GAME #11 STORYLINES

- Saturday is the second straight meeting between Iowa and Rutgers where both teams are ranked in the AP Top 25 when playing each other.
- Saturday is Iowa's first visit to Piscataway, New Jersey, since its last-second victory on Feb. 16, 2019. Joe Wieskamp made his first 3-pointer of the game on a banked 3-pointer with 0.2 seconds left to propel the visiting Hawkeyes to a 71-69 win. Iowa led the Scarlet Knights by two points (68-66) in the closing seconds before Geo Baker rattled home a 3-pointer with 3.3 seconds left to give Rutgers a one-point lead (69-68) before Wieskamp's heroics.
- Luka Garza finished Tuesday's game versus Northwestern with 18 points, halting his streak of scoring 20+ points at 18 straight Big Ten games, dating back to last season. His 18-game streak is the longest by any player against a Big Ten team in over three decades.
- Freshman forward Keegan Murray is the only bench player in the country to record at least 50 points, 30 rebounds, 10 blocks, and 10 steals this season.
- Joe Wieskamp is 25 points from becoming the 50th Hawkeye to score 1,000 career points.
- Iowa has two of the top four active scorers in the Big Ten: Luka Garza is first with 1,836 points, while Jordan Bohannon is fourth with 1,396 points.
- Luka Garza scored his 1,000th conference point on at Minnesota (Dec. 25). Garza joins Roy Marble, Ronnie Lester, and Greg Stokes as the only Hawkeyes to reach the milestone. Garza has tallied 72 points in three Big Ten contests this season; 496 in 20 games in 2019-20; 243 in 19 contests in 2018-19; and 223 in 18 games in 2017-18.
- Iowa, who has led the Big Ten in scoring each of the last two seasons, is the highest scoring offense in the country, averaging 94.3 points per game.
- Iowa leads the Big Ten in scoring offense (94.3), rebounding (42.3), assists per game (21.5), turnover margin (+5.6), 3-pointers made per game (10.7), and assist-to-turnover ratio (2.3).
- Luka Garza is 24 points from passing Aaron White for second and 281 points from Iowa's all-time leading scorer Roy Marble.
- Luka Garza ranks first in the country in points per game (27.7 ppg). He has scored 384 points against AP Top 25 teams, the most of any player since the start of the 2019-20 season.
- Jack Nunge has been Iowa's biggest producer off the bench, averaging 7.6 points and 5.4 rebounds per outing.
- Iowa has made 10+ 3-pointers in eight of ten games. The Hawkeyes have four players who have made 18+ triples: Luka Garza, CJ Fredrick, Jordan Bohannon, and Joe Wieskamp.
- Luka Garza (27.7) and Joe Wieskamp (15.2) combined to average 42.9 points, which is 46.8 percent of Iowa's offensive production through nine games.
- Iowa has made more free throws (182) than its opponents have attempted (153).

No. 10 Iowa (8-2, 2-1) will play at No. 14 Rutgers (7-1, 3-1) on Saturday. Tipoff is scheduled for 1:05 p.m. (CT) at Piscataway, New Jersey.

Saturday will be Iowa's second straight game against a ranked opponent.

ON THE AIR

Radio: Iowa games are broadcast on the Hawkeye Radio Network. Gary Dolphin handles the play-by-play, along with color commentator Bob Hansen. The network includes more than 40 stations that blanket the state of Iowa and include portions of Illinois, Nebraska, Minnesota, Missouri and Wisconsin. The Hawkeye Radio Network coverage includes a 60-minute pregame show.

TV: Saturday's game will be televised nationally on ESPN2. Jason Benetti and Dan Dakich will call the action.

HAWKEYES TOP NORTHWESTERN, 87-72

No. 10 Iowa handed 19th-ranked Northwestern its first conference defeat of the season, 87-72, Tuesday evening at Carver-Hawkeye Arena in Iowa City.

