**TICKETS** - - Tickets remain on sale at the UI Athletics Ticket Office in Carver-Hawkeye Arena or by phone or website (1-800-IA-HAWKS or [hawkeyesports.com](http://hawkeyesports.com)). Tickets are \$65 for adults and there is a youth ticket price of \$25.

**RADIO** - - (Originating Network): Learfield Communications with a network of over 40 stations. Gary Dolphin and Ed Podolak call the action, with sideline reporter Rob Brooks. KRUI (89.7 FM), the UI student radio station, and on Sirius channel 136 and XM channel 204 on satellite radio.

**TELEVISION** - - The game will be televised by ESPNU. The announcers are Anish Shroff and Ahmad Brooks. Iowa is 7-0 all-time on ESPNU.

**THE RECORDS** - - Iowa is 3-0, with wins over Illinois State (31-14), at Iowa State (31-17) and Pittsburgh (27-24). The Hawkeyes were 7-6 last season, earning a trip to the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl. Iowa was 4-4 in Big Ten play and 3-2 in nonconference games last season.

North Texas is 0-2 after a 31-13 loss at SMU and a 38-24 home loss to Rice. The Mean Green posted a 4-8 record in 2014, including a 2-6 mark in Conference USA West. North Texas was 9-4 in 2013.

**THE SERIES** - - This is the first football game between the two schools.

**COACHING RECORDS** - - Kirk Ferentz is in his 20th year as a college head coach and his 17th year as Iowa's head coach. His career record is 130-106 and he is 118-85 at Iowa. He is the 12th Big Ten Conference coach to win 100 games.

Dan McCarney is in his 17th season as a college head coach and his fifth season at North Texas. McCarney holds a record of 22-29 with the Mean Green and his career mark is 78-114. McCarney is an Iowa City native, an Iowa graduate (1975) and was an offensive lineman for the Hawkeyes (1971-74). He was an Iowa assistant coach (1977-89) and the head coach at Iowa State (1995-2006, 56-85 record).

**NEXT GAME** - - Iowa begins Big Ten Conference action at Wisconsin (11 a.m., TBA). North Texas travels to Southern Mississippi.

- The Hawkeyes are trying to improve to 4-0 for the first time since 2009, and the fourth time under Kirk Ferentz.
- Junior QB C.J. Beathard is undefeated in four career starts. Numbers include 74-of-126 (58.7) passing for 929 yards, five touchdowns, and two interceptions, and 171 yards rushing with three rushing touchdowns.
- Senior WR Tevaun Smith needs 16 yards to become the 37th player in program history to Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 118 wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference, one shy of tying Barry Alvarez (119) for ninth in conference history.
- Junior WR Matt Vandenberg has more catches through the first three games of the season (22) than any player in the Kirk Ferentz era (since 1999). His 22 catches lead the league.
- Iowa's defense leads the Big Ten and ranks fifth in the country in rushing yards per game (51.0)
- North Texas head coach Dan McCarney is one of five UI graduates leading FBS programs, most in the nation.
- Iowa is one of only four schools in the country yet to allow a rushing touchdown.
- Iowa is 10-1 in the month of September over the last three seasons. Kirk Ferentz is 46-22 all-time in September, 26-6 since 2008.
- The Hawkeyes are one of only five schools with two wins against teams from a Power 5 conference. The others include Northwestern, Georgia, LSU, and Toledo.
- The Hawkeyes have played 59 consecutive games without a missed or blocked PAT, the longest streak of any school in the nation.

**IOWA/NORTH TEXAS NOTES**

- Iowa leads the Big Ten allowing just 51 yards rushing per game. North Texas averages 143.5 rushing yards per game, the 11th most in Conference USA.
- Iowa is one of only four teams not to allow a rushing touchdown. North Texas has only two rushing touchdowns in two games.
- Former Iowa head coach Hayden Fry compiled a 40-23-3 record from 1973-78 at North Texas.
- North Texas head coach Dan McCarney and North Texas quarterback Andrew McNulty are Iowa City, Iowa, natives. McNulty was North Texas' leading passer in 2014.
- North Texas head coach Dan McCarney is the second Iowa City native in the last three seasons to coach in Kinnick Stadium (Terry Allen, Missouri State, 2013). McCarney, a Hawkeye assistant from 1977-89, will make his seventh appearance on the opposing sideline at Kinnick. He was 3-3 as a visitor as Iowa State's head coach.

**MCCARNEY ONE OF 5 UI GRADS LEADING FBS PROGRAMS**

The University of Iowa has produced more active FBS head coaches than any other school. Bret Bielema (Arkansas), Bob Diaco (UCONN), Dan McCarney (North Texas), Bob Stoops (Oklahoma), and Mark Stoops (Kentucky) all earned undergraduate degrees from the University of Iowa. Bielema, Diaco, Bob Stoops, and Mark Stoops played for former UI head coach Hayden Fry. McCarney played on teams coached by Frank Lauterbur and Bob Commings. All five head coaches served as assistants under Fry.

McCarney played on the offensive line from 1972-74. He was named team captain his senior season, and eventually joined Fry's staff in 1977. He was an assistant coach at Iowa from 1977-89.

Bielema played on the defensive line from 1989-92. He was team captain his senior season, played in the 1991 Rose Bowl, and served as an assistant coach on the Iowa staff from 1993-2001.

Diaco played linebacker from 1992-95 and was a graduate assistant on the staff from 1996-97. The Hawkeyes advanced to the Alamo Bowl in 1996 and the Sun Bowl in 1997.

Bob Stoops was a defensive back from 1979-82. He was named team MVP in 1982, and played in the 1982 Rose Bowl and 1982 Peach Bowl. He served on the Iowa staff from 1983-87.

Mark Stoops was a defensive back from 1987-89. He played in the 1987 Holiday Bowl and 1988 Peach Bowl, and served as a graduate assistant coach from 1989-91.

**FERENTZ CLOSING IN ON ALVAREZ**

Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 118 wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference, one shy of tying Barry Alvarez (119) for ninth in conference history. Alvarez won 119 games in parts of 18 seasons at Wisconsin.

