Reporting to the People Manager – Strategy and Planning Specialists, and with workflow direction from Technical Director Strategic Waters, you will be responsible for the strategic planning needed to inform the operation, upgrade and expansion of the Pukete Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). In this role you will lead the development, delivery and maintenance of the Master Plan for the Pukete WWTP. A framework for this has already been developed which provides a roadmap to deliver the master plan, including key decisions that need to be made to progress the master plan and upgrade programme. This role is responsible for driving the project forward, facilitating and coordinating inputs from key internal staff, managing external consultants, and overall project delivery.
