2007-08 Season Preview

As Head Coach **Marc Long** enters his third season leading the men and women's combined swimming program, he looks for continued progress.

"We set a lot of career bests this year, and we want to continue to build on that and take our program to the next level. We are excited about the direction the program is headed and the commitment that has been made with the Campus Recreation and Wellness Center."

Long led the men to their first Big Ten win since 2003 and their first Big Ten road win since 2000 when they defeated Michigan State in East Lansing. The men finished the season at 5-6 (1-3 Big Ten), while the women finished with a 6-6 record (0-4 Big Ten).

Long is assisted by fourth year coaches Frannie DeBord, Robert Pinter and second year coach, Kirk Hampleman.

Here is an event-by-event look at the 2007-08 Hawkeyes.

Butterfly

As the birthplace of the butterfly, the University of Iowa is looking to several returnees and newcomers to make this a strong event.

The women's butterfly will be anchored by sophomores Margie Chamberlin and Laura Mozdzen, and freshman Molly Houlton. Chamberlin led the team in the 100 (55.96) and 200 (2:02.24), with those respective times ranking fourth and third in school history. She recorded her best time in the 200 fly at the Big Ten Championships, which was good for 15th and an NCAA 'B' time. She recorded three victories in the 100 and four in the 200, along with 17 top-five finishes last season. Mozdzen was second on the team in both the 100 (56.30) and 200 (2:02.90), which rank seventh and fourth in school history, respectively. Houlton's best time in the 100 fly is 56.23. Sophomore Katie Michelau will add depth.

Nate Keeling returns for his senior season after leading the team in both the 100 (48.89) and 200 (1:48.74), and placing 13th in the 200 at the Big Ten Championships. His time of 1:48.74 in the 200 ranks ninth on lowa's all-time list. Junior James Dragon and sophomore Seth Wessels will provide significant depth. Dragon is second on the team in both the 100 (49.48) and 200 (1:52.67) and Wessels follows at third in the 100 (50.62) and 200 (1:53.95). Incoming freshmen will





have the opportunity to make an impact right from the start. **Richard Salhus** boast a converted 49.62 in the 100 fly and lowa state champion **Cameron Lennon** swam a 50.5.

Backstroke

Houlton will make an immediate impact as her best times of 55.62 (converted) in the 100 and 1:58.35 in the 200 lead the team.

Junior **Alison Gschwend** led lowa both events last season. Her best 200 time (2:02.23) ranks fourth in school history and her best 100 time (56.53) ranks third. She was named Big Ten Swimmer of the Week after sweeping the 100 and 200 against lowa State. She won the 100 three times and the 200 twice last season.

"Alison scored points for us at Big Tens and I think she's ready to take her swims to the next level," said Long.

Another major contributor will be freshman **Katarina Tour**, who possesses a fast 50 back. Junior **Leah Schwartz**, sophomores **Hilary Leigh** and **Nicki Wex** and freshman **Amanda Johnson** will add depth.

Sophomore **Wil Whaley** will lead the men in the backstroke. As a freshman, Whaley led the team in the 100 (50.30) and 200 (1:47.66),

with his 200 time ranking fourth on lowa's all-time list. He won the 200 at Michigan State and recorded eight runners-up. He enters his sophomore year with U.S. Olympic Traisl cuts. Senior **Andrej Lenert** was second on the team in the 100 (51.72) and 200 (1:50.30) and notched 11 top-five finishes. Incoming freshman **Max Dittmer** will add strength to the lineup, after recording times of 23.6 seconds in the 50 and 50.86 in the 100 back during his senior year of high school.

Breaststroke

Leading the Hawkeyes will be NCAA qualifier **Dragos Agache**, who set collegiate bests and school records while recording 'B' times in the 100 (53.77) and 200 (1:58.40). Agache hit these marks at the Big Ten Championships, where he placed third in the 100 and sixth in the 200. He won the 100 four times, the 200 three times and recorded 19 top-five finishes.

Sophomore **Matt Ryan** will play an important role behind Agache. Ryan was third on the team in both the 100 (57.47) and 200 (2:07.12), while recording eight top-five finishes in 2006-07.



"We had some good time drops from Matt and I look for him to be a big contributor next year." Long said.

Freshman **Alex Dragon** will add solid depth to the 100 (57.86) and 200 (2:06.20), along with **Sean Hagen** and **Josh Peterson** adding speed.

Tour will add speed for the women in the 100 (1:02.86). Sophomore **Julie Feingold** led the team in the 100 (1:05.23) and the 200 (2:22.03) last season. Her time in the 100 ranks ninth on Iowa's all-time list. Feingold recorded seven runners-up and 22 top-five finishes on the season. Fellow sophomore **Stacia Johns** will provide some depth behind Feingold. Johns was third on the team in the 100 (1:07.77) and 200 (2:27.37), and notched eight top-five finishes. Freshman **Rachel Lee** joins the team with times of 1:07.97 in the 100 and 2:24.69 in the 200.

Freestyle

Sophomore **Christine Kuczek** had a major impact as a freshman, leading the team in the 50 (23.35), 100 (50.74) and 200 (1:50.98). She placed 12th in the 100 and 16th in the 50 at the Big Ten meet. Kuczek recorded NCAA 'B' times in the 50 and 100 free, and cracked lowa's all-time list in the 50 (fifth), 100 (second) and 200 (eighth).

"Christine was a big contributor for us, scoring in two Big Ten individual events. We look for her to improve and contribute at the NCAA Championships this season," said Long.

Adding depth to the Hawkeye sprints will be sophomore **Julie DeBruin** and senior **Mindy Schulte**. DeBruin's best 50 (23.59) ranks ninth on lowa's all-time list, while Schulte swam a 23.62 in that event. Freshman **Caitlin Carlyle** will also be an impact swimmer for the Hawkeyes in the 50 (24.6) and 100 (52.6).

