THE SETTING

Iowa (4-2) concludes its five-game road trip at Northern Iowa (0-3) Monday. Tip-off is slated for 7:05 p.m. in the UNI Dome. Monday's contest will be Iowa's fifth road game in 11 nights. Three of Iowa's next four opponents are from the Missouri Valley Conference (Northern Iowa, Drake and Creighton).

ON THE AIR

All Iowa games are broadcast on the Hawkeye Radio Network. Listen to Iowa women's basketball games on KXIC-AM 800 in Iowa City, WHO-AM 1040 in Des Moines and WMT-AM 600 in Cedar Rapids. Mark Allen and Karen Schulte call the action.

IOWA HISTORY

Iowa has played 823 games since beginning basketball in 1974. Overall, Iowa's record is 502-321 (.610). That includes a 266-138 (.658) mark in Big Ten games and a 221-49 (.819) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

NUMBER OF THE WEEK -- 100

Iowa Head Coach Lisa Bluder will be coaching her 100th Iowa game Monday night against her alma mater. She holds a 61-38 (.616) record while mentoring the Hawkeyes. In addition, Bluder is three games from coaching in her 600th career game as a head coach. She holds a 417-180 (.698) mark in 597 contests.

While Coach Bluder will be coaching her 100th game as a Hawkeye, senior Jennie Lillis will be playing her 100th game. Lillis has started 98-of-99 contests during her Hawkeye career.

HAWKEYES CAPTURE WIN NUMBER 500

Iowa won its 500th game in its program's 30-year history with a 62-58 victory over Saint Joseph's in the first round of the FIU Thanksgiving Classic on Nov. 28.

JENNIE LILLIS BREAKS RECORD

Senior Jennie Lillis entered the FIU Thanksgiving Classic 10 free throws attempted from breaking Toni Foster's school record of 445. Lillis attempted 20 free throws -- 10 in each game. She is the new record holder with 459.

Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her fourth season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 20th season as a college head coach. Bluder, 41, has a career record of 417-180 (.698), including a 61-38 (.616) record at Iowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose. In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the Women's Basketball News Service and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year.



Last year, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to its first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times at Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (6) and Emma (3) and one son, David (1).

Bluder is 20-2 against Northern Iowa, with 19 of the 20 victories coming while she coached at Drake.

FOUL PLAY

Four Hawkeyes fouled out at Iowa State (Jennie Lillis, Jamie Cavey, Johanna Solverson and Kristi Faulkner). Jennie Lillis has fouled out in three of Iowa's first six games this season. The senior from Urbandale, IA, fouled out only once in 33 games her junior year and three times in 29 contests her sophomore season.

As a team, Hawkeye players have fouled out nine times in Iowa's first six games, matching its total all of last year.

IOWA CAPTAINS

Iowa captains for the season include seniors Kristi Faulkner, Jennie Lillis and Becca McCann.

HAWKEYES DEFEAT MARQUETTE

Playing in its second road game in three nights, Iowa rallied from a 10-point deficit late in the fourth quarter to win 65-62 at Marquette. The win was Iowa's fourth-straight over the Golden Eagles.

Trailing 59-49 with 4:17 left, the Hawkeyes ended the game on a 16-3 run to claim victory. The Hawkeye defense did not allow a Marquette field goal the last 4:17. Jamie Cavey scored Iowa's last five points, three of which came from the free throw line to help secure the win. Cavey finished the game converting a career-high 7-8 from the charity stripe.

Cavey scored a team-high 15 points (4-8 FG, 7-8 FT), Jennie Lillis tallied 13 points (6-9 FG, 1-1 FT), while Kristi Faulkner added 12 points (4-8 FG, 2-2 FT). Johanna Solverson pulled down a team-high nine rebounds and dished out a career-high nine assists.

Iowa yielded 19 offensive rebounds. The Golden Eagles tuned the 19 offensive rebounds into only nine points. The Hawkeyes left Milwaukee victorious, despite committing 27 turnovers, one shy of a season high.