Ferentz has 68 Big Ten wins, the 10th most in conference history. He trails John Cooper (Ohio State) by two wins for ninth all-time.

Only eight coaches rank in the top 10 in both categories: overall wins as a member of the Big Ten, and conference wins. The others include Woody Hayes (OSU), Amos Alonzo Stagg (CHI), Bo Schembechler (MICH), Hayden Fry (IOWA), Robert Zuppke (ILL), Lloyd Carr (MICH), and Alvarez (WIS).

Ferentz also has six bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten, tying Fry and Carr for No. 2 all-time. Only Alvarez has more (9).

**THE KICK**

Marshall Koehn kicked a 57-yard field goal as time expired to defeat Pitt, 27-24, on Sept. 19. The game-winning field goal was the second longest in school history and tied the Kinnick Stadium record (Arizona's Lee Pistor in 1977).

After Pitt tied the game, 24-24, with 0:52 left in the fourth quarter, Iowa DB Desmond King picked up a squib kick at the 3-yard line and returned it 27 yards to the Iowa 30. QB C.J. Beathard picked up two rushing first downs to move the ball into Pitt territory, and after a pair of sideline routes to WR Tevaun Smith fell incomplete, Beathard scrambled for eight yards to the Pitt 39-yard line. Iowa then used its final timeout to stop the clock with two seconds left.

On fourth-and-2, Pitt called a timeout to freeze Koehn. Koehn let a kick sail anyway, but it landed far short of the goal post. On the ensuing attempt, Dillon Kidd placed a snap from Tyler Kluever on the Pitt 47-yard line, and Koehn split the uprights, giving Iowa its first walk-off field goal since 1986 (Holiday Bowl).

**KOEHN EARNS BIG TEN HONOR**

K Marshall Koehn was named Big Ten Conference Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in Iowa's 27-24 win over Pittsburgh Saturday night.

The Big Ten honor is the first for Koehn (6-foot, 200-pounds), a senior from Solon, Iowa (Solon HS). He is the second Hawkeye to earn a weekly conference honor this season (QB C.J. Beathard vs. Iowa State). He is the first Iowa kicker to earn the special teams award since Mike Meyer was recognized following a 19-16 double overtime win at Michigan State in 2012.

Koehn delivered the winning margin against Pittsburgh as he booted a 57-yard field goal as time expired. The kick tied the Kinnick Stadium record for longest field goal (Lee Pistor, Arizona, 1977) and ranks as the second longest in Iowa history (58 yards, Tim Douglas at Illinois, 1998). With a 52-yard kick in the 24-20 win at Pittsburgh in 2014, Koehn now has two of the nine longest field goals in Iowa history. It was the first walk-off field goal for Iowa football since Rob Houghtlin connected from 41 yards to win the 1986 Holiday Bowl.

**THE DRIVE**

Iowa put together a 99-yard scoring drive on its second possession of the season. It was the Hawkeyes' first 99-yard touchdown drive since 2002. Iowa passed six times and rushed six times while converting five first downs on the drive. QB C.J. Beathard was 4-of-6 passing for 63 yards. He also carried once for two yards. RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., carried four times for 18 yards, and RB Jordan Canzeri took his first carry of the season five yards into the end zone. Canzeri also had a 21-yard reception.

Iowa has put together four drives covering nine or more plays and 80 or more yards four times this season tying for the most in the country through three games (Texas A&M, Bowling Green, and Florida State).

**IOWA VS. CONFERENCE USA**

Iowa is 4-1 all-time against members of Conference USA. The Hawkeyes defeated UTEP, 69-7, in 1986, and are 3-1 all-time against Tulsa. The last meeting was a 54-16 Iowa win in 1997.

**THE FOURTH QUARTER**

QB C.J. Beathard and the Hawkeyes' rush defense have dominated the fourth quarter in 2015. Iowa's rush defense, the top rush defense in the conference, has yielded four yards rushing in the fourth quarter this season.

Beathard is 14-of-17 passing for 206 yards and one touchdown. He has also rushed six times for 35 yards and one touchdown in the fourth quarter this season. He has engineered game-winning drives in the fourth quarter in each of the last two weeks. He was 4-of-4 for 46 yards and a touchdown against Iowa State, and he rushed for 27 yards on three carries to set up K Marshall Koehn's 57-yard game winning field goal against Pitt.

In his last four games, including the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl, Beathard's fourth quarter numbers include 21-of-24 passing for 301 yards and three touchdowns, and eight carries for 73 yards and one touchdown.

**FORE!**

The Hawkeyes are trying to improve to 4-0 for the first time since 2009, and the fourth time under Kirk Ferentz. Iowa finished 11-2 the last time it started the season 4-0. The 2009 Hawkeyes won their first nine games, finished 11-2 overall, and won the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl. The 2006 Hawkeyes started 4-0 and participated in the Alamo Bowl. The 2003 Hawkeyes started 4-0 and went on to finish 10-3 with a win over Florida at the 2004 Outback Bowl. Iowa is 3-0 for the sixth time since 2001.

**RUSH DEFENSE... NO TOUCHDOWNS FOR YOU**

Iowa is the only Big Ten school, and one of four schools nationally, to not allow a rushing touchdown (Boston College, Utah, Navy). The Hawkeyes yield an average of 51.0 rushing yards per game, best in the Big Ten and fifth nationally. Iowa has limited opponents to 1.87 yards per carry (82 attempts, 153 yards), the best in the conference and No. 6 in the country.

**2-FOR-2 AGAINST POWER 5**

Iowa has two wins against Power 5 schools: Iowa State, 31-17, and Pitt, 27-24. The Hawkeyes are one of only five schools with two wins against teams from a Power 5 conference. The other include Northwestern, Georgia, LSU, and Toledo.

**FLIRTING WITH 100**

Junior QB C.J. Beathard gained 111 yards but lost 34 yards rushing against Iowa State on Sept. 12. His net gain of 77 yards threatened his career-high of 82 set at the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl. The last Iowa quarterback to rush for 100 yards in a single game was Butch Caldwell, who ran for 109 yards on 12 attempts against Michigan State on Nov. 24, 1973 in Iowa City.