Junior **Ashley Dell** will lead lowa's distance freestyle, after leading the team last year in the 500 (4:59.59), 1,000 (10:16.48) and 1,650 (17:12.87). Her time in the 500 is a collegiate best and ranks 10th on lowa's all time list. She won the 1,000 four times and the 500 twice.

Sophomore **Ashley Lawler** will add depth to the Hawkeye distance freestyle.

Freshmen Salhus and **Conor Dwyer** will make an immediate impact in the sprint freestyle events for lowa. Salhus boasts converted times of

20.73 in the 50, 45.45 in the 100 and 1:38.64 in the 200, while Dwyer posted converted times of 45.41 in the 100 and 1:37.90 in the 200.

Sophomores **Brad Jones**, **Jake Moore** and **Brian Farris** will also contribute in the sprint freestyle. Jones led lowa in the 50 and was third in the 100 last season. He won the 50 against Truman State and Western Illinois, and was runner-up against Ohio State, along with 10 top-five finishes. Farris led the Hawkeyes in the 200, and will add significant depth in the distance events. He finished his freshman campaign second on the team in the 500, 1,000 and 1,650.

Junior **Nick Divan** is the top returning distance swimmer for the lowa men. Divan led the team in the 500 (4:29.30), 1,000 (9:27.84) and 1,650 (15:42.67), and his time in the 1,650 ranks ninth on lowa's all-time top performers list. Sophomore **Tyler Verink**, who specializes in the distance events, plans to build off the success of his freshman year.

Individual Medley

Newcomers Houlton and Tour bring ample talent to the women's IM corps. Houlton's best swims are 2:02.57 in the 200 IM and 4:12.43 in the 400, while Tour boasts a converted 2:04.14 in the 200.

Feingold is the top returning Hawkeye in the IM, after leading the team in the 200 (2:07.50) and 400 (4:29.39) last year. Her 400 time tied her for ninth in school history. She won the 400 vs. Truman State, and was runner-up in the 200 at Minnesota and the 400 vs. Louisville.

Mozdzen, Gschwend, Dell and newcomer **Kelsey Neubauer** will strengthen the Hawkeye IM. Mozdzen was second on the team in the 200 (2:08.59), with Gschwend shortly behind her (2:08.71), and Dell was third on the team in the 400 (4:41.50).

The Hawkeye men return their top two IM swimmers in **James Dragon** and Divan. Dragon led Iowa in the 200 (1:51.87) and Divan had the season best in the 400 (3:59.12), with Dragon second in the 400. Both Dragon and Divan set collegiate bests in both the 200 and 400. Wessels was second on the team in the 200 (1:52.47) and third in the 400, and was runner-up in the 200 at Minnesota and the 400 vs.



Truman State. Rookie **Alex Dragon** will compete on a high level for the Hawkeyes in the IM events. Dragon was the lowa state champion in the 200 and is skilled in the 400 as well.

Diving

Leading the Hawkeye divers will be sophomores **Deidre Freeman** and **Michael Gilligan**. Freeman led the women's squad in both the one-and three-meter boards. She scored a 245.17 against lowa State on the one-meter and a 276.45 at home against Western Illinois. Gilligan led the men's team on the platform where he set a school-record 327.60 at the Big Ten Championships. Fellow sophomore **Frank Van Dijkhuizen** will return to action after missing the spring semester. Van Dijkhuizen led the Hawkeyes on the one-meter with 312.68 and the three-meter with 337.95. He was also named Big Ten Diver of the Week after winning both the one-meter (283.00) and the three-meter (322.90) in the season opening meet against Wisconsin and Wisconsin-Milwaukee. Freshman **Veronica Rydze** will make a big impact on the boards this year. She was the lowa state champion during her senior year, and is an outstanding addition to the Hawkeyes after just barely missing the state record on the one-meter board.





Head Coach Marc Long



Marc Long Head Coach Fourth Season

Marc Long is in his fourth season as head coach for the University of Iowa swimming team. He served two seasons at the Iowa women's assistant coach (2003-04) before taking over the helm for the 2004-05 season. He also served at the Hawkeye men's assistant coach from 1998-2001.

In Long's second season at the helm of the Hawkeyes, two school records were broken and nine student-athletes qualified for the NCAA Championships. Dragos Agache led the Hawkeyes by competing at the NCAA Championships in both the 100 and 200 breast – the two events in which he set new school records. Agache posted lowa's highest Big Ten finishes with third in the 100 and sixth in the 200.

In his first season with the combined program, four student-athletes qualified for the NCAA Championships and four school records were broken. Four-time all-American diver Nancilea Underwood completed her Hawkeye career by leading the women's team to a 27th-place finish at the NCAA meet. Dragos Agache led the men's squad, competing in the 100 and 200-yard breaststroke at the NCAA meet, setting the school 100-yard breaststroke record and posting lowa's highest individual finishes at the Big Ten Championships.

In 2004-05, the women's team recorded their second-highest finish at the NCAA Championships (23rd) in school history. The Hawkeyes were led by all-American diver Nancilea Underwood and four-year NCAA

qualifier and all-American Jennifer Skolaski at the meet. The Hawkeyes set five school and two Fieldhouse pool records, posting a 5-4 overall dual mark.

While great individual and team performances are crucial, Coach Long also places a high priority on academic success. During Long's tenure, Iowa has crowned 11 academic all-Americans and 26 academic all-Big Ten selections, and the team has earned academic all-America honors three times.

As an assistant coach, Long helped lowa to its highest placing and point total in school history (20th, 41 points) at the 2003 NCAAChampionships. The Hawkeyes also posted an 8-4 overall season record, which was the first winning season for the program since 1999-2000.

