NILE KINNICK



Nile Kinnick, the all American and hero for whom this football stadium is named, won practically every major honor as he led the 1939 Hawkeye football team to numerous last quarter victories.

His name has become legendary at the University of Iowa. Kinnick died in the waters off the coast of Venezuela, in the Caribbean Sea, after his fighter plane plunged into the sea several miles from his carrier, June 2, 1943.

Kinnick played football at lowa in the 1937-39 seasons, but his final year was his greatest. Nile played 402 minutes out of a possible 420, including the entire games on successive Saturdays against Indiana, Michigan, Wisconsin, Purdue, Notre Dame, and Minnesota. Iowa had a 6-1-1 season record and a league mark of 4-1-1, good enough for second place.

In eight games, he participated in 197 plays (104 rushing, 93 passing) accounting for 998 yards. Eleven of his passes went for touchdowns. He drop kicked 11 points after touchdown, scored 41 points personally, and was instrumental in making 107 of lowa's 130 points. He was truly the Ironman of the Ironmen team.

The honors piled up after the 1939 season: top male athlete in the United States that year, winner of the Heisman, Walter Camp, and Maxwell trophies as college football's Player of the Year; the captaincy of the honor team chosen by the all American Football Board; winner of the gold football from Collier's magazine and the Chicago Tribune's silver football recognizing the top player in the Big Ten; and he also ranked first in the national poll to pick members of the College All-Star team, which played the World Champion Green Bay Packers at Soldier Field in Chicago.

When he graduated from the College of Commerce in June 1940, Kinnick was a member of Phi Beta Kappa, with a 3.4 grade point average. He had turned down a large offer to play professional football because it would have interfered with his law studies, which he started in the fall of 1940. That was interrupted in December of 1941 when he was called to duty just days before Pearl Harbor was bombed.

Kinnick was born July 9, 1918, in Adel, Iowa. His family later moved to Omaha, Nebraska. Kinnick's playing weight was 170 pounds, and he was only 5-8. Although not exceptionally fast as a runner, he ran with drive and was considered very hard to tackle.

A 12-foot statue of his likeness, sculpted by Larry Nowland and unveiled before the 2006 season, is located immediately behind the south grandstands at Kinnick Stadium. The statue shows Kinnick as a student-athlete, holding text-books in his right arm and carrying his number 24 jersey over his left shoulder, while wearing an lowa letter-jacket. His weight is on his right leg, which is the same side the books are on, emphasizing the importance of academics. Kinnick's football helmet rests on the statue's concrete base directly behind his left foot. The 2006 Hawkeyes began a tradition of touching his helmet for good luck as they passed through the Krause Family Plaza to enter the stadium on game

And, of course, the naming of this stadium for Kinnick in 1972 forever puts his name on lowa football.







Nile Kinnick Heisman Award Acceptance Speech

"Thank you very, very, kindly, Mr. Holcombe. It seems to me that everyone is letting their superlatives run away with them this evening, but none the less, I want you to know that I'm mighty, mighty, happy to accept this trophy this evening.

Every football player in these United States dreams about winning that trophy, and of this fine trip to New York. Every player considers that trophy the acme in recognition of this kind. And the fact that I am actually receiving this trophy tonight almost overwhelms me, and I know that all of those boys who have gone before me must have felt somewhat the same way.

From my own personal viewpoint, I consider my winning this award as indirectly, a great tribute to the coaching staff at the University of Iowa, headed by Dr. Eddie Anderson, and to my teammates sitting back in Iowa City. A finer man and a better coach never hit these United States, and a finer bunch of boys, never graced the gridirons of the Midwest, than that Iowa team in 1939. I wish that they might all be with me tonight to receive this trophy. They certainly deserve it.

I want to take this grand opportunity to thank collectively, all the sports-writers and all the sportscasters, and all those who have seen fit, have seen their way clear to cast a ballot in my favor for this trophy. And I also want to take this opportunity to thank Mr. Prince and his committee, the Heisman award committee, and all those connected with the Downtown Athletic Club for this trophy, and for the fine time that they're showing me. And not only for that, but for making this fine and worthy trophy available to the football players of this country.