HAWKEYES REACH DOUBLE FIGURES

Iowa had all five starters reach double figures in scoring at Iowa State. It marked the second-consecutive game that the Hawkeyes had five players post double figure numbers. In addition, Iowa has scored 90 points or more in back-to-back road games (at Florida International - 93, and at Iowa State - 94). The last time Iowa posted back-to-back 90-point scoring outbursts was when the Hawkeyes poured in 95 vs Northwestern and 91 at Wisconsin in 2000. The Hawkeyes have scored 90 points or more in 11 games under Coach Bluder.

OVERTIME BLUES

Iowa's game at Iowa State last Wednesday was the third overtime game in the series history and the first double overtime contest. Iowa State has a 2-1 advantage in overtime games between the two schools. It was the first overtime game for Iowa since falling to NC State (69-66) on Nov. 29, 2002 in the first round of the LMU Thanksgiving Classic. Furthermore, it marked only the second time Iowa has ever played in a double overtime game in its 30-year program history. Michigan State defeated the Hawkeyes (71-70) on Jan. 15, 1995 in East Lansing, MI. Iowa is 2-4 in overtime games under Coach Bluder.

SEASON TICKETS

Hawkeye fans can purchase a season ticket package for only \$70 for the 2003-04 season. Senior citizens and faculty/staff can purchase season tickets for \$56, while the price for students is \$35. There is also a "Family Pack" for \$145 that includes admission for two adults and two youths. Tickets can be purchased online by logging on to www.hawkeyesports.com or by calling 1-800-IA-HAWKS. Fans may also order tickets in person at the UI Ticket Office.

SCOUTING NORTHERN IOWA

Northern Iowa enters Monday's contest with the Hawkeyes with an 0-3 record. The Panthers dropped a 70-61 decision at Illinois-Chicago on Dec. 4 in their last game. Northern Iowa had two players post double-doubles in the loss. Junior Alex Cook scored 19 points and collected 10 rebounds, while sophomore Kim Hansen tallied 15 points and grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds. The Panthers shot only 21-63 (.333) from the field, including converting only 1-15 (.067) from beyond the arc.

Senior Amy Swisher leads Northern Iowa in scoring (14.3 ppg) and ranks third in rebounding (7.7). Cook ranks first in rebounding (9.3 rpg) and second in scoring (12.3 ppg). Junior Emily Berry ranks third on the squad in scoring (11.7 ppg), while Hansen ranks fourth in scoring (10.7 ppg) and second in rebounding (8.3 rpg).

Tony DiCecco is in his eighth season as a college head coach, all at Northern Iowa. DiCecco's overall record is 115-112 (.507).

ALL-TIME SERIES RECORDS

This will be the ninth meeting between the two schools. Iowa holds a 7-1 advantage in the series that began with a Northern Iowa win (83-39) in Cedar Falls in 1975. Since that loss, the Hawkeyes have won seven straight over the Panthers. Iowa won last year's game (98-68) in Iowa City. Iowa and Northern Iowa did not play each other from 1984-2002. The Hawkeyes own a 3-1 edge in games played in Cedar Falls.

COMMON OPPONENTS

Northern Iowa and Iowa share four common opponents: Houston, Iowa State, Drake and Creighton. The Panthers lost to Houston (63-58) in overtime in their season opener. Northern Iowa has yet to play Iowa State (Dec. 30), Drake (Jan. 22, Feb. 22) and Creighton (Jan. 25, Feb. 20).

Iowa lost to Houston (70-64) and Iowa State (101-94, 2OT). The Hawkeyes will face Drake (Dec. 21) and Creighton (Dec. 28) later this month.

LAST MEETING

Iowa defeated Northern Iowa (98-68) in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes out-rebounded the Panthers 69-37. The 69 rebounds broke the school and Carver-Hawkeye Arena records for Iowa. The previous school record was 62 set in 1977 vs. Iowa Wesleyan, while the arena record for Iowa was 61 against Wisconsin in 1993. Washington holds the arena rebounding record for all teams when it pulled down 70 rebounds in its double overtime win over Northern Illinois in the 1991 Hawkeye Challenge.