Before his assistant coaching stints, Long served as head coach of the lowa City Eels Swim Club (ICE) and the COHO Swim Club

(Deerfield, IL). During his tenure, Long has helped produce numerous state champions, record holders, and NCAA and USS national qualifiers.

Long swam at the University of Northern Iowa for one year (1986), winning a conference title and setting the 100 fly school record before joining the University of Iowa men's squad. As a Hawkeye swimmer (1987-89), Long was a six-time all-American and three-time Big Ten Champion, winning two conference titles in the 100 fly and one as part of the 400 free relay. During his career, the Hawkeyes were Big Ten runners-up and recorded their highest placing (eighth) in modern day history at the 1989 NCAA Championships. Long also swam on Iowa's 200 free relay that set Big Ten and NCAA records in that event.

Bob RydzeDiving Coach 33rd Season

Bob Rydze is in his 33rd year as diving coach of the men and women's teams at the University of Iowa, and is dean of Big Ten diving coaches.

Rydze will serve as Team Leader for USA Diving at the 2008 Olympics in Bejing, China. He was named chairman of U.S. Diving's Competition Committee

for Excellence (CCE) in 2006. Rydze has also served as Vice President of U.S. Diving and joined its Board of Directors.

During his tenure at Iowa, Rydze has coached 31 all-Americans, nine Big Ten Champions and one NCAA Champion. He has been named Big Ten Diving Coach of the Year three times (1985, 1986 and 1995). He and his wife, Elaine, have three children, Bo, Robin and Veronica. Veronica is a freshman diver on the Hawkeye team.



Frannie DeBord Assistant Coach Fourth Season

Frances DeBord is in her fourth season as assistant coach with the University of Iowa swimming team. DeBord was a backstroker and student assistant coach

for the Hawkeyes from 1996-2000.

DeBord's second season on the Hawkeye staff saw

two school records broken and nine-student-athletes qualify for the NCAA Championships. Dragos Agache led the Hawkeyes by competing at the NCAA Championships in both the 100 and 200 breast – the two events in which he set new school records. Agache posted Iowa's highest Big Ten finishes with third in the 100 and sixth in the 200.

In her first season with the combined program, four student-athletes qualified for the NCAA Championships and four school records were broken. Four-time all-American diver Nancilea Underwood completed her Hawkeye career by leading the women's team to a 27th-place finish at the NCAA meet. Sophomore Dragos Agache led the men's squad, competing in the 100 and 200-yard breaststroke at the NCAA meet, setting the school 100-yard breaststroke record and posting lowa's highest individual finishes at the Big Ten Championships.

In 2004-05, the women's team recorded their second-highest finish at the NCAA Championships (23rd) in school history. The Hawkeyes were led by two-time all-American diver Nancilea Underwood and four-year NCAA qualifier Jennifer Skolaski at the meet. The Hawkeyes set five school and two Fieldhouse pool records, posting a 5-4 overall dual mark.

Before returning to Iowa, DeBord served as an assistant women's swimming coach at Tulane (2003) and Fresno State (2002). At Tulane, she helped field the first Green Wave swimming team since 1989-90, recruiting a class of 15 student-athletes. The fledgling team posted a 13-3 dual record, won three Conference USA individual titles and recorded 20 top eight finishes at the conference meet. Linda McEachrane won two conference titles to earn Conference USA Freshman of the Year accolades and posted NCAA performances in the 50 and 100 free. At Fresno State, DeBord helped the Bulldogs to a 6-6 record and a fourth-place finish in the Western Athletic Conference with a team comprised of one senior and 18 freshmen.

DeBord served as a graduate assistant coach at Ohio University (2001) and student assistant coach at the University of Iowa (1998-2000). Her club coaching experience includes leading the Willow Knolls Country Club and Ohio Master's Swimming Program, and serving as an assistant with the Central Illinois Aquatics Program.

DeBord is a Dimension I and II graduate of the NCAA Women's Coaches Academy. She is a USA Swimming Registered Coach, and a member of the American Swimming Coaches Association and the College Swimming Coaches Association of America.

A native of Peoria, IL, DeBord earned her bachelor's degree from lowa in 2000 and her master's degree in physical education and sports science from Ohio University in 2004.

Kirk Hampleman Assistant Coach Second Season

Kirk Hampleman is in his second season as the assistant coach for the lowa swimming team.

In his first season at lowa, two school records were broken and four student-athletes received NCAA Championship provisional time standards. Kirk and Assistant Coach Frannie DeBord worked

closely with the stroke group which included Dragos Agache who led the Hawkeyes by competing at the NCAA Championships in both the 100 and 200 breaststroke – the two events in which he set new school records. Agache posted Iowa's highest Big Ten finishes with third in the 100 and sixth in the 200.

Hampleman completed a two-year stint as graduate assistant coach for Florida State University before joining lowa's staff in 2006. Hampleman's specialties include training the stroke and sprint freestyle groups. In 2006, Florida State won its first ever women's ACC team championship. His other experience includes an assistant position at Tanoan Country Club in Albuquerque, NM, in 2002.

Hampleman was a nine-time all-American swimmer for Auburn University from 1998-2002. He helped the Tigers to a 1999 NCAA team title, and received the Auburn Swimming Award in 2002 which recognizes superior scholarship, leadership and performance. Kirk was third in the 200 backstroke and eighth in the 200 individual medley at the 2002 NCAA Championships and was also an SEC Champion.

Hampleman earned his B.A. in mass communication from Auburn in 2002. He received a M.S. in physical education-sport administration from Florida State in 2006.

Robert Pinter Assistant Coach Fourth Season

In his first season with the combined program, four Hawkeyes qualified for the NCAA meet and four school records were broken. Fourtime all-American diver Nancilea Underwood completed her Hawkeye career by leading the women's team to a 27th-place finish at the NCAA meet. Sophomore Dragos Agache led the men's squad, competing in the 100 and 200 breast at NCAAs, setting the school 100 breast record and posting lowa's highest individual finishes at the Big Ten meet.

