TIPOFF

- The Hawkeyes return three starters and 10 letterwinners from a team that went 19-15 overall and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament.
- Iowa returns three All-Big Ten selections -- Josh Dix (honorable mention), Owen Freeman (honorable mention, Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Year) and Payton Sandfort (third team). Sandfort is a preseason first-team All-Big Ten selection in 2024-25.
- The Hawkeyes have won 10 or more Big Ten games in a school record six consecutive seasons. Iowa has won 10+ Big Ten games in nine of the last 10 seasons under head coach Fran McCaffery and the program has 11 Big Ten upper division finishes in the last 12 years.
- Iowa has placed fifth place or better in the Big Ten standings seven of the last 10 years.
- Iowa added two transfers -- Drew Thelwell (Morehead State) and Seydou Traore (Manhattan College) -- and four freshmen -- Trey Buchanan, Cooper Koch, Jacob Koch and Chris Tadjjo.
- Senior Payton Sandfort led the team in scoring (16.4) and 3-point field goals (94), while ranking second in assists (91) and rebounds (224) during his junior season. His 94 3-pointers were the third-most in a single season in program history.
- Sophomore Owen Freeman was a nine-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week selection in 2023-24, averaging 10.6 points, 6.6 rebounds and 1.8 blocks. He had five double-doubles, the most among Big Ten freshman.
- Thelwell is the winningest player in Morehead State history with 94 victories, helping the Eagles to two OVC tournament titles and three postseason appearances (two NCAA, one NIT).
- Junior Josh Dix was one of the most efficient offensive players in the country, averaging 8.9 points, 2.2 rebounds and 1.7 assists. He shot .552/.421/.860 as a sophomore.
- Traore was an All-Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Rookie Team honoree. He was the only player in MAAC with 300+ points, 200+ rebounds, 60+ assists, 40+ steals and 30+ blocks.
- Sandfort currently has an 89.8 career free throw percentage, which is tops in program history.
- Redshirt junior Carter Kingsbury was awarded a scholarship for the 2024-25 season. He was a walk-on his first three seasons.
- The Hawkeyes averaged 83.1 points per game -- the third-highest scoring average during the McCaffery era. Iowa has averaged 80+ points per game in four straight seasons for the first time since since 1968-72.
- Iowa led the Big Ten and ranked third nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.85) last season. It was the second straight year the program has been third nationally in the category.
- The Hawkeyes were also in the top 20 nationally in assists (ninth, 17.8), fastbreak points (12th, 14.85), scoring offense (12th, 83.1), turnovers per game (18th, 9.6) and free throw percentage (18th, .774).

HEAD COACH FRAN McCAFFERY

Fran McCaffery, who is signed through the 2028 season, is in his 15th season as the head basketball coach at the University of Iowa and his 29th year overall as a college head coach. McCaffery has reached the 20-win plateau 11 of the previous 17 seasons.

McCaffery spent five seasons (2005-10) as the head coach at Siena, six years at UNC-Greensboro (1999-2005) and three seasons at Lehigh (1985-88) before joining the Hawkeyes.

McCaffery has nearly four decades of Division I coaching experience.

He completed his 42nd season as a collegiate coach, which includes 28 years as a head coach and 15 as an assistant. In 2022, McCaffery joined Hall of Fame coaches Rick Pitino, Bob Huggins, Eddie Sutton and Lefty Driesell as the only Division I coaches to lead teams to conference tournament titles in four or more different leagues (Big Ten, MAAC, SoCon, ECC). He is one of 14 coaches to lead at least four different Division I teams to the NCAA Tournament.

McCaffery, 65, won his 500th game as a head coach on Dec. 8, 2022 and win No. 250 at Iowa on Dec. 17, 2022. He holds a career mark of 531-368 (.591) and guided his teams to 17 postseason appearances (12 NCAA & five NIT). Iowa likely would have competed in another NCAA Tournament in 2020, if not for the NCAA canceling the postseason due to COVID-19. He is 280-191 (.593) at Iowa. The 280 wins are a school record, including a record 136 Big Ten victories. McCaffery led Iowa to wins in four of the last eight NCAA Tournaments (2015, 2016, 2019, 2021).

Since taking over the Iowa program in 2010, Iowa has earned 11 postseason tournament bids (7 NCAA, 4 NIT). McCaffery coached Iowa to a Big Ten Tournament title and 26 wins in 2022, the second-most win total in program history. McCaffery has guided seven players to first team All-Big Ten status eight of the last 11 years, including the 2020 & 2021 National and Big Ten Player of the Year, Luka Garza.

McCaffery has posted upper division finishes in 11 of the last 12 seasons at Iowa and 23 of 28 seasons as a head coach. The Hawkeyes have finished fifth or better in the Big Ten standings seven of the last 10 years. He has posted 20 wins or more 11 of the last 16 seasons, including eight of the last 11 years at Iowa (2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2019, 2020, 2021 and 2022). Iowa's 205 victories between 2013-21 are the most over a 10-year span at Iowa since 1987-96 (207).