**FIRST TIME STARTERS**

The Hawkeyes have used nine first time starters. RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., LT Boone Myers, DT Nathan Bazata, DT Jaleel Johnson, LB Cole Fisher, LB Ben Niemann, and SS Miles Taylor all started the season opener. TE Jameer Outsey made his first career start against Iowa State, and DE Parker Hesse started for the first time in the win over Pitt.



## HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 17th season as head football coach at Iowa and the dean of Big Ten Conference football coaches. His latest contract extension runs through the 2020 season.



- Named Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year in 2002, 2004 and 2009, joining Hayden Fry, Bo Schembechler and Joe Paterno as the only three-time recipients.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004.
- Ferentz ranks ninth with 118 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 68 Big Ten wins, ninth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl.
- Iowa has played in seven January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 109-64 (.630) overall mark and a 63-46 (.578) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference nine times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and a second-place finish in 2009.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 118-85 (.581) and a 68-60 (.531) mark in Big Ten games. In his 19th season as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 130-106 (.551). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, in his fourth season as Iowa's offensive line coach, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven is an offensive lineman in his fourth season.

### REMOVE THE REDSHIRT

Three true freshmen played in the 2015 season opener: OL James Daniels, WR Jerminic Smith, and WR Adrian Falconer. Daniels is the first true freshman to play offensive line since Bryan Bulaga in 2007. Daniels joined the Iowa program last spring and participated in spring practice.

### **QB C.J. BEATHARD (SO., 6-2, 209)**

#### Career Games Played/Starts: 17/4

Junior QB C.J. Beathard set career bests in completions (27), attempts (40), and yards (258) to lead Iowa to a 27-24 win over Pitt and improve to 4-0 as Iowa's starting quarterback. He joins Nathan Chandler (2003) as the only quarterbacks to win each of their first four career starts under Kirk Ferentz. His starting record includes a 2-0 mark on the road (Purdue 2014, Iowa State 2015) and a 2-0 mark at home (Illinois State, Pitt).

Beathard earned Co-Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors after helping lead Iowa to a 14-point triumph at Iowa State. Beathard totaled 292 yards (215 passing and 77 rushing) against the Cyclones. Beathard was the first quarterback in the Kirk Ferentz era (1999-2015) to amass more than 400 yards passing (426) and 100 yards rushing (103) through the first two games of a season.

#### **Beathard in 3-2-1:**

- Leads all Big Ten quarterbacks with 142 yards rushing and three rushing touchdowns.
- Undefeated in four career starts. Numbers include 74-of-126 (58.7) for 929 yards passing, five touchdowns, and two interceptions. He has also rushed for 171 yards and three touchdowns in four career starts.
- Won his first four career starts. The last Iowa quarterback to win his first five career starts was Matt Sherman. Sherman won his first seven starts, including the final two games of 1994 and the first five games in 1995.

### **RB LeSHUN DANIELS, JR. (JR., 6-0, 225)**

#### Career Games Played/Starts: 15/2

Junior RB LeShun Daniels rushed nine times for 17 yards against Pitt on Sept. 19, one week after leaving the Iowa State game in the second quarter due to injury. Daniels started Iowa's first two games, but did not start against Pitt, that starting job went to RB Jordan Canzeri.

#### **Daniels in 3-2-1:**

- Set career highs in carries (26), rushing yards (123), and longest rush (27) in his first career start against Illinois State on Sept. 5. It was his first career 100-yard game.
- Entered the season with 184 rushing yards in 12 games. Has 196 yards through three games in 2015.
- He was Iowa's eighth different opening day starting running back since 2007.

**OL AUSTIN BLYTHE (SR., 6-3, 290)**

**Career Games Played/Started: 39/38**

Senior C Austin Blythe is the veteran on an offensive line that includes three sophomores. He has started 39 games for Iowa, more than any other active Hawkeye, since debuting as Iowa's starting RG as a redshirt freshman in the 2012 season opener.

**Blythe in 3-2-1:**

- 33 consecutive starts on the offensive line.
- Iowa's opening day starting center for three straight years.
- Rimington and Outland Trophy Watch Lists.

**RB JORDAN CANZERI (SR., 5-9, 192)**

**Career Games Played/Starts: 32/3**

Senior RB Jordan Canzeri made his third career start against Pitt on Sept. 19 and set a career high with seven receptions for 30 yards. He also had a team-high 12 carries for 49 yards and two touchdowns, marking his first career multi-touchdown game. He has rushed for a touchdown in each of Iowa's three games this season.

**Canzeri in 3-2-1:**

- Ties for the Big Ten lead with four rushing touchdowns. Entered his senior season with two career rushing touchdowns in 29 career games.
- Ranks ninth in the Big Ten in all-purpose yards (201 rushing, 139 receiving). Including the 2015 TaxSlayer Bowl, Canzeri has 488 all-purpose yards over the last four games (321 rushing, 152 receiving, 15 kickoff returns).
- Second on the team with 12 receptions. Six straight games with at least one reception.

**FS JORDAN LOMAX (SR., 5-10, 205)**

**Career Games Played/Starts: 36/16**

Senior FS Jordan Lomax ranks second on the team with 20 tackles. He had 10 stops in a 27-24 win over Pitt last week. He has started 15 of Iowa's last 16 games.

**Lomax in 3-2-1:**

- 10 tackles against Pitt was one shy of matching his career high (11), set at Maryland in 2014.
- 92 tackles in 2014 ranked third on the team.
- Saw action in 11 games as a true freshman before redshirting in 2012 with shoulder injury.

**DE DREW OTT (SR., 6-4, 272)**

**Career Games Played/Started: 44/27**

Senior DE Drew Ott saw limited action against Pitt, one week after leaving the Iowa State game with three minutes left in the first quarter. He did not start against Pitt, snapping his streak of 15 consecutive starts at defensive end, but did play. Ott recorded two sacks for a loss of 20 yards and forced one fumble in Iowa's season opener. His two sacks against Illinois State are the first time a Hawkeye collected multiple sacks in a season-opener since Mitch King had a pair in 2007. Ott led the team and tied for third in the Big Ten with 8.0 sacks in 2014. He had two tackles, one sack (7 yards), and two quarterback hurries against Pitt in 2014.