A native of Romania, Pinter graduated in 1994 from the University of Wisconsin with a degree in political science. While a Badger he earned all-America accolades in the 200 fly and 500 free in 1991 and 1992.

Internationally, Pinter is an accomplished swimmer. He began swimming at age seven and was the 1984 Junior European 200 fly champion. From 1990-92 he was ranked in the top 20 World Rankings. Pinter was also a finalist in the 1992 Barcelona Olympics where he placed seventh in the 200 fly.

Pinter was voted the Wisconsin Senior Coach of the Year in 2004, and coached club swimming for eight years (1997-2004). He and his wife, Christie, have a son, Lukacs.


The Hawkeye Strength Training Program

The program is designed to develop strength, explosiveness, speed, coordination, balance and flexibility. All qualities are developed through progression of exercises in four phases of training:

- 1. work capacity ability to perform work for a prolonged time and recover quickly
- 2. strength ability to exert force
- 3. power ability to exert strength quickly
- 4. speed ability to move the body in shortest time possible

The highest level of performance is achieved by training under close supervision, in a year-round program. Improvement is monitored closely through the newest and best technology. Electronic timing devices are used to measure sprints, while a microcomputer device is used to monitor peak velocity and power outputs in weight training movements. With this technological support, the athletes are constantly receiving immediate feedback on their development.

The 2,000-square foot strength training facility in Carver-Hawkeye Arena (pictured below) was completely remodeled over the last three years. The facility is equipped with eight Olympic platforms, squat racks, medicine balls, physio balls and over 10,000 pounds of free weights. The swimming team uses this facility, as well as the one in the Fieldhouse for strength training and conditioning.

Iowa Fieldhouse Pool and Swimming Tradition



Iowa Swimming History & Tradition

Since 1917, the University of Iowa swimming and diving program has been rich in tradition. Iowa was one of the first schools in the nation to compete on a collegiate level, and competed at the first NCAA Championship. From 1937 to 1960, Iowa placed in the NCAA top 10 18 times, crowning nine NCAA and 22 Big Ten champions.

lowa's facility, the Fieldhouse Pool, was the world's largest indoor pool when it was dedicated in January 1927. Head Coach Dave Armbruster, who founded the team in 1917 and coached until 1957, designed the facility. Iowa hosted the NCAA Championships that year.

The Fieldhouse pool was the birthplace of the butterfly stroke. Armbruster and swimmer Jack Sieg collaborated in its development in the 1930s. The acceptance of the new stroke encountered considerable controversy and was first used February 25, 1935, in lowa City in the medley relay in a dual against Wisconsin. The relay included Dick Westerfield, Jack Sieg and Adolph Jacobsmeyer. Sieg's time was five second faster than the existing 100-yard world record.

The lowa men's team has produced 17 Olympians, 26 NCAA champions, 382 all-Americans and 163 Big Ten champions in its 92-year history. Three Hawkeye men's teams have won the Big Ten team title and have a dual meet record of 372-292-4. The women's team boasts 111 NCAA qualifiers, 39 all-Americans and 16 Big Ten champions in its 34-year history. The women's team has a dual meet record of 163-139-2.

Fieldhouse Pool

lowa's Fieldhouse Pool was built in 1927 and was, at the time, the world's largest indoor swimming pool. The pool has been the site of many national and international meets.

In 1979, the pool underwent a \$400,000 renovation, making it one of the fastest competitive pools in the midwest. Diving platforms were added in 1980.

The pool is 150 feet long and 60 feet wide and has eight lanes (7-foot-3 wide) with a one-foot buffer lane on each side. The lanes in the competition end of the pool are separated by two Kiefer nonturbulent lines, and all four walls have recirculating gutters which make for very fast conditions.

The competitive end of the facility is separated from the shallow section by a four-foot wide Whitten bulkhead. The bulkhead allows 30 percent of the water to flow through, contributing to the calm water surface. Each lane is equipped with a Whitten starting block, which can be adjusted to permit competition at 25 meters or yards or long-course training. Diving facilities include a pair of one- and three-meter springboards, plus five-and ten-meter platforms. Automatic timing equipment is used in all eight lanes and a large readout board posts times for each swimmer.

Campus Recreation and Wellness Center






Campus Recreation and Wellness Center

The University of Iowa Athletic Department and the University of Iowa Recreational Services have partnered together to construct a new Campus Recreation and Wellness Center (CRWC), which will serve as the new home of the Hawkeyes. The facility will be located at the corners of Burlington and Madison streets. The facility is expected to cost \$69 million, with construction beginning in fall 2007 and to be completed in fall 2009.

The CRWC will include a 50-meter competition pool, a separate diving well, a leisure pool with lap lanes and 24,000 square feet of fitness space.

Hawkeye Administration



Sally Mason University President

Sally Mason became the 20th President of The University of Iowa on August 1, 2007. She holds a full professorship with tenure in the Department of Biological Sciences of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.

President Mason served as Provost of Purdue University from 2001-2007, where she was responsible for planning, managing, and reviewing all academic

programs at Purdue's West Lafayette and four affiliated branch campuses throughout Indiana. Her accomplishments as Provost included increasing diversity, recruiting top faculty, doubling the research program, advancing public engagement, and improving the learning environment for students. During President Mason's tenure as Provost, Purdue hired over 800 new faculty, 300 of which were new positions; 56% of those hires were women and/or minorities. She also formed a diversity leadership group while at Purdue. President Mason was instrumental in the development of Purdue's Discovery Park, an interdisciplinary research incubator focused on such topics as nanotechnology, entrepreneurship, and biosciences.