McCaffery and the Hawkeyes boast a 180-47 (.792) home record over the last 14 seasons, which includes a school-record 18 wins in 2014 and 13 consecutive victories in 2019-20. Iowa has won 14+ games in Carver-Hawkeye Arena in five of the last six seasons (2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023).

McCaffery's five years at Siena were the best in its 70-year history. He led the Saints on an incredible run that ended with three straight Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference championships and NCAA Tournament appearances.

McCaffery's Saints owned a 112-51 (.687) record in his five years with the program. He guided the Saints to four consecutive 20-win seasons. McCaffery's achievements earned the head coach Siena Hall of Fame recognition in 2017.

The 2009 MAAC Coach of the Year and 2010 District I Coach of the Year is the third winningest coach, by percentage, in league history (.68-22, .756). He is the only coach to guide a MAAC program to two NCAA Tournament wins. McCaffery led his 2008 and 2009 teams to first round NCAA Tournament victories over Vanderbilt and Ohio State, respectively.

In his final two seasons at Siena, he coached the Saints to back-to-back 27-win campaigns and boasted a combined 39-3 (.929) record against MAAC opponents, which included MAAC Tournament contests.

McCaffery began his coaching career as an assistant at Penn (1982-83) and Lehigh (1983-85). After three seasons as head coach at Lehigh, he spent 11 seasons as an assistant at Notre Dame (1988-99).

McCaffery played basketball at Wake Forest his freshman year (1977-78) and concluded his playing career at Penn his final three seasons (1979-82). He earned his bachelor's degree in economics from The Wharton School (Penn) in 1982. McCaffery also earned a master of education from Lehigh in 1985.

ON THE AIR

Radio: Games are broadcast on the Hawkeye Radio Network with Gary Dolphin (play-by-play) and Bobby Hansen (color) on the call. The network includes more than 40 stations that blanket the state of Iowa and include portions of Illinois, Nebraska, Minnesota, Missouri and Wisconsin. The Hawkeye Radio Network includes a 60-minute pregame show.

Stream: Friday's game will be streamed live on B1G+ -- a paid subscription service. AJ Reisetter (play-by-play) and Jess Settles (color) will be on the call.

SCOUTING MINNESOTA DULUTH

- The Bulldogs finished the 2023-24 season with a 26-7 record and an 18-4 mark in the Northern Sun Conference. The team advanced to the Division II Regional semifinalist.
- Minnesota Duluth has won 25 or more games in each of the past three seasons.
- UMD is picked to finish third in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. The Bulldogs received one first place vote.
- Charlie Katona is a NSIC Player to Watch after averaging 12.8 points, 4.9 rebounds and 1.9 assists a season ago. He is the reigning NSIC Defensive Player of the Year.
- The Bulldogs are coached by former Hawkeye and North Liberty native Justin Wieck. Wieck, who went to Iowa City West High School, joined Iowa as a walk-on in 2004 before earning a scholarship as a senior -- the same year the Hawkeyes won the Big Ten Tournament title.
- Wieck also served four seasons on Iowa's coaching staff -- two as a graduate assistant and two as the video coordinator -- under Steve Alford and Todd Lickliter. He is in his seventh season at UMD.

SANDFORT: PRESEASON FIRST-TEAM ALL-BIG TEN

Senior Payton Sandfort was one of 10 players named to the preseason All-Big Ten team. It is the fifth time in the last six seasons a Hawkeye has been named to the list. Sandfort is also a preseason all-league selection by Blue Ribbon and he is tabbed as one of the top sharp shooters and seniors in college basketball by Andy Katz at NCAA.com.

• Sandfort put up career-best numbers across the board during the 2023-24 season, averaging 16.4 points, 6.6 rebounds and 2.7 assists, while shooting 44.6 percent from the floor, 37.9 percent from distance and 91.1 percent from the free throw stripe. His 94 3-pointers led the Big Ten.

3-HEADED MONSTER

The Hawkeyes return three starters in Payton Sandfort, Owen Freeman and Josh Dix. All three players earned All-Big Ten recognition a season ago. Sandfort was a third-team All-Big Ten selection, while Freeman and Dix both were honorable mention all-league selections. Freeman was also the Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Year.

- Sandfort averaged a team-best 16.4 points and 6.6 rebounds, reaching double figures in 27 games with 11 20-point contests.
- Freeman averaged 10.6 points and 6.6 rebounds, while shooting 61.4 percent from the floor. He had five double-doubles and had an Iowa freshman record 61 blocks.
- Dix averaged 8.9 points and 2.2 rebounds, while ranking third on the team with 59 assists. He was one of the most efficient players in the Big Ten, shooting 55.2 percent from the floor, 42.1 percent from 3-point range and 86 percent from the free throw stripe.