Iowa's 98 points tied as the sixth-highest scoring output in school history. It also marked the second-highest scoring output in Carver-Hawkeye Arena next to its 99-point outburst vs. Western Illinois in the 2000 Hawkeye Challenge.

All 13 players scored for the Hawkeyes, including four players in double figures. Kristi Faulkner added 16 points and five rebounds. Jennie Lillis scored 14 points and grabbed eight rebounds, while Jenna Armstrong scored 10 points and collected two steals. Becca McCann and Tiffany Reedy pulled down nine rebounds to post career highs and lead Iowa in rebounding.

Emily Berry scored 15 points, while Amy Swisher tallied 11 points for the Panthers.

Iowa recorded 23 assists in the win, marking the third consecutive game that it collected 20 assists or more. The Hawkeyes also registered 13 steals and six blocks.

REMMERDE STILL SIDELINED

Hawkeye freshman Deb Remmerde, who suffered a stress fracture in her left foot during a practice in early November, will remain sidelined for Monday's contest. Coach Bluder is hoping to have Remmerde back by Iowa's next home game vs. Kansas State on Dec. 12. The native of Rock Valley, IA, is the Iowa High School all-time scoring leader and was named Iowa's Miss Basketball her senior year.

SOLVERSON CRASHES THE BOARDS

Johanna Solverson pulled down a team-high nine rebounds at Iowa State and Marquette. The sophomore has led the Hawkeyes in rebounding in 4-of-6 games this season. Solverson led Iowa in rebounding in two games all of last year. She ranks first on the Hawkeyes in rebounding (7.0 rpg).

The native of Lake Zurich, IL, collected a then-career-high nine rebounds twice last year. Already this year, she has posted rebounding games of 13 (vs. Saint Joseph's) and nine (at Iowa State and at Marquette).

SMITH HAS CAREER GAME

Sophomore Crystal Smith has had a good start to the 2003-04 season, putting together a career game in Iowa's contest at Florida International. The native of Haughton, LA, scored a career-high 10 points on 4-5 from the field, bolstered by a perfect 2-2 from three-point range. She also collected four rebounds, three of which were offensive, and two steals.

Smith has been Coach Bluder's first guard off the bench in Iowa's first six games.

RAINING THREES

Iowa converted 5-10 (.500) three-pointers at Marquette. The Hawkeyes have drained nine triples in three of their last four contests. Iowa has sank at least one three-pointer in 154 consecutive games. It is a streak that has occurred over a span of seven seasons. The last time the Hawkeyes did not make a three-pointer was against Purdue in the Big Ten Tournament on March 1, 1998.

RICHARDS HAS ANOTHER CAREER GAME VS. ISU

Last year point guard Lindsay Richards posted career highs in points (11), field goals made (4) and attempted (5), rebounds (4) and minutes played (23) against Iowa State.

Richards duplicated her career efforts at Iowa State on Dec. 3. The sophomore scored a career-high 12 points, bolstered by 2-4 shooting from three-point range. She also played in a career-high 43 minutes.

CENTURY MARK

Iowa State became the sixth Iowa opponent in its 30-year program history to score 100 points or more. The 101 points tie as the fourth-most scoring output the Hawkeyes have ever yielded. The Hawkeyes have yielded 100 points or more to a road opponent three of the last four years. Southwest Missouri State tallied 101 points in 2000, while No.4 Kansas State collected 103 points last season.

HAWKEYES EARN TOURNAMENT HONORS

Kristi Faulkner was named the 2003 FIU Thanksgiving Classic Most Valuable Player. The senior averaged 20.5 ppg, 6.0 rpg and 2.5 apg in the two games. Senior Jennie Lillis, who averaged 17.0 ppg, 8.0 rpg and 2.5 apg was named to the all-tournament team.

