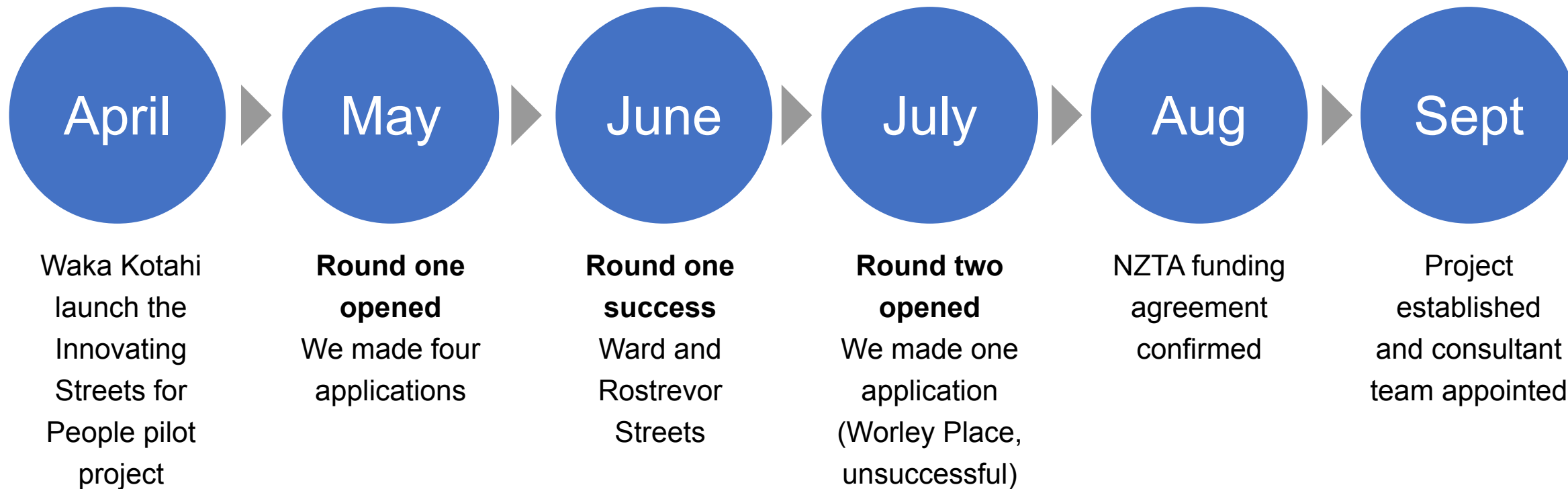

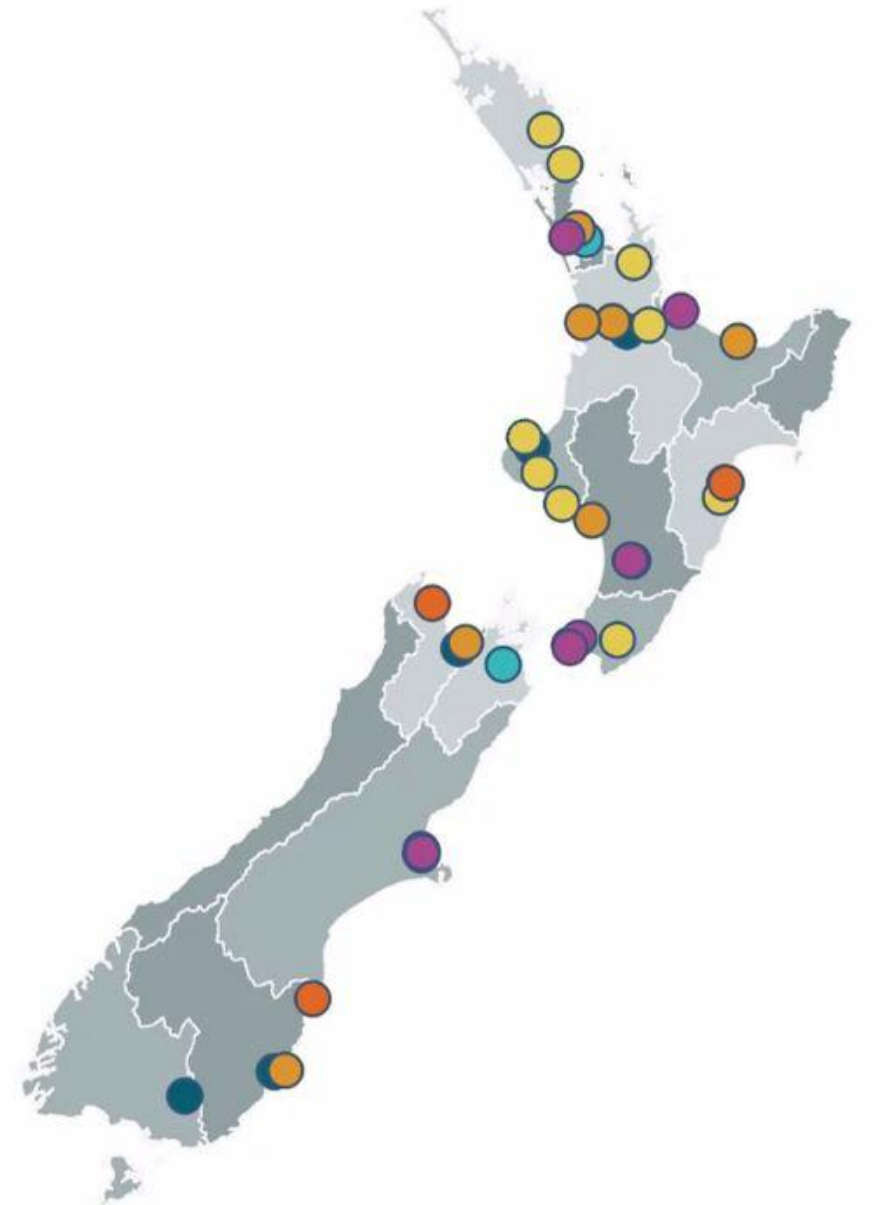


Innovating Streets for People programme



- Waka Kotahi Innovating Streets for People programme aim:
“to make it faster and easier to transition our streets to safer and more liveable spaces.”
- \$7 million fund and **90% funding** for Council projects
- Waka Kotahi support: strategic, tactical, and operational including legislative
- Focus on capacity building
- 72 projects funded at Councils throughout New Zealand