Finally, if you will permit me, I'd like to make a comment which in my mind, is indicative, perhaps, of the greater significance of football, and sports emphasis in general in this country, and that is, I thank God I was warring on the gridirons of the Midwest, and not on the battlefields of Europe. I can speak confidently and positively that the players of this country, would much more, much rather struggle and fight to win the Heisman award, than the Croix de Guerre.

Thank you."

FRED 'DUKE' SLATER



Fred "Duke" Slater, a 6-2, 210-pound tackle for the Hawkeyes from 1918-21, was the first black player in school history to earn All-America honors. A three-time All-Big Ten selection, Slater competed in football and track and field for the Hawkeyes. He was inducted to the National Football Foundation College Hall of Fame in 1951. Slater is also a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame and the National Iowa Varsity Club Hall of Fame.

Slater helped lowa to a perfect 7-0 record in 1921, including a 10-7 victory over Knute Rockne's Notre Dame team, ending a 20-game Irish winning streak. Slater turned pro in 1922, joining the Milwaukee Badgers. After just two games, he signed with the Rock Island Independents, where he played from 1922-25. Slater completed his career with the Chicago Cardinals (1926-31).


Slater starred as a two-way tackle for 10 seasons and was the longest tenured African American player during that era. Slater played the full 60 minutes during the historic Thanksgiving Day game in 1929 when Ernie Nevers scored a single-game record 40 points, an NFL record that still stands.


Racial bias presumably kept Slater from being named to the official NFL All-Decade Team of the 1920's. However, he was recognized as an All-Decade player of the 1920's in the book "The Pro Football Chronicle." In total, Slater was named AII-BNFL four times (1923, 1925, 1926, 1929), and second-team, All-NFL by various outlets in seven of his 10 pro seasons (1923-27, 1929-30).


Slater graduated from law school and passed the bar in 1928 while still playing in the NFL. He started a practice in Chicago and became an assistant district attorney and assistant Illinois commerce commissioner. Slater was elected Chicago's second black judge in 1948, and in 1960 became the first black judge to serve on the Superior Court of Chicago.

Slater Residence Hall, a 489-bed dormitory located on the west side of the University of Iowa campus, was named after Slater.

Slater was born December 9, 1898, in Normal, III. He attended high school in Clinton, Iowa, where he earned all-state honors at left tackle. He died August 14, 1966 at the age of 67.







The Hawkeye Nickname

The University of Iowa borrowed its athletic nickname from the state of Iowa many years ago.

The name Hawkeye was originally applied to a hero in a fictional novel, The Last of the Mohicans, written by James Fenimore Cooper. Author Cooper had the Delaware Indians bestow the name on a white scout who lived with them.

In 1838, 12 years after the book was published, people in the territory of Iowa acquired the nickname, chiefly through the efforts of Judge David Rorer of Burlington and James Edwards of Fort Madison.

Edwards, editor of the Fort Madison Patriot, moved his paper to Burlington in 1843 and renamed it the Burlington Hawk Eye. The two men continued their campaign to popularize the name and territorial officials eventually gave it their formal approval.

School Fight Song

The Iowa Fight Song was written in 1950 by Mason City, Iowa, native Meredith Willson. Best known as the creator of Broadway's "The Music Man," Willson was awarded a 1963 University of Iowa Alumni Association Distinguished Service Award for "setting the spirit of Iowa to music." The lively cheer is sung hundreds of times during Iowa athletic events during the year.

The Tigerhawk Emblem

When Hayden Fry was named University of Iowa Head Football Coach in 1979, he wanted to change the Hawkeyes' image from a team that posted 17-straight losing seasons to that of a winner. One part of that makeover was creating and introducing a new logo. Fry and the athletics marketing department held a campus-wide contest asking fans to submit their logo ideas. The winner - the tigerhawk designed by Cedar Rapids native Bill Colbert - has become synonymous with University of Iowa Athletics.

Herky The Hawkeye

The Hawkeye nickname gained a tangible symbol in 1948 when a cartoon character, later to be named Herky the Hawk, was hatched. The creator was Richard Spencer III, instructor of journalism.

The impish hawk was an immediate hit and he acquired a name through a statewide contest staged by the athletic department. John Franklin, a Belle Plaine alumnus, was the man who suggested Herky.