The honor was Faulkner's first of her career in a holiday tournament, while Lillis was named to a holiday tournament all-tournament team for the sixth time in her career.

HAWKEYES WIN FIU THANKSGIVING CLASSIC

Iowa defeated Saint Joseph's (62-58) in a thriller in the first round of the FIU Thanksgiving Classic played in Miami, FL. In a game that saw six lead changes and seven ties, Iowa rallied to win its second game of the year. Trailing 55-50 with 4:30 left the Hawkeyes ended the game on a 12-3 run, including scoring the game's final seven points.

Senior Jennie Lillis led the Hawkeyes, posting her first double-double of the season and 16th of her career (19 points, 10 rebounds). Sophomore Johanna Solverson added seven points and collected a career-high 13 rebounds. Senior Kristi Faulkner contributed 15 points and eight rebounds.

The Hawkeyes cruised to a 93-86 victory over host school Florida International in the championship game. Five players scored in double figures for the Hawkeyes. Faulkner scored a game-high 26 points and collected four rebounds, Lillis posted 15 points and six rebounds, junior Jamie Cavey registered 13 points and eight rebounds, while sophomores Crystal Smith and Lindsay Richards each added 10 points.

ONE AND THE BONUS

Jennie Lillis has attempted at least one free throw in 94-of-99 games she has played during her three-year career. Lillis has converted 341-459 free throws in her four-year career. Last weekend, she broke the school record for career free throw attempts and is 50 free throws made from breaking the career free throws made record, which is held by Amy Herrig (390).

IOWA CAPTURES SECOND IN HAWKEYE CHALLENGE

For the first time in seven years, Iowa did not win its annual tournament. The Hawkeyes won their first round contest over Butler (83-60), but lost to Houston (70-64) in the championship game last weekend. The Cougars snapped Iowa's 11-game tournament winning streak.

Iowa had four starters score in double figures to lead the Hawkeyes to a 23-point season-opening win. The victory improved Iowa's record to 4-0 in season openers under Coach Bluder.

A superior effort by tournament MVP Chandi Jones lifted Houston past the Hawkeyes in the championship game. The nation's leading scorer last year, scored 25 of her game-high 34 points in the second half to propel the Cougars to victory.

Cavey led Iowa with 18 points and six rebounds. Lillis scored all of her 14 points in the second half, while senior Kristi Faulkner added 16 points and five rebounds.

TWO HAWKEYES NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Junior Jamie Cavey and senior Jennie Lillis were named to the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge All-Tournament Team. It marked the third time Lillis earned the accolade, including being named the MVP last year. Cavey's honor marked the first time that she was named to the Hawkeye Challenge all-Tournament squad in her three years with the Black and Gold.

FAULKNER ON PACE TO SCHOOL RECORD

Senior Kristi Faulkner has converted .842 (197-234) of her free throw attempts during her three years with the Hawkeyes. She is on pace to break Lindsey Meder's school record of .799 (287-359) set 1998-2002.

THE NAME GAME

Iowa has two players with the first name Lindsay (Geoffroy and Richards). The Hawkeyes also have two Jennie's on its team. Senior forward Jennie Lillis and athletic trainer Jennie Hartgrave.

Iowa Signs Four

Head Coach Lisa Bluder received National Letters of Intent from Abby Emmert, Krista Vande Venter, Stacy Schlapkohl and Jeneé Graham to attend the University of Iowa.

Vande Venter, a native of Osseo, MN, is a 6-2 power forward who led her conference in scoring and rebounding last year. Vande Venter is a three-time all-conference selection and has been a starter since her freshman season. Vande Venter is a two-time Osseo High School team captain. As a junior, she was named to the Pre-season Star Tribune Top 20 and *Minnesota Basketball News* Top 10. She was also an Associated Press all-state honorable mention, second team all-metro and Minnesota Girls Basketball Coaches all-state first team pick. Vande Venter scored her 1,000th career point last year.