**Ott in 3-2-1:**

- Has started 27 of the last 29 games at defensive end.
- One of 11 players on Big Ten Players to Watch List.
- Picked up a deflected punt against Nebraska in 2014 and returned it 12 yards for his first career touchdown.

**CB DESMOND KING (JR., 5-11, 190)****Career Games Played/Starts: 29/28**

Junior CB Desmond King, regarded as one of the top corners in the conference, has made a habit of making big plays on returns this season. King returned a punt 37 yards (career long) to set up Iowa's go-ahead touchdown drive against Iowa State on Sept. 12, and picked up a muffed squib kick and returned it 27 yards to set up K Marshall Koehn's 57-yard game winning field goal against Pitt on Sept. 19.

**King in 3-2-1:**

- Tied for the Big Ten lead with three interceptions. The last Hawkeye to lead the league in interception was Tyler Sash in 2009 (6).
- Had interceptions on Pitt's first two possessions. They were his second and third interceptions of the season, and the fifth and sixth of his career. He is the first Hawkeye with two interceptions in a game since John Lowdermilk in the fourth period at Purdue in 2014.
- Has started 28 consecutive games since entering the starting lineup in Week 2 of his true freshman season.

**WR TEVAUN SMITH (SR., 6-2, 205)****Career Games Played/Starts: 38/17**

Senior WR Tevaun Smith hauled in a 51-yard reception in the first quarter against Pitt to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards. Smith has 1,067 receiving yards, ranking 36th in program history.

**Smith in 3-2-1:**

- Has at least one reception in 16 straight games.
- Eight catches and 120 receiving yards both rank third on the team. He led Iowa with 596 yards receiving in 2014.
- His 51-yard catch against Pitt ties for the longest reception by a Hawkeye this season (Canzeri). He had a team-high eight plays of 30-plus yards from scrimmage in 2014, including two touchdowns (37, 31) and a 35-yard rush.

**WR MATT VANDEBERG (JR., 6-1, 185)****Career Games Played/Starts: 26/6**

Junior WR Matt VandeBerg has more catches through the first three games of the season (22) than any player in the Kirk Ferentz era (since 1999). Kevin Kasper had 21 receptions through the first three games of 2000, and Kevonte Martin-Manley, the school's all-time leader in receptions, had 19 catches through three games in 2013 and 2014.

**VandeBerg in 3-2-1:**

- Leads the Big Ten with 22 receptions and ranks seventh in receiving yards per game (72.7).
- Set career highs with nine receptions and 114 receiving yards in Iowa's 31-17 win at Iowa State on Sept. 12.
- Entered the season with 22 career receptions (23 games). He has 22 through three games in 2015.

**DE NATE MEIER (SR., 6-2, 252)****Career Games Played/Starts: 30/16**

Senior Nate Meier leads the Hawkeyes and ranks third in the Big Ten with four sacks. Meier entered 2015 with three career sacks. His 19 tackles tie for third on the team.

**Meier in 3-2-1:**

- Leads Iowa in tackles-for-loss (5-23) and sacks (4-21).
- Meier and fellow defensive end Drew Ott were two of seven true freshmen to see action in 2012.
- One of three Hawkeye defensive linemen to play 8-man football in high school (Drew Ott, Nathan Bazata).

**LB BEN NIEMANN (SO., 6-3, 225)****Career Games Played/Starts: 16/3**

Sophomore LB Ben Niemann ties for 10th in the Big Ten with 4.5 tackles-for-loss. Niemann has started each of Iowa's first three games (his first three career starts).

**Niemann in 3-2-1:**

- Has two sacks this season, tying Drew Ott and trailing team-leader Nate Meier (4.5)
- Blocked a punt and returned it for a touchdown against Northwestern in 2014.
- One of three true freshman to see action in 2014.

**TE JAKE DUZEY (SR., 6-4, 248)****Career Games Played/Starts: 37/13**

Senior TE Jake Duzey suffered a knee injury in the final week of spring practice and is currently not available for game action.

**Duzey in 3-2-1:**

- Three touchdown receptions in 2014 tied for the team lead (Damond Powell, Ray Hamilton, Tevaun Smith).
- Had 36 receptions in 2014, a single-season career high and tied for the second most by a Big Ten tight end this season.
- 85-yard TD reception at Ohio State in 2013 is ninth longest scoring reception in school history.

**P DILLON KIDD (SR., 6-2, 215)**

Senior P Dillon Kidd shared punting duties in 2014, averaging 38.5 yards per punt. In near full-time duty in 2015 (Marshall Koehn has one of Iowa's 11 punts) Kidd is averaging 49.8 yards per punt.

**Kidd in 3-2-1:**

- Leads the Big Ten averaging 49.8 yards per punt.
- 64-yard punt against Pitt is a career long.
- Has five punts of 50-plus yards, the fourth highest total in the Big Ten.

**K MARSHALL KOEHN (SR., 6-0, 200)**

Senior K Marshall Koehn was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week following his game-winning field goal against Pitt on Sept. 19. Koehn connected on the second longest field goal (57 yards) in school history as time expired to give Iowa a 27-24 win. It was Iowa's first walk-off field goal since the 1986 Holiday Bowl, and the longest game-winning field goal in FBS since 2008 (Fresno State's Kevin Goessling, 58 yards in 2008 against Utah State). Koehn is 4-for-4 on field goal tries this season, all 40-plus yard attempts (40, 49, 43, 57).

Koehn leads the Big Ten averaging 64.1 yards per kickoff. He has 11 touchbacks, the third highest total in the conference. He also has one punt this season for 64 yards. It is the only punt of his career, and it came to rest inside the opponent's 5-yard line.