- The win was Iowa's eighth straight over a ranked opponent at home, dating back to last season. That is the longest such streak in program history during the AP Poll Era (since 1948-49).
- Tuesday marked the first time in the 180-game series history that Iowa and Northwestern played with both teams ranked in the AP Top 25.
- Jordan Bohannon equaled a season high with 24 points (North Carolina), bolstered by 6-of-9 shooting from 3-point territory. His six triples were one shy of a season best.
- All-American Luka Garza tallied 18 points, snapping his streak of scoring 20+ points at 18 straight Big Ten games, dating back to last season. His 18-game streak is the longest by any player against Big Ten competition in over three decades.
- Both CJ Fredrick (Iowa) and Pete Nance (Northwestern) scored 17 first-half points.
- Northwestern was led by Pete Nance and Chase Audige, who scored 21 points and 14 points, respectively. Iowa held the Wildcats' second-leading scorer, Boo Buie, to only two points on 1-of-8 shooting from the field. Buie did record a game-high eight assists.

VALUING THE BASKETBALL

Iowa's three starting guards rank in the top eight in the Big Ten in assist-to-turnover ratio. CJ Fredrick ranks first with a 6.75 ratio (27 assists, 4 turnovers), followed by Connor McCaffery in second with a 4.5 ratio (45 assists, 10 turnovers) and Jordan Bohannon fourth with a 3.14 ratio (44 assists, 14 turnovers).

HEAD COACH FRAN McCAFFERY

Fran McCaffery, who is signed through the 2024 season, is in his 11th season as the head basketball coach at the University of Iowa and his 25th year overall as a college head coach. McCaffery has reached the 20-win plateau nine of the last 13 seasons, including four of the last six years.

McCaffery spent five seasons (2005-10) as the head coach at Siena, six years at UNC-Greensboro (1999-2005) and three seasons at Lehigh (1985-88) before joining the Hawkeyes.

McCaffery has over three decades of Division I coaching experience. He concluded his 38th season as a collegiate coach in 2020, which includes 24 years as a head coach and 14 as an assistant. McCaffery is one of 14 coaches to lead at least four different Division I teams to the NCAA Tournament.

McCaffery, 61, holds a career mark of 453-322 (.584) and guided his teams to 12 postseason appearances (nine NCAA & four NIT). Iowa likely would have competed in another NCAA Tournament in 2020, if not for the NCAA canceling the postseason due to COVID-19. He is 202-145 (.582) at Iowa; the second winningest coach in program history. McCaffery led Iowa to wins in three of the last five NCAA Tournaments (2015, 2016, and 2019).

Since taking over the Iowa program in 2010, Iowa has earned seven postseason tournament berths (4 NCAA, 3 NIT). McCaffery coached Iowa to 25 victories in 2013, equaling the second-most win total in program history. McCaffery has guided five different first team honorees over the last seven years, including the 2020 National and Big Ten Player of the Year, Luka Garza.

McCaffery has posted upper division finishes in seven of the last eight seasons at Iowa and 19 of 24 seasons as a head coach. He has posted 20 wins or more 10 of the last 14 seasons, including six of the last eight years at Iowa (2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2019, and 2020). Iowa's 163 victories between 2013-19 are the most over an eight-year span at Iowa since 1987-94.

McCaffery and the Hawkeyes boast a 110-29 (.791) home record the last eight seasons, which includes a school-record 18 wins in 2014 and 13 consecutive victories in 2019-20.

McCaffery's five years at Siena were the best in its 70-year history. He led the Saints on an incredible run that ended with three straight Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference championships and NCAA Tournament appearances.

McCaffery's Saints owned a 112-51 (.687) record in his five years with the program. He guided the Saints to four consecutive 20-win seasons. McCaffery's achievements earned the head coach Siena Hall of Fame recognition in 2017.

The 2009 MAAC Coach of the Year and 2010 District I Coach of the Year is the third winningest coach, by percentage, in league history (.687). He is the only coach to guide a MAAC program to two NCAA Tournament wins. McCaffery led his 2008 and 2009 teams to first round NCAA Tournament victories over Vanderbilt and Ohio State, respectively.

