Stanford (12-2, 8-1) defeated Iowa (12-2, 8-0), 45-16, Friday at the 2016 Rose Bowl Game at Rose Bowl Stadium.

Iowa finished the season with a school-record 12 wins, including a 12-0 regular season. The Hawkeyes return 15 starters in 2016, seven on offense and eight on defense.

The 102nd Rose Bowl Game was the first meeting between the two schools. Iowa is 2-4 in six Rose Bowl appearances. The Hawkeyes are 14-14-1 all-time in 29 bowl game appearances.

The Hawkeyes allowed a pick-six (66 yards) and a punt return for touchdown (63 yards) for the first time this season. Five of Stanford's touchdowns covered 277 total yards. Stanford's 75-yard passing touchdown on the game's first play was the first pass play of 30 yards or more allowed by Iowa since Week 10.

Iowa allowed 30-plus points for the first time this season. Stanford scored 30 points for the 13th consecutive game.

Sophomore LB Josey Jewell's interception in the fourth quarter was the 19th interception for Iowa this season, and the Hawkeyes' 27th takeaway. Iowa turned the interception into a touchdown. Iowa scored 93 points off turnovers this season.

Sophomore RB Akrum Wadley's fourth quarter touchdown reception was the first touchdown reception of his career. Wadley finished the game with three catches for a career-high 60 yards.

Sophomore LB Josey Jewell intercepted a Stanford pass in the end zone in the fourth quarter. It was his fourth interception this season, and fourth of his career. Jewell had seven tackles today. In three postseason games, Jewell has 29 tackles and two interceptions.

LG James Daniels became the first true freshman to start a Bowl Game since RB Jordan Canzeri made his first career start at the 2011 Insight Bowl. Today was Daniels' second career start (Northwestern).

Junior QB C.J. Beathard finished the game with 239 yards passing and two touchdowns. In three career postseason games, Beathard is 52-of-82 for 600 yards and five touchdowns.

Junior WR Matt VandeBerg caught a 36-yard touchdown pass from QB C.J. Beathard in the fourth quarter. It was VandeBerg's fourth touchdown reception of the season, fifth of his career, and the longest touchdown reception of his career.

Senior C Austin Blythe made his 45th consecutive start and appeared in his 50th career game. He is the 12th player to play 50 or more games under Kirk Ferentz.

Redshirt freshman DL Matt Nelson recorded his first career sack and tackle-for-loss. Nelson recorded a 2-yard TFL and contributed to a 3-yard sack on Stanford's final drive of the third quarter, which resulted in a punt.

Senior K Marshall Koehn scored four points today to move into sole possession of 13th place on Iowa's all-time scoring list (170 points).

Stanford won the toss and elected to receive. Iowa kicked off to start the game for the fourth time this season (3-1). In 17 seasons as Iowa's head coach, Kirk Ferentz and the Hawkeyes have started the game on defense in 42-of-214 games (23-19).