**Koehn in 3-2-1:**

- Hit a career-long 57 yard field goal as time expired to defeat Pitt, 27-24, on Sept. 19. It is the second longest field goal in school history (Tim Douglas, 1998) and ties a Kinnick Stadium record (Lee Pistor, Arizona, 1977). He has kicked two of Iowa's nine longest field goals in school history -- both coming against Pitt (52 at Pitt in 2014 and 57 vs. Pitt in 2015).
- Has 98 career points. Needs two points to become the 36th player in program history with 100 career points.
- Has made seven consecutive field goal attempts, 15 of his last 16 attempts, and 50 consecutive PAT attempts (50/50 in his career).

**BAPTISM BY FIRE**

Iowa starting tackles LT Boone Myers and RT Ike Boettger entered 2015 with one combined career start (Boettger started as a second tight end against Wisconsin in 2014). The sophomores replace a pair of NFL lineman -- 2014 Outland Trophy winner LT Brandon Scherff (Washington Redskins) and RT Andrew Donnal (St. Louis Rams).

Myers joined the program as a walk-on and was put on scholarship prior to the 2014 season. He saw action in four games last season. Boettger joined the team as a tight end but was moved to offensive line in 2013. He saw action in seven games as a redshirt freshman in 2014.

**FIND THE NFL-ER**

Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as UI head coach, the Hawkeyes have had a future NFL player start on the offensive line in every season.

In each of the last eight years, an eventual NFL first-round draft pick started on the offensive line. Brandon Scherff, selected by the Washington Redskins fifth overall in 2015, was Iowa's left tackle from 2012-14. Riley Reiff, selected 23rd overall by the Detroit Lions in 2012, started at left tackle from 2010-11. Bryan Bulaga, selected 23rd overall by the Green Bay Packers in 2010, started at left guard in 2007 before moving to left tackle in 2008-09.

From 2005-06, Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Marshal Yanda shared time at tackle and guard for the Hawkeyes. Mike Elgin, a seventh round selection of New England, was Iowa's starting center in 2004. Pete McMahon, drafted by Oakland in 2005, was Iowa's right guard in 2003. Oakland's first round pick in 2004, Robert Gallery, was Iowa's left tackle from 2001-03. Eric Steinbach (Cincinnati) started at guard for Iowa from 2000-02, and Bruce Nelson (Carolina) was a four-year starter from 1999-02. Both players were second round draft picks in 2003.

Freshmen Landan and Levi Paulsen are the sixth set of twins to play football at the University of Iowa. The offensive linemen from Woodbury High School in Northwest Iowa join the company of Leo and Lloyd Jenvold (1929-30), Harold and Herbert Shoener (1946-47), Kent and Kevin Ellis (1977-80), Aaron and Evan Kooiker (1992), and Shane and Shaun Prater (2008).

The Paulsens are one of three sets of brothers on Iowa's 2015 roster, joining DB Kevin Ward and OL Ryan Ward, and OL James Daniels and RB LeShun Daniels.

**GLANCE AT THE SCHEDULE**

- The Hawkeyes open Big Ten play at Wisconsin on Oct. 3. This marks the 13th time in Kirk Ferentz's 17 years at Iowa that the Hawkeyes open the conference season on the road.
- For the first time in program history Iowa plays more than one night game at Kinnick Stadium. Iowa defeated Pitt, 27-24, in a BTN primetime game Sept. 19. The Hawkeyes host Minnesota on Nov. 14 at 7 p.m. (CT) on BTN.
- Iowa is one of four Big Ten teams (Iowa, Michigan, NW, Rutgers) with two power five schools on its nonconference schedule (Iowa State, Pitt). The Hawkeyes defeated Iowa State, 31-17, on Sept. 12, and Pitt, 27-24, on Sept. 19.
- The Hawkeyes defeated Illinois State, 31-14, in the season opener. The Redbirds lost to North Dakota State in the 2014 FCS title game. Iowa opens the 2016 season hosting North Dakota State.
- Iowa will face Maryland on Oct. 31 in Iowa City. It marks Maryland's first football game in Iowa City. It also marks the 16th time in Iowa program history the Hawkeyes play on Halloween (6-8-1).
- The Hawkeyes do not face Big Ten opponents Michigan, Michigan State, Ohio State, Penn State, and Rutgers.
- Iowa's Homecoming game is Oct. 10 against Illinois at 11 a.m. Iowa is 56-42-5 all-time in Homecoming contests, and has won five of its last Homecoming games. Illinois is visiting Kinnick Stadium for the first time since 2007.
- Three of Iowa's nonconference opponents are led by coaches who have been assistants in the Big Ten, including Illinois State's Brock Spack (Purdue), Pitt's Pat Narduzzi (Michigan State), and North Texas' Dan McCarney (Iowa, Wisconsin). Iowa State's Paul Rhoads was a graduate assistant under John Cooper at Ohio State.
- North Texas head coach Dan McCarney and North Texas quarterback Andrew McNulty are Iowa City, Iowa, natives. McNulty was North Texas' leading passer in 2014.
- North Texas head coach Dan McCarney is the second Iowa City native in the last three seasons to coach in Kinnick Stadium (Terry Allen, Missouri State, 2013). McCarney, a Hawkeye assistant from 1977-89, will make his seventh appearance on the opposing sideline at Kinnick. He was 3-3 as a visitor as Iowa State's head coach.
- Iowa has four trophy games on its schedule in 2015: Iowa State (Cy-Hawk: W, 31-17), Minnesota (Floyd of Rosedale), Wisconsin (Heartland), and Nebraska (Heroes).

**FERENTZ SECOND IN LONGEVITY**

Kirk Ferentz is in his 17th season as Iowa's head football coach and ranks second in longevity among FBS head coaches. Ferentz is first among Big Ten coaches and nationally ranks behind Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer (28). Ferentz is tied for second with Bob Stoops of Oklahoma.

**IOWA PROGRAM NOTES**

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 13 of the last 14 seasons.
- Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002) is one of four Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls in four times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004 and the Hawkeyes were also 20th in 2008.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared the poll 297 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa established a school record with 11 wins in 2002 (11-2) and matched that record in 2009. In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times (2002, 2004 & 2009) and he was named National Coach of the Year in 2002. Ferentz joins Michigan's Bo Schembechler (four), Iowa's Hayden Fry (three) and Penn State's Joe Paterno (three) as the only coaches to be honored in more than two seasons.
- Iowa has had national award winners in: Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman).
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry, leading the program for the 17th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

**59 AND COUNTING**

The Hawkeyes have played 59 consecutive games without a missed or blocked PAT, the longest streak of any school in the nation. Iowa has converted on 179 consecutive PATs during the streak.

