THE SETTING:

The Hawkeyes host Purdue in a three-game series at Duane Banks Field this weekend, the first game is slated for Thursday at 6:05 p.m. With hopes of earning a Big Ten Tournament berth (the first since 2007), Iowa's destiny lies in its own hands. Iowa concludes the regular season with its second straight home series, while Purdue ends its season with its second consecutive weekend road trip. The Hawkeyes are currently in a four-way tie for fifth and three games out of first place. Admission is \$3 for adults, while UI students and youths are free.

ON THE NET:

Iowa baseball fans can follow the Hawkeyes, as live stats will be available on hawkeyesports.com. Just click on the Gametracker link found on both the front page and the baseball schedule page. Whistlin' Ray Gilmore enters his 33rd season with the Hawkeye baseball program and will be posting the stats.

ON THE RADIO:

Hawkeye fans can catch this weekend's games on AM-800 KXIC. The Voice of the Hawkeyes, Brent Balbinot will handle the play-by-play, while Steve Duncan and a few ex-Hawkeyes, will provide expert analysis. All three games will be broadcasted on the radio and online.

SCOUTING PURDUE:

Purdue is 31-19 and 12-9 in Big Ten Play. The Boilermakers took two from Illinois in a three-game series last weekend. Purdue's offense is hitting .297 in conference play. In overall games, the Boilermaker offense is led by Tyler Spillner, Kevin Plawecki and Cameron Perkins.

The Boilermaker pitching staff has a 4.63 ERA and are led by ace Matt Bischoff. Bischoff has a 3.29 ERA with a 9-1 record. He also has amassed 83 strikeouts with only 11 walks.

Bischoff retired 23 consecutive Illinois hitters at one point during an 8-2, complete game victory over the Illini. He retired the side in order from the second through the seventh innings.

IOWA VS BISCHOFF:

Iowa has had success against the ace the last two years. Last year in West Lafayette, Bischoff got the loss in a 15-7 Iowa win, going 5.2 IP, 8 R, 6 ER, 10 hits, 3 BB. Two years ago in Iowa City, Purdue won 8-6, but Bischoff was chased after 2.0 IP. He surrendered seven hits, 6 ER and 2 BB in those two innings.

LEE GOES YARD:

With the game tied in the bottom of the eighth last Friday at Duane Banks Field against Ohio State, Iowa's offense exploded with a towering three-run blast to left field off the bat of **Kurt Lee**. The homer lifted Iowa to a thrilling 7-5 victory.

With his first big fly as a Hawkeye, the junior drove in three runs.

TAKING THREE-STRAIGHT:

With the series win over Ohio State last weekend, the Hawkeyes have now taken three-straight conference series'.

After being swept at Indiana April 17-18, Iowa took two at Michigan, two at Penn State now two vs. Ohio State. The Hawkeyes are 6-3 in the past three weekends in conference play.

IOWA SHUTSOUT SAU:

Iowa's three pitchers in Tuesday's victory over St. Ambrose combined for a two-hitter and its first shutout of the season.

Hawkeye starter **Matt Dermody** earned his second victory throwing five scoreless innings. The freshman struck out five Fighting Bees, while only allowing one hit, which came one out into the fifth. Senior **Michael Jacobs** and freshman **Ricky Sandquist** combined to throw four scoreless innings, allowing only one hit the last four innings.

LEE 'SAVES' TWO:

In game one of a three-game series against Ohio State last weekend **Kevin Lee** notched his ninth save. With the bases loaded and only one out in the top of the ninth, and a hot hitting Zach Hurley at the plate for the Buckeyes, Lee got Hurley to hit a liner to Lee at shortstop who flipped to second for the game-ending double play.

Lee earned his 10th save of the season in Saturday's victory, pitching a 1-2-3 ninth.

Z-ROB EARNS TWO WINS:

Southpaw reliever **Zach Robertson**, who picked up the win in game one of the series, picked up his team-best sixth win of the season, tossing one and one-third innings allowing no hits or runs in game two.

WILLS GUNS 'EM OUT:

Junior **Trevor Willis** boasted strong defense the past few weeks, but has remained constant in gunning people out; whether it be at second, third or home. The junior has six assists to lead the Big Ten this season and is tied for 28th nationally.