Schlapkohl, a native of Durant, IA, is a 6-3 forward/center that holds the Durant High School record for career rebounds, rebounds per game, field goal percentage and points in a single season and tied the school record for points in a game. She is a two-time captain and an all-state, all-conference and all-district selection.

Graham, a 5-10 guard from Bolingbrook, IL, has started on the varsity squad since her freshman year. Graham averaged 10.0 ppg, 9.0 rpg and 3.0 spg her freshman year and 13.5 ppg, 8.5 rpg and 4.5 spg her sophomore season. Graham sat out her junior year after suffering a torn ACL at a summer camp in 2002. She was named all-Conference SICA North, second team all-area and all-state honorable mention by the *Champaign News-Gazette* her sophomore year. Graham was also named to the Plainfield all-tournament team. She was named to the Top 10 all-Area Freshman Team and was all-conference honorable mention her freshman season.

Emmert, a 5-9 point guard from Winterset, IA, is a three-time all-conference selection and is the Winterset High School career leader in scoring and assists. Emmert was a first team Iowa Girl's Coaches Association (IGCA) all-state, second team Iowa Newspaper Association (INA) all-state and a third team *Des Moines Register* all-state selection her junior year when she averaged 19.2 ppg and 5.0 apg. As a sophomore, Emmert was a second team IGCA all-state and a second team INA all-state choice. She has been a starter since her freshman season.

LILLIS NAMED TO WADE TROPHY WATCH LIST

Senior forward Jennie Lillis is one of 35 players named to the 2004 State Farm Wade Trophy Watch List. This prestigious award is presented to the nation's top player.

Lillis, who is a three-time captain, was an all-Big Ten first team selection last year by the media and a second team choice by the media her sophomore season. Lillis was also named to the preseason all-Big Ten squad for the second straight year.

Garnered as "The Mother of Modern Women's Collegiate Basketball," Lily Margaret Wade pioneered an unprecedented dynasty in women's basketball, which led to the growth and popularity of the sport during the 1970s.

Highlighting the 2004 list is last year's recipient, Connecticut senior Diana Taurasi. Lillis is one of five Big Ten players named to the list. Other league players include Penn State senior Kelly Mazzante, Purdue senior Shereka Wright, Minnesota senior Lindsay Whalen and junior Janel McCarville.

JENNIE LILLIS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN

For the second consecutive year, senior Jennie Lillis was named to the Preseason All-Big Ten team at the annual Big Ten Conference Media Day held Oct. 26 in Rosemont, IL. The three-time captain was the only player to be ranked in the top ten in scoring, rebounding, steals and blocks in the Big Ten last year.

CENTER OF ATTENTION

For the fourth consecutive season, Iowa started its season with a new starting center. Junior Jamie Cavey has solidified herself as Iowa's starting center in preseason practice.

Since Coach Bluder began coaching the Hawkeyes in 2000 Iowa has had a different center start the season. Randi Peterson was Iowa's starter in 2000-01, followed by Beatrice Bullock (2001-02) and Tracy Schrupp (2002-03). Peterson, Bullock and Schrupp were all seniors. Cavey is the first junior starting center Coach Bluder has coached at Iowa.

JENNIE LILLIS CONTINUES TO RISE

Senior Jennie Lillis has been Iowa's leader on and off the court the last couple years. The native of Urbandale, IA, averaged 14.8 ppg, 6.0 rpg and 2.6 apg her sophomore season and 16.3 ppg and 7.2 rpg last season. She has started all but one game in her career and currently has 1,389 career points, which is seventh-best on Iowa's career scoring chart. She also has collected 683 rebounds, which is ninth-best all-time. Lillis is on pace to finish her career in the top-five in career rebounding and top 10 in career scoring. Lillis, who was a WBCA Region 6 All-American Honorable Mention last year, was the only Big Ten athlete ranked in the top 10 in the conference in scoring, rebounding, blocks and steals.

