
- OT Tristan Wirfs earned first-team All-Pro and was a Pro Bowl selection in 2021.
- TET.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson (Detroit), TE George Kittle (San Francisco) and Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 24 years, 209-of-252 (83 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 16 years, lowa has had 61 NFL Draft picks, the third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (93), Michigan (85).
- lowa has had 10 first round picks in the last 14 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020; OL Tyler Linderbaum, 2022; LB Lukas Van Ness, 2023, LB Jack Campbell, 2023.
- lowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former lowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 11th year on staff and sixth as lowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former lowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- $\bullet Former \, center \, James \, Ferentz \, was \, a \, member \, of the \, 2016 \, Super \, Bowl \, champion \, Denver \, Broncos.$
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz, WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.
- Former OL Tristan Wirfs was the starting right tackle as a rookie for the 2021 Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Former DL Anthony Nelson was a reserve defensive end for the Bucs. Former LB Ben Niemann and LB Anthony Hitchens were on the AFC Champion Kansas City Chiefs.
- Entering the 2024 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (18) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 21 lowa tight ends since 1999 (13 drafted/8 free agents).
- All 11 members of lowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

- The victory is head coach Kirk Ferentz's 197th career win two behind Chicago's Amos Alonzo Stagg for the second-most victories in Big Ten history.
- The Hawkeyes improve to 101-33-2 all-time in season openers, including a 22-4 record under Ferentz.
- Assistant head coach Seth Wallace was the acting head coach with Ferentz serving a one game school-imposed suspension for a recruiting contact violation.

#### **INDIVIDUAL NOTES**

- Senior QB Cade McNamara completed 21-of-31 passes for 251 yards and three touchdowns.
- McNamara's passing yardage is his high as a Hawkeye.
- He is now 18-4 in his career as a starter.
- Junior Kaleb Johnson paced the team with 11 carries for 119 yards and two touchdowns a 64-yarder and 18-yarder in the fourth quarter.
- It is Johnson's fifth career 100-yard game and he tied a career-best with two rushing touchdowns.
- The 64-yard rush is the third-longest rush of Johnson's career (75 at Purdue in 2022; 67 vs. Purdue in 2023).
- It was Johnson's 10th and 11th career rushing touchdowns.
- Freshman WR Reece Vander Zee finished with five receptions for 66 yards and two touchdowns -- a 7-yarder -- the first of his career in the third quarter and a 19-yarder early in the fourth.
- Vander Zee is the first Hawkeye true freshman with a receiving touchdown in the season opener since Dominique Douglas vs. Montana in 2006.
- He is the first Hawkeye freshman wideout to have two receiving touchdowns in a game since Ihmir Smith-Marsette at Iowa State in 2017.
- Junior WR Jacob Gill had a 31-yard touchdown in the third quarter. It was his first touchdown as a Hawkeye and the third of his career.
- Gill finished with three receptions for 46 yards.
- Senior TE Luke Lachey led the team with six receptions for 63 yards.
- lowa's tight ends combined for 10 catches and 119 yards in the game.
- Sophomore DL Caden Crawford forced his first career fumble in the fourth quarter.
- Senior DB Sebastian Castro had a forced fumble the fifth of his career in the first quarter and T.J. Hall recovered, giving lowa its second forced turnover of the game.
- Junior DL Aaron Graves finished with four tackles, including a career-high three sacks and three tackles for loss.
- Senior DB Jermari Harris had a first-quarter interception the sixth pick of his Hawkeye career.
- Junior K Drew Stevens went 2-for-2 on field goal attempts in the first half. He connected from 41 yards for lowa's first points of the 2024 season in the first quarter before making a 28-yarder just before half.
- WR Reece Vander Zee made his first career start. He is the first true freshman to start since 2022, the first true freshman wide receiver to start since 2021 and the seventh true freshman wide receiver to start in the Kirk Ferentz era.

- Junior Kaleb Johnson recorded his second straight and sixth career 100-yard game, finishing with 187 yards on 25 attempts with two touchdowns, tying a career high.
- He is the first player to have 100 yards in the first two games of the season since 2017 (Akrum Wadley) and the first Hawkeye since 2021 (Tyler Goodson) to have back-to-back 100-yard games.
- Johnson is the first player to have two touchdowns in consecutive games since Goodson in 2020.

#### INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Junior Kaleb Johnson recorded his third straight and seventh career 100-yard game, finishing with 173 yards on 25 attempts with two touchdowns.
- He rushed for 100 yards in the first half for a second straight game and for the third time in his career.
- Johnson is the first Hawkeye running back since Jordan Canzeri in 2015 to rush for 100+ yards in three consecutive games.
- His seven career 100 yard games are tied for the 15th-most in program history (Canzeri).
- Johnson had a 5-yard touchdown run in the second quarter and a 33-yard TD run in the fourth his fifth and sixth touchdowns of the season.
- The six touchdowns are the most by a Hawkeye running back since he had six touchdowns in 2022.

- lowa has won five straight over the Gophers in Minneapolis and nine of the last 10 meetings overall.
- The Hawkeyes are 28-10 in their last 38 rivalry trophy games and 9-4 in their last 13 Big Ten openers.

- Junior Kaleb Johnson notched his second career 200-yard game and fourth consecutive 100-yard game, finishing with a career-high 206 yards on 21 attempts with a career-high three touchdowns -- a 1-yarder in the first and 15 and 40-yards in the third.