Last weekend against Ohio State, Willis threw out Michael Stephens at the plate to get the final out of the fifth inning and cut Iowa's damages to only a pair of runs.

HAWKEYES SWING IT:

Mike McQuillan is currently on a team season-best 15-game hit streak. The sophomore also leads the Hawkeyes with 22 multi-hit games, followed by **Kurtis Muller** and **Ryan Durant** both with 20.

Durant leads the way with 11 multi-RBI games and McCool has collected eight.

STACKING UP IN THE BIG TEN:

When compared to the conference's best in overall games several Hawkeyes rank in the top 10.

Kurtis Muller is tied for first in fielding percentage. The junior also ranks in triples (2nd), and stolen bases (6th). **Ryan Durant** is first in sacrifice flies and seventh in doubles and **Zach McCool** ranks first in sacrifice bunts.

Ace **Jarred Hippen** ranks in batters struck out looking (1st), innings pitched (3rd) and ERA (7th), **Kevin Lee** ranks second in saves.

3 THINGS TO WATCH THIS WEEK

1. Iowa's defense has been solid the past week, including an errorless game against St. Ambrose in its non-conference finale Tuesday evening.

2. **Mike McQuillan** is on a season-high 15-game hit streak. 'Q' went 4-for-10 with two walks against Ohio State.

3. **Zach Robertson** picked up two wins in two consecutive games against Ohio State last weekend. He now has a team-best six on the year.

DURANT SOLID IN BIG TEN:

Iowa's cleanup hitter, **Ryan Durant** has hit a solid .388 in conference play. He leads the team with 12 doubles, 18 RBI and a .538 slugging percentage.

Durant ranks in the Big Ten, in conference games only, in doubles (1st), sacrifice flies (1st) and sacrifice bunts (1st.).

MULLER LACES FIVE:

In the series finale at Penn State, **Kurtis Muller** tied an individual-game record after going 5-for-6. In the feat, the outfielder collected a game and career-high five RBI, recording hits in his first five at-bats. With the game tied, he blasted a three-run homer, his first of the season, to put the Hawkeyes in front to stay.

Teammate **Zach McCool** tied the individual-game record earlier in the season. He went 5-for-6 from the leadoff spot for Iowa in its series finale against the Spartans. McCool's five hits ties a single-game school record, last achieved by former Hawkeye standout, Justin Toole, in 2008.

ALL-TIME SERIES:

Iowa leads the all-time series with Purdue, 81-62-1. The Hawkeyes took the Friday night game from Matt Bischoff and the Boilermakers last season, however fell the last two games to lose the series.

Iowa slugged past the Purdue Boilermakers, 15-7, in the weekend series opener Friday afternoon at Lambert Field. Iowa plated 15 runs, five each in the second and ninth innings, on 18 hits en route to its 11th overall and second Big Ten triumph. The offensive output was Iowa's second-highest scoring and hitting performance of the season. The Hawkeyes scored 25 runs on 25 hits at Tennessee-Martin earlier this season.

2009 IOWA DRAFT PICKS:

Three Hawkeyes were drafted in the Major League Baseball's 2009 First-Year Player Draft. Right-handed fireballer **Steve Turnbull**, lefty relief pitcher **Kyle Heim** and closer **Mike Schurz** all signed contracts in June. Three-time all-Big Ten selection **Justin Toole** later signed a free agent contract.

Other draftees included current Iowa freshmen: **Matt Dermody** and **Dan Sheppard**.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



In six years as Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the Iowa baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the Iowa baseball team in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Hawkeye program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years.

In Dahm's 16 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, eight freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his six years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 24 all-Big Ten selections, including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Last season, Iowa went 16-35, but was decimated by injuries, which gave several young players opportunities and experience. Three Hawkeyes received all-conference honors. Ryan Durant received first team laurels, while Justin Toole was named third team all-Big Ten for the third consecutive year. Freshman Dallas Burke was named a unanimous choice to the conference's all-freshman team after seeing significant time on the field.