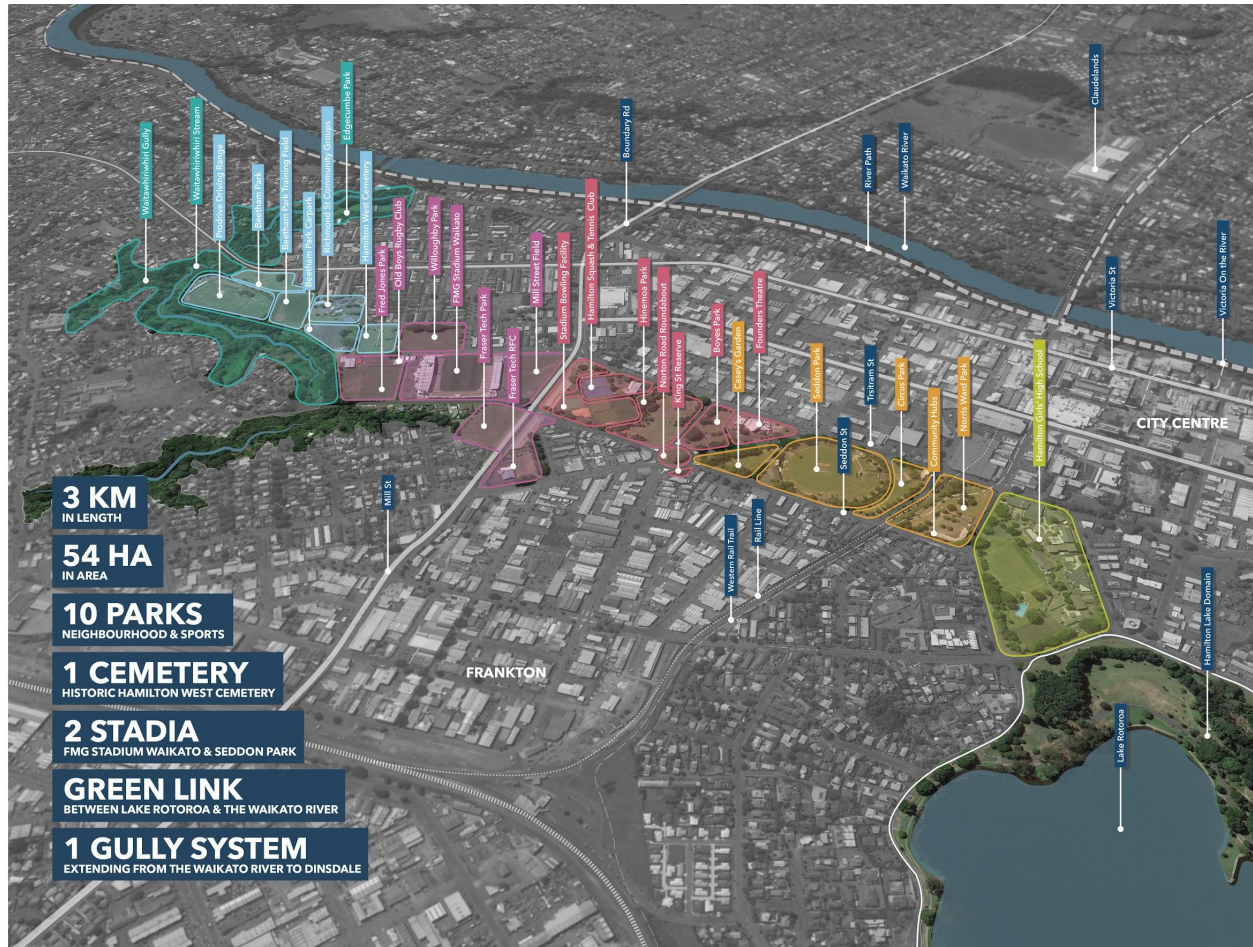

Why change existing streets?



- Hamilton's city centre starting to gather pace in becoming a really buzzing city

First steps
in Streets’
evolution

Mandatory design parameters

1. Improving how each street serves disabled people
2. Improving how each street serves people walking, scooting, cycling
3. Improving how each street serves people lingering, looking around, staying in place
4. Staying within legal requirements for what's allowed to go in a street
5. Retaining servicing vehicle access on Ward St, and legal road status for Rostrevor

Minimum improvements post projects:



- Both streets better serve disabled people than before Kirikiriroa Innovating Streets projects
- Service vehicle access maintained on Ward St
- Legal road status maintained on Rostrevor St

How we are communicating with the public



- use networks first
- platform all the different people positively involved
- support neighbours and partners to be in the limelight
- stimulate people's curiosity
- embrace the dynamism of spaces
“what's it like this week?” “Let's go see!”

From you: overall going forward, and today

Overall going forward:

- Help the city get a real taste, and see if it likes:
 - turning the dial on streets towards people
 - using adaptive trialling and experiential consultation to find the best way
- Get people to come down, have a taste, give lots of feedback. Repeatedly
