ON THE MAT

The University of Iowa wrestling team travels to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, to compete at the 2025 NCAA Championships from March 20-22 at the Wells Fargo Center. The three-day tournament begins Thursday with Session I starting at 11 a.m. (CT) and Session II at 6 p.m. The quarterfinals and consolation round begin Friday at 11 a.m and the semifinals begin Friday at 7 p.m. The medal round starts Saturday at 10 a.m. and the championship finals begin Saturday at 6 p.m.

 Morning sessions will be available on ESPNU, while evening sessions will be live on ESPN or ESPN2. Individual mat coverage will be available on ESPN+.

HAWKEYE WRESTLING HISTORY

The Hawkeyes have won 24 national titles and 37 Big Tentitles

 Iowa's 55 NCAA Champions have won a total of 85 NCAA individual titles, crowning seven three-time and 16 twotime champions.

 The Hawkeyes' 118 Big Ten champions have combined for 210 conference titles. There have been eight four-time, 20 three-time and 31 two-time Big Ten champions from lowa.
 lowa's 166 All-Americans have earned All-America status 367 times, including two five-time, 25 four-time, 38 three-time and 40 two-time honorees.

NCAA TROPHIES

The Hawkeyes have earned a team trophy at the NCAA Championships 14 times in the last 16 championships. Iowa has won 14 team trophies in head coach Tom Brands' 17 seasons. (The 2020 season, in which Iowa was favored, was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic).

• Iowa has won 48 team NCAA trophies in program history and have 69 top 10 finishes. The Hawkeyes have been the NCAA runner-up seven times.

CHASING THE HAWKEYES

Gary Kurdelmeier led Iowa to its first NCAA Championship in 1975, and in the 49 years since, the Hawkeyes have accumulated 24 team titles, more than any other school -- Penn State (11), Oklahoma State (7), Minnesota (3), Iowa State (2), Ohio State (1) and Arizona State (1).

A LOOK BACK AT 2024 NCAAs

The Hawkeyes placed fifth as a team at the 2025 NCAA Championships, finishing with 67 points. Four Hawkeyes finished on the poidum.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS OUTSTANDING WRESTLERS

Ten different Hawkeyes have been named NCAA Championships Outstanding Wrestler. They include Chuck Yagla (1976), Bruce Kinseth (1979), Jim Zalesky (1984), Barry Davis (1985), Mary Kistler (1986), Tom Brands (1992), Terry Steiner (1993), Lincoln McIlravy (1997), Joe Williams (1998) and Brent Metcalf (2008).

HAWKEYES IN THE FINALS

Drake Ayala advanced to the 125-pound finals of the 2024 NCAA Championships to extend lowa's streak of NCAA finals appearances to 34 consecutive tournaments.

• lowa has had at least one wrestler in the NCAA finals every year since 1990, and in 48 of the last 49 tournaments dating back to 1975.

ALL-AMERICAN STREAK

The Hawkeyes have crowned at least one All-American in 53 consecutive tournaments, a stretch dating back to 1972. lowa has totaled 327 All-America honors during that stretch.

NINE QUALIFIERS

The Hawkeyes are sending nine wresters to the NCAA Championships. The Hawkeyes have sent at least nine wrestlers for 13 straight years and 17 times since 2007, Tom Brands first year as head coach.

• Eight of Iowa's nine qualifiers earned automatic bids to the NCAA tournament at the 2025 Big Ten Championships. Joey Cruz got an at-large bid at 125 pounds.

• lowa is one of 10 schools sending 9 wrestlers to the national tournament.

• Iowa has sent at least eight athletes to the NCAA Championships in each of head coach Tom Brands' 18 seasons.

NCAA EXPERIENCE

The Hawkeyes have six wrestlers with previous NCAA experience. Those six wrestlers have wrestled in a combined 16 NCAA Championships.

• Three Iowa wrestlers -- Joey Cruz, Gabe Arnold and Ben Kueter -- are making their national tournament debuts.

133 | #2 DRAKE AYALA | JUNIOR

- Drake Ayala will be making his third NCAA Championships appearance. He earned an automatic berth after finishing second at the Big Ten Championships.
- Ayala is seeded 2nd at 133 pounds as he brings a 17-2 record to Philadelphia with nine bonus point victories -- three majors and six tech falls. He is 10-2 against the NCAA field.
- Ayala is 5-3 all-time at the NCAA Championships, competing at 125 pounds in 2022 and 2024. The Fort Dodge, Iowa, native was runner-up in 2024 at 125 pounds.
- Since 1999, when the NCAA implemented the weight classes used today, lowa has won four NCAA titles at 133 pounds (Eric Juergens 2000, 2001; Tony Ramos 2014 and Cory Clark 2017).

