HAWKEYES | 1st & 10

- Iowa is ranked 25th in the preseason Associated Press poll and the team is receiving votes, coming in 26th in the preseason coaches' poll. The Hawkeyes have been in the preseason AP Top 25 in four of the past five seasons and 10 times in the Kirk Ferentz era (27 times in program history).
- The Hawkeyes return 14 starters (six offense, five defense, three specialists) for the 2023 season.
- Head coach Kirk Ferentz -- the dean of coaches in college football -- is two wins shy of the 200-win milestone in his coaching career. Ferentz will be the 24th Division I coach to reach the 200-win mark. Former Hawkeye head coach Hayden Fry had 236 career victories.
- Junior DB Cooper DeJean and senior punter Tory Taylor are preseason All-Americans by various outlets. Taylor is a first-team selection by Phil Steele, Athlon Sports, The Athletic, Associated Press and The Sporting News, while DeJean is a first-team selection by The Athletic, AP and The Sporting News and a second-team honoree by both Athlon and Phil Steele.
- DeJean is the preseason Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year. The Odebolt, Iowa, native had 75 tackles, five interceptions and three defensive touchdowns as a sophomore, setting the single season record. Former Hawkeye LB Jack Campbell was the preseason Big Ten DPOY in 2022.
- DeJean is rated as the 23rd ranked player in the nation by Pro Football Focus and No. 46 on ESPN.com's top 100 players. The defensive back is on the watch lists for the Bronko Nagurski Award (defensive player of the year), Jim Thorpe Award (defensive back), Paul Hornung Award (versatility) and Chuck Bednarik Award (most outstanding defensive player).
- The Hawkeyes rank seventh nationally with the most consecutive winning seasons amongst Power 5 programs. Iowa is one of six teams to win eight or more games each year since 2015 (excluding COVID).
- Iowa is one of five college football teams (Alabama, Clemson, Ohio State, Georgia) that have won at least eight games the last seven completed seasons while winning 75 percent of its games in the COVID year.
- Over the past five seasons, Iowa has the third-most wins in the Big Ten Conference. The Hawkeyes have 43 overall, trailing only Ohio State (55) and Michigan (46).
- The Hawkeyes have had six NFL first round picks in the last five years -- the seventh-most nationally in that span.
- Michigan transfer Cade McNamara will start his 17th career game when he takes the field for the Hawkeyes. For his career, McNamara has completed 63.1 percent of his passes for 3,181 yards and 21 touchdowns. He played in three games in 2022 before missing the remainder of the season because of a knee injury.
- The Hawkeyes have 218 interceptions since 2009 -- tied for the second most nationally (one behind Oregon). Iowa's 33 interception returns for a touchdown are third-most in the nation in that span.
- Iowa is 99-33-2 in season openers, including a 20-4 mark under head coach Kirk Ferentz. The Hawkeyes are 20-2 in season openers since 2001.
- Iowa's scoring defense has surrendered 18.86 points per game (in 178 games) since 2009 -- ranking third nationally. The unit's 4.81 yards per play total is third-best in the same span.





SERIES HISTORY

The Hawkeyes are 2-0 all-time against Utah State, winning the most recent meeting 48-7 in 2002. Iowa put up 70 points, winning 70-14 during the 1957 season.

- Iowa is 11-1-1 all-time against current members of the Mountain West Conference. It is the second straight year the Hawkeyes have faced a MWC foe; Iowa shutout Nevada, 27-0, last season in Iowa City.

AT THE TOP

Kirk Ferentz is entering his 25th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz has 115 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach, tied for the third most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history.

- Ferentz's 186 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference.

- Ferentz has 198 career victories, two wins shy of becoming the 24th coach in Division I history to reach the 200-win mark. Former Hawkeye head coach Hayden Fry finished his career with 236 victories.

STAFF CONSISTENCY

Iowa is one of just seven programs from across the country that has retained all 10 of its assistant coaches from the 2022 season. Five of the Hawkeye assistants are in at least their eighth season on the Iowa coaching staff -- the second-highest total nationally.

- Defensive coordinator Phil Parker and special teams coordinator LeVar Woods were named to the 247Sports All-Big Ten Coaches first team this summer. Woods' 95.80 score on the Coach Rating Index is second highest in the Big Ten. Parker also had the highest CRI amongst defensive back coaches (81.74).

