WHY THIS ROLE EXISTS

This position sits within the multi-Council collaboration Shared Services Team. The purpose of the team is to provide quality infrastructure solutions and services for the Waikato Region. This role supports the delivery of Sampling & Analysis Services for participating Councils across the region. The purpose of the Laboratory Assistant role is to provide operational support in our Sampling & Analysis Laboratory to support Councils in achieving compliance with Drinking Water requirements and Waikato Regional Council granted resource consents.

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WHAT YOU WILL DO

Reporting to the Senior Laboratory Technician, a Laboratory Assistant will perform basic Laboratory analysis and sample preparation to meet the monitoring requirements of the participating Councils. You will also undertake data handling, equipment maintenance and calibration, and help the team maintain its IANZ accreditation scope.

KEY OUTCOMES

Some of the key outcomes for this role include:

- Undertake physical, chemical and biological testing of samples as requested in accordance with standard methods.
- Monitor and report on inventory to ensure all critical reagents, equipment and consumables are available at all times and stored as per legislative requirements.
- Calibrating, cleaning, and maintaining sampling and testing equipment to a high standard.
- Identifying and promptly reporting equipment defects to Senior Laboratory Technician and assisting in arranging repairs or replacements.
- Contributing to monitoring compliance with Resource Consents and reporting any anomalies to the appropriate personnel immediately.
- Contributing to monitoring compliance with Drinking Waters Standards and actioning any transgression response procedures immediately.
- Contributing to efficient and accurate management of data and data systems and assisting with system maintenance and upgrades as required.
- Contributing to retention of IANZ accreditation and Ministry of Health approval by:
 - Adhering to documented procedures.
 - Actively participating in system reviews.
 - Suggesting process improvements.
- Keeping yourself and others safe at work by:
 - Following required safety practices and policies.
 - Positively engaging with health and safety initiatives.
 - Proactively reporting safety concerns.
 - Actively participating in health and safety activities, including Civil Defence.
- Adhering to Council's quality management systems, procedures and policies.

- Ability to help review processes and contribute to implementing improvements.