Iowa comes in ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff (CFP) Standings, No. 6 in the Associated Press poll and No. 7 in the *USA Today* Coaches poll; **Stanford** is No. 6 in the CFP Standings, No. 5 in the AP poll and No. 6 by the coaches ● The latest weather forecast as of New Year's Eve called for the temperature at kickoff to be in the mid-60s, with sunny skies, negligible winds and no precipitation expected ● This is the first-ever meeting between the two schools despite the long-standing relationship between their respective conferences (and a combined 2,326 games played all-time between the two); in fact, the last time the two schools played a game in the same state on the same day was **October 5, 1974**: Iowa lost 41-3 at USC, while Michigan defeated Stanford in Palo Alto, 27-16. Both had bowl games at about the same time in Texas in 1996 and in Arizona in 2011, but the games were a few days apart ● All-time records in the Rose Bowl Game: Stanford 6-7-1, Iowa 2-3; all-time records at Rose Bowl Stadium: Stanford 13-17-1, Iowa 2-3 ● The Hawkeyes are 14-13-1 all-time in 28 bowl games, while the Cardinal are 12-13-1 in 26 previous bowl affairs ● There have been 23 Rose Bowl games (RBG) where both teams were ranked in the top five; the lower ranked team has won 13 of those previous 23; this is the first RBG featuring a Nos. 5 vs. 6 matchup ● Iowa's **Kirk Ferentz** was named the 40th winner of the Bobby Dodd Coach-of-the-Year Award earlier this week (*note: Ferentz is just the seventh from the Midwest to earn it, and only five times has the recipient come from the Mountain or Pacific time zones*) ● According to NCAA records (the schools often differ), Iowa and Stanford enter today tied for the 42nd most wins all-time with 624 (the Cardinal are 624-447-49, the Hawkeyes are 624-543-39; Iowa lists its record as 625-542-39, however) ● Stanford has the fourth-best record this decade (2010-15), as the Cardinal are 65-15 the last six seasons; that trails only Alabama (70-10), Oregon (69-11) and Florida State (70-13); Michigan State dropped to 65-16 ● Iowa was 7-6 in 2014, thus the Hawkeyes are among the most improved teams in the NCAA (+5 at present) ● Iowa traveled 1,535 miles to get to Pasadena; its six road/neutral games this year totaled 1,359 miles from campus. Stanford, on the other hand, traveled 4,289 miles to its road/neutral destinations, but just 317 miles to get to the RBG; it likely had the shortest "road trip" in the nation in 2015, traveling all of 10 miles to the Pac-12 title game in Santa Clara ● Stanford's **Christian McCaffrey** is the nation's leader in all-purpose yards (268.9); the high this bowl season through yesterday's games is 299 by Baylor's Johnny Jefferson (all rushing yards) ● Stanford leads the Pac-12 in 10 statistical categories (second in five others) and is in the top 10 in 10 NCAA categories; Iowa leads the Big Ten in two (second in five others) and is in five NCAA top 10s ● No crossovers: Iowa has no players from California on its roster; Stanford does not have any Iowans on its roster ● Both teams open the 2016 season on Saturday, Sept. 3: **Iowa** will host Miami-Ohio, while **Stanford** plays host to Kansas State ● Return of the Running Game? Breakfast will be served in the media compound from 7-9 a.m. A catered buffet will be served from 11:30 a.m. to 2 p.m., and a halftime meal will be provided in the three main working media areas on game day - the media compound, press box (levels F and G) and the digital media room. A postgame meal will also be provided at both the stadium and the media headquarters (the L.A. Hotel, Grand Dad's Lounge). Snacks and beverages will be provided throughout the game in all areas.

Postgame

All non-ENG credentialed media will be allowed field access with five (5) minutes remaining on the game clock in the fourth quarter. Field access from the press box is accessible via the stadium concourse aisles 15 and 22. Any media with an ENG camera will be held off the field in Tunnel 28A until the game clock expires. You must have a blue ENG video vest to film video on the field.

At the conclusion of the Rose Bowl Game presented by Northwestern Mutual, the trophy presentation will take place at the 50-yard line on the west hash marks. Three trophies are presented in the following order: "The Leishman Trophy" to the head coach of the winning team, and then the Offensive and Defensive Player of the Game trophies.

At the post-game press conference, the head coach and two key student-athletes are positioned at the main table from the runner up team after a 10-minute cooling off period, beginning when the coach enters the lockerroom. The cooling-off period for the winning team is 20 minutes, which begins at the conclusion of the trophy presentation. The postgame press conference will also be available on several televisions in the press box and in the media work room to assist those with tight deadlines.



MORE McCAFFREY The Stanford sophomore and Heisman runner-up finished his season with 3,864 all-purpose yards after recording 368 today. Of those yards, 146 came post-contact (73 rush/15 receiving/58 return).

McCaffrey touched the ball the first five times for Stanford: reception (75 yards), fair catch, rush (5), rush (22) and rush (19) for 121 yards in the game's first four minutes.



THE MODERATOR: We have a nice family affair up here with Stanford University. Joining us right now is head coach David Shaw. Seated next to Coach Shaw is Kevin Hogan followed by Offensive Player of the Game, Christian McCaffrey. We'll have Aziz Shittu, who will be joining us shortly, Defensive Player of the Game.