The daughter of an immigrant family and the first child to attend college, President Mason received her B.S. in zoology from The University of Kentucky in 1972, her M.S. from Purdue University in 1974, and her Ph.D. in cellular, molecular, and developmental biology from The University of Arizona in 1978. She subsequently spent two years at Indiana University in Bloomington doing postdoctoral research before joining The University of Kansas in 1981. A strong advocate of undergraduate education, she received awards for outstanding undergraduate advising and teaching, and she was awarded a prestigious Kemper Teaching Fellowship. During her 21 years at Kansas, President Mason served as a full professor in the Department of Molecular Biosciences, Acting Chair of the Department of Physiology and Cell Biology, and Associate Dean in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. In 1995, she was appointed Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, the largest academic unit on the University of Kansas campus.

President Mason is the author of many scientific papers and has obtained a number of research grants from the National Science Foundation, the National Institutes of Health, the Wesley Research Foundation, and the Lilly Endowment. Her research interests have focused on the developmental biology, genetics, and biochemistry of pigment cells and pigments in the skin of vertebrates. She has served as President of both the PanAmerican Society for Pigment Cell Research and the Council of Colleges of Arts and Sciences, and has served as Chair of the Advisory Committee to the National Science Foundation Directorate for Education and Human Resources (EHR) and the Executive Committee of the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges (NASULGC) Chief Academic Officers Group. She also served on the Executive Committee of the Committee on Institutional Cooperation (CIC) from 2003-2007 and was appointed to the National Medal of Science Selection Committee from 2006-2008.

President Mason is married to Ken Mason, an educator and textbook author who teaches biological sciences at The University of Iowa.



Gary BartaDirector of Athletics

Gary Barta is beginning his second year as Athletic Director at The University of Iowa. He became the University's 11th Director of Intercollegiate Athletics on August 1, 2006. He succeeded Robert Bowlsby, who left after 15 years at Iowa to take over the program at Stanford.

A native Midwesterner, Barta signed a five-year contract to lead one of the most

successful athletic programs in the nation. His wife Connie is a native of Waterloo, Iowa. The two met while Barta was an Assistant Athletic Director at Northern Iowa.

Barta has already put his stamp on Hawkeye Athletics during his first year in Iowa City. He oversaw the final stages of the \$89 million renovation at Kinnick Stadium and the new Paul W. Brechler Press Box. He officially opened Iowa's new Hawkeye Tennis and Recreation Center. In the spring of 2007 he hired new Head Men's Basketball Coach Todd Lickliter from Butler University. Lickliter's hiring came on the heels of his team's Sweet 16 appearance and his being named the NABC Division I Coach of the Year. Basketball experts from around the country are touting this as an outstanding hire.

Several other initiatives were set in motion during Barta's first year. An Athletic Department Strategic Plan has been launched mapping out the vision and goals for the future. Plans are underway to build a new \$6.1 million boathouse for the rowing program. Construction begins this fall on a new Campus Wellness and Recreation Center which includes a first-class aquatic center. It will serve as the new home to the Hawkeye men's and women's swimming and diving teams. Carver-Hawkeye Arena is in the early planning stage of a \$30-\$40 million renovation that will add a practice facility, improve the fan experience, and renovate and add office space. In addition to facilities, the Strategic Plan lays out goals for academic achievement, championship success, fiscal growth, and overall student-athlete, coach, and staff performance.

Barta has over 20 years of university and athletic administration experience. Before taking over at lowa he had been the Wyoming Athletic Director since October of 2003. From November 1996 to October 2003, he was Senior Associate Athletic Director for External Relations and Sports Programs at the University of Washington in Seattle. From 1990 to 1996, he was associated with the University of Northern Iowa in Cedar Falls, where he was the Director of Athletic Development and External Relations. He also served as Associate Director of Development at North Dakota State University in Fargo, from 1988-90, where he was involved in fund-raising for athletics, the colleges of business and engineering, and the University's annual fund.

Wyoming received the NCAA Division IA Program of Excellence Award in 2006 during Barta's tenure there, which honors athletic programs that are superior athletically, academically, and in student-athlete life skills preparation.

Barta, and his wife, Connie, have a son, Luke (9) and a daughter, Madison (7). He was born September 4, 1963, in Minneapolis, MN.



Hawkeye Athletics

The University of Iowa Athletic Department is under the direction of Gary Barta and is regarded as one of the top intercollegiate programs in the nation.

The men's and women's departments, operating separately for over 25 years, merged in 2001. It combined nationally recognized programs for both genders into one successful and progressive unit.


Combining their successes on the playing fields with continued success and recognition in the class-room, UI student-athletes practice and perform in some of the best facilities in the nation. The support of their efforts and attendance by Hawkeye fans ranks among the best in the country.

While the Hawkeyes compete with the best in the nation in a variety of sports, lowa boasts some of the most impressive athletic facilities in the nation, operated by one of the most respected departments.

Several new projects are underway on the Iowa campus. Some of the latest additions to the UI campus are the Roy G. Karro Athletics Hall of Fame and Visitors Center and the Russell and Ann Gerdin Athletic Learning Center. Construction on the new Campus Recreation and Wellness Center will also begin in the fall of 2007.

Kinnick Stadium received a major up-grading and renovation that was completed just prior to the 2006 season. The \$89 million project included the replacing of the south end zone stands and building of a four-level press box that houses 47 guest suites. New scoreboards, video walls, concession stands and new restrooms were also part of the project.

Additional priorities for the lowa program include establishment and development of endowments for all sports programs, continued enhancement of graduation rates, and implementation of a long-range plan to ensure lowa's financial, academic and competitive future. As an example, all of lowa's 13 scholarships for men's basketball are fully endowed.



The graduation rate of lowa's student-athletes has improved in each of the past 10 years and has consistently ranked above the graduation rate of all UI students. Hawkeye athletes have garnered more than 70 academic All-America honors since 1992. The 2006-07 school year saw the University of Iowa produce 125 academic all-Big Ten athletes.

lowa athletes have been recognized as all-Americans in their sport on 223 occasions during the past 15 years

During the 2006-07 athletic year, the Hawkeyes continued their trend of success on the playing fields and in academic pursuits.