In his final two seasons at Siena, he coached the Saints to back-to-back 27-win campaigns and boasted a combined 39-3 (.929) record against MAAC opponents, which included MAAC Tournament contests.

McCaffery began his coaching career as an assistant at Penn (1982-83) and Lehigh (1983-85). After three seasons as head coach at Lehigh, he spent 11 seasons as an assistant at Notre Dame (1988-99).

McCaffery played basketball at Wake Forest his freshman year (1977-78) and then concluded his collegiate playing career at Penn his final three seasons (1979-82).

He earned his B.S. degree in Economics from The Wharton School (Penn) in 1982. McCaffery also earned a Master of Education from Lehigh in 1985.

LUKA GARZA CONTINUES WHERE HE LEFT OFF

- Luka Garza has passed nine former players (Dean Oliver, Adam Haluska, Jess Settles, Matt Gatens, Ronnie Lester, Devyn Marble, B.J. Armstrong, Greg Stokes, and Acie Earl) on Iowa's all-time scoring list in only nine games played so far this year. Only two players in program history have scored more points than Garza (Roy Marble, Aaron White).
- Reached the 30-point plateau five times this season, the most by any player nationally. Garza has topped 30 points ten career times, tying Fred Brown for second most in program history trailing only John Johnson (13).
- Twice has been named Big Ten Player of the Week this season (Nov. 30 and Dec. 14). Garza was named Co-Big Ten Player of the Week after averaging 24.3 points, 8.3 rebounds, and 1.7 blocks in wins over No. 16 North Carolina, Iowa State, and Northern Illinois. Garza was named Big Ten Player of the Week after averaging 33.5 points, 9.5 rebounds, and 3.0 blocks in victories over N.C. Central and Southern.
- Garza scored 44 points at Michigan (Dec. 7, 2019) and 41 points versus Southern University (Nov. 27, 2020). He is one of two players in program history to score 40 points or more in two games in a career (John Johnson, 49 and 46).
- Tallied 102 points in three games; that is the most points by any Division I player over his first 3 games of a season since Davidson's Stephen Curry had 106 in 2008-09.
- Garza is the only Division I player in the last 25 years to score 100+ points on 75.0 percent shooting over any 3-game span. The last NBA player to accomplish that over a 3-game span was Shaquille O'Neal in January, 1996.
- Torched Southern University for 41 points, nine rebounds, and three blocks. Garza netted 36 first-half points, which is believed to be the most points scored by a Hawkeye in a half in program history. In the first half, Garza made all 12 field-goal attempts and was 10-of-12 from the free throw line.
- His 41 points are the most points scored by a Hawkeye in a single-game in Carver-Hawkeye Arena history (1983), besting 36 scored by Adam Haluska (2006) and Rob Griffin (2000). The arena record is 45 points by Brian Quinnett of Washington State in a neutral site contest contested against Loyola Marymount (1986).
- Finished the Southern University contest with a .933 field goal percentage (14-of-15), including a perfect 1.000 (3-of-3) from 3-point range, which is the best single-game mark by a Big Ten player since 1984 (Minnesota's Tommy Davis, 15-of-16, at Indiana).
- Recorded his fifth double-double of the season and 25th of his career in Iowa's last outing at Minnesota. Garza scored a game-high 32 points and snagged a season-best 17 rebounds.
- Posted a double-double (16 points and 14 rebounds) to go along with a season-high four blocks against No. 16 North Carolina.