We'll open the floor with an opening statement from Coach Shaw.


COACH SHAW: Hard to put into words what this team did today because it's a culmination of what we've been doing kind of all year. Just starting off so slow with a sub-par performance at Northwestern. And, once again, give Northwestern a lot of credit. They played better than we did that day. But the senior leadership coming like we needed them to, and we went back to work and worked so hard all year and got ourselves to the point where we're here, but not being satisfied. And that explosion that you felt in the beginning of the game was these guys coming and just wanting to play so well and playing so hard and playing together.

We didn't talk about it too much, but we played so well this year and enjoyed the process so much that we tried not to talk about this being the last game, but the guys wanted to go out with a bang, and they did.

Q. Coach Shaw, why do you think you won today?

COACH SHAW: I think you just stumped a head coach. We just played really well. You know, I think it's something we've been building all year kind of for this and trying to get better each week. We started off fast, and our defense, you give our defense a lead and we feel good about closing the game out.

Now, I'm still a football coach. I'm still not really happy about the second half. Thought we should have put



some more points on the board, but we didn't do that.

Bottom line for me, though, is we kept fighting the whole game and then came out in that fourth quarter and put the game away.

Q. Christian, was this your best game? Just amazing?

CHRISTIAN MCCAFFREY: I don't know. I don't know how to answer that. I think there's been so many games this year where our offense has really gelled. And I think in the start of this game you saw our offense make plays, on special teams we were making plays.

And it's so fun when a team can come together and gel as a unit to try to make plays. Like Coach said, the second half didn't go as we planned, but we've got a bunch of fighters on this team that will never give up. Just love playing with these guys.

Q. Coach Shaw, do you think that this game proved that Christian McCaffrey is the best player in America?

COACH SHAW: I think he was the best player in America before this game, so I think it's just the icing on the cake for us. I do think it's a shame that a lot of people didn't get a chance to see him during the course of the year. Apparently the games were too late. But the bottom line for me is his heart and his determination is evident in every single practice and every single game. Christian, I told him at the Heisman ceremony and I told him again not too long after that, we need him to lead, and he's leading by example and showing guys how to work and push themselves because that's what great players do.

Q. Christian, the way the Heisman vote turned out, did it give you any extra motivation going into this game?

CHRISTIAN MCCAFFREY: No, I mean, you talk to so many great players and great players always play with a chip on their shoulder no matter if they have a reason to or not. I'm someone who believes in having motivation at all times, win or lose, individual awards. I play for my teammates. I play for God and my family.

At the end of the day, whether I win anything or don't, that's the reason why I play and that keeps me

motivated.

Q. Coach Shaw, and I'd like to hear from both Kevin and Christian as well, how much would you like to play the winner of the Alabama-Clemson game in two weeks?

COACH SHAW: That's not a loaded question (laughing). You know what? I just keep referencing what I said at the beginning of the year. I just think four teams is too little, regardless of our situation. Because we've separated ourselves as a big five conference when you have a four-team playoff. But I'm also fine with the fact that it's going to stay this way for a while. It's not going to change next year or the year after that. We're going to go through many different years with this four-team playoff. And with enough evidence of how the season's end, I think eventually whether it turns into an eight-team playoff or six-team playoff with two teams with a bye. However it works. I think at some point we're going to change it.

But for us, today, was just about being Pac-12 Champions, and coming to the Rose Bowl and being Rose Bowl champions, and that's what our guys did today.

KEVIN HOGAN: I don't know what I'm supposed to say.

COACH SHAW: I know what you're supposed to say.

KEVIN HOGAN: It feels great to be Rose Bowl champs.

CHRISTIAN MCCAFFREY: I second that. I go to battle with these guys against anybody in the world. But, once again, I second what Coach and what Kevin said. This is an unbelievable feeling for us, for our team, for our community. Couldn't be more thankful to be a part of a group that's Rose Bowl champs.