**HAWKEYE HISTORY**

Iowa has played 1,196 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 616-541-39 (.530). That includes a 388-213-16 (.641) record in home games, a 228-328-23 (.413) record in games away from Iowa City, a 306-366-25 (.457) mark in Big Ten games and a 271-177-15 (.600) record in Kinnick Stadium.

**HOME GROWN HAWKEYES**

Iowa's roster of 114 players includes 49 players from Iowa. The roster includes 14 players from Illinois; nine from Texas; seven from Maryland; six from Missouri, five from Ohio; four from Michigan; three from Florida, Nebraska, and New Jersey; two from South Dakota, Wisconsin, and Canada; one from Alabama, Minnesota, New York, Oklahoma, and Tennessee.

**IOWA WILL RECEIVE**

Iowa received the opening kickoff in all three games this season. In 17 seasons as Iowa's head coach, Kirk Ferentz and the Hawkeyes received the opening kickoff in 165-of-203 games (98-67). Iowa has started the game on defense in 38-of-203 games under Ferentz (20-18).

**IOWA AMONG TOP 25 IN WINS, 2002-15**

Iowa has posted 107 wins since the start of the 2002 season, tied for the 21st highest total in Division I football. **No. 12 Iowa def. No. 7 Michigan State, 14-10**

College Football Hall of Fame coach Forest Evashevski and Iowa controlled the first half during Hall of Fame coach Duffy Daugherty's Michigan State debut, and the Hawkeyes went into the break ahead 7-0. Daugherty had all the right things to say to his players at halftime, and they came out and scored on Leroy Bolden's touchdown run and a Gerry Planutis field goal. Hawkeye halfback Eldean Matheson fielded a punt from Don Kauth, and he raced 53 yards to the Spartans' three-yard line. On fourth-and-one at the goal line, Iowa quarterback Jerry Reichow plunged into the end zone behind a line featuring Hall of Fame guard Calvin Jones, giving his team the win. The Hawkeyes finished the season 5-4 and the Spartans finished 3-6.

**IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL**

- There are 30 Hawkeyes currently active in the NFL.
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978.
- Kirk Ferentz has produced seven first-round draft picks, tied for ninth most among active college coaches.
- Since 2011, Iowa has had 22 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State matches Iowa's NFL total. Iowa has had five first round picks in the last six NFL drafts, tying Wisconsin (5) for the league lead.
- Iowa had 22 players drafted from 2010-15, including four first round picks (OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015).
- Iowa and Alabama were the only two college football programs to have a first round draft selection following the 2009, 2010 and 2011 seasons.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a four-time Pro-Bowler (2011-14) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, and 2014.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his fourth year as Iowa's offensive line coach, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Every Iowa senior starting tight end (11) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team in his first year as a rookie (including 2015 rookie Ray Hamilton).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Over the past 13 years, 123-of-137 (90 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.

**AMONG THE BEST IN THE BIG TEN**

Iowa has posted a 6-6 bowl record under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State has won more bowl games (including the FBS championship game), than Iowa. Following is the record for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

**OFFENSIVE LINE EARNS RECOGNITION**

Iowa's offensive line earned a "Game Ball" from the Joe Moore Award for its play in Iowa's 31-17 win at Iowa State last Saturday. The Joe Moore Foundation for Teamwork honors the most notable performances each week by offensive line units.

At Iowa State, Iowa's offense rushed for 260 yards, averaging 5.8 yards per rushing attempt. Iowa controlled the fourth quarter with 10:55 in possession time, scoring two touchdowns in the final 2:14 to earn the road win.

Iowa's starting offensive line includes center Austin Blythe, tackles Boone Myers and Ike Boettger, and guards Sean Welsh and Jordan Walsh. Blythe and Walsh are seniors, while Myers, Boettger and Welsh are sophomores.

The Joe Moore Award is named after Joe Moore, widely regarded as one of the best offensive line coaches in college football history, and is the only major college football award to honor a unit.

**IOWA BOWL NOTES**

Iowa has appeared in 28 bowl games with a record of 14-13-1 (.518). The Hawkeyes have competed in the Rose (five times), Outback (four), Alamo (four), Holiday (three), Orange (two), Peach (two), Sun (two), Insight (two), Gator/TaxSlayer (two), and the Capital One, and Freedom bowls once. Iowa has played 12 bowl games under Kirk Ferentz (6-6).

- Iowa has been bowl eligible 13 of the last 14 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz and his staff.
- Iowa ranks third in Big Ten bowl appearances. Ohio State has received a conference-best 45 bowl bids, followed by Michigan (43), Iowa (28) and Wisconsin (26).
- During the BCS bowl era (1998-2013), the Big Ten qualified 27 teams for BCS bowls, more than any other conference. Eight different Big Ten programs played in BCS bowl games, including two appearances by Iowa (1-1).
- For just the second time in league history, 10 Big Ten Conference teams competed in bowl games in 2014 (2011). Ohio State won the inaugural College Football Playoff, while Michigan State won the Cotton Bowl, another College Football Playoff bowl.

**KIRK FERENTZ RADIO SHOW**

Iowa Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week. The 90-minute radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes. The show airs each Wednesday evening at 6:30 p.m. from Carlos O'Kelly's in Iowa City.

**IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP**

The University of Iowa football program has 16 players on its 2015 Leadership Group, including 13 seniors, two juniors, and one sophomore. The purpose of the group is to assist in formulating policies, and being involved in team decision-making matters regarding the upcoming season. Players are selected by a team vote.

The seniors are OL Austin Blythe, RB Jordan Canzeri, DL Darian Cooper, FB Adam Cox, TE Jake Duzey, WR Jacob Hillyer, PK Marshall Koehn, DB Jordan Lomax, DE Nate Meier, DE Drew Ott, LB Travis Perry, FB Macon Plewa and WR Tevaun Smith. The junior class is represented by QB C.J. Beathard and RB LeShun Daniels, Jr., and LB Josey Jewell represents the sophomore class.