IN THE RANKINGS

- The Hawkeyes were ranked No. 3 in the AP Poll three of the first four weeks of the season. The last time Iowa was ranked as high as third nationally was Jan. 25, 2016.
- Iowa's No. 5 preseason ranking is its highest preseason position in 65 years (No. 4 in the 1955-56 preseason poll). This marks the eighth time in program history that Iowa is ranked in the AP Preseason Top 10: No. 4 in 1954-55, No. 4 in 1955-56, No. 9 in 1981-82, No. 7 in 1983-84, No. 7 in 1988-89, No. 8 in 1995-96, and No. 9 in 2001-02. Iowa last started a season ranked in the AP Poll 15 seasons ago (No. 20 in 2005-06).
- Saturday's game against Gonzaga was just the second time in program history that Iowa played in a contest pitting No. 1 against No. 3.
- Nine of the 14 Big Ten teams are ranked in this week's AP Top 25, led by No. 6 Wisconsin. Iowa is No. 10, followed by No. 14 Rutgers, No. 15 Illinois, No. 16 Michigan, No. 17 Michigan State, No. 19 Northwestern, No. 21 Minnesota, and No. 25 Ohio State.

ALL-TIME SERIES RECORDS

Saturday will be the 10th meeting between Iowa and Rutgers. The Hawkeyes are 7-2 against the Scarlet Knights, including a 3-1 record in Piscataway, New Jersey.

Iowa recorded a 71-69 win over Rutgers in its last visit to Piscataway, New Jersey on Feb. 16, 2019. Freshman Joe Wieskamp made his first 3-pointer of the game on a banked 3-pointer with 0.2 seconds left.



SCOUTING RUTGERS

- No. 14 Rutgers enters Saturday's contest against the Hawkeyes with a 7-1 overall record, including a 3-1 mark in Big Ten play. The Scarlet Knights are a perfect 6-0 in home games, winning their last two home games by a combined eight points over Purdue and nationally-ranked Illinois.
- Rutgers made 50 percent of its field goal attempts and sank four more 3-pointers than Purdue in an 81-76 victory Tuesday at the Rutgers Athletic Center. Montez Mathias scored a game-high 25 points, draining all five 3-point attempts. Geo Baker registered 19 points and four assists in the winning effort.
- Leading scorer Ron Harper, Jr. (23.4 ppg) did not play in the Scarlet Knights' last game (ankle). Cliff Omoruyi (5.3 ppg and 5.8 rpg) was also sidelined for the second straight game (knee).
- Rutgers ranks second in the Big Ten in 3-point field goal percentage defense (.300), third in field goal percentage (.498), blocked shots (5.1), steals (7.4), and last in free throw percentage (.624).
- Rutgers is in the middle of a stretch of playing four of five games against a ranked opponent.
- Three Scarlet Knights average double figures in scoring: Ron Harper Jr. (23.4), Montez Mathias (15.6), and Jacob Young (15.5). Young also ranks first in the Big Ten in steals per game (2.4) and third in assists per game (5.4). Myles Johnson ranks second in the league in blocked shots (2.25) and fourth in rebounding (8.5).
- Steve Pikiell is in his 16th season as a head coach (262-222, .541) and his fifth season at Rutgers (71-66, .518).

LAST MEETING VERSUS RUTGERS

Iowa outscored Rutgers 9-3 over the final 2:16 to record an 85-80 win over No. 24 Rutgers on Jan. 22, 2020, in Iowa City in the only regular season meeting between the two teams.

- Luka Garza posted team bests in scoring (28) and rebounds (13). The junior center also blocked four shots, was credited with two steals, and made two 3-pointers.
- Iowa's 85 points were the most Rutgers allowed last season.
- Joe Wieskamp drained his 100th 3-pointer of his career with 1:27 remaining in the second half to increase Iowa's lead from one to four points and never looked back.
- Iowa was the first Rutgers opponent to shoot better than 50 percent from the field in 2019-20.
- Rutgers was led by Ron Harper Jr., who netted a game and career-high 29 points. He also snagged a team-best nine rebounds. Akwasi Yeboah tallied 17 points, while Myles Johnson contributed 10 points and a game-best three steals.