Q. Kevin, when you threw that touchdown pass to Christian, you had a very unique vantage point on that move that Christian made to beat that safety. What did you see back there? Once you get to the sideline, how did that get you guys going in a positive way early on?

KEVIN HOGAN: I've had the best vantage point all season watching this guy. You get used to seeing that stuff. I shouldn't take it for granted, but I saw him make a great cut across the defender's face and just try to put a ball on him. Of course, he makes people fall and outraces them to the end zone, and that's the start we needed. We play a lot of young guys on this team, and to come out with a quick touchdown, quick strike really helped us out, helped us feel confident and settle into the game. I think it helped the whole team kind of get into a rhythm.

Q. Coach Shaw and Kevin, who drew up the fumble play -- the fake fumble play that led to that big touchdown pass for you guys?

COACH SHAW: I tell you what, that's been in the works probably for about six years. First saw Boise State do it with Chris Petersen there and always liked it, always looking for the right situation to do it. We've worked on it on and off at different times. But then for this game, it was kind of a group effort. Try not to give any one person credit, but it's one of those things when you talk about it everybody says, no, we can't do that, then we look at it again and say, gosh, that could be really good. It could be really good.

For me, underlying this whole entire game plan was utilization of our speed. Getting Christian out in space, using Michael Rector and Devon Cajuste down the field, Austin Hooper on option routes inside, and give Bryce a chance to touch the ball different ways and sprinkling in Barry Sanders. We knew we were going to have a chance to get guys in space. But that was one way we thought we could really get the safeties to suck up and isolate Michael Rector down the field, and it worked to perfection.

Q. Aziz, what was critical in Stanford controlling the line of scrimmage today? I'd like to also ask that for Kevin. Or Coach Shaw. And one question for Kevin and Christian. The 75-yard touchdown play, do you think that put Iowa back on its heels?

COACH SHAW: So the touchdown pass?

Q. No. That would be --

COACH SHAW: Line of scrimmage? I feel like I'm trying to unravel a Rubik's Cube here. It's a key for every football game. When you walk in the locker room, that's the reason we put our locker room the way it is. When our players walk in the locker room, to the left is the offensive line, to the right is the defensive line. Our guys are reminded every day that the game starts in the trenches. That's where it starts in establishing the physical nature. Aziz has heard it for years and Coach Hart's been driving him nuts for years about reestablishing the line of scrimmage and taking advantage of that and knocking guys back.

And you saw the guys up front do it today, and Aziz was phenomenal today. When you can establish the line of scrimmage on the offensive side and establish line of scrimmage on the defensive side, you've got the edge.

As for the touchdown pass, absolutely. I mean, we feel very, very strongly about what we do on defense. Coach Anderson, Lance Anderson does a phenomenal job on the defensive side. If we can get ourselves the

lead, we're a tough team to beat. The way we play defense, the way we can run the football and stay on the attack. So, absolutely early on we wanted to get the lead and hopefully try to extend it.

AZIZ SHITTU: I think Coach pretty much hit on everything that we focus on as a defense. We made it a point of emphasis all week, starting back from bowl practice to stop the run. We knew Iowa was going to come out and try to establish their run game and get that going, and we made it a point of emphasis. The team that's going to win this game is the team that controls the line of scrimmage. Guys like Solomon, Brennan Scarlett, all those guys, Nate Lohn did a great job coming in. As a unit, we played very well. So proud of those guys.

Q. Aziz, following up on that, how does it feel to be the Defensive Player of the Game? How much did you get a chance to play in the two previous Rose Bowls?

AZIZ SHITTU: It feels awesome, just to see all your hard work come and you be able to walk away with some hardware is never a bad thing. But it's really the whole defense played a great job today. Wouldn't have been able to do it myself. Wouldn't have been able to make the plays I made today by myself. As a unit, we work so well together. Just on the previous Rose Bowls, I played a little bit in the Michigan State game, but not that much. Freshman year I didn't play at all. But it's just been cool watching those guys that have done the job before me and be able to replicate that and play my hardest.

Q. On the first play of the game with the wheel route to Christian, to turn the game around against USC a month ago you used that play and you were able to use it to get things back on track. How much did that put in your mind that that play would work in this game?