A VERSATILE ADDITION

Sophomore forward Seydou Traore gives Hawkeyes a versatile piece in 2024-25. The New York native was an All-Metro Atlantic Conference Rookie Team selection a season ago, averaging 11.9 points and 8.1 rebounds to go along with 62 assists and 34 blocks. He was the only player in the MAAC with 300+ points, 200+ rebounds, 60+ assists, 40+ steals and 30+ blocks.

WINNINGEST PLAYER IN MOREHEAD HISTORY

Graduate transfer Drew Thelwell won 94 games during his four-year career at Morehead State, making him the winningest player in program history. Thelwell helped the Eagles to two OVC regular season and two OVC tournament titles and to three postseason appearances (two NCAA, one NIT).

- The Florida native averaged 10 points and 6.2 assists as a senior. He led the OVC in assists (15th nationally) and assist-to-turnover ratio (2.71).

FRESHMAN-TO-SOPHOMORES

Iowa's current sophomore class combined to play in 132 games during their freshman season in 2023-24. Owen Freeman and Brock Harding played in all 34 contests, while Ladji Dembele and Pryce Sandfort saw action in 32 games apiece.

- Seydou Traore started 27-of-28 games at Manhattan College.

PAYTON'S PROGRESSION

Senior forward Payton Sandfort has seen his numbers and production improve each season since joining the Hawkeyes during the 2021-22 season.

PAYTON AT THE STRIPE

Senior Payton Sandfort enters his final season as a Hawkeye with a chance to break the program's all-time free throw percentage record.

- Sandfort currently has an 89.8 (168-of-187) career free throw percentage, which is tops in program history. Jordan Bohannon holds the record, making 88.7 (370-of-417) of his attempts from 2017-22.

PAYTON WATCH

Senior Payton Sandfort currently ranks 46th in program history with 1,067 career points. If Sandfort matches his 2023-24 production, he would climb to 11th place in program history.

- Sandfort also ranks ninth in program history with 187 career 3-point field goals. Should he match his junior year totals, he would finish second in program history to Jordan Bohannon (455 makes) in the record books.

THELWELL APPROACHES 1K

Graduate transfer Drew Thelwell enters his final collegiate season 190 points shy of the 1,000 point milestone. He scored 810 points in 114 career games at Morehead State.

FAMILY BUSINESS

Iowa will have a set of brothers on the roster for the sixth straight year in 2024-25 with Payton and Pryce Sandfort teaming up for a second straight season.

6 NEWCOMERS

Six players on the 2024-25 roster are newcomers in 2024-25, including a pair of transfers. Drew Thelwell transferred to Iowa from Morehead State, while Seydou Traore made the move to Iowa City after playing one season at Manhattan College.

- The Hawkeyes welcome four freshmen – Trey Buchanan, Cooper Koch, Jacob Koch and Chris Tadjio. Trey Buchanan (preferred) and Jacob Koch joined the team as non-scholarship athletes.

2024-25 SCHEDULE NOTES

- Iowa will play six of its first eight regular season games at home. The Nov. 4 opener against Texas A&M Commerce will be the earliest regular season game in program history.
- The first three regular season games against Texas A&M Commerce (Nov. 4), Southern (Nov. 7) and South Dakota (Nov. 12) will be part of the Kenny Arnold Classic. Arnold played for the Hawkeyes from 1979-82, helping lead the program to its third Final Four in 1980 and a Big Ten regular season championship in 1979. He passed away in 2019.
- The Hawkeyes will play three neutral site opponents – Washington State (Nov. 15 in Moline, Illinois), Utah State (Nov. 22 in Kansas City, Missouri) and Utah (Dec. 21 in Sioux Falls, South Dakota).
- The Hawkeyes will play a total of 18 home games (and an exhibition) on Mediacom Court inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena.
- Iowa will open its Big Ten slate at home against Northwestern (Dec. 3) before traveling to Michigan (Dec. 7) for the early portion of the league schedule.
- The Hawkeyes open the 2025 calendar year with a road game at Wisconsin (Jan. 3) for a second straight season.

IOWA HISTORY

Iowa has played 2,975 games since beginning basketball in 1902. Iowa's overall record is 1,758-1,217 (.591). Iowa's 1,758 wins are 38th most among Division I programs. That includes a 1,124-385 (.745) record in home games, a 634-832 (.433) record in contests away from Iowa City, an 836-831 (.502) mark in Big Ten games and a 528-159 (.769) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

IOWA VS. RANKED TEAMS

The Hawkeyes went 1-6 against AP ranked opponents in 2023-24, dropping road games at No. 8 Creighton in the Gavitt Tipoff Games, at No. 4 Purdue, at No. 21 Wisconsin and at home against No. 2 Purdue before downing No. 20 Wisconsin, 88-86 in overtime, on Feb. 17.