The Hawkeye football team enjoyed a trip to the 2006 Alamo Bowl, where they faced the defending national champion Texas Longhorns. Iowa followed its 11-2 mark of 2002 with a 10-3 record in 2003 and a 10-2 mark in 2004, finishing each of those seasons ranked eighth nationally.

lowa's men's and women's basketball teams have advanced to post-season play in six of the last seven

seasons. The men's team is in its first season under new Head Coach Todd Lickliter, who was named the 2007 NABC Coach of the Year.


The lowa wrestling squad crowned an NCAA Champion in Mark Perry last season and three Hawkeyes were named all-Americans. Former Hawkeye three-time NCAA Champion and Olympic Gold Medalist Tom Brands is in his second season as head coach. He is joined on the staff by the legendary Dan Gable, who led lowa to 15 NCAA titles and 21 Big Ten Championships in his 21 seasons as head coach at lowa.

The lowa field fockey team won three matches in three days to claim the 2006 Big Ten Tournament title and earned an automatic berth in the NCAA Tournament. Iowa won a field hockey national title in 1986 and has produced six olympians, 17 national team players, 73 all-Americans and 140 all-Big Ten picks.

The lowa men's cross country team advanced to the NCAA Championships for the third-consecutive year in the fall of 2006, while the men's track team crowned three Big Ten champions and one all-American. The women's cross country team also quaified for the NCAA Championships and had two all-Americans. Women's track had five athletes claim Big Ten titles and all-America honors.

lowa's softball team has been selected to NCAA regional action 11 times in the past 14 seasons. The Hawkeyes have advanced to the World Series on four occasions over the past 12 seasons and Head Coach Gayle Blevins is one of three coaches to reach 1,000 career victories.

Whether it's the top-notch athletic or academic performances, the outstanding community and fan support or the impressive facilities, it's easy to understand why lowa fans everywhere truly believe, "It's great to be a Hawkeye."

Since its inception in 1979, Athletics Student Services has evolved from a two-person, academic support service to a broad-based, nationally prominent student support services operation. Its purpose is to offer academic and personal support services that will assist student-athletes in making timely and satisfactory progress toward their degrees and becoming tomorrow's leaders.

Athletics Student Services focuses on four important areas — academic counseling and monitoring, educational and support programs, retention programs and compliance services — when working with student-athletes. Following are descriptions of some of the programs, services and opportunities available in those areas.

Athletics Learning Center

The \$4.6 million Russell A. and Ann Gerdin Athletics Learning Center opened in August of 2003 and gives all lowa student-athletes a state-of-the-art facility to help them with their educations.


The Athletics Learning Center is a multi-level, 20,000 square foot facility which provides a computer center, study areas, classes and meeting places for all Hawkeye student-athletes. It features an auditorium that converts into two classrooms, separate study rooms for under and upper-class student-athletes with 28 study carrels, a computer lab, five tutorial rooms, the book loan repository, office space for lowa's Student Services staff and a display area to recognize the academic accomplishments of lowa's student-athletes.

Academic Counseling & Monitoring

Athletics coordinators work closely with student-athletes and their university-assigned advisors from the time they arrive on campus until the time they leave the University. Along with focusing on academic planning matters such as goal-setting, plans of study, choosing majors and degree requirements, athletics coordinators also help student-athletes understand NCAA, Big Ten and University academic policies. They also solicit feedback from instructors on academic progress made by student-athletes.

Transition Seminar

All new student-athletes attend an eight-week transition seminar during the fall semester that is geared toward helping them make the transition from high school to college successfully. Seminar topics include time management skills, learning and study strategies, the culture and rules of the university, and life skills concerning alcohol and other substances, relationships and intimacy, diversity, tolerance, values and character.



Retention

A full-time staff member directs the retention program, which identifies student-athletes who may need tailored academic assistance and structure, and implements individualized learning plans to help them succeed. Such plans may include daily and weekly planning sessions with athletics coordinators and retention staff, tutoring, study groups, mainstreaming into on-campus services like the writing center, math labs and services for students with learning disabilities.

Minority Enrichment Program

This program offers a culturally supportive environment in which minority student-athletes have the opportunity to develop friendships and a support network in the university. A core focus group of students and staff coordinate programs such as guest speakers, holiday celebrations, community service activities with the local neighborhood centers, events with Cultural Centers and networking with minority faculty, staff, professional and business leaders.

CHAMPS/Life Skills

Life skills programs are conducted throughout the year with and for student athletes on quality of life issues critical to personal growth, such as personal accountability, responsible use and nonuse of alcohol, diversity and gambling.

Tutoring

Tutoring is available free of charge to all student-athletes. Tutors, who are post-graduates and teachers, help with course content as well as study strategies and are available in virtually all general education program subjects.

Career Guidance & Development

Planning a meaningful career and a fulfilling life is an ongoing process of expanding and narrowing choices, beginning when student-athletes arrive on campus and continuing throughout their college career and lifetime. The professional staff works with other career development professionals on campus to offer individual consultation, career development seminars, workshops, referrals to other campus offices and special events like the Senior Recognition Banquet for graduating student-athletes.

Compare the Numbers



Sports Medicine & Athletic Training

Sports Medicine

Continuing to set the standard in Sports Medicine Service, the University of Iowa provides each student-athlete with the most up-to-date and highest quality medical care available. The 10 full-time certified and licensed athletic trainers of the Athletic Training Services department are committed to a multidisciplinary approach to sports medicine.

By providing quality health care, injury rehabilitation programs, and prevention programs, the University of Iowa swimming and diving student-athlete is guaranteed to receive timely and adequate medical care whenever necessary. A well-equipped athletic training room in the Fieldhouse is available for use by the men and women's swimming and diving teams.