Lillis started the 2003-04 season strong, collecting 13 points or more and in all six games. She posted her first double-double of the season and 16th of her career vs. Saint Joseph's (19 points, 10 rebounds).

Lillis is 210 points from moving into sixth in career scoring and nine rebounds from sliding into the No. 8 position in career rebounds.

CAVEY PACES HAWKEYES

Jamie Cavey has been a force in the post for Iowa. Cavey ranks second on the squad in scoring (16.2 ppg) and third in rebounding (5.5 rpg). In addition, she has led the Hawkeyes in scoring in 4-of-6 games, scoring 20 points or more in two contests. The native of Mechanicsville, IA, scored 23 points (11-16 FG, 1-2 FT) in only 25 minutes of play at Iowa State. Her 11 field goals made tied a career high, while her 16 attempts set a new career high. She posted a team-high 15 points, bolstered by converting a career-high 7-8 from the free throw line at Marquette. She scored the game's final five points to help preserve the come-from-behind victory.

Cavey is tied for the Big Ten lead in field goal percentage (.667) and ranks 10th in scoring (16.4).

CAVEY IMPROVES AT THE CHARITY STRIPE

Jamie Cavey's free throw shooting is just one aspect of her game that she has improved on this year. Cavey has converted 21-31 (.677) from the charity stripe in six games this year. Last year, she made 38-72 (.528) of her attempts.

FAULKNER RISES TO THE TOP

After a sluggish start to the 2003-04 season, senior Kristi Faulkner has returned to form. The native of Glen Ellyn, IL, scored 48 in Iowa's last two road games. Faulkner registered a game-high 26 points at Florida International and 22 points at Iowa State. She made a season-high four three-pointers against the Cyclones. Faulkner ranks first on the squad in scoring (16.3 ppg), three-pointers made (13), attempted (30) and percentage (.433). She has also been crashing the boards. She ranks fourth on the team in rebounding (4.2 rpg).

Faulkner was a third team all-Big Ten honoree last year.

PAINT JOB

Iowa has out-scored its opponents in the paint 194-166. The Hawkeyes have out-scored their opponents in the paint in 5-of-6 games. Saint Joseph's is the only squad to out-score Iowa in the paint this season.

ATTRACTIVE HOME GAMES

Iowa opened its 13-game regular season home schedule with the annual KCRG-TV 9 Hawkeye Challenge on Nov. 21-22. Besides eight exciting Big Ten Conference home games, Iowa hosts Big 12 power Kansas State (Dec. 12), in-state rival Drake (Dec. 21) and last year's Missouri Valley Conference co-champions Creighton Bluejays (Dec. 28).

The Hawkeyes play every Big Ten school twice except Northwestern, Michigan, Michigan State and Ohio State. Iowa will play the Buckeyes and Wolverines at home, while it will visit the Wildcats and Spartans.





Game 1

Iowa 83, Butler 60

Nov. 21, 2003, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - Iowa opened its 2003-04 season with an 83-60 win over Butler in the first round of the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Ten of Iowa's 11 players that played scored at least one point, including four starters posting double figures. Junior Jamie Cavey had a strong debut as Iowa's starting center, posting career highs in points (26), field goal attempts (11) and attempted (13) and assists (4). Senior Jennie Lillis contributed 15 points and grabbed a team-high seven rebounds. Sophomore Johanna Solverson added 10 points and two steals.

Sophomore Lindsay Richards, who played in her first regular season game since suffering a knee injury last December, scored 10 points, pulled down four rebounds, tied a career high with seven assists and only turned the ball over once.

Butler grabbed a 37-36 lead with 2:18 left in the first half, but that would be its only lead of the game. The Hawkeyes scored the final six points of the first half and Solverson scored the first seven points of the second half to stretch Iowa's lead to 49-37. Iowa built its lead to as many as 24 points before recording the 23-point win.

The victory was Iowa's 499th in its 30-year history of the program and extended its tournament winning streak to 11 games. Iowa also improved to 4-0 in season opening contests under Coach Bluder.

