THIS WEEK

The fifth-ranked University of Iowa field hockey team continues Big Ten play Friday at No. 9 Maryland beginning at 4 p.m. (CT). The Hawkeyes will then travel to No. 16 Penn State for their last regular season away game beginning at 11 a.m. on Sunday.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Iowa is ranked No. 5 in this week's NFCA poll. The Hawkeyes were ranked No. 1 for four weeks straight (Sept. 5 - Oct. 2) for the second time in program history (2021). Iowa has been ranked in 79 consecutive polls dating back to the 2016 season.
- The Hawkeyes lead the nation in scoring margin (2.86). Iowa ranks second in shutouts (8), shutouts per game (.57), goals against average (0.64), and save percentage (.830), third in goals (49), goals per game (3.50) and scoring average (3.50), fourth in goals allowed (9), and fifth in points per game (9.43) and winning percentage (.857).
- Freshman Dionne van Aalsum was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week for the third time this season (Sept. 11, Sept. 18) after tallying two goals in a top ten win over No. 5 Louisville this past weekend. The Castricum, Netherlands, native has also been named NFCA Offensive Player of the Week on September 13 and Big Ten Freshman of the Week three times this season (Aug. 26, Sept. 5, Sept. 11). Van Aalsum leads the nation with 24 goals, 54 points, 1.79 goals per game, and 3.86 points per game.
- Sophomore Mia Magnotta has only allowed nine goals this season and has recorded 43 saves. She has been in goal the duration of the season including all of Iowa's eight shutout victories. Forty-Fort, Pennsylvania native, was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on August 29 and NFCA Division I Defensive Player of the week on August 30.
- Iowa has defeated the top-ranked team in three straight seasons (3-1 vs. No. 1 North Carolina in 2021, 2-0 vs. No. 1 Northwestern in 2022 and 3-2 vs. No. 1 North Carolina in 2023).
- The Hawkeyes' win over No. 5 Louisville this past weekend was their fifth win against a ranked opponent this season. Iowa previously downed No. 12 Wake Forest, No. 1 North Carolina, No. 19





Lisa Cellucci enters her 24th season as a member of the University of Iowa field hockey team's coaching staff in 2023-24 and her 10th as head coach. Cellucci, a three-time All-American and member of the U.S. National Team, is the all-time saves leader at Iowa. In her 23 years at Iowa, the Hawkeyes have compiled a 280-175 record and have been consistently ranked in the top 15 of the NFCA national rankings.

In the past four seasons, the Hawkeyes have been a top 10 team in the national poll and the team ascended to the No. 1 spot in the rankings for seven straight weeks during the 2021 season. Iowa has advanced to the Elite Eight in each of the last four seasons, including a Final Four appearance in the spring of 2021.

Cellucci earned back-to-back-to-back Big Ten Coach of the Year honors (2019-21), becoming the first coach in Big Ten history to accomplish the feat. She and her staff have earned NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year honors twice.

In her nine years as head coach, Cellucci has coached:

- 18 NFCA All-Americans
- 34 NFCA All-West Regional selections
- 25 All-Big Ten selections, including 11 first-team honorees three NFCA West Region Players of the Year, two Big Ten Player of the Years, two Big Ten Defensive Player of the Years, three Big Ten Offensive Players of the Year and one Big Ten Freshman of the Year
- 85 Academic All-Big Ten selections, 74 NFCA National Academic Squad honorees, 40 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, and 66 NFCA Scholars of Distinction selections.

The Hawkeyes advanced to their fourth straight NCAA Elite Eight in 2022, finishing the season with a 12-8 overall record. Iowa, which finished the year ranked 11th in the NFCA poll, advanced to its 21st Elite Eight with a shootout win over Virginia in the Sweet 16. The season ended in a shootout fashion, falling in a 2-1 heartbreaker at Northwestern.

UAlbany, and No. 14 Michigan. Iowa is 5-2 against ranked foes.

- The Hawkeyes return seven starters and 14 letterwinners from a team that finished 12-8, advancing to the Elite Eight for the 21st time in program history in 2022.
- The Hawkeyes made their fifth straight and 27th NCAA Tournament appearance in program history -- the most of any team as a member of the Big Ten Conference.
- Head coach Lisa Cellucci is in her tenth season at the helm of the Hawkeye field hockey program and her 24th season overall. Cellucci has been a part of 289 Iowa victories and in 2020, she led the program to the Final Four for the 12th time -- the first since 2008. Iowa has posted double digit win totals in eight of her ten seasons. The Hawkeyes have won three Big Ten titles (2019, 2019 (BTT), 2021) under her watch.

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- The Hawkeyes are 29-27 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.
- Iowa has qualified for five straight NCAA Tournaments -- the longest streak since making a school record 15 consecutive tournaments from 1982-96.

CELLUCCI REACHES MILESTONE

Head coach Lisa Cellucci -- the three-time reigning Big Ten Coach of the Year -- earned her 100th career victory on Aug. 26, 2022 when the Hawkeyes downed No. 20 Wake Forest in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. The tenth year head coach is the fourth Hawkeye head coach to reach this 100-win milestone.

- Cellucci earned her third straight Big Ten Coach of the Year honor in 2021. She is the first coach in Big Ten history to be named Coach of the Year in three consecutive seasons.

IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

Iowa is ranked No. 5 in this week's NFCA poll. The Hawkeyes have been ranked in 79 consecutive polls dating back to the 2016 season.

- The Hawkeyes were ranked No. 1 for four weeks in row earlier this season (Sept. 5 - Oct. 2). It was the second time in program history (2021) the Hawkeyes have been ranked No. 1 by the NFCA.