IOWA HAD 4 BIG TEN STAT CHAMPIONS IN 2019-20

The Hawkeyes had four different players lead the conference in four major statistical categories. Luka Garza was first in points per game (23.9), Joe Wieskamp led all players in free throw accuracy (.856), CJ Fredrick was tops in 3-point field goal percentage (.461), while Connor McCaffery led the league and nation in assist-to-turnover ratio (4.6).

All four return in 2020-21, along with redshirt senior Jordan Bohannon, who is Iowa's all-time 3-point leader.

FAMILY AFFAIR

Redshirt junior Connor McCaffery and redshirt freshman Patrick McCaffery are one of 16 father/coach and son/player duos in Division I in 2020-21 (Boise State, Connecticut, Detroit Mercy, Illinois, Liberty, Memphis, Michigan State, USC Upstate, Southern, Syracuse, Texas Southern, Utah, Western Illinois, Western Kentucky, and Wright State). Of the 16 schools, the McCaffery's are the only program with a father/coach and two sons on the roster.

GARZA RETURNS FOR SENIOR SEASON

All-American Luka Garza has been named to every major pre-season All-America list, including headlining the AP Preseason All-America Team. Garza, who is the first Iowa men's basketball player named to a preseason AP All-American, was the lone unanimous selection, receiving all 64 votes. EMOTIONAL YEAR FOR NUNGE

It has been a difficult 12 months for forward Jack Nunge. On Nov. 24, 2019, Nunge tore his ACL (right knee) in the fifth game of the 2019-20 season after sitting out the previous season (redshirt). Nearly 12 months to the day later, Nunge's father (Dr. Mark Nunge) passed away unexpectedly at the age of 53 on Nov. 28, 2020.

Nunge did not play in Iowa's first two games against N.C. Central and Southern University as the redshirt sophomore was with family back home in Indiana. Nunge returned to Iowa City on Dec. 1, and played in his first game in over a year, tying a career high with 18 points and snagging five rebounds versus Western Illinois (Dec. 3).

Nunge is Iowa's leading scorer (7.6) and rebounder (5.4) off the bench.

HEALTHY CJ FREDRICK PAYING DIVIDENDS

Last season, CJ Fredrick missed six full games and two second halves due to different injuries (quad, ankle, stress reaction in foot). After undergoing foot surgery this past July, Fredrick entered the 2020-21 season fully healthy.

Fredrick ranks first on the team in 3-point percentage (.550, 22-of-40), second in 3-pointers made (22) and leads the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio (6.75). He ranks third on the squad in scoring (11.3).

Fredrick has been fantastic in Iowa's last two outings, scoring 23 points at Minnesota and netting 19 versus Northwestern. The Cincinnati native sank a combined 8-of-12 (.667) from long distance in those two contests.

In his redshirt freshman season in 2019-20, Fredrick was one of only three players nationally -- and only player from a major conference dating back to 1993 -- with 65+ assists, 32 or fewer turnovers, and shoot 46%+ from 3-point range.

Fredrick was named to the All-Big Ten Freshman Team, Big Ten Freshman of the Week (Jan. 20, 2020), and earned all-tournament honors at the Las Vegas Invitational.

LUKA GARZA HAD HISTORIC SEASON

Luka Garza had a historic season in 2019-20, earning National Player of the Year honors by six major news outlets, recognized as the Big Ten and USBWA District VI Player of the Year, Pete Newell Big Man of the Year and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year, as well as being honored as a unanimous consensus first-team All-American.

The six news outlets to name Garza National Player of the Year include: *Sporting News*, *Basketball Times*, *Stadium*, *Bleacher Report*, FOX, and ESPN. He is the first Iowa men's basketball player to earn national player of the year distinction. Garza was also a unanimous consensus first-team All-America selection. He joins former Hawkeyes Murray Wier (1948) and Charles Darling (1952) as the program's only consensus first team All-Americans. Garza is also the first Hawkeye to win the Abdul-Jabbar and Newell national awards.