- Since 1999, when the NCAA implemented the weight classes used today, lowa has won three NCAA titles at 149 pounds (T.J. Williams 1999, Brent Metcalf 2008, 2010).

A PERFECT (BIG) TEN

Stephen Buchanan (8-0) finished the Big Ten duals season with perfect conference record.

- Since 2007, Tom Brands' first season as Iowa head coach, a wrestler has navigated a perfect Big Ten regular season 24
- From 2014-15 to 2020-21 when the conference went to a nine-dual regular season schedule, eight Hawkeyes posted perfect 9-0 records: Spencer Lee, Kaleb Young, and Michael Kemerer in 2019-20, Alex Marinelli did it in 2018-19, Thomas Gilman did it three times (2015, 2016, 2017), and Alex Meyer, Brandon Sorensen, and Sam Stoll were all 9-0 in 2015-16.
- Austin DeSanto and Jayden Eierman had perfect 5-0 records during the Big Tén only season. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic the Hawkeyes had three duals cancelled that
- Since the conference switched back to eight duals in 2020-21 two Hawkeyes have gone a perfect 8-0 (Buchanan this season and Leé in 2022-23)

FRESHMAN TRACKER

STARTING AT 125

In the 320 matches that lowa has wrestled under head coach Tom Brands the Hawkeyes have started at 125 pounds 268 times. Iowa is 240-27-1 in those matches.

- Iowa is 50-1 under Brands when starting at a weight other
- Since 2003, lowa is 251-32-1 when starting at 125 and 68-10 at when starting at a different weight.

lowa wrestling's season ticket allotment at Carver-Hawkeye Arena is sold out for a fourth straight season. The Hawkeyes have led the nation in attendance every year since 2006-07. lowa set an NCAA record, averaging 14,905 fans in 2021-22.

 There have been 48 sets of brothers to come through the lowa wrestling program, including head coach Tom Brands and associate head coach Terry Brands.
- Terry and Nelson Brands are the ninth father son duo and Tom and Nelson are the fifth uncle nephew duo to wrestle for lowa.

Free parking is available in the Hancher Auditorium Parking Lot on dates where no performances are scheduled. When the Hancher Auditorium Lot is available, complimentary Cambus shuttles to Carver-Hawkeye Arena will begin 90 minutes prior to the start of the meet and run until one (1) hour following the conclusion of the meet.

KUETER EARNS SILVER AT U20 WORLDS

Ben Kueter earned a second-place finish on Sunday evening at the U20 World Championships.

- The Iowa City, Iowa, native is now a two-time U20 World medalist having won gold at 97kg in 2022.
- Kueter faced Iranian Amirreza Fardin Masoumi Valadi a now five-time age-level World champion — in his finals matchup and lost via a 4-2 decision.
- En route to the finals Kueter outscored his opponents, 24-3. He won his opening match against Alikhan Kussainov of Kazakhstan, 7-0. In his quarterfinal matchup with Individual Neutral Athlete Stsiapan Mandryk he needed only 27 seconds to win via fall.

HAWKEYES AT AGE GROUP NATIONALS

University of Iowa wrestlers Patrick Kennedy and Ben Kueter won age-group National Titles and seven Hawkeyes placed at U23 Nationals and U20 World Team Trials at the Spire Institute in Geneva, Ohio.

- In the U20 division, Kueter brought home the title at 125 kg, and Gabe Arnold was runner-up at 79 kg for the second straight year.
- Kueter won the 125 kg division winning five straight matches to make the world team. Kueter defeated Jimmy Mullen of the South East Regional Training Center and Virginia Tech in the best-of-three finals. Kueter won 5-4 and 5-3 against Mullen.
- In the U23 division, Kennedy won the 79 kg title, Drake Ayala (61 KG) finished in third, Caleb Rathjen (70 kg finished in fifth and Joey Cruz finished in seventh at 57 kg.
 • In the best-of-three finals Kennedy defeated Julian
- Ramirez of the Spartan Combat RTC via a 10-0 technical superiority in both matches. In seven matches in the tournament Kennedy outscored his opponents, 75-4.