Services from the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics, among the world's largest university-owned teaching hospitals, support the efforts of the athletic training staff. The new University of Iowa Sports Medicine Center, located in the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics employs a staff of team physicians, orthopaedic surgeons, physician assistants, and physical therapists. A team physician and orthopaedic surgeon are assigned to the men and women's swimming and diving teams. In the

event it is necessary for a swimming or diving student-athlete to receive advanced medical care, the athletic training staff makes referrals to the staff of the Sports Medicine Center where the student-athlete is assured of being seen by a physician within 24 hours.

Fieldhouse Athletic Training Room

The Fieldhouse athletic training room (pictured below) is conveniently located near the natatorium and is staffed by Mike Lawler, ATC, LAT, a full-time athletic trainer certified by the National Athletic Trainers' Association and licensed in the state of lowa, one certified graduate assistant athletic trainer, and students from the athletic training curriculum program. A senior athletic training student is assigned to the swimming and diving teams for the entire year and, along with the certified athletic trainers, provide individualized care on a daily, 24-hour basis. The athletic training staff utilize current and traditional rehabilitation and treatment technology, including whirlpools, hot hydrocollator units, ultrasound, electrical stimulation, ice, rehabilitation weights, Physio-gymnic balls, Stairmaster, Cybex isokinetic exercise, and Life Fitness exercise cycles.



The Colleges

Freshmen who enroll at The University of Iowa are admitted to either the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences or the College of Engineering. The General Education Program allows students to sample courses in more than 100 areas of study. At Iowa, students are required to take electives, major courses, and general education course work.

Liberal Arts & Sciences

Undergraduate Degrees Offered - Bachelor of Arts (BA) and Science (BS) in 58 major fields; Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) in Music (BM) and of Liberal Studies (BLS). **Admission** - Freshmen and transfer students are to meet the college's admissions requirements.

Engineering

Undergraduate Degrees Offered - Bachelor of Science in Engineering (BSE) in six majors- biomedical, chemical, civil, electrical, industrial, and mechanical engineering. **Admission -** Students must meet the college's high admissions requirements.

Business

Undergraduate Degrees Offered - Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) in six majors: accounting, economics, finance, management, management information systems, and marketing. Admission - Requires two years of pre-business study in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. Details at www.biz.uiowa.edu/upo/admissions/.

Education

Nursing

The College of Nursing has competitive admission. The BSN requires three years of study once the student earns admission.


Pharmacy

Professional Degree Offered - Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD).

Admission - Students must successfully complete required pre-pharmacy course work in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. These requirements may be met in two years but do not guarantee admission. Students must also complete the Pharmacy College Admission Test (PCAT).

Graduate and Professional Degrees

Many student-athletes who have attended The University of Iowa and completed their undergraduate degrees continue their education at the University. Student-athletes who attend graduate or professional school must first complete course work toward a bachelor's degree in their field of study. The University also offers undergraduates the opportunity to participate in research and overseas study programs, as well as internships that will help prepare them for graduate school.

Housing

Each athletics team has its own rules regarding residence of incoming freshmen. Across the University, about 90 percent of freshmen choose to live on campus in one of the 10 residence halls. Most studentathletes live at least two years on campus.

The residence halls have full-service dining rooms, study lounges, laundry facilities, recreational facilities, vending, and bank machines. Each room has high-speed computer connections for e-mail and Internet access, plus there are wireless networking hot spots in a variety of locations across campus. Iowa also offers wireless networking in 52 buildings and several outdoor areas, providing more than 265 access points across campus.

Safety

- 11:55 p.m. 2:10 a.m.: Free SafeRide buses take students home Fridays and Saturdays during the fall and spring semesters.
- Special telephones with blue lights are stationed across campus with a direct link to the UI Department of Public Safety.
- University of Iowa Police personnel educate students on safety during summer orientation.
- The Rape Victim Advocacy Program cooperates with the UI Department of Public Safety and participates in Sexual Crime Awareness Week.

Cambus

There are six primary bus routes throughout the lowa campus. The University Cambus provides over three million free rides to class and to the dorms for students each year. Some routes run seven days a week, and some run until 2:30 a.m. Cambus also operates a specialized transportation service for persons with disabilities.

Health Services

The University of Iowa provides the student-athlete with the most up-to-date and highest-quality medical care available. Students at Iowa can go to Student Health Service, which is open Monday through Friday. The service is supported by a fee paid by all full-time students. It offers students unlimited free office visits (there is a charge for other procedures done in the office, such as blood tests).

Libraries

The University of Iowa Libraries supports the academic achievement of all student-athletes with specialized courses, one-on-one consultations with librarians, 24/7 access to electronic resources through the web site (www. lib.uiowa.edu), and extended hours, which can accommodate complicated practice and travel schedules. UI Librarians help students find answers, whether they're on a web site, in a book, journal, government document, or database. Librarians also plan and teach students how to find, evaluate, and use information from a variety of sources--skills they will use throughout their lives.



Career Planning

Finding and pursuing a career takes careful planning. The Pomerantz Career Center is extremely valuable for student-athletes and can help identify stills that transfer from athletics to the workplace. The program suggests a timeline each student-athlete may follow throughout his or her stay at lowa. The components of the program include:

- · Individualized career advising
- · Career education programs
- Summer job/internship opportunities
- · Resume and cover letter development
- · Preparing for life after college athletics

Computers

There are 26 Instructional Technology Centers all over the campus which are filled with 1,200 computers. These facilities are open at least 50 hours a week. Some are open 24 hours. Also, the Information Arcade in the Main Library provides a variety of specialized computing tools. The Computer Demo Center provides information for students who want to purchase computers and software.