DIONNE VAN AWESOME

Freshman Dionne van Aalsum was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week for the third time this season. She leads the nation with 24 goals, 54 points, 1.79 goals per game, and 3.86 points per game.

- The Castricum, Netherlands, native has also been named NFCA Offensive Player of the Week on September 13 and Big Ten Freshman of the Week three times this season (Aug. 26, Sept. 5, Sept. 11).
- She scored eight goals in wins over Western Michigan and UMass Lowell to become the first Hawkeye to record a hat trick since Maddy Murphy vs. Indiana in 2019 and the first Hawkeye with four goals in a game since Kim Scrapper vs Brown in 2016.

ALL ABOUT THE DEFENSE

Iowa has surrendered nine goals in 14 games, and the Hawkeye defense has allowed 107 shots and 53 shots on goal.

- The Hawkeyes have recorded eight shutouts in 14 games, three being against ranked opponents. Iowa shutout No. 14 Michigan in its Big Ten opener.
- Iowa's defense ranks second in the nation in shutouts (8), and shutouts per game (.57), and goals against average (0.65) and fourth in goals allowed (9).



DOWN GOES NO. 1 FOR THE THIRD STRAIGHT SEASON

Freshman Lieve van Kessel's first career goal in overtime sent the seventh-ranked University of Iowa field hockey team to an upset victory over top ranked North Carolina, 3-2, on the Tar Heels home turf on August 27, 2023. Dionne van Aalsum was the key player in sending the matchup into overtime after scoring her second goal of the game with six minutes left in regulation.

- This was the Hawkeyes' first win against UNC in Chapel Hill.
- This is the second time in program history that Iowa went 2-0 in ACC/Big Ten Challenge (since 2002).
- This was only North Carolina's third loss in Karen Shelton Stadium which opened in 2018.
- This was the first loss for the Tar Heels since November 2021, and their first regular season loss since October 2021.
- The Hawkeyes have downed the No. 1 team in the nation three years in a row (3-1 vs. No. 1 North Carolina in 2021, 2-0 vs. No. 1 Northwestern in 2022 and 3-2 vs. No. 1 North Carolina in 2023).
- Prior to 2021, Iowa hadn't defeated a No. 1 ranked team since 2008. The win snapped Northwestern's 12-game winning streak dating back to last season.

FRESHMAN, FRESHMAN, FRESHMAN

- Six of Iowa's seven goals in opening weekend were scored by freshmen, including all three against No. 1 North Carolina.
- The three-time Big Ten Freshman Player of the Week Dionne van Aalsum has gone nine-for-14 in multi-goal games in collegiate career, and she has scored at least one goal in 12 games.
- Freshman Miranda Jackson has recorded two goals against ranked foes, No. 12 Wake Forest and No. 14 Michigan. She has recorded four goals this season ranking second in the Hawkeye offense.
- Freshman Rachel Herbine recorded her first career goals and first multi-goal game against Merrimack College.
- Freshman Lieve van Kessel's first career goal was in overtime against the No. 1 Tar Heels.

MAGNOTTA IN GOAL

Sophomore goal keeper Mia Magnotta has played the duration of all 14 games this season. She has only allowed nine goals, tallied 43 saves, and has been part of eight Hawkeye shutouts. The Forty-Fort, Pennsylvania native tallied a career high eight saves against No. 2 Northwestern breaking her previous career high six saves she recorded in win over No. 1 North Carolina at the beginning of the season.

- Magnotta ranks second in the nation in goals against average (.67) and fourth in save percentage (.827).
- Magnotta was Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on August 29 and NFHCA Division I Defensive Player of the Week on August 30.

IRON HAWKS

Four returning Hawkeye position players played the duration of last season and rarely leave the field -- Harper Dunne, Esme Gibson, Sofie Stribos, and Lieve Schalk.

HELPING THE CAUSE

Iowa has 34 assists on its 49 goals this season with eight different players tallying at least two assists. Six different Hawkeyes have at least three assists on the year. The Hawkeyes rank 11th nationally in assists per game (2.43) and assists (34).

A STORIED HISTORY

- The Hawkeyes have made 27 NCAA Tournament appearances in program history -- the most of any school as a member of the Big Ten Conference.
- Iowa has made 12 NCAA Final Four appearances, including winning the 1986 NCAA Championship.
- The program's 30 NCAA Tournament victories and 12 NCAA Final Fours are the most of any school as a member of the Big Ten Conference.

SCOUTING MARYLAND

- Maryland is ranked ninth in the NFHCA poll with an overall record of 12-3 and conference record of 4-1.
- The Terrapins defeated Ohio State, 2-1, in their last matchup. The Buckeyes gave the Hawkeyes their first loss of the season.
- Junior Hope Rose leads the team with 12 goals, one assist, and 25 points.

SCOUTING PENN STATE

- Penn State is ranked 16th in the NFHCA poll with an overall record of 7-6 and conference record of 2-3.
- The Nittany Lions defeated Ohio State, 2-1, earlier this season. The Buckeyes gave the Hawkeyes their first loss of the season.
- Senior Forward Sophia Gladieux leads the team with 16 goals, two assists, and 34 points. She has recorded goals in 11 out of 13 games for the Nittany Lions.

SERIES RECORDS

- Iowa is 6-19-1 all-time against Maryland.
The Hawkeyes lost to Maryland 2-1 in overtime last season. Iowa beat the Terrapins, 3-0, in the first round of the 2020 Big Ten Tournament.
- Iowa is 33-26-1 all-time against Penn State.
The Hawkeyes lost to Penn State 2-1 in overtime last season snapping an eight game series win streak.