Garza (740 points and 305 rebounds) is one of three Big Ten players to ever total 740+ points and 300+ rebounds in a single-season (Purdue's Glenn Robinson in 1994 and Purdue's Joe Barry Carroll in 1979). He ranked second nationally with 12 20-point/10-rebound performances, 20-point games (25); third in total field goals made (287) and points per 40 minutes played (29.8), fifth in scoring (23.9), 10th in 30-point games (5), 19th in double-doubles (15), and 34th in rebounding (9.8). Garza averaged 26.7 points, 11.1 rebounds, and 1.7 blocks in 12 games against AP ranked opponents in 2019-20, including recording 11 straight 20-point performances.

Iowa's Male Athlete of the Year, Garza finished the 20-game league schedule averaging 26.2 points per game, becoming the first player to average at least 26 points in Big Ten play since Purdue's Glenn Robinson in 1994 (31.1 ppg). Garza scored a school-record 740 points, breaking the program's 50-year old record previously set by John Johnson in 1970.

Garza is the only Big Ten player to register seven 25-point/10-rebound performances in the same season in more than 17 years.

JORDAN BOHANNON RETURNS FOR REDSHIRT SENIOR SEASON

Jordan Bohannon had surgery on his left hip last December after playing in 10 games in 2019-20. The native of Marion, Iowa, had the same procedure done on his right hip in May, 2019. He played in 10 games prior to his latest procedure, averaging 8.8 points and 3.3 assists per game.

Bohannon is tied with Wisconsin's D'Mitrik Trice for most games played among active Division I players with 122. Bohannon is the only player other than Luka Garza to lead the Hawkeyes in game scoring this season, scoring a team-best 24 points in wins over No. 16 North Carolina and No. 19 Northwestern.

Bohannon has made a school-record 307 3-pointers and is 67 triples from tying the all-time Big Ten record (374, Jon Diebler). His 307 triples are the most of any active player from a Power 5 conference and rank ninth best in Big Ten history.

A third-team All-Big Ten performer in 2019, Bohannon was credited with a team-best 118 assists, becoming just the seventh Hawkeye to register three 100-assist seasons.

Bohannon, who ranks fifth in Iowa career assists, is one of seven Hawkeyes to post three 100-assist seasons (Dean Oliver, Jeff Horner, B.J. Armstrong, Andre Woolridge, Mike Gesell, Devyn Marble).



HAWKEYE FASTBREAKS

- Iowa is 102-24 when scoring 80 points or more, the last 11 seasons. The Hawkeyes are 81-2 when holding opponents to fewer than 61 points, the last 10 years.
- The Hawkeyes opened their season with 93+ points in each of their first six games for the first time in program history.
- Iowa has won 21 of its last 22 games inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena, dating back to last season.
- Iowa's 53-point win over Northern Illinois (106-53) tied the 18th largest margin of victory in program history.
- Iowa beat Northern Illinois by 53 points, tying the 18th largest margin of victory in program history.
- The Hawkeyes have won 70 of its last 75 nonconference home games, dating back to 2012.
- Iowa is one of six teams from last year's final AP Top 25 that returns their leading scorer; the other five teams include Baylor, Illinois, Houston, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.
- Iowa's 105 points and 28-point victory on Dec. 11, are the most points scored and the largest margin of victory, respectively, in the 74-game series history with Iowa State.
- Iowa returns a large percentage of its production: scoring (81%), rebounding (76%), assists (77%), steals (83%), and blocks (67%). Iowa is one of eight schools from Power 5 conferences to have at least 65 percent of its production return from the previous season.
- The Hawkeyes sank 17 3-pointers against the Tar Heels. The 17 triples were two shy of a school record (19 against Savannah State on Dec. 22, 2018). Additionally, the 17 3-pointers tie for the third most ever against North Carolina.
- Assistant Coach Billy Taylor has been named to the class of 2021 for the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.
- Luka Garza scored 20+ points in 19 straight games (Jan. 10-Dec. 3, 2020), including 16 straight against Big Ten opponents, breaking the school's 49-year old record. The 16-game streak against Big Ten opponents is the longest streak since Ohio State's Dennis Hopson accomplished the feat in 1987. Garza scored 20+ points in 19-of-20 Big Ten games in 2019-20.
- Jordan Bohannon joined Bob Hansen, Kevin Boyle, and Mark Gannon as the only Hawkeyes to register four victories over the Cyclones in their career.
- Head Coach Fran McCaffery has coached a first-team All-Big Ten honoree five of the last seven seasons, the most over a seven-year span since 1956-62. Garza joins Devyn Marble (2014), Aaron White (2015), Jarrod Uthoff (2016), and Peter Jok (2017) as first team selections.
- As a result of Iowa's win over No. 16 North Carolina, the Hawkeyes have won six of their last eight ACC/Big Ten Challenge games and four straight Challenge home games.
- Fran McCaffery has guided Iowa to 20 wins or more in six of the last eight seasons. He has led Iowa to Big Ten upper division finishes seven of the last eight years. Only Michigan State (8) has more first division finishes than Iowa (7) and Wisconsin (7) since the 2013 season.
- If not for the COVID-19 global pandemic, Iowa would have competed in its 27th NCAA Tournament in 2020, including its fifth appearance in seven seasons.
- The Hawkeyes have won 10 or more Big Ten games five of the last six seasons.
- Iowa has qualified for four NCAA tournaments over the last six completed seasons (2014, 2015, 2016, 2019) and seven post-season tournaments over the last eight completed seasons (4 NCAA; 3 NIT).