- Defensive line coach Kelvin Bell and linebackers coach Seth Wallace were named to the 247Sports All-Big Ten Coaches second team.

ALUMS ON STAFF

The Hawkeyes have five University of Iowa alums on the coaching staff -- Brian Ferentz, Abdul Hodge, LeVar Woods, Kelvin Bell and Ladell Betts. The five alums are tied for the second most nationally (trailing only Air Force, 8).

GONE PORTALING

The Hawkeyes landed seven players from the transfer portal for the 2023 season, including four from Power 5 schools.

QB Cade McNamara (Michigan) – Passed for 2,576 yards and 15 touchdowns in leading the Wolverines to the 2021 Big Ten title. . . he missed a majority of 2022 because of injury.

TE Erick All (Michigan) – Honorable mention All-Big Ten in 2021. . . has 54 career receptions for 565 yards and two touchdowns. . . missed a majority of 2022 because of injury.

WR Seth Anderson (Charleston Southern) – Big South Offensive Freshman of the Year and Jerry Rice Freshman of the Year finalist. . . second-team All-Big South. . . had 42 receptions for 612 yards and seven touchdowns. . . son of former NFL WR Flipper Anderson.

LB Nick Jackson (Virginia) – Three-time All-ACC line-backer. . . Butkus Watch Lists. . . posted three straight 100+ tackle seasons. . . has 354 tackles, 20 TFL and 10.5 sacks. . . started 33 career games.

OL Rusty Feth (Miami (Ohio)) – Started 34 career games for Redhawks, including 25 straight over last two seasons at center. . . earned second-team All-MAC honors in 2022.

OL Dajion Parker (Saginaw Valley State) – Appeared in 21 games the last two seasons.

WR Kaleb Brown (Ohio State) – Had one catch for five yards (coincidentally against Iowa) as a true freshman. . . has the highest 247Sports rating coming out of high school for a recruit in Iowa history.

THE NEXT GREAT HAWKEYE TIGHT ENDS?

Junior Luke Lachey and graduate transfer Erick All will be a fearsome 1-2 punch out of the tight end room in 2023. Lachey finished with 28 receptions for 398 yards and caught a team-best four touchdowns a season ago. All, a Michigan transfer who missed a majority of the 2022 season because of injury, has 54 career receptions for 565 yards and two touchdowns.

- Lachey and All are both on the Mackey Award Watch List. Iowa is one of five teams nationally to have two players on the preseason honors list.

EXPERIENCE ON DL

The Hawkeyes return two starters on the defensive line in 2023 in Joe Evans and Logan Lee. The duo started all 13 games for during the 2022 season and they have a combined 40 career starts.

- Evans tied for the team lead with 6.5 sacks last season and he finished with 41 tackles, including 8.5 tackles for loss. The Ames, Iowa, native has 18.5 sacks heading into his sixth and final season.
- Lee has started 27 consecutive games heading into 2023. The Illinois, native had 54 tackles, including eight tackles for loss and three sacks a season ago.
- DE Deontae Craig tied for the team lead with 6.5 sacks and had 10 TFL in a reserve role in 2022. He also forced three fumbles and had 31 tackles a season ago.

DEJEAN'S PICK 6s

Junior DB Cooper DeJean had a school record three interception returns for a touchdown during the 2022 season. The three pick 6s are tied for the most career interceptions returned for a touchdown in Iowa history.

Kicker Drew Stevens returns for his sophomore season after earning freshman All-America honors during the 2022 season. Stevens, who added 20 pounds to his frame in the offseason, made 16-of-18 field goal attempts last season – the most by a Hawkeye freshman all-time (passing Mike Meyer and Nate Kaeding).

The South Carolina native went 7-for-7 from 20-29 yards, 3-for-3 from 30-39 yards, 4-of-6 from 40-49 and 2-for-2 from 50+. Stevens finished tops in the Big Ten and 16th nationally with an .889 field goal percentage and he was sixth in the Big Ten in field goals per game (1.23).