Five Hawkeyes were drafted in 2009, including two incoming recruits. Relievers Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz were all picked up, as well as Matthew Dermody and Dan Sheppard. Additionally, Justin Toole signed a free agent contract with the Cleveland Indians. Thirty-four of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21st in a 9-4 victory over Western Illinois. Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23. He also picked up his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State on May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 16 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey. He was born January 19, 1967 in Skokie, Illinois.

Iowa scored five runs in the fifth inning and never looked back en route to an 8-0 triumph over St. Ambrose Tuesday night in front of 1,321 fans at Modern Woodmen Park. The game was played at a rapid pace, finishing in only 2:11.

Tuesday marked Iowa's fifth victory in six games.

Leading the Hawkeyes offensively was **Trevor Willis**, **Zach McCool** and **Kurt Lee**. Willis had a pair of bunt singles and two runs scored. Lee had a game-best three singles and an RBI, while McCool collected two hits and an RBI.

SITUATIONALLY SPEAKING:

Ryan Durant is hitting a solid .388 against southpaw pitchers. While **Mike McQuillan** is hitting .410 off of rightys.


Kurtis Muller is cool under pressure, hitting .444 with two outs. The leadoff leads the team with 16 two-out RBI, followed by **Zach McCool** and **Ryan Durant** with 13.

HIPPEN TOSSES A GEM:

Jarred Hippen threw his third complete game of the season and earned his team-best fourth win in game one of a doubleheader against Minnesota on May 1.

Coming off a complete game in Ann Arbor the previous Friday, the lefty allowed only four runs, three earned, on 10 hits with seven strikeouts and issued no walks.

All three complete games have been in conference play and all have resulted in a win. In his last complete game the Rock Falls, IL, native, allowed only two runs, one earned, scattered six hits and struck out five en route to his third win in a 5-2 victory at Michigan.

Hippen's first career complete game was in the Big Ten opener at Michigan State. He allowed three runs off seven hits and striking out two. The last Hawkeye to throw a complete nine was Nate Johnson in 2004.

MULLER EARNS FIRST BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Kurtis Muller was named co-Big Ten Player of the Week by the conference office Tuesday. Muller shares the honor with Indiana's Alex Dickerson. The weekly accolade is the first of Muller's career and first for the Hawkeyes this season.

Muller put on an offensive clinic in the final two games against the Nittany Lions. In the series finale, Muller collected a game and career-high five RBI, recording hits in his first five at-bats to tie the school single-game record. With the game tied, he blasted a three-run homer, his first of the season, to put the Hawkeyes in front to stay. The next half inning, he made a sliding catch into the wall to help preserve the lead. The native of Sun Prairie, WI, nearly hit for the cycle in Saturday's 9-3 triumph. He went 3-for-6 (single, double, triple) while registering two RBI.

RECORD BREAKING McCOOL:

Junior **Zach McCool** tied yet another school record. McCool laced two consecutive triples in Iowa's victory over Western Illinois Tuesday. The last time that was done was in 1999 by Brian Burks.

McCool tied another individual-game record earlier in the season. He went 5-for-6 from the leadoff spot for Iowa in its series finale against the Spartans. McCool's five hits ties a single-game school record, last achieved by former Hawkeye standout, Justin Toole, in 2008.

BIG TEN OPENER VICTORY:

With a gem of a pitching performance from **Jarred Hippen**, Iowa picked up its first conference-opening win since a 9-5 triumph over Michigan in 2003.

Besides that, Iowa had won six of its last seven games and snapped Michigan State's 11-game win streak.

Senior **Michael Jacobs**, red shirt junior **Tyson Blaser**, junior **Kurtis Muller**, sophomore **Patrick Brennan** and freshman **Dan Sheppard**.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM:

With a 2-1 record, Iowa had several quality performances in Florida (Feb. 26-28). Sophomore pitcher **Jarred Hippen** and senior outfielder **Ryan Durant**, however, were the two Hawkeyes to earn second team all-tournament honors by collegebaseball360.com.

Hippen got his first win of the year, by-way of an eight and two-third innings performance with eight Ks and only one walk. Durant went 6-for-11 with a double, homer and six RBI.

RBI ALERT:

Sophomore **Mike McQuillan** drove in seven RBI to lead Iowa to victory over Illinois State Feb. 22. The RBI total is the most since Dallas Burke drove in six against Minnesota on May 2, 2009. Seven RBI also ties for the conference's game-high this year. (Tying two other Big Ten players.)