A NEW HOME FOR IOWA WRESTLING

Construction on the \$31 million Goschke Family Wrestling Training Center finished in May 2024. The 38,000-squarefoot facility is the new training home of the lowa men's and women's wrestling programs. The wrestling room on the south end of the building is connected by underground tunnel to Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

- The two-level building features a Hall of Champions that pays homage to the history of lowa wrestling. The main entrance welcomes visitors with trophy displays celebrating lowa's All-Americans and national champions. The lowerlevel includes locker rooms, while the upper-level houses student-athlete lounges and coaches' offices that overlook the wrestling room.
- The facility's largest space, the Bob and Kathy Nicolls Wrestling Room, features 30-foot-high ceilings with nearly twice as much practice space as the former room. An adjacent strength and conditioning room on the lower level flows seamlessly into the wrestling room.

WRESTLETOWN, USA

Iowa City, Iowa, was dubbed Wrestletown, USA by NBC Sports when hosting the 2016 Olympic Team Trials.

- The University of Iowa men's wrestling program led the nation in attendance for the 17th straight year last year.

 • The Hawkeyes drew an average of 14,847 fans per home
- date during the 2023-24 season with 89,082 fans entering the doors of Carver-Hawkeye Arena. lowa drew capacity crowds of 14,847 in all six of its home duals.
- Iowa has led the nation in attendance in each season of head coach Tom Brands' tenure (attendance totals weren't tracked during the 2020-21 season due to most venues having no-spectators due to the COVID-19 pandemic). This was the 15th straight year the Hawkeyes have averaged more than 8,000 fans.

NEWCOMERS

The Hawkeyes have 12 newcomers on the 2024-25 roster, including three transfers.

- · Stephen Buchanan is a three-time All-American at Wyoming (2021-22) and Oklahoma (2024). He finished third at both the 2022 and 2024 NCAA Championships.
- Kyle Parco is a four-time All-American at Fresno State (2021) and Arizona State (22-24). He is a three-time PAC-12 Champion. Parco finished fifth at the 2024 NCAA Champion-
- Jacori Teemer is a four-time All-American at Arizona State (2020-22, 2024) and was the NCAA runner-up in 2024.

NCAA EXPERIENCE

The Hawkeyes have nine wrestlers on the roster with NCAA Championships experience. Drake Ayala was the 2024 runner up at 125 pounds. Caleb Rathjen (2024) and Victor Voinovich III (2023) have both qualified once at 149 pounds. Kyle Parco (149) and Jacori Teemer (157) are both four-time All-Americans. Parco's highest finish came in 2023 when he finished fourth and Teemer was the runner up in 2024. Michael Caliendo (165) is a two-time All-American and finished fourth in 2024. Patrick Kennedy is a two-time national qualifier at 165 and 174 pounds. Nélson Brands (174/184) is a two-time All-American and finished fifth in 2023 at 174. Stephen Buchanan (197) is a three-time All-American finishing 3rd in both 2022 and 2024.

A LOOK BACK

The University of Iowa wrestling team finished the 2023-24

season with a 12-2 overall and a 6-2 Big Ten mark.

• The Hawkeyes placed fourth at the Big Ten Championships and fifth at the NCAA Championships. lowa had four All-Americans. The program had 20 Academic All-Big Ten selections — the highest total in school history.

SPENCER LEE THE OLYMPIAN

Former University of Iowa All-American and three-time National Champion Spencer Lee won a silver medal at the 2024 Paris Olympics, becoming the 11th Hawkeye wrestler in school history to medal at the Olympic Games

ACADEMIC ALL-BIG TEN

20 Hawkeye wrestlers were among the 59 University of lowa student-athletes named to the 2023-24 Big Ten Winter Academic All-Conference Team. The 20 honorees are the most in program history.

To be eligible for Academic All-Big Ten status, students

must be on a varsity team, as verified by being on the official squad list as of March 1 for winter sports, who have been enrolled fulltime at the institution for a minimum of 12 months and carry a cumulative grade-point average of 3.0 or higher.

HAWKEYES AND CARVER-HAWKEYE ARENA

Iowa is 138-14 (.907) at Carver-Hawkeye Arena since Tom Brands took over the program prior to 2006-07. The Hawkeyes are 287-27 (.914) all-time at Carver-Hawkeye Arena since moving from the UI Field House in 1983. Iowa went 5-1 in Carver in 2023-24.

· Carver-Hawkeye Arena has hosted two United States Olympic Team Trials, four Big Ten Championships (1983, 1994, 2005, 2016) and four NCAA Championships (1986, 1991, 1995, 2001). The Hawkeyes have won five tournament titles on their home mat, including the 1983 and 1994 Big Ten Championships, and the 1986, 1991 and 1995 NCAA Championships.