- Stevens is listed on the Lou Groza National Collegiate Place-Kicker Award Watch List. Last season, he was one of 20 semifinalists for the honor.
- Stevens made a career-long 54-yard field goal in Iowa's 33-13 win over Northwestern. It was one of a career-high four field goal makes against the Wildcats, which led to him earning Big Ten Freshman of the Week and Groza

Stars of the Week honors on Oct. 31. The 54-yarder tied for the seventh-longest in program history and was the longest by a Hawkeye since Marshall Koehn drilled a 57-yarder in 2015.

- He made two field goals at Minnesota – from 38 and 21 yards. The 21-yard field goal was a game-winner with 28 seconds remaining in the game.

THE MOST FAMOUS PUNTER IN AMERICA

Senior Tory Taylor returns for his fourth season as Iowa's starting punter. The Australia native has a 45.4 career average over 202 punts with 95 -- 47 percent -- landing inside the 20-yardline.

- Taylor has set the school record for punt yardage in consecutive years. He had 80 punts for 3,688 yards in 2022 and 82 punts for 3,725 yards in 2023.
- His 45.4 average in 2022 was second in the Big Ten and 11th nationally.
- He punted a career-high 10 times for 479 yards, averaging 47.9 yards per attempt, against South Dakota State on Sept. 3. Taylor had punts downed at the 1, 2, 6, 8, 8 and 12-yard lines and seven of his punts were inside the 20.
- Taylor has been named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week three times in his career (2021 at Iowa State, 2022 vs. South Dakota State and 2022 at Rutgers).
- During the Music City Bowl win over Kentucky, Taylor tied a bowl record with eight punts for 386 yards (48.3 avg.). Four of his punts pinned the Wildcats inside the 10 and two were inside the 15. He tied Nick Gallery (1993 Alamo) and Jason Baker (1997 Sun) with eight punts.

STUDENT-ATHLETES = GRADUATES

Ten Iowa football student-athletes enter the season having already earned their undergraduate degrees: Nick DeJong, Joe Evans, Rusty Feth, Cade McNamara, Daijon Parker, Tanner Pollock, Nico Ragaini, Chris Reames, Quinn Schulte and Noah Shannon.

WORLD CHAMPION; DUAL SPORT HAWKEYE

Freshman LB Ben Kueter is a world champion wrestler, winning the U20 World Wrestling Championship in July, 2022. The Iowa City, Iowa, native was named the USA Today Boys Wrestler of the Year for 2022-23 and he was one of five finalists for the high school Butkus Award.

- Kueter will be a dual-sport athlete for the Hawkeyes, as he will also compete on the Iowa wrestling team.

LEE NOMINATED FOR AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Senior defensive lineman Logan Lee has been nominated for the AFCA Good Works Team. The award recognizes the extra efforts made by college football players and student support staff off the field.

HAWKEYE FREAKS

Two Hawkeyes -- DB Cooper DeJean and C Logan Jones -- are on listed on Bruce Feldman's college football Freaks List. DeJean comes in at No. 14 after clocking a 0.92 score in his flying 10s and a 2.39 in his 20-yard spring out of a two-point stance. Jones is ranked No. 52 after being second in Iowa history in hang-clean and setting a record with a 700 pound squat, while vertical jumping 36 inches.

HALE BAY CHAMP

For a second straight year, sophomore OL Gennings Dunker prevailed as the Solon Beef Days hale bay champion. Dunker finished with a record toss of 14'6" to beat fellow Hawkeye OL Logan Jones. (Hay bales weigh approximately 60 pounds.)

IN THE RANKINGS

- Iowa is ranked No. 25 in the preseason Associated Press poll and the team is receiving votes in the preseason AFCA Coaches Poll, coming in at No. 26 with 169 points. Iowa is also receiving votes in the FWAA/NFF Super 16 rankings.
- It is the fourth time in the last five years and the 10th time in the Kirk Ferentz era (27th time overall) that the Hawkeyes have been in the preseason AP Poll.
- The Hawkeyes finished the 2022 season receiving votes in the final AP and AFCA Coaches polls. Iowa was 33rd in the coaches' poll with nine votes and 34th in the AP Poll with four votes.
- Prior to 2022, Iowa had been ranked in the AP Top 25 at least once in each of the last seven seasons, the third-longest streak in school history.

