SERIES RECORDS

- The Hawkeyes are 6-0 against UC Davis. The last meeting between the two was at Grant Field in 2019, with lowa winning 3-1.
- lowa is 13-1 all-time against Cal (lowa is 6-0 in the last six meetings against the Golden Bears).







Lisa Cellucci enters her 24th season as a member of the University of lowa field hockey team's coaching staff in 2023-24 and her 10th as head coach. Cellucci, a three-time All-American and member of the U.S. National Team, is the all-time saves leader at lowa. In her 23 years at lowa, the Hawkeyes have compiled a 294-177 record and have been consistently ranked in the top 15 of the NFHCA national rankings.

In the past five seasons, the Hawkeyes have been a top 10 team in the national poll and the team ascended to the No. 1 spot in the rankings for seven straight weeks during the 2021 season and four weeks in the 2023 season. Iowa has advanced to the Elite Eight in four out of the five last seasons, including a Final Four appearance in the spring of 2021.

Cellucci earned back-to-back-to-back Big Ten Coach of the Year honors (2019-21), becoming the first coach in Big Ten history to accomplish the feat. She and her staff have earned NFHCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year honors twice.

In her ten years as head coach, Cellucci has coached:

- 20 NFHCA All-Americans
- 37 NFHCA All-West Regional selections
- 28 All-Big Ten selections, including 13 first-team honorees
 three NFHCA West Region Players of the Year, two Big Ten Player of
 the Years, two Big Ten Defensive Player of the Years, three Big Ten
 Offensive Players of the Year and two Big Ten Freshman of the Year
 97 Academic All-Big Ten selections, 74 NFHCA National Academic
 Squad honorees, 41 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, and 66 NFHCA
 Scholars of Distinction selections.

The Hawkeyes advanced to their fourth straight NCAA Elite Eight in 2022, finishing the season with a 12-8 overall record. Iowa, which finished the year ranked 11th in the NFHCA poll, advanced to its 21st Elite Eight with a shootout win over Virginia in the Sweet 16. The season ended in a shootout fashion, falling in a 2-1 heartbreaker at Northwestern.

SCOUTING UC DAVIS

- The Aggies are 2-8 overall and 0-4 in conference.
- UC Davis has faced one other Big Ten opponent this season, Michigan State, falling 4-3.
- UC Davis is ranked first in their conference in saves per game (fifth nationally, 8.50) and save percentage (11th nationally, .780).
- Sophomore goalkeeper Emma Giesting is ranked first in the conference in saves per game (4th nationally, 8.10) and save percentage (12th nationally, .786).

SCOUTING NO. 18 CAL

- The Golden Bears are currently 6-5 overall, and 0-5 in conference.
- Cal defeated UC Davis this season on September 29th, winning 4-0.
- Cal is currently ranked first in their conference and fifth nationally in defensive saves (7)...
- Graduate student midfielder Canisha van Duyn is second in their conference and fourth nationally in assists per game. van Duyn is also first in their conference and fourth nationally in defensive saves (4).

NCAA STANDINGS

- The Hawkeyes rank fifth in the nation and third in the Big Ten in shutouts per game (.50).
- The Hawkeyes rank fourth in the B1G and 31st in the nation in save percentage (.742).
- lowa ranks fifth in the Big Ten and 18th in the nation in average goals against (1.28).

IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

lowa comes in at No. 17 in the NFHCA poll. The Hawkeyes have been ranked in 89 consecutive polls dating back to the 2016 season.

- The Hawkeyes were ranked in the top 10 for the duration of the 2023 season.
- The Hawkeyes were ranked No. 1 for four weeks in row last season (Sept. 5 Oct. 2). It was the second time in program history (2021) the Hawkeyes had been ranked No. 1 by the NFHCA.
- The Hawkeyes are #17 this week in the NFHCA poll, in week seven of the 2024 season.

SHUTOUT SHUTDOWN

The Hawkeye defense has six shutouts under their belts this season. Every win lowa has recorded has had a scoreless opponent on the other side.

- The largest shutout this season came against New Hampshire, the Hawkeyes holding the Wildcats to zero while scoring five goals.
- lowa's defense ranked fifth in the nation and third in the conference in shutouts per game (.50).

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- lowa traveled to Evanston for the second straight year for the NCAA Tournament in 2023.
- lowa has qualified for six straight NCAA Tournaments -- the longest streak since making a





school record 15 consecutive tournaments from 1982-96.

- The Hawkeyes have made 28 NCAA Tournament appearances in program history -- the most of any school as a member of the Big Ten Conference -- and have made 12 NCAA Final Four appearances, including winning the 1986 NCAA Championship.
- The Hawkeyes are 30-28 all-time in the NCAA Tournament. The program's 30 NCAA Tournament victories and 12 NCAA Final Fours are the most of any school as a member of the Big Ten Conference.

