Saint Louis (1-4-1) **BILLIKENS**

THE MATCH-UP

The University of Iowa soccer team returns to action Friday, hosting Saint Louis at 7 p.m. (CT) at the Iowa Soccer Complex. The Hawkeyes are 6-0 this season and have a 23-game nonconference winning streak.

SCOUTING SAINT LOUIS

Saint Louis opened its 2013 campaign with a 3-2 victory of Western Michigan, but lost its next four contests before tying Evansville, 1-1, on Sept. 8. During their four-game losing streak, the Billikens failed to score a goal while giving up nine to their opponents.

Four players lead Saint Louis with one goal each with senior Jenny Hummert leading the team in shots with 19. Hummert was selected as Saint Louis' most valuable player in 2012.

Sophomore goalkeeper Hannah Benben currently holds a 1.93 goals against average, and has played every minute of the 2013 season in goal for the Billikens.

SAINT LOUIS VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES

This is the sixth meeting between the schools, with the series tied at 2-2-1.

The Hawkeyes won the last match in 2012 by a score of 3-0 in St. Louis. Ashley Catrell scored two goals in the contest with Cloe Lacasse assisting on both. Lacasse also added a goal early in the second half.

LAST GAME

The Hawkeyes emerged victorious over Wright State on Sept. 8, 1-0, after an own-goal by the Raiders in the second half served as the contest's lone goal. Sophomore goalkeeper Hannah Clark picked up her fifth shutout of the year, making three saves.

NCAA STATISTICS

lowa currently ranks in the top-10 in several NCAA statistical categories.

The Hawkeyes' .833 shutout percentage is tied for the fourth best mark, the 0.167 goals against average is eighth and the .938 save percentage ranks ninth.

lowa is one of 18 teams in the NCAA without a tie or a loss.

lowa's defense is currently riding a streak of 380:01 minutes without a surrendering a







HEAD COACH RON RAINEY

Ron Rainey has turned the University of lowa soccer program into consistent contenders, guiding lowa to its two best seasons in program history the past two years. With Rainey at the helm, the Hawkeyes have averaged over 10 wins a season the past four years, marking its most successful stretch in program history.

With 69 career victories at lowa, Rainey is the school's all-time winningest coach. His career record is 161-125-38, while he sports a 71-60-17 record at lowa. He has guided lowa to at least 12 wins in the past two seasons, going undefeated in nonconference play and qualifying for the Big Ten Tournament in consecutive seasons. lowa has also re-written the record books the past two years, breaking or tying 10 school records.

lowa wrapped up a 12-6-3 season in 2012 with a trip to Bloomington, Ind., for the Big Ten Tournament. The Hawkeyes went 9-0 in nonconference play and outscored its opponents 31-3 in that stretch. Iowa picked up Big Ten victories against Indiana and Purdue, and defeated Wisconsin, 2-0, to reach the postseason in a dramatic conclusion of the regular season. Iowa outscored its opponents, 40-19, in 2012.

The Hawkeyes finished 13-4-3 in 2011 and set or tied nine school records. Iowa went 9-0 in nonconference play and outscored its opponents 35-5 in that stretch. Iowa's 5-4-2 Big Ten record was its best since 2000. Iowa went on to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament for the sixth time in program history. The Hawkeyes ranked near the top in many major Big Ten statistical categories and finished fifth in Big Ten standings.

Rainey joined the Hawkeyes from Ball State University before the start of the 2006 season, where he served as the school's head coach since the program's inaugural season in 1999. Under his tutelage, the Cardinals posted a 70-52-17 record in seven seasons.

Before starting the program at Ball State, Rainey served as an assistant coach at the University of Iowa for the first two seasons of the Hawkeye program (1997-98). In Iowa's first year of varsity soccer, Rainey and the Hawkeyes were named the No. 1 first-year program by Soccer Buzz Magazine.

Rainey's wife Margaret earned her master's degree in education at lowa and played collegiate soccer at the University of Wisconsin. They have three children: Wade (11), Sally (9) and Mary (7).

goal. The Hawkeyes have posted four consecutive shutouts and haven't allowed a goal since the second game of the season against Western Michigan. The Bronco's strike is the only goal allowed by lowa in 2013.

BREAKING RECORDS, BEATING RIVALS

The Hawkeyes continued their dominance over lowa State on Sept. 6, beating the Cyclones 3-0 in front of a record crowd of 1,594 at the lowa Soccer Complex. The crowd bested the previous high mark of 975 fans set in the 2011 season.

Junior Anne Marie Thomas scored her first goal of the season via an assist from junior Melanie Pickert in the 11th minute. Senior Alex Melin headed the ball into the net off an assist from sophomore Brooke Backes in the 20th minute to push the lead to 2-0, and freshman Bri Toelle sealed the game with a goal in the 64th minute via a second assist from Pickert.