That includes a 424-227-16 (.648) record in home games, a 260-344-23 (.433) record in games away from Iowa City, a 353-389-25 (.477) mark in Big Ten games and a 308-192-15 (.613) record in Kinnick Stadium.

TROPHY COLLECTION

- Iowa went 3-2 in trophy games in 2022. The Hawkeyes fell 10-7 to Iowa State in their first trophy game -- the team's first loss to the Cyclones since 2014. Iowa reclaimed the Heartland Trophy on Nov. 12, downing Wisconsin, 24-10, in Kinnick Stadium, and defeated Minnesota for the eighth straight time, winning 13-10, to retain the Floyd of Rosedale trophy. Nebraska downed Iowa, 24-17, in the regular season finale to claim the Heroes Trophy for the first time since 2013.
- The Hawkeyes closed out the season with a 21-0 win to hoist the TransPerfect Music City Bowl trophy.
- Iowa is 28-9 in its last 37 trophy games (includes bowl games and conference championships). The Hawkeyes are 24-8 in their last 32 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

- The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 21 times in the last 22 seasons. Iowa accepted an invitation to the 2020 Music City Bowl, but the game was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz won the 10th bowl game of his career in the Hawkeyes' 21-0 win over Kentucky in the 2022 TransPerfect Music City Bowl, tying Joe Paterno (10) for most bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Ferentz has a 10-9 bowl record.
- Eighteen coaches have won 10 or more bowl games in their career. Among active coaches, only Nick Saban (18), Mack Brown (14), Kyle Whittingham (11), Mike Gundy (11) and Dabo Swinney (11) have more bowl wins than Ferentz.

HALL OF FAME

The University of Iowa Athletics Department’s 34th Hall of Fame class will be inducted into the Iowa Athletics Hall of Fame on Friday, Sept. 1, the evening prior to the season opener against Utah State.

The 34th Hall of Fame class includes B.J. Armstrong (men’s basketball), Cherie Freddie (field hockey), Jolette Law (women’s basketball), Terri McFarland (softball), Brent Metcalf (wrestling), Peaches Roach Findlay (women’s track and field), Bill Seaberg (men’s basketball), J. Daniel Sherman (wrestling), Eric Steinbach (football) and Anne West Burmeister (rowing).

All Iowa athletes who have earned at least one varsity letter at Iowa are eligible for the Iowa Athletics Hall of Fame. Athletes must have completed their eligibility 10 years and coaches/administrators five years prior to their induction.

CHICAGOLAND HOF

Former Hawkeye Eric Steinbach has been selected to the Chicagoland Sports Hall of Fame. Steinbach was an All-America offensive lineman at Iowa from 1999-2002 before playing in the NFL for 11 seasons. Steinbach prepped at Providence Catholic High School. Steinbach will also be inducted into the Iowa Athletics Hall of Fame on Sept. 1.

FRYfest

FRYfest is in its 14th year of celebrating all that is Hawkeye. The event, named after legendary UI football coach Hayden Fry, kicks off the UI football season each year at Coralville’s Iowa River Landing. This year’s FRYfest is FRYday, Sept. 1, and includes the World’s Largest Hawkeye Tradeshow, a panel discussion and autograph session with the 2023 Athletics Hall of Fame class, the Hawkeye pep rally, and a “High Porch Block Party” that includes the kids zone, bags tournament, fireworks, and live music.

PHIL PARKER'S IOWA DEFENSE

- Phil Parker was named PFF's top defensive coordinator in college football in April, 2023.
- Since Parker took over as Iowa's defensive coordinator, Iowa is second in the Big Ten and fifth nationally in points (18.9), third in the Big Ten and seventh nationally in total offense (326.9) and the unit leads the nation in interceptions (158).
- The Hawkeyes have top-six scoring defenses nationally in three of the past four years. The scoring defense has ranked in the top 20 in the nation in each of the last eight years.
- Iowa's 3.986 yards per play during the 2022 season were the lowest by any team at the FBS level since Florida State's 3.853 in 2012.
- In 2022, the Hawkeyes led FBS in points per drive (1.09), yards per pass attempt (5.3), yards per rush (2.8) and ranked second in FBS in points per game (13.3) and yards per game (270.8).
- Iowa's 270.8 yards per game surrendered was the fewest by an Iowa defense since 1981.
- The defense had a 79 percent stop rate -- drives that ended in punts, turnovers or turnovers on downs -- to lead the country.
- Iowa has 2018 interceptions since the start of the 2009 season -- the second-most nationally in that span, only trailing Oregon's 2019. The "BallHawks" had a school record 25 interceptions in 2021.
- A principle of Parker's defense is to limit explosive plays, forcing the offense to sustain a drive. Iowa surrendered just 15 explosive plays out of 883 defensive snaps over 13 games during the 2022 season.
- Iowa has had five players win the Big Ten Tatum-Woodson Defensive Back of the Year since 2012: Micah Hyde, 2012; Desmond King, 2015; Josh Jackson, 2017; Amani Hooker, 2018; Riley Moss, 2021).