Since his birth, Herky has symbolized Iowa athletics and epitomized University life. He even donned a military uniform during the Korean War and became the insignia of the 124th Fighter Squadron. During the mid 1950s Herky came to life at a football game as the Iowa mascot. Since then Herky has been a familiar figure at Iowa athletic events.

The Wave

The Hawkeye football program was chosen to receive the prestigious 2017 Disney Sports Spirit Award after launching a heart-warming tradition at its home games that touched the lives of scores of young patients at the university's Stead Family Children's Hospital. The Wave also received the 2024 USA Today Readers' Choice Award for Best College Sports Tradition.

In a tradition that started at the 2017 season opener, fans inside Kinnick Stadium and patients and families inside the UI Stead Family Children's Hospital exchanged waves at the end of the first quarter of each home game.

The UI Stead Family Children's Hospital opened in 2017. It is connected to the south end of the University of lowa Hospitals and Clinics and overlooks Kinnick Stadium from the southeast grandstands. During lowa football home games, patients and their fami-

lies can watch the game from the top floor (Level 12), one of the highest vantage points in Iowa City.

School Colors

For 40 years lowa was without school colors, but in 1887 a group of 50 seniors met on the steps of the Old Capitol to decide, what are now, the official school colors. They chose Old Gold, the color of lowa's vast corn fields and Black, the color of the rich soil.

The Swarm

Coach Fry wanted to create a sense of unity and togetherness on game days amongst his new team in 1979. Before each game, he instructed his team to take and leave the field as a tight group with everyone holding hands and moving at a slow trot. Fry coined the entrance "The Swarm".

"I wasn't sure what we'd look like as a team after the first snap," explained Fry, "so I wanted to make sure that we looked like winners coming on and off the field. I told my first team that the Swarm was to get the attention of the other team," he laughed. "But it was just as much for us to relax and not be scared."





Cy-Hawk Trophy - Iowa vs. Iowa State

When The University of Iowa resumed its football series with Iowa State in 1977, the Des Moines Athletic Club donated a trophy to be awarded to the winner of the annual in-state battle.

The original Cy-Hawk Trophy featured a football player in the classic running back pose and a likeness of both Herky the Hawkeye and Cy the Cardinal. A new Cy-Hawk Trophy, selected through a fan vote, was introduced for the 2012 contest, which is a part of the lowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series.

The Hawkeyes hold a 47-24 advantage in the series that began in 1894, including a 31-16 margin since 1977 when the Cy-Hawk Trophy was first awarded. Iowa State holds possession of the trophy with a 20-19 victory in September in Iowa City. The winning university is entitled to keep the trophy until it loses the annual battle.

Heartland Trophy - Iowa vs. Wisconsin

The Heartland Trophy was inaugurated in 2004 and goes each year to the winner of the football battle between lowa and Wisconsin.

The trophy was designed and crafted by artist and former lowa football player Frank Strub. The trophy, which is a bull mounted on a walnut base (native to both Wisconsin and lowa), has been inscribed with the scores of all games in the long-time series. The teams have met 97 times, with Wisconsin holding a 49-46-2.

Wisconsin leads the series, 10-8, since the inception of the Heartland Trophy in 2004. The trophy resides in lowa City following lowa's 15-6 win in Madison last season. The winning university is entitled to keep the trophy until it loses the annual battle.



To the winner of the lowa-Minnesota football game goes possession of a statue of a pig named "Floyd of Rosedale."

A bet in 1935 between Minnesota Governor Floyd B. Olson and Iowa Governor Clyde Herring gave birth to Floyd of Rosedale. Tensions between the two state universities had been running high and a wager was made in an effort to relieve the situation.

After Iowa lost the 1935 game, Herring presented Olson with Floyd of Rosedale, a full-blooded champion pig and a brother of BlueBoy from Will Rogers' movie State Fair. Olson gave the pig to the University of Minnesota and commissioned St. Paul sculptor Charles Brioscho to capture Floyd's image.

The result is a bronze pig 21 inches long and 15 inches high and weighs in at 98.3 pounds. Floyd currently resides in lowa City as a result of lowa's 31-14 victory earlier this season in Minneapolis. Minnesota holds a 44-41-2 advantage in the series with Floyd of Rosedale on the line. The winning university is entitled to keep the trophy until it loses the annual battle.