COACH SHAW: Well, I think it's pretty straightforward what Christian's been able to do in two short years. The bottom line is we try to get him matched up in space on everybody, whether it's linebacker, safety, whoever it is. That's what that play was all about. They pushed the coverage to the field and had Christian at one-on-one back side and gave him the ball and watched him do what he does.

Q. What kind of message do you think this game sends on a national level?

COACH SHAW: The big thing, my guys get tired of me sometimes because I'm very, very repetitive. I did a rhyme today: Repeating the truth is still a good thing. But we talk a lot about not sending messages. We just talk about playing football. People can write what they want and say what they want. We know in our hearts

how good we are. We put that on the field today. The rankings will be whatever they are, but to me, watching this game, you saw how explosive this team is. You saw how athletic this team is. You saw how physical this team is. And more importantly, you saw how together this team is and how hard these guys play for each other. When one guy makes a play, another guy's jumping on his head because he's so happy for him.

That's the way this team has played all year, and it's been really fun to be a part of. What people say about this team and ranking of this team, that's all fine and good. That's not for us. That's for other people. All I know is today we're Rose Bowl champs.

THE MODERATOR: We're joined with student-athletes from The University of Iowa and Coach Kirk Ferentz. Seated closest to Coach Ferentz is Jordan Lomax and next to Jordan is Austin Blythe.

Coach, an opening statement?

COACH FERENTZ: First of all, I just want to congratulate Stanford. They're a tremendous football team, very well-coached, and they played a tremendous game today, needless to say.

So, we're all disappointed at the outcome of the game today, the way we played. But that being said, I just say it one more time, just how proud I am of our football team. They've been a tremendous group all season long. 13 times they've prepared well, they've competed hard, and today just didn't work out for us.

Obviously, very, very proud of the way the guys have done things, and that really goes back 12 months. So this game hurts. We'll learn from it. We'll move on. We'll improve. But right now it certainly hurts and it's something that we'll deal with.

Couple people I want to thank. First of all, the people involved with the Rose Bowl. Our experience has been just first class. Every part about it has been fantastic, so we're very, very appreciative of that. It's a tremendous experience to play in this game and compete in this game. Our fan turnout was just phenomenal today. They've been great historically, and to have them all out here supporting the team today and all week is something we really appreciate as well.

Great to see so many former players. We had a ton of former players here. Appreciative of that also. And most importantly, just our senior class. I can't tell you or describe in terms just what a great job they have done going back to last January. These guys have walked the walk on a daily basis. They've done a



tremendous job of providing leadership for everybody on our football team, and these guys are the main reason why we made history this year.

So really appreciative of all their efforts. Certainly wish all of them the best as they move forward, and I know they're going to all do well, and our team will move forward as well. Thank you.

Q. Kirk, one question, did the first pass of 75-yard play from scrimmage, to what degree, if any, did that put your team on the heels? And I'd like to ask each of the players something. I'd like to ask Austin, when Kirk is done, what was pivotal about Stanford controlling the line of scrimmage? And to Jordan, what makes McCaffrey unique among the offensive players you have faced?

COACH FERENTZ: In the first place, it was a big play certainly. We had a similar situation to that in 2009 at Penn State. They hit an 80-yard pass on us right off the bat. But we came back and won the football game. Just like this game won't define this team. One play doesn't define a game. We had ample opportunity after that to play. But to put it on that would really diminish the way they played. They played a tremendous game in all phases.

AUSTIN BLYTHE: For us, we just didn't get it going offensively. And Stanford played a good defensive game obviously, and we didn't get anything going until the end there. And at that point it was too little way too late.

JORDAN LOMAX: McCaffrey, he's a great running back. Everybody saw that today, and everybody's seen it all season long. His ability to allude tackles and stay on his feet. He's just a great player.

Q. Kirk, you guys used a different offensive line combination that you hadn't used since I think Northwestern. Was that related to any kind of injury status or was it the practices? How did that come about and what kind of impact did you think it had negatively on the running game?