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ



Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 25th season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2029 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and Big Ten West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant

Coach of the Year award.

- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 186 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He has 115 Big Ten wins, which ties for third all-time. He has 198 victories during his coaching career.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 12 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 177-94 (.653) overall mark and a 111-69 (.617) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 16 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and West Division titles in 2015 and 2021.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 186-115 (.618) and a 115-83 (.581) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 186 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 198-136 (.593), giving him the fourth most wins among active head coaches.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steve was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.
- James Ferentz is in his eighth NFL season as a member of the New England Patriots. Steve Ferentz is in his first season as a member of coaching staff at the University of South Dakota (outside linebackers coach).

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 21 of the last 22 seasons. Iowa is 10-9 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (12) and Wisconsin (12) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 18-16-1 in 35 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (186-115) replaced Fry and has completed 24 seasons. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa won the Big Ten West Division title in 2021 and made its second appearance in the Big Ten Championship game. The Hawkeyes played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP Poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP Poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 354 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 13 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End), Tyler Linderbaum, (Rimington, Top Center), Jack Campbell (Campbell Trophy, Butkus Award).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa has six unanimous consensus All-Americans since 2010, the third-most in the nation.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 213 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (85 draft picks/128 free agents).
- Seventeen former Hawkeyes participated in the 2023 NFL Playoffs, a number that ranked eighth nationally among programs and former players. Just one Big Ten program (Ohio State) had more former players participating in the playoffs.
- Iowa and Florida lead all schools with five offensive tackles currently active in the NFL.
- Iowa is tied with Miami, Florida, Notre Dame, Penn State and Stanford with the most tight ends active in the NFL (4).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (45 consecutive years).
- Iowa has had 13 First Round NFL Draft picks under head coach Kirk Ferentz.
- Iowa had two first round picks in the 2023 NFL Draft -- LB Lukas Van Ness (Packers) and LB Jack Campbell (Lions). It is the fourth time in program history Iowa has had two players selected in the first round.

- OT Tristan Wirfs and TEs George Kittle and T.J. Hockenson were both selected to the Pro Bowl in 2023. Wirfs and Kittle were Second Team NFL All-Pro selections.
- Two former Hawkeyes -- Jake Gervase and Alaric Jackson -- were members of the Los Angeles Rams' 2022 Super Bowl champion team.
- OT Tristan Wirfs earned first-team All-Pro and was a Pro Bowl selection in 2021.
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
- OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson (Detroit), TE George Kittle (San Francisco) and Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
- TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 23 years, 204-of-245 (83 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 15 years, Iowa has had 57 NFL Draft picks, the third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (89), Michigan (72).
- Iowa has had 10 first round picks in the last 13 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020; OL Tyler Linderbaum, 2022; LB Lukas Van Ness, 2023, LB Jack Campbell, 2023.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 11th year on staff and sixth as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz, WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Former LB Anthony Hitchens and LB Ben Niemann played for the Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs in 2020. Former QB C.J. Beathard, TE George Kittle, and OL Ross Reynolds were on the NFC Champion San Francisco 49ers.
- Former OL Tristan Wirfs was the starting right tackle as a rookie for the 2021 Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Former DL Anthony Nelson was a reserve defensive end for the Bucs. Former LB Ben Niemann and LB Anthony Hitchens were on the AFC Champion Kansas City Chiefs.
- Entering the 2023 season, every Iowa senior starting tight end (17) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or signed by an NFL team. The NFL has employed 19 Iowa tight ends since 1999 (12 drafted/7 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.