Nov. 22, 2003, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - Houston's Chandi Jones scored 25 of her game-high 34 points in the second half to lift the Cougars to a 70-64 victory in the championship game of the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Houston's victory snapped an Iowa 11-game tournament winning streak and became the first Hawkeye Challenge champions other than Iowa since Washington won the 1997 tournament.

Jones, who was named the tournament MVP, was 10-29 from the field and 10-12 from the free throw line. Her 29 field goal attempts tied a Carver-Hawkeye Arena record for women.

Trailing 59-56 late in the second half, sophomore Johanna Solverson sank her second three-pointer of the night to tie the game at 59 with 3:01 left. Houston closed the game on an 11-5 run to capture the tournament title.

Cavey, who was named to the all-tournament team, led the Hawkeyes in scoring for the second-straight game, scoring 18 points and pulling down six rebounds. Senior Kristi Faulkner tallied 16 points, five rebounds and dished out three assists. Senior Jennie Lillis, who earned her third Hawkeye Challenge all-Tournament accolades, added 14 points and five rebounds. Solverson posted six points and a team-high seven rebounds.

Lillis' 14 points moved her past Amy Herrig and into eighth in career scoring at Iowa. Herrig was at the game doing color commentary for the Hawkeyes on local television.

The championship game was a see-saw affair that involved 10 ties and 12 lead changes. Houston collected 18 steals and forced 28 Hawkeye turnovers.

MIAMI, FL - Iowa defeated Saint Joseph's, 62-58, in the first round of the FIU Thanksgiving Classic. Not only was the victory the Hawkeyes' second of the season, but it marked the 500th in the program's 30-year history.

Iowa trailed Saint Joseph's 55-50 with 4:30 remaining but ended the game on a 12-3 run, including scoring the contest's last seven points. Behind 55-50, junior Jamie Cavey scored her only two points with a nine-foot jumper in the lane. After a missed three-pointer by Saint Joseph's, senior Jennie Lillis drained her second three-pointer of the game to even the game (55-55). Saint Joseph's scored its final three points of the contest on a three-pointer with 2:36 remaining to go up three (58-55). Senior Kristi Faulkner drained her third three-pointer of the contest on Iowa's next trip down the floor to tie the game for the sixth time with 1:29 left. Saint Joseph's missed its last six shots down the stretch, while two Lillis free throws and two sophomore Lindsay Richards free throws secured the win for the Hawkeyes.

Lillis, Faulkner and sophomore Johanna Solverson paced the Hawkeyes. Lillis posted her 16th career double-double, leading all scorers with 19 points (5-9 FG, 7-8 FT) and grabbing 10 rebounds. Faulkner contributed 15 points (6-13 FG, 0-1 FT) and pulled down eight rebounds, while Solverson added seven points and collected a career-high 13 rebounds.

Iowa out-rebounded Saint Joseph's 49-34, including yielding only eight offensive rebounds in the contest. The Hawkeyes made nine three-pointers, while Saint Joseph's sank four.

Iowa advanced to the championship game of the FIU Thanksgiving Classic to face host school Florida International.

Iowa 93, Florida International 86

MIAMI, FL - Iowa had five players score in double figures for the first time this season as the Hawkeyes cruised to a 93-86 victory over Florida International to capture the championship of the FIU Thanksgiving Classic.

The Hawkeyes built a 19-point halftime lead. Iowa made its first four three-point attempts and finished the half making 70 percent (7-10) of its attempts. The Hawkeyes also possessed the ball, recording only four turnovers in the half.

Iowa led by as many as 24 points in the second half before Florida International mounted a comeback. The Golden Panthers shaved the Hawkeyes' lead to five (89-84) with 1:37 left, but would get no closer.