Skills Labs & Support

Many academic departments offer skills labs to help students improve skills necessary to succeed at lowa, such as writing, speaking, math, science, and foreign language. Assistance with skills such as note-taking, time-management, and test-taking are available through resources such as the College Transition Seminar (a credit-bearing course offered through University College), University Counseling Services, and Athletic Student Services staff.

Cultural Centers

Four cultural centers on campus provide a welcoming setting where students from various cultures can find cultural, academic, and personal support services: the Latino and Native American Cultural Center, the Afro American Cultural Center, the Asian Pacific American Cultural Center, and the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Resource and Education Center.



The Iowa City Community

lowa City is a diverse, highly cosmopolitan community of 60,000 set in the natural scenic beauty of lowa's rolling hills and woods along the tree-lined banks of the lowa River. lowa City has all the art galleries, ethnic foods, historic architecture and vibrant atmosphere of a much larger city, but with the compactness and friendly feeling of a small town.

As a place to live, Iowa City keeps winning awards and accolades - Named one of the 10 most enlightened towns in the country by *Utne Reader*, listed in the book The 100 Best Small Art Towns in America and selected the number-one place to live in the nation by *Editor & Publisher* magazine.

Economically, businesses such as Rockwell Collins, American College Testing and Procter & Gamble help keep the city booming. In Coralville, a branch office of Geico Auto Insurance has provided many residents with employment opportunities.

Culturally, lowa City is alive with concerts, art exhibits, readings, plays and art events of all kinds. Located on the University of Iowa campus, Hancher Auditorium is a nationally-known performance center that brings in the best of Broadway, classical and jazz music, dance and other performances. The University of Iowa Theater Arts department also produces a full schedule of plays each year, featuring the work of student performers and directors. So whether you enjoy the arts as a spectator or as an outlet for your own creativity, Iowa City has the opportunities.

Residents of lowa City are not only economically and culturally enriched, they also take advantage of the numerous recreational facilities offered around town. The area's more than 30 parks provide opportunities for year-round activities including boating, hiking, swimming, fishing and skiing.

The city's greatest charm, however, remains the sincere friendliness of its citizens, the cosmopolitan atmosphere and the successful partnership built between the community and the University.

Old Capitol

One of the most recognizable sites in Iowa City is the gold dome of the Old Capitol which is situated in the heart of downtown. Built in 1840, it is Iowa City's most historic building. The Old Capitol was the site of the first governor inauguration as well as the first six Iowa General Assemblies. It is also where the state's Constitution was drafted. When the capital was moved to Des Moines in 1857, the Old Capitol was dedicated to The University of Iowa, becoming the first building owned by the University.

Coralville Lake

Just north of Iowa City is Coralville Lake, an outdoor recreational area that offers a variety of opportunities for the public. Coralville Lake offers picnic shelters, biking, hiking, fishing, boating, swimming, hunting, camping, snowmobiling, cross country skiing, golf and disc golf.

Pedestrian Mall

Located downtown and in walking distance of many of the University's dormitories is the Pedestrian Mall. It is a perfect place to sit outside and study or hang out with friends. During the fall, spring and summer months there are concerts and art festivals in the "Ped" Mall.

Coral Ridge Mall

The Coral Ridge Mall is a 1.2-million-square-foot shopping center located just minutes from campus. The center combines a mix of over 120 specialty shops and strong department stores including Dillards, JC Penney, Sears, Target and Younkers. Coral Ridge also offers entertainment features such as an NHL-regulation-sized indoor ice arena, state-of-the-art 10-screen movie theatre and a large carousel along with a 1,000-seat food court with sit-down restaurants. Specialty stores include Abercrombie & Fitch, Barnes & Noble, Gap, Old Navy, Scheels All Sports and Pier 1 Imports.

Hawkeye Traditions

The Hawkeye Nickname

The University of Iowa borrowed its athletic nickname from the state of Iowa many years ago. The name Hawkeye was originally the name of the hero in the fictional novel, The Last of the Mohicans, written by James Fenimore Cooper. Cooper had the Delaware Indians bestow the name on a white scout who lived with them.

In 1838, 12 years after the book was published, people in the territory of lowa acquired the nickname, chiefly through the efforts of Judge David Rorer of Burlington and James Edwards of Fort Madison.

Edwards, editor of the Fort Madison Patriot, moved his paper to Burlington in 1843 and renamed it the Burlington Hawkeye. The two men continued their campaign to popularize the name, and territorial officials eventually gave it their formal approval.

Herky The Hawkeye

The Hawkeye nickname gained a tangible symbol in 1948 when a cartoon character, later to be named Herky the Hawkeye was hatched. The creator was Richard Spencer III, instructor of journalism at Iowa.

The impish Hawk was an immediate hit and acquired a name through a statewide contest staged by the athletic department. John Franklin, a Belle Plaine alumnus, was the man who suggested Herky.

Since his birth more than 45 years ago, Herky has symbolized lowa athletics and epitomized University life. He even donned a military uniform during the Korean War and became the insignia of the 124th Fighter Squadron.

During the mid-1950s, Herky came to life at a football game as the lowa mascot. Since that time, Herky has been a familiar figure at lowa athletics events.

School Colors

For 40 years lowa was without school colors, but in 1887 a group of 50 seniors met on the steps of the Old Capitol to decide what are now the school official colors. They chose Old Gold, the color of Iowa's vast corn fields and Black, the color of the rich soil.





School Fight Song

The Iowa Fight Song was written in 1950 by Mason City, Iowa, native Meredith Willson. Best known as the creator of Broadway's "The Music Man," Willson was awarded a 1963 University of Iowa Alumni Association Distinguished Service Award for "setting the spirit of Iowa to music." The lively cheer is sung hundreds of times during Iowa athletics events the year around.

The word is Fight, Fight, Fight for IOWA
Let every loyal lowan sing;