DUANE BANKS FIELD:

Every year the UI Athletics Department continues to upgrade Duane Banks Field. This year's primary addition is 500 new chair back seating behind home plate.

For the first time, season tickets are available for purchase. Fans can reserve their own chair backs for the 2010 season by calling the UI Athletic Ticket Office at 1-800-IA-HAWKS.

Besides that, in 2009, the Recreation Building underwent a complete makeover. Improvements included: a new locker room, lounge, training room and weight room.

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach **Ryan Brownlee** and coach **Chris Maliszewski**, along with volunteer coach **Zach Dillon**.

Over the past nine seasons, Brownlee has had 21 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts. This past summer, Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim, Mike Schurz and recruits Matt Dermody and Dan Sheppard were drafted by major league teams. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he has seen 33 of his players sign pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Kevin Cash of the Yankees, Joe Thatcher of the Padres, Dan Meyer of the Marlins and Luke Scott of the Astros.

In 2008, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and knowledge of hitting were essential in establishing team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was set by the 1981 team. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Maliszewski is in his second season as the Hawkeyes' pitching coach. In addition to his role as pitching coach, Maliszewski is also responsible for the team's travel arrangements and assists in the youth summer camps.

In his first season, the team's ERA in Big Ten play improved 1.45 points from 2008 to 2009. On top of that, Hawkeye pitchers recorded nearly 20 less walks than the season before and over 30 strikeouts more than in 2008.

Over the summer, Maliszewski had three Hawkeye relievers get drafted; Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz, all of whom signed professional contracts.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin'" **Ray Gilmore**, who serves as Iowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for Iowa Baseball.

Iowa Inks Recruits

Iowa Head Baseball Coach **Jack Dahm** has announced that **Kasey Carling, Patrick Lala, Bryan Niebalski** and **Taylor Zeutenhorst** have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa and **Kyle Haen, Jake Mangler** and **Aaron Smit** intend to enroll and admit to the University of Iowa.

Carling, a native of Salem, UT, is a middle infielder who will be in the mix at shortstop. Carling lettered three years in baseball earning all-state, all-region and all-conference accolades his senior season. He also helped his Spanish Fork HS team win the state title in 2009. Carling was a NJCAA distinguished academic all-American last season with Salt Lake City Community College. He started every game at short stop and was named to the SWAC all-region team.

Haen, from Verona, WI, is an athletic outfielder that bats lefty. Haen was a National Honor Society and high honor roll athlete in high school. He started on the varsity baseball team since his freshman year, the team is 69-7 with him on the roster. In 2009, Haen helped lead his Madison Edgewood HS team to a division two state championship and was named first team all-conference, all-city and all-area. His junior campaign, he batted .359 with 29 RBI and a .554 slugging percentage.

Lala, a native of Marion, IA, is a right-handed pitcher from Kirkwood Community College. Lala appeared in 18 games. He amassed 45 strikeouts in 40.1 innings of work and finished the year with a 4.86 ERA.

Mangler, from Clinton, IA, will be a utility player for the Hawkeyes. He led Clinton HS to one of their best football seasons in history this fall, playing both sides of the ball.

Niebalski, a native of Ballwin, MO, is an infielder. He earned four letters in hockey and baseball at DeSmet HS. Niebalski led his fifth-seeded HS team to a district championship last spring batting .500 with five RBI over the three-game tournament. In 2009, he hit .362 with 18 RBI and 13 extra base hits.

Smit, from Wellman, IA, is a lanky left-handed pitcher from Mid Prairie HS. His junior season, he was named first team all-conference, second team all-district academic and an excellent student. Smit was named to the gold honor roll this year. In 2009, he appeared in 16 games with a 8-2 record and five saves. Smit compiled a 2.86 ERA with 88 strikeouts.

Zeutenhorst, a native of Sheldon, IA, is an athletic utility player. He has the ability to play on the left side of the field, as well as be a power arm on the mound. In 2009, he batted .560 with a 1.095 slugging percentage for his Sheldon HS. He is a two-time all-conference, all-district and all Northwest Iowa short stop. Zeutenhorst has earned three letters in football, three letters in basketball and three in track.