The Hawkeyes were led by tournament MVP, Kristi Faulkner. The senior scored a game-high 26 points (9-14 FG, 6-7 FT) and grabbed four rebounds. Senior Jennie Lillis was also named to the all-tournament team. She tallied 15 points (4-11 FG, 7-10 FT) and pulled down six rebounds. Her 10 free throw attempts helped her break the school record for career free throw attempts, previously held by Toni Foster.

Junior Jamie Cavey scored in double figures for the third time in four games. Cavey collected 13 points (4-7 FG, 5-9 FT) and grabbed a game-high eight rebounds. Sophomore Lindsay Richards added 10 points (3-6 FG, 2-2 FT) and dished out six assists.

Iowa made nine three-pointers for the second-consecutive game and out-rebounded its opponent for the second-straight game. The Hawkeyes out-rebounded the Golden Panthers 34-23. Iowa pulled down 11 first half offensive rebounds, while FIU collected only nine total rebounds.

The Hawkeyes extended their streak of winning at least one holiday tournament to six-straight years.

Game 5

Iowa State 101, Iowa 94 (2OT)

Dec. 3, 2003, Hilton Coliseum

AMES, IA - - Iowa lost its fourth-straight game at Hilton Coliseum, as Iowa State defeated the Hawkeyes 101-94 in a double overtime thriller.

The Hawkeyes trailed for most of the game until a Jennie Lillis lay-up with 1:28 left gave Iowa its first lead at 72-70. The two squads exchanged baskets the remainder of regulation to send the game into overtime. Iowa built a six-point lead with 1:22 left in the first overtime, but Iowa State scored six-consecutive points to send the game into a second overtime. With momentum on their side, the Cyclones out-scored the Hawkeyes 16-9 in the second overtime to lift Iowa State to the 101-94 victory.

The combined 195 points are the most ever scored in the 34-game history. Furthermore, Iowa State's 101 points marked the first time a team has eclipsed the century mark in the series history.

The overtime game was the third in the series history and was Iowa's second-ever double overtime contest.

All five Iowa players scored in double figures. Jamie Cavey led the Hawkeyes with 23 points and five rebounds. Kristi Faulkner contributed 22 points and four rebounds, while Lillis added 14 points and three assists. Johanna Solverson scored 10 points and collected a team-high nine rebounds. Lindsay Richards tallied a career-high 12 points and dished out five assists.

Iowa's 94 points scored, tied the ninth-highest scoring output in Hawkeye history. The Hawkeyes scored 90 points or more in back-to-back games for the first time since Iowa poured in 95 vs. Northwestern and 91 at Wisconsin in 2000.

Iowa State scored 14 more points than Iowa at the free throw line. The Cyclones converted 27-35 (.771) of their attempts, while the Hawkeyes made 13-19 (.684).

Iowa State converted 7-11 (.636) of its field goal attempts and 12-16 (.750) of its free throw attempts in the two overtime sessions. Iowa converted 6-16 (.375) of its field goals and 506 (.833) of its free throws.

Iowa took a four-point lead midway through the second frame, but a 15-1 run by Marquette gave the Golden Eagles a 59-49 advantage with 4:17 left. Iowa ended the contest on a 16-3 run, allowing no Marquette field goals in the last 4:17 to help preserve the victory.

Jamie Cavey led the Hawkeyes in scoring for the second-straight game and fourth time this season. Cavey scored 15 points and grabbed four rebounds. The junior scored a career-high seven of her 15 points from the free throw line. Jenne Lillis contributed 13 points and six rebounds, while Kristi Faulkner added 12 points. Johanna Solverson pulled down nine rebounds and dished out a career-high nine assists. She also only recorded one turnover.

Iowa finished the game making 23-43 (.535) of its field goal attempts, while Marquette struggled to find the basket, making only 23-67 (.343) from the field. In addition, the Golden Eagles made only 6-21 (.286) from beyond the arc.

The Hawkeyes escaped with their fourth victory of the year, despite finishing the game with 27 turnovers and allowing 19 offensive rebounds. After yielding the offensive rebounds Iowa's defense did a good job of buckling down, allowing only nine second chance points.