COACH FERENTZ: Well, I think injuries have pretty much dictated how we play all season long and who plays more specifically. So, yeah, really coming out of the Michigan State game, we had some guys injured, Boone, and Ike Boettger hasn't been healthy since the

Illinois game.

So we felt during the course of the last couple weeks it was the best lineup to go with. And, again, just I don't -- you know, we ran the ball fine against Northwestern using that same lineup. So today they just outplayed us. They outplayed us in every turn, and credit goes to them.

Q. What impact did C.J.'s maybe early injury, if any, play an impact on that offense and his limitations?

COACH FERENTZ: It's kind of the same thing. C.J.'s been less than a hundred percent basically all season long, so I'm not saying he's used to that, but it's par for the course. But, again, just to put it on one injury or guys being a little bit hobbled, Stanford just outplayed us every turn. They outplayed us. They did a great job. They're a veteran football team. It's hard to find -- you can find less than a handful of guys that aren't seniors or juniors on that team, and I think that was a big part of it. Obviously, another big part of that was one of the underclassmen that's not a junior or senior, No. 5, he's a very, very special player too. They have an excellent football team.

Q. Coach, two things, basically. How did McCaffrey differ from what you've seen on film? Was it a shock to your guys to see him in action?

Secondly, did you take any umbrage at the final pass of the game when they were up by 22 and went for a 40-yard pass?

COACH FERENTZ: Regarding the last play, our job if we're on defense is to defend whatever they choose to run. Run, pass, really doesn't matter. So that's what you do when you're on defense, and we didn't successfully defend that play.

Regarding McCaffrey, the thing there is when you play a great football player, and he is a great football player, he earned that trip to New York, and nobody on our football team would disagree with that, it's impossible to duplicate that out there on the practice field. We don't have anybody like that, and I mean that with all due respect to our players. We have a lot of good players, but he's a rare talent. He's a tremendous football player, great balance, great vision, very difficult to tackle. So, you know, it's just a real credit to him.

But for us to try to duplicate that, just like you can go back historically, it's always a big challenge.

Q. Kirk and Jordan both, there seemed to be significant issues with slipping from the very beginning of the game, even in pregame warm-ups. The first play of the game I think, Jordan, you and Cole Fisher slipped, which enabled McCaffrey to kind of split both of you guys. Did you guys

change cleats at halftime? Did you try to talk about it before the game?

COACH FERENTZ: You've got to play with your feet up underneath you. That's what it gets down to. The surface was excellent. That's part of playing on natural grass. It wasn't the shoes. It's just they're a good football team.

JORDAN LOMAX: I agree with what Coach Ferentz just said. We just had to keep our feet up underneath us. We didn't change our shoes at halftime or anything. Pretty much you can't blame it on the cleats or anything. Everybody was on the same surface. It was an even playing field. For us to say it was a slipping issue would be incorrect.

Q. Regarding off-season surgeries, I'm sure you've got a laundry list of that. Is C.J., Boone, anybody else that's kind of on that list right now?

COACH FERENTZ: No, those two guys aren't -- to my knowledge, at least at this point, I just walked out of the locker room and unfortunately haven't had much time to visit, no, they're not on the list. We'll cross that bridge when we get to it. Nothing major to report right now at least that I'm aware of.

Q. Jordan and Austin, I know it's going to be tough to think about it right now, but looking back on your careers, what stands out most to you as being an Iowa Hawkeye?

JORDAN LOMAX: Just being able to play with a group of guys this year. It was a very great year for us. The togetherness and maturity within this group and the camaraderie and just being able to play under Coach Ferentz and the rest of the coaching staff has just been a huge honor.

Couldn't thank this university, our fans and my teammates -- they've done so much for me, and it's just been an awesome year.

AUSTIN BLYTHE: I'd like to echo everything Jordan just said. It's been an unbelievable year with the group of guys we've got. Everybody working towards a common goal, working together. There was nobody standing off on the side doing their own stuff. Like Jordan said, just playing for these fans, this university and for a coach like Coach Ferentz is second to none.

COACH FERENTZ: Thank you.