The win was the sixth-straight for lowa in the series. In those six games, lowa has outscored the Cyclones 19-4.

NONCONFERENCE DOMINANCE

The Hawkeyes have been dominant in non-league competition dating back to the 2011 season. The Hawkeyes have compiled a 23-0 nonconference record during the stretch.

lowa's last nonconference loss came during the 2010 season against Nebras-ka, a year before it joined the Big Ten.

Since the 2011 season, the Hawkeyes have outscored their nonconference opponents, 76-9.

HAWKEYES TAKE TOURNEY TITLE

After defeating UC Davis on Aug. 30 and Pacific on Sept. 1, the Hawkeyes captured the Pacific Soccer Classic team title.

Senior Alex Melin, Juniors Melanie Pickert, Caitlin Brown, Cloe Lacasse, and sophomore Hannah Clark were named to the all-tournament team.

CLARK EARNS B1G HONOR

Sophomore goalkeeper Hannah Clark was selected as the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 3 after posting consecutive shutouts and leading the Hawkeyes to the team title at the Pacific Soccer Classic. The Fort Collins, Colo., native made six saves on the weekend and had a 0.00 goals against average and a 1.000 saves percentage. The honor is the second of Clark's career.

LEADING THE B1G

Sophomore Hannah Clark ranks among the top-three in the Big Ten in three different statistical categories. The Colorado native's five shutouts and .938 saves percentage are tops among the league's 12 goalkeepers and her 0.170 goals against average is the second-best figure in the conference.

BALANCED SCORING

Seven different lowa players have scored at least one goal thus far in 2013. Senior Alex Melin and juniors Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert are leading the team with two strikes apiece. Pickert is also tops on the squad with two assists, giving her a team-best six points. Five different lowa players have notched game-winning goals.

PERFECT ON PENALTY KICKS

lowa is a perfect 3-for-3 in penalty kicks in 2013. The Hawkeyes got PK goals from Lana Bonekemper (Drake), Ashley Catrell (Western Michigan) and Cloe Lacasse (Pacific).

lowa was 4-of-4 in penalty kicks the entire 2012 season.

OUTSHOOTING THE OPPONENT

In six games, lowa has doubled the shot output of its opponents, 96-48. In the first half alone, the Hawkeyes have attempted 57 shots compared to their opposition's 20.





IRON WOMAN

Junior Caitlin Brown is the only position player to play every minute for the Hawkeyes in 2013. Brown, who has played all 540 minutes along with goalkeeper Hannah Clark, has anchored an lowa defense that surrenders just eight shots a game.

TRANSFER ADDED

Junior Emily Scott joined the Hawkeye soccer program this fall after two seasons at Milwaukee. Scott started every game as a freshman at central defender, and played every minute of the 2012 season at the position.

The Tinley Park, III. native tallied a goal in an exhibition match against her former team on Aug. 17.

LACASSE HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

In two-plus years, junior Cloe Lacasse has made her mark on the lowa soccer program.

The Sudbury, Ontario, native is currently third for career goals (27), surpassing Katelynn Quinn (25) after her consecutive one-goal games against UC Davis and Pacific. She currently ranks third in career points (68), and fourth in career shots (171).

Lacasse has led lowa in goals scored, points, and shots taken in both the 2011 and 2012 seasons.

Lacasse was named lowa's MVP in 2012, scoring goals in each of the team's first nine matches. She was named to the Madness' 2012 All-Big Ten first-team by CollegeSportsMadness.com, and was an All-Great Lakes Region second team honoree by the NSCAA.

B1G IN THE POLLS

In the most recent NSCAA Coaches Poll, two Big Ten teams are in the Top 25.

Penn State (3-1-1) moved to No. 13 from its previous spot at No. 14. Michigan (5-0-0) maintained its position at No. 11. Illinois received votes.

Ohio State and Wisconsin received votes.

HAWKEYES ON TV

lowa will appear on BTN at least once this season, and the Big Ten Digital Network at least three times.

The Hawkeyes' Sept. 22 contest with Michigan will be broadcast live on BTN. The match will begin at 1 p.m. (CT).

The Big Ten Digital Network will broadcast lowa's games against Northern Iowa (Sept. 17), Michigan State (Oct. 6), and Ohio State (Oct. 27).

The BTN will also be televising the Big Ten Tournament on Nov. 6-10.

ALL-TIME WINNINGEST COACH

In his eighth season as lowa head coach, Ron Rainey is the winningest coach in school history. He has compiled a 71-60-16 record, which includes 29 victories the past two plus seasons. The stretch is the best in program history, including a 13-win season in 2011.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Senior Alex Melin and junior Caitlin Brown have been voted team captains for the 2013 Iowa soccer team.
