1.1 Purpose of the Report

1.1.1 To seek adoption of the Territorial Authority report on dog control policies and practices, prior to being made publicly available.

1.2 Summary of Key Points

- 1.2.1 Section 10A of the Dog Control Act 1996 requires Territorial Authorities to report on dog related activity and policy annually.
- 1.2.2 On 4 May 2017 Council delegated power to the Chief Executive to receive future reports under Section 10A of the Dog Control Act.
- 1.2.3 The report covers the period of 1 July 2019 to 30 June 2020.
- 1.2.4 As at 30 June 2020 Hamilton had 12070 known dogs.
- 1.2.5 Animal Education and Control Officers undertook 5410 service requests related to dogs for the period (Full summary of activity see appendix 1).
- 1.2.6 Hamilton City Councils Dog Control Policy was reviewed and adopted in 2015 and was due for review again in 2020, this will move to align with the Dog Control bylaw and Animal Nuisance by law in 2023

2.0 Background

2.1 Legislative requirement

2.1.1 Section 10A of the Dog Control Act 1996 requires Territorial Authorities to report on dog related activity and policy annually.



2.1.2 Section 10A, subsection 1 requires Territorial Authorities to report on their dog control policy and activities annually. The report must be adopted by council and made publicly available.

2.2 Council resolution

- 2.2.1 On 4 May 2017 Council passed a resolution to delegate to the Chief Executive the power to receive future reports pursuant to Section 10A of the Dog Control Act 1996 and to submit the reports to the Secretary for Local Government and publish the reports as required under the Act.
- 2.2.2 The requirement to submit annual reports to the Secretary for Local Government was repealed on 21 March 2019.

2.3 Dog Control Policy

- 2.4 Hamilton City Council's <u>Dog Control Policy</u> was reviewed and updated through a public consultation process in 2015.
- 2.5 The updated Policy was approved by Council on 28 May 2015 and came into effect on 1 July 2015.
- 2.6 The Policy is available on the Councils website and was due for review again in 2020 at the same time as the bylaw. Legal advice noted the Dog Control Bylaw should now be on a 10 year review cycle and the policy review would align to this. The bylaw and policy will be reviewed in 2023 as we align their review cycle to match the Animal Nuisance bylaw.

2.7 Summary of Activity

- 2.7.1 As at 30 June 2020 Hamilton had 12070 registered dogs
- 2.7.2 AEC staff undertook 5410 service requests related to dogs
- 2.7.3 Hamilton has 378 dogs registered as dangerous or menacing
- 2.7.4 There are 34 disqualified or probationary dog owners in Hamilton (for full summary of activity see appendix 1)