RAINING THREES

Three Hawkeyes sank five or more 3-pointers in Iowa's victory over No. 16 North Carolina: Jordan Bohannon (7), CJ Fredrick (5), and Joe Wieskamp (5). It was the first time in UNC history that three opponent players made five or more triples in a game. It is also the only time in the last 25 years that three teammates (on any team) have made 5+ threes apiece in regulation against an AP Top 25 opponent.

5 NEWCOMERS TO JOIN ROSTER IN 2020-21

The Iowa basketball program welcome five freshmen to the 2020-21 roster: Keegan Murray, Kris Murray, Josh Ogundele, Tony Perkins, and Ahron Ulis.

Perkins was one of 13 seniors named to the 2020 Indiana All-Star Team. As a senior, Perkins averaged 18.6 points, 5.6 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.8 steals leading Lawrence North to a 25-2 record. He shot 58 percent from the field and 35 percent from 3-point range.

Ulis was the ESCC Player of the Year and named to the AP All-State Class 4A First Team. The three-year starter finished with over 1,500 points, trailing only his brother, Tyler, in the school's record book.

3 HAWKEYES GRANTED MEDICAL HARDSHIP WAIVERS

Forwards Jack Nunge and Patrick McCaffery, and guard Jordan Bohannon were each granted medical hardship waivers in 2019-20.

Nunge suffered a season-ending torn anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) of his right knee in November. Bohannon had season-ending hip surgery in December, while McCaffery was dealing with residual health and wellness issues related to his thyroid.

COOL HAND LUKA

Last season, Luka Garza became the sixth Hawkeye to average 22+ points per game and first in 49 years since Fred Brown averaged 27.6 points per game in 1971. He became the fourth Big Ten player since 1993 to average at least 23 points per game (Glenn Robinson, Shawn Respert, and Carsen Edwards).

Garza finished the 20-game conference schedule averaging 26.2 points per game to become Iowa's first scoring leader in Big Ten games only since Adam Haluska (21.3 ppg) in 2007. Garza's 26.2 Big Ten scoring average is the highest by a true center since Minnesota's Tom Kondla (28.3 ppg) in 1967.

Garza tallied 38 points at Indiana (Feb. 13, 2020). The 38 points were two points shy of matching the Assembly Hall single-game record by an opponent. Garza had the two highest single-game point totals in the Big Ten in 2019-20: 44 at Michigan & 38 at Indiana. He amassed 77 points in two games against Michigan, the most points by any Big Ten player versus a single opponent in regular season conference play over the last 20 seasons.