SEASON OPENING SHOOTOUT

lowa defeated Wake Forest for the fifth consecutive year in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge to open the season.

- The Hawkeyes and Demon Deacons needed more than 80 minutes to finish game one of the 2024 sea-son, before Dionne van Aalsum found the back of the net as her shootout goal propelled lowa to victory,
- Mia Magnotta stopped Ashley Hart the Demon Deacons fifth shooter to set up the opportunity for van Aalsum to clinch the match. van Aalsum got the ball past the Wake Forest goalkeeper and sent the Hawkeyes to a 1-0 record.
- The Hawkeyes have won seven straight season openers.

PRESEASON B1G HONORS

Mia Magnotta, Milly Short and sophomore Dionne van Aalsum have been named to the Big Ten Preseason Honors List.

• It is the second straight season Magnotta has a been preseason honoree.

NFHCA PRESEASON HONORS

Mia Magnotta, Dionne van Aalsum, Gia Whalen and Sabrina McGroarty were named to the National Field Hockey Coaches Association Watchlist.

• The NFHCA Watchlist represents top collegiate student-athletes who are early contenders for this year's NFHCA All-Region and All-American teams.

DIONNE VAN AWESOME

Van Aalsum led the nation throughout last season with 28 goals, 62 points, 1.47 goals per game, and 3.26 points per game. She was named Big Ten Freshman of the year and earned first-team All-Big Ten recognition.

- She scored eight goals in wins over Western Michigan and UMass Lowell to become the first Hawkeye to record a hat trick since Maddy Murphy vs. Indiana in 2019 and the first Hawkeye with four goals in a game since Kim Scraper vs Brown in 2016.
- Van Aalsum has scored five goals so far in the 2024 season.

MAGNOTTA IN GOAL

- So far in the 2024 season Magnotta has allowed 17 goals, and registered 48 saves.
- Magnotta currently ranks in the top-10 in four Big Ten categories: fourth in saves per game (4.00, 43rd nationally), fifth in save percentage (.738, 31st nationally), fifth in average goals against (1.28, 21st nationally), and sixth in goalie win-loss percentage (.500, 38th nationally).

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT 2023

- The Hawkeyes finished their season with a 13-6 overall record. lowa made its sixth straight and 28th NCAA Tournament appearance in program history the most of any team as a member of the Big Ten Conference.
- lowa finished the season ranked No. 8 in the NFHCA poll.
- Head Coach Lisa Cellucci concluded her tenth season at the helm of the Hawkeye field hockey program and her 24th season overall. Cellucci has been a part of 293 lowa victories and in 2020, she led the program to the Final Four for the 12th time the first since 2008. lowa has posted double digit win totals in eight of her ten seasons. The Hawkeyes have won three Big Ten titles (2019, 2019 (BTT), 2021) under her watch.
- The Hawkeyes had two student athletes earn NFHCA All-America honors freshman Dionne van Aalsum earned her first career All-America nod, as she was named first team. Gibson earned second team and was named an All-American for a third straight season.
- •Three Hawkeyes earned NFHCA All-West Region selections. Gibson earned her fourth all-region acco-lade and was also named to the NFHCA Senior Team. Van Aalsum also earned first team honors while So-fie Stribos earned second-team.
- Three Hawkeyes Dionne van Aalsum (Freshman of the Year/First-Team), Esme Gibson (First-Team), and Harper Dunne (Sportsmanship Award) earned Big Ten recognition for the 2023 season.
- 12 field hockey student athletes were named to fall academic all-Big Ten. Senior Harper Dunne finished with a 4.0 GPA.
- Freshman Dionne van Aalsum was named Big Ten Freshman of the year and received first team honors after leading the nation in goals and points through the duration of the season. The Castricum, Nether-lands, native was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week four times last season (Sept. 11, Sept. 18, Oct. 16, Oct. 30), Big Ten Freshman of the Week four times (Aug. 26, Sept. 5, Sept. 11, Oct. 30), and NFHCA Offensive Player of the Week on September 13.
- lowa has defeated the top-ranked team for the third straight season (3-1 vs. No. 1 North Carolina in 2021, 2-0 vs. No. 1 Northwestern in 2022 and 3-2 vs. No. 1 North Carolina in 2023).
- The Hawkeyes defeated six ranked opponent last season. Iowa downed No. 1 North Carolina, No. 3 Rutgers, No. 5 Louisville, No. 12 Wake Forest, No. 14 Michigan, and No. 19 UAlbany.

The Hawkeyes will travel to East Lansing to take on Michigan State on Friday, October 25th at 2p.m. lowa will continue its Big Ten road trip by heading to Columbus to take on Ohio State on Sunday October 27th at 11a.m.