The Heroes Game - Iowa vs. Nebraska

The Heroes Game was created to highlight the border rivalry between lowa and Nebraska. The institutions annually honor one citizen from each of their respective states who are admired for their brave deeds and noble qualities.

These heroes are nominated by friends, neighbors or co-workers and are guests of the two teams at the game, where they will be honored on-field. Each will also have their name and hometown etched on the Heroes Trophy.

Nebraska holds a 30-21-3 advantage in the all-time series. The trophy resides in lowa City after lowa's 13-10 victory in Lincoln last season.







Thirty-one University of Iowa football players have earned Consensus All-America status, an honor bestowed to any player that appears on three of the five media outlets that determine All-America teams. Two players -- OL Calvin Jones (1954, 1955) and LB Larry Station (1984, 1985) -- were honored on more than one occasion.

Of the 31 players honored, 15 earned unanimous status by being recognized by each of the five media outlets used in the consensus selection process. Those players include QB Randy Duncan (1958); Station (1985); QB Chuck Long (1985); TE Dallas Clark (2002); OL Robert Gallery (2003), RB Shonn Greene (2008), OL Brandon Scherff (2014); DB Desmond King (2015); DB Josh Jackson (2017); LB Josey Jewell (2017), DL Daviyon Nixon (2020), OL Tyler Linderbaum (2021) and LB Jack Campbell (2022), Cooper DeJean (2023), Tory Taylor (2023). The media outlets used in determining consensus status include American Football Coaches Association (AFCA); Associated Press; Football Writers Association of America (FWAA); Sporting News; and the Walter Camp Foundation.







HAWKEYE RADIO NETWORK





The lowa radio broadcasts throughout the football season feature the play-by-play commentary of Gary Dolphin (left) and color analysis provided by former Hawkeye standout Pat Angerer (right).

Fans of the University of Iowa following the Hawkeyes on radio can tune in on their favorite station throughout the state of Iowa and the Midwest.

The radio voice of the Hawkeyes is Gary Dolphin, a Cascade, lowa, native who handles all play-by-play action of both lowa football and men's basketball. In addition, Dolphin also serves as the host of the weekly coach's shows during the season with football Coach Kirk Ferentz and men's basketball Coach Fran McCaffery. He also hosts the Fight For lowa Podcast, available on all podcast platforms each week. Dolphin is a three-time lowa Sportscaster of the Year. He is in his 28th year of broadcasting lowa football and basketball on the Hawkeye Radio Network. Dolphin, overall, is in his 52nd year of play-by-play broadcasting, which includes seven years of broadcasting basketball games for Northwestern University. He served as the Network Television Coordinator for the Chicago Bears from 1989-99.

Dolphin is joined on all University of Iowa football broadcasts by former Hawkeye great Pat Angerer. The Bettendorf, Iowa, native played for the Hawkeyes from 2005-09, where he compiled 258 tackles, including 11.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, and six interceptions. Angerer was a member of four bowl teams - 2005 Outback, 2006 Alamo, 2008 Outback, 2009 Orange – during his lowa career. A first-team All-Big Ten selection, Angerer led the conference in tackles, averaging 12.8 stops per contest in league games (and he was second in all games at 11.2 tackles per game). Following his Hawkeye career, Angerer was selected with the 63rd pick in the 2010 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts. He played four seasons in Indianapolis, where he accumulated 328 career tackles, 2.5 sacks, 14 tackles for loss, four forced fumbles and two interceptions. Angerer, who was named to PFWA and The Sporting News All-Rookie teams in 2010, was a member of three playoff teams (2010, 2012, 2013) during his NFL career.

lowa's sideline reporter is Rob Brooks, son of Hall of Fame broadcaster, Bob Brooks. Rob also handles play by play duties of lowa Women's basketball.

The Hawkeye Radio Network, a production of Learfield, blankets the state of Iowa and bordering states with more than 50 stations providing live coverage. The Hawkeyes can also be heard on the Varsity Network App, the official YouTube channel of the Hawkeyes, hawkeyesports.com, and on SiriusXM satellite radio.