Garza, who is 12th on Iowa's career scoring chart with 1,559 points, is the fourth Hawkeye over the last four decades to average better than 20 points per game. He totaled 287 field goals and 530 field goal attempts; two field goals from John Johnson's record of 289 in 1970 and five attempts from tying Fred Brown's record of 535 in 1971.

He is one of six Hawkeyes in school history with 1,550 points and 650 rebounds and is the only Iowa player to post those numbers through his junior season. Garza joined Jarrod Uthoff (2015 & 2016) as the only players in program history to total 50+ blocks and 35+ 3-pointers in a season.

Garza is also one of only five Big Ten players since the 2011 season to post multiple 30-point/10-rebounds games in the same season.

Garza scored 25 points or more 13 times in 2019-20 (fifth nationally). He controlled 10 rebounds or more in 14 games. He snagged a career-best 18 boards twice in 2019-20.

20-YEAR ANNIVERSARY

This season is the 20-year anniversary of Iowa's first Big Ten Tournament championship. The Hawkeyes won four games in four days, knocking off Northwestern (72-55), Ohio State (75-66), Penn State (94-74), and Indiana (63-61). Reggie Evans was voted the Most Outstanding Player of the tournament.

RECENT GRADUATES PLAYING PROFESSIONAL BASKETBALL

A number of recent Iowa basketball graduates are playing professionally: Jarrod Uthoff (NBA Washington Wizards), Devyn Marble (Kazakhstan), Tyler Cook (NBA Denver Nuggets), Adam Woodbury (NBA G League: Grand Rapids Drive), Anthony Clemmons (Bosnia), Gabriel Olaseni (Turkey), Peter Jok (Spain), and Aaron White (Greece).

IOWA VS. RANKED TEAMS

Iowa is 2-1 against ranked teams. The Hawkeyes beat No. 16 North Carolina (93-80) and No. 19 Northwestern (87-72) in Iowa City, but fell to No. 1 Gonzaga (99-88) in Sioux Falls, South Dakota.

The Hawkeyes have won seven straight home games against AP ranked opponents. That's the longest such streak in program history during the AP Poll era (since 1948-49).

Iowa won seven contests against ranked opponents last season, the most by any team nationally and the most by a Hawkeye team in a single-season since 2006 (8).

McCAFFERY CLIMBING WINS CHART

Fran McCaffery (91) is one Big Ten win from tying Lute Olson (92) for second place on Iowa's conference wins chart. Tom Davis is Iowa's all-time winningest coach with 125 Big Ten victories.

McCaffery and the Iowa Hawkeyes have reached the 20-win plateau six of the last eight seasons. McCaffery joins Lute Olson (6) and Tom Davis (10) as the only Iowa head coaches to win 20 or more games in at least five seasons.

McCaffery has taken Iowa to the NCAA Tournament four times, and likely a fifth time last March if not for the postseason cancellation due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Among Iowa's head basketball coaches, McCaffery ranks third in tournament appearances behind Davis (9) and Olson (5). Davis is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, while McCaffery is second.

COACHING EXPERIENCE

Fran McCaffery has the most experienced coaching staffs in the country. The Iowa men's basketball staff has 73 years of combined collegiate head coaching experience and more than 125 years of collegiate coaching under their belts.

Iowa is one of two programs nationwide who have four current/former Division I head coaches on their active coaching staffs (Pitt).

MEN'S BASKETBALL REPRESENTED ON BIG TEN COALITION

Iowa has played 2,846 games since beginning basketball in 1902. Iowa's overall record is 1,676-1,170 (.589). Iowa's 1,676 wins are 38th most among Division I programs. That includes a 1,074-372 (.742) record in home games, a 596-797 (.428) record in contests away from Iowa City, a 788-797 (.497) mark in Big Ten games and a 479-147 (.765) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.