**ALL IN THE FAMILY**

Iowa coach Kirk Ferentz has two of his three sons involved in the Iowa program again in 2015. Brian, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his fourth season as Iowa's offensive line coach. Steven is an offensive lineman who is in his fourth season as a redshirt junior. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in May 2013. He is currently playing for the NFL's Denver Broncos. Ferentz is the only FBS coach ever to coach three sons at the same school.

**MORE THAN ONE**

Eleven high schools have contributed more than one player to the current Iowa football roster. Dowling Catholic HS in West Des Moines, Iowa; and Providence Catholic HS in Homer Glen, Illinois each graduated three current Hawkeyes. The schools with two current Hawkeyes include DeMatha Catholic HS (Washington, D.C.), Harding HS (Warren, Ohio), Regina HS (Iowa City, Iowa), Solon HS (Solon, Iowa), Waukeel HS (Waukeel, Iowa), West Branch HS (West Branch, Iowa), West Lyon HS (Inwood, Iowa), Williamsburg HS (Williamsburg, Iowa), and Woodbury Central HS (Menville, Iowa).

**THE HAWKEYES, SIZE WISE**

Redshirt freshman WR Brandon Bishop and freshman WR Emmanuel Ogwo are the lightest Hawkeye players at 170 pounds. Junior DL Jaleel Johnson is the heaviest at 310 pounds. A total of seven Hawkeye players are listed at 300 pounds or more.

The tallest player at 6-8 is redshirt freshman DE Matt Nelson. The shortest player, at 5-8, is sophomore WR Jonathan Parker.

The average Hawkeye player is 6-2 and weighs 232 pounds. That is the one inch taller and two pounds heavier than the average Iowa player in 2013.





**FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS**

Iowa has nine players on its 2015 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes. WR Brandon Bishop (Willie in 1986), QB Drew Cook (Marv in 1985-88), OL Cole Croston (Dave in 1984-86), OL Mitch Keppy (Myron in 1986-87), LS Tyler Kluver (Todd in 1986-87), TE George Kittle (Bruce in 1977-80), WR Anthony Nelson (Jeff in 1990-92), TE Peter Pekar (Jim in 1980-81), and QB Ryan Schmidt (Rick 1984-85).

**ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!**

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is once again available for fans traveling to Kinnick Stadium on Iowa Football game days. The Hawkeye Express enters its 12th season. Adults can ride the train for \$12, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. Media credentials are accepted as well.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to 11 a.m. kickoffs, and four hours prior to the start of afternoon and night games. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

**BEATHARD EARNS NATIONAL MANNING AWARD**

Junior quarterback C.J. Beathard was selected as the Manning Award Quarterback of the Week following his play in Iowa's 31-17 win at Iowa State. He earned the honor over seven other Manning Award Stars of the Week in the Allstate Sugar Bowl's Facebook contest.

In his third career start, the Franklin, Tennessee, native completed 15-of-25 passes for 215 yards and three touchdowns as the Hawkeyes scored 21 unanswered points in the second half to earn the road victory. His 25-yard touchdown pass to junior WR Riley McCarron in the fourth quarter gave the Hawkeyes the lead with 2:14 left in the game. Beathard also carried the ball a career high 10 times for 77 yards, showcasing his athleticism on runs of 44 and 57 yards in the first half. He was also named the Big Ten Conference Co-Offensive Player of the Week.

Beathard earned the award over Washington State's Luke Falk, who completed 47-of-66 passes for 478 yards and four

touchdowns in a 37-34 win at Rutgers. Third in the voting was Paxton Lynch from Memphis, who led the Tigers to a 55-23 win at Kansas to snap a 19-game losing streak against power-five teams.

Each week during the regular season, eight quarterbacks are recognized as Manning Quarterbacks of the Week. Sixty-two players from 58 different schools were honored during the 2014 season.

**BEATHARD EARNS BIG WEEKLY HONOR**

Junior quarterback C.J. Beathard was named co-Offensive Player of the Week by the Big Ten after leading Iowa to a 31-17 win at Iowa State on Sept. 15. He completed 15-of-25 attempts for 215 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions. He also rushed 10 times for 77 yards, including runs of 44 and 57 yards. His scoring strikes covered three, 14, and 25 yards, with the 25-yard score giving Iowa the lead with 2:14 remaining in the fourth quarter.

The Big Ten weekly honor was the first for Beathard. He is the first Hawkeyes to win the offensive honor since former WR Marvin McNutt, Jr., following a win over Indiana in 2011.

**COACH TO CURE MD CELEBRATES EIGHTH SEASON**

For the eighth year in a row, football coaches nationwide will band together for the Coach to Cure MD program, which will be held during games on Saturday, Sept. 26. The annual effort has raised more than \$1.25 million to battle Duchenne muscular dystrophy.

On Saturday, September 26, American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) members will wear a Coach to Cure MD logo patch on the sidelines. College football fans will be asked to donate to research projects supported by Parent Project Muscular Dystrophy (PPMD), the largest nonprofit organization in the U.S. to focus solely on Duchenne muscular dystrophy.

The Coach to Cure MD patches will also be worn on non-Saturday games the same weekend, and teams who do not play will wear the patches during other games throughout the season. Additionally, more than 60 teams will recognize a local Duchenne family on the field before or during the game.

Football fans can donate to Duchenne muscular dystrophy research by either going on-line to [CoachtocureMD.org](http://CoachtocureMD.org) or by texting the word CURE to 90999 (a \$5 donation will automatically be added to your next phone bill).

Last year, more than 10,000 college coaches at more than 600 institutions participated in Coach to Cure MD events. The seven-year fundraising total (2008-14) is now over \$1.25 million.

## GAME RECAP

Iowa scored the game's first 31 points en route to a 31-14 season-opening victory over Illinois State at Kinnick Stadium.

