THIS WEEK

The University of Iowa soccer team will host Michigan on March 4 in its home opener. The game will be held at the TBK Sports Complex in Bettendorf, Iowa, beginning at noon (CT). The Hawkeyes also host Northwestern in Bettendorf on March 8 at 11 a.m. Due to the coronavirus pandemic, general admission fans will not be permitted to attend the contests.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Head coach Dave Dilanni is in his seventh season at the helm of the soccer program. In 2019, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to a 15-5-1 overall record and an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament for the second time in program history.
- The Hawkeyes have out-shot each of their first three opponents, but the team is still looking for its first goal of the 2021 campaign.
- Iowa returns six starters from a team that won a school-record 15 games in 2019. The Hawkeyes replace a senior class that accounted for 25 goals and included the all-time wins leader Claire Graves in goal.
- Three Hawkeyes -- Hailey Rydberg, Sara Wheaton, and Samantha Cary -- were named to the Big Ten Preseason Honors List. Iowa was picked to finish sixth of 14 teams in the preseason coaches' poll.
- Junior Samantha Tawharu and sophomore Gianna Gourley return as the team's top two goal scorers with five apiece. Tawharu scored five goals on just 19 shots and she finished with 15 points -- one off the team lead.
- The Hawkeyes have eight newcomers -- all freshman -- to round out the 28-player roster.





Dave Dilanni is entering his seventh season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 282-72-26 career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history. In six seasons at Iowa, Dilanni has 61-52-8 record.

Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to one of the best seasons in program history in 2019. Iowa tied a school record, winning its first nine games of the season, which included road wins at No. 14 NC State and Notre Dame. It resulted in the Hawkeyes achieving the highest ranking — No. 19 — in program history.

Iowa finished with 15 wins to tie the single-season record and it earned an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament for the second time in program history. The Hawkeyes won seven games in Big Ten play to tie a program record and the fifth place finish was tied for the second-highest finish in school history. Iowa also finished with a school-record nine victories at the Iowa Soccer Complex.

The Hawkeyes won with a potent offense and a stout defense. Iowa finished with 45 goals in 2019 with an NCAA-best 16 different goal scorers. The team ranked second in the Big Ten and 26th nationally in scoring, while posting eight shutouts. Senior Claire Graves finished had 14 wins in 2019 — the second-most in school history — and finished with a school record 37 victories in four years.

At season's end, three Hawkeyes — Natalie Winters, Devin Burns, and Gianna Gourley — earned All-Big Ten recognition. Winters became the first player to earn all-league honors all four seasons and she also garnered all-region honors for a second straight season.

- Juniors Hailey Rydberg and Riley Whitaker were voted team captains for the 2021 spring season.
- The Hawkeyes will play 11 games over a seven-week period before competing in a Big Ten Wildcard Weekend from April 8-11. The semifinals of the Big Ten Tournament will be held April 15, but it will include only four teams.

LAST GAME

Iowa fell 2-0 at Indiana at Bill Armstrong Stadium in Bloomington, Indiana. The Hawkeyes were propelled to victory by two goals from Avery Forbes. Redshirt sophomore goalkeeper Monica Wilhelm made three saves in the span of 40 seconds in the second half, but it wasn't enough for the Hawkeyes to pull out a win.

90 TRACKER

Junior Sara Wheaton is the only Hawkeye position player to have reached 90 minutes in each of Iowa's three games this season. Other Hawkeyes to play all 90 minutes include: Aleisha Ganief (2), Samantha Cary (1), and Rielee Fetty (1).

DEFENSIVE DEFENDERS

The Hawkeyes most experienced position on the roster is the defender position where juniors Sara Wheaton and sophomore Sam Cary started every game in 2019. The duo was instrumental in Iowa allowing just 18 goals in 21 games and posting six shutouts.

FRESH HAWKEYES

A year after having one of the most veteran teams in the nation, the Hawkeyes have one of the youngest. Iowa has only one senior on the 2021 spring roster in Diane Senkowski. Eighteen of the 28 players on the roster are underclassmen.

WHO'S IN GOAL

For the first time in four seasons, Iowa has a starter not named Claire Graves in goal. Redshirt sophomore Monica Wilhelm has helmed the goal in each of Iowa's first three games.

2021 HOME GAMES "AWAY" FROM HOME

The Hawkeyes will play "home" games away from Iowa City for at least the early portion of the 2021 season. Iowa will play its first two home games this week at the TBK Banks Sports Complex in Bettendorf on March 4 and March 8. The Hawkeyes also could also play games in Cedar Rapids at Mount Mercy.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- The Hawkeyes have 28 players on the 2021 roster, which includes 10 freshmen/redshirt freshmen.
- Junior Samantha Tawharu and sophomore Gianna Gourley return after combining to start 16 games (eight apiece) during their first Hawkeye seasons. Junior Skylar Alward scored two goals in 18 games as a reserve as a sophomore
- The Hawkeye midfielder are anchored by junior Hailey Rydberg. The St. Charles, Illinois, native started 11 games as a sophomore and has 24 career starts. Junior Josie Durr has three career goals in 33 career games (11 starts).
- Along with sophomore Monica Wilhelm, the Hawkeyes have a total of three underclassmen at the goalkeeper position. Redshirt freshman Sabrina Shaw and freshman



Macy Enneking have no collegiate experience.

- The Hawkeyes welcome eight newcomers to the mix in 2021, including two players -- Enneking and Jayln Mosley -- who joined the program last January.
- Forward/defender Aleisha Ganief played on the Canadian National Team, joining Tawharu, who was a part of the New Zealand Youth National Team prior to becoming a Hawkeye.

NEW DIGS ON THE HORIZON

Construction is underway on the new soccer operations facility at the Iowa Soccer Complex. The \$4 million facility, which is expected to open in time for the 2021 fall season, will include a spacious locker room and lounge area, multi-purpose space, athletic training space, visiting team and official locker rooms, and a press box.

SCOUTING REPORT

- Michigan has started the season 1-1-1 and enters Thursday's game reeling from a 1-0 loss to Wisconsin. The Wolverines were picked to finish third in the conference by the Big Ten coaches.
- Northwestern is 2-1 in conference play thus far; another win would tie its 2019 total of three Big Ten wins. The Wildcats were picked to finish seventh in the Big Ten, one spot below Iowa.

SERIES HISTORY

- Michigan leads the series 17-5-3. The Hawkeyes have won two in a two in a row against the Maize and Blue and haven't dropped a game since 2016.
- Iowa is 7-14-2 against Northwestern. The Wildcats won the most recent meeting 2-1 in 2019.

UP NEXT

Iowa hosts Minnesota on March 14. A time and location will be dependent on weather.