TOM BRANDSHead Coach University of Iowa, 1992

Five-time Big Ten and three-time NWCA Coach of the Year Tom Brands completed his 18th season as head wrestling coach at the University of Iowa in 2023-24. A 1996 Olympic gold medalist and member of wrestling's Hall of Fame, Brands is only the eighth head wrestling coach at the University of Iowa. The former Hawkeye wrestler was a four-time All-American and three-time national champion (1989-92) at Iowa. He has a 291-28-1 (.912) overall and 140-15 (.914) Big Ten coaching

record at Iowa. He has a 308-48-1 (.861) career mark and a 140-14 (.907) record at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

In 18 seasons as lowa's head coach, the Sheldon, lowa, native has led the Hawkeyes to four NCAA and six Big Ten team titles, crowning 13 NCAA champions, 26 Big Ten champions and 104 All-Americans. lowa has had 190 Academic All-Big Ten recipients, including a school-record 20 in 2023-24. The Hawkeyes have qualified 176 wrestlers for the NCAA Championships in the last 18 years, sending the entire 10-man lineup in 2010, 2014, 2015, 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023. lowa has won or shared the Big Ten regular season title 12 times in Brands' 17 seasons.

The program set the national collegiate dual meet attendance record of 42,287 when No. 3 lowa defeated top-ranked Oklahoma State, 18-16, on Nov. 14, 2015 at the Grapple on the Gridiron at Kinnick Stadium. lowa has led the nation in attendance every year since Brands became head coach in 2006-07, setting an NCAA all-time attendance average of 14,905 in 2021-22.

Brands has been named NWCA National Coach of the Year three times. He was first honored in 2008 after leading the Hawkeyes to their first NCAA team title since 2000. He was recognized in 2020 when the top-ranked Hawkeyes won Big Ten regular season and tournament championships and entered the NCAA Championships as the favorite to win the team title. The tournament was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He most recently won the award in 2021 when lowa won Big Ten and NCAA team titles.

Brands was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2008, 2009, 2010, 2020 and 2021. He is the only coach in program history to earn the award five times.

Brands served as head coach at Virginia Tech University for two seasons (2005-06), recording a 17-20 dual mark. In his first season with the Hokies, Brands led the team to the 2005 regular season Atlantic Coast Conference title, set a school record for dual meet wins (16) and had a school-record five wrestlers qualify for the NCAA Championships.

Prior to taking the helm at Virginia Tech, Brands was an assistant coach at lowa for 12 seasons (1993-2004). He helped the Hawkeyes to a 177-27 dual record, seven NCAA and eight Big Ten team titles, while crowning 23 NCAA champions, 73 All-Americans and 36 Big Ten champions. He was named the National Wrestling Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000.


In 2004, he was one of three coaches for the U.S. Olympic freestyle wrestling team, participating in Athens, and in 2016 he was named a volunteer coach of the United States Olympic team in Rio. Brands also served as assistant coach for the U.S. Freestyle World Teams in 2001, 2002, 2003, 2013, 2014, and 2015. He was named Freestyle Coach of the Year by USA Wrestling in 2002 and 2003. He has coached a number of other U.S. teams in international competition.

As a competitor, Brands won the 1996 Olympic freestyle gold medal at 136.5 pounds in Atlanta, Georgia. He also won a gold medal at the 1993 World Championships in Toronto, two World Cup gold medals (1994, 1995) and was the 1995 Pan American Games champion. He won four U.S. National titles (1993-96) and made four straight U.S. World or Olympic teams (1993-96). Along with his twin brother, Terry, Tom was named 1993 USA Wrestling Athlete of the Year, the 1993 John Smith Outstanding Freestyle Wrestler, and 1993 Amateur Wrestling News Man of the Year. He was inducted into wrestling's Hall of Fame in 2001.

Brands was a four-time All-American at lowa (1989-92). During his Hawkeye career, he won three NCAA titles and was named Outstanding Wrestler of the 1992 NCAA Championships. Also a three-time Big Ten champion, Brands won 95 percent of his matches at lowa. His career mark of 158-7-2 includes an undefeated season in 1991 (45-0).

The Sheldon, Iowa, native was born April 9, 1968. He earned his B.S. degree in physical education from Iowa in 1992. He and his wife, Jeni, have three adult children, Madigan, Kinsee and Tommy.