In his second career start, first at home, QB C.J. Beathard accounted for three touchdowns (two rushing and one passing), while throwing for 211 yards (15-of-24). Beathard scored on runs of six and one yard, while completing a 9-yard score to WR Matt VandeBerg. Beathard became the first Hawkeye quarterback to rush for two TD's and pass for another in a game since Brad Banks at Minnesota in 2002.

The Hawkeyes dominated the game in the trenches, rushing 44 times for 210 yards offensively, and collecting 10 tackles for loss, including five first-half sacks, defensively.

RB LeShun Daniels and RB Jordan Canzeri led the Hawkeyes offensively, combining for 241 all-purpose yards. Daniels led the Hawkeye ground attack rushing for 123 yards on 26 attempts. Canzeri had a game-best 90 yards receiving on four catches, while also rushing for 28 yards and a TD on five carries.

Iowa took a 17-0 lead into halftime after PK Marshall Koehn split the uprights from 40 yards as time expired in the second quarter. The field goal followed rushing scores from Beathard (six yards) and Canzeri (five yards) earlier in the half. Canzeri's score capped off a 12-play, 99-yard drive -- Iowa's first 99-yard TD drive since its game at Miami (OH) in 2002.

The only scoring in the third quarter was VandeBerg's 9-yard reception. Beathard closed out the Hawkeye scoring with a one-yard plunge midway through the fourth quarter. Illinois State added two late touchdowns against the Hawkeyes' second unit.

The Hawkeye defense was in the Illinois State backfield applying pressure most of the afternoon. DE Drew Ott had two sacks for a combined loss of 20 yards. DE Nate Meier had two tackles for loss, including a sack, while LB Ben Niemann had 2.5 tackles for loss, including a sack. LB Cole Fisher led the team with eight total tackles. DT Nathan Bazata had a sack and blocked Illinois State's 50-yard field goal attempt.

As a unit, the Hawkeyes held the Redbirds to 35 yards rushing on 28 attempts, including zero yards on 15 carries in the first half.

### GAME RECAP

Iowa scored 21 unanswered second-half points to record a 31-17 come-from-behind road victory over Iowa State at Jack Trice Stadium and reclaim possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy.

The Hawkeyes were led offensively by QB C.J. Beathard, RB Jordan Canzeri, and WR Matt Vandenberg. Canzeri rushed a career-high 24 times for 124 yards and a TD. Vandenberg posted career highs in receptions (9) and receiving yards (114), while also scoring a TD. Beathard rushed 10 times for 77 yards, including a career-long rush of 57 yards, while also completing 15-of-25 passes for 215 yards and a career-high three touchdowns. Beathard's efforts earned the junior signal caller Manning Quarterback of the Week and Co-Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors.

After each team posted a field goal in the first quarter, the Cyclones grabbed a 10-3 advantage with an 11-yard touchdown pass from QB Sam Richardson to Quenton Bundrage. The Hawkeyes evened the score two possessions later with a 14-yard WR Tevaun Smith scoring reception to culminate a 93-yard drive.

Iowa State took a 17-10 lead into halftime after a 29-yard scoring reception by Jauan Wesley.

The Hawkeyes controlled the second half, scoring three touchdowns and allowing Iowa State only 66 total yards on 31 plays.

Vandenberg recovered a TE Henry Krieger-Coble fumble on Iowa State's 3-yard line and crossed the goal line to tie the game in the third period. Riley McCarron then scored the game-winning TD, the first score of his career, on a 25-yard pass from Beathard in the back corner of the end zone with 2:14 remaining in the contest. Canzeri tallied Iowa's final score on an 8-yard scamper following Desmond King's first interception of the season.

Iowa's defense collected six tackles for loss, including four sacks by four different players. The Hawkeyes limited the Cyclones to 63 yards rushing on 27 attempts (2.3 avg.). DE Nate Meier and LB Josey Jewell each registered seven tackles. In addition to the interception, King had five tackles.

Iowa's DE Drew Ott and RB LeShun Daniels left the game in the first and second quarters, respectively, and did not return due to injury.

### GAME RECAP

Marshall Koehn drilled a 57-yard field goal as time expired to lift Iowa to a 27-24 triumph over Pittsburgh in Kinnick Stadium. The 57-yard field goal is the second longest in school history and tied a Kinnick Stadium record.

Koehn's kick marked the first time the Hawkeyes won a game with a field goal as time expired since Rob Houghtlin made a 41-yard game-winning kick in the 1986 Holiday Bowl to beat San Diego State, 39-38.

The victory marked the Hawkeyes' first 3-0 start in six seasons (2009).

C.J. Beathard improved to 4-0 as Iowa's starting quarterback after posting career bests in completions (27), pass attempts (40), and passing yards (258). He also rushed for a 9-yard score in the second quarter.

With Iowa leading 10-0 after a Koehn 43-yard field goal and Beathard's score, Pittsburgh cut the deficit to 10-7 after Scott Orndorff caught a 15-yard scoring reception one play after an Iowa turnover. Iowa extended its advantage to 17-7 with 44 seconds remaining before halftime with a Jordan Canzeri 4-yard run -- his first of two scores of the night.

The visitors evened the score with 10 special-teams points in the third period, via a Chris Blewitt 48-yard field goal and a 28-yard return by Pat Amara following a blocked punt.

Canzeri (1-yard run) and Pittsburgh's Tyler Boyd (8-yard reception) exchanged touchdowns in the fourth period before Koehn's heroics. The winning field goal was set up after the Hawkeyes drove 31 yards in the final 52 seconds after the Panthers had tied the score. It marked the second straight week that Beathard engineered a fourth quarter game-winning drive.

WR Matt VandeBerg (45 yards) and Canzeri (30 yards) each caught seven balls, while Canzeri also rushed for a game-high 49 yards on 12 carries.

Defensively, CB Desmond King had a career-best two interceptions, both in the first quarter, to go along with eight tackles. One of King's thefts came in the end zone to thwart a Panther scoring threat. LB Cole Fisher (12) and DB Jordan Lomax (11) posted double-digit tackles.

Koehn's two field goals, along with his first career punt of 64-yards, earned the senior placekicker Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honors.
